VANDY: SEEKING THREE-GAME WIN STREAK

Vanderbilt will be seeking its first three-game win streak in more than two years when they host Southeastern Conference Western Division rival Ole Miss this Saturday.

The Commodores' last three-game streak came early in the 2008 season when they put together wins over Rice, Ole Miss and Auburn.

WINNING VS. BCS BOWL PARTICIPANTS

Vanderbilt's victory Sept. 10 over Connecticut of the Big East Conference marked the second win in five years against a team that made a BCS bowl appearance the previous season.

In 2010, UConn received the Big East's invitation into BCS postseason play as the league's co-champion. The Huskies ended the season playing Oklahoma in the Fiesta Bowl near Phoenix, Ariz.

The Commodores' only other victory over a team that played the previous year in a BCS bowl came in 2006 when Vanderbilt defeated nationally ranked Georgia on the road. The Bulldogs played in Sugar Bowl after the 2005 season.

SEVEN FIRST-TIME STARTERS THIS SEASON

Three young Commodore offensive players – **Chris Boyd** (WR, R-Fr.), **Fitz Lassing** (TE/FB, So.) and **Chase White** (OL, R-Fr.) – enjoyed their first career starts in the win over Connecticut on Sept. 10.

The trio is among seven players who have earned their first career starts early this season.

Boyd had two catches, including one for a TD, in his first start. Lassing also posted a 14-yard catch.

A fourth offensive player, **Mylon Brown** (R-So., OG), earned his first start in the opener.

Three defensive players have also enjoyed initial career starts: **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB), **Chase Garnham** (So., LB) and **Javon Marshall** (So., safety).

THIRTEEN FIRST-TIME CONTRIBUTORS

Vince Taylor (R-Fr., DT) became the 13th underclassmen to see their initial action as a Commodore when he played on the defensive front against Connecticut.

Taylor had a fumble recovery and quarterback hurry in limited snaps against the Huskies.

Besides, Taylor, other first-time defensive players this season were **Robby Barbieri** (R-Fr., LB), **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Fr., DE), **Reggie Ford** (So., DB) and **Thomas Ryan** (R-Fr., DE).

First-time offensive players were **Chris Boyd** (R-Fr., WR), **Andrew Bridges** (R-Fr., OT), **Trent Pruitt** (R-Fr., WR), **Spencer Pulley** (Fr., OG), **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB), **Jerron Seymour** (Fr., RB) and **Joe Townsend** (Fr., C).

Andrew East (R-Fr.), also is in his first year as the primary snapper.

FOUR TRUE FRESHMEN SEE EARLY ACTION

Four true freshmen on the Commodore roster have played early in the 2011 season. **Jerron Seymour** (RB) is the team's second leading rusher with 85 yards, including a 40-yard TD scamper vs. Connecticut. Two freshman linemen, **Spencer Pulley** (OG) and **Joe Townsend** (C), also have played. Tight end **Dillon van der Wal** saw his first action vs. UConn.

LOHR GETS SEC DEFENSIVE LINE WEEKLY AWARD

Rob Lohr (R-Jr., DT) earned Southeastern Conference Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his performance in Vanderbilt's 24-21 victory over Connecticut.

Lohr, who contributed four tackles for loss in the victory, was selected over several SEC standouts. Two other Commodores, **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Fr., DE), also were nominated for the league's weekly defensive recognition.

Lohr's four tackles for loss was the most by a 'Dore defender since linebacker Jamie Winborn contributed five tackles resulting in losses during a 43-20 against No. 6 Florida on Nov. 4, 2000.

Lohr becomes the first Vanderbilt defensive player to earn SEC weekly honors since defensive back **D.J. Moore** was recognized after the Commodores' 31-24 victory over Kentucky on Nov. 15, 2008.



WINNING THE TURNOVER MARGIN STAT

Vanderbilt has started the 2011 season exactly the way it wanted in turnover margin, a statistic that has been a dependable indicator of team success for the Commodores.

The Commodores are plus 4 in turnover margin through two games, forcing two fumbles and picking off five passes. On offense, Vanderbilt has lost three turnovers: one fumble and a pair of interceptions.

The forced turnovers have directly led to 35 Vanderbilt points, including interception returns for touchdowns by **Trey Wilson** (DB, Jr.) and **Casey Hayward** (DB, Sr.).

On Saturday, the Commodores scored one play after **Kenny Ladler** (safety, So.) picked off a pass early in the first quarter. The 'Dores last touchdown came on Hayward's return.

After two weeks of the season, the Commodores rank among the Southeastern Conference and NCAA leaders. They top the SEC and are tied for 10th nationally in the category.

Since arriving on campus, Coach Franklin has talked about the need to force turnovers while protecting the ball on offense. In 2010, his Maryland Terrapins' squad rode a positive turnover margin (+15) to a 9-4 record and Military Bowl victory. On the flip side, Vanderbilt finished the 2010 season with a negative turnover margin (-4) and disappointing 2-10 record.

In 2008, the Commodores' 7-6 season and Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl victory were aided by a positive turnover margin (+9).

FOUR COMMODORES FACE PREP TEAMMATES

Four Commodores will face prep teammates this Saturday when Ole Miss visits Nashville.

DeAndre Jones (R-Jr., LB) was a teammate of Ole Miss' **Barry Brunetti** (So., QB) at Memphis University School.

Steven Clarke (So., DB) played in the same secondary at powerful Boyd Anderson H.S. in Lauderdale Lakes, Fla., as Ole Miss' **Cliff Coleman** (R-Fr., DB).

Chase White (R-Fr., OL) was classmates with Ole Miss' **John Pelozo** (R-Fr., TE) at Plano (Texas) West H.S.

Barron Dixon (Fr., DT) went to the same school (Chattahoochee HS near Atlanta) as Ole Miss senior DT **Justin Smith**.

Vanderbilt has won four of the past six games – between the teams.

The 'Dores have won the last four meetings against the Rebels played in September, outscoring them by an average of 10.5 ppg. during the span.

The only team that Vanderbilt has played more than Ole Miss (86th meeting on Saturday) is Tennessee (89).

KEY GAMES IN THE OLE MISS SERIES

2010 Warren Norman scored on a 80-yard carry to seal a road victory for the Commodores. Vanderbilt jumped out to a 14-0 early lead after Zac Stacy's 35-yard TD rush and a 21-yard interception return by Eddie Foster.

2008 The Commodore defense forces six turnovers, helping Vanderbilt edge the Rebels 23-17 in Oxford. Safety Ryan Hamilton earns national player of the week honors after tying a school record with three INTs. The victory is saved when LB Chris Marve forces a Rebel fumble into the end-zone as Ole Miss appears ready to take a lead in the closing minutes.

2007 Vanderbilt used 119 rushing yards and three TDs by Cassen Jackson-Garrison to record a 31-17 victory on campus. It was the Commodores' second straight home win.

2005 Vanderbilt used touchdowns by Jeff Jennings and Cassen Jackson-Garrison to take a 24-3 third quarter lead before Ole Miss came back with 20 straight points to narrow the margin to 24-23. In the fourth quarter, Jay Cutler guided a game-clinching touchdown drive. With :01 left, Moses Osemwegie sealed the Commodore win with a quarterback sack and forced fumble.

2003 The Commodores received career performances by a pair of sophomores – Cutler and WR Erik Davis – during a narrow loss in Nashville. Cutler posted highs in completions (20) and passing yards (248) while Davis set a best with 138 receiving yards.

2002 Freshman RB/KR Kwane Doster posted one of the most productive offensive games in Vanderbilt and SEC history, compiling 344 all-purpose yards, including 101 yards rushing and a league-record 243 yards in kickoff returns.

1997 Vanderbilt came out on top in overtime 37-34, giving the 'Dores its first SEC road win in five years. Greg Zolman threw for 344 yards, including a last-minute tying touchdown to WR Todd Yoder and a game-clinching pass to Elliott Carson in overtime.

OLE MISS OFF. COORDINATOR HAS VANDY TIES

Ole Miss offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **David Lee** was a standout for one of the finest Vanderbilt teams of the modern era.

Lee was a three-year letterwinner at quarterback for the 1974 Commodores that posted a 7-3-1 regular season record en route to the Peach Bowl in Atlanta. Lee served as team captain on the squad and was named the team's MVP after throwing for 1,173 yards. Three years after graduating, Lee returned to Vanderbilt as QB coach in 1977.

2010 VANDERBILT-OLE MISS GAME RECAP

OXFORD, Miss. – Warren Norman rushed for 111 yards, including an 80-yard touchdown, as Vanderbilt beat Ole Miss 28-14 for coach Robbie Caldwell's first career win.

Vanderbilt (1-2, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) snapped a 10-game conference losing streak dating back to 2008. The 'Dores have beaten the Rebels four of the past six seasons.

It was Norman's third career 100-yard rushing game, and his first against an SEC opponent. The Commodores did most of their damage on the ground, rushing for 227 yards.

Vanderbilt lived off big plays all afternoon. The Commodores scored their first three touchdowns on 35-yard touchdown run by Zac Stacy, a 21-yard interception return by Eddie Foster and the biggest of all -- Norman's 80-yard touchdown run that gave them the lead for good.

Norman's touchdown came at a critical juncture. Ole Miss (1-2, 1-1) had just tied the scored at 14-14 when the 5-foot-10, 195-pound sophomore scored on Vanderbilt's first play from scrimmage, running untouched for the longest run of his career and the second-longest run in school history.

Commodore Notes

COMMODORE DEFENSE: PRODUCING POINTS

The Vanderbilt defense has made sure that James Franklin's preseason prediction that the Commodores would produce points off defensive plays.

The Commodores have used explosive defensive plays resulting in quick touchdowns during wins over Elon and Connecticut.

One week after **Trey Wilson** (DB, Jr.) took an interception 21 yards for a score over Elon, **Casey Hayward** (DB, Sr.) went 50 yards on the fourth quarter pick against UConn to knot the score at 21-21. One series later, Vanderbilt produced the game-deciding points – **Carey Spear's** 31-yard field.

It marked the first time in more than a decade that Vanderbilt scored defensive touchdowns in consecutive games. In 1999, **Nate Morrow** returned a fumble 65 yards for a score and **Lamont Turner** had a 59-yard interception return for another TD in consecutive games against The Citadel and Georgia.

SUPERLATIVES & NOTES FROM VICTORY OVER CONNECTICUT

- The fourth quarter comeback victory was Vanderbilt's first since defeating Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl on Dec. 31, 2008.

- In just his second game as the team's placekicking specialist, sophomore **Carey Spear** became the first Commodore kicker to convert a game-winning field goal late in the fourth quarter since Bryant Hahnfeldt's 45-yarder sealed Vanderbilt's bowl win over Boston College. Spear is now 2-for-2 in field goals this year.

- The Commodore defense limited Connecticut to just 193 yards on 65 plays. The Huskies managed just 91 total yards after the opening stanza.

The last time Vanderbilt held a BCS opponent under 200 yards of total offense was when Ole Miss was limited to 179 total yards Oct. 7, 2006.

- **Jerron Seymour** (Fr., RB) scored his first collegiate touchdown on a 40-yard scamper off right tackle. Seymour topped the team with 70 rushing yards and ranks second on the squad behind **Zac Stacy** with 85 yards through two games.

- Interceptions by **Javon Marshall** (R-So., safety), **Kenny Ladler** (So., safety) and **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) pushes the team season total to five picks. Vanderbilt is tied with Ole Miss for second in the SEC.

- The Commodore defense posted five quarterback sacks, and ranks first in the SEC after two weeks. **Tim Fugger** (R-Sr., DE) topped the unit with two sacks.

Through two weeks of action, Fugger's three-sack total also tops the conference.

- **John Cole** (R-Jr., WR) topped the receiving corps with three catches, good for 50 yards.
- **Chase Garnham** (So., LB) continues to impress as a first-year starter. Garnham's five-tackle total ranked second on the team.

Garnham also forced a fumble while contributing his first career quarterback sack. The fumble was recovered by **Vince Taylor** (R-Fr., DT).

- The Commodore career of **Chris Boyd** (R-Fr., WR) is off to a rousing start. After scoring on his first two career receptions against Elon, Boyd scored on his first of two catches Saturday – a 42-yard toss from Larry Smith (R-Sr., QB). nother to an amazing start to his Commodore career.

Boyd is the team leader with 87 receiving yards, and is averaging 21.8 yards per catch.

- The Vanderbilt defense limited Connecticut to just three third down conversions in 15 attempts (20 percent).

- **Richard Kent** (R-Jr., punter) contributed a career-long effort of 67 yards to switch field position in the third quarter.

- Besides contributing his first career interception, **Javon Marshall** (R-So., safety) matched a career high with four total tackles.

- **Chris Marve** (R-Sr., LB) topped the Commodores with seven total tackles, and set a single-game career high with two defended passes.

- The Commodores earned the win despite committing a season-high 11 infractions, resulting in 81 penalty yards.

- Early in the season, Vanderbilt has been a fast starter and strong finisher. The Commodores are outscoring opponents 21-3 in the first quarter and 31-8 in the fourth quarter.

BURROW'S CAREER ENDS

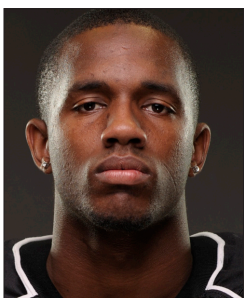
Jabo Burrow (R-Jr., OG) has played his final snap as a Commodore, Head Coach James Franklin said after the Connecticut game.

2011 CAPTAINS: MARVE, HAYWARD, SMITH, FISCHER, SPEARS GET TEAMMATES' VOTE

In late August, Vanderbilt players voted five teammates to serve as 2011 captains: **Kyle Fischer**, **Casey Hayward**, **Chris Marve**, **Larry Smith** and **Carey Spear**.

Fischer (R-Sr., OT) and Smith (R-Sr., QB) will serve on the offensive side; Hayward (Sr., CB) and Marve (R-Sr., LB) on defense; and Spear (So., PK) on special teams.

Fischer, Hayward, Smith and Spear are first-time co-captains. Marve served in the role last year.

FISCHER: A 27-game starter on the offensive line, Fischer accepted a greater leadership role last spring. As a senior, he has moved to right tackle after playing guard as a junior.

HAYWARD: The latest in a string of excellent Vandy defensive backs, Hayward ranks among the SEC active leaders in INTs (10) and enters the season with a team-leading 26 consecutive starts.

MARVE: A three-year starter and candidate for numerous postseason defensive awards, Marve is the SEC's active leader with 325 career

tackles. He also has a team-high 38 starts.

SMITH: The fifth-year senior has shown determination to improve technique since Franklin's arrival. Smith has jumped into the team's all-time Top Ten in passing early in the season.

SPEAR: After earning the placekicking duties in preseason, Spear is 2-2 this year in field goals, including a 31-yard game winner vs. UConn. The 'Dores will also name additional captains prior to each game.

VANDY RESULTS IN SEC OPENERS

Vanderbilt looks to return to winning ways in SEC Conference openers when it faces Ole Miss on campus Saturday.

Though just 5-20 in their last 25 SEC openers, the 'Dores are 2-4 since 2005, having defeated South Carolina at home (24-17, 2008) and Arkansas on the road (28-24, 2005).

The Commodores lost at LSU, 27-3, in their 2010 conference opener.

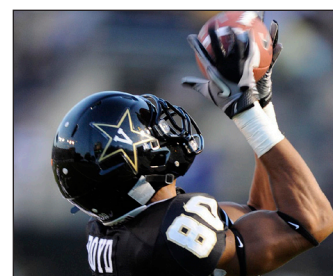

COMMODORES INTRODUCE BLACK HELMETS

After warming up in their traditional gold helmets, the Commodores returned to the field just minutes before kickoff Saturday donning new black helmets.

It marked the first time since the Watson Brown Era (1990) that Vanderbilt helmets were painted all black.



TWO MISSISSIPPI RESIDENTS ON VANDY ROSTER

The Vanderbilt player roster includes a pair of Mississippi products, **Vince Taylor** (R-Fr., DL) and **Jahmel McIntosh** (Fr., safety).

Taylor earned the first action of his Commodore career in the victory over Connecticut. Inserted at DT, Taylor quickly made his presence known, forcing a poor Huskie pass on third down. Later in the game, he recovered a Connecticut fumble for a Vanderbilt turnover.

McIntosh is a freshman at Vanderbilt after playing at Cleveland H.S.

OL: FAMILIAR FACES, NEW POSITIONS

Early in the 2011 season, the Vanderbilt offensive line has featured a bunch of familiar jersey numbers lining up at unfamiliar positions.

Three 2010 starters – **Wesley Johnson** (R-So.), **Kyle Fischer** (R-Sr.) and **Ryan Seymour** (R-Jr.) – are playing new positions this year.

Johnson, an SEC All-Freshman pick last year at left tackle, moved inside to center. Seymour, an All-SEC candidate, shifted from right tackle to left tackle. Fischer, the team's most experienced lineman, moved from right guard to right tackle.

FRANKLIN FACTS

- When announced as the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, Franklin also became the first African-American to hold the Commodore position.
- Franklin is the first Vanderbilt coach to start his Commodore career 2-0 since Fred Pancoast in 1975.
- As a quarterback at East Stroudsburg, Franklin was a finalist for the NCAA Division II National Player of the Year.
- Regarded as a top recruiter, Franklin has been named among the nation's Top 25 recruiting coaches on multiple occasions by Rivals.com.
- Franklin is recognized as a noted quarterback mentor, having worked closely with Josh Freeman at Kansas State, and Danny O'Brien among others at Maryland. He also worked with several other top QBs, including Dan Marino and Donovan McNabb as a participant in the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship and Brett Favre as a Green Bay WR coach in 2005.
- Franklin's Kansas State offense in 2006 featured a rare triple accomplishment, producing a 1,000-yard rusher, 3,000-yard passer and 1,500-yard receiver.
- Franklin pupil Danny O'Brien earned ACC Rookie of the Year honors in 2010 after throwing for 2,438 yards and 22 touchdowns.

KEY MARYLAND STAFFERS JOIN FRANKLIN

Franklin enticed four key staffers from the University of Maryland to help turnaround the fortunes of Vanderbilt football.

- **DWIGHT GALT, Director of Performance Enhancement**
For years, Galt and Franklin talked about how they would manage a football program if given the opportunity. When Vanderbilt hired Franklin, the lifetime Maryland man jumped at the chance to join him. For 27 years, Galt poured his passion into the Terp program. Since 1993, he had served as its director of strength & conditioning.
- **JEMAL GRIFFIN, Chief of Staff**
Griffin served as Maryland's Director of Football Operations for the last three years. He worked closely with Franklin, the Terps' assistant head coach/offensive coordinator during the same period.
- **JOHN DONOVAN, Offensive Coordinator**
For the last three years, Donovan and Franklin spent many hours together, orchestrating the Maryland offensive attack.
- **CHARLES BANKINS, Special Teams Coordinator**
Bankins joined Franklin and Donovan in 2009, working as the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.

Franklin...Building Interest Since Arriving on Campus

FRANKLIN INTRODUCED IN NASHVILLE ★ Dec. 17, 2010

James Franklin is introduced as Vanderbilt's 27th head football coach in a press conference held in the Board of Trust Room at Sarratt Student Center. At 39, the former assistant head coach/offensive coordinator at Maryland becomes the youngest Vandy head coach in nearly two decades.

FRANKLIN: "It's time that this football program starts reflecting everything else on this campus, and that's a commitment to excellence. I'm not a six-and-five guy, and I'm not a seven-and-five guy. There's going to be high expectations from day one. There is no part of this program that will settle. Everything we do will be about championships."

FRANKLIN ANNOUNCES OFFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 13, 2011

The head coach announces the hirings of his offensive coaches, including new coordinator John Donovan, and Dwight Galt, the man who will guide the Commodores' conditioning program. He also names key administrators in the football office.

FRANKLIN: "We're really laying the foundation right now with the offensive staff, the administrative staff, the strength coach, to put together what my focus is on, which is to build the best staff in the country. When I say that, I'm talking about people that are passionate about being at Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN INTRODUCED AT BASKETBALL GAME ★ Jan. 20, 2011

Franklin takes the floor during halftime of the men's basketball game against Ole Miss in Memorial Gymnasium, asking students and fans for their support for the football team in the coming months.

FRANKLIN: "We have a plan; we have a vision for what this program could be, but we can't do it alone. We need everybody's support. We need this community, we need this campus to come together and unite more than it ever has before."

FRANKLIN NAMES DEFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 31, 2011

Four defensive coaches are named to fill out Franklin's staff: defensive coordinator and safeties coach Bob Shoop, linebackers coach and co-defensive coordinator Brent Pry, secondary coach Wes McGriff and defensive line coach Sean Spencer.

NATIONAL SIGNING DAY ★ Feb. 2, 2011

Fueled by a strong finish to recruiting, Franklin lands 21 signees coming from 13 states. The class, which includes a pair of 4-star prospects, is touted as Vanderbilt's most talented class in years.

FRANKLIN TO AUDIENCE OF FANS: "Basically, this staff was not going to take 'no' for an answer. We told every recruit that. We would go into their homes and tell them reasons they should come and tell their family. In the end, we would look them in the eye and tell them we weren't taking 'no' for an answer and they were coming to Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN STAGES STUDENT TRYOUTS ★ Feb. 15, 2011

After visiting dorms and fraternity row, Franklin personally conducts tryouts for the Vanderbilt student body to make the team's spring roster. Seventeen students participated in the tryouts. Eventually, six students would join the team for spring drills.

FRANKLIN GUIDES SPRING DRILLS ★ March 18, 2011

Franklin oversees his first spring practice as head coach at the John Rich Practice Facility on campus. During the ensuing 14 practices, Franklin puts his stamp on the Commodore program: upbeat, energetic, disciplined, physical and positive.

THOUSANDS ATTEND SPRING GAME ★ April 17, 2011

The 'Dores conclude a month of drills with the Black and Gold Spring Game in Vanderbilt Stadium. The Black Team comes away with a 19-7 victory in front of a large and enthusiastic crowd. It marks the first spring intrasquad game on campus in more than 10 years. A fireworks display caps the spring finale.

OPENS FIRST PRESEASON AS HEAD COACH ★ Aug. 5, 2011

Pushing for an ultra-competitive atmosphere, Franklin tells team that every starting job will be decided during preseason camp. High energy is the theme through team's August drills. Franklin eyes a bigger picture – changing the expectations of all associated with Vanderbilt football.

POSTS WINS IN FIRST TWO VANDY GAMES ★ September, 2011

Franklin becomes the first new Vandy coach to win his opening two games since Fred Pancoast did it nearly three decades ago.

2008-10 MARYLAND (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

On December 23, 2007, Ralph Friedgen sways Franklin back to Maryland as the Terps' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. In February 2009, Friedgen designates Franklin as his successor at Maryland... The Terrapins go 9-4 overall in 2010, finishing second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and winning the Military Bowl... Quarterback Danny O'Brien earns ACC Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors under Franklin's mentorship, ranking third nationally among freshmen in pass efficiency rating... O'Brien throws for 22 touchdowns against only eight picks after becoming the team's starter in Week Four... Franklin's 2010 offense ranks among the nation's best in limiting turnovers... Torrey Smith also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... In 2008, the Terps defeat four ranked teams en route to a win in the Humanitarian Bowl to cap an 8-5 record. Terp WR Darrius Heyward-Bey becomes No. 9 overall pick of the 2009 NFL Draft.

2006-07 KANSAS STATE (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

As K-State's offensive coordinator, Franklin helps the Wildcats to a 7-6 record in 2006, including a 45-42 win over No. 4 Texas. Kansas State also plays in the Texas Bowl, its first postseason appearance in three years... In 2007, under Franklin's guidance, K-State offense becomes first in team history to feature a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season... SEEKING PAIR OF BOWL APPEARANCES

Nine Commodore returnees are trying to achieve something no other Vanderbilt letterwinner can claim: become the team's first players to make multiple postseason bowl appearances.

The current players – **Brandon Barden** (TE), **Tim Fugger** (DE), **T.J. Greenstone** (DT), **Casey Hayward** (DB), **Josh Jelesky** (OL), **Chris Marve** (LB), **Sean Richardson** (safety), **Larry Smith** (QB) and **Udom Umoh** (WR) – played in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, a 16-14 victory over Boston College.

Several of the current 'Dores played pivotal roles in the postseason win. It marked the first career start for Smith at quarterback. Marve also started and finished with a team-high 10 tackles. Richardson made one of the biggest plays of the game, recovering a fumbled punt for a touchdown. Hayward played much of the game in place of an injured D.J. Moore. Umoh posted the first three catches of his career.

RECORDS FOR FIRST-YEAR 'DORE COACHES

James Franklin, the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history, became the first coach in 36 years to register victories in his first two games on the Commodore sideline.

Franklin has guided Vanderbilt to a 45-14 victory over Elon on Sept. 3 and an impressive 24-21 come-from-behind win over UConn on Sept. 10.

The last new coach to guide Vanderbilt to wins in his first two games was Fred Pancoast in 1975.

On Saturday, Franklin will try to join elusive company vs. Ole Miss. Excluding the abbreviated 1943 season during World War II, no first-year Vanderbilt head coach since College Football Hall of Famer Dan McGugin in 1904 has owned a 3-0 record in his opening season.

Pancoast is also the only Vanderbilt first-year coach since WWII to achieve a winning record in his initial year (7-5 in 1975).

Larry Smith (R-Sr., QB) joined the Vanderbilt top ten for career passing yardage during the win over Connecticut.

Smith, a two-year starter, passed Mackenzi Adams (2006-09) on the yardage list by passing for 140 yards vs. the Huskies. He also ranks No. 8 all-time in pass attempts (559) and No. 9 all-time in completions (267).

Coming off a confidence-building preseason camp where he was elected as an offensive co-captain, Smith could reach the team's all-time Top 5 in several categories with an outstanding season.

Last Saturday, Smith was 12 of 24 for 140 yards and a TD despite being sacked seven times by the UConn defense.

HAYWARD: OFF TO SENSATIONAL CAMPAIGN

Casey Hayward (Sr., DB) is off to an sensational 2011 season.

Hayward has an interception in both of Vanderbilt's early-season games, returning a critical pick in the fourth quarter against UConn that he returned 50 yards for his first career return for a score. The touchdown tied the score for Vanderbilt.

The performance earned Hayward National Defensive Back of the Week honors from the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA).

Hayward, a first-team All-SEC preseason recipient, is tied for ninth all-time among 'Dores with 10 career interceptions. Hewill join three others – **Reshard Langford** (2005-08), **Manuel Young** (1981-84) and **Christie Hauck** (1967-69) – with his next pick.

He is five interceptions shy of matching the team record of 15 picks set by All-American **Leonard Coleman** accomplished in the early 1980s.

MARVE, HAYWARD TOP SQUAD IN STARTS

Chris Marve (R-Sr., LB) has started more games than any other position player on the 2011 Commodore roster. The All-SEC candidate and two-time defensive co-captain made his 38th career start when Vanderbilt defeated Connecticut last Saturday.

Brandon Barden (R-Sr., TE) ranks second on the team with 32 starts, followed by **Kyle Fischer** (R-Sr., OL) with 27 starts. Four other veterans – **John Cole** (R-Jr., WR), **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB), **Sean Richardson** (Sr., safety) and **Udom Umoh** (R-Sr., WR) – have at least 21 career starts. One specialist, **Ryan Fowler** (R-Jr., PK) also has at least 20 starts.

Hayward leads the team with 26 consecutive starts entering this season. He is followed by Barden (20), Richardson (20) and Fischer (19). Four other 'Dores – **Wesley Johnson** (R-So., OL), **Richard Kent** (R-Jr., punter) and **Rob Lohr** (R-Jr., DT) – have started 14 consecutive games.

LINEBACKER CHRIS MARVE 12TH IN CAREER TACKLES

Chris Marve, a two-time All-Southeastern Conference linebacker for the Commodores, is nearing the team's all-time Top Ten for career tackles.

Marve posted a team-high seven tackles and two key defended passes in Vanderbilt's win over Connecticut, one week after garnering a team-high 12 tackles in the Commodores' season opener vs. Elon.

Marve has 16 career games with at least 10 total tackles, tops on the team.

Marve needs 25 tackles to pass 1970s standout **Randy Sittason** for 11th all-time, and 34 stops to reach the the Top Ten.

Marve will need to continue his first-game performance to challenge the team's top three career tacklers:

Andrew Coleman (458), **Joe Staley** (443) and **Chris Gaines** (440).

The Memphis product has been named to the preseason watch list for several prestigious honors, including the Nagurski Trophy, the Bednarik Award, Lombardi and Butkus Award. He also is a candidate for the Lott IMPACT Trophy.

A two-time defensive captain who has worked in Vanderbilt's Admissions Office and interned with a Nashville law firm, Marve is coming off a sub-par season. Marve garnered 80 stops last year while nursing an injury. Marve posted more than 100 tackles as a freshman and sophomore.

The team's second leading tackler, **Sean Richardson** (Sr., safety) passed the 200-tackle plateau vs. Connecticut. With 201 career tackles, Richardson can reach the Top 25 career list with 28 tackles.

James Franklin is one of 13 NCAA FBS coaches across the nation who will be directing their first game as a head coach this season.

Vanderbilt is one of 24 programs entering the year with a new head coach.

Franklin, regarded as one of the nation's top offensive minds following successful coordinator tenures at Maryland and Kansas State, was named as Vanderbilt's 27th head coach last December.

Franklin is also one of two new head coaches in the Southeastern Conference, joining Will Muschamp of Florida. This is also Muschamp's first year as a collegiate head coach.

FORMER COACH MACINTYRE HONORED SEPT. 10

Former Vanderbilt Head Coach **George MacIntyre** was honored during halftime of the Connecticut game for his incredible contribution to the legacy of Commodore football and also to assist in raising awareness within the Commodore community for finding a cure to multiple sclerosis.

Coach MacIntyre, a longtime resident of Nashville, was known throughout his coaching career as a powerful motivator and infectious personality. Those qualities have never been more apparent than in his current battle with multiple sclerosis.

More than 50 of MacIntyre's former players joined Vanderbilt Athletics officials during the on-field ceremony.

"Coach Mac," as he's been known throughout much of his career, served as head coach of the Commodores from 1979-1985 and led Vanderbilt to some of the university's biggest victories. In 1982, MacIntyre's team upset 14th-ranked Florida 31-29 and went on to finish the season 8-3 with an appearance in the Hall of Fame Bowl. That year, he received the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award, the *Sporting News* College Football Coach of the Year and the SEC Coach of the Year. The eight wins posted in 1982 were the most wins posted by a Commodore team since 1955 and a mark that has not been matched since.

After leaving Vanderbilt, MacIntyre went on to a successful business career before returning to the coaching ranks as an assistant coach at Liberty University when in 1997 he was forced to retire after being diagnosed with primary progressive multiple sclerosis. In the subsequent years, Coach Mac has continued to serve as an inspiration to his former players and fellow coaches.

A group of those former players came together earlier this year with the hopes of honoring MacIntyre for his contributions to Vanderbilt and the local community. In conjunction with the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and the athletic department, this group of former players and colleagues has worked to raise awareness and money in Coach Mac's honor in the fight against MS.

The infectious personality and strong will continue to resonate today from Coach Mac, who still serves as a motivator and inspiration for former players, coaches and friends that visit him at his home in Nashville.

On defense, seven starters from a year ago should be in the starting unit vs. Elon. They are **Tim Fugger** (DE), **Rob Lohr** (DT), **Colt Nichter** (DT), **Chris Marve** (LB), **Casey Hayward** (CB) and **Sean Richardson** (safety).

Four other starters – **Zac Stacy** (RB), **Jordan Matthews** (WR), **Austin Monahan** (TE) and **Johnell Thomas** (DE) – also started games last year.

A number of other position players that played key roles for the Commodores in the opener also have multiple career starts, including **John Cole** (WR), **Jonathan Krause** (WR), **Eddie Foster** (CB), **T.J. Greenstone** (DT), **Andre Hal** (CB) and **Kenny Ladler** (safety).

VANDERBILT VS. RECENT NON-SEC OPPONENTS

After defeating Elon (45-14) and Connecticut (24-21) early in the season, Vanderbilt is 11-8 against non-Southeastern Conference opponents in the last five years.
