

# Nine 'Dores to Play in Second Bowl

When the Commodores and Bearcats square off in the 53rd Liberty Bowl, nine Vanderbilt players will earn the distinction of becoming the first football letterwinners in team history to ever make multiple post-season bowl appearances.

The nine, all active contributors on the 2011 squad, saw action in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, which the Commodores captured over Boston College 16-14.

The nine players are:

- Brandon Barden, R-Sr., TE
- Tim Fugger, R-Sr., DE
- Casey Hayward, Sr., DB
- Sean Richardson, Sr., safety
- Udom Umoh, R-Sr., WR
- Kyle Fischer, R-Sr., OL
- T.J. Greenstone, R-Sr., DT
- Chris Marve, R-Sr., LB
- Larry Smith, R-Sr., QB

Several of the current Commodores played pivotal roles in the Music City Bowl win.

It marked the first career quarterback start for Smith. Marve started at inside linebacker, finishing with a team-high 10 tackles. Richardson made one of the biggest plays of the game, recovering a fumbled punt for a touchdown. Hayward played much of the game at cornerback in place of an injured **D.J. Moore**. Umoh posted the first three catches of his career.

# Vanderbilt Defense Produces Points, Records

The Vanderbilt defense has produced a team-record four defensive touchdowns this season. Along the way, the Commodores also broke two other team marks for interception returns.

The fourth score came Nov. 19 when **Archibald Barnes** (R-Jr., LB) went 100 yards after intercepting a pass at Tennessee. Barnes' return ranks as the longest in team history.

Early in the year, **Trey Wilson** (Jr., CB) scored on interception returns of 21 and 52 yards against Elon and Ole Miss, respectively, and **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) returned a pick 50 yards for a TD against Connecticut. It marked the first time in modern history that Vanderbilt scored TDs on INT returns in three straight games.

The Vanderbilt defense also has established a new team record for total interception return yardage in a single season. The Commodores returned 17 interceptions for 395 yards, an average of 23.2 yards per return.

defeated No. 24 Boston College 16-14 in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl.

The Commodores are 2-1-1 all-time in postseason bowls. Victories have come in the 2008 Music City Bowl and 1955 Gator Bowl (25-13 over Auburn). Vanderbilt also tied Texas Tech in the 1974 Peach Bowl and lost in a high-scoring affair to Air Force in the 1982 Hall of Fame Bowl.

In accepting the AutoZone Liberty Bowl bid, James Franklin becomes the first new coach to ever guide the Commodores into postseason play. His six-win total also represents the most victories by a first-year Vanderbilt head coach in 36 years.

# Four Standouts Earn All-SEC Recognition

Four Vanderbilt standouts – **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB), **Chris Marve** (R-Sr., LB), **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Sr., DE)— were named to the Coaches' All-SEC Team Dec. 6.

One day earlier, Stacy, Marve and Hayward were named All-SEC by AP writers. Stacy, a junior from Centreville, Ala., was named to the second team All-SEC offense. Marve, a senior from Memphis, Hayward, a senior from Perry, Ga., and Fugger, a senior from Oak Brook, Ill., were placed on the second team defense.

The quartet played vital roles as the Commodores enjoyed one of the nation's top turnarounds.

Marve is a three-year starter who will be returning to his hometown for the AutoZone Liberty Bowl. As a senior, he topped the Commodores and ranked 13th in the SEC with 84 tackles. He also ranks ninth all-time at Vanderbilt with 390 career tackles and eighth with 28.0 career tackles for loss.

Fugger became a big defensive playmaker this season, contributing 12 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. He ranked eighth in the SEC in both categories.

Stacy enjoyed one of the finest offensive seasons ever by a Vandy back. The junior broke the team's single-season record with 1,136 rushing yards and scored 13 rushing TDs, the most ever by a Commodore running back.

Hayward ranks third in the SEC with five interceptions and second in the league with 14 passes defended. He enters the bowl with 13 career interceptions, just two behind Leonard Coleman's (1980-83) school record.

# **Sports Illustrated Features 'Dores**

Even before he directed the Commodores on the field for the first time, new Head Coach **James Franklin** was working to attract national media attention for the Vanderbilt program.

Sports Illustrated, given rare behind-the-scenes access during preseason camp, published a lengthy feature on the team just as Franklin's Commodores were reeling off three straights wins to open the year.

SI staff writer Michael Rosenberg attended Southeastern Conference Media Days, then spent three days on campus during camp doing research for the in-depth look at Franklin's vision to improve the Vanderbilt program.

# Franklin's First Year: Vast Statistical Improvement

Statistics reveal the same fact that Vanderbilt's 6-6 win-loss record shows: the 2011 Commodores are a vastly improved team over the 2010 squad.

In addition to a four-game improvement in the regular season record, first-year Head Coach James Franklin has the Commodores performing at a higher level than the 2010 squad in virtually every area.

In a regular season comparison of the 2010 and 2011 teams, the current edition scored more points (26.9-16.9), allowed less points (20.8-31.2), produced more first downs (17.4-15.0), gave up fewer first downs (17.8-19.9), scored more rushing TDs (24-13) and red zone TD (23-14), and allowed fewer red-zone TDs (16-29).

The 2011 offense and defense are greatly improved. The offense has produced more total yards (44.6), rushing yards (28.8) and passing yards (15.8). The 2011 defense has given up nearly 100 fewer total yards (94.6), including 70 less rush yards (70) and 24.6 less passing yards.

The team is also improved in all rushing categories. The offense is averaging more yards per rush attempt (4.1-4-0). The 1.1-yard defensive improvement in yards per attempt (3.4-4.5) is one of the team's most impressive statistics.

The overall improvement has resulted in nearly a three-minute gain in time of possession.

The 2011 defense also has eight more interceptions, helping the team to improve in turnover margin (+6).

# Vanderbilt Point Production At Near-Record Levels

The Commodore offense is on pace to produce more points than any Vanderbilt offense since World War II.

The 2011 unit, under the direction of first-year coordinator **John Donovan**, has scored 323 points, just five fewer points than in 1948. Prior to Red Sanders' 1948 squad, the most explosive Commodore offense dates back to the 9-1 Dan McGugin squad of 1915 that racked up 514 points.

This is just the third Vanderbilt team since the 1920s to score more than 300 points.

The Commodores are averaging 26.9 points, ranking third in the post-World War II era: 1948 (29.8) and 2005 (27.2).

Since midseason, Vanderbilt's offense has scored consistently, averaging 31.5 points during its last seven games. The unit also has scored at least 21 points in its last seven games, marking the first time a Commodore offense has done so since the 1948 season.

In the defensive-oriented Southeastern Conference, the offense is averaging 21.1 points, a 10.8-point improvement from one year ago.

# 'Dores: Unbeaten in Non-Conference Play

Vanderbilt earned its first undefeated campaign in non-Southeastern Conference play in 12 years when it finished 4-0 this year against non-SEC opponents.

The Commodores ended the season with a convincing 41-7 victory at Wake Forest, its final non-conference foe. Earlier, Vanderbilt topped Elon (45-14, Sept. 3), UConn (24-21, Sept. 10) and Army (44-21, Oct. 22).

In the last decade, Vanderbilt sports a 19-15 record against non-conference opponents.

Vanderbilt's last undefeated non-SEC slate came in 1999, with victories over Northern Illinois, Duke and The Citadel.

# Franklin Accomplishment: First to Guide Initial Vanderbilt Squad to Postseason

James Franklin, the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, became the first coach to guide his initial Commodore squad to a postseason bowl game.

Franklin also became the first new Vandy coach to register six wins since Fred Pancoast earned seven victories in 1975.

Franklin also became the first new coach at Vanderbilt to claim victories in his first three games since E.H. Alley accomplished the feat in 1943. Before Alley's achievement, the last new coach to duplicate Franklin's 3-0 mark was Dan McGugin in 1904.

Franklin guided Vanderbilt to a 45-14 victory over Elon on Sept. 3, a 24-21 comefrom-behind win over Connecticut on Sept. 10, and an impressive 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17 to open the season.

**Kyle Fischer** (R-Sr., RT) was recognized as SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his strong play in the Commodores' 41-7 win at Wake Forest.

The offensive co-captain from Columbia, S.C., continuously opened holes in the Deacs' defensive line, helping the 'Dores produce 297 rushing yards and four rushing TDs. **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) had 184 rushing yards and three TDs in becoming the team's all-time single-season rusher.

# Zac Stacy Off. Player of the Week, Nov. 12 (Kentucky)

Zac Stacy (Jr., RB) earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his stellar rushing performance in Vanderbilt's 38-8 victory over Kentucky. Stacy rushed for 135 yards and three TDs against the Wildcats.

Stacy became the first Vanderbilt running back to win the SEC's top offensive player award since Corey Harris was honored on Oct. 19, 1991 after a 169-yard rushing performance against Georgia.

**Ryan Seymour** (R-Jr., LG) was recognized as the SEC's Offensive Lineman of the Week for his strong play in a 44-21 win over Army. Stacy's total was the third-highest rushing total in school history by a Vanderbilt player.

Jones prepped at Memphis University School, teaming with former Commodore teammate **John Stokes** to form a superb linebacker tandem at MUS. Jones was a 2007 finalist for the Division II-AA Mr. Football Lineman of the Year Award. Pulley captured the Division II-A Mr. Football Lineman of the Year Award as a standout at Evangelical Christian. Lewis has not played as a true freshman.

# Vandy Defensive Coach Worked at Memphis

Vanderbilt co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach **Brent Pry** served as a defensive assistant coach for three years at the University of Memphis.

Pry coached the Memphis defensive line from 2007-09, and helped guide the Tigers to appearances in the 2007 New Orleans Bowl and the 2008 St. Petersburg Bowl. His defensive fronts with the Tigers were regarded among the best in Conference USA.





# Junior Zac Stacy Sets New Single-Season Rush Mark; Contributes 13 Rushing TDs to Successful Campaign

**Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) is the new single-season rushing leader at Vanderbilt.

Stacy finished the regular season with 1,136 rushing yards, 33 more than the former mark set by **Corey Harris** in 1991.

Stacy also set a modern-day school record with 13 rushing touchdowns, one more than **Jamie O'Rourke** scored in 1974.

Stacy broke the single-season record during a 184-yard, 3-TD performance in the team's regular season finale at Wake Forest.

In early December, Stacy was rewarded for the outstanding season by getting named as a consensus All-Southeastern Conference running back.

The Wake Forest effort allowed Stacy to move up to No. 8 on the team's career rushing list. He has 1,945 rushing yards and 19 TDs on 356 career carries.

Stacy is averaging 121.7 rushing yards over his last seven games. He scored 12 rushing TDs during the seven-game stretch.

Stacy also became the first 'Dore running back in two decades to earn SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors following a 135-yard, 3-TD performance vs. Kentucky on Nov. 12.

Donovan coached Maryland running backs in 2005 and quarterbacks in 2006. Galt directed the strength and conditioning effort for Maryland football while Banks served on the Terp staff. Griffin served as Maryland's assistant recruiting coordinator in 2006.

# Hand Worked With UC Head Coach

Vanderbilt offensive line coach **Herb Hand** and Cincinnati Head Coach **Butch Jones** were members of the West Virginia offensive staff in 2005-06.

With Hand coaching tight ends and Jones mentoring wide receivers, the Mountaineers recorded back-to-back 11-win campaigns, earned a pair of top-10 national rankings. West Virginia also notched victories in the Sugar Bowl and Gator Bowl during those years.

# Beatty, UC's Johnson Coach Ties

Prior to joining the Franklin staff this year, Vanderbilt offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Chris Beatty served three years at West Virginia with current Cincinnati tight ends coach Dave Johnson.

Beatty coached running backs, slot receivers and directed the recruiting effort as a WVU coach from 2008-10. Johnson served the same three years as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach.

# **Smith Reaches Milestones**


**Larry Smith** (R-Sr., QB) has surpassed three career passing milestones this season: 300 completions, 600 attempts and 3,000 yards.

Casey Hayward (Sr., DB) became the first Commodore in three years to garner All-America recognition when he was named to the second team defense by the prestigious Walter Camp Football Foundation on Dec. 7.

Hayward, a native of Perry, Ga., was also named as a Second Team All-America by both Yahoo! Sports and Rivals.com, and Third Team All-America by Phil Steele's.

Hayward is the first Commodore All-America since another defensive back, D.J. Moore, received widespread recognition in 2008.

Hayward and Moore are tied for second on Vanderbilt's alltime interceptions list. With 13 career picks, Hayward trails only Leonard Coleman, who

nabbed 15 interceptions from 1980-83.

In early December, Hayward was named All-Southeastern Conference for the second consecutive year by coaches and sportwriters. He also was named as a midseason semifinalist for Jim Thorpe Award given annually to the nation's top defensive back.

Hayward ranks among the SEC and NCAA leaders this season with five interceptions and 14 passes defended. With 13 career interceptions, he is also the SEC's active career leader.

Hayward also has 40 solo tackles and 6.5 tackles for loss this year. He has amassed 190 career tackles.



# All-SEC 'Backer Chris Marve Returns Home for Bowl; Co-Captain Ranks 9th Among Vandy Career Tacklers

Chris Marve, a three-time All-Southeastern Conference linebacker and two-year defensive co-captain, will play the final game of his Commodore career in his hometown.

Marve, a product of White Station High School, ranks among Vanderbilt's Top Ten career tacklers, and has a chance to become just the eighth Commodore to reach the 400-tackle plateau.

In early December, Marve was named second team All-SEC by both the Associated Press and league's 12 head coaches. It marked the third consecutive season that Marve received all-conference recognition.

This season, Marve topped the Vandy defense with 45 solo stops and 84 total tackles. He also produced seven tackles for loss, an interception, forced fumble and quarterback sack.

In Vanderbilt's regular season finale at Wake Forest, Marve had five tackles, passing former linebacker Shelton Quarles (1990-93) into ninth place on the career

tackles list. Marve enters the AutoZone Liberty Bowl with 390 career tackles, just one shy of former linebacker Moses Osemwegie (2002-05) for eighth place.

Marve also has 28 tackles for loss for his career. He ranks eighth all-time on the team's tackles for loss chart, and will pass former standouts Jamie Duncan (1994-97) and James Manley (1992-95) with his next tackle for loss.

A captain for the past two years, Marve has achieved at least 80 tackles in each of his four seasons. He set a personal single-season career high as a sophomore, posting 121 total tackles. Marve also was a standout in his previous bowl appearance, contributing 10 tackles in Vanderbilt's 16-14 victory over Boston College in the 2008 Music City Bowl.

Just two weeks ago, Marve completed his undergraduate coursework, earning degrees in sociology and Human & Organizational Development. After his football career concludes. the 2011 Lott Impact Trophy semifinalist plans to attend law school.

The Commodores are 8-6 all-time in regular season games held in Memphis, and 2-4 in six appearances at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Records indicate that Vanderbilt have played games in four venues in Memphis: Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium opened in 1965, Crump Stadium opened in the mid-1930s, and two venues that do not remain: Red Elm Park and Billings Park.

# Rodgers Effective As Commodores' Starting Quarterback

**Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr, QB) has been effective since being inserted as the Commodore starting quarterback at midseason.

In six career starts, Rodgers has accounted for 12 TDs – eight passing and four rushing.

Since the starts, Rodgers has been one of the Southeastern Conference leaders in passing yards (208.7 ypg) and total offense (259.2 ypg).

Rodgers also has thrown for 1,498 yards, the most of any first-year Vanderbilt starting quarterback. He has also thrown at least one touchdown in every start, becoming the first

Commodore signal caller to do so in at least six straight starts since Jay Cutler in 2005.

In the bowl-clinching victory at Wake Forest, Rodgers was 7-of-15 for 139 yards and a TD. He also hurt the Demon Deacons by rushing for 90 yards on 16 carries.

Rodgers' 297 passing yards at Florida was the most by a Commodore since **Chris Nickson** threw for 446 yards vs. Kentucky on Nov. 11, 2006.

When reviewing stats for plays of at least 30 yards, Vanderbilt is tied with Arkansas for the SEC lead with 31 plays. Only one other team (Alabama, 29) is within eight of the Vanderbilt-Arkansas total.

The added big plays have resulted in a scoring average of 26.9 points, 10.0 points more than the team's 2010 scoring average.

The offense is producing more big plays via the rush and pass. The unit has 46 rushes of 12 yards or more, 12 more than a year ago. It also has produced 41 passes of 15 yards or more, five more than in 2010



# Teammates Vote Fischer, Hayward, Marve, Smith, Spear as Team Captains

**Kyle Fischer, Casey Hayward, Chris Marve, Larry Smith** and **Carey Spear** were voted by teammates to serve as captains for the 2011 season.

Fischer (R-Sr., OT) and Smith (R-Sr., QB) serve on the offensive side; Hayward (Sr., CB) and Marve (R-Sr., LB) on defense; and Spear (So., PK) on special teams. Fischer, Hayward, Smith and Spear are first-time cocaptains. Marve served in the role last year.

**FISCHER:** A 37-game starter on the offensive line, Fischer embraced a greater leadership role this year. As a senior, he has moved to right tackle after playing guard, and has developed into one of the SEC's top linemen, earning honorable mention All-SEC recognition.
