UGA leads all-time series 54-19-2

**Series History:** Georgia won last year's meeting 44-17 in Athens. However, the Commodores registered a 31-27 win over the Bulldogs in 2013. Georgia has won 18 of the last 20 meetings.

### High-Powered Offense Continues

In the season-opening win over ULM, Georgia tallied 51 points, running 52 plays and gaining 435 yards. The Bulldogs led the SEC and were eighth nationally in Scoring at 41.3 points/game in 2014. With the departure of offensive coordinator Mike Bobo to become the head coach at Colorado State, the Bulldogs hired **Brian Schottenheimer** from the St. Louis Rams in January 2015 to lead the offense. Junior transfer **Greyson Lambert**, who earned his Anthropology degree from Virginia over the summer, went 8-for-12 for 141 yards and two touchdowns in his Bulldog debut as the starting quarterback.

### Rushing Attack

During the 51-14 win over the Warhawks of ULM, Georgia gained 243 rushing yards on 38 carries (6.4 avg.) with four touchdowns. Georgia returns four out of its top five rushers from 2014, including **Nick Chubb**. Chubb has started the Bulldogs' last nine games and gone over the century mark each time, which is the longest active streak in the FBS. He led Georgia in its opener with 120 yards on 16 carries (7.5 avg.) and two scores. In 2014, Chubb finished with 1,547 yards and 14 rushing touchdowns to help Georgia tally 70 touchdowns (10th nationally). Against ULM, sophomore **Sony Michel** had 41 yards on six carries and also set a career high with a team-best 79 yards receiving on two catches, including a 31-yard touchdown. Also, junior **Keith Marshall** looked fully healed from a 2013 ACL injury. He had 10 carries for 73 yards and two touchdowns. This marked his first rushing touchdown since the 2013 season opener against Clemson.

### Veteran Offensive Line Back In Business

The Bulldogs return four starters on the offensive line. Senior LT **John Theus**, junior C **Brandon Kublanow**, junior RG **Greg Pyke** and senior RT **Kolton Houston** all started in Georgia's opener after only three-year starting C David Andrews graduated. Andrews was drafted by the New England Patriots and made the 53-man roster. Sophomore **Isaiah Wynn** started at LG against ULM for his second career start.

### Defense At A Glance

Georgia's defense is led by second-year coordinator **Jeremy Pruitt**. In game one this year, Georgia held ULM to 14 points as the Warhawks ran 51 plays for 255 yards. The game was terminated with 9:54 left due to lightning. Pruitt has six starters back from a defense that posted two shutouts and held #23 Missouri and #9 Auburn to a combined seven points in 2014.

Senior OLB **Jordan Jenkins** ranks as the top returning tackler (2014 totals: 70 stops, 9.5 TFLs, 5 sacks) while junior OLB **Leonard Floyd** had a team-high six sacks, 8.5 TFLs and 55 tackles last year. In the win over ULM in this year's season opener, Floyd was the co-leader with eight stops, including 1.5 tackles for loss, and Jenkins had seven stops with a sack. Jenkins is the SEC's active leader in sacks (16) and TFLs (30.5).

The Bulldogs had three first-time starters on defense last Saturday. Senior ILB **Jake Ganus**, who transferred from UAB, and true freshman DB **Rico McGraw** started and they had three tackles each. Sophomore CB **Malkom Parrish** also got his first start and finished with two stops.

### 2014 Georgia-Vanderbilt Flashback

The Bulldogs jumped out to a 21-0 lead over the Commodores in the opening period and went on to win 44-17. Current St. Louis Ram Todd Gurley led the charge with 163 yards rushing and two scores.

### Last Time In Nashville

In 2013, Vanderbilt outscored Georgia 15-0 in the fourth quarter to post a 31-27 upset of the #15 Bulldogs. The Commodores seized momentum late in the third quarter when they recovered a fumbled punt at the UGA 36. Then, they converted a pair of fourth-down attempts and eventually scored a touchdown with 10:38 left to play to make it a six-point contest.

Next, they made it a three-point game courtesy of a 40-yard field goal with 4:44 remaining in the game. After Georgia failed to gain a first down, punter **Collin Barber** was unable to field a high snap from center, and the Commodores cashed in on the very next play, a 13-yard touchdown run with 2:53 left, and the lead would hold up for the home team.

### ON DECK: SOUTH CAROLINA 6 p.m. ET (ESPN)

The Bulldogs hold a 47-18-2 edge over the Gamecocks. However, South Carolina has won four out of the last five games, including a 38-35 victory in 2014. Georgia handed the Gamecocks a 41-30 loss the last time the teams played in Athens in 2013.

## UGA IX THE MASCOT

### Current Record: 45-19

The University of Georgia will introduce its newest mascot, Uga X, at a yet-to-be announced date during this season. The new mascot will be succeeding Uga IX, affectionately known as "Russ," who recently turned 11 years old.

"We look forward to celebrating the reign of Russ who has served the University and our sports program in magnificent fashion," said UGA President Jere W. Morehead. "He has truly endeared himself to fans all over the country. At the same time we anxiously await the arrival of the newest in our long-standing line of mascots, Uga X."

The half-brother of Uga VII, Russ has compiled an overall record of 44-19. He served as an interim Bulldog mascot for a total of 25 games (16-9). He worked nine games during the 2009 and 2010 seasons after Uga VII and VIII passed away. Russ roamed the sidelines at all 14 games during the 2011 season. He then served for two wins at the beginning of the 2012 season before being promoted as Uga IX prior to the Florida Atlantic game on Sept. 15, 2012.

His time as mascot has included the 2011 and 2012 SEC Eastern Division championships, three road wins at Georgia Tech and a victory over Texas A&M in the 2009 Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La. He completed 2012 with a 12-2 record and a win over Nebraska in the Capital One Bowl. In 2013, he finished with an 8-5 record before the Bulldogs completed the 2014 season with a 10-3 mark, capped by a victory over 20th-ranked Louisville in the Belk Bowl.

**ATHENS, Ga.** - Georgia quarterback Greyson Lambert threw two touchdown passes in his UGA debut and the Bulldog running backs piled up 243 yards on the ground as Georgia defeated ULM, 51-14, in front of a Sanford Stadium capacity crowd of 92,746 and a SEC Network television audience.

The 2015 season opener was a shortened contest. The game officially ended with 9:54 remaining in the fourth quarter due to lightning at 3:49 p.m.

The rain-soaked capacity crowd watched Lambert complete 8-of-12 passes for 141 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions in his first start as a Georgia Bulldog. Fellow quarterback Brice Ramsey threw for 51 yards after completing each of his two pass attempts -- one of which was a 31-yard TD pass to tailback Sony Michel in the second quarter.

Sophomore running back Nick Chubb led the way for the Bulldogs on the ground with 120 yards rushing. The All-SEC tailback tallied two touchdowns, including the Bulldogs' first of the season from 14 yards out four minutes into the game. Senior wide receiver Malcom Mitchell led the team with three catches for 52 yards and a touchdown.

The defense held the Warhawks to 251 total yards. Georgia defensive back Aaron Davis notched the team's only takeaway during the contest, intercepting a fade pass thrown by ULM in the first quarter. The Bulldogs were led by safety Quincy Mauger and linebacker Leonard Floyd, who both finished the contest with eight tackles.

Senior place kicker Marshall Morgan tied Blair Walsh for the school record for PATs with 184. His tally ranks third in SEC history.

After forcing a three and out on the Warhawks' first drive, a shanked punt handed the home team the ball at ULM's 21 yard line. Two Chubb carries later and Georgia had its first lead of the game at 7-0.

On the ensuing possession, Davis picked off ULM QB Garrett Smith's fade pass down the left sideline, returning the ball to the 15-yard line. The Bulldogs wasted no time, putting six more points on the board when Lambert hit tight-end Jeb Blazeovich in the endzone for a diving catch.

The Bulldogs then put up 21 points in the second quarter thanks to a trio of touchdowns by the Georgia tailbacks. Keith Marshall, who missed most of last season due to an injury, made the most of his return, recording two touchdowns on the day -- his first coming on a 3-yard run in the second quarter. Chubb added a 23-yard TD run before Michel caught a 31-yard TD pass from Ramsey to take the Bulldogs into the half with a 35-7 lead.

The Warhawks opened the second-half with a touchdown drive before play was suspended with 8:35 in the third quarter due to lightning. After an hour and 16-minute delay, action resumed at 3:15 p.m.

Georgia added nine points to its lead in the third quarter thanks to a blocked punt by D'Andre Walker that forced a ULM safety. Malcolm Mitchell followed with a 28-yard TD reception from Lambert.

The Bulldogs added a score in the fourth when Marshall rushed in for his second score of the game -- this time a 2-yard TD run with 10:58 remaining in the fourth quarter to put the final score at 51-14 in the Bulldogs' favor.



### Coach Mark Richt said...

"We believe in running the ball and we think we do a great job of it. Today was all about execution. We're blessed that all our tailbacks stayed healthy in camp. They practiced extremely well. We have faith in their ability to do whatever it takes to make the offense go. We hope they continue to stay healthy and continue to share the load."

### Worth Noting...

- Georgia improved to 92-27-3 in season openers, including 12-3 under Mark Richt. The Bulldogs are now 57-11 against non-conference teams, including 40-2 at home under Richt. The game was halted twice due to lightning (the first delay lasted one hour), and on the second stoppage with 9:54 left in the contest, the game was declared a final.
- Junior QB Greyson Lambert finished 8-for-12 for 141 yards and two touchdowns in his Bulldog debut. Lambert, who had nine starts for Virginia last year, graduated from UVA and transferred to UGA in the summer.
- With seven PATs vs. ULM, senior PK Marshall Morgan tied the school record for career PATs made with 184 with Blair Walsh. That tally ranks third in SEC history.
- Georgia had three first-time starters vs. ULM. Two of the first-time starters were transfers in QB Greyson Lambert (Virginia) and senior ILB Jake Ganus (UAB). The third was true freshman DB Rico McGraw. Senior LT John Theus is the active leader with 36 career starts, including 21 in a row.
