# 2009 SEASON REVIEW

## 2009 SEASON REVIEW

- Vanderbilt opened the 2009 season with a 1-3 ledger against then No. 5 Stanford and Cal on the West Coast. All three of the losses, two to the Cardinals and one to the Bears, were by just one run.
- Before the season started sophomore catcher Curt Casali, who was expected to start at catcher, hurt his throwing arm and needed Tommy John surgery. He held off on the procedure until after the season and played in all 64 games, predominantly at first base.
- The Commodores won nine of their next 10 to improve to 10-4, but lost junior catcher Andrew Giobbi for 16 games after he broke his hand against Vermont on Feb. 27. He showed tremendous toughness after hurting it early in the game and then playing the rest of the contest while in tremendous pain.
- With Giobbi down and Curt Casali unable to catch, redshirt freshmen Drew Fann and Aaron Westlake shared duties behind the plate. It was the first time Westlake had ever caught in his life and he ended up starting 14 games.
- VU opened Southeastern Conference play by dropping two of three in its first three series to #14 Ole Miss, Kentucky and Auburn and ended March with a 3-6 league mark and a 17-10 overall record.
- The struggles continued with a midweek loss to Belmont at Greer Stadium and a series opening loss to #19 Florida to fall to 17-12.
- The team rebounded with a 4-3 win over the Gators on Saturday to even the series but looked like they were on the verge of losing their fourth straight conference series, trailing 9-2 heading into the bottom of the sixth. VU then exploded for 14 runs over the final three innings to defeat Florida, 16-9, to take the series.
- After a midweek shutout loss at Middle Tennessee, the Commodores responded by sweeping a rain-shortened two-game series against then No. Arkansas in Fayetteville. Junior left-hander Mike Minor struck out 11 and limited the Razorbacks to just four hits in eight innings of work in the 9-0 shutout win in the opener.
- VU swept a pair of home midweek contests against Middle Tennessee and Morehead State (Drew Hayes, Nick Christiani, Chase Reid and Russell Brewer combined on a five-hit shutout in an 8-0 win over Morehead) to improve to 23-13 overall and entered a home three-game series against Alabama with a 7-7 league mark.
- The hard-hitting Crimson Tide swept the series, including a Saturday doubleheader that was scheduled to avoid torrential rain in the Nashville area.
- VU dropped a 9-8 decision at Austin Peay, marking the second of three four-game losing streaks on the year. The Dores then used a late rally at Louisville to start a four-game winning streak. Brian Harris' bases loaded walk in the ninth tied the game at 3-3 and Joe Loftus' grounder in the 10th gave Vanderbilt a 4-3 win over Louisville. The win was the Commodores first when trailing after eight innings, as they were 0-13 in such situations entering tonight's game.
- Vanderbilt swept Mississippi State for the second straight year and improved to 27-17 overall and 10-10 in the SEC at the end of April.

- The up and down campaign continued as VU couldn't sustain the success at South Carolina, dropping all three games to the Gamecocks in Columbia.
- VU swept a doubleheader against Belmont to close out midweek play and then traveled to No. 13 Georgia with its SEC tourney chances on the line. The Commodores rode strong pitching performances by Sonny Gray and Mike Minor to take the first two games of the series.
- Vanderbilt entered the final regular season series against in-state rival Tennessee having to win just one contest to clinch a spot in the SEC tournament. The Commodores had swept the Vols the previous two seasons and VU was expected to win against a UT team that was eliminated from postseason contention. Tennessee responded by sweeping a hard fought series with two of three games going into extra innings.
- VU finished the regular season with a 31-24 overall record and 12-17 league mark and was able to make the tournament inspite of the results against the Vols.
- Vanderbilt, the No. 8 seed, faced No. 1 seed LSU in the opening round and rode a stellar pitching performance by Mike Minor to a 4-1 win over the Tigers. Minor pitched his second complete game victory in three games and pitched on four days rest. He scattered six hits over nine innings and allowed just one run while striking out five and walking three.
- The Commodores moved into the semifinal round for the fourth straight year and for the fifth time in six years with a thrilling 5-4 win over South Carolina, avenging a series sweep to the Gamecocks at the start of the month.
- VU continued its domination of Arkansas in the semis, eliminating the Razorbacks via an 11-1 seven-inning run rule decision. Caleb Cotham pitched seven innings of five-hit ball to lead the Dores into the tourney finals.

## SEASON REVIEW

- The Commodores reached the tourney finals for the third time in four years, but fell to LSU, 6-2. The Tigers would go on to win the national championship in June.
- VU made its fourth straight NCAA appearance, a school record, and traveled to Louisville as the No. 2 seed in the Cardinals regional.
- After falling to Middle Tennessee by a 5-4 score in the tourney opener, Vanderbilt responded with three stellar pitching performances by Sonny Gray, Caleb Cotham and Nick Christiani in wins against Indiana (10-0), Middle Tennessee (6-0) and Louisville (8-4). The win over the Cardinals forced a second championship game in which UL won 5-3.
- Vanderbilt finished the 2009 season with a 37-27 record, its sixth straight year of 30 or more wins dating back to 2004.
- Several players earned postseason plaudits led by Brian Harris' first-team All-SEC nod at shortstop. Pitcher Sonny Gray, second baseman Riley Reynolds and designated hitter Aaron Westlake were named Freshman All-Americans by *Collegiate Baseball*. (complete list of awards below)
- Mike Minor was drafted in the first round by the Atlanta Braves, marking the third straight year Vanderbilt had a No. 1 draft pick.



Caleb Cotham led the team in wins, finishing with a 7-5 record and 4.10 ERA. He was named to the Louisville Regional All-Tournament Team after a complete game shutout performance against Middle Tennessee.
