Unprecedented Media Coverage

Beginning this season, ESPN and CBS embark on a 15-year, \$2.25 billion agreement which will televise all 96 conference games every season over the duration of the contract.

Almost half of the SEC's league games will be distributed nationally with ESPN or ESPN2 televising 27 contests, ESPNU showing eight and CBS Sports five.

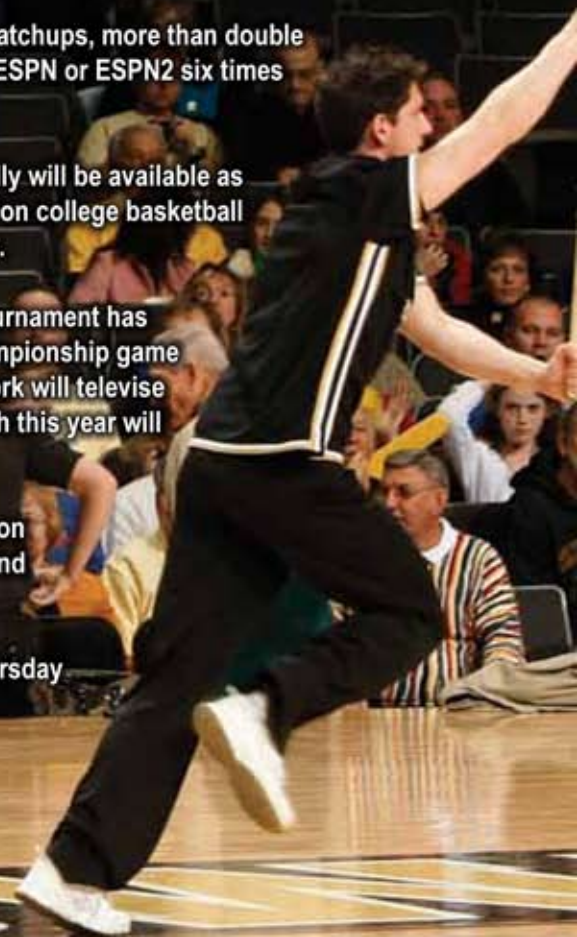
ESPN and ESPN2 will offer 27 conference matchups, more than double the 2008-09 total. Vanderbilt will appear on ESPN or ESPN2 six times this season.

The majority of games not televised nationally will be available as a part of ESPN Full Court, the pay subscription college basketball out-of-market service, and on ESPN360.com.

National coverage of the SEC Basketball Tournament has been expanded with the semifinals and championship game broadcast on ESPN on ABC. The SEC Network will televise the first two rounds of the tournament, which this year will be played March 11-14 in Nashville.

SEC games will be televised nationally now on Tuesday (ESPN Super Tuesday), Thursday and Saturday

ESPNU will also be televising games on Thursday night.





The Southeastern Conference has captured 10 NCAA Championships and five NIT titles.

Since 1990, the SEC has produced five NCAA Tournament champions. The SEC is one of only two conferences in the nation to have all of its teams ranked at least one week in the Associated Press Top 25 since 1996.

The SEC leads the nation with 11 of its 12 members reaching the Sweet 16 since 1996.

The SEC has placed at least one team in the Sweet 16 in 19 out of the last 20 years. Vanderbilt has participated in the Sweet 16 twice in the last six seasons.
