



2010 SEASON REVIEW

The 2010 season saw Vanderbilt enjoy one of the most successful campaigns in school history with the team winning 46 games, second-most in VU history, and advancing to the school's second-ever Super Regional falling one game shy of Vanderbilt's first trip to the College World Series.

February 21-23 – The Commodores open the season with a four-game homestand against Niagara and Austin Peay pummeling Niagara in a three-game series (46-5) and escaping against the Govs of Austin Peay (2-1 in 11 innings). Vanderbilt set season-highs against Niagara with 21 runs scored and 24 hits on February 21.

February 26-28 – Vanderbilt heads west for the Dodgertown Classic playing UCLA, USC and Oklahoma State. UCLA pitcher Gerrit Cole dominates the Dores in a 9-2 Bruins victory. However, Vandy rebounds to beat USC (10-1) and takes down Oklahoma State (7-6) in Dodger Stadium.

March 3-17 – The Dores flip the calendar and enjoy a nine-game homestand eventually running their Hawkins Field winning streak to 12 games before being hammered by Western Kentucky 17-2 on a Tuesday night. The Commodores scored revenge the next night at Western Kentucky beating the Hilltoppers 17-6 to improve to 15-2 on the year.

March 19-21 – Southeastern Conference play begins with a three-game series at No. 21 Alabama. The Crimson Tide win the first two games of the series but the Dores escape with a Sunday win to avoid the sweep.

March 26-28 – Another weekend in the SEC and another ranked team on the schedule. The Commodores welcome 21st ranked Kentucky to Hawkins Field for the first SEC home weekend of the year. VU sweeps the Wildcats running their winning streak to five games and eventually seven games with a two-game sweep of Wofford the following week.

April 2-4 – Vanderbilt travels to No. 8 Florida and barely escapes a sweep with the Gators winning the first two games. The Commodores respond with a 7-0 shutout victory on Sunday to move to 5-4 in the SEC.

April 9-11 – Hawkins Field welcomes eventual national champion and eighth ranked South Carolina to Nashville. Two of the three games are tight with the Gamecocks claiming both games. Fortunately, the Dores win the Saturday contest 8-2.

April 16-18 – For the fifth straight weekend the Commodores play a ranked opponent with 23rd ranked Auburn visiting Nashville. Vanderbilt takes two-of-three to win their second SEC series of the year and first since sweeping Kentucky.

April 21 – Head Coach Tim Corbin moves into second on the Commodores all-time wins list with the team's 31st win of the year, an 11-10 victory at Middle Tennessee State. Corbin passes former coach Larry Schmittou and now trails only longtime coach Roy Mewbourne.

April 23-25 – For the first time since mid-March the Commodores do not play a ranked opponent on the weekend when they visit Tennessee. After winning the Friday night game, however, the Vols sweep a Sunday doubleheader to win the series and hand the Dores their third SEC series loss of the year.

April 30 – After a mid-week loss at Austin Peay, Vandy bounces back to hammer Georgia 17-5 on Friday night. Mother Nature ends the series there, though, dropping 13.5 inches of rain on the Nashville-area over the next two days and flooding the city. The rainfall more than doubles the previous record with damages estimated at \$1.5 billion.

May 7-9 – Not having played in a week, the Commodores hit the road to visit No. 15 LSU and the new Alex Box Stadium. The Tigers squeak out a 16-15 win in 10 innings on Friday night but Vanderbilt rebounds to win the next two games and leaves Baton Rouge with a 12-10 SEC record.

May 11 – A midweek game with eighth-ranked Louisville turns into an epic, 17-inning, five hour, 33 minute affair that sees sophomore Jason Esposito hit a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 17th to give the Dores an 11-10 victory. Freshman Anthony Gomez sets the school record with nine at-bats and the team sets records in at-bats (64), put outs (51) and assists (22). Dubbed Nashville Flood Relief, VU raises over \$20,000 for the Red Cross.

May 14-16 – The Commodores run their winning streak to five games with a three-game series sweep at Mississippi State. Sophomore Jason Esposito again writes his name in the school's record book reaching base in 15 consecutive at-bats with eight hits and seven walks over the three-game set.

May 20-22 – Back at Hawkins Field for the final weekend of the regular season the Dores welcome in 14th-ranked Arkansas. Vandy wins the series opener behind sophomore Sonny Gray's solid, eight-inning performance but the Razorbacks rally to win the final two games and leave the Commodores with a 40-15 mark at the end of the regular season.

May 26 – In an ironic twist, Vanderbilt opens the SEC Tournament with Arkansas. Sophomore Sonny Gray rises up again to hold the Hogs in check, this time tossing seven scoreless innings and leading the Commodores to a 2-0 opening round win.

May 27 – Up next for Vandy in the second round was LSU, who jumped on the Dores early with three runs in the first inning and never trailed. Two runs in the bottom of the ninth made it interesting but the Tigers claim a 7-5 win.

May 28 – In their third day in Hoover, Ala. Vanderbilt faces No. 4 Florida in a win-or-go-home scenario. The Gators send the Commodores home with a 5-2 Florida win.

June 4 – The Dores make their fifth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament and sixth appearance under Head Coach Tim Corbin. The Commodores draw Illinois State, who Vanderbilt beat 9-2 at Hawkins Field in early March, in the opening round of the Louisville Regional. The game turns into another epic affair lasting 13 innings before the Dores emerge victorious 8-7.

June 5 – Regional host and ninth-ranked Louisville dominates the Dores in the second round winning 7-1, beating up sophomore Sonny Gray along the way for seven runs, six earned, on nine hits in 7.1 innings.

June 6 – Vanderbilt enters the third day of the regional hoping to play two games in order to earn a chance to win the regional. The Commodores waste little time disposing of Illinois State scoring four runs in the first three innings before piling on five in the ninth en route to a 10-4 win. Host Louisville was up next and the Dores receive an amazing performance from an unexpected source in junior Richie Goodenow. The lefty tosses a complete game shutout allowing only two hits on 99 pitches to set up a championship showdown between the two teams the next day.

June 7 – The Commodores and Cardinals find themselves in the same situation in 2010 as they did in 2009. Although this time with a different outcome, Louisville beat Vandy in the 2009 regional but the Dores scratch out a 3-2 win in 10 innings on freshman Connor Harrell's suicide squeeze in the bottom of the 10th inning. The win delivers the school's second-ever regional championship. During the game senior shortstop Brian Harris sets an NCAA record after being hit by a pitch for the 36th time on the year.

June 11 – Vanderbilt travels to Tallahassee to take on Florida State in a best-of-three series with the winner going to the College World Series. The Seminoles jump out to an early 6-0 lead after two innings but the Commodores battle back to take the lead in the eighth inning. The lead was short lived, however, with FSU scoring in the eighth and eventually winning the game on a walk-off home run from Mike McGee in the bottom of the ninth.

June 12 – The Commodores recover from a tough loss the day before to win 6-2 behind sophomore pitchers Sonny Gray and Grayson Garvin. Gray turns in six solid innings to earn the win and Garvin tosses three scoreless innings to earn the save and set up a winner-take-all game three.

June 13 – Again Florida State jumps out to an early lead, this time thanks to a four-run second inning. And once more Vanderbilt battles back drawing within a run of the Seminoles in the bottom of the ninth. However, with the tying run on first base the Commodores' season comes to an end when FSU's Mike McGee strikes out sophomore Joe Loftus.

Following the season freshman Anthony Gomez is named to the All-SEC first team and Freshman All-America first team. Sophomore Sonny Gray is selected as an All-SEC second team pitcher and wins a Rawlings Gold Glove Award. Freshman Connor Harrell is recognized on the All-SEC Freshman Team and sophomore Aaron Westlake is an All-SEC Tournament selection.

In June six Commodores hear their name called in the Major League Baseball Draft. Pitchers Drew Hayes (11th, Cincinnati), Taylor Hill (30th, Cleveland), Russell Brewer (31st, Colorado) and Chase Reid (41st, St. Louis) join position players Aaron Westlake (22nd, Toronto) and Andrew Giobbi (32nd, Seattle). Westlake and Hill choose to return to school while Hayes, Brewer, Reid and Giobbi begin their professional careers.
