MASON LOOKS FOR MORE IMPROVEMENT IN SQUAD

Head coach **Derek Mason** will welcome an eager Vanderbilt squad with plenty to prove when he starts his fifth season on campus this August.

Forty-five letterwinners from the 2017 squad, including 16 position players who started multiple games, are expected to greet Mason when preseason camp opens Aug. 2. The returnees include seven position starters and 22 letterwinners on offense, four starters and 22 letterwinners on defense and two letterwinners back on special teams.

The 2018 Commodores will look to improve off a 2017 campaign which begins with impressive wins over Middle Tennessee, Alabama A&M and nationally-ranked Kansas State. After struggling following back-to-back losses to eventual national champion Alabama and national runner-up Georgia, the Dores capped the season with a 42-24 victory at Tennessee.

Mason believes Vanderbilt fans will find plenty to support from an energetic and focused roster which features 62 freshmen and sophomores.

"I'm excited to get back on the practice field and I know our players are ready to get back to work," Mason said. "Every player and coach is focused and committed to getting better. Our veterans have been leading and the buy-in from our younger players has been outstanding. Everybody's rowing in the same direction, with the goal of winning games and representing Vanderbilt University to our very best."

Off the field, Mason has strengthened his staff by adding four new coaches: **Jason Tarver** (defensive coordinator/outside linebackers), **Shawn Mennenga** (special teams coordinator); **Aaron Moorehead** (wide receivers) and **Terrence Brown** (cornerbacks).

The team enters its fourth year with head strength coach **James Dobson**, whose program has dramatically improved conditioning, strength and power throughout the Commodore roster.

KEYS TO COMMODORE SUCCESS

EFFICIENT, BALANCED ATTACK ON OFFENSE

With proven QB Kyle Shurmur leading an offense that features all five starters back on the offensive line, the Dores will look to create greater balance in order to maximize production. Limiting turnovers and improved red-zone efficiency will be critical.

CREATING MORE DEFENSIVE TURNOVERS

The message from new DC Jason Tarver has been clear: create turnovers with physical, opportunistic play. Tarver's motto – just get off the field, with a premium on third-down & red-zone efficiency.

The offense features standout quarterback and All-SEC candidate **Kyle Shurmur**, wide receiver **Kalija Lipscomb**, tight end **Jared Pinkney** and linemen **Devin Cochran**, **Egidio DellaRipa**, **Bruno Reagan**, **Justin Skule** and **Saige Young**.

Top defensive returnees include outside linebacker **Charles Wright**, cornerback **Joejuan Williams**, safety **LaDarius Wiley**, and brothers **Dare** and **Dayo Odeyingbo**.

Vanderbilt hosts Middle Tennessee in the opener at Vanderbilt Stadium on Sept. 1. The 2018 slate features six more games on campus: Nevada on Sept. 8, South Carolina on Sept. 22, Tennessee State on Sept. 29, Florida on Oct. 13, Ole Miss on Nov. 17 and Tennessee on Nov. 18.

OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

STARTERS BACK: 2 LETTERWINNERS: 6

One of the most prolific quarterbacks in Commodore history returns for his final season to lead the Vanderbilt offense.

While quarterback **Kyle Shurmur** (Sr.) enters his final season within reach of virtually every Commodore career passing mark, his main objective is to efficiently direct the balanced offense managed by **Andy Ludwig**, who enters his fourth season as offensive coordinator.

Shurmur is coming off one of the finest seasons ever by a Vanderbilt

quarterback. In 2017, he smashed a school record by throwing for 26 touchdowns. He also passed for 2,823 yards, the third-highest season total ever by a Commodore. Shurmur looks to build on his 2017 formula for success – creating more explosive plays while limiting turnovers.

Quarterback coach **Gerry Gdowski** lacks experience behind Shurmur. Sophomore transfer **Mo Hasan** and freshman **Allan Walters** will back up Shurmur.

At running back, several talented prospects are ready to face the challenge of replacing all-time leading rusher Ralph Webb, who is currently competing for a roster position with the New England Patriots.

Fifth-year contributor **Khari Blasingame** is the most experienced Dore returnee at running back. A physical back, Blasingame rushed for 596 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns as Webb's top reserve the last two years.

Commodore fans are excited to see **Ke'Shawn Vaughn** (Jr.) in action this fall. The Nashville native transferred from Illinois, where he rushed for 1,024 yards and nine touchdowns in 2015-16.

Josh Crawford (Jr.) and **Jamauri Wakefield** (So.) also will get plenty of opportunities this August to earn a significant role in the rushing game.

Vanderbilt also added talented **Ja'Veon Marlow** in its 2018 signing class. **Jaire George** (Jr.) and **Josh Higgs** (So.) are fullbacks on the roster.

RECEIVING CORPS

STARTERS BACK: 2 LETTERWINNERS: 7

Two talented juniors with explosive abilities will highlight a new-look Commodore receiving corps this season.

The wide receiving unit, directed by first-year coach **Aaron Moorehead**, must replace three productive seniors from a year ago, including wideouts **CJ Duncan**, **Caleb Scott** and **Trent Sherfield**. The three graduates, who combined for 332 career catches, are competing for NFL roster spots.

Junior **Kalija Lipscomb** is the Commodores' top returning wide receiver. A potential All-Southeastern Conference performer, Lipscomb is on the path to becoming one of the top receivers in team history. He enters his third season with 64 receptions, good for 929 yards and 10 touchdowns.

In 2017, Lipscomb was one of VU's most productive aerial targets, catching 37 passes for 610 yards and a team-high eight touchdowns.

Trey Ellis (Grad.), **Donaven Tennyson** (Jr.), **Chris Pierce** (So.) and **Alex Stump** (Jr.) will look to fill the production void left by the departure of Duncan, Scott and Sherfield.

Tennyson looks to capitalize on his breakaway abilities in his third season. In 2017, he averaged 14.8

transferring to West End from Ohio State.

Other returnees at wide receiver are **Jackson Winrow** (So.), **James Bostic** (R-Fr.) and **Keithian Starling** (So.).

Vanderbilt also added three talented wide receivers in the 2018 signing class: **Amir Abdur-Rahman**, **CJ Bolar** and **Cam Johnson**.

The Commodores will feature one of the SEC's top tight end targets in **Jared Pinkney**. After catching 22 passes for 279 yards and three touchdowns last year, the physical junior could be in for a breakout campaign this season.

Senior **Sam Dobbs** also is a viable receiving target at tight end. In 2017, he posted eight receptions.

Two sophomores, **Cody Markel** and **Braden Kopp**, look to bring physicality to the Commodore rushing attack from the tight end position. Another sophomore, **Turner Cockrell**, adds a receiving threat at the position.

The Commodores also added two tight ends in their 2018 signing class: **Ben Bresnahan** and **Gavin Schoenwald**.

OFFENSIVE LINE

STARTERS BACK: 5 LETTERWINNERS: 6

One year after lacking veteran experience and leadership on the offensive front, Vanderbilt enters this season with all five starters and a top reserve returning and several young prospects ready to break into the Commodore rotation.

Two seniors, **Justin Skule** and **Bruno Reagan**, anchor assistant coach **Cameron Norcross**'s offensive line. Both Skule and Reagan are productive two-year starters who have played multiple positions during their Commodore careers.

Skule put together a solid campaign protecting Kyle Shurmur's blindside. A 27-game career starter, Skule should be formidable against oncoming pass rushers after playing his first full season at left tackle.

The sophomore provided a physical presence as a first-year starter in 2017.

Reagan is one of the Commodores' most versatile linemen. After starting at guard as a sophomore and at center as a junior, the coaching staff shifted him back to guard during spring drills.

Devin Cochran (So.) could be the Commodores' most athletic lineman. Blessed with a huge frame, Cochran started 10 games at right tackle as a redshirt freshman.

Junior **Saige Young** filled a big uncertainty at guard last year, showing an excellent combination of physicality and agility as a first-year starter.

Senior **Egidio DellaRipa**, who started the last eight games at guard last year, spent the spring taking over for Reagan at center.

Jared Southers (Jr.) started four games last year, and provides more veteran experience at the guard position. **Cole Clemens** returns after seeing playing time as a true freshman.

The coaches believe **Sean McMoore** (So.) also can push for the starting center position this summer.

David Floyd (Jr.) is a potential swing player at tackle or guard.

Three talented redshirt freshmen - **Bryce Bailey**, **Grant Miller** and **Jonathan Stewart** - also will compete for playing time this August.

The Commodores also added three new offensive line prospects, two coming in the 2018 signing class and a third arriving as a transfer from California. They are **Dan Dawkins Jr.** (Fr.), **Carlton Lorenz** (So.) and **Tyler Steen** (Fr.).

DEFENSIVE LINE

STARTERS BACK: 1 LETTERWINNERS: 7

A bevy of newcomers and talented young players are expected to move into more important roles this fall on the VU defensive line.

Third-year coach **C.J. Ah You** will welcome seven returning letterwinners, a highly regarded graduate transfer and several newcomers to the defensive line playing mix.

The unit, which lost Nifae Lealao, Jay Woods and Jonathan Wynn to graduation, is headlined by **Dare Odeyingbo** (Sr.) and **Dayo Odeyingbo** (So.).

Dare Odeyingbo, who brings superb effort to the field, is coming off his best season as a Dore. In 2017, he started 11 of 12 games at defensive end, registering 36 tackles, 4.5 quarterback sacks, four hurries and a team-high 11 tackles for loss.

Dare's younger brother Dayo played as a true freshman in 2017. An imposing presence at defensive end, Dayo Odeyingbo finished with 20 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 quarterback sacks and an interception.

Depth at defensive end should be strengthened by attracting graduate transfer Louis Vecchio to campus. Recruited by Derek Mason out of high school, Vecchio was a first-team All-Ivy League contributor at Penn

in 2016-17, finishing his career there with 8.5 quarterback sacks and 21.5 tackles for loss among 83 total tackles.

The Commodores will feature several young defensive tackles who gained valuable experience in 2018, including **Drew Birchmeier** (R-So.), **Cameron Tidd** (R-So.), **Darion DeBrossard** (Jr.) and **Josiah Sa'o** (R-So.). Birchmeier and Tidd earned starting assignments in 2017.

Two additional red-shirt freshmen, **Jonah Buchanan** and **Stone Edwards**, will contend for roles.

The unit also could be bolstered by local product **Rutger Reitmaier** (R-Fr.), a highly regarded prospect who entered Vanderbilt classes last January. **Kade Mayle** (Jr.) and **Cameron Robinson** (So.) also will compete for snaps in the fall.

The Commodores also added defensive line prospect **Lorenza Surgers** in the 2018 signing class.

LINEBACKERS

STARTERS BACK: 2 LETTERWINNERS: 7

The Commodore linebacking corps will feature a solid blend of veteran performers and exciting newcomers looking to start their Vanderbilt playing careers. The competition for playing time will be intense.

The unit, which must replace Green Bay third-round draft pick Oren Burks, is guided by first-year defensive coordinator **Jason Tarver** and **Chris Marve**. Tarver mentors outside linebackers while Marve enters his third year as inside linebackers coach.

Four seniors, including three with starting experience, bring a veteran presence to the corps.

Charles Wright (Sr.) is an All-Southeastern Conference-caliber

performer at outside linebacker. As a first-year starter in 2017, Wright ranked fourth in the SEC with nine quarterback sacks and among the league's top 20 in tackles for loss.

Two other seniors, **Jordan Griffin** and **Josh Smith**, will be counted on heavily. Griffin ranked third on the team last year with 62 tackles and 8.5 tackles for loss from his inside linebacker post. Smith comes off his best year as a Commodore and looks to be an impact defender in his final season.

Caleb Peart (Jr.) had a strong spring and will compete for a substantial role at outside linebacker. Another veteran, **Andrew Rector** (Sr.), also should contribute solid minutes.

If sophomores **Andre Mintze** and **Kenny Hebert** continue to blossom as they did last spring, they will bring depth and playmaking ability to Tarver's outside linebackers.

The Commodores' 2017 signing class included several talented linebacker prospects all looking to find their role on the defense. **Feleti Afemui**, **Colin Anderson**, **Brayden DeVault-Smith**, **Dimitri Moore**, **Michael Owusu** and **Brett Starr** are redshirt freshmen looking to build a case for playing time this August.

The Commodores also added two linebackers in the 2018 signing class: **Elijah McAllister** and **Alston Orji**.

DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD

STARTERS BACK: 2 LETTERWINNERS: 9

The Commodore secondary, led by two all-Southeastern Conference candidates, will blend experienced performers with an eager group of youngsters ready to place their stamp on the Vanderbilt defense.

The secondary, mentored by four-year assistant **Marc Mattioli** and first-year coach **Terrence Brown**, has two starters and nine returning letterwinners back to compete for starting roles.

In preseason camp, Mattioli and Brown will look to identify replacements for four key contributors from a year ago, co-captain and safety Ryan White, safety Arnold Tarpley, cornerback Tre Herndon and nickel back Taurean Ferguson.

A Nashville product, **Joejuan Williams** (Jr.) leads Vanderbilt's cornerback corps. A 12-game starter last year, Williams is regarded among the SEC's top cover corners in 2018.

Blessed with superb length and athletic abilities, Williams registered 10 defensed passes as a sophomore, ranking second on the team and fifth among all SEC defenders.

Donovan Sheffield (Sr.) and **Elijah Hamilton** (R-So.) are expected to compete for the cornerback slot left open by Herndon's graduation. Coaches were pleased with the development both prospects showed during spring drills.

Defensive coaches also praised **Allan George** (R-Fr.) and **Randall Haynie** (R-Fr.) for their improvement during the spring.

The Commodores also added two freshman prospects at cornerback in the 2018 signing class: **BJ Anderson** and **Tré Douglas**.

All-SEC candidate **LaDarius Wiley** (Sr.) is the team's top returning safety and one of the defense's most productive players in recent seasons. A two-year starter, Wiley brings excellent size and abilities to the free safety role. In 2017, Wiley paced the Commodores and ranked sixth in the SEC with 58 solo tackles. His 88 total tackles also led the Vanderbilt defense.

A young Commodore is likely to depart August camp as the starter alongside Wiley at strong safety. Among the prospects who impressed coaches last spring were **Zaire Jones** (R-So.), **Tae Daley** (So.), **Frank Coppet** (R-So.), **Austin Quillen** (R-So.) and **Gil Barksdale** (Jr.).

Three talented freshmen also will get looks at safety this summer: **Brendon Harris**, **Dashaun Jerkins** and **Max Worship**.

Graduate transfer **Alim Muhammad** is among several candidates expected to compete for the secondary's nickel back role.

Derek Mason pulled **Shawn Mennenga** from the National Football League to guide Commodore special teams.

Mennenga joins Mason's staff from the Cleveland Browns where he was a long-time special teams assistant. He will have to retool Commodore units that lost its starting punter and kicker.

Mennenga and Mason went to work quickly, attracting graduate transfer Parker Thome from Columbia University as the team's punter.

In Thome, the Commodores gain one of the best punters in the NCAA-FCS division. In 2017, Thome led the Ivy League and ranked 11th nationally with a 42.9-yard punting average. A first-team All-Ivy Leaguer, Thome is the third punter from Columbia to transfer to the SEC in as many years.

Mennenga is excited about a competition this August for the team's kicking chores between **Ryley Guay** (Jr.) and **Javan Rice** (Fr.). Guay was the Commodores' top reserve last year and showed further improvement during spring drills. Rice is a highly regarded member
