



Vanderbilt is a national leader in graduation rates among its student-athlete population. In 2006, Vanderbilt tied for third nationally. In 1997 and 2007, the Vanderbilt football program topped all NCAA members.

For nearly two decades, the College Football Coaches Association has recognized Vanderbilt for graduating at least 70 percent of its players.

Vanderbilt student-athletes are supported by an eight-person professional staff of advisors and counselors directed by Elizabeth Wright in the Stratton-Foster Academic Center, located in McGugin Center. The recently expanded facility contains tutorial rooms, a computer lab, quiet reading zones, and private study areas.
