2008 OUTLOOK

A firm believer in the foundation he has created at Vanderbilt, Head Coach Bobby Johnson is looking for a lot more success from his 2008 Commodore squad than most observers predict.

Johnson, entering his seventh season at the helm of Vanderbilt football, believes the pieces are in place to improve on last season's 5-7 record.

To overcome severe losses to graduation and the National Football League, Johnson will look to an impressive group of prospects that remain largely untested at the highest levels of college football. Johnson says he's eager to face - and overcome - the challenge.

"This team has plenty of guys who can play at this level, and play very effectively. Make no mistake about that," Johnson said. "Yes, we lost some very productive players, but at the same time, we've improved the talent base through our recruiting. We have guys who will step in and will play extremely well."

Since 2005, Johnson has fielded a Vanderbilt squad that can compete with any in the nation. Their 14 wins in the last three years, including five-win campaigns in 2005 and 2007, are the most by a Commodore squad in that span since 1992-94. Those victories have included four of the program's biggest road wins in decades: a 17-6 triumph at then-No. 6 ranked South Carolina 28-24 in 2007, a 24-22 victory at No. 22 Georgia in 2006, and wins at Arkansas and Tennessee in 2005.

When Johnson opens preseason camp July 31 in Nashville, he will be greeted by a dozen starters and 47 letterwinners from a year ago.

At the same time, the staff has plenty of holes it must fill. Thirteen starting roles, occupied last year by some of the most productive Commodores in recent memory, must be claimed. The entire offensive line, topped by No. 14 overall NFL draft pick Chris Williams, graduated. Earl Bennett, the receiver who broke the SEC's all-time record for catches in a three-year career, has moved on to the next level. Four defensive standouts, linebackers Jonathan Goff and Marcus Buggs, tackle Theo Horrocks and end Curtis Gatewood, are currently competing for pro jobs.

The Commodore defense, among the nation's best last year, has seven starters back, including a talented secondary led by All-America candidate D.J. Moore at cornerback and safety Reshard Langford. The offense has plenty of firepower returning, but must receive more production from the

guarterback position. Virtually every specialist from last year is expected back.

"Our team needs a very productive (preseason) camp," Johnson said. "We accomplished that goal during Spring Practice and we've had a great summer conditioning effort, but we expect some guys to step forward when camp opens and show why they should be on the field.

"At the same time, we have to continue developing more guys that can go in, and play effectively against the best competition in America."

Johnson wants to take the program beyond the point of simply seeking bowl eligibility. He thinks Vanderbilt can contend for Southeastern Conference championships.

"Everyone associated with the Vanderbilt program, from players and coaches to students and fans, should have the expectation of success. We're working to get to that level every day," Johnson said.

Commodore Offense

QUARTERBACKS: The Commodores enter the preseason without a definite starter at guarterback, though the two most likely candidates both started six games a year ago. Whoever gets the nod, the coaches look for more production and greater leadership from the position.


Competition was fierce between top candidates Chris Nickson 6-1, 210, R-Sr.) and Mackenzi Adams (6-3, 215, R-Jr.) during spring drills, and coaches praised the improvement of two younger prospects, Jared Funk (6-2, 202, R-So.) and Larry Smith (6-2, 215, R-Fr.). When

summer camp convenes in late July, expect a top coaching priority to be identifying the signal caller that will confidently guide the Commodores into the 2008 campaign.

Adams directed the Commodores to two wins, including a victory at South Carolina in his first career start, after getting the call in the seventh game. Equally adapt at running or passing, Adams also played well in narrow losses to Kentucky and Tennessee but struggled in the season finale. He finished the year connecting on 55.5 percent of his passes, throwing more touchdowns (9) than interceptions (6).

Nickson entered 2007 as the clearcut starter and looked impressive in the early season, throwing for four touchdowns in the opener and guiding the Commodores to a victory over Ole Miss. But he struggled with a sore shoulder against conference foes Alabama, Auburn and Georgia before









being replaced by Adams. On the season, Nickson completed 52.1 percent of his passes but failed to show the same dualthreat ability apparent in 2006 when he accumulated nearly 2,800 yards of total offense in an excellent campaign.

If Adams and Nickson struggle, the coaches will look to their younger understudies. Funk has been in the system for two years, and possesses arguably the strongest throwing arm. Like Nickson, Smith is a former Alabama Prep Player of the Year who impressed during fall practices and in spring drills.

RUNNING BACKS Despite losing 2007 leading rusher Cassen Jackson-Garrison to graduation, new position coach Des Kitchings returns a deep corps of running backs that impressed during spring drills.

Jeff Jennings (6-1, 214, R-Sr.) and Jared Hawkins (5-10, 202, R-Jr.) are expected to compete for the starting assignment in the Commodores' typical one-back set, though **Gaston Miller** (5-7, 180, R-So.) put together arguably the strongest Spring Practice coming off a redshirt season. Any of three underclass candidates – **Kennard Reeves** (6-0, 202, R-So.), Jermaine Doster (5-10, 205, R-Fr.) and Ryan van Rensburg (6-1, 215, R-Fr.) – could contend for a playing role with an impressive performance during preseason camp.

Jennings, a tough, inside-the-tackles rusher, returned last year after missing 2006 to rehabilitate an injured knee. Jennings' bruising running

style and confidence in his repaired leg gradually improved as the 2007 season developed. Jennings returned for summer workouts in superb shape, and looks ready to put together his finest season as a senior.

Hawkins might have been Vanderbilt's top rusher last year. Possessing an excellent ability to set up blocks and tough inside-in-the-tackle push, Hawkins' role should expand without Jackson-Garrison in the equation. Hawkins' career 5.9-yard average easily tops all returning backs.

Miller's continued improvement will be interesting to watch. He seemed to blossom under Kitchings' tutelege last spring, constantly proving an elusive target to tackle. Miller, who added 10 pounds while redshirting in 2007, is unlike any other Commodore back, blending an elusive style with explosive speed.

Though limited to special teams activity in 2007, Reeves showed marked improvement in his second season after a productive effort in the weight room. Both van Rensburg, a power rusher, and Doster, brother of beloved former Commodore running back Kwane Doster, possess plenty of potential and could be helpful on special teams in their first varsity season.

RECEIVERS Arguably the finest receiver to ever play at Vanderbilt, SEC career receiving leader Earl Bennett has moved on to the NFL after deciding to forego his final Commodore year. While Bennett's departure leaves a huge hole in production, the Commodores offer an interesting mix of veterans and talented newcomers ready to accept the challenge of replacing






Larry Simmons (5-10, 168, R-Jr.), Chris Reinert (5-9, 182, R-Jr.), Turner Wimberly (6-1, 195, R-So.) and Chris Crooks (6-3, 208, R-Fr.) exhibited skills as potential possession receivers.

Two other players, Jamie Graham (6-0, 190, R-Fr.) and Andrew Diomande (6-2, 205, R-Sr.), are unknowns entering preseason camp. Graham redshirted as a defensive secondary prospect in 2007, then contributed to the Commodore men's basketball NCAA-bound team as a defensive gem. Though he missed most of spring drills, the coaches will be interested to watch Graham's progress as a wide receiver. Diomande, a senior transfer from Clemson, is a physical presence at receiver.

The Commodores also signed two freshman prospects, John Cole (5-11, 170) and Akeem Dunham (6-3, 185).

The tight end corps, though collectively inexperienced, could be a strength of the Commodore offense in 2008. Jake Bradford (6-6, 270, Sr.), the only returnee with a prominent role last year, became a late-season target for Mackenzi Adams. Justin Green (6-6, 235, R-So.) and Austin



Monahan (6-7, 255, So.) are a pair of young athletic prospects, with Monahan showing a nice combination as a blocker and receiver. Brandon Barden (6-5, 245, R-Fr.) also exhibited impressive skills at spring practice and could secure a key playing role this year. Matt Bubis (6-0, 235, R-Jr.) offers another blocking presence at the position corps.


OFFENSIVE LINE The Commodore offense will totally retool its offensive line corps decimated by graduation losses. The entire offensive front - All-SEC left tackle Chris Williams, four-year right tackle Brian Stamper, dependable center Hamilton Holliday, steady left guard Josh Eames and improved right guard Merritt Kirchoffer - have graduated, leaving behind 160 combined career starts. Despite the losses, position coach Robbie Caldwell enters preseason optimistic about his pupils.



At center, the Commodores have an excellent performer in **Bradley Vierling** (6-3, 292, R-Jr.). The co-captain Vierling is a tough-nosed player with a starting job secured. He also gives the offensive front a stabilizing presence with excellent knowledge of what coaches are looking to accomplish. Promising **Joey Bailey** (6-4, 280, R-So.) should support Vierling while former defensive line prospect **Rob Ashabranner** (6-2, 280) could get repetitions at the position.

Vierling's classmate, **Ryan Custer** (6-3, 295, R-Jr.) should take over at left guard while **Drew Gardner** (6-6, 305, R-Jr.) and **Ryan Vance** (6-3, 290, R-Jr.) are likely to compete for the starting right guard slot. **Nick Forte** (6-2, 290, R-Jr.) and **Chris Aaron** (6-4, 290, R-So.) also could be involved in the competition at guard.

Nobody has bigger shoes to fill than **Thomas Welch** (6-7, 305, R-Jr.) and **Eric Hensley** (6-6, 312, R-Jr.). Caldwell thinks Welch, expected to replace first-round draft pick Williams at left tackle, has potential to play at the next level. Recruited as a tight end, Welch has greatly improved his strength while maintaining the agility he possessed as a Vanderbilt newcomer. Hensley showed vast improvement during spring drills, but missed two months of offseason conditioning due to a leg injury. Though undersized, **Reilly Lauer** (6-6, 270, R-So.) is one of the unit's best blocking technicians.

Coaches like the athleticism of **Kyle Fischer** (6-6, 300, R-Fr.) and **James Williams** (6-6, 305, R-Fr.). If the team's veteran tackles fail to claim starting tackle jobs, either could be in contention for playing time.

The team also welcomes three freshmen candidates – Michael Bryant (6-5, 290), Richard Cagle (6-4, 280) and Caleb Welchans (6-5 265).

Commodore Defense

TACKLES In the interior, the Commodores must replace 2007 starters Theo Horrocks and Gabe Hall. While Horrocks graduated as an All-SEC caliber tackle and one of the team's top interior defensive players in recent memory, Hall impressed teammates and coaches as a first-year starter. **Greg Billinger** (6-3, 285, Jr.) has the potential to be the next outstanding Commodore tackle, and comes into preseason camp off a solid perfor-

mance in Spring Practice. Billinger has two years of experience playing

behind Horrocks and has showed physical development that should help with the pounding taken at the tackle position.

Energetic **Adam Smotherman** (6-4, 285, R-So.) is another promising tackle, and looks to fully return from lingering leg injuries. As Smotherman's health improves and his confidence builds, he should be a key contributor.


Depth at the tackle position could come from **T.J. Greenstone** (6-2, 280, R-Fr.) and **Derrius Dowell** (6-3, 285, R-Jr.), both of whom enjoyed productive showings during spring drills. Dowell has the talent to contribute, but has never put all the pieces together. Greenstone continues to impress the staff with his physical tools and desire on the practice field.

Bo Cramer (6-2, 280, R-Fr.) and James Elledge (6-3, 280, R-Fr.) also

DEFENSIVE ENDS A trio of talented and experienced ends are back for the Commodores, who lost athletic Curtis Gatewood to the NFL.

Steven Stone (6-5, 268, R-Jr.) developed into a productive performer last year in his first year as a starter. Stone set highs in every statistical category while playing the most minutes of his career.

Broderick Stewart (6-5, 230, R-Jr.) is a big-play defensive specialist, and one of the team's top sack threats. As Stewart continues to improve his physique, he has the talent to become more of an every-down player.


Theron Kadri (6-4, 270, So.) played as a freshman in 2007, and likely will become more valuable to the Commodores with Gatewood's departure.

Others expected to compete for playing time are **Teriall Brannon** (6-3, 238, R-So.), **Tim Fugger** (6-4, 255, R-Fr.) in line for additional playing time. **David Leinweber** (6-5, 245, Jr.) also could get repetitions.

The Commodores signed seven defensive line candidates: John Burrow (6-4, 230), Josh Jelesky (6-5, 234), Taylor Loftley (6-2, 250), Rob Lohr (6-4. 265), Colt Nichter (6-2, 275), Ryan Seymour (6-4, 255), and Johnell Thomas (6-1, 240).




LINEBACKERS The defensive staff will look to replace two standouts – All-SEC performer Jonathan Goff and Marcus Buggs – now applying their trade in the NFL. The duo will be missed for their leadership skills almost as much as for their on-field production.

Patrick Benoist (6-0, 222, Jr.), Chris Johnson (6-1, 228, R-Jr.) and Chris Marve (6-0, 225, R-Fr.) are expected to compete for the opening at middle linebacker.

Benoist has more game experience than Johnson or Marve, and brings superb knowledge of schemes to the unit. As a sophomore, Benoist became a late-season starter after injuries slowed his progress to start the season. On the field, Benoist is a big-play defender with a nose for the football.

Johnson has made a name for himself as a productive special teams' performer, but has never enjoyed an instrumental role at linebacker. Marve is a physical specimen and practice squad standout from a year ago. He







also earned high praise from coaches and teammates for his effort last spring.

Brandon Bryant (6-1, 228, R-Jr.), and Nathan Campbell (6-3, 228, R-So.) are the top candidates at weakside linebacker.

Bryant, a starter when the 2007 season began, brings plenty of physicality to the position. He returns for preseason camp needing

to overcome a pair of injury setbacks suffered in the last year. When Bryant missed spring drills, Campbell used the opportunity to claim an increased role. Other weakside candidates are walk-ons **Michael Garcia** (6-0, 235, R-So.) and **Bo Baggerly** (6-1, 210, R-Jr.).

John Stokes (6-5, 228, So.) departed Spring Practice as the probable starting strongside linebacker. He was one of three true freshmen to see action last year. **Austin Newton** (6-3, 220, R-So.) will compete with Stokes.

Vanderbilt added three linebackers in the 2008 signing class: **Tristan Strong** (6-1, 220), **DeAndre Jones** (6-0, 220) and **Dexter Daniels** (6-1, 210, Fr.).

CORNERBACKS The Commodores appear in excellent shape at cornerback where three top-notch starters return from a year ago and two dependable seniors are waiting in support. The unit was one of the SEC's top ranked last year,

helping to produce 19 interceptions, most by a Vanderbilt defense in nearly two decades.

Both starters from a year ago – D.J. Moore (5-10, 182, Jr.) and Myron Lewis (6-3, 202, Jr.) - are back, hoping to build on impressive seasons. Moore was a dynamic player last year, unanimously voted All-SEC by coaches and media. He ranked among SEC and NCAA leaders with six interceptions and

16 defensed passes. A triple-threat for the field, Moore gives the Commodores a proven playmaker in the secondary.

Lewis also impressed last year as a first-year starter, proving to be a physical cover corner gifted with imposing size. He topped the squad and ranked among the SEC's elite with 12 deflected passes.


Dariron Spead (5-10, 186, R-Jr.), a superb open-field tackler who blends knowledge of schemes with athleticism, has been the Commodores' top nickelback for the last two years. Though he did not see full contact last spring, Spead is expected to return fully healthy for preseason camp.

The Commodores feature excellent depth

at cornerback. Two redshirt seniors with previous starting experience, **Josh Allen** (5-9, 184) and **Jared Fagan** (5-9, 180), will look to expand their roles. Both are assets to the secondary, with the versatility to fill any of

SAFETIES This

position seems like an area of strength for the Commodore defense, with a pair of quality starters and the top two reserves preparing to compete during preseason. Three-year

starting strong safety **Reshard Langford** (6-2, 212, R-Sr.) is back for his final year. Langford is a hard-hitting, All-SEC caliber player who virtually every Commodore player voted as their captain. Langford's superb qualities as a field leader are sure to benefit the defense in 2008.

Langford's counterpart at free safety, **Ryan Hamilton** (6-2, 210, R-Jr.) blossomed as a second-year starter. Another punishing tackler, Hamilton set career bests in virtually every statistical category last year.

One of the most intriguing Commodores to watch this season is **Brent Trice** (6-3, 214, Jr.). Blessed with superb athleticism in a crowded crop of safeties, Trice needs a strong spring performance to demand increased playing time. Trice can play either safety position.

The Commodores' experience at safety extends to **Joel Caldwell** (6-1, 190, R-Jr.), who spent his first year at the position as a second-team reserve after starting at cornerback in 2006.

The Commodores signed four prospects in the secondary: **Casey Hayward** (6-0, 178), **AI Owens** (6-2, 198), **Micah Powell** (6-0, 192) and **Sean Richardson** (6-2, 190).

COMMODORE SPECIAL TEAMS

PLACEKICKING Three-year starter **Bryant Hahnfeldt** (5-11, 185, Sr.) returns for his final year as the Commodores' primary placekicker. Hahnfeldt's career at Vanderbilt has featured highs and lows. His pressure placements have taken down the likes of Georgia on the road. At the same time, Hahnfeldt's career field goal percentage of 61.1 percent needs to improve. The senior, on target to become the team's all-time placekicking scorer, will enter camp fully healthy after concluding the last two seasons with leg injuries that hindered his effectiveness.

Hahnfeldt is the only Commodore kicking prospect with collegiate




