Vanderbilt Athletic Communications

Vanderbilt Assistant Director of Communications Andrew Pate is the media contact for baseball. He can be contacted in the office 615.322.4121 or via e-mail at andrew.pate@vanderbilt.edu. The Vanderbilt Athletic Communications office is located directly across the street from Hawkins Field on the second floor of the McGugin Center in room 225.

Press and Photo Credentials

Requests for press and photo credentials can be made via email or mail at least one week prior to the desired game or series. Requests should be directed to Andrew Pate. All credentials will be available at media will call located at the front entrance of Hawkins Field.

Interview Policy

All Vanderbilt coaches and players will be available throughout the season for interviews with members of the media prior to practice. All requests for interviews should be made through Andrew Pate. Post-game interviews with Coach Corbin and requested players may be conducted after a mandatory 10-minute cooling off period on the field in front of the Vanderbilt dugout.

Practice Policy

Vanderbilt baseball practices are open to the media and the public. Practice starts at approximately 3 p.m. Tuesday - Friday (Monday is an off day). Media members are encouraged to arrive at Hawkins Field by 2 p.m. to conduct interviews prior to practice. Members of the media need to notify Andrew Pate in advance with their interview request(s).



HAWKINS FIELD

Hawkins Field serves as the home of the Vanderbilt Commodores and with recently completed facilities it stands as one of the top college baseball parks in the country. Now in its 16th season of existence, Hawkins Field greets fans with chairback seats close to the field of play with bleacher seating in the outfield. The revamped 30-foot Green Monster wall in left field promises unique opportunities for excitement and a first-rate field that prevents bad hops and promotes defensive gems from the infielders and outfielders alike.

With a brick and rod-iron fence design, Hawkins Field features a classic baseball park atmosphere coupled with a modern design that includes more than 2,200 chairback seats and a state-of-the-art press box. Still nestled along-side Vanderbilt Stadium and Memorial Gymnasium on the west end of campus, the ballpark was constructed as the Commodores' first baseball-only facility in school history. It was built near the exact location of McGugin Field, which served as Vanderbilt baseball's home field for 76 years and part-time football practice field.



A \$4.5 million project to add on to Hawkins Field was completed in the Spring of 2006. Phase Two saw the addition of over 475 new stadium seats along the baselines.

Phase Three included the construction of a two-story complex along the third baseline, including locker rooms, a weight room, coaches' offices and a Hall of Fame. It was completed at the end of the 2006 season and now houses the team. The team also has a new pitcher's area enclosed in the football stadium next door, as well as a new indoor batting cage inside Memorial Gym.

In 2009, permanent bleacher seating was added in the outfield from the right field foul pole to the Green Monster wall in left. In addition, 200 chairback seats were added on the first base side and a new trainer's room was created along with renovated dugouts.

The summer of 2012 saw the most dramatic change to the facility when the natural grass field was ripped up in favor of a synthetic surface. The AstroTurf surface is not a typical synthetic surface featuring multiple blade lengths and sand/rubber mixture on the infield and in the outfield. Center field features the world's largest Star V logo stitched into the turf. New in 2016, a turf mound replaces the previous dirt mound.

The complex is named for the Charles Hawkins Family. Charles Hawkins III, the stadium's namesake, was a long-time contributor to the Vanderbilt community, who graciously donated more than \$2 million to the stadium project. Sadly, he passed away on June 16, 2004, after his beloved Commodores ended one of their most successful seasons ever. A successful real estate developer, Hawkins played baseball and football for the Commodores from 1952-1954 and became the first Vanderbilt pitcher to earn All-Southeastern Conference honors. He was named to Vanderbilt's Athletic Hall of Fame in the fall of 2009. His father, Charles Hawkins II, lettered in both baseball and football at Vanderbilt in the mid-1920s.



Hawkins Field's latest enhancement reached its completion prior to the 2018 season in left field with work on the new building that will house the team's batting cages, weight room and new coach and staff offices. The exterior of the new building now serves as the left field wall and the new Monster.

The \$10 million project, expands Memorial Gym to just beyond the left field wall and moves the team's batting cages to a below-ground level of Memorial Gym that has been retrofitted for that purpose. In addition, the ground level and top floor of Memorial have been renovated and expanded to house a state-of-the-art classroom, cardio room, new and expanded weight room, recruiting area as well as coaches' and staff offices. The weight room, will be nearly twice the size of the former baseball weight room and also be used by the women's and men's basketball teams. There will also be a larger professional locker room to serve the many former Commodore players who return to train and mentor current players.





Former Commodore and major league All-Star David Price provided the capstone gift to the \$12 million project, giving a record \$2.5 million.

"I would not be where I am today, as a person or as a player, without the guidance, education and support I received from Coach Corbin and from Vanderbilt," Price said. "I am honored to be part of this project, which will support the current players and also provide a place that allows us all to come back to campus and stay in touch and involved with the program."

2018 SEASON PREVIEW

The Commodores enter the 2018 season boasting the Southeastern Conference's longest consecutive streak of NCAA Regionals with 12 straight.

During that stretch, the Dores lead the league in a number of categories including overall wins (540) and SEC wins (215) while making six NCAA Super Regionals and three College World Series appearances.

Vanderbilt begins the season ranked inside the Top 10 nationally for the eighth straight year in a pair of polls and welcomes the nation's top-ranked recruiting class. Alongside 16 freshmen, the Vandy Boys also return 2018 preseason All-Americans Julian Infante and Patrick Raby -- who headline a stready pitching staff.

Under the direction of 16th-year head coach Tim Corbin, the Dores seek their fifth NCAA Super Regional appearance in six years and return to the College World Series for the first time since 2015. Corbin also enters the season just 10 victories shy of becoming the program's all-time wins leader and currently sits at 646 victories.

The Dores hope to replace a trio of .300plus hitters from a season ago in Will Toffey, Jeren Kendall and Jason Delay. Beyond Infante, the offense welcomes back juniors Ethan Paul and Connor Kaiser.

On the mound, Raby is joined by Drake Fellows and Chandler Day, who each made 13-plus starts and boasted sub-3.80 ERAs.

The Commodores play arguably their toughest schedule in recent memory. The slate includes a combined 22 games against preseason top-25 opponents including non-conference matchups against preseason No. 7 TCU, No. 11 UCLA, No. 15 Louisville, No. 24 Houston and No. 25 Duke.

Vanderbilt opens the season with 10-straight games at home, beginning with a three-game series vs. Duke. The early season schedule features a World Series feel as the Dores play three games at Minute Maid Park (March 2-4) before a West Coast

visit is capped by a matchup against TCU at Dodger Stadium.

The 56-game schedule features matchups against 14 different conferences including the American Athletic, American East, Atlantic Coast, Atlantic Sun, Big 12, Big South, Big West, Conference USA, Missouri Valley, Ohio Valley, Pac-12, Southeastern, Southland and Sun Belt.

In total, the team returns 18 letterwinners and five positional starters to a team that has finished third in the SEC East each of the last two seasons.

PITCHING

Vanderbilt's pitching has led the way in the Corbin era with at least one first round pick in the weekend rotation over the last 15 seasons.



Despite losing six pitchers, including fifth-overall pick Kyle Wright, the 2018 staff has a steady mix of veteran presence and youth.

"(Patrick) Raby has been a winning pitcher ever since he got to Vanderbilt and will certainly be looked upon to help lead a staff," head coach Tim Corbin said. "(Maddux) Conger and (Chandler) Day have starting experience and could fit in those roles again. (Zach) King, (Drake) Fellows and (Jackson) Gillis are three sophomores who gained a lot of experience toward the

end of last year. King was our most used freshman, while Fellows and Gillis really performed well down the stretch."

Raby enters his junior season ranked the No. 34 prospect in the Southeastern Conference for the 2018 MLB Draft by D1Baseball.com after going 10-4 with a 2.73 ERA a season ago. The right-hander led the Dores with 105.1 innings pitched across 16 starts.

Raby set new career highs during 2017, tossing his first complete game against Georgia on April 21. On March 12, he posted a dominant performance against St. Mary's, striking out 11 hitters.

It marked the second-straight season in which Raby served as an important piece of the Dores' staff. As a freshman in 2016, the Knox-ville, Tenn., native went 7-1 with a 2.61 ERA in 15 games, including 10 starts en route to Freshman All-America status.

Outside of Raby, Conger and Day are expected to be back in the mix as starters this season. Day enters his junior campaign as D1Base-ball.com's No. 41 prospect in the SEC for the 2018 draft after strong production a season ago.

Day turned in a 7-2 record alongside a 3.78 ERA in 13 appearances and 12 starts. The then-sophomore fanned 53 hitters in 52.1 innings. The Granville, Ohio, native struck out 10 UT Martin hitters on April 4 just a week after tossing a complete game, one-hitter vs. Lipscomb.

Meanwhile, Conger, who was used in three starts a season ago, garnered a 2-1 record and 4.96 ERA in 15 appearances (32.2 innings). As a sophomore, the Stephenville, Texas, native struck out a careerhigh six batters against Evansville on Feb. 22



King is coming off an equally impactful freshman season, leading the charge out of the bullpen. The Spring Hill, Tenn., native posted a team-high 25 appearances and team-low 2.56 ERA in 38.2 innings. Opponents hit just .174 and were allowed only eight extra-base hits. King fanned a season-high five hitters in 5.1 innings of work against Missouri on May 7.

King, who ranked as the SEC's No. 16 prospect for 2019 by D1Baseball.com, is joined by high-profile righty Drake Fellows who cracked the list at No. 15.

Fellows turned heads in 2017, boasting a 3-3 record and 3.30 ERA in 62.2

innings. As a freshman, the Plainfield, III., native made 16 appearances, including 10 starts and a 68-17 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Fellows permitted no more than three walks in a game and struck out a season-high 10 hitters against Alabama on May 20. He earned a start in the Clemson Regional, permitting just two runs on six hits with seven strikeouts across 6.2 innings against the host Tigers.

Southpaw Jackson Gillis ranks as Vandy's highest prospect for the 2019 draft -- coming in at No. 9 -- entering his sophomore campaign. The Wilmington, Mass., product made 16 relief appearances, spanning 15 innings, limiting opponents to a .173 average alongside a 3.60 ERA.

Left-hander Jake Eder is among eight freshmen who enter the 2018 season trying to find where their role will come. Eder is tabbed as the No. 16 prospect for the 2020 draft by D1Baseball.com and chose Vandy after being taken in the 34th round by the New York Mets.

Joining Eder are freshmen David Bates, Aaron Brown, Tyler Brown, Hugh Fisher, Mason Hickman, Erik Kaiser, Justin Willis and Reid Schaller (redshirt freshman).

The young core will have senior Tyler Stover as a reliable resource for guidance. The former transfer from Mississippi State and Dyersburg Community College recorded 15 appearances a season ago, limitting opponents to a .229 average.

With the loss of several pieces offensively, the Dores turn to their pitching staff to provide consistency on the mound. Under sixth-year associate head coach -- and pitching coach -- Scott Brown, the unit expects to be up to the task. In five years under Brown, Vandy leads the nation with a combined 2,996 strikeouts.

CATCHING

Behind the dish, Vanderbilt looks to replace standout Jason Delay, who became the highest selected Dores' catcher since 1980 when he was selected in the fourth round by the Pirates.

In his absence, a trio of catchers look to fight for the starting job, led by sophomore Ty Duvall. The Lebanon, Ohio, native impressed at -- and behind -- the plate in limited action a season ago. Duvall appeared in 17 games, hitting .375 (9-for-24) while driving in six runs alongside 12 total bases. Duvall also made four starts and registered 63 putouts and three assists to just one error.

"Tyler is a hard working kid who is passionate about what he is

doing. He is a student of the game and takes a very serious approach with the pitchers," head coach Tim Corbin said. "Stephen Scott has bounced back and forth from outfield to catcher and has played well behind the plate in early scrimmages. Philip Clarke is another hard working athlete who inserted himself with confidence as a freshman. All three players will help us at some point."

Scott also spent spent 38 games between designated hitter and the outfield a season ago, but is also in the mix for the starting job. Scott hit .227 with 11 RBIs



a year ago. The Cary, N.C., native has shown his ability, offensively, being named 2016 Rookie of the Year in the New England Collegiate Baseball League, but has yet to be tested behind the plate.

The third candidate for the job, Clarke, comes to Vandy following a decorated high school career at Presbyterian Academy in Franklin, Tenn. The four-year letterwinner helped lead the Lions to a runner-up finish in the state tournament. As a junior, Clarke was named a Perfect Game All-American while Presbyterian finished state runners-up. As a senior, he was tabbed The Tennessee Class AA Mr. Baseball, while also serving as team captain.

INFIELD

The Commodores' infield returns three of four impact players in Julian Infante, Ethan Paul and Connor Kaiser. The unit will be in search of a starter at the hot corner following the draft of standout Will Toffey. Toffey started 56 games a season ago and paced the

Commodores' offense in average (.354), runs (55) and walks (48).

Arguably the biggest offensive piece back for the Dores will be Infante, who was tabbed a preseason All-American entering 2018 after leading Vandy with 66 RBIs behind a .315 average a year ago.

The first baseman was lethal at the plate, producing the program's first seven-RBI game since 2006 when he did so against Missouri. In the performance, Infante matched a Hawkins Field record with three doubles. The Miami, Fla., native also produced a career high four hits and as many runs against Belmont on March 22. The junior has played in 88 games for his career, including making 84 starts, while hitting .301 including a .524 slugging percentage.



Expected to join Infante on the infield at second base is junior Ethan Paul. The Bellevue, Wash., native started 52 games and appeared in 53 total during 2017, hitting .251 and finishing third on the team with 15 doubles. Paul, who could also see time at shortstop, swiped five bases on the year, including a pair against Clemson in regional action on June 5.

Paul showcased his versatility during a breakout 2016 freshman campaign that saw the newcomer play multiple positions and post a career-high four RBIs against Louisville on May 10. Paul hit .305 in 54 games that season while contributing 31 RBIs.

Meanwhile, Connor Kaiser will be back for the Dores at shortstop, and will be looking to rebound from a struggling sophomore campaign one year after a steady freshman campaign.

Kaiser hit just .222 in 62 games, totaling seven doubles and 18 RBIs. Through the ups and downs, the Overland Park, Kan. native showed signs of what could be, recording three hits on multiple occassions and scoring three runs against Alabama on March 19.

"Infante, Paul and Kaiser have seen a lot of playing time since they began here as freshmen," head coach Tim Corbin said. "Ethan and Connor are very good defensive players who take care of the baseball at a high level and will makeup the middle of the field. Both have been very consistent players and personalities for us and they will be asked to provide daily leadership. Julian is a very invested young man. He has improved his defensive skills over the last two years at first base and also developed strong leadership qualities."

With the depth of the group, it is likely to be a true freshman who rounds out the infield at third base. Jayson Gonzalez has shown his power and ability defensively leading into the season. The Covina, Calif., product helped lead Bishop Amat High School to a national championship a season ago and was named All-American and All-State on top of numerous other honors.

Also in the mix is Garrett Blaylock, Austin Martin and sophomore Harrison Ray. Ray is the only player from the group with collegiate experience, making 32 appearances including 17 starts a season ago. As a freshman, he hit .244 (19 for 78) while driving in 12 runs.

Blaylock and Martin also enter the season following standout high school careers.

OUTFIELD

With the absence of first-round selection Jeren Kendall and fouryear standout, Ro Coleman, the Vanderbilt outfield is expected to have a much different look in 2018.

The Commodores return sophomore JJ Bleday, who spent time in right field a season ago. The Panama City Beach, Fla., native is expected to man the position again after playing 51 games and hitting .256 a year ago.

Bleday made 48 starts and was a key contributor in Vandy's success in the Clemson Regional, scoring twice and recording a season-high three hits against the Tigers on June 5.

In center field, the Dores have eyed a variety of options including freshman Pat DeMarco, who was a Perfect Game Southeast Region All High School as a senior.

Utility player Ray Harrison, who could play the middle infield or in left field, is also a candidate for center. Harrison spent limited time in right field last season.

Meanwhile, Alonzo Jones transitioned into an outfield role last fall and continued to earn time there during the spring. The former



freshman All-American is looking to regain his step after earning just 25 starts and hitting .221 a season ago. The Columbus, Ga., native is the favorite to start in left field.

"Although JJ Bleday is a sophomore, he might be the most experienced outfielder we have in the group." head coach Tim Corbin said. "He has mature offensive abilities and has progressed as a defensive player over the last year. Both (Walker) Grisanti and (Stephen) Scott have played at certain points of their time here and both bring corner outfield skills and left-handed offensive punch. Alonzo Jones is making the transition from

infield to outfield and has settled in very well. His speed to the ball is very impressive and he may possess the most accurate throwing arm that we have."

DESIGNATED HITTER

Designated hitter will be up for grabs heading into the season.


Among returners who contributed at the position last year include Stephen Scott and Harrison Ray. Scott batted .227 a season ago and slugged .311 while Ray hit .244 and slugged .333.

"Much like years past, this spot will be ever changing for a while," head coach Tim Corbin said. "We have several kids with various offensive skill sets, so I would imagine the opponent will have something to do with how we identify this spot in the lineup."

4 Tim Corbin - Head Coach

Head Coach Tim Corbin begins his 16th season at the helm of the Vanderbilt baseball program. During his tenure Corbin has turned the Commodores into a national power and taken the program to unprecedented success leading Vanderbilt to the top of college baseball in 2014 with the school's first-ever men's national championship.

Corbin's overall record of 646-315-1 (.672) is second all-time in terms of wins at Vanderbilt, and first in terms of winning percentage for coaches with 100 games or more. In his career as a head coach Corbin is 752-453-1 (.624). Corbin's efforts have paid off in the win column and across the board as D1Baseball. com tabbed Vanderbilt the top program in the nation in 2015 and second in 2017.

Over the last four seasons, the Dores have secured a pair of trips to the College World Series championship while running their streak to 12 consecutive NCAA Tournament berths -- the longest active streak in the Southeastern Conference.

Under the direction of Corbin, the 2017 squad captured the program's fourth NCAA Regional

Under the direction of Corbin, the 2017 squad captured the program's fourth NCAA Regional title in five years, running off three victories in four days including an 8-0 statement victory to capture the event against host Clemson.

Following the season, Baseball America tabbed juniors Kyle Wright and Jeren Kendall All-Americans. Four days later, the duo were selected in the first round of the MLB Draft with the fifth pick and 23rd selection, respectively. In total, 15 Commodores have been selected in the first round since Corbin arrived to campus in 2003, including seven in the past four years. Meanwhile, fresh off a phenomenal sophomore campaign, starting pitcher Patrick Raby became the 17th Commodore overall to play for USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team, not including Corbin, who coached the 2006 team to a 28-2-1 mark while winning the gold medal at the World University Championship in Cuba.

A young roster helped lead the 2016 Vanderbilt squad to a successful season that saw the Commodores and Hawkins Field host NCAA Regionals for the fifth time in six seasons before finishing the year 43-19. The season came to an abrupt end in the NCAA Nashville Regional following the tragic death of freshman Donny Everett the night before the tournament began

The Commodores were led by third team All-Americans Jeren Kendall and Bryan Reynolds, who combined to drive in 116 runs, score 122 runs and hit 22 home runs — led by Reynolds' 13 homers. Three Vandy freshmen earned Freshman All-American status with Alonzo Jones, Ethan Paul and Patrick Raby all earning the honor. Fellow freshman Connor Kaiser picked up Freshman All-SEC honors along with Paul.

Jordan Sheffield Ied the way for the Dores' pitching staff going 8-6 with a 3.01 ERA and 113 strikeouts over 101.2 innings en route to becoming the 13th first round pick under Corbin and 10th Vanderbilt pitcher to hear his name in the first round when the Los Angeles Dodgers tabbed him with the 36th overall pick. Fellow pitcher Ben Bowden followed quickly in the second round to the Colorado Rockies before Reynolds was selected later in the second round by San Francisco to give the Commodores three selections in the first two rounds of the MLB Draft. John Kilichowski, Jason Delay and Will Toffey were all selected to give Vanderbilt six players selected in the draft, marking the 10 straight years that at least five Commodores have been selected in the draft.

The 2015 Commodores marched back to the College World Series for the second straight year to give the program it's first-ever consecutive trips to Omaha finishing as the national runner-up, losing in three games to Virginia in a rematch of the 2014 CWS championship series. Vanderbilt finished the season 51-21 for the second consecutive year making it the only program in the nation with three straight 50-win seasons.

The Dores rallied to win nine straight games, the team's longest winning streak of the season, in the NCAA Tournament to reach the CWS finals sweeping through the Nashville NCAA Regional in dominant fashion before toppling national seed Illinois on the road to reach Vanderbilt's third trip to the College World Series. VU rolled through the Regional with wins over Lipscomb, Indiana and Radford. The 21-0 victory over Radford shattered the school record for margin of victory in the NCAA Tournament and matched the NCAA mark. The Commodores continued the roll in Illinois with a pair of dominating wins over the Illini to win the school's first-ever road Super Regional. Back in Omaha for the third time in five years, the Commodores rolled through their half of the bracket with a come-from-behind victory over Cal State Fullerton and two wins over TCU. The Dores provided plenty of drama in the win over the Titans, winning on Jeren Kendall's walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 4-3 victory in the resumption of a suspended game. Vandy won it's third straight game at TD Ameritrade Park via the home run in the team's first game against TCU with Zander Wiel's seventh inning solo homer scoring the only run of the game. VU breezed into the championship series with a 7-1 victory in the rematch against the Horned Frogs three days later. Vanderbilt claimed the opening game against Virginia 5-1 behind a dominant Carson Fulmer start that saw the right-hander turn in 7.2 scoreless innings in his final start as a Commodore.

Dansby Swanson and Carson Fulmer led the team in their final season in Black & Gold earning




first team All-American honors with Swanson picking up National Player of the Year honors from D1Baseball.com and Perfect Game. Fulmer was named National Pitcher of the Year with Swanson earning the Brooks Wallace Award as the nation's top shortstop. The duo also became the second pair of Vanderbilt teammates and the fourth in the history of the Golden Spikes to be finalists in the same year joining David Price and Pedro Alvarez from 2007. Corbin has coached three different pairs of teammates to be finalists for the Golden Spikes with the four Vanderbilt players joining Clemson's Khalil Green and Jeff Baker. Fulmer became the third Vanderbilt pitcher to pick up SEC Pitcher of the Year honors after becoming just the fourth pitcher in the league's history to win the pitching triple crown, leading the nation's premier league in wins, ERA and strikeouts. Freshmen Will Toffey, Jeren Kendall and Kyle Wright were consensus Freshman All-Americans.

Three Commodores were selected in the first round of the MLB Draft, another program first, with Swanson, Fulmer and Walker Buehler all joining a growing group of Vanderbilt first round picks to bring the total to 14 overall, 12 in the Corbin era. Swanson became the second Commodore to hear his named called first with the Arizona Diamondbacks taking him No. 1 overall. Vanderbilt is one of two colleges to have multiple top picks with David Price and Swanson. Fulmer was taken eighth overall by the Chicago White Sox and Buehler 24th overall by the Los Angeles Dodgers. Fulmer and Buehler became the eighth and ninth VU pitchers under Corbin to be selected in the first round joining Jeremy Sowers (6th overall, Cleveland 2004), David Price (1st overall, Tampa Bay 2007), Casey Weathers (8th overall, Colorado 2007), Mike Minor (7th overall, Atlanta 2009), Sonny Gray (18th overall).

overall, Oakland 2011), Grayson Garvin (59th overall, Tampa Bay 2011) and Tyler Beede (14th overall, San Francisco). In Corbin's program since 2003, an astounding 48 pitchers have been selected in the MLB Draft. Five more Dores heard their name called during the draft for a total of eight in 2014; the most since a school and SEC record 12 were selected in 2011.

Vanderbilt finished off the school's second-ever national championship with a dramatic 3-2 victory over Virginia in the finals of the College World series to cap a 51-21 season in 2014. The 51-win season marked the third time





in the last four seasons Corbin had led the Dores to at least 50 wins as the Vandy skipper was named the consensus National Coach of the Year. Corbin's Commodores rose to the occasion in the postseason sweeping through the Nashville Regional with wins over Xavier and Oregon before taking down Stanford in three games of the Super Regional to advance to Vanderbilt's second College World Series in school history. Hawkins Field hosted NCAA Regionals and Super Regionals for the third time in four years. Once in Omaha, Corbin continued to push the Commodores with wins over rival Louisville in the first round and comeback win over UC Irvine. VU reached the championship series with a dramatic, walk-off win over Texas on Tyler Campbell's bases loaded, infield single. The team sealed the national title in the third game thanks to an eighth inning, solo homer from John Norwood and clutch pitching from Adam Ravenelle over the final two frames. The final victory in Omaha gave the Dores a 10-3 record in the NCAA Tournament.

Corbin reached two more milestones during the regular season with his 500th victory at Vanderbilt, a 5-1 victory at Missouri on May 3, 2014, and his 600th career victory with a win at Arkansas on April 19, 2014.

Vanderbilt's middle infield of Dansby Swanson and Vince Conde led the way much of the season with the duo earning first team All-SEC honors. Both garnered All-American honors along with freshmen Bryan Reynolds and Hayden Stone, who picked up Freshman All-American status. Carson Fulmer was picked as a second team All-SEC and All-Defense team member by the league's coaches. Over the summer the Dores pulled off another program first with four players — Dansby Swanson, Carson Fulmer, Bryan Reynolds & Walker Buehler — suiting up for USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team, matching the Collegiate National Team's record for players from one school.

Tyler Beede became the ninth player under Corbin to be drafted in the first round of the MLB Draft in June when the San Francisco Giants picked Beede with the 14th overall selection.

For the second time in his career Corbin was named the SEC
Coach of the Year by the league's coaches after the Commodores
posted one of the best seasons in school history in 2013. The Commodores matched the school record with a 54-12 mark and smashed
the Southeastern Conference record, finishing the conference slate
an amazing 26-3. Vanderbilt won every series during the regular season, including nine series sweeps. The squad outscored opponents
by an average of 8.2-3.9 runs per game with the pitching staff turning
in a sub 3.00 ERA for the second time in three seasons. Five Commodores earned All-American honors led by first team All-Americans
Tony Kemp and Tyler Beede. Kemp became just the second Commodore in history to be named SEC Player of the Year and Just the third
in league history to win both Freshman of the Year and Player of the
Year awards in his career. Over the summer, Beede pitched for Team
USA to become the 12th Vanderbilt player to don the Stars & Stripes

USA to become the 12th Vanderbilt player to don the Stars & Stripes. The Commodores' SEC regular season championship was the team's second in three years and third under Corbin. For the fourth time in five years the Dores played in the SEC Championship game and made their eighth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament hosting Regionals for the third time in school history and Super Regionals for the second time.

The 2012 Vanderbilt Commodores overcame a slow start to the season to post the team's seventh straight trip to the postseason. The Dores finished the season as one of the hottest teams in the nation winning four of the last four SEC series of the regular season, including series victories over No. 3 Kentucky and at No. 4 LSU. Vanderbilt rolled into the SEC Tournament having won 12 of the last 15 regular season games. Corbin guided the Commodores to the championship game for the sixth time in nine trips, losing to a red-hot Mississippi State team in the final. Vanderbilt made the NCAA Tournament with a trip to the Raleigh Regional finishing runner-up to host NC State to end the season 35-28.

For the second consecutive season (2011-12) the Commodores' freshman class was tabbed as the nation's best by Baseball America, becoming the first school in the poll's 13-year history to post back-to-back top classes. Vanderbilt's 2012 freshman class was the unanimous top class, also picking up the honor from Collegiate Baseball. Since Corbin's arrival in 2003, Vanderbilt has earned three top-ranked recruiting classes (2005) and is the only school in the nation to have more than two top classes.

In 2012, one of Corbin's prize pupils, David Price, was named the American League Cy Young Award winner. Price was the top overall pick by Tampa Bay in 2007 after a stellar career at Vanderbilt. The southpaw went 20-5 with a 2.56 ERA and 205 strikeouts over 211 innings for the Rays to become the first Commodore to win the Cy Young

The Commodores' magical run to Omaha saw several school records equaled or passed. VU won 54 games to match the school record set in 2007 and set the SEC record with 12 players selected in the Major League Baseball draft. Hawkins Field hosted the NCAA Regional round for just the second time in history and Super Regionals for the first time with the Dores sweeping through both rounds en route to the College World Series. Individual awards supplemented the team's success with Grayson Garvin earning SEC Pitcher of the Year and Tony Kemp picking up SEC Freshman of the Year honors. Garvin became the second VU pitcher to earn the prestigious league award joining David Price, while Kemp is the second Commodore to be named the league's freshman of the year along with Pedro Alvarez. All four awards have come under Corbin's watch. Sonny Gray, Jason Esposito, Aaron Westlake and Garvin all garnered All-American honors with Kevin Ziomek, T.J. Pecoraro, Conrad Gregor and Kemp being named Freshmen All-American.

The 2010 Commodores racked up the second-most wins in school history finishing the year with a 46-20 mark, eventually falling at Florida State in the third game of the Super Regional. In order to get to Florida State the team advanced out of the Louisville regional, a place that saw the Dores' 2009 season end. During the regular season, Corbin led the Commodores to a 16-12 mark, good enough for third in the Southeastern Conference East division behind Florida and eventual national champion South Carolina.

In 2009, Corbin took a young squad with seven new offensive starters and molded them into a team that finished with a 37-27

record and runner-up finishes in the SEC tournament and the NCAA Louisville Regional. The 2009 draft saw six Commodores selected, highlighted by junior pitcher Mike Minor's selection with the seventh overall pick by the Atlanta Braves. His selection marked the fifth time in the last three seasons a Vanderbilt player has been picked in the first round.

In 2008, Corbin guided the Commodores to their second straight 40-win season (41-22) and third consecutive appearance in the NCAA tournament. The Commodores battled through the first half of the season without the services of Preseason Player of the Year Pedro Alvarez and managed to record road sweeps over Mississippi State and Tennessee for the first time in school history.

The 2008 draft saw eight Commodores selected, highlighted by Pedro Alvarez who was taken with the second overall pick by the Pittsburgh Pirates. Vanderbilt became the first school in draft history to have the first overall pick (David Price in 2007) and second overall pick in consecutive drafts.

In 2007, Corbin guided the Commodores to their best season ever, finishing with a school record 54 wins. The team also achieved a No. 1 national ranking for the first time in school history and held that honor for 13-of-15 weeks during the regular season.

The Vanderbilt baseball team also swept through the SEC, winning both the regular season and tournament crown for the first time ever and it marked the first time an SEC team had done it since 1996. The team lost only one conference series the entire season against SEC West Division winner Arkansas in Fayetteville and avenged the series loss by defeating the Razorbacks in the SEC tournament title game.

The conference recognized Corbin for the work he had done, naming him SEC Coach of the Year. Corbin also picked up Co-National Coach of the Year honors from College Baseball Insider and regional Coach of the Year honors by the American Baseball Coaches Association

The Commodores hosted their first-ever NCAA regional as the No. 1 National Seed and arrived as a power in college baseball. Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities. In the summer of 2006 he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba. The .919 winning percentage set a new national team high and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee.

In 2006, he led a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth-place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters being freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional. The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.





In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional, they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record. Along the way Vanderbilt racked up 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first) and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

His first Vanderbilt team in 2003 finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the series finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games. That squad set then school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168). The team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each among the top 15 at the time. Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort. Four different pitchers contributed to the 4-0 victory over Western Kentucky.

In addition to the on field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. The program's facilities again will undergo a dramatic upgrade beginning after the 2016 season. A new building — housing new coaches offices, meeting space, media room, professional locker room, batting cages and weight room among other amenities — will emerge beyond the left field wall with the exterior of the building itself becoming the new "Monster" left field wall.

In 2009, permanent seats in the outfield pushed Hawkins Field seating capacity to double the amount when Corbin arrived in 2003. These upgrades reinforced the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Corbin had achieved. In the latest facility improvement the playing surface at Hawkins Field was replaced during the summer of 2012 with a synthetic surface. The timing of the change to turf was perfect as the Commodores played multiple games in bad weather during the 2013 season.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw

their recruiting efforts pay in 2005, 2011 and 2012 as their recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America. Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program with 13 Commodores being selected in the first round since 2003.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade but made the post-season tournament in 2004. During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series wins in all. His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick, pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

Corbin came to Vanderbilt following nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson. During his time there (1994-2002), the Tigers had more victories than all but four programs. Clemson won more than 71-percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and reached the College World Series four times (1995, 1996, 2000 and 2002). The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994. Corbin was promoted twice during his tenure. He received the title of assistant head coach in 1998 and in September 2001 became associate head coach and recruiting coordinator. Along the way, he crafted a national reputation as one of the most respected assistant coaches in the country while helping produce nine straight top-25 ranked recruiting classes. His on-field work with outfielders and hitters helped 20 Clemson players earn All-America honors and 36 to be drafted to play professional baseball.

Corbin's dedication and attention to detail caught the eye of the national baseball publication Baseball America on numerous occasions. In 1997, it touted the Clemson coaching staff as one of the top five "College Recruiting Staffs" in the country. It later tabbed the 1999 Tiger freshman class as No. 1 nationally. In 2000, Baseball America and the American Baseball Coaches Association named Corbin its National Assistant Coach of the Year. Also in 2000, Southern California head coach Mike Gillespie served as skipper of the USA Baseball team and chose Corbin as an assistant for his staff. That group guided the Americans to a gold-medal finish at the World Championships in the Netherlands, and that team set a national program record for best winning percentage (.900).

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin was head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. There he restarted a baseball program that had been dormant for several years. He directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to NCAA Division II status and had a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, the Blue Hose made three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93), and Corbin earned South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.





Sixth Season SUNY-Cortland, 2000

Scott Brown enters his sixth season as the pitching coach and third as Associate Head Coach at Vanderbilt. Brown has helped the Commodores go 235-98-1 and strike out a nation-high 2,996 batters during his first five

The 2017 season resulted in Brown's fifth first round arm taken in the MLB June Draft when the Atlanta Braves selected Kyle Wright with the fifth overall pick. The right-hander started 16 games for the Dores and went 5-6 with a 3.40 FRA. He struck out a team-high 121 in 103.1 innings pitched. He was named first-team All-

SEC, joining Carson Fulmer as Commodore pitchers to nab first team honors under Brown.
Wright teamed with sophomore Patrick Raby to give Vanderbilt one of the best tandems in the country. Raby with 10-4 with a 2.73 ERA in 16 starts. He tossed a team-high 105.1 innings. Starters Drake Fellows and Chandler Day rounded into form as the season progressed. Fellows started 10 games and pitched in 16 overall. He posted a 3-3 record with a 3.30 ERA in 62.2 innings. Day went 7-2 with a 3.78 ERA in 13 games (12 starts).

Brown's staff posted five shutouts to run the total to 35 during his tenure. The pitching staff as a whole led the SEC in hits allowed per nine innings. The group yielded only 7.47 hits per nine, the sixth-best mark in the country.

Brown's fourth season on West End saw him produce another first round pick in Jordan Sheffield, his fourth with the Commodores. Sheffield headlined a young pitching staff that punched out 593 batters and walked just 211 batters, the team's fewest since 2011. The staff also combined for nine shutouts to run the total to 30 in Brown's four seasons. Junior Ben Bowden's 10 saves led the Dores and placed him fourth in a single-season at VU all-

Sophomore Kyle Wright blossomed in a move from the bullpen to the starting rotation, going 8-4 with a 3.09 ERA in 16 starts. Wright earned second team All-SEC honors after going 5-3 with a 1.76 ERA in his 10 league starts. Brown also developed freshman Patrick Řaby into a Freshman All-American and Freshman All-SEC pitcher in his first season. Raby

started 10 games for the Commodores, going 7-1 with a 2.61 ERA.

For the second straight season Brown's pitching staff broke the school record for strikeouts, smashing 2014's total with 703 strikeouts as the Commodores marched back to the College World Series finals for the second straight year. For the third year under Brown Vandy posted a team ERA under 3.00 with a 2.84, marking the first time in program history the team has posted three consecutive team ERAs under 3.00. The Dores' 14 shutouts led the nation and also set a new program standard.

The Vanderbilt pitching staff held two first round picks in Carson Fulmer (8th overall) and Walker Buehler (24th overall) and a third round pick in Philip Pfeifer. Fulmer matched the school record with 14 wins en route to National Pitcher of the Year honors and being named a consensus first team All-American as well as SEC Pitcher of the Year. He became just the fourth pitcher in league history to win the pitching triple crown, leading America's best conference in wins, ERA and strikeouts. Fulmer's career ERA of 1.99 is just the second

sub 2.00 career ERA in school history joining the legendary Jeff Peeples.

Brown developed Kyle Wright into a Freshman All-American as the right-hander moved into the team's closer role at the end of the season, finishing the year with a 6-1 record and

Brown's second Vandy pitching staff set the school record with 636 strikeouts passing the epic 2007 pitching staff that featured David Price and Casey Weathers. The Dores' pitching staff also posted a sub 3.00 ERA for the second straight season under Brown with a 2.90 team ERA led by All-SEC pitcher Carson Fulmer, whose 1.98 ERA was the fifth-lowest in school history and lowest since 1973. Fulmer's low ERA marked the second straight season that a Commodore pitcher posted an ERA in the top ten in school history. Fulmer also led the team with 10 saves before seamlessly transitioning to the starting rotation midway through conference play.

The staff also featured first round pick Tyler Beede, who led the team with 116 strikeouts, and 12-game winner Walker Buehler. Buehler's 12 wins matched the third-most in a single-season by a Commodore.

Brown again developed a freshman into a Freshman All-American with Hayden Stone earning the honor. Stone's freshman campaign was phenomenal with the right-hander striking out 80 in 58 innings. Brown has developed one freshman pitcher into a Freshman All-American in each of his first three seasons at VU.

The Commodores' pitching staff posted one of the best years in Vanderbilt history in Brown's first season going 54-12 with 24 saves and a team ERA of 2.76 - marking the second time in three years the Dores have posted a sub 3.00 ERA. The VU pitching staff was dominant led by All-Americans Tyler Beede, Kevin Ziomek and Brian Miller leading the way with Freshman All-American Carson Fulmer playing a key role. Beede and Ziomek paired up to be a force for the Commodores combining to win 25 games with Beede winning a school record 14 games. Miller became the school's all-time saves leader with a school single-season record 16 saves in 2013 to give him 21 in his first two seasons in Nashville.

Brown's work with freshmen Fulmer, Walker Buehler and Tyler Ferguson was evident as the trio improved throughout the season. Fulmer blossomed into one of the Dores' most valuable pitchers in the bullpen down the stretch. Buehler spent time in the weekend starting rotation and Ferguson started four midweek games for the squad going 3-1.

Brown joined the Commodores after nine successful seasons at St. John's as the Red Storm's pitching coach. During his time at St. John's, Brown oversaw remarkable progress in the Red Storm pitching staff, a group that has had 15 players sign professional contracts in the last eight seasons. Four pitchers (Rob Delaney, Craig Hansen, Anthony Varvaro and

Scott Barnes) that Brown mentored at St. John's have played major league baseball. Led by First Team All-Big East and second team All-Region honoree Kyle Hansen, the 2011 staff tossed four shutouts, had 399 strikeouts and limited opponents to just a .261 average. Hansen, who tossed a complete game shutout against Big East foe Notre Dame, set a school-record with 107.2 innings pitched and finished with 106 strikeouts, good for sixth

The 2010 pitching staff helped the team win a school-record 43 games and racked up 455 strikeouts, second-most in school history. A Third Team All-Big East selection, freshman Kyle Hansen earned Freshman All-America honors from Baseball America, Louisville Slugger and the NCBWA, and was the Big East Tournament Most Outstanding Player. Three players were drafted in the MLB Draft and alums Rob Delaney and Anthony Varvaro each made their Major League debuts.

A season after seven pitchers graduated or were drafted, a young 2009 staff that featured four freshmen ranked sixth in the Big East with 328 strikeouts. Brown also saw two of his alums, Rob Delaney and Anthony Varvaro, added to the MLB 40-man rosters for their respec-

Brown helped lead the 2008 pitching staff to a 3.78 ERA, which ranked first in the Big East and ninth in the country and gave the Red Storm staff an ERA that ranked in the top ten nationally for the third-straight season. Lefty George Brown was a second team All-American, the Big East Pitcher of the Year and a first team all-conference selection, while Scott Barnes (first team) and Colin Lynch (second team) also earned all-conference honors. Five players were also selected in the MLB Draft, as Barnes (8th round), Justin Gutsie (14th), Jared Yecker

(22nd), Brown (27th) and Lynch (40th) all signed professional contracts.

The 2007 staff posted a 3.48 ERA, which ranked 10th in the country and second in the Big East, and two pitchers earned All-Big East recognition as southpaw Scott Barnes was named to the first team and lefty George Brown earned third team honors.

In just his third season at St. John's, Brown guided the 2006 pitching staff to an ERA (3.21) that ranked fifth in the country.

The 2005 Red Storm staff had a combined 3.38 ERA and set a school-record with a conference-leading 499 strikeouts. Craig Hansen and Anthony Varvaro each earned All-America honors, while Hansen was also named the Big East Pitcher of the Year. Four pitchers also went on to sign professional contracts. Hansen went on to become the first player in Red Sox history to make his major league debut the same year he was drafted.

In 2004, his first season at St. John's, Brown guided the Red Storm pitching staff to a 3.86 ERA, which ranked second in the Big East and was nearly a run-and-a-half better than the previous season.

From 2002-04, Brown served as the head coach of the Sanford Mainers of the New England Collegiate Baseball League, one of the top summer wood-bat leagues in the nation. Brown was named the league's Manager of the Year.

Brown came to St. John's from the State University of New York at Cortland, where he served four years as an assistant coach.

Brown first entered the coaching ranks after a stellar three-year pitching career at Cortland.

A second team All-American in 1999 after going 9-1 with a 2.03 ERA, Brown racked up 19 career victories at Cortland, a mark that was tied for fifth-most in school history when he graduated

Brown and his wife Mary have one son, Nolan, twin daughters, Kelsey and Riley and daughter Emma.

Mike Baxter enters his first season as the hitting coach and recruiting coordinator for the Commodores.

Baxter joins Vanderbilt after a 12-year professional baseball career that included playing in the big leagues for four organizations over parts of six seasons. Baxter made his major league debut with the San Diego Padres in 2010, and also

played for the New York Mets (2011-13), Los Angeles Dodgers (2014) and Chicago Cubs (2015).

Immediately following his playing career, Baxter was hired by the Toronto Blue Jays organization as a Special Assistant for the 2016 season.

He was drafted by San Diego in the fourth round of the 2005 MLB Draft following a successful two-year career for the Dores. Baxter put together a huge season in 2005 when he led the team with a .374 average, 79 hits, 48 RBI, 16 doubles, nine home runs, three triples and 30 walks. He was awarded the Jeff Peeples Most Valuable Teammate award, in addition to garnering an SEC Player of the Week award in early April. Baxter was named to the All-SEC Academic team in 2004 and 2005.



Vanderbilt making an impact in MLB front offices too

Vanderbilt has infused major league baseball organizations with dozens of players during the Tim Corbin era. The Commodores are now starting to have an impact in MLB front offices as well. Former VU catcher Carter Hawkins was promoted from within the Cleveland Indians' organization to Assistant General Manager following the Indians' trip to the World Series in 2016. Hawkins leads a contingent of five members in the Indians' organization to have Vandy ties with former VU director of baseball operations Mike Calitri, who is now a major league scout. Former volunteer assistant Larry Day is set to manage his first season in the minor leagues and former Commodores Tony Mansolino and David Wallace are both steadily rising through the managerial ranks within the system. Wallace was named the Minor League Manager of the Year by Baseball America after leading the Indians' Double-A team to a league title in 2016.

Including Cleveland's five, at least 12 former Commodores are impacting major league franchises in a variety of ways. Former Vandy pitching coach Derek Johnson is now the pitching coach for the Milwaukee Brewers.

Gil Kim (2003-05) is the director of player development for the Toronto Blue Jays after playing for Corbin's first Vanderbilt team. Charlie Sullivan (1991) is a long-time amateur scout for the Brewers. Greg Smith (1985-88) is the director of scouting for the Pittsburgh Pirates. Former Vandy intern Anthony Aloisi is an area scout for the Oakland A's.

Former Commodore David Macias (2006-08) moved into a role with the Chicago Cubs after retiring from playing and later become the coordinator of international player programs for the Seattle Mariners. Macias currently serves as a volunteer assistant coach with the Commodores.

Vanderbilt's former video coordinator David Schnabel is continuing to make a visual impact but now does so for the New York Yankees. Schnabel's work is directly linked to the Yankees' baseball operations department.

The Commodores dipped into its major league front office pool by bringing back former team manager Alex Levitt, who was an area scout for the Cubs, to serve as director of player development.

Since Coach Corbin's arrival in 2003, 17 Commodores have donned the Stars & Stripes with four players representing Vanderbilt on the Collegiate National Team in 2014 marking just the fifth time since 1980 a school had placed four players on the collegiate national team.

Tim Corbin years at Vanderbilt: 2003-present

USA National Team 2006 - Head Coach, 2000 - Assistant Coach I Corbin guided the National Team to its then-best record ever as the team went 28-2-1 over the summer, culminating with a gold medal at the World University Championships in Havana, Cuba. In 2000, Southern Cal head coach Mike Gillespie served as head coach and chose Tim Corbin as an assistant for his staff. That group won a gold medal at the World Championships in the

Netherlands.



Pedro Alvarez years at Vanderbilt: 2006-08

USA National Team 2006-07 | Led USA National Team for second straight year with a .315 batting average, seven homers and 30 RBI in 2007. As a freshman in 2006, he showed no-ill effects with the wood bat and led the all-star contingent with a .379 batting average to go along with five homers, 12 doubles and 43 RBI.

Tyler Beede years at Vanderbilt: 2012-14

USA National Team 2013 I Beede became the seventh Commodore pitcher to wear the Red, White & Blue pitching in five games, three starts, going 1-1.





Finished 5-1 with a 0.20 ERA in eight starts with 61 strikeouts and only seven walks win 44.0 innings. Price was named a Summer All-American by Baseball America after a solid summer for Team USA in 2005. He went 2-0 with a 1.26 ERA in five games with 39 strikeouts and 13 walks in 28.2 innings.





Vanderbilt has placed multiple players on Team USA's collegiate national team three times with four players in 2014 (Buehler, Fulmer, Swanson & Reynolds). In 2006 and 2007, three Dores suited up for Team USA with Alvarez, Price & Weathers in 2006 and Alvarez, Flaherty & Minor in 2007. Head Coach Tim Corbin led the 2006 squad that featured three Commodores.





Patrick Raby years at Vanderbilt: 2016-present USA National Team 2017 I Picked up three victories without allowing an earned run for the Red, White & Blue, including making the start in the opener of the 2017 tour. The sophomore tossed three innings of one-hit ball against Catawba Valley on June 22.



The award pays tribute to Jeff Peeples, who was a four-year letterwinner at Vanderbilt from 1970-73

He was a three-time All-Southeastern Conference selection who helped guide the Commodores to three SEC Tournaments and the 1972 SEC Championship.

Peeples was one of only two pitchers in SEC history to lead the league in earned run average for two consecutive years (1971-72). He also led the conference in victories (12) and strikeouts (113) in 1973.

Peeples still holds Vanderbilt career records for wins (29) and earned run average (1.68).

He went on to play professionally for the St. Louis Cardinals and was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame in the spring of 2001.



Nicholas S. Zeppos Chancellor

Vanderbilt Chancellor Nicholas S. Zeppos continues to demonstrate his appreciation for and commitment to the University's athletic program in a variety of ways.

His active role in Southeastern Conference leadership and regulatory issues and his vocal support of college athletics becoming more diverse and inclusive are just two examples of how Zeppos' influence has been felt.

Zeppos has taken a keen interest in athletics at Vanderbilt throughout his tenure which spans more than two decades. "I don't call the plays or throw the passes," Zeppos said. "I'm here simply trying to do whatever I can to support all of the talented people who do these things."

In the spring of 2016 Zeppos displayed that support yet again during the hiring of two of the nation's most dynamic and sought after basketball coaches, Bryce Drew and Stephanie White, to lead the Commodores' men's and women's respective basketball programs.

Zeppos previously endorsed an athletics capital improvement plan that has surpassed \$60 million, orchestrating efforts to improve the student experience for athletes and assist with recruiting.

"One thing I consider the ultimate compliment is when a coach calls me and says, 'I've got a couple of recruits here. Could you meet them?'"

Zeppos previously served as president of the Southeastern Conference and continues to be an important voice within the SEC where his legal expertise and commitment to fairness, student-athlete welfare, and diversity have been on display for nearly a decade. He played a key role in the extensive SEC commissioner search while serving as chair of the SEC Executive Committee of presidents and chancellors and in March 2015, he introduced Greg Sankey as league commissioner.

A distinguished legal scholar, teacher and executive, Zeppos served from 2002 to February 2008 as Vanderbilt's chief academic officer, overseeing the University's undergraduate, graduate, and professional education programs as well as research efforts in liberal arts and sciences, engineering, music, education, business, law and divinity. As provost and vice chancellor, he chaired Vanderbilt's budgeting and capital planning council and led all fundraising and alumni relations efforts across the institution, in addition to overseeing the dean of students and dean of admissions.

Zeppos has led a number of important initiatives at Vanderbilt, including the planning process for The Ingram Commons, a landmark transformation of the first-year experience; Warren and Moore colleges for upperclassmen; and Vanderbilt Barnard College, the next phase of the university's unique living-learning residential college system currently under construction on the original campus. Other key advancements include restructuring of the institution to split out clinical health care operations into a new corporate entity; the Academic Strategic Planning Group; innovative efforts in undergraduate admissions and financial aid; and the development of new programs in Jewish studies, law and economics and genetics.

In a bold move to strengthen Vanderbilt's commitment to admitting undergraduates on the basis of accomplishment and achievement, rather than their ability to pay, Zeppos significantly expanded the financial aid program in 2009. By replacing undergraduate, need-based loans with grant and scholarship assistance, the University opened its doors wider to highly talented and qualified students of all economic, cultural and geographical backgrounds. The expanded aid program is funded by a combination of strategic budget allocations and gifts from thousands of generous donors to the current Opportunity Vanderbilt campaign.

Zeppos was recognized with five teaching awards at the law school before serving as an associate dean, associate provost, and provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs. He served as interim chancellor for eight months prior to being formally appointed as Vanderbilt's eighth chancellor on March 1, 2008.



David Williams, II Director of Athletics

Vanderbilt Director of Athletics David Williams II ranks among the university's most prominent leaders.

Aside from his role in McGugin Center, Williams is Vice-Chancellor for University Affairs and Athletics as well as a tenured professor at the University's nationally ranked law school. He continues to teach at the Law School where he conducts courses on Taxation and Education as well as

Sports Law. He is also an active participant in the SEC and NCAA in matters of negotiations, reforms, enforcements and planning. Williams is a frequent speaker on collegiate athletics, including recent appearances at Harvard and Arizona State law schools and as keynote speaker at the Black Male Student Athlete Summit.

Since adding athletics to his multiple titles and responsibilities in 2002, Vanderbilt has seen its athletic department and individual programs recognized as being among the nation's most innovative and successful. The 2016-17 academic year may have been one of the best yet under Williams' leadership.

Eight Vanderbilt teams reached NCAA postseason competition, including an SEC regular season and tournament title and a third straight Final Four appearance by the 2015 NCAA national champion women's tennis. Men's golf won its first SEC Championship and claimed a spot in the Final Four for the first time in program history. Vanderbilt baseball reached the NCAA tournament for the 12th straight season – the longest active streak in the SEC – and reached an NCAA Super Regional for the fourth time in five years. Meanwhile, women's bowling finished third at the NCAA Championships and second consecutive Southland Conference crown.

In the most recent Academic Progress Rate scores released by the NCAA, Vanderbilt football, men's golf, women's golf, men's tennis and women's tennis led the SEC in APR. Bowling and lacrosse also finished atop the Southland and BIG EAST Conferences, respectively. All Vanderbilt teams scored between 976 and 1000 (which is a perfect score), with an overall average of 993.6. That average surpassed the NCAA four-year rate of 981. Moreover, seven programs received the prestigious Public Recognition Award, which honors programs ranking in the top 10 percent nationally in multiyear APR scores in each sport.

In 2016, Williams again demonstrated his hiring prowess. Williams orchestrated two successful searches resulting in the hiring of two of the nation's top basketball coaches, Bryce Drew and Stephanie White, to led the respective Vanderbilt men's and women's programs. In addition, the return of Commodore legend and favorite Carolyn Peck as a member of the women's staff was very well received by the Vanderbilt faithful.

Drew and White join a growing list of highly regarded head coaches hired by Williams, including head football coach Derek Mason in 2013. The next year, Williams attracted Darren Ambrose from the University of Pennsylvania to direct the women's soccer program. In 2012, Williams directed the search for men's golf coach Scott Limbaugh, who has since led the team in three straight NCAA Final Eight appearances and just earned men's golf National Coach of the Year recognition. In addition, Williams has hired Greg Allen (women's golf coach), lan Duvenhage (men's tennis coach) and Steven Keith (cross country/track coach), all who have taken their teams to NCAA postseason. Allen and Keith also have guided their teams to SEC team titles. Williams has also retained top coaches and staffs by orchestrating extensions for Mason, baseball coach Tim Corbin, women's tennis coach Geoff MacDonald, women's bowling coach John Williamson and women's lacrosse coach Cathy Swezey.

Williams has addressed numerous facility upgrades, including a state-of-the-art training center which opened February 2016 in McGugin Center. The new training center provides top-notch medical care for Vanderbilt student-athletes. Ground was broken immediately after the 2016 baseball season for a new expansion of our wonderful baseball complex, Hawkins Field. Other improvements in recent years include refurbishing of Vanderbilt Stadium and its football locker rooms, an addition of new tennis courts and amenities at

Brownlee O. Currey Tennis Center, renovations in Memorial Gym and McGugin Center, a new multipurpose facility for athletic and general university use, a new four-lane bowling center and a clubhouse with hitting bays for our men's and women's golf programs.

An initiative to allow more overseas travel and study abroad for Vanderbilt student-athletes also has become reality during Williams' tenure. In 2013, 15 athletes ventured to Tanzania during the summer for a service trip to bring shoes to underprivileged communities in Africa in conjunction with Soles4Souls. The partnership continued in 2014 with another community service effort to Costa Rica. In 2015, Williams led the summer service trip to Cuba, and this past summer a group of Commodores ventured to Jamaica on a service trip in partnership with Soles4Souls.

More students within Vanderbilt's athletic community were able to study abroad, including football players Oren Burks, Ean Pfeifer, Emmanuel Smith, Ralph Webb and Jonathan Wynn. In 2016, the Athletic Department began a newly created Internship Program for student-athletes matching them with employers who provide real life training for life after college. The program continued in 2017 and has received rave reviews from the student athletes, the employers, the NCAA as well as other colleges and universities.

In association with Vanderbilt Athletics, Williams has served as a member of the SEC team that negotiated past ESPN and CBS television partner contracts. Williams also serves as Chair of the NCAA Infraction Appeals Committee and was a member of the NCAA Enforcement Working Group.

Williams came to Vanderbilt in 2000 to serve as Vice Chancellor, General Counsel and University Secretary, after a 14-year tenure at The Ohio State University, where he served in numerous administrative roles including Vice Provost for Minority Affairs, Vice President of Student and Urban/Community Affairs and Professor of Law.

A native of Detroit, Williams received a Bachelor of Science in Social Sciences and Master of Arts in Education from Northern Michigan University, where he was a member of the university track team. He also earned a Master of Business Administration (MBA) and a Doctor of Jurisprudence (JD) from the University of Detroit, where Williams presently serves on the University's Board of Trust. Williams also earned an LL.M., in Taxation from New York University. Before entering law school, Williams spent 10 years as a teacher and coach in the Detroit public school system.


In 2011, 2013-16, Colon directed Vanderbilt's hosting of the NCAA baseball Regionals and Super Regionals. He was the school's official liason at the 2011, 2014 and 2015 College World Series.

Colon came to Vanderbilt in 1998, organizing and directing CHAMPS/Life Skills, the community outreach arm of Commodore athletics.

As CHAMPS/Life Skills director, Colon guided Vanderbilt student-athletes into an expanded role in giving back to local schools, hospitals, non-profit organizations and other efforts aimed at disadvantaged residents of Nashville and Middle Tennessee. The program also emphasized a commitment to academic excellence, personal development, leadership and career development for participating student-athletes.

Before joining Vanderbilt, Colon served two years as Assistant Director for Student Services at Kansas State University. He has also served as an academic advisor for the Syracuse University football team. Colon earned an undergraduate degree from lowa State University and master's degree from the University of Toledo.

Colon has one son, DuBois, and is married to the former Terri Fortenberry.







Vanderbilt pushed the team's streak of consecutive postseason berths to a Southeastern Conference best 12 straight. The Commodores captured the NCAA Clemson Regional title, advancing to the fourth NCAA Super Regionals in five years, before falling short at top-seeded Oregon State. Vandy finished the year at 36-25-1 including a 15-13-1 mark in the SEC.

February 17-20 - No. 7 Vanderbilt opened the 2017 season by taking two-of-three on the road at San Diego. The series shifted up a day to avoid a rainy forecast, beginning on Thursday night with the Toreros rallying from behind to win the opener 3-2. Junior Kyle Wright took the loss despite allowing just three runs on four hits over five innings. The teams played six innings on Friday before rain suspended the game with the Commodores leading 8-2. The two teams finally resumed the game on Sunday afternoon with VU finishing off the 8-2 victory. Alonzo Jones led the way reaching base four times, with three hits and a walk while matching a career-high with three runs. The Commodores clinched the series later on Sunday behind freshman Drake Fellows. The big right-hander dominated in his collegiate debut, scattering two hits over six scoreless innings with five strikeouts for his first career win. Julian Infante matched his career-high with three RBIs with Ethan Paul also driving in three in the win.

February 22-26 - No. 17 Vanderbilt split the week going 2-2 at Hawkins Field. The Commodores opened the home schedule on Wednesday with a 7-4 victory over Evansville. Sophomore Maddux Conger earned the win in his first career start, striking out six and allowing one run on six hits over 4.1 innings. Ro Coleman helped put the game away with a two-run triple in the eighth inning. Vandy dropped the series opener against UIC on Friday afternoon 5-3 in 10 innings. Kyle Wright was solid in a no decision allowing one run on four hits with seven strikeouts over six innings. The Commodores bounced back on Saturday with a 6-2 win to even the series. Patrick Raby earned the win with six innings of work, striking out six and giving up one unearned run on three hits. Reed Hayes recorded the final four outs, including getting out of a bases loaded jam in the eighth, to notch his first save as a Commodore. Vanderbilt dropped the series finale on Sunday afternoon in a 5-2 loss in 11 innings. Matt Ruppenthal took the loss after allowing three runs on five hits over four innings of relief. Freshman Drake Fellows turned in an impressive start with seven strong innings and nine strikeouts while allowing two runs on seven hits. Jason Delay had a season-high three hits and Julian Infante added a pair of singles in the defeat.



February 28-March 1 - No. 17 Vanderbilt posted a winning week with two wins over Southeastern La. in the midweek The Commodores rallied to beat Southeastern La. on Tuesday 9-6 with Collin Snider picking up the win out of the bullpen. Jeren Kendall led the way with his second career two home run game as part of a three-hit day with four RBIs. Freshman Harrison Ray added his first career homer. The



Dores rallied again on Wednesday to take down the Lions 4-2. Paxton Stover earned the win out of the bullpen in his Vanderbilt debut. Ro Coleman had a pair of singles with home runs from Julian Infante and freshman JJ Bleday the difference.

March 3-5 - The Commodores matched a season-high with 12 left on base in Friday's series-opening 6-4 loss to CSUN. Kyle Wright took his second loss of the season after allowing five runs, three earned, on six hits with eight strikeouts over five innings. Will Toffey hit his first home run since 2015 with a two-run shot in the first inning. The Vandy offense struggled in a 4-1 loss on Saturday to CSUN with a season-low four hits. Patrick Raby was pegged with his first loss of the year despite allowing three runs, one earned, on four hits with seven strikeouts over six innings. The Commodores salvaged Sunday's game with an 11-3 win. The VU offense walked nine times and went 7-for-10 with runners in scoring position. Ethan Paul hit a pair of solo home runs as eight different Dores recorded hits.

March 7-8 - No. 25 Vanderbilt posted a pair of wins over Central Arkansas in the midweek. The Commodores opened the week with a 10-5 win over UCA on Tuesday. Jason Delay drove in four runs, including his first home run of the year with a three-run shot, and Reed Hayes came off the bench to add a career-best three hits with two RBIs and struck out two in a clean ninth inning. Bleday and Julian Infante each knocked in three runs as Collin Snider picked up his second win out of the bullpen. Saturday's game was postponed due to snow on the field and rescheduled as part of a doubleheader on Sunday. The Commodores dropped the front end of the twin bill in a 5-1 loss. Patrick Raby was superb in a tough-luck loss giving up five runs, three







March 17-19 - Vanderbilt dropped the SEC opener at Ole Miss 1-0 on Friday night in a pitcher's duel. The Rebels scored the lone run of the game in the sixth inning off Vandy starter Kyle Wright, who took the loss despite giving up just one run on six hits over seven innings. The offense was held to a season-low three hits. The Dores used the long ball to even the series on Saturday in a 6-2 win, matching a season-best with three home runs. Jeren Kendall, Will Toffey and Stephen Scott all went long with Toffey and Scott going back-to-back in the three-run fourth inning. The Commodores lost a late lead and the series on Sunday in a 10-8 loss. Ole Miss rallied for three runs in the eighth inning to clinch the series. The Dores used a season-high seven pitchers and walked a season-high seven batters. Penn Murfee took his first career loss, allowing two runs over 1.1 innings.

March 21 - The Commodores clobbered Belmont 17-11 on Wednesday night at First Tennessee Park scoring a season-best 17 runs on a season-high 17 hits. Will Toffey drove in a career-best six runs with a career-high four hits, including a three-run inside the park home run, with Julian Infante picking up a career-best four hits. Chandler Day earned the victory.

March 24-26 - Vanderbilt used one swing of the bat to win the series opener Friday night against Texas A&M 4-3. Jeren Kendall hit his first career grand slam and the Commodores' first since 2015 in the second inning. Kyle Wright won his first game of the season by allowing three runs on six hits with six strikeouts over five innings. Reed Hayes recorded his fourth save with 1.2 innings. The Dores hammered A&M 17-3 on Saturday afternoon, hitting a season-high four home runs. Jeren Kendall, Will Toffey, Julian Infante and Ethan Paul all hit homers in the win. Reed Hayes knocked in a career-best four runs with Toffey and Infante driving in three each. Patrick Raby dominated over seven scoreless innings for his fourth win of the season. Vandy could not finish the sweep on Sunday in a 6-4 loss to the Aggies. Jeren Kendall extended his





streak to six straight games with at least two hits with a pair of singles.

March 28 - Chandler Day no hit Lipscomb for 8.2 innings until a Zeke Dodson single broke up Day's bid for the first Vanderbilt no-hitter since 2003. Jason Delay hit his second homer of the season off the left field foul pole in the seventh inning. A five-run third inning by the Wildcats on Saturday sunk the Commodores in a 7-4 loss. The series loss snapped a streak of seven straight series wins for Vanderbilt against Kentucky. Kyle Wright took the loss after giving up seven runs on nine hits and four walks over five innings. Kyle Wright snapped the Dores' season-long, three-game losing streak with a three-hit shutout on Friday night in Vanderbilt's 2-0 win over Florida. Wright punched out a career-best 13 with no walks in his second straight shutout of the Gators. Jason Delay led the



offense with three hits and scored both runs in the victory. Will Toffey and Ethan Paul each added two hits apiece. The Commodores dropped the series on Saturday in a 20-8 loss. Jason Delay drove in three runs with Jeren Kendall and Ethan Paul chipping in three hits each. Drake Fellows took the loss after allowing six runs, five earned, on four hits over two innings.

April 18 - The Commodores hammered the Blue

The Dores and Bulldogs split a Saturday doubleheader to wrap up the series with VU dropping the first game 1-0 before claiming the series with a 10-5 win. Matt Ruppenthal took the loss in the first game after allowing a home run to the first batter he faced in the eighth inning. Kyle Wright did not factor in the decision despite seven scoreless innings with eight strikeouts. VU bounced back in the nightcap behind Chandler Day, who earned the win in his first career SEC start. The sophomore allowed three runs on six hits over 5.1 innings to notch his sixth victory of the season. Drake Fellows pitched the final 3.2 innings to notch his first career save. 

A big two-out rally in the third inning was too much for Vanderbilt to overcome on the road at top-ranked Oregon State in a season-ending 9-2 loss. Wright was pinned with the loss after giving up seven runs on eight hits over 6.2 innings. The junior struck out eight and walked three in his final outing. Toffey recorded his fifth multi-hit game in his last six games with a pair of singles.



Tim Corbin

Vanderbilt Head Coach 2003 - present 646-315-1 Overall Record



In 15 seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has transformed Vanderbilt into one of the national powers of college baseball and taken the program to unprecedented success winning the school's first-ever men's national title in 2014.

Corbin's overall record of 646-315-1 (.672) is second-best in terms of wins at Vanderbilt, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more

for coaches with 100 games or more.

Under Corbin, Vanderbilt boasts the Southeastern Conference's longest streak of consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances at 12. The Dores have advanced to a Super Regional in four of the last five years.

In 2015, Vanderbilt returned to the College World Series for the third time in five years with team's fourth 50-win season in the last four making it back to the CWS Finals before losing in three games to Virginia. The Dores captured the SEC East with a 20-10 mark.

The 2014 Commodores topped Virginia in the College World Series finals in three games to claim the title in just the Dores' second trip to Omaha. For the third time in four years Vandy hosted NCAA Regionals and Super Regionals, topping Oregon in the Regional final and Stanford in the Super Regionals.

Vanderbilt's 2013 team was one for the ages as the Commodores matched the school record with a 54-12 record and smashed the SEC record with a 26-3 mark to win the league title.

Roy Mewbourne

Vanderbilt Head Coach 1979-2002 655-608-9 Overall Record



A fixture around Vanderbilt baseball for nearly a quarter century, Roy Mewbourne retired following the 2002 campaign, ending his career as the Commodores' all-time winningest skipper and one of most successful coaches in collegiate baseball history.

The native of Birmingham,
Ala., compiled a 655-608-9 mark

in 24 seasons at Vanderbilt, and finished his 30-year coaching tenure with a 922-683-9 overall record.

In his final season as Vanderbilt's head coach, Mewbourne achieved several personal milestones, most notably becoming the 35th coach in college baseball history to reach the 900-win plateau. He registered his 900th career win against West Virginia (2/16) and his 650th victory at Vanderbilt against Mississippi State (4/28). The win over the Bulldogs also came in Mewbourne's 1,600th game as a collegiate head coach.

At the start of the season, the then-56-year-old skipper also saw his dream of a new stadium become a reality with the unveiling of Hawkins Field. A catalyst in the stadium's construction, Mewbourne played a vital role in fund-raising, planning and oversight for the \$5.8 million facility.

Mewbourne fielded some outstanding teams in his Vanderbilt tenure, highlighted by his 1980 squad that captured the SEC Championship, which earned him SEC Coach of the Year honors.

He coached 19 All-Americans, 19 All-SEC honorees and 59 players who signed professional baseball contracts and 111 Commodores earned SEC Academic honors, including a school record 16 in 2002.

Larry Schmittou Vanderbilt Head Coach 1968-78 306-252-1 Overall Record



Larry Schmittou arrived at Vanderbilt in 1968 and immediately changed the mindset of Commodore baseball in the Music City. After combining for 13 total wins the previous three seasons, he guided VU to eight wins his first year, 12 in 1969 and 24 in 1970. In 1971, Vanderbilt broke

through with a 34-19 record

and won the SEC Eastern Division with an 11-5 record. That would be the first of four consecutive division crowns for the Commodores. In 1973 and '74, the Commodores swept Alabama, 2-0, in a pair of best-of-three series for the overall SEC championship earning him SEC Coach of the Year honors. He coached 20 All-SEC, eight All-SEC East, eight All-South Region and seven Academic All-SEC. He had 21 players in Major League Baseball with 14 of those players taken in the draft

Schmittou retired following the 1978 campaign after 11 years as the Vanderbilt head coach. He amassed a 306-252-1 overall record and a 98-98 mark in Southeastern Conference play.

During the time Schmittou roamed the dugout at McGugin Field, Vanderbilt won more games than any other SEC school and was one of only two schools to win four divisional titles.

Upon his retirement as Vanderbilt's head coach, Schmittou acquired the rights to a Southern League expansion franchise team, the Nashville Sounds.

He was inducted into the Vanderbilt Hall of Fame in 2016.

<u>2014 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS</u>



The Commodores claimed Vanderbilt's first-ever men's national title in 2014 winning the College World Series. The Commodores notched the team's third 50-win season in the last four seasons going 51-21 and playing in a school record 72 games. Vanderbilt hosted an NCAA Regional and Super Regional for the third time in four years. The Dores clinched the squad's second trip to the College World Series with a Super Regional victory over Stanford after securing the NCAA Nashville Regional against Oregon with a walk-off win.


May 20-22 – SEC Tournament – Vanderbilt opens the SEC Tournament in unfamiliar territory having to play a single-elimination game against Tennessee on Tuesday morning. The Dores take an early 3-2 lead and turn the ball over to Carson Fulmer in the ninth with a one-run lead. Fulmer finds trouble immediately allowing a leadoff double to Nick Senzel and balking him over to third with no outs. The sophomore, however, finds a way out of the jam in an unbelievable way. Taylor Smart's one-hopper to Xavier Turner at third takes the VU third baseman directly into Senzel at third to tag the runner before he gets back to third for the first out. Fulmer then picks off Smart at first and strikes out Vincent Jackson to end the game. The next two games, however, do not bounce the Commodores way. LSU run rules the Dores 11-0 and Ole Miss eliminates Vandy 7-2 to send the Commodores home before the championship game for the first time since 2010.

May 30-June 1 – NCAA Nashville Regional – The Commodores host NCAA Regionals for the third time in four years with Oregon, Clemson and Xavier coming to Nashville. The Dores open against Xavier on Friday night with Tyler Beede bringing his A-game. The right-hander strikes out a career-best 14 over eight scoreless innings to get the win in an 11-0 blowout. Xavier Turner drives in three runs and John Norwood adds three hits in the win. Carson Fulmer keeps the strong Vandy pitching rolling on Saturday in the Dores' 7-2 victory. Fulmer allows two runs on three hits as VU uses a five-run fifth to down Oregon and advance to the championship game. Bryan Reynolds impacts the victory with three hits, including an RBI-single in the fifth. Walker Buehler shows up in a big way Sunday night allowing two runs on six hits with eight strikeouts to push Vanderbilt's starting pitching totals for the Regional to an amazing 25 innings, four runs, five walks, 27 strikeouts and three wins. Buehler's heroics are slightly overshadowed by Ro Coleman. The freshman delivers in a big spot in the bottom of the ninth with a bases loaded single through the left side for a walk-off win to send Vandy back to the Super Regional.

June 6-8 - NCAA Nashville Super Regional - The Commodores appear headed to Indiana for a Super Regional until Stanford stuns the Hoosiers with a walk-off home run to set up Vandy's third Super Regional at Hawkins Field in four years. Set with a rematch against the Cardinal, the Commodores get off to a fast start with 10 runs in the first three innings of the series opener. But the Cardinal storm back with six runs in the middle innings and have the tying run at the plate before the Vandy bullpen can put the game away in an 11-6 victory. With a trip to Omaha on the line on Saturday the Dores are the road team and struggle early against Stanford starter Cal Quantrill. The Stanford freshman stymies VU for seven innings before the Dores can get to the bullpen. Once in the pen, Vandy ties the game in the top of the ninth but leaves the go-ahead run at third base with the bases loaded. Wayne Taylor quickly forces a game three with a walk-off solo homer into the right-center field bleachers. Faced with an elimination game, the Commodores respond with five runs in the first inning on six hits and three stolen bases. The Cardinal bounce back to close within a run, however, and the game enters the seventh with the Dores up 6-5. Nine outs from Omaha the Commodores hammer the gas, scoring six runs over the final three innings to seal the deal and the program's second-ever trip to the College World Series. Four different Commodores record multi-hit games with Bryan Reynolds, Vince Conde and John Norwood combining to go 9-for-14 with six runs and five RBÍ. Hayden Stone strikes out eight over six innings to notch the win.

June 14-25 – College World Series – Back in Omaha for the second time in school history, the Commodores draw rival Louisville in the opener. The Dores claim an early lead on a wild pitch to score John Norwood from third and Dansby Swanson comes

up big with a two-out, two-run double to give Vandy an early three-run lead. VU tacks on runs in the fourth and seventh to hold off a Cardinals comeback and win the opening game of the CWS. Early offense again keys the Commodores in the second game against UC Irvine with two runs in the first inning. But the Anteaters counter with four runs in the second and take a 4-2 lead into the fifth. Swanson doubles to open the frame and sparks a three-run inning to put Vandy back in front. Walker Buehler entered in the bottom of the fourth and was magnificent. The sophomore pitched 5.1 no-hit innings with seven strikeouts to earn the win as the Dores come from behind to advance in the winner's bracket. After three days off, Vanderbilt returns to action against Texas on Friday afternoon. The Longhorns are ready and shutout the Dores 4-0 behind senior Nathan Thornhill's eight strong innings. Tyler Campbell comes off the bench to start at third base and goes 2-for-3 in the loss. Vandy's second elimination game of the postseason is pushed back to the night game when the Virginia-Ole Miss game is washed out on Friday night. The Commodores scratch out a run in the first



and take a 2-0 lead in the third before Texas ties it in the fourth. The two teams head to the 10th tied 3-3. Rhett Wiseman singles with two outs in the 10th in front of Ro Coleman, who walks, and Karl Ellison, who is hit by a pitch to load the bases for Campbell. The sophomore delivers by beating out an infield single to score Wiseman from third and send the Commodores to the championship series on a walk-off. Facing off against Virginia in the finals, the Cavaliers score two runs in the first inning of game one and look to be in total control heading into the third. UVa starter Nathan Kirby strikes out Chris Harvey for his seventh straight retired batter to open the game but loses all control after that. The sophomore issues a walk before Campbell doubles to put two on for Swanson. Kirby walks four of the next five batters before an error ends his day. In his second at-bat of the inning, Campbell delivers the big blow with a three-run double down the third baseline. Suddenly up 9-2 the Commodores have to hold on for a 9-8 win with Adam Ravenelle finishing it off in the ninth. Brandon Waddell holds the Dores down in the second game of the series, tossing a complete game in the Cavs' 7-2 win. Tyler Beede hangs tough to save the bullpen with 6.2 innings of work. Again the Commodores come out hot in the team's third and final elimination game. Vandy scores a run in the first thanks to Swanson, who singles and comes around to score. Pitching on short rest in his third start of the CWS, Carson Fulmer is sharp over the first five innings for Vandy and takes a 2-0 lead into the bottom of the sixth. The Cavaliers finally get to the right-hander to tie the game but Hayden Stone enters and gets a pair of strikeouts to end the inning. John Norwood comes up with one out in the eighth inning of a tie game and does the unthinkable, blasting a solo home run over the left field wall off UVa closer Nick Howard. The home run is the first for the Commodores in over a month and just the third by any team at the CWS. The Cavaliers open the bottom of the eighth with a single and walk to chase Stone and bring in Ravenelle. The junior responds by working out of a bases loaded jam in the eighth to preserve the lead. Ravenelle finishes off Vanderbilt's first national championship with a quick 1-2-3 ninth inning with a pair of strikeouts to end it. Following the game, Dansby Swanson is named the Most Outstanding Player of the College World Series. Joining him on the CWS All-Tournament team are John Norwood, Rhett Wiseman and Tyler Campbell.
