Five Starters Return in 2011-12

All five starters return with five other letterwinners (10 total). Only one player who saw somewhat significant minutes, Andre Walker, departed. Walker graduated with a degree in May and enrolled at Xavier as a graduate student where he will compete with the Musketeers this season. It marks the first time in the Stallings' era (since 1999-2000) that all five starters return from the previous season.

2010-11 Postseason Player Accolades

Junior John Jenkins was a first-team All-SEC selection, senior center Festus Ezeli and senior forward Jeffery Taylor were named to the second team. Taylor was also named to the league's All-Defensive team. Senior Brad Tinsley led the SEC in assists in his first season as a collegiate point guard in 2010-11 (4.6 per game).

Commodores Led SEC In Several Categories

Vanderbilt led the SEC in scoring in all games (75.9) and SEC games only (73.8 ppg). In all games, the Commodores finished statistically in the top three in scoring margin (3rd, +8.2), free throw percentage (2nd, .743), field goal percentage (3rd, .458), 3-point field goal percentage (2nd, .371), 3-point field goal percentage defense (2nd, .313), assists (3rd, 13.4), defensive rebounds (2nd, 26.0), and threes made (2nd, 7.7).

In SEC games only, Vanderbilt also led the league in three-point field goal percentage defense (30.5). VU finished in the top three in SEC games only in free throw percentage (2nd, .752), field goal percentage (3rd, .381), and threes made (3rd, 7.5).

Individual Notes

- Jenkins led the SEC in scoring in overall games and SEC games only.
- Jenkins became Vanderbilt's all-time leading sophomore scorer in points and scoring average with 624 points and 19.5 ppg average.
- Four of Vanderbilt's five starters (Brad Tinsley, John Jenkins, Lance Goulbourne, Festus Ezeli) claimed an SEC Player of the Week award last season.
- Festus Ezeli set a new single-season block record of 87 in 2010-11, and is five blocks shy (152) of setting the new career blocks record currently held by Will Perdue.
- Ezeli was named the most improved player in the nation last year by Yahoo Sports.

Four 1,000-point scorers?

Jeffery Taylor became the 41st player in Vanderbilt history to surpass the 1,000-point barrier in 2010-11. John Jenkins is 16 points away from 1,000 and Brad Tinsley is 71 points shy of the mark. If Festus Ezeli repeats his 2010-11 statistical campaign, he would also surpass the 1,000-point mark.

Stallings' Success

Coach Stallings has had six 20-win seasons in the last eight, with five NCAA tournament appearances and two Sweet 16's (2004 and 2007). He is entering his 13th season in Nashville. He is the second winningest coach in Vanderbilt history behind Roy Skinner with 236 wins. Skinner has 278 wins.

Getting to the Line

For the second consecutive season, Vanderbilt topped the league in free throws made and attempted in all games and in the 16 conference games. Vanderbilt attempted 837 free throws on the season, for an average of 24.6 attempts per game, and made 622 (18.3 per game). In league play, the Commodores attempted 383 free throws (23.9) and connected on 288 of those attempts (18.0).

Individually, Festus Ezeli was second in the league in free throw attempts with 216, with Jeffery Taylor finishing eighth in the conference with 167, and John Jenkins ninth with 161.

International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very wordly roster, with players from four different countries. Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang and James Siakam are from Cameroon.

3-Point Streak Continues Through 25th Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 796 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (770) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (649) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

Commodores Add Three Freshmen In 2011-12

The Commodores have added three freshmen to the roster in 2011-12. Freshman point guard Kedren Johnson (6'4, 215), forward Shelby Moats (6'8, 225), and guard Dai-Jon Parker (6'3, 190).

Vanderbilt And National Rankings

The Commodores ended the 2010-11 season ranked 29th in the nation in scoring offense (75.9), 35th in scoring margin (+8.2), 27th in 3FG% defense (31.3%), 37th in free throw percentage (74.3), and 38th in blocks per game (4.8). Individually, John Jenkins ranked ninth in three-point field goals per game (3.1), 25th in three-point field goal percentage (40.8), and 30th in scoring (19.5 ppg). Festus Ezeli finished

18th in blocks per game (2.6), and Brad Tinsley ended the year 27th in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.46).

Looking For Three Consecutive NCAA Tournaments

The Commodores have appeared in two consecutive NCAA Tournaments, and are seeking a third consecutive berth for the first time in the program's history.

Top 25 Recognition

Vanderbilt has been ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 for 18 of the last 34 weeks in 2009-10 (9 weeks) and 2010-11 (9 weeks). The 2007-08 team has the record for most weeks in the Top 25 with 16. The highest ranking for a Vanderbilt team occurred in the December 28, 1965 poll, when Clyde Lee and company made it to number two in the country. The Commodores have been ranked in the AP top five 26 times, with the last time coming on March 8, 1993, when Vanderbilt was ranked fifth.

Memorial Gym In Its 60th Season

The Commodores are entering their 60th season in the Southeastern Conference's oldest facility for basketball. Vanderbilt has an all-time record of 708-191 in its 59 years of existence. In 2010-11, the Commodores finished 14-3, averaged 80.3 points per game, and shot 49.1% from the floor. Vanderbilt also made 8.4 3's per game, shot 41.9% from beyond-the-arc, and outrebounded opponents by a margin of +4.7. VU also shot 77.4% from the FT line at Memorial Gym.

As Jeffery Taylor Goes...

So do the Commodores. In 2010-11, Vanderbilt was 17-3 in games in which Taylor scored 15 or more points, and 6-8 in games in which he failed to reach the 15-point barrier.

The 2011-12 Schedule

May be one of the most difficult the Commodores have ever faced and one that could see the Commodores take on as many as 13 teams that participated in postseason play a year ago.

The home schedule includes the season opener against Pac-12 member Oregon (November 11) and a matchup with perennial NCAA tournament stalwart and Atlantic 10 member Xavier on November 28. Vanderbilt will also host the ESPN Gameday franchise for the first time from Memorial Gym on February 11 against Kentucky.

All Five Starters Return

The Commodores' five starters from the end of the 2010-11 campaign all return - it marks the first time in the Stallings' era (since 1999) that all five starters have returned the following year.

Jenkins With Team USA At University Games

Junior John Jenkins made the squad of 12 players to represent USA Basketball at the University Games in China, and led the team in scoring over their six-game span at 13.5 points per game. Team USA finished fifth at the event, which took place August 13-23.

NASHVILLE - Brad Tinsley recorded the first triple-double in school history and Jeffery Taylor scored a career-high 27 points as Vanderbilt rolled to an 88-47 victory over Presbyterian in the season opener for both teams.

Tinsley finished with 11 points, plus career highs of 10 assists and 10 rebounds. His pass that set up Rod Odom's 3-pointer with 4:31 left sealed the feat and sent the Vanderbilt bench into a frenzy. Coach Kevin Stallings quickly called a timeout and Tinsley's teammates mauled him at halfcourt.

The game was well in hand by that point as the Commodores opened with six straight baskets and made 10 of their first 12 shots to take a 24-11 lead with 11:47 left in the first half.

Festus Ezeli had a career-high 14 points and John Jenkins added 10 for Vanderbilt. Al'Lonzo Coleman had 17 points and Josh Johnson scored 11 for Presbyterian.

The Tar Heels had made a last gasp effort for the win when they got the ball inside to Zeller, who got the basket and the foul. Vanderbilt forward Andre Walker fouled out on the play and Zeller made the free throw to make it 59-57.

It wasn't enough.

Vanderbilt fattened the lead from the free-throw line and Taylor slid down the baseline for a bank-layup and a 65-58 lead. Lance Goulbourne slammed home a 3-point miss for a seven-point lead with 1:20 left.

NASHVILLE - Festus Ezeli scored a career-high 24 points and added 10 rebounds as Vanderbilt beat cross-town rival Belmont 85-76.

Ezeli scored 17 points in the second half as the Commodores overcame a 35-32 halftime deficit. Vanderbilt scored the first six points of the second half and never trailed again. The Commodores shot 57 percent (12 of 21) over the final 20 minutes.

Jeffery Taylor added 16 points and eight rebounds for the Commodores (7-1). Lance Goulbourne had 15 points, and Brad Tinsley added 14 as Vanderbilt attempted 45 free throws -- the most in the Kevin Stallings era (2000-present). The Commodores made 35 of them.

Belmont was led by Mick Hedgepeth with 16 points. Kerron Johnson added 13, and Jordan Campbell had 12.

The scrappy Bruins (5-2) led by as much as seven in the first half before trailing for a three-point lead at the break.

NASHVILLE - Jeffery Taylor and Steve Tchiengang had 15 points each and Vanderbilt hit a season-high 13 3-pointers to breeze past Southeastern Louisiana 85-52.

Eight different Commodores made a 3-pointer. Vanderbilt (8-2) shot 50 percent (13 of 26) from long distance, but only a little better from the free-throw line (14 of 24).

It was a career high for Tchiengang, who at 6 feet 9 stepped out and hit two 3-pointers. Lance Goulbourne had 13 points, and John Jenkins added 12 on a team-high four 3-pointers.

The Lions (5-4) were led by Gary Dixon, who came off the bench to score 16. Antonio Benton added 10 as the Southeastern Louisiana bench outscored its starters 36-16.

The Commodores rolled up a 53-24 halftime lead behind a sizzling shooting performance. They converted 62.5 percent (20 of 32) from the floor. It was the most points they had scored in a first half since Nov. 24, 2007, against Bradley in the Cancun Challenge.

Vanderbilt hit eight 3-pointers in the opening 20 minutes. Jenkins knocked down three of them, and freshman Rod Odom had a pair.

Jenkins' trey with 47 seconds to go until halftime gave Vanderbilt its largest lead of the half at 53-19. The Commodores shot 53.3 percent (8 of 15) from long range in the opening stanza.

MURFREESBORO - Jeffery Taylor led four Vanderbilt players in double figures with 18 points as the Commodores beat rival Middle Tennessee 72-53.

John Jenkins added 16 points, Festus Ezeli had 15, and Brad Tinsley 10 for Vanderbilt.

The Commodores (9-2) played without forwards Lance Goulbourne and Andre Walker. Goulbourne, the team's second-leading rebounder at 6.7 per game, was not on the bench but was in attendance.

Walker, who started the first seven games, has missed the past four with mononucleosis. He's scheduled to make his return for Vanderbilt's next game, Dec. 29 at home against Marquette.

The Commodores built a 14-point lead at the half and the Blue Raiders (4-8) never got closer than eight in the second half. Vanderbilt shot 36 free throws, 26 in the second half, to just 14 for Middle Tennessee.

Jason Jones led Middle with 15 points. The Blue Raiders have lost four in a row.

The Blue Raiders had cut the lead to six at 30-24 with 1:53 to go when Jenkins took over. He scored nine of his 11 first-half points in a 60-second span beginning at 1:38 when he grabbed an offensive rebound along the left baseline and hit a stepback 3-pointer.

Jenkins followed with a steal near halfcourt, drove the right side, made the layup and converted the three-point play after getting fouled by Middle's Kyle Hunt. Forty-nine seconds later Jenkins' long 3-pointer up top made it 39-26.

After Harris' layup with 1:09 left and a timeout, John Jenkins stepped out of bounds with 44 seconds left. Melvin Goins missed two shots for the Vols, and Brad Tinsley fouled Brian Williams with 2.7 seconds left as he grabbed the rebound.

Instead of letting Tennessee take the ball in bounds, Rod Odom fouled Tobias Harris, sending him to the line for one-and-one. Harris hit both shots, and Williams stole the ball as Tinsley threw it in bound and the clock ran out.

It was the second time this season the Commodores watched a solid lead unravel. In an 83-75 overtime loss to South Carolina on Jan. 8, the Dores led by 11 points with 8:42 in the second half when the Gamecocks went on a 20-9 run to close out regulation.

Vanderbilt pushed the first-half margin to 17 points on a free throw by Tinsley with 2:03 before halftime, but Tennessee put together a modest 7-0 run to close the half and cut the halftime margin to 30-20 in favor of the Dores.

The Vols used 48.7 percent shooting after the break to slowly chip away at the Commodores' lead, and a 3-pointer by Cameron Tatum with 3:03 to go gave them their first lead of the second half. Harris finished with 15 points, Tatum had 12 and Skylar McBee had 10.

Jenkins led the Commodores (12-4, 1-2) with 21 points, Jeffery Taylor had 14 and Tinsley 12.

STARKVILLE - Jeffery Taylor scored 25 points and John Jenkins added 21 as No. 19 Vanderbilt rallied for an 81-74 victory over Mississippi State.

The Commodores (15-4, 3-2 Southeastern Conference) won at Humphrey Coliseum for the first time since 1993, breaking a streak of eight straight losses in Starkville. Vanderbilt trailed by as many as nine points, but used a 12-0 run late in the second half to recover for its third straight victory.

Festus Ezeli added 14 points for Vanderbilt while Lance Goulbourne had nine points and 12 rebounds.

Vanderbilt led 77-74 with 20 seconds remaining when Taylor stole the ball in the press and dunked for the clinching basket. The 6-foot-7 junior was 9 of 18 from the field and had five rebounds, three steals and two assists.

Jenkins made 9 of 9 free throws, including seven during Vanderbilt's crucial 12-0 run that turned a 66-59 deficit into a 71-66 lead.

Raven Johnson scored 19 points and Dee Bost added 18 for the Bulldogs (10-9, 2-3), who shot 26 of 58 (44.8 percent) from the field. Mississippi State struggled from 3-point range, making just 8 of 29 (27.6 percent).

Renardo Sidney, MSU's best post player, battled foul trouble for most of the game. The 6-10, 275-pound sophomore finished with six points and five rebounds in just 13 minutes.

Notes

- Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings got the first win of his career in Starkville. His overall record at the Humphrey Coliseum is now 1-5, and against the Bulldogs overall, he is now 7-8. Stallings has now won in every SEC venue.
- The win was Vanderbilt's first SEC road victory of the season, and its second of 2010-11. The Commodores are now 2-3 on the road (win vs. MTSU, losses at Missouri, South Carolina, Tennessee).
- Vanderbilt committed only nine turnovers against Mississippi State, which tied a season-low. The Commodores also committed nine against Davidson and Southeastern Louisiana.

NASHVILLE - Rotnei Clarke scored a season-high 36 points and Michael Sanchez had a career-best 20 as Arkansas upset No. 19 Vanderbilt 89-78, handing the Commodores' their first home loss this season.

Vanderbilt (15-5, 3-3 Southeastern Conference) had won its first 11 at Memorial Gym, and the Commodores had a sold-out crowd cheering them on.

Arkansas (14-6, 4-3) hadn't had much success here, winning on only three of its previous 10 trips. The Razorbacks also had lost to the first two ranked teams they played this season. That didn't matter Saturday as they shot a season-high 57.4 percent.

They also outrebounded (30-22) and outdefended Vanderbilt. The Commodores only bettered Arkansas at the free throw line (25 of 26), which wasn't nearly enough.

John Jenkins led Vanderbilt with 24 points. Festus Ezeli had 18 points, Jeff Taylor 13 and freshman Rod Odom had a season-high 12.

Sanchez missed all but four games last season with plantar fasciitis and sat out the first 11 games due to a stress fracture in his foot. That may be why the Commodores simply weren't ready for him. Sanchez wound up scoring more points than he had managed in the previous eight games combined (17), using his speed to dominate the Commodores in the paint.

The Razorbacks blew open a game that was tight in the opening minutes with five ties and seven lead changes, before Mardraus Wade's free throw put them up for good at 15-14 with 13:28 left. They built the margin to as many as 11, led 43-36 at halftime and pushed the lead to as much as 16 in the second half.

Notes

- Vanderbilt lost at home for the first time this season and the first time losing in Memorial since falling to South Carolina 77-73 on March 6, 2010.
- The Commodores allowed a season-high 89 points, the most points an opponent has scored against Vanderbilt since Georgia put up 94 in an overtime game in Memorial Gym on February 25, 2010.
- The 11-point margin of defeat is the largest since falling 72-58 at Georgia on February 6, 2010 and the largest at home since dropping to Florida 94-69 on January 25, 2009.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings challenged Jeffery Taylor to shut down South Carolina freshman Bruce Ellington.

The junior essentially did just that, allowing Ellington only two of his 13 points when it mattered, and Taylor also hit a career-high four 3-pointers in scoring 17 points as No. 24 Vanderbilt routed South Carolina 78-60 on Saturday to snap a two-game skid.

Ellington scored 22 points in helping South Carolina rally from a 14-point deficit to beat Vanderbilt on Jan. 8 to open Southeastern Conference play, and Stallings told Taylor two days ago that this would be his most important defensive game for the Commodores this season.

John Jenkins scored a game-high 18 points for Vanderbilt. Festus Ezeli added 17, and Brad Tinsley had 11 points and nine assists.

South Carolina (13-8, 4-4) has lost three of four, and this one ties the Gamecocks with Vanderbilt at the bottom of the Eastern Division.

Ramon Galloway led South Carolina with 16 points before fouling out. Malik Cooke scored 12 and Sam Muldrow had 11.

Vanderbilt outshot the Gamecocks all over the court but dominated from beyond the arc. The Commodores hit 11 of 20 from 3-point range, their most 3s against an SEC opponent this season and just two shy of the 13 they hit in beating Southeastern Louisiana in December.

Notes

- Vanderbilt wore their gold uniforms for the first time this season.
- The Commodores won the opening tip and are now 15-3 when doing so.
- VU went 2-2 from the free throw line in the first half, tying a season-low for free throws attempted in a half. The Commodores went 1-2 in games against Presbyterian and Western Kentucky.

NASHVILLE - Brad Tinsley sunk his off-balance jumper despite getting fouled and hit the free throw to help seal the victory for Vanderbilt (No. 24 ESPN/USA Today, No. 23 AP) in an 81-77 win over Alabama at Memorial Gym.

JaMychal Green thought he got fouled, too, seconds later only to see officials rule the Alabama forward stepped out of bounds trying to drive the baseline and tie up the game.

With Tinsley's three-point play with 17 seconds left, Vanderbilt beat Southeastern Conference-leading Alabama 81-77 on Thursday night. Alabama coach Anthony Grant said he'd have to check the replay, which he didn't have the benefit of seeing after the game.

Now Vanderbilt (17-6, 5-4) has won the first two games of a three-game homestand with No. 18 Kentucky visiting Saturday to remain knotted with three others for second in the SEC's Eastern Division. Tinsley's shot came off a screen, and he hit the shot even as Trevor Releford hit his arm.

Jenkins finished with a team-high 20 points for Vanderbilt. Jeff Taylor had 19 before fouling out with 90 seconds left, Tinsley had 15 and Ezeli had 11. Taylor said it was great to watch his teammates close out a tight game, but difficult to watch from the bench helpless.

Green finished with 23 points for Alabama, including shooting 10 of 11 at the line. Tony Mitchell scored 22 points, and Releford had 11 before fouling out late.

The Tide came in with the nation's third-stringiest defense and best in the SEC, holding opponents to 57.1 points per game. Vanderbilt is the SEC's best scoring offense, and the Commodores matched what Alabama had been allowing with less than 12 minutes left.

Notes
• With the win, Vanderbilt improved to 81-1 at home this year. The Commodores' 81-point performance Thursday marked their 10th time this year that they have scored at least 80 points at home (10-0).

• Vanderbilt improved to 13-1 on the year when Jeffery Taylor scores at least 15 points. Their only loss came at Missouri when Taylor had 18 points.

BATON ROUGE - Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor gave his sizable rooting gallery every reason to be heard.

With more than two dozen relatives traveling from Texas and Louisiana to see him play, Taylor scored 20 points and the 18th-ranked Commodores outscored LSU 49-26 in the second half for a comfortable 90-69 victory.

John Jenkins overcame a slow start to finish with 17 points for Vanderbilt (21-7, 9-5 Southeastern Conference), which bounced back from its first loss in six games last Tuesday against state rival Tennessee.

Vanderbilt, which shot 54.4 percent (31 of 57), trailed 43-41 at halftime but surged into the lead for good early in the second half with a 14-0 run during which Taylor dunked twice and hit two free throws.

Vandy then held the Tigers to 25 percent shooting (8 of 32) in the second half.

Storm Warren had a career-high 24 points and Ralston Turner added 18 for LSU (11-18, 3-11), which has lost 11 of 12 games.

Andre Stringer scored 10 points for the Tigers, who on Wednesday had snapped a 10-game losing streak with a victory at Mississippi State.

A strong first half put LSU in position to make it two straight wins, but the Tigers wound up looking overmatched by the Commodores, who had five players in double figures, including Lance Goldbourne and Brad Tinsley with 16 each and Festus Ezeli with 15.

- Vanderbilt posted its first 90-point true road game since a 91-85 road win at DePaul on December 12, 2007. First 90-point game in the SEC since February 28, 2007 (99-90 overtime win).
- The Commodores shot 54.4% from the floor for the game, their highest percentage from the floor in SEC play and their highest FG percentage since shooting since shooting 60.7% as a team in the season opener against Presbyterian (11/12).

LXINGTON - Kentucky hadn't lost a game at Rupp Arena in two years. There was no way the Wildcats were going to let Vanderbilt ruin senior center Josh Harrellson's going away party.

An exhausted Harrellson flustered Vanderbilt's Festus Ezeli into mishandling a lob pass in the final second, allowing the 20th-ranked Wildcats to beat the 21st-ranked Commodores 68-66.

The Wildcats showed plenty of grit in the final 1:36 with freshmen Brandon Knight and Terrence Jones combining to make 7 of 8 free throws as Kentucky won its 34th straight home game, the third-longest streak in school history.

Knight finished with 17 points and Jones added the second and nine rebounds for Kentucky, which avenged a loss at Vanderbilt on Feb. 12 by slowing down star John Jenkins.

Jenkins torched the Wildcats for 32 points in the first meeting but was held to 16 this time.

Ezeli led the Commodores (21-8, 9-6) with 22 points, 13 rebounds and three blocks but also turned it over three times.

Still, Vanderbilt was able to do something most of the previous 33 visitors failed to do when walking into Rupp, it made the Wildcats work for it.

Notes

- Vanderbilt shot 44.8% for the game, compared to 42.4% for Kentucky. The Commodores moved to 16-4 when they outshoot their opponents in 2010-11.
- The Commodores were 2-for-11 from three, the fewest threes Vanderbilt has made this season. Previous low was three made threes against Tennessee on February 22. The 18.2 percentage from three is the team's lowest of the year.
- VU outrebounded Kentucky, 36-34. The Commodores move to 13-2 when outrebounding their opponent.

DENVER - Richmond's Kevin Anderson scored 16 of his 25 points in the second half, including a game-sealing floater with 18.7 seconds remaining, to lift 12th-seeded Richmond to a 69-66 win over No. 5 seed Vanderbilt in the second round of the Southwest regional.

This is the Spiders' first tournament win since they beat South Carolina in 1998 as a No. 14 seed, but the reputation has been cemented.

Maybe that's why this win didn't seem like all that big of surprise for the Atlantic-10 champions, who were only a three-point underdog to the Commodores of the Southeastern Conference.

Justin Harper added 13 points and Francis-Cedric Martel contributed 12 as the Spiders won their eighth straight game.

Vanderbilt had a chance to tie with 2.5 seconds left, but Rod Odom's desperation heave was nowhere near the hoop as time expired.

So much for the Commodores (23-11) vanquishing their tournament demons. They have now stumbled in their last three appearances in the NCAA, also losing to No. 13 seed Murray State on a last-second shot last season and falling to Siena, another 13th seed, in 2008.

They thought this could be the squad to end the drought.

But they ran into a team with a penchant for up-sets. The Commodores also hurt themselves by never finding an answer for Anderson, who made 4 of 9 from 3-point range to take control of the second half.

Vanderbilt big man Festus Ezeli and John Jenkins, the SEC's leading scorer, each finished with 21 points.

Notes

- Vanderbilt entered the game allowing opponents to shoot just 30.6 percent from the outside. Richmond shot 54.5 percent (12-for-22).
- Vanderbilt finished 1-5 this season when its opponent makes more 3-point field goals. Richmond had 12 3-pointers' to Vanderbilt's six.
- This was Vanderbilt's third loss this season when outrebounding its opponent (36 to 27).
- Vanderbilt finished 0-4 when allowing 10 or more 3-pointers.
