

### **HAWKINS FIELD**

Hawkins Field serves as the home of the Vanderbilt Commodores and with recently completed facilities it stands as one of the top college baseball parks in the country. Now in its 12th season of existence, Hawkins Field greets fans with chairback seats close to the field of play with bleacher seating in the outfield. The 35-foot Green Monster wall in left field promises unique opportunities for excitement and a first-rate field that prevents bad hops and promotes dazzling defensive gems from the infielders and outfielders alike.

With a brick and rod-iron fence design, Hawkins Field features a classic baseball park atmosphere coupled with a modern design that includes more than 2,200 chairback seats and a state-of-the-art press box. Still nestled along side Vanderbilt Stadium and Memorial Gymnasium on the west end of campus, the ballpark was constructed as the Commodores' first baseball-only facility in school history. It was built near the exact location of



McGugin Field, which served as Vanderbilt baseball's home field for 76 years and part-time football practice field.

A \$4.5 million project to add on to Hawkins Field was completed in the Spring of 2006. Phase Two saw the addition of over 475 new stadium seats along the baselines.

Phase Three included the construction of a two-story complex along the third baseline, including locker rooms, a weight room, coaches' offices and a Hall of Fame. It was completed at the end of the 2006 season and now houses the team. The team also has a new pitcher's area enclosed in the football stadium next door, as well as a new indoor batting cage inside Memorial Gym.

In 2009, permanent bleacher seating was added in the outfield from the right field foul pole to the Green Monster wall in left. In addition, 200 chairback seats were added on the first base side and a new trainer's room was created along with renovated dugouts.

The summer of 2012 saw the most dramatic change to the facility when the natural grass field was ripped up in favor of a synthetic surface. The surface is not a typical synthetic surface featuring multiple blade lengths and sand/rubber mixture on the infield and in the outfield. The only dirt on the field is on the pitcher's mound with center field featuring the world's largest Star V logo.

The complex is named for the Charles Hawkins Family. Charles Hawkins III, the stadium's namesake, was a long-time contributor to the Vanderbilt community, who graciously donated more than \$2 million to the stadium project. Sadly, he passed away on June 16, 2004, after his beloved Commodores ended one of their most successful seasons ever. A successful real estate developer, Hawkins played baseball and football for the Commodores from 1952-1954 and became the first Vanderbilt pitcher to earn All-Southeastern Conference honors. He was named to Vanderbilt's Athletic Hall of Fame in the fall of 2009. His father, Charles Hawkins II, lettered in both baseball and football at Vanderbilt in the mid-1920s.

Vanderbilt returns a wealth of talent and experience on the mound in 2014 but must replace six players from last year's lineup that helped set a Southeastern Conference record with a 26-3 mark to win the league title for the second time in three years.

SEC Player of the Year Tony Kemp will no longer be the top name on Tim Corbin's lineup card after signing a deal with the Houston Astros as a fifth round selection. All-Americans Kevin Ziomek, Connor Harrell and Mike Yastrzemski will also suit for pro teams this spring, leaving major voids on the Commodores' roster and in the locker room. But the Commodores' cupboard is not bare thanks to consecutive, top-ranked recruiting classes that are now in their second and third years in the program.

"This group just needs continual game growth and maturity," Head Coach Tim Corbin says. "We have a nice mix of talent on the mound and some developing talent in the field. The mental growth of learning how to compete as well as the personal development of each player will be the emphasis of our group as we move forward."

While the Dores have the talent on the roster the game experience is lacking with only Vince Conde and Xavier Turner starting more than 15 games last year.

"There will be five to six people on the field that have never been in this position before, so it will be a growth transition for many of those kids," Corbin says. "New roles and dealing with day-to-day mental stamina of playing. We just want to be better in two months than we are right now."

As usual a demanding schedule awaits the Commodores with non-conference series at Long Beach State and at home against Stanford before beginning SEC play with series against two teams that went to the College World Series last season in LSU and Mississippi State. In all, the Dores will play seven teams in the preseason Top 25.

"The schedule is tough and demanding," Corbin says. "We begin on the road against a Long Beach State team that brings back most of its players. This will be a strong challenge for us immediately. Illinois-Chicago, Stanford and Winthrop are our out of conference opponents. Stanford is very recognizable, but the other two are future regional squads that pose many issues for us. Then we start the SEC season off with LSU and Mississippi State... enough said."



### **PITCHING**

Much like a year ago the Commodores' pitching staff returns nearly intact with the Dores losing only lefty All-American Kevin Ziomek to the Detroit Tigers as a second round selection. But even with the loss of Ziomek, Vanderbilt returns 49 of the team's 66 starts and 477 innings of the squad's 596 from a 2013 staff that posted a 2.76 ERA, allowed opponents to hit only .220 and struck out 520 batters.

The staff returns two pitchers and 2014 preseason All-Americans that set single-season school records last season in Tyler Beede, who led the nation with 14 wins, and Brian Miller, who saved 16 games. With the junior duo of Beede and Miller leading the way the pitching staff appears to be a strength for the Dores.

Corbin and pitching coach Scott Brown have plenty of options for starters with six arms in the mix to be the first guy on the bump.

"Starting pitching is very open right now. Tyler Beede, Jared Miller, T.J. Pecoraro, Carson Fulmer, Walker Buehler and Tyler Ferguson would all be considered starters at this point," Corbin says. "Beede, obviously, is a front-runner. He manned a starting spot as a freshman and grew into one of the best starting






pitchers in the country last year. We will continue to train six or seven guys for that role right now. We have been fortunate in the last couple of years to have consistency with our starting spots and we hope to have that again."

The Commodores' bullpen is loaded with talent on both sides with everyone back from a crew that posted a 2.40 ERA and allowed only 22% of inherited runners to score. Brian Miller, the school's all-time saves leader in just two seasons with 21, anchors the group at the back end of the pen. Fulmer, a Freshman All-American, could also play a vital role in the bullpen if he does not land in the starting rotation. The right-hander was a force out of the VU pen last season going 3-0 with a 2.39 ERA with 51 strikeouts in 52.2 innings.

"Our bullpen will have a nice mix of arm variations and rhythm changes," Corbin says. "We will certainly use the pitchers who don't start, moving them to a bullpen roll. Like the starting situation, it's too early to put kids into specific bullpen positions. Brian Miller has been in that role ever since he landed here as a freshman and will continue to have a large impact. Adam Ravenelle, Luke Stephenson and freshman Hayden Stone are very good candidates from the right side. We are continuing the development of Jordan Sheffield; if he continues to strengthen his arm and stamina he could



find himself there as well. Steven Rice and freshmen Ryan Johnson, Ben Bowden and Jon Kilichowski are all left-handed pitchers who could figure into this spot as well. Ravenelle and Rice have certainly separated themselves enough from an experience and development standpoint to be big factors."

Ravenelle and Rice are coming off big summers with Ravenelle helping Cotuit to a Cape Cod League title along with Brian Miller and Rhett Wiseman. Rice was named the Reliever of the Year in the New England Collegiate Baseball League for Sanford after striking out 52 in 28.2 innings and going 5-2 with a 0.94 ERA and seven saves.

### CATCHING

The spot behind the plate will be one of the positions to feature new faces for the Commodores this season with junior Chris Harvey leading the way. A pair of freshmen - Jason Delay and Karl Ellison - joins Harvey behind the dish. The trio must replace Spencer Navin, who signed with the Los Angeles Dodgers last summer. Navin started 56 games last year hitting .302 with four home runs and 34 RBI.

"Our catching situation will get better as the year progresses," Corbin says. "Chris Harvey improves every time he steps on the field. He brings two years of backup experience, but has grown nicely as a receiver and thrower. Jason




Delay and Karl Ellison are two very promising freshmen that will have playing opportunities this year."

Harvey played in 29 games as a sophomore, starting 13, hitting .250 with four doubles, three triples and nine RBI. Harvey's three triples trailed only Tony Kemp for the team lead in 2013. The

Commodores responded in Harvey's 13 starts going 11-2 with the pitchers posting a 3.01 ERA. Delay and Ellison each showed improvement during the fall both offensively and defensively. Both backstops were highly recruited out of high school.





### **INFIELD**


The Dores' infield is the only position on the field where game experience can be found with junior Vince Conde and Freshman All-American Xavier Turner slated to hold down the left side of the infield.


After starting the season at third base, Conde moved to shortstop in the eighth game of the year and never looked back posting career numbers as a sophomore hitting .307 with 18 doubles, six home runs and 44 RBI.

Turner's collegiate career began as the team's designated hitter but with Conde's move to shortstop, Turner took advantage of the opportunity moving to the hot corner permanently. The Sandusky, Ohio native hit .324 with 40 runs scored and 36 RBI to go along with 22 stolen bases in his first Commodore campaign.

"The left side of our infield should stay intact," Corbin says.
"Turner and Conde should play third base and shortstop,
respectively. They both move very well and have enough athleticism and arm strength to give us good coverage and range
on that side of the field."

The infield will get a boost from talented sophomore Dansby

Swanson, who missed much of his freshman season with injuries. Swanson played in just 11 games, starting four, before being sidelined for good in April.

"Swanson will play somewhere, he could be our shortstop right now, but Vicente has played that position very well for the last year, so we may slide Dansby to second base," Corbin says. "He's a very good all-around player and will be extremely rangy at that position."

The Commodores hope Zander Wiel picks up where he left off last season. Wiel was inserted into the starting lineup in the second game of a doubleheader at Georgia in April and produced one of the greatest performances in school history by a player in his first career start. Wiel blasted a pair of home

runs along with a double to go 3-for-3 with four runs and five RBI to lead the Dores to a win. Wiel stayed hot down the stretch as the team's primary DH earning Freshman All-SEC honors. He finished the year hitting .305 with five home runs and 27 RBI in just 33 games, 15 starts.

"Wiel is our frontrunner at first base; he's a good athlete for his size and has improved his glove skills," Corbin says.




Sophomore Tyler Campbell brings a unique blend of tools to the infield with the ability to play virtually anywhere. Freshmen



Nolan Rogers, Ro Coleman, Tyler Green, Aubrey McCarty and Penn Murfee all add depth and could push for playing time.



"Tyler Campbell has the ability to play all infield positions and will most likely do that during the year," Corbin says. "Nolan Rogers and Ro Coleman could also find their way into the infield at various times."



### **OUTFIELD**

The Commodores' outfield will look completely different in 2014 with three-year starters Connor Harrell and Mike Yastrzemski graduating last spring along with fellow senior Jack Lupo. However, much like other positions on the field the Dores have the talent to fill the void. Junior John Norwood possesses the tools to make an immediate impact in the outfield and in the lineup. Sophomores Rhett Wiseman and Kyle Smith contributed offensively as true freshmen last year combining for seven home runs and 33 RBI. Wiseman's walk-off home run helped Vandy finish off a series sweep of Illinois-Chicago early



in the year and Kyle Smith's grand slam against Tennessee sent the Dores to a sweep of the Volunteers.

"Our outfield may be the biggest question right now," Corbin says. "Obviously when you lose three seniors like Connor Harrell, Mike Yastrzemski and Jack Lupo in one spot it impacts a position. We have very good parts, we just don't

know what parts will be installed. Rhett Wiseman and Johnny Norwood should both play somewhere. They possess athleticism. strength and have had various experiences out there. Coleman, Rogers, Bryan Reynolds and Kyle Smith could all be impactful as well. They have different styles of play, but they all have bright futures."

The freshmen trio of Ro Coleman,



Bryan Reynolds and Nolan Rogers bring an intriguing mix of skills to the table. Both Coleman and Reynolds are switch hitters and Rogers brings another potential lefty bat to the lineup. Coleman posted a solid fall after moving to the outfield from second base. The Chicago-native did not let the defensive switch slow down his offensive game, ripping a triple in the first at-bat of the Black & Gold Series off Tyler Beede. Reynolds is a rangy athlete with power potential from both sides of the plate. Rogers could find time in the outfield or at second base this spring.

Junior Will Cooper is coming off an injury shortened sophomore season and will look to get back in the mix. Freshman Drake Parker brings lots of speed to the outfield and can use his speed to take the extra base or steal one too.

### **DESIGNATED HITTER**

The designated hitter will again be a very flexible spot in the Commodores' lineup in 2014. With multiple switch hitters on the roster Corbin and hitting coach Travis Jewett can play the hot bat, the best match-up or mix and match throughout the game.

Sophomore Kyle Smith looks to be the front runner for the DH spot if he does not lock down a starting spot in the outfield. The Mount Juliet, Tenn. native showed lots of power potential and patience as a freshman last season and during fall practice.

If Smith does secure a spot in the starting lineup, the DH spot opens up to several possibilities. Freshmen switch hitters Bryan Reynolds and Ro Coleman bring very different skill sets to the team but both are loaded with potential.

Junior Chris Harvey could also help fill the DH spot in Corbin's lineup when he's not behind the plate.





### 4 Tim Corbin - Head Coach

Head Coach Tim Corbin begins his 12th season at the helm of the Vanderbilt baseball program. During his tenure Corbin has turned the Commodores into a national power and taken the program to unprecedented success leading Vanderbilt to the College World Series for the first time in 2011.

Corbin's overall record of 465-229 (.670) is second all-time in terms of wins at Vanderbilt, and first in terms of winning percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

For the second time in his career Corbin was named the SEC Coach of the Year by the league's coaches after the Commodores posted one of the best seasons in school history in 2013. The Commodores matched the school record

with a 54-12 mark and smashed the Southeastern Conference record, finishing the conference slate an amazing 26-3. Vanderbilt won every series during the regular season, including nine series sweeps. The squad outscored opponents by an average of 8.2-3.9 runs per game with the pitching staff turning in a sub 3.00 ERA for the second time in three seasons. Five Commodores earned All-American honors led by first team All-Americans Tony Kemp and Tyler Beede. Kemp became just the second Commodore in history to be named SEC Player of the Year and just the third in league history to win both Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year awards in his career. Over the summer, Beede pitched for Team USA to become the 12th Vanderbilt player to don the Stars & Stripes.

The Commodores' SEC regular season championship was the team's second in three years and third under Corbin. For the fourth time in five years the Dores played in the SEC Championship game and made their eighth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament hosting Regionals for the third time in school history and Super Regionals for the second

The 2012 Vanderbilt Commodores overcame a slow start to the season to post the team's seventh straight trip to the postseason. The Dores finished the season as one of the hottest teams in the nation winning four of the last four SEC series of the regular season, including series victories over No. 3 Kentucky and at No. 4 LSU. Vanderbilt rolled into the SEC Tournament having won 12 of the last 15 regular season games. Corbin guided the Commodores to the championship game for the sixth time in nine trips, losing to a red-hot Mississippi State team in the final. Vanderbilt made the NCAA Tournament with a trip to the Raleigh Regional finishing runner-up to host NC State to end the season 35-28.

For the second consecutive season (2011-12) the Commodores' freshman class was tabbed as the nation's best by Baseball America, becoming the first school in the poll's 13-year history to post back-to-back top classes. Vanderbilt's 2012 freshman class was the unanimous top class, also picking up the honor from Collegiate Baseball. Since Corbin's arrival in 2003, Vanderbilt has earned three top-ranked recruiting classes (2005) and is the only school in the nation to have more than two top classes.

In 2012, one of Corbin's prize pupils, David Price, was named the American League Cy Young Award winner. Price was the top overall pick by Tampa Bay in 2007 after a stellar career at Vanderbilt. The southpaw went 20-5 with a 2.56 ERA and 205 strikeouts over 211 innings for the Rays to become the first Commodore to win the Cy Young.

The Commodores' magical run to Omaha saw several school records equaled or passed. VU won 54 games to match the school record set in 2007 and set the SEC record with 12 players selected in the Major League Baseball draft. Hawkins Field hosted the NCAA Regional round for just the second time in history and Super Regionals for the first time with the Dores sweeping through both rounds en route to the College World Series. Individual awards supplemented the team's success with Grayson Garvin earning SEC Pitcher of the Year and Tony Kemp picking up SEC Freshman of the Year honors. Garvin became the second VU pitcher to earn the prestigious league award joining David Price, while Kemp is the second Commodore to be named the league's freshman of the year along with Pedro Alvarez. All four awards have come under Corbin's watch. Sonny Gray, Jason Esposito, Aaron Westlake and Garvin all garnered All-American honors with Kevin Ziomek, T.J. Pecoraro, Conrad Gregor and Kemp being named Freshmen All-American. The 2010 Commodores racked up the second-most wins in school history finishing the

year with a 46-20 mark, eventually falling at Florida State in the third game of the Super Regional. In order to get to Florida State the team advanced out of the Louisville regional, a place that saw the Dores' 2009 season end. During the regular season, Corbin led the Commodores to a 16-12 mark, good enough for third in the Southeastern Conference East division behind Florida and eventual national champion South Carolina.

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

In 2009, Corbin took a young squad with seven new offensive starters and molded them into a team that finished with a 37-27 record and runner-up finishes in the SEC tournament and the NCAA Louisville Regional. The 2009 draft saw six Commodores selected, highlighted by junior pitcher Mike Minor's selection with the seventh overall pick by the Atlanta Braves. His selection marked the fifth time in the last three seasons a Vanderbilt player has been picked in the first round.

In 2008, Corbin guided the Commodores to their second straight 40-win season (41-22) and third consecutive appearance in the NCAA tournament. The Commodores battled through the first half of the season without the services of Preseason Player of the Year Pedro Alvarez and managed to record road sweeps over Mississippi State and Tennessee for the first time in school history.

The 2008 draft saw eight Commodores selected, highlighted by Pedro Alvarez who was taken with the second overall pick by the Pittsburgh Pirates. Vanderbilt became the first school in draft history to have the first overall pick (David Price in 2007) and second overall pick in consecutive drafts.

In 2007, Corbin guided the Commodores to their best season ever, finishing with a school record 54 wins. The team also achieved a No. 1 national ranking for the first time in school history and held that honor for 13-of-15 weeks during the regular season.

The Vanderbilt baseball team also swept through the Southeastern Conference, winning both the regular season and tournament crown for the first time ever and it marked the first time an SEC team had done it since 1996. The team lost only one conference series the entire season against SEC West Division winner Arkansas in Fayetteville and avenged the series loss by defeating the Razorbacks in the SEC tournament title game.

The conference recognized Corbin for the work he had done, naming him SEC Coach of the Year. Corbin also picked up Co-National Coach of the Year honors from College Baseball Insider and regional Coach of the Year honors by the American Baseball Coaches Association.

The Commodores hosted their first-ever NCAA regional as the No. 1 National Seed and arrived as a power in college baseball. Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities. In the summer of 2006 he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba. The .919 winning percentage set a new national team high and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee.

In 2006, he led a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth-place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters being freshmen or sophomores. For the

second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional. The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional, they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record. Along the way Vanderbilt racked up 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first) and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

His first Vanderbilt team in 2003 finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a seasonending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the series finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games. That squad set then school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168). The team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each among the top 15 at the time. Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort.

In addition to the on field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room.

In 2009, permanent seats in the outfield pushed Hawkins Field seating capacity to double the amount when Corbin arrived in 2003. These upgrades reinforced the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Corbin had achieved. In the latest facility improvement the playing surface at Hawkins Field was replaced during the summer of 2012 with a synthetic surface. The timing of the change to turf was perfect as the Commodores played multiple games in bad weather during the 2013 season.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay in 2005, 2011 and 2012 as their recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America. Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program with eight Commodores being selected in the first round since 2003.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade but made the post-season tournament in 2004. During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series wins in all. His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick, pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

Corbin came to Vanderbilt following nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson. During his time there (1994-2002), the Tigers had more victories than all but four programs. Clemson won more than 71-percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and reached the College World Series four times

(1995, 1996, 2000 and 2002). The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994. Corbin was promoted twice during his tenure. He received the title of assistant head coach in 1998 and in September 2001 became associate head coach and recruiting coordinator. Along the way, he crafted a national reputation as one of the most respected assistant coaches in the country. His efforts helped produce nine straight recruiting classes that were ranked among the top 25 nationally. His on-field work with outfielders and hitters helped 20 Clemson players earn All-America honors and 36 to be drafted to play professional baseball.

Corbin's dedication and attention to detail caught the eye of the national baseball publication Baseball America on numerous occasions. In 1997, it touted the Clemson coaching staff as one of the top five "College Recruiting Staffs" in the country. It later tabbed the 1999 Tiger freshman class as No. 1 nationally. In 2000, Baseball America and the American Baseball Coaches Association named Corbin its National Assistant Coach of the Year. Also in 2000, Southern California head coach Mike Gillespie served as skipper of the USA Baseball team and chose Corbin as an assistant for his staff. That group guided the Americans to a gold-medal finish at the World Championships in the Netherlands, and that team set a national program record for best winning percentage (.900).

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin was head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. There he restarted a baseball program that had been dormant for several years. He directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to NCAA Division II status and had a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, the Blue Hose made three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93), and Corbin earned South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.

#### **50 TRAVIS JEWETT**

Hitting Coach/Recruiting Coordinator

Second Season Washington State, 1993

Travis Jewett begins his second season as the Commodores hitting coach and recruiting coordinator after a very successful first season on West End in 2013.

The Commodores' offense clicked under Jewett's guidance in 2013 with the Dores improving in virtually every offensive category hitting .313 as a team - 45 points higher than 2012 - to lead all Southeastern Conference teams. Vanderbilt also led the SEC in slugging percentage (.439), on-base

percentage (.407), runs scored (459), RBI (418), triples (17), walks (295) and stolen bases (139). Along with the team successes, multiple individuals produced career years under Jewett for the first time. Tony Kemp was named SEC Player of the Year after hitting a career-best .391 and posting an on-base percentage of .471 in his final year in Black & Gold. Connor Harrell bounced back from a tough junior season to be the Commodores' main source of power with a team-high 12 home runs. Harrell hit a career-best .312 while driving in 67 runs, sixth-most in

Jewett's leadership with the team's outfielders molded the Commodores' outfield into one of the best in the nation in 2013 with seniors Jack Lupo, Connor Harrell and Mike Yastrzemski roaming the 'green ocean' during the year. Harrell and Yastrzemski started all 66 games in center and right field, respectively.

Prior to Vanderbilt, Jewett spent the previous three years at Arizona State, where he oversaw the Sun Devils' hitters and recruiting while serving as Associate Head Coach.

Jewett coached in the Pac-12 for 11 seasons prior to his arrival on West End spending five years at Washington State and three seasons at Washington along with three at Arizona State. At WSU he helped lead the Cougars to a NCAA Tournament berth in 2009, their first since 1990. Prior to coaching at WSU, Jewett spent three years at Washington coaching infielders and third base. The Huskies made the NCAA Tournament in each of Jewett's three seasons (2002-04), reaching the Regional finals all three years.

Jewett served as an assistant coach at Gonzaga from 1999-2001, helping lead the Bulldogs to a West Coast Conference division title in 2001.

Jewett's three seasons at Arizona State saw the Sun Devils go 131-48 (.732), including a trip to the College World Series in 2010 that ended with a loss to eventual champion South Carolina. The Sun Devils offense produced under Jewett, hitting over .300 as a team during his tenure and averaging nearly seven runs per game winning the Pac-10 league title in 2010 and hosting NCAA Regionals in each of his first two years.

The 2012 season saw Arizona State finish with a 36-20 mark, including an 18-12 record in the Pac-12. The Sun Devils hit 42 home runs and scored 339 runs with a .443 slugging percentage. The team finished the season winning 12 of its final 16 games. Joey DeMichele's .336 average paced the team and Abe Ruiz led the way with 13 home runs. DeMichele and Deven Marrero were both selected as All-Pac-12 perfermors.

In 2011, the Sun Devils finished 43-18 with a 17-10 mark in Pac-10 play to finish second in the league. The squad hit .301 as a team led by Joey DeMichele's .368 average and nine home runs. Following the season five Sun Devils earned All-Pac 10 honors with Deven Marrero being named the Defensive Player of the Year and DeMichele earning All-American status. As a team the Sun Devils led the Pac-10 in home runs (37), slugging percentage (.444) and stolen bases (99). Arizona State hosted and swept through the NCAA Regional before falling at Texas in the Super Regional round in three games.

Arizona State was a powerhouse in 2010 winning the Pac-10 title with a 20-7 mark and earning the top national seed in the NCAA Tournament. The team swept its way through Regionals and Super Regionals and into the school's 22nd College World Series. Offensively, Jewett's hitters posted a .337 team batting average while belting 68 home runs and scoring 520 runs. The club also swiped the third-most bases in school history with an amazing 136 steals.

His three-year stint at Arizona State saw 31 players drafted; including first round pick Deven Marrero in 2012. Of the 31 Sun Devils selected during Jewett's tenure 19 were position players.

During his time at Washington State he helped lead the Cougars from a 1-23 Pac-10 record in his first year to a 19-8 mark to finish second in the league in his final season in Pullman. The Cougars made their first trip to the NCAA

At Washington State, 15 Cougars were selected in the major league baseball draft during Jewett's five seasons.

While at Washington the Huskies went 114-65-2 in Jewett's three seasons. He instructed the infielders and coached third base for the Huskies while helping lead the hitters. Nine players earned All-Pac 10 honors, including Tim Lincecum, with four players earning Freshman All-American accolades (Aaron Hathaway, Kyle Larsen, Brent Lillibridge and Lincecum).

During his tenure with Washington 17 Huskies were drafted by major league baseball.

At Gonzaga, Jewett was in charge of the infield and coaching third base while assisting with the offense. Eight players were named First Team All-West Coast Conference during Jewett's time in Spokane with Barry Matthews earning All-American honors. Gonzaga won the WCC regular season title in Jewett's final season after finishing second the previous two seasons.

With the Zags, Jewett helped four players be drafted in his three seasons.

During his coaching career, Jewett has coached numerous major leaguers, including Jason Bay, Brent Lillibridge, Bo Hart, Sean White and 2008 and 2009 Cy Young Award winner Tim Lincecum.

Jewett coached with Joe Ross at Washington and Mark Machtolf at Gonzaga, both Ross and Machtolf served on Tim Corbin's 2006 Team USA staff.

A native of Tacoma, Washington, Jewett began his collegiate coaching career at Tacoma Community College, first as an assistant in 1994 followed by two years as the head coach. He was the head coach at Edmonds (Wash.) Community College for two seasons, earning NWAACC Coach of the Year and National Junior College Coach of the Year honors in 1998.

Jewett is a 1993 graduate of Washington State. He played two seasons at Lower Columbia College in Longview, Wash. before finishing his degree at WSU, where he did not play baseball.

Second Season SUNY-Cortland, 2000

Scott Brown enters his second season as the pitching coach at Vanderbilt after an outstanding first season in 2013.

The Commodores' pitching staff posted one of the best years in Vanderbilt history in Brown's first season going 54-12 with 24 saves and a team ERA of 2.76 — marking the second time in three years the Dores have posted a sub 3.00 ERA. The VU pitching staff was dominant led by All-Americans Tyler Beede, Kevin Ziomek and Brian Miller leading the way with

Freshman All-American Carson Fulmer playing a key role. Beede and Ziomek paired up to be a force for the Commodores combining to win 25 games with Beede winning a school record 14 games. Ziomek capped his career with an 11-win season and the lowest ERA (2.12) for a Commodore pitcher since the legendary Jeff Peeples posted a 1.64 ERA in 1973. Miller became the school's all-time saves leader with a school single-season record 16 saves in 2013 to give him 21 in his first two seasons in Nashville.

Brown's work with freshmen Fulmer, Walker Buehler and Tyler Ferguson was evident as the trio improved throughout the season. Fulmer blossomed into one of the Dores' most valuable pitchers in the bullpen down the stretch. Buehler spent time in the weekend starting rotation and Ferguson started four midweek games for the squad going 3-1.

Brown joined the Commodores after nine successful seasons at St. John's as the Red Storm's pitching coach. During his time at St. John's, Brown oversaw remarkable progress in the Red Storm pitching staff, a group that has had 15 players sign professional contracts in the last eight seasons. Four pitchers (Rob Delaney, Craig Hansen, Anthony Varvaro and Scott Barnes) that Brown mentored at St. John's have played major league baseball.

Led by First Team All-Big East and second team All-Region honoree Kyle Hansen, the 2011 staff tossed four shutouts, had 399 strikeouts and limited opponents to just a .261 average. Hansen, who tossed a complete game shutout against Big East foe Notre Dame, set a new school-record with 107.2 innings pitched and finished with 106 strikeouts, good for sixth all-time.

The 2010 pitching staff helped the team win a school-record 43 games and racked up 455 strikeouts, second-most in school history. A Third Team All-Big East selection, freshman Kyle Hansen earned Freshman All-America honors from Baseball America, Louisville Slugger and the NCBWA, and was the Big East Tournament Most Outstanding Player. Three players—Daniel Burawa (12th round), Bruce Kern (23rd) and Ryan Cole (34th)—were drafted in the MLB Draft and alums Rob Delaney and Anthony Varvaro each made their Major League debuts.

A season after seven pitchers graduated or were drafted, a young 2009 staff that featured four freshmen ranked sixth in the Big East with 328 strikeouts. Brown also saw two of his alums, Rob Delaney and Anthony Varvaro, added to the MLB 40-man rosters for their respective teams.

Brown helped lead the 2008 pitching staff to a 3.78 ERA, which ranked first in the Big East and ninth in the country and gave the Red Storm staff an ERA that ranked in the top ten nationally for the third-straight season. Lefty George Brown was a second team All-American, the Big East Pitcher of the Year and a first team all-conference selection, while Scott Barnes (first team) and Colin Lynch (second team) also earned all-conference honors. Five players were also selected in the MLB Draft, as Barnes (8th round), Justin Gutsie (14th), Jared Yecker (22nd), Brown (27th) and Lynch (40th) all signed professional contracts.

The 2007 staff posted a 3.48 ERA, which ranked 10th in the country and second in the Big East, and two pitchers earned All-Big East recognition as southpaw Scott Barnes was named to the first team and lefty George Brown earned third team honors.

In just his third season at St. John's, Brown guided the 2006 pitching staff to an ERA (3.21) that ranked fifth in the country.

The 2005 Red Storm staff had a combined 3.38 ERA and set a school-record with a conference-leading 499 strikeouts. Craig Hansen and Anthony Varvaro each earned All-America honors, while Hansen was also named the Big East Pitcher of the Year. Four pitchers also went on to sign professional contracts as Hansen (first round), Varvaro (12th) and Anthony Sullivan (19th) were selected in the amateur draft, and Jim Wladyka signed as a free agent. Hansen went on to become the first player in Red Sox history to make his major league debut the same year he was drafted.

In 2004, his first season at St. John's, Brown guided the Red Storm pitching

staff to a 3.86 ERA, which ranked second in the Big East and was nearly a runand-a-half better than the previous season. Varvaro posted an 8-3 record and earned Second Team All-Big East honors, while Hansen set a school-record with 10 saves.

From 2002-04, Brown served as the head coach of the Sanford Mainers of the New England Collegiate Baseball League, one of the top summer wood-bat leagues in the nation. The Mainers won the NECBL Championship in 2004 and Brown was named the league's Manager of the Year.

Brown came to St. John's from the State University of New York at Cortland, where he served four years as an assistant coach. Brown helped guide the SUNY-Cortland program to a 35-11 record in 2003, including a 15-1 record in the State University of New York Athletic Conference. The Red Dragons won their seventh-straight league title, 12th in 13 years and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for an 11th-straight season. Brown guided the pitchers to a school-record 333 strikeouts during the 2003 season, and the staff finished the season ranked ninth in the country with a 2.93 ERA.

In the summers of 2000 and 2001, Brown was also the head coach for the Cortland Apples of the New York Collegiate Baseball League. He led the team to the league's best regular season record (25-15) in 2000.

Brown first entered the coaching ranks after a stellar three-year pitching career at Cortland. A second-team All-American in 1999 after going 9-1 with a 2.03 ERA, Brown racked up 19 career victories at Cortland, a mark that was tied for fifth-most in school history when he graduated.







### Vanderbilt & USA Baseball

Over the last decade Vanderbilt has been extremely well represented on various USA Baseball Teams. At least one Commodore has donned the Stars and Stripes during the summer six of the past seven years and since 1997, 12 Vanderbilt players have played for Team

### Tim Corbin (Years at Vanderbilt: 2003-present)

USA National Team (2006- Head Coach, 2000- Assistant Coach)

Corbin guided the National Team to its then-best record ever as the team went 28-2-1 over the summer, culminating with a gold medal at the World University Championships in Havana, Cuba.

In 2000, Southern Cal head coach Mike Gillespie served as head coach and chose Tim Corbin as an assistant for his staff. That group won a gold medal at the World Championships in the Netherlands.

## Pedro Alvarez (Years at Vanderbilt: 2006-08) USA National Team (Summer, 2006-07)

Led USA National Team for second straight year with a .315 batting average, seven homers and 30 RBI in 2007. As a freshman in 2006, he showed no-ill effects with the wood bat and led the all-star contingent with a .379 batting average to go along with five homers, 12 doubles and 43 RBI.

### Tyler Beede (Years at Vanderbilt: 2012-present)

USA National Team (Summer, 2013)

Beede became the seventh Commodore pitcher to don the Red, White & Blue pitching in five games, three starts, going 1-1.

### Jason Esposito (Years at Vanderbilt: 2009-11)

USA National Team (Summer, 2010)

Was a late addition to the 2010 squad but started 12 of the 14 games he played in hitting .273 with three extra-base hits and six RBI for silver-medal winning team at FISU World University Baseball Championships in Japan.

### Ryan Flaherty (Years at Vanderbilt: 2006-08)

USA National Team (Summer, 2007)

Started predominantly at second base on the team that won a silver medal at the Pan American Games in Rio de Janeiro. Batted .270 with two homers, seven doubles and 14 RBI in 34 games (30 starts).

### Sonny Gray (Years at Vanderbilt: 2009-11)

USA National Team (Summer, 2009-10)

Third Vandy pitcher in five years to be tabbed Summer Player of the Year joining David Price and Mike Minor after going 3-0 with a 0.38 ERA in five games, four starts. In 2009, he went 3-1 with a 0.75 ERA in eight appearances. Struck out 27 in 24 innings while opponents hit only .139 off him.

### Warner Jones (Years at Vanderbilt: 2003-05)

Invited to USA National Team Tryouts (2004)

### Matt Kata (Years at Vanderbilt: 1997-99)

USA Junior National Team (1996)

### Mike Minor (Years at Vanderbilt: 2007-09)

USA National Team (Summer, 2007-08)

Named Summer Player of the Year in 2008 after leading team to 24-0 record. Went 3-0 with a 0.75 ERA with 37 K's in 36 innings. Went 5-2 with 1.64 ERA and developed into team ace by the end of the summer. Struck out 37 with just four walks in 33.0 innings.

### Ryan Mullins (Years at Vanderbilt: 2003-05)

USA National Team (Summer, 2004)

Mullins was one of five pitchers who combined to throw the first no-hitter in USA Baseball recorded history (since 1984) as the USA National Baseball Team defeated Canada, 9-0, at Durham Bulls Athletic Park June 24, 2004. Mullins pitched 2.1 innings.

### David Price (Years at Vanderbilt: 2005-07)

USA National Team (Summer, 2005-06)

Price was the ace of the 2006 USA Baseball National Team's Gold Medal Winning squad. Finished 5-1 with a 0.20 ERA in eight starts with 61 strikeouts and only seven walks win 44.0 innings. Price was named a Summer All-American by Baseball America after a solid summer for Team USA in 2005. He went 2-0 with a 1.26 ERA in five games with 39 strikeouts and 13 walks in 28.2 innings.

### Mark Prior (Years at Vanderbilt: 1999)

USA National Team (1999-00)

### Casey Weathers (Years at Vanderbilt: 2006-07)

USA National Team (Summer, 2006)

Weathers was a late addition to the squad after dominating in the Alaska Summer League where he was named closer of the year. He finished his USA stint with an appearance in the gold medal game against Chinese Taipei. He pitched a total of nine innings in sever games and notched 17 strikeouts









### Jeff Peeples

The award pays tribute to Jeff Peeples, who was a four-year letterwinner at Vanderbilt from 1970-73

He was a three-time All-Southeastern Conference selection who helped guide the Commodores to three SEC Tournaments and the 1972 SEC Championship.

Peeples was one of only two pitchers in SEC history to lead the league in earned run average for two consecutive years (1971-72). He also led the conference in victories (12) and strikeouts

Peeples still holds Vanderbilt career records for wins (29) and earned run average (1.68).

He went on to play professionally for the St. Louis Cardinals and was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame in the spring of 2001



### Nicholas S. Zeppos Chancellor

Chancellor Nicholas S. Zeppos was raised in Milwaukee, where he spent many an afternoon watching the great Hank Aaron of the Braves slug home runs in the old County Stadium.

Named Vanderbilt's eighth chancellor in 2008, Zeppos has taken a keen interest in athletics at Vanderbilt during his more than two

decades at the university.

"I don't do the operations," Zeppos said. "I don't call the plays, I don't throw the passes. I see my job as simply trying to do whatever I can to support all of the talented people who do these things."

This support has included the endorsement of an athletics capital improvement plan expected to surpass \$50 million, which orchestrates efforts to improve the student experience for athletes and assists with recruiting.

"One thing I consider the ultimate compliment is when a coach calls me and says, Tve got a couple of recruits here. Could you meet them?"

A distinguished legal scholar, teacher and executive, Zeppos served from 2002 to February 2008 as Vanderbilt's chief academic officer, overseeing the university's undergraduate, graduate and professional education programs and research in liberal arts and sciences, engineering, music, education, business, law and divinity. As provost and vice chancellor, he chaired Vanderbilt's budgeting and capital planning council, as well as oversaw the dean of students and dean of admissions.

Zeppos has led a number of important initiatives at Vanderbilt, including the planning process for The Ingram Commons, a landmark transformation of the first-year experience; the Strategic Academic Planning Group; innovative efforts in undergraduate admissions and financial aid; and the development of new programs in Jewish studies, law and economics and genetics, among others

In a bold move to strength Vanderbilt's commitment to admitting undergraduates on the basis of accomplishment and achievement, rather than their ability to pay, Zeppos significantly expanded the financial aid program in 2009. By replacing undergraduate, need-based loans with grant and scholarship assistance, the university opened its doors wider to highly talented and qualified students of all economic, cultural and geographical backgrounds. The expanded aid program is funded by a combination of strategic budget allocations, the university's Shape the Future fundraising campaign, which under Zeppos' leadership raised over \$1.9 billion, and the current Opportunity Vanderbilt campaign.

Zeppos was recognized with five teaching awards at the law school before serving as an associate dean, associate provost, and provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs. He also served as interim chancellor for eight months prior to being formally appointed as Vanderbilt's eighth chancellor on March 1, 2008.

Zeppos is the Vice President of the 2013-14 executive committee of the Southeastern Conference and has been named President-elect for the 2014-16 term.

In the Nashville community, Zeppos serves on the boards of the Nashville Area Chamber of Commerce and the Nashville Public Education Foundation. He also serves on the National Security Higher Education Advisory Board and the Freedom Forum Diversity Institute Board.

From 1982 to 1987, Zeppos practiced law in Washington, D.C., at the United States Department of Justice and at Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering, where he specialized in appellate litigation involving complex regulatory, statutory and constitutional matters.

Zeppos is a 1979 magna cum laude graduate of the University of Wisconsin Law School, where he served as editor in chief of the Wisconsin Law Review and was selected as the outstanding graduate of his class. He studied history during his undergraduate years at the university, where he was a 1976 Phi Beta Kappa graduate.

He is married to Lydia A. Howarth, a graduate of the University of Chicago and Lawrence University, who is an editor. They have two sons, Benjamin and Nicholas.



### David Williams, II Director of Athletics

An integral part of the Commodore athletics community for the last decade, David Williams II serves in a full-time role as Athletics Director at Vanderbilt University.

Williams ranks among the university's most prominent leaders, serving in numerous capacities since arriving in Nashville in 2000. Aside from his role in McGugin Center, Williams

holds the titles of Vice Chancellor for University Affairs and Athletics and law professor at Vanderbilt.

He also is active with the SEC and NCAA in matters of negotiations, reforms, regulations and planning.

Williams has guided Vanderbilt Athletics since 2003 when the Board of Trustees and its administration accepted an initiative to more fully integrate Commodore athletics into the total Vanderbilt student life experience.

Today, Williams has firmly placed his stamp on the program, and has positioned Vanderbilt Athletics among the most innovative in the nation. The cumulative grade point for Vanderbilt student-athletes has continued to improve through Williams' tenure, reaching its highest level in more than two decades. Competitive successes, such as back-to-back bowl wins in football, recent SEC titles in baseball and women's cross country, is becoming an expectation on campus. Individual accomplishment has been increasing, with 11 Vanderbilt athletes being selected in the first round of their respective professional drafts in the last nine years.

Williams also demonstrated his leadership within the Vanderbilt program by orchestrating successful searches for exceptional coaches to guide Commodore sports. Recently he enticed Stanford University Defensive Coordinator Derek Mason to become the 28th head coach in Vanderbilt football history.

Williams also directed the search for men's golf coach Scott Limbaugh, who guided his first Vanderbilt squad to the NCAA Regional Championships.

Williams has kept top coaches and staffs on campus. Orchestrating extensions for baseball coach Tim Corbin and men's tennis coach Ian Duvenhage.

Williams has addressed numerous facility upgrades, including an extensive refurbishing of Vanderbilt Stadium and football locker rooms, expansion of Hawkins Field, addition of new tennis courts and amenities at Brownlee O. Currey Tennis Center and renovations in Memorial Gym, the Hendrix Room and the McGugin Center. This October, several Vanderbilt teams will start using a new on-campus indoor multipurpose facility that will house an eightlane track complex and regulation football field.

An initiative to allow more overseas travel and study for Vanderbilt teams and student-athletes also has become reality during Williams' tenure.

In association with Vanderbilt Athletics, Williams has served as a member of the SEC team that negotiated recent ESPN and CBS television partner contracts, and is beginning the final year of a four-year term on the NCAA Division I Academic Cabinet. He also serves as Chair of the NCAA Infraction Appeals Committee and is a member of the Enforcement Working Group.

Williams joined Vanderbilt from The Ohio State University in 2000 as Vice Chancellor, General Counsel and University Secretary. His role expanded to Vanderbilt Athletics in 2002.

Williams served numerous administrative roles at Ohio State over 14 years. When he accepted the Vanderbilt role, Williams was Vice President of Student and Urban/Community Affairs and Professor of Law at Ohio State.

A native of Detroit, Williams received a Bachelor of Science in Social Science and Master of Arts in Education from Northern Michigan University where he ran track. He also earned a Master of Business Administration and a Doctor of Jurisprudence from the University of Detroit, and an L.L.M. in taxation from New York University. Before entering law school, Williams spent 10 years as a teacher and coach in the Detroit public school system.

Williams has taught at the law schools of the University of Detroit, Capital University, Ohio State and Vanderbilt, and twice directed the Ohio State

Law Program in Oxford, England. He was elected outstanding law professor at both the University of Detroit and The Ohio State University.

Williams is active in the Nashville area community, serving as a board member with several organizations.

Currently, Williams is serving a second term on Nashville Mayor Karl Dean's Procurement Standards Board. He is also a former two-term member of the Nashville branch of the Atlanta Federal Reserve Board.

Williams and his wife, Gail, have four children: Erika, who is a grade school teacher in Detroit and graduate of Eastern Michigan University; David Williams III, who is a two-time graduate of Bowling Green State University, and is an academic counselor at Michigan State where he is working toward a doctorate; Samantha, who is a graduate of Brown University where she competed in swimming, is now working in the U.S. Senate; and Nick, who will enroll this fall at High Point (N.C.) University after graduating from University School of Nashville. Nick was selected as USN's 2012–13 co-Athlete of the Year after competing in cross country, basketball, track and soccer.

Williams' wife, Gail, is a graduate of the University of Michigan and the University of Detroit College of Law and serves as the Associate Director of Community Relations of Vanderbilt. She is a past president and current board member of the University School of Nashville Board of Trustees and is the past Chair of the Metro Transit Authority where she continues to serve as a board member. In addition, Gail serves on the Boards of many non-profit organizations, including The Frist Center, The Women's Fund Advisory Board, and the YWCA.



## Kevin Colon Assoc. Director of Athletics

Kevin Colon, a 16-year veteran of Vanderbilt athletics, oversees the Commodore baseball program.

Colon also oversees the football team, women's bowling team, the video, equipment and strength and conditioning departments.


In 2011 and 2013, Colon directed Vanderbilt's hosting of the NCAA baseball Regionals and Super Regionals. He was the team's official liason at the 2011 College World Series.

Colon came to Vanderbilt in 1998, organizing and directing CHAMPS/Life Skills, the community outreach arm of Commodore athletics.

As CHAMPS/Life Skills director, Colon guided Vanderbilt student-athletes into an expanded role in giving back to local schools, hospitals, non-profit organizations and other efforts aimed at disadvantaged residents of Nashville and Middle Tennessee. The program also emphasized a commitment to academic excellence, personal development, leadership and career development for participating student-athletes.

Colon earned an undergraduate degree from Iowa State University and master's degree from the University of Toledo.

## **2013 SEASON REVIEW**

The 2013 Vanderbilt season was a remarkable, record-breaking year that saw the team match the school record with 54 wins and shatter the Southeastern Conference record with 26 wins in league play. The Commodores won all 14 series during the regular season and clinched the team's third SEC championship under Corbin with one week left in the regular season. For the seventh time in 10 trips in the Corbin Era the Dores played in the SEC Championship game at the SEC Tournament, hosted NCAA Regionals for the third time in school history and Super Regionals for the second time. Vanderbilt's trip to the NCAA Tournament is the team's eighth straight.


**FEBRUARY 15-17** – The No. 2 Commodores open up with Long Beach State at Hawkins Field marking the first time since 2010 for the Dores to open the season at home. Vandy uses a stellar pitching performance from Kevin Ziomek (6 IP, 1R/1ER, 1BB, 7K) and an 11-hit attack to down the Dirt Bags 10-4 in the opener. On Saturday, VU draws 10 walks and scores 12 runs on five hits to claim the series and give Tyler Beede the victory. LBSU fights back and keeps on fighting on Sunday to salvage a game with a 13-9 win in a travel-shortened game. The game ends after the eighth inning when the Dirt Bags have to catch a flight back to California. Connor Harrell belts his second homer of the weekend and drives in four runs in the loss.

**FEBRUARY 19** – Vanderbilt starts a 13-game winning streak with a 9-3 victory at Belmont. The game is played in a howling wind and temperatures in the 40s, a sign of things to come from Mother Nature. Philip Pfeifer pitches his best game-to-date as a Dore with 10 strikeouts over 6.2 innings to earn his first collegiate win. Tony Kemp produces his second career five-hit game.

**FEBRUARY 22-24** – The Commodores make a clean sweep of Monmouth for the Dores' first series sweep of the season, outscoring the Nighthawks 29-3 in the three games. Kevin Ziomek fans 11 over seven innings to earn his second win of the year in the series opener. Vandy rolls in the Saturday game with 10 Commodores collecting at least one hit led by Jack Lupo's three-hit, three-run effort. Philip Pfeifer earns his second win of the week with six stellar innings giving up two hits and one unearned run en route to being named SEC Pitcher of the Week.


**FEBRUARY 26-MARCH 3** – A five-win week keeps the Dores' winning streak rolling with wins over Arkansas State and Evansville in the midweek followed by a second straight sweep over the weekend vs. Illinois-Chicago. On a Friday night in a wintry mix of sleet and snow, Kevin Ziomek tosses a one-hit shutout with a career-best 15 strikeouts to down the Flames in the series opener. Saturday's game is played in frigid temperatures and snow but it doesn't stop Tyler Beede from picking up his third win of the year. The highlight of the week is provided by a freshman on Sunday afternoon. After failing to get a sacrifice bunt down in a 1-1 game in the 10th inning, Rhett Wiseman blasts his first collegiate home run over the right field bleachers to give the Commodores their 10th straight win.

**MARCH 8-10** – After playing their fifth straight game with temperatures in the 30s at Hawkins Field in the midweek, the Commodores pack up and head for their annual trip to the west coast, this time to Oregon. For the second straight week Kevin Ziomek absolutely dominates in the Friday night win. The lefty fans 13 and allows one run on two hits in another complete game. VU clinches the series on Saturday behind Tyler Beede, who allows only one unearned run despite six walks over 6.2 innings.



The Commodores look primed for another sweep on Sunday afternoon with a 5-2 lead going into the bottom of the eighth inning but a bullpen meltdown and a costly error lead to five Oregon runs and Vandy's winning streak stops at 13 games.

MARCH 15-17 - The Commodores open league play on The Plains at Auburn on Friday night with Kevin Ziomek continuing to deal. The lefty carries a no hitter into the seventh inning and goes 8.1 innings for his fifth win of the year. Connor Harrell's three-run homer in the third puts the Dores over the top in a 5-2 victory. Tyler Beede picks up where Ziomek left off, carrying a no hitter of his own into the seventh on Saturday before allowing a one-out single. The Commodores blow out. a close game over the final three frames, scoring six runs off the

Tigers' bullpen in an 8-1 victory. Vandy finishes off the team's second straight sweep at Auburn on Sunday with an 8-6 win. Tony Kemp and Mike Yastrzemski combine for six hits and Conrad Gregor drives in three runs in the Dores' 19th win of the year.

MARCH 22-24 – After an upset loss in the midweek at Middle Tennessee State, the Commodores open SEC play at Hawkins Field with Florida in town. The Gators hand the Dores their second straight loss of the week on Friday night in a 7-1 VU loss. Kevin Ziomek struggles with command with five walks and gives up a late home run to Taylor Gushue in the loss. The Vandy offense evens the series on Saturday, pounding out 15 hits led by Connor Harrell, Conrad Gregor and Jack Lupo who all have three-hit games. Tyler Beede earns the win with 6.1 scoreless innings allowing only two hits. Sunday's game is a wild back-and-forth game that ends in the seventh inning due to Florida's travel restrictions. In a 4-4 game in the seventh and final inning John Norwood's twoout, infield single scores Mike Yastrzemski from second base for the winning run. The victory gives Vanderbilt its first series victory over Florida since 2009.

MARCH 29-31 – The Commodores take down Lipscomb 4-1 in the midweek in another game played in 30-degree temperatures at Hawkins Field. In-state rival Tennessee visits for the weekend with Mother Nature imposing her will once again, this time with rain. All three games vs. the Volunteers are played in a steady rain over the weekend. The Dores trail 3-1 in the bottom of the seventh inning on Friday night before getting back-to-back RBI-singles from Tony Kemp and Xavier Turner to tie the game. Brian Miller enters in the eighth for VU and turns in five scoreless innings with six strikeouts before Spencer Navin delivers a walk-off single in the bottom of the 12th for a 4-3 win. The Dores claim the series on Saturday behind Tyler Beede, who allows two runs on four hits with nine strikeouts over 7.1 innings. A five-run eighth inning puts the game away in an 8-3 victory. Another wild Sunday game sees the Commodores outlast Tennessee 12-8 with the two teams combining for 32 hits. Freshman Kyle Smith produces a monster game, walking in each of his first three at-bats before belting a grand slam over the left field wall to put the Dores on top to stay and complete another sweep.

APRIL 5-7 - Vanderbilt exacts revenge on Middle Tennessee State in the midweek with a 12-3 win before heading to No. 16 Ole Miss for a big time conference clash. Fans in Oxford are treated to a pitcher's duel on Friday night with Kevin Ziomek outlasting Rebels' right-hander Bobby Wahl to earn the win in a 3-1 VU victory. The Commodores scratch out a run in the eighth on Spencer Navin's sac fly and Connor Harrell's single in the ninth plates Tony Kemp for an insurance run before Brian Miller nails down his ninth save of the season. The Commodores claim the series on Saturday, using 10 hits to score two runs in a 2-1 victory. The Dores' bullpen shuts down Ole Miss over the final three innings allowing only one hit in the win. For the third straight Sunday the Commodores are involved in a wild game but emerge victorious, this time 7-6 in 11 innings. After a four-run fourth inning, the Commodores appear to be cruising to their second straight SEC sweep but Ole Miss gets two runs off Brian Miller in the ninth to send it to extra innings. Vandy catches a break in the 11th when All-SEC catcher Stuart Turner throws the ball into left field trying to nab Connor Harrell on a wild pitch. Harrell scores the winning run on the play and Miller finishes off the sweep with a 1-2-3 11th inning.

**APRIL 12-14** — Missouri visits Hawkins Field for the first time after the Dores down UT-Martin 10-3 during the week. The Commodores rock Tigers' ace lefty Rob Zastryzny

for six runs on eight hits, including three home runs. VU cranks out 17 hits with Connor Harrell belting a pair of home runs and driving in four runs along with Vince Conde in an 11-5 Vandy victory. Saturday is more of the same as Vanderbilt collects a season-best 19 hits in support of Tyler Beede, who fans a career-best 10 with no walks over seven innings. Spencer Navin drives in four runs, scores four runs and picks up four hits in the Dores' 12-1 win. The Commodores complete their third straight sweep with a 16-4 win on Sunday to improve to 33-4 on the year and 14-1 in the SEC.


**APRIL 20-23** — A 10-9 midweek loss to Tennessee Tech leaves a bad taste in the mouth of the Dores heading into a series at Georgia for the weekend. Mother Nature shows up again on Friday night in Athens, raining out the game and setting up a doubleheader on Saturday. The Bulldogs stun Vanderbilt in the opener 3-1 despite Kevin Ziomek tossing a complete game in the loss. VU leaves 11 men on base in the loss and collects only five hits. Zander Wiel is inserted into the lineup for the second game of the double dip for his first career start. The redshirt freshman then produces one of the greatest games in Vanderbilt history in Vandy's 15-4 win. In his first at-bat Wiel blasts a three-run homer to left-center. He laces a RBI-double in his second at-bat before launching a solo homer in the fifth. Two more walks and two more runs scored bring his total to 3-for-3, five RBI and four runs scored. The Commodores claim the series on Sunday with a 5-1 win scoring four runs in the first three innings.

**APRIL 23** – The Commodores' annual meeting with Louisville in the Battle of the Barrel is a match up of two Top 10 teams in Louisville. Vanderbilt jumps on the Cardinals early and hammers the host 10-2 to keep the Barrel. Tony Kemp scores three runs and adds three hits with Mike Yastrzemski and Vince Conde combining for seven RBI in support of Walker Buehler, who earns the win in his home state.

**APRIL 26-28** — Another weekend in the SEC brings another top-tier opponent in No. 16 Mississippi State coming to Hawkins Field. Fans at The Hawk are treated to a great game on Friday night that sees the Dores win 3-1 behind Kevin Ziomek, who allows one run on four hits with nine strikeouts over seven innings. Brian Miller works the final two frames to notch his 12th save of the season and set the school record for saves in a season. Four runs in the first two innings send the Dores to a 5-2 win on Saturday and the team's 11th straight series victory. Tyler Beede improves to 11-0 with six solid innings allowing two runs on seven hits with seven strikeouts. The Commodores waste no time on Sunday scoring five runs in the first en route to an 8-3 win. Conrad Gregor goes 3-for-3 with three RBI and three runs scores.


MAY 3-4 — Vanderbilt travels to South Carolina for a showdown of two Top 10 teams. The Commodores edge the Gamecocks 3-2 on Friday night for their sixth straight win. Kevin Ziomek allows one run over eight innings for the win and Spencer Navin adds a two-run homer. The Dores get to South Carolina starter Jordan Montgomery early four runs in the first three innings and hold on to win 5-2 on Saturday. VU racks up 15 hits led by three-hit games from Mike Yastrzemski, Zander Wiel and Vince Conde. Mother Nature shows up again and rains out Sunday's game to give the Commodores their second straight SEC sweep and sixth sweep in league play.

**MAY 11-12** – The Commodores return to the road at Kentucky after a midweek win over Presbyterian 5-2. Again Mother Nature forces a change of plans with rain on Friday night setting up a doubleheader on Saturday. The Dores play it right this time taking both games of the double dip, winning the first game 11-3 and second game



5-3. Tony Kemp goes 6-for-10 in the two Saturday games. Tyler Beede matches Grayson Garvin's school record for wins in a season improving to a perfect 13-0. Vandy finishes off the sweep with a 10-5 win on Sunday and clinches the outright league title with an amazing 24-2 SEC mark with one weekend left to play. Steven Rice earns the win with 4.2 innings of scoreless relief.

MAY 16-18 – Alabama visits Nashville for the final weekend of the regular season. On Thursday night in the opener, freshman Walker Buehler deals over seven innings. The right-hander gives up two runs on seven hits to earn the win in a 7-6 victory. Kyle Smith comes off the bench to hit a home run, double and score three runs. Vandy rallies for two runs in the eighth inning to force extra innings on Friday night



but it's still not enough as the Tide scratches out a run in the 10th to snap the Dores' winning streak at 14 games. The Commodores bounce back on the final day of the regular season with a 14-10 win, drawing nine walks to go with their nine hits. Tyler Beede's attempt to win all 14 of his starts comes to an end with Alabama knocking him out of the game in the fourth. Vanderbilt finishes the regular season a school record 48-7 and smashes the SEC mark with a 26-3 record in league play.

MAY 22-26 - SEC TOURNAMENT - Vanderbilt heads to Hoover, Ala. for the SEC Tournament as the top seed. The Commodores open with Texas A&M after the Aggies down Florida in the opening round. Vandy's first-ever meeting with Texas A&M does not go as planned, as the Aggies shut out the Commodores. The shutout loss is the first for the Dores since the 2012 SEC Tournament. The Aggies hit three home runs and hold VU to only three hits. Vanderbilt bounces back to outlast South Carolina 4-3 in 10 innings in an elimination game the next day. Conrad Gregor delivers a walk-off single that sends the Gamecocks packing. The victory earns the Commodores a shot at redemption against Texas A&M and the Dores take advantage of it with a 3-0 win. VU pounds out 14 hits while holding the Aggies to only two. Tyler Beede dominates over 7.1 innings allowing two hits and striking out eight to set the Vanderbilt school record with 14 wins. The Dores face Mississippi State with a spot in the championship game on the line. Vandy feasts on a fatigued Bulldogs' pitching staff scoring seven runs in the second in a 16-8 win. Tony Kemp drives in three runs and Xavier Turner, Connor Harrell, Conrad Gregor and Zander Wiel all post three-hit games. The matchup everyone has been waiting to see is finally set in the championship game with the Dores taking on LSU. The Commodores rally for two runs in the seventh inning to force extra innings before the Tigers finally prevail 5-4 in an instant classic.

MAY 28 – Tony Kemp and Head Coach Tim Corbin earn SEC honors with Kemp being named SEC Player of the Year and Corbin the Coach of the Year. Kemp becomes just the third player in league history to win both Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year in his career. For Corbin, it is his second SEC Coach of the Year honor. Mike Yastrzemski joins Kemp on the All-SEC first team. Connor Harrell and Tyler Beede are named to the second team with Xavier Turner, Zander Wiel and Carson Fulmer getting nods for the All-Freshman squad.

MAY 31-JUNE 3 – NCAA NASHVILLE REGIONAL – The Commodores enter the NCAA Tournament as the No. 2 overall seed with East Tennessee State, Illinois and Georgia Tech coming to Nashville for the Regional. The Dores open with a 9-1 win over ETSU. Connor Harrell launches his 12th home run of the season and Kevin Ziomek picks up his 11th win. As the visiting team in their home park, VU uses two big innings to beat Illinois 10-4. A relentless five-run eighth inning puts the game away. Tony Kemp, Xavier Turner and Mike Yastrzemski combine to go 10-for-16 from the top of the lineup. Georgia Tech's Josh Heddinger does something no one has done all year, he tosses a complete game against Vandy on his way two a two-hit shutout in the Yellow Jackets' 5-0 win. The loss sets up a win or go home scenario for VU and the Dores respond with a 7-1 win to claim the Regional. Philip Pfeifer is sharp over five scoreless innings to earn the win and send the Commodores to their third Super Regional.

**JUNE 8-9 – NCAA NASHVILLE SUPER REGIONAL** – A very familiar foe rests between Vanderbilt and the College World Series with Louisville coming to Nashville for the Super Regional. The Commodores fail to take advantage of early opportunities in the series opener and fall 5-3. The Cardinals score three runs in the seventh and hold off the Vandy offense in the eighth and ninth stranding five VU runners. The loss pushes the Dores to the brink and sets up another win or go home situation. Louisville pushes the Commodores even further early on the next day scoring two runs in the second inning off Tyler Beede. Cardinals' starter Jeff Thompson makes those two runs stand up over seven innings before handing it over to the bullpen. The Louisville bullpen responds by pitching out of two big jams, including the ninth inning. With the tying run at third base in the top of the ninth Cody Ege strikes out Mike Yastrzemski to end the Commodores' season with a 2-1 loss.

### Tim Corbin Vanderbilt Head Coach 2003 - present 465-229 Overall Record



In 11 seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has transformed Vanderbilt into one of the national powers of college baseball and taken the program to unprecedented success with seven straight NCAA regional appearances and Vanderbilt's first-ever College World Series.

Corbin's overall record of

465-229 (.670) is second-best in terms of wins at Vanderbilt, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Vanderbilt's 2013 team was one for the ages as the Commodores matched the school record with a 54-12 record and smashed the SEC record with a 26-3 mark to win the league title running away. The Dores hosted NCAA Regionals and Super Regionals for the second time in three years falling two Louisville in the Super Regional.

The 2012 season saw a young team endure a rough start to the season before maturing into one of the hottest teams in the nation down the stretch. The Commodores played in the SEC Championship game for the the second consecutive season and fell one game shy of a return trip to Super Regionals, losing in the final game to host North Carolina State.

2011 proved to be one of the all-time greatest seasons in Vanderbilt history. The Commodores matched the school record for wins in a season with 54 en route to the school's first-ever College World Series winning a share of the Southeastern Conference crown along the way, the second SEC title under Corbin. The Commodores hosted Regionals for just the second time in history and Super Regionals for the first time.

### Roy Mewbourne Vanderbilt Head Coach 1979-2002 655-608-9 Overall Record



A fixture around Vanderbilt baseball for nearly a quarter century, Roy Mewbourne retired following the 2002 campaign, ending his career as the Commodores' all-time winningest skipper and one of most successful coach in collegiate baseball history.

The native of Birmingham,
Ala., compiled a 655-608-9 mark
in 24 seasons at Vanderbilt, and finished his 30-year
coaching tenure with a 922-683-9 overall record.

In his final season as Vanderbilt's head coach, Mewbourne achieved several personal milestones, most notably becoming the 35th coach in college baseball history to reach the 900-win plateau. He registered his 900th career win against West Virginia (2/16) and his 650th victory at Vanderbilt against Mississippi State (4/28). The win over the Bulldogs also came in Mewbourne's 1,600th game as a collegiate head coach

At the start of the season, the then-56-year-old skipper also saw his dream of a new stadium become a reality with the unveiling of Hawkins Field. A catalyst in the stadium's construction, Mewbourne played a vital role in fund-raising, planning and oversight for the \$5.8 million facility.

Mewbourne fielded some outstanding teams in his Vanderbilt tenure, highlighted by his 1980 squad that captured the SEC Championship, which earned him SEC Coach of the Year honors.

He coached 19 All-Americans, 19 All-SEC honorees and 59 players who signed professional baseball contracts and 111 Commodores earned SEC Academic honors, including a school record 16 in 2002.

### Larry Schmittou Vanderbilt Head Coach 1968-78 306-252-1 Overall Record



Larry Schmittou arrived at Vanderbilt in 1968 and immediately changed the mindset of Commodore baseball in the Music City. After combining for 13 total wins the previous three seasons, he guided VU to eight wins his first year, 12 in 1969 and 24 in 1970.

In 1971, Vanderbilt broke through with a 34-19 record

and won the SEC Eastern Division with an 11-5 record. That would be the first of four consecutive division crowns for the Commodores. In 1973 and '74, the Commodores swept Alabama, 2-0, in a pair of best-of-three series for the overall SEC championship earning him SEC Coach of the Year honors. He coached 20 All-SEC, eight All-SEC East, eight All-South Region and seven Academic All-SEC. He had 21 players in Major League Baseball with 14 of those players taken in the draft.

Schmittou retired following the 1978 campaign after 11 years as the Vanderbilt head coach. He amassed a 306-252-1 overall record and a 98-98 mark in Southeastern Conference play.

During the time Schmittou roamed the dugout at McGugin Field, Vanderbilt won more games than any other SEC school and was one of only two schools to win four divisional titles.

Upon his retirement as Vanderbilt's head coach, Schmittou acquired the rights to a Southern League expansion franchise team, the Nashville Sounds.
