

QUOTING CORBIN \* Jack bolstered our pitching staff last year as a weekend starter and I expect that he will be in that role again this year. There are not many kids out there that possess the athleticism and pitching tools that Jack does. He continues to make strides every time we give him the baseball. He was the winner of our Omaha Challenge for the pitchers as well.

2010 \* Finished his sophomore year 7-4 with a 4.71 ERA in 16 starts... His 16 starts and seven wins were tied for the second-most on the club... Was 2-for-3 with two RBI as a pinch-hitter... Tagged for four runs on four hits in just 1.1 innings against Florida State in the final game of the NCAA Super Regional (6/13)... Allowed three runs on one hit while walking a careerhigh six batters in four innings against Illinois State at the NCAA Regional (6/6)... Handed second straight loss allowing five runs, four earned on four hits in 4.1 innings against Florida in elimination game at the SEC Tournament (5/28)... There are not many kids who possess the size, arm strength and catching ability that Curt does. Besides being a quality catcher, Curt has distinguished himself as one of the better offensive players in our league. He will start for us behind the plate and hit in the middle of our order.


