

### **Season Preview**

Armed with what many consider to be the top pitching prospect in the country in junior southpaw David Price, and with sophomore slugger Pedro Alvarez, Vanderbilt baseball is primed for one of the best seasons

After the 2006 College World Series in June, Baseball America predicted its 2007 CWS field, and Vanderbilt is one of the eight teams expected to head to Omaha. These are lofty expectations for a program that has never advanced to the series, but Tim Corbin has had his eyes set on that goal since becoming head coach in 2003.

"You walk through our locker room now and there are things on the wall that have Omaha mentioned," Corbin said. "And so it is clear what our goals are. There is no question about it. And they are lofty goals. But as Herb Brooks said as the coach of the [1980 gold medal-winning] U.S. national [hockey] team, if you don't have lofty goals then what is the sense in competing?"

The Commodores were a youthful bunch in 2006; eight of the nine everyday starters were sophomores and freshmen. The crew exceeded expectations as they made the finals of the SEC Tournament and advanced to the championship round of the NCAA Atlanta Regional before falling to eventual College World Series participant Georgia Tech.

Although Vanderbilt finished among the league leaders with a .308 team batting average, Corbin believes that number along with the total offensive production can be improved upon.

"I said in the first meeting of the year in August that the most important thing to improve on offensively is to get stronger and get to a point where we can get more extra base hits," Corbin said. "We finished second or third in the conference in hitting, but to me it was a hollow figure. I think run production is the most important thing when it comes to offense and that means getting on base. I thought the thing we needed to improve on most is the ability to drive in and create runs."

Shea Robin made 26 starts at catcher as a sophomore last year and spent the rest of the time as the designated hitter. He will get the nod behind the plate and will be expected to build upon his offensive stats of 2006 when he hit .327 with five homers and 36 RBI.

Senior Carter Hawkins provides veteran leadership and experience. He will serve as the backup at catcher and will occassionally see time at DH.

A pair of redshirt freshmen Andrew Giobbi and Jay Moreland will also serve apprenticeships behind the dish this season with more playing time expected in the future.

#### First Base

Junior Brad French was a catalyst for the Commodores down the stretch last season and will begin the year as the starter at first. The coaches love his contagious attitude and believe he was a big reason the Commodores won its last two SEC series and advanced to the conference tourney championship. He finished the year with a .312 average with three homers and 16 RBI.

Sophomore Kurt Lipton has moved from the outfield to first in order to better utilize his tall frame. He has power potential in his bat and should see some playing time if he can master the position.

Freshman Steven Liddle may also have an opportunity at first or at DH due to his quality bat. He hit over .500 last year at Franklin High and showed the ability to hit college pitching in the fall.

#### Second Base

Junior Alex Feinberg had a solid year last season and will look to build on that as the starter at second. He hit .322 last year and took to second well after starting most of his freshman year at third base.

Redshirt freshman Brian Harris made strides in the weightroom and in his offensive development over the last year and should challenge for some playing time. He will also serve as the backup at short.

#### Shortstop

Sophomore Ryan Flaherty led the Commodores last year with a .339 batting average, 19 doubles and 49 RBI and earned honorable mention Freshman All-American honors. The coaches love his saavy play and expect him to become the leader of the infield.

Redshirt freshman Matt Shao will serve as a backup at short along with Harris and provides another quality defender in the infield.

### Season Preview

Third baseman Alvarez, a first team preseason All-American, was a force for the Commodores as a freshman; he hit .327 and 64 RBI to go along with his school-record 22 homers. He was a unanimous selection as the National Freshman of the Year and had a star-making summer with USA Baseball's National Team, which is made up of the top collegiate players in the country. He was named the MVP of the USA-Japan Friendship Series after he led all batters with a .409 average, two doubles, a grand slam and nine RBI in the five-game skein, which the U.S. won 3-1-1. Alvarez is expected to be the driving force in the middle of the Vanderbilt lineup the next two seasons.

Newcomer Russell Brewer will serve as the backup at third and also has a promising future as a pitcher.

#### Leftfield

Junior Dominic de la Osa made the transition from shortstop to leftfield at the end of last year and did so in seamless fashion. He added more bulk during the offseason and will be one of the team's power sources after finishing last season with a .319 batting average to go along with nine homers and 46 RBI.



Senior Matt Meingasner will serve as the backup in left and will also get some at bats at DH. He should improve on his numbers from last season when he hit .260 with two homers and 24 RBI as a junior col-

Freshman Jordan Wormsley showed promise in the fall and will be one of the outfielders to watch in the future.

#### Centerfield

Junior David Macias will patrol center for the second straight year. Last season he made the move from the infield and was a catalyst at the top of the order. He hit .328 with 39 walks, 14 hit by pitches and a .447 on base percentage.

Sophomore Jonathan White has made the most improvement of anyone on the team according to the coaches and has warranted more playing time with his strong showing in the fall. He will see some action in the outfield and will also DH.

Freshman Alex Hilliard is a promising talent who is making the move from the infield to the outfield in the spring. He has power potential and will be a guy to watch in the future.

Junior Ryan Davis will once again start in right and will look to build on a solid 2006 campaign in which he hit .323 with four homers and 31 RBI. He has a very accurate arm and takes a serious approach to the

Junior Parker Hanks will split time here and at DH this season. He along with Meingasner provide quality depth and starting experience in the corner outfield spots. The duo combined for 63 starts last year with Hanks hitting .274 with three homers and 22 RBI.

"Every single guy that returns should make a jump in production offensively," said Corbin. "A lot of that comes from experience that they gained last year and over the summer. They were able to hit off of our pitchers every day as well and were able to face some quality pitching and know how to handle it. I think with age comes strength and strike zone discipline and knowledge. With that, they better themselves offensively and we become better as a team."

#### **Pitchers**

Junior ace David Price (9-5, 4.16 ERA) returns after setting the school record for single-season strikeouts with 155 in 110.1 innings in 2006. He was named a third-team All-American by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and was a finalist for the Golden Spikes Award, widely considered the most prestigious honor in all of college baseball. The Murfreesboro native is geared up to have his finest season in a Commodore uniform in 2007.

Senior closer Casey Weathers (1-1, 3.33 ERA) had a dominant summer in the Alaska Baseball League, recording eight saves. He was 1-0 in 18 relief appearances with a 0.84 ERA and struck out 25 batters in 21.1 innings. The California native capped off his summer by being added to the USA Baseball National Team. The flamethrower has consistently thrown 94-97 miles per hour and will be the man at the end of games for the Commodores.

Several pitchers will have a chance to complement Price in the starting rotation. Sophomore Nick Christiani (3-4, 4.79 ERA) had a strong showing in the fall. Also in a position to challenge for a rotation spot are juniors Cody Crowell (6-2, 3.95 ERA) and Ty Davis (5-5, 3.91 ERA) and senior Stephen Shao (2-3, 3.62 ERA).

Sophomores Josh Zeid (0-1, 5.24 ERA) and Brett Jacobson (2-0, 4.20 ERA) each progressed well over the summer and fall and will be counted on heavily in a variety of roles.

Juniors Cameron Betourne (1-1, 2.56 ERA) and Tyler Rhoden (3-1, 4.81 ERA) are battle tested veterans that will be counted on again to pitch in key situations.

Freshman Mike Minor stood out in the fall and may get a chance to see action in possibly a starter's role.

One player that turned out to be a surprise and who has garnered the coaches attention is southpaw Jason Cunningham. He served as one of the team managers last season and made the squad this year after consistently performing well over the fall.

Freshmen Caleb Cotham, Richie Goodenow and Mark Lamm along with junior Stephen Schwartz all have a quality arms and will be cornerstones of the future.

"We go into the year with some depth in pitching, but outside of David (Price), there are some questions still to be answered as far as the weekend starting rotation," said Corbin. "I think we could go in five different ways with the starters. Cody Crowell, Stephen Shao, Ty Davis, Nick Christiani and possibly Mikie Minor depending on his development could vy for spots. Compared to recent years, where we had spots defined by the winter, know we have five or six guys that are relatively even in what they can do. I think the strength behind that is whoever doesn't start can move into a relief role, allowing us to put in a guy who may be just as good as the starter. This should avoid any dips caused when changing pitchers and give us balance throughout the staff.

With so many talented and experienced performers, the 2007 season is looking to be something special for Vanderbilt baseball, with expectations as high as they have ever been for the program. It is a challenge that the coaching staff and players are looking forward to undertaking their guest to reach Omaha in June.

Coach Corbin Quote: Pedro will hit somewhere in the middle of the lineup this season and will be counted on to be a major power source again. He has continued to improve and mature a great deal. He is a very good team player and is a leader through his actions.

2006: Named the National Freshman of the Year by Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball and Rivals.com ... Also named the SEC Freshman of the Year after finishing the season with a .329 batting average to go along with a Vanderbilt school record 22 homers and 64 RBI ... 
