### NO. 11/10 VANDERBILT PLAYS FIRST SEC ROAD GAME AT OLE MISS

OXFORD, Miss. -- The No. 11/10 Vanderbilt women's basketball team plays its first Southeastern Conference road game of the season this Sunday, Jan. 7, at Ole Miss. The game will be televised by FSN South and is scheduled to tip-off at 1:30 p.m. CT.

Vanderbilt (14-1, 1-0 SEC) defeated Arkansas, 98-61, in its conference opener Thursday to equal the school's second-best start. A win over the Lady Rebels would put the Commodores just seven games away from matching the 22-1 record that the 1992-93 team jumped out to on its way to the NCAA Final Four.

Senior leadership has been a big reason for Vanderbilt's success this season. Carla Thomas posted a double-double against Arkansas, with 12 points and 14 rebounds, and currently ranks third in the conference in scoring.

Dee Davis leads the league in assists, while Caroline Williams is one of the most-feared shooters in the country.

Vanderbilt holds a 21-12 all-time advantage over Ole Miss, but has lost nine of 14 meetings in Oxford -- including the team's last trip to C.M. "Tad" Smith Coliseum in 2005.

Balcomb enters the 2006-07 season looking for her fifth straight trip to the NCAA Tournament with the Commodores. In 13-plus seasons as a head coach, Balcomb has compiled 270 career wins in 412 games for a .655 winning percentage. Seven Balcomb teams have advanced to postseason play, including an NCAA Elite 8 trip with Xavier and a pair of journeys to the Sweet 16 with the Commodores.

Now in her fifth season in Nashville, Balcomb has compiled a 107-38 record at Vanderbilt, including a SEC Tournament Championship in only her second season. She has coached 12 players who have received All-Conference accolades and six of her players have been drafted by the WNBA -- including VU great Chantelle Anderson, who went as the second overall pick to the Sacramento Monarchs in the 2003 draft.

## NEXT TIME OUT

Vanderbilt travels to South Carolina for its first road conference game of the 2007 slate. The game on Sunday, Jan. 7, is scheduled to tip-off at 1:30 p.m. CT at Tad Smith Coliseum, and will be broadcast by FSN South.

The Lady Rebels head into their final non-conference with a 10-4 record, including wins in three of their last four games. Senior Arminie Price ranks second in the league in scoring, averaging 19.6 points per game.

## BALCOMB GETS 100TH WIN AT VU

Now in her 14th season as a collegiate head coach, Melanie Balcomb oversaw her 400th career game when Vanderbilt played host to TAMUCC on Monday, Nov. 20. A native of Cranbury, N.J., Balcomb won 259 of the first 400 games she coached -- a winning percentage of 64.8%.

Four games later at UAB, Balcomb achieved another landmark -- her 100th all-time win at Vanderbilt. The Commodores have won 73% of their games since Balcomb came to Nashville prior to the 2002-03 season.

## SENIOR CLASS BRINGS WEALTH OF EXPERIENCE

Vanderbilt's three seniors are passing milestones nearly every week, especially when their extensive experience is the subject.

Guard Dee Davis earned her 100th career start on Dec. 21 against Indiana State. The Cincinnati, Ohio product also recently played in her 100th career game -- Dec. 3 against Clemson. Davis became only the second Commodore to reach 600 assists for her Vanderbilt career with two helpers in that game. Davis totaled 869 points in her first 100 contests.

Senior forward Carla Thomas played her 100th career game on Monday, Nov. 20, against TAMUCC. She made 87 career starts in her first 100 games, averaging over 13 points per game.

## DAVIS NAMED TO WOODEN WATCH LIST

Vanderbilt senior point guard Dee Davis was one of only 30 student-athletes named to the preseason watch list for the Women's John R. Wooden Award, presented annually to the top collegiate women's basketball player.

Davis led the Southeastern Conference in assists a season ago, ranking fourth in the nation with 6.8 assists per game (212 assists in 31 games). She earned All-SEC honors for the 2005-06 season and was lauded by league coaches as a first-team All-SEC selection for the upcoming season.

The Cincinnati, Ohio, native is the backbone of Head Coach Melanie Balcomb's Commodores. Vanderbilt went 21-11 a year ago, making its seventh consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. In preseason polls, the Commodores were picked as high as No. 11 in the nation.

## ESPN.COM LAUDS DAVIS

Senior point guard Dee Davis was named one of the five best point guards in the country, in a poll of national experts released on ESPN.com.

Davis is joined on the list by Lindsay Harding of Duke, Lyndsey Medders of Iowa State and Renee Montgomery of Connecticut, all ranked just behind North Carolina's Ivory Latta.

Davis led the Southeastern Conference with 6.8 assists per game as a junior during the 2005-06 season. She earned preseason All-SEC

honors from league coaches and media.

The voting panel featured ESPN analysts Nancy Lieberman and Beth Mowins, as well as Mechelle Voepel, Graham Hays and Melanie Jackson of ESPN.com.

## DAVIS, THOMAS: PRESEASON ALL-SEC (COACHES)

Seniors Dee Davis and Carla Thomas were named preseason All-Southeastern Conference selections by a vote of league coaches.

Davis, who led the SEC in assists a season ago, was a first-team choice. Her 6.8 assists per game last year ranked third in the nation and earned her a spot on the Nancy Lieberman Award watch list.

Thomas led the Commodores in scoring last season at 12.4 points per game, surpassing 1,000 points for her career early in the conference season. After earning second-team All-SEC from the media at the conclusion of last season, the coaches made Thomas a second-team preseason pick this year.

Vanderbilt joins Georgia and LSU with two honorees on the Coaches' All-SEC team, while Tennessee led the league with three selections. Georgia's Tasha Humphrey, LSU's Sylvia Fowles and Tennessee's Candace Parker were all unanimous first-team choices.

## DORES 4TH, DAVIS &amp; THOMAS HONORED BY MEDIA

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth overall in the Southeastern Conference, according to media voting at the league's Media Days, Oct. 25-26, in Birmingham, Ala.

Melanie Balcomb's fifth squad at Vanderbilt (85) was predicted to finish behind Tennessee (19), Georgia (48) and LSU (51). Tennessee was picked to finish first in the league by all 19 media voting in the women's poll.

Commodore senior guard Dee Davis and senior forward Carla Thomas both were chosen All-SEC Second Team honorees by the attending media.

Tennessee's Candace Parker was selected as the SEC's Player of the Year.

**INAUGURAL SIXTH WOMAN RETURNS**

Center Liz Sherwood was lauded with the league's first "SEC Sixth Woman of the Year" award last season. The Castle Rock, Colo., native came off the bench in VU's final nine SEC games to average 11 points per game while connecting on 81 percent of her free throws. Sherwood led the conference in field goal percentage last year, hitting 66.4 percent of her 238 shot attempts.

**WHO DOESN'T LIKE FREE?**

The Commodores make a living at the free throw line, shooting an SEC-best .753 from the charity stripe.

Senior forward Carla Thomas ranks second all-time at Vanderbilt and currently leads the SEC in free throw percentage. She made 14 consecutive made free throws between the UAB and Lipscomb games. Earlier this season, Thomas made 15 straight free throws between the WKU and FAU contests.

Other Commodores have also put together impressive streaks. Sophomore Christina Wirth hit 13 straight free throws after missing the first of three against TAMUCC.

Senior guard Caroline Williams made 13 consecutive free throws from the Colorado game through the TAMUCC contest.

Senior guard Dee Davis closed the 2005-06 season by making 27 straight free throws after missing her second of six attempts in a home game against Georgia. Davis opened the season by making her first four attempts at Colorado for a total streak of 31 straight makes.

**VU's 20/20 VISION**

Vanderbilt earned its 20th overall 20-win season and fourth straight under Melanie Balcomb when the Commodores defeated Alabama, 84-62, in the opening round of the 2006 SEC Tournament. The Commodores have won at least 20 games in 13 of the last 14 seasons, and seven in a row. A complete list is below:

**ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS**

Senior Carla Thomas earned Most Valuable Player honors following the 2006 VU Holiday Classic. Thomas poured in 32 points in a pair of Commodores victories to lead Vanderbilt to its second home tournament championship of the season. Senior Dee Davis and sophomore Christina Wirth also earned All-Tournament accolades for their performances.

Senior Caroline Williams was honored as the Most Valuable Player of the 2006 Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament after leading the Commodores past Florida Atlantic and No. 16 California. Williams was VU's leading scorer during both games. Thomas also earned All-Tournament honors for her performance, which included an impressive first half that helped Vanderbilt take an early lead over California in Saturday's championship game.

Last season, Thomas earned MVP honors at the 2005 Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament. Thomas averaged 21 points and eight rebounds in two VU victories. Williams and Liz Sherwood also were featured on that All-Tournament team.

Sherwood earned a similar honor at the 2005 WBCA/BTI Classic after a pair of impressive performances against Arizona State and Clemson. She led the Commodores with 14.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game.

## THOMAS' TIMELINE

• Thomas became the 26th Commodore to score 1,000 points on Jan. 12, 2006 with a layup less than a minute into a game against Mississippi State. She was only the 11th VU player to reach 1,000 points prior to her senior season.

• Thomas entered VU's all-time Top 20 on Feb. 12, 2006, at Tennessee, scoring her 1,105th career point on a lay-up with 6:31 remaining in the first half. She passed Mara Cunningham, who scored 1,104 points during her Vanderbilt career (1993-96).

• Thomas passed Jillian Danker for 19th on the all-time scoring list on Feb. 23, 2006, against Kentucky, converting a jumper in the lane (off an assist from point guard Dee Davis) for her 10th point of the game (1,136th of her career) with 10:08 remaining in the second half.

• Thomas finished the 2005-06 season with 1,223 points, good for 19th all-time at Vanderbilt.

• Thomas made quick work of moving up the scoring list this season, opening the year with 26 points at Colorado on Nov. 12, 2006, to jump from 19th to 17th on the all-time list.

• After scoring nine points in the first half, Thomas poured in Vanderbilt's first eight points of the second half and then passed Carolyn Peck for 18th all-time with a lay-up at the 10:36 mark (assisted by Davis as part of a three-point play).

• Later in that game, Thomas capped another three-point play at the 5:52 mark of the second half to pass Misty Lamb for 17th all-time.

• Thomas moved into 16th all-time on Nov. 20, 2006, with 16 points against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. At the 14:21 mark of the first half, Thomas converted a lay-up (off an assist from guard Jennifer Risper) to give her 1,296 career points.

• After scoring 32 points (one shy of her career high) at UAB and 19 points in 18 minutes against Clemson, Thomas stood only five points behind 15th place.

• With a team-high 14 points against Duke, Thomas jumped Ashley Earley and Deborah Denton on the same night to move into 14th place. At the 1:39 mark of the first half, Thomas scored her sixth point of the game on a jumper in the paint to slide past early. She tied and then overtook Denton with two made free throws at the 2:28 mark of the second.

• Thomas scored 18 points at South Florida to jump two spots in the rankings. She moved past Julie Powell into 13th place with her fourth point of the game on a jumper off an assist from Merideth Marsh. She later passed the 1,400-point threshold and Donna Harris (for 12th place) with her 10th point of the game on a layup at the 6:08 mark of the first half, assisted by Jennifer Risper.

• Thomas posted her second double-double of the season in VU's rout of No. 20 Arkansas, scoring 12 points to pull within 18 of former teammate Jenni Benningfield.

## Game Recap

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- The 22nd-ranked Vanderbilt women's basketball team used a second-half surge to defeat Southeastern Conference rival Ole Miss, 68-58, Sunday afternoon at Memorial Gymnasium.

Junior Carla Thomas led all scorers with 16 points, while Caroline Williams (15) and Cherish Stringfield (11) were also in double-figures for the Commodores. Senior Nicole Jules grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds in the game, as the Does out rebounded the Lady Rebels 21-15 in the second half.

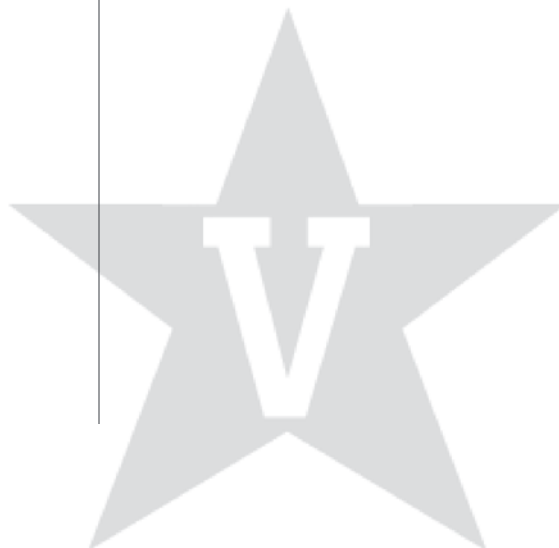
Down four at the half, Vanderbilt looked to junior Dee Davis, the SEC's assist leader. Coaches had hoped to rest the injured left knee of Davis, who sat out the LSU game, but were forced to go to their only true point guard for the final 20 minutes.

Vanderbilt found the aggression they had been lacking during a three-game skid. The Commodores went to the foul line 28 times in Sunday's game, after having only attempted a total of 18 charity tosses in the three previous games combined. Thomas led VU at the line, knocking down eight of her 10 attempts. Entering Sunday, the Commodores ranked first in the league in free throw percentage but 11th in the league in free throw attempts.

Over 7,500 fans converged on Memorial Gymnasium in an effort to "Jam the Gym," and were treated to SEC basketball and a host of other entertainment, including a halftime mascot game. Tickets for the game were reduced to one dollar.

Jady Mincy and Arminie Price each scored 12 points for Ole Miss (12-8, 2-5 SEC).

With the win, Vanderbilt (14-7) breaks a three-game losing streak and moves to 3-4 in SEC play. The Commodores travel south to Tuscaloosa, Ala., on Thursday, Feb. 2, for a game with the Crimson Tide.

### Series Notes vs. Ole Miss

Today's game marks the 34th meeting between Vanderbilt and Ole Miss in a series that began in the Commodores' first year as a varsity program -- 1977-78. The Lady Rebels took that first meeting, 85-64, and would lead the series until 1998.

Playing in Oxford during the 1998 regular season, Vanderbilt notched a 66-56 victory to even the series (11-11) for only the second time since its inception. Later that season, the Commodores would knock off Ole Miss in the SEC Tournament to take their first series lead.

That postseason win was the third of 11 consecutive victories in the series for the Commodores. That streak came to an end in 2005 -- the last time Vanderbilt visited Oxford -- a 66-60 Ole Miss win. The Commodores avenged the loss last season, defending Memorial Gym and beating the Lady Rebels, 68-58.

The Commodores hold a distinct advantage in games played outside of Oxford (16-3, including a 5-0 record in the SEC Tournament), but have not fared so well on Ole Miss' home court (5-9). After winning the first meeting in Oxford, the Does would fall in their next eight trips between 1981-1996. The win in 1998 sparked a run of four straight road victories, which was snapped two years ago.

Overall, Vanderbilt has won 12 of the last 13 meetings between the two schools, dating back to Jan. 22, 1997 and a 74-47 win in Nashville.

Four prep standouts inked a National Letter of Intent during the early period to attend Vanderbilt and play women's basketball for Coach Balcomb.

Chanel Chisholm (Long Island, N.Y.), Jence Rhoads (Slippery Rock, Pa.), Rebecca Silinski (Birmingham, Ala.) and Hannah Tuomi (Brighton, Colo.) all plan to enroll at Vanderbilt and begin their collegiate eligibility in the Fall of 2007.

"We are extremely excited about next year's incoming class," Balcomb said. "Our staff has worked very hard evaluating talent and establishing relationships, and we couldn't be happier with the four student-athletes who have chosen to come to Vanderbilt. This is an extremely talented class that is bound to make an immediate impact on our team."

Chisholm recently moved into Scout.com's National Hot 100. Playing at North Babylon High School, she was named to the 2006 All-Island Team after averaging 21 points, eight rebounds, five assists and two steals during her junior season. Chisholm led the Lady Bulldogs to an 18-4 record and League IV championship. Off the court, Chisholm also competed as a sprinter for her school's track team.

Rhoads, a point guard at Slippery Rock High School, was ranked No. 25 in the nation by

Scout.com. As a junior for the Rockets, she earned all-state honors and was the co-recipient of the Swin Cash District 10 Player of the Year award from the Western Pennsylvania Youth Basketball Club. Rhoads led her club squad, Tri-State Rock Solid, to the finals of the adidas Tournament of Champions and was invited to the Top Ten All-American Camp.

A 6-3 forward from nearby Birmingham, Ala., Silinski was an honorable-mention all-state selection by the Alabama Sports Writers Association last season. With her senior year upcoming, she already holds the all-time scoring record at Shades Mountain Christian with 1,423 career points. BOULDER, Colo. -- The No. 15/16 Vanderbilt women's basketball team survived a tough road contest against a major-conference opponent, overcoming Colorado, 81-76, Sunday at the Coors Events Conference Center.

Senior forward Carla Thomas posted a team-high 26 points, including 17 in the second half, to lift the Commodores. Thomas was a late scratch from the starting lineup due to a back ailment, but came in early in the first half and played a total of 29 minutes.

Thomas' 26 points were the most she had scored since a 37-point performance at Georgia in the 2004-05 regular season finale.

Senior Caroline Williams added 21 points, while sophomore Christina Wirth had 14.

The Commodores led by as many as 17 points in the second half, but Colorado clawed back behind a 27-point, 12-rebound performance by Jackie McFarland.

Junior Liz Sherwood scored six points in the first five minutes of the game, but was forced to sit after picking up two quick fouls.

Sophomore Jennifer Risper made her first career start, while five Commodores made their first collegiate appearances. Jessica Mooney led all newcomers with four points and three rebounds, while Lauren Lueders, Merideth Marsh, Amber Norton and Amy Malo all saw action.

Marsh's first points as a Commodore came in exciting fashion, as the Louisville, Ky., native banked in a half-court shot as the first half expired.

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. - The 15th-ranked Vanderbilt women's basketball team closed with a 17-2 run to earn a hard-fought road victory, 86-78, over Western Kentucky Thursday at E.A. Diddle Arena.

Senior Caroline Williams scored 19 points, including 14 in the second half, to lead the Commodores. Williams finished 9-of-9 from the free throw line, including six makes in the game's final three minutes.

Vanderbilt played four freshmen during the night, with all four in the game at one point midway through the first half. The newcomers combined to play 57 minutes, scoring 27 points led by Nashville product Jessica Mooney.

Mooney scored seven straight Commodore points in the second half, the last two bringing Vanderbilt within four of the Lady Toppers.

Freshmen guards Merideth Marsh and Lauren Lueders each scored five points, while post Amber Norton added 9 points. Senior Carla Thomas had another big night, scoring 18 points and adding nine rebounds. Point guard Dee Davis dished out seven assists.

Two free throws by Christina Wirth at the 2:15 mark gave Vanderbilt only its second lead since breaking out to a 5-0 advantage to start the game.

The Lady Toppers answered VU's 5-0 start with a 13-point run of their own. Western Kentucky built a 12-point lead nine minutes into the first half. The Lady Toppers were led by 10 points from Cammie Campbell. VU's Thomas scored the half's last four points, and eight of Vanderbilt's final 10, to bring VU within 43-37 at the break.

Western made 6-of-9 three-point attempts in the first half, but were limited to one three-pointer on three tries in the second period. Vanderbilt, on the other hand, made 17-of-24 field goal attempts in the second half to outscore Western Kentucky by 14.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The 15th-ranked Vanderbilt women's basketball team won its home opener Saturday against Dartmouth, 79-49, in Memorial Gymnasium.

Senior Carla Thomas led all scorers with 21 points on 8-of-10 shooting from the field. All 12 of Vanderbilt players saw action during the game, with everyone scoring except for senior guard Caroline Williams. Williams came into Saturday's game averaging 21 points in VU's first two contests.

"The reason we got off to a slow start was because Caroline [Williams] and Carla [Thomas] were targeted as offensive threats," VU Head Coach Melanie Balcomb said. "I've known [Dartmouth Head Coach] Chris Wielgus for a long time and she's a very good coach. She had her team prepared and wanted to shut down our two offensive producers. That's why Caroline didn't score this evening."

Vanderbilt's defense forced 25 turnovers, while the offense shot better than 50% and committed only nine giveaways. The last time Vanderbilt had less than 10 turnovers was Jan. 15, 2006, at South Carolina (8).

Senior point guard Dee Davis had eight assists and no turnovers in the game to go along with two steals.

Freshman Merideth Marsh and sophomore Jennifer Risper and Christina Wirth scored eight points each. Dartmouth was led by 11 points each from Koren Schram and Cookeville, Tenn., native Ashley Taylor.

For Vanderbilt, it was the 21st consecutive victory in a home opener, dating back to a Nov. 28, 1986, victory over Mississippi Valley.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- Six Commodores scored in double-figures as 14th-ranked Vanderbilt women's basketball defeated Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, 102-75, Monday night at Memorial Gymnasium.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- The 14th-ranked Commodore women's basketball team defeated Florida Atlantic, 81-49, to advance to the championship game of the Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament Friday at Memorial Gymnasium.

Vanderbilt will face California, a 69-52 winner over Belmont, on Saturday in the tournament championship -- scheduled to begin 30 minutes after the conclusion of the Florida Atlantic-Belmont game, which begins at Noon CT.

Senior guard Caroline Williams led all scorers with 17 points on 5-of-11 shooting from three-point range. Senior point guard Dee Davis dished out a season-high 10 assists and came away with five steals, as the Commodores forced the Owls into 25 turnovers.

Sophomore Christina Wirth (12 points) and freshman Lauren Lueders (11) also tallied double-figures for the Commodores.

Mistoria Brown led Florida Atlantic with 11 points and seven rebounds.

After a slow start in the first half, Vanderbilt connected on 59% of its second-half field goals. Florida Atlantic was held to 26% shooting in the period, and connected on only 32% of its field goal attempts for the game.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- The 14th-ranked Commodore women's basketball team played smothering defensive basketball en route to a 67-55 win over No. 16 California in the championship game of the Vanderbilt Thanksgiving Tournament Saturday at Memorial Gymnasium.

Vanderbilt's defense held California scoreless for nearly 11 minutes at one stretch, opening a 19-point lead at the beginning of the second half before California scored at the 14:57 mark. The Golden Bears had been stuck at 20 points since the 5:50 mark of the first half.

Senior guard Caroline Williams, who had 18 on Saturday, was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player after scoring 35 points in two games. Senior Carla Thomas also found her way onto the All-Tournament Team after a 16-point, seven-rebound performance.

Ashley Walker led the Golden Bears with 19 points, while Rama N'Diaye posted a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

California's only lead of the game came on their first possession, as Alexis Gray-Lawson opened with a three-pointer. Thomas and sophomore Christina Wirth would combine for Vanderbilt's first 18 points before a steal and three-point play by sophomore Jennifer Risper, as Vanderbilt opened up a seven-point lead 12 minutes into the game.

The Commodores led by 11 at the half, and would continue to grow that lead during a 17-0 run, capped by a fast-break lay-up by Williams assisted by senior Dee Davis. Williams would also go 4-for-4 from behind the arc in the second half.

In the process, Head Coach Melanie Balcomb earned her 100th career victory at Vanderbilt. Balcomb has won 73% of her 137 games since moving to Nashville prior to the 2002-03 season.

Thomas scored 32 points -- one shy of her career high -- and added 11 rebounds, posting her first double-double of the season and the 10th of her career.

Senior point guard Dee Davis, the Southeastern Conference leader in assists, dished out a career-high 12 helpers as Vanderbilt (7-0) outscored UAB, 51-28, in the second half.

Winless UAB (0-6) hung tough with the visiting Commodores into the second half. The game was last tied at the 15:35 mark of the second half before a jumper by senior Caroline Williams gave Vanderbilt the lead for good.

Thomas led all scorers with 16 points in the first half, shooting 6-of-8 from the floor. Thomas' only two misses of the first half came on the first two three-point attempts of her VU career; entering Thursday's game, Thomas had attempted 970 shots as a Commodore.

Aside from Thomas, the Commodores made only six of 17 first-half field goal attempts. UAB turned scored 15 points in the first half off of 12 VU turnovers, helping the Blazers take a 35-34 lead into the half.

Freshman Lauren Lueders scored six points in her first career start, hitting 2-of-4 three-point attempts. Sophomore Jennifer Risper missed her first game of the season. Risper is expected to miss about a week with a knee injury.

DURHAM, N.C. -- The 11th-ranked Commodore women's basketball team suffered its first defeat of the season at the hands of the fourth-ranked Duke Blue Devils, 69-48, Thursday at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Senior Carla Thomas led the Commodores with 14 points, while senior Dee Davis had a season-high 12. Alison Bales, Duke's 6-7 senior center, led four Blue Devils' in double-figures with 16 points.

The Commodore defense forced Duke into a season-high 23 turnovers, holding the Blue Devils under 70 points for the first time this year.

Davis led the Commodores with eight points in the first half, matching her season-high from the UAB game. Duke took a seven-point lead into the break after outrebounding Vanderbilt, 21-12, in the opening stanza. Of Duke's 29 first-half points, 11 came after offensive rebounds.

Vanderbilt scored the first four points of the second half to get within three (29-26) on a jumper by sophomore Christina Wirth.

The Duke lead swung between five and 11 points for most of the second half, but with just over four minutes remaining in the game the Blue Devils put together an eight-point possession to stretch their advantage.

An intentional foul was whistled on Vanderbilt as Duke made a break-away lay-up. The foul was judged to be after the shot, giving Duke two free throws. The Commodore bench was assessed a technical foul after the first free throw was missed, giving Duke two additional free throws. The Blue Devils would make three charity tosses and sink a three-pointer on the ensuing possession to stretch the lead to 17 points at 57-40.

Ten of Duke's final 12 points came at the free throw line, expanding the lead to 23 points before Davis made a lay-up at the buzzer.

TAMPA, Fla. -- The 12th-ranked Commodore women's basketball team defeated South Florida, 76-68, at the St. Pete Times Forum Sunday.

Junior Liz Sherwood and sophomore Christina Wirth each posted double-double performances for Vanderbilt (9-1) -- the second time this season that a pair of Commodores have achieved the feat in the same contest.

Sherwood led all Commodores with 19 points and pulled down a career-high-tying 13 boards. Wirth scored 12 and had a personal-best 11 rebounds.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- The 12th-ranked Vanderbilt women's basketball team had little trouble advancing to the championship of its Holiday Classic, defeating neighboring Lipscomb, 109-40, Wednesday at Memorial Gymnasium.

Vanderbilt's win set up a championship matchup with Indiana State -- 79-68 winners over Longwood earlier in the day. Longwood and Lipscomb will begin Thursday's action at 1 p.m. CT, with Vanderbilt and Indiana State to follow 30 minutes after the consolation game concludes (approximately 3:15 p.m.).

The Commodore win was the third-largest margin of victory in Vanderbilt history and the most points scored by the Commodores (10-1) since they put up 116 against Hampton in 1998.

All 12 players on Vanderbilt's roster scored at least five points in the game, with only four players reaching double-figures -- led by freshman Amber Norton's game-high 14 points.

Norton was one of four true freshmen to register career highs -- with Jessica Mooney (12 points on 6-of-6 shooting), Ashlee Bridge (9) and Merideth Marsh (9) also putting up personal bests.

Sophomore Jennifer Risper scored a career-high 11, and senior Carla Thomas added 10. Lipscomb (3-10) was led by nine points from Katie Woods.

The Commodores scored 41 points off of 29 Lipscomb turnovers. All 12 of Mooney's points came in transition, as she led VU with six steals.

Vanderbilt connected on 25-of-31 shots from the field in the second half (80.6%) to expand a 33-point halftime lead.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Carla Thomas scored 22 points to lead No. 12 Vanderbilt to an 89-75 victory over Indiana State on Thursday in the championship game of the Vanderbilt Holiday Tournament.

The Commodores (11-1) pulled away in the second half with a 19-8 run, stretching a 58-53 lead to 77-61 with 5:27 remaining.

Meagan Cowher, the daughter of Pittsburgh Steelers coach Bill Cowher, scored 21 points to pace Princeton, which shot 42 percent (26-of-62).

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -- Carla Thomas had 16 points and nine rebounds to help Vanderbilt (No. 12 ESPN/USA Today; No. 11 AP) beat La Salle 70-59 Monday.

Lauren Lueders made a 3-pointer with 18:17 left to give the Commodores a 43-27 lead. But the Explorers chipped away and trailed 59-53 with 4:33 left after a pair of free throws by Crista Ricketts.

Vanderbilt (13-1) sealed the victory when Caroline Williams hit a 3-pointer and Christina Wirth scored inside to push the lead to 64-53 with 3:03 to go. La Salle got no closer than seven points the rest of the game.

Carlene Hightower scored 21 points for the Explorers (11-3). Ricketts, who entered the game averaging a team-high 19.8 points, scored just two in the first half and finished with eight.

The Commodores raced to a 14-4 lead and never trailed. Vanderbilt shot 52.8 percent from the field and held La Salle to 41.7.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- Sophomore Christina Wirth scored a career-high 24 points and senior Carla Thomas had a double-double to lead No. 11/10 Vanderbilt to a convincing 98-61 win over No. 20/23 Arkansas in the Southeastern Conference women's basketball opener for both schools, Thursday night at Memorial Gymnasium.

Wirth's 24 points came in only 11 shots, as the Mesa, Ariz., native misfired only once on the evening and hit all four of her three-point attempts. Her 10-of-11 performance from the field marks the best shooting night for an SEC player this season.

Wirth led five Commodores in double-figures. Senior Caroline Williams scored 15 points on 3-of-3 shooting from behind-the-arc. Senior Dee Davis added 13 points and seven assists, while Thomas posted 12 points and 14 rebounds. Sophomore Jennifer Risper scored 10 points, one off her career high.

Vanderbilt's defense held Arkansas to a season-low 30% from the field, while the Commodores were unstoppable offensively. The Dores made 62% of their field goals and 69% of their three-point attempts.

Donica Cosby scored a team-high 15 points for the Lady Razorbacks coming off the bench. She was the only Lady'Back in double-digits.

The 37-point victory marked Vanderbilt's largest margin in conference play since defeating Mississippi State, 87-48, on Jan. 12, 2005.
