EIGHTH-YOUNGEST TEAM IN NATION GETS YEAR OF EXPERIENCE UNDER THEIR BELT

Despite playing with a team with no seniors in 2008-09, the Commodores finished with a 19-12 overall record and an 8-8 record in SEC play, the third consecutive season Vanderbilt has ended the season with a .500 record or better in league action. Sophomore A.J. Ogilvy made the All-SEC second team for the second straight year, and freshman Jeffery Taylor was named to the All-SEC Freshman team for their exploits on the floor.

2008-09 Postseason Accolades

Then-sophomore center A.J. Ogilvy was named to the All-SEC second team by the league's coaches and was an honorable mention selection by the league's media after averaging 15.4 points and 7.1 rebounds per game, both team highs. Freshman Jeffery Taylor was named to the All-Freshman team for his exploits by the league's coaches, and Elliott Cole, Joe Duffy, and Andre Walker were named to the Winter SEC Academic Honor Roll for their work in the classroom. It marks the 12th time in the Stallings era that Vanderbilt has had a player on the All-SEC team, and the fifth time VU has had someone on the All-Freshman team. Stallings has coached 29 members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll since his arrival on the Vanderbilt campus in 1999-00.

Quick 2008-09 Recap

The Commodores finished with a 19-12 overall record and an 8-8 record in SEC play, but missed the postseason for the first time since the 2002-03 season and only the second time in the Kevin Stallings era, which began prior to the 1999-00 season. However, the Commodores were the eighth-least experienced team in the nation in 2008-09 according to KenPom.com, and the team won eight out of its last 11 regular season games, including a win over SEC regular champion LSU in Baton Rouge on March 4.

SEC Success

Vanderbilt ended SEC play with an 8-8 record, the third consecutive season Vanderbilt finished with a .500 record or better, and the fifth time in six years it has happened.

A.J. Ogilvy led the team in scoring at 15.4 points per game and rebounding with 7.1 rebounds per contest. Point guard Jermaine Beal, who once again led the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio last year, added 12.5 points, freshman Jeffery Taylor chipped in 12.2 points a game, and Brad Tinsley tallied 11.0 points a game. Taylor was second on the team in rebounding with 6.2 rebounds per game.

Two Freshman Double Digit Scorers For First Time Since...

1977. Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor and Brad Tinsley both averaged double digits at 12.2 and 10.7 points per game, respectively, the first time since 1977 that VU has had a true freshman scoring tandem. Charles Davis (15.3) and Greg Fuller (10.8) accomplished the feat in 1977.

Ogilvy Eclipses 1,000-Point Barrier, Becomes First Vanderbilt Sophomore To Do So

With a 33-point effort against LSU on March 4, A.J. Ogilvy became the first sophomore in the history of Vanderbilt basketball to eclipse the 1,000-point barrier, and has 1,026 points heading into his junior season. Vanderbilt legend Clyde Lee scored 1,100 points in his first two seasons in a Commodore uniform as a sophomore and junior. Freshmen were not eligible in those years (1963-65). Billy McCaffrey, who played as a junior and senior (1992-94) also scored a 1,000 points in two seasons (1,359 points). Ogilvy has scored in double-figures in 57 out of 63 games in his two year career at Vanderbilt. He has 17 career 20+-point outings and has had eight double-doubles in his career.

Ogilvy Three Blocks Away From Milestone

A.J. Ogilvy has 97 blocks for his career and is only three blocks away from becoming the second Commodore to post 1,000 points and 100 blocks in a career. Vanderbilt great Will Perdue is the only other VU player to accomplish the feat, with 1,281 points and 157 blocks. Ogilvy will be only the fourth Vanderbilt player to eclipse the 100-block barrier in his career.

Ogilvy On Career Lists

Sophomore A.J. Ogilvy has already made the all-time records list in scoring and blocks after only two years of competition. Ogilvy currently has 1,026 points, which is good for 37th all-time, and his total of 97 blocks put him in fourth place overall for blocks in a career.

Speaking of Blocks...

The Commodores blocked 137 shots in 2008-09 as a team, which set a new single-season record. The previous mark was 131 during the 1994-1995 season.

Beal Leads SEC In Assist-to-Turnover Ratio For Second Consecutive Season

Jermaine Beal, who started in every game last season as a junior, led the league in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.02, percentage points in front of Tennessee's Bobby Maze and Garrett Temple of LSU. As a sophomore in 2007-08, Beal led the SEC and was sixth in the nation in the category at an astonishing 3.06 to 1.

40-Minute Man

Beal played the entire 40 minutes against Alabama on February 5, the first time a player has done that in a regulation game since March 17, 1998. Vanderbilt senior guard and Nashville native Drew Maddux played all 40 minutes of regulation en route to scoring 17 points and leading Vanderbilt to a 72-68 win over Wake Forest in the second round of the 1998 NIT.

Underclassmen Produce In 2008-09

Vanderbilt's redshirt freshmen and freshmen accounted for 1,085 points last year, a percentage of 49.7%, and underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) tallied 1,619 points, or 74.1% of the points scored in 2008-09.

Tinsley Ties Freshman Record

Freshman Brad Tinsley made 69 three-pointers in his initial collegiate campaign, a total that tied Shan Foster for the most three's made by a Commodore freshman in a single season. Foster made 69 threes in his freshman season, which came in 2004-05.

International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very worldly roster, with players from five different countries. A.J. Ogilvy is from Australia, Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang is from Cameroon. Of the 341 NCAA Division I teams, only eight have players from five countries, and only Vanderbilt and Northwestern hail from BCS leagues.

Starting Lineups

The Commodores used nine different starting lineups in 2008-09. Junior Jermaine Beal and freshman Jeffery Taylor have been the two constants for Vanderbilt all season. The team's results with the different lineups:

3-Point Streak Continues Through 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 729 consecutive games after the 2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (738) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (623) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

Walker Returns From Torn ACL

Andre Walker, a 6'7 guard/forward who tore his ACL against Middle Tennessee State on November 24, 2008, returns from the injury after extensive rehab. Walker, who redshirted the season last year because of the injury and will be a sophomore this year, will be back to fortify the Commodores' wing and power forward position. The Flossmoor, Ill., native was named to the Spring SEC Academic Honor Roll last season and was one of the team's top defenders before his season-ending injury.

Commodores Add John Jenkins To The Fold

Vanderbilt had one signee in 2008-09, John Jenkins from nearby Station Camp High School in Gallatin, Tenn. Jenkins, a 6'4 shooting guard, led all high scorers last season at 42.3 points per game and scored more than 30 points in every one of his games last year as a high school senior. He converted 62% of his shots from the

floor and 47% from three and also made 88% of his free throws in his senior year.

Drake Moves On

George Drake, who graduated with a degree in Sociology in May of 2009, will pursue a master's degree at UAB in the 2009-10 campaign. Drake was granted a waiver from the NCAA to play immediately for the Blazers and will compete this season.

Vanderbilt And National Rankings

The Commodores ended the season ranked 32nd in the nation in field goal percentage defense at 39.9% and ranked 42nd in the country in rebound margin at +4.7.

Vanderbilt and SEC Rankings

Vanderbilt had four players ranked in the SEC individual rankings at the end of the season.

Freshman Jeffery Taylor's 16 points led five players in double figures, three of which were freshmen, as Vanderbilt defeated Morehead State.

"I liked our team's effort," Kevin Stallings, VU head coach, said. "I thought we played really hard. To turn them over 21 times and hold them to 34 percent shooting, I'm pleased with that.

"I thought we didn't take care of the ball in the first half. Our team's mentality is to come out and try to win the game in the first five minutes, but it's a 40 minute game. We need to slow down mentally."

Taylor scored 10 in the second half as the Commodores outscored the Eagles 43-24.

Vanderbilt (1-0), which has seven freshmen on its roster, also got 12 points from sophomore A.J. Ogilvy and 10 from junior Jermaine Beal.

Morehead State (0-2), which led for most of the game's first 11 minutes, got 10 points each from Robert Murry and Terrance Hill.

"They had a lot of size," A.J. Ogilvy remarked. "They tried to play physical with us and they got into foul trouble. We adjusted early on and then played pretty well."

The Commodores were without freshman forward Steve Tchiengang, who was declared ineligible for the first five games of the season by the NCAA under a policy that involves certain first-year international students. Tchiengang is a native of Cameroon.

Vanderbilt (3-1) made its first six field-goal attempts and never trailed. The Commodores led by as many as 25 points in the first half and took a 48-29 halftime lead.

"We built a nice lead in the first half and kept our turnovers down," Kevin Stallings, VU head coach, said, "but this wasn't the performance that I was hoping for."

Central Arkansas (2-2) opened the second half with an 18-6 run, including five straight points by Mike Pouncy, but could draw no closer than 12 points with 12:31 remaining.

The Vanderbilt Commodores claimed an impressive, 72-57, win over the Drake Bulldogs at the Moon Palace Resort in Cancun, Mexico.

Freshman guard Brad Tinsley led an array of Vanderbilt scorers in double figures with a career-high 19 points on 7-of-14 shooting, 5-of-8 from three-point range. Another freshman, Jeffery Taylor, added 15 points, while junior Jermaine Beal chipped in 14 points, and sophomore center A.J. Ogilvy notched 13 points, all in the second half.

"Brad's a very good offensive player, and we knew with their zone, he had a chance to have a good night because he can really shoot it," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "It was a good performance out of our guys tonight. I thought we played real hard, intelligently, and we took care of the ball when they tried to press us in the second half. Vanderbilt sophomore A.J. Ogilvy scored 25 points to lead four Commodore players in double figures in route to a 71-66 win over VCU in the finals of the Cancun Challenge at the Moon Palace Resort in Cancun, Mexico. Ogilvy was named the tournament's MVP, and junior guard Jermaine Beal was named to the Cancun Challenge All-Tournament team.

Sunday's win marked the second consecutive Thanksgiving tournament title for the Commodores. Vanderbilt captured the South Padre Island Invitational in 2007 with wins over Utah State and Bradley.

The Commodores led for most of the contest, but VCU made the game interesting in the second half behind their frenzied defense and clutch shooting Ram guard Eric Maynor, who ended the game with 31 points, 23 of those in the second half. Vanderbilt, who saw its lead balloon to as many as 18 early in the second half, struggled with the quickness of the VCU guards in the period, and had its lead cut to one, 48-47, with 11:11 to play in the game. VU responded and pushed its lead back up to seven, but once again VCU came back, this time cutting the deficit to two points with 1:19 to play in regulation.

Free throw shooting, a strong point for the Commodores in the tournament, came through again in the waning moments, as Beal knocked down two shots and sophomore forward Darshawn McClellan made one-of-two with 30 seconds remaining to give VU the winning margin of 71-66. On the night, Vanderbilt was 26-for-30 from the charity stripe (86.7%).

"Mayo can shoot the ball," said UIC coach Jimmy Collins. "Everybody talks about the guys who are shooting from the main conferences and they just overlook Josh Mayo. Everybody saw in this building that he's a tremendous player as well as a tremendous shooter."

Mayo's big night from beyond the arc was the most 3-pointers ever by a visiting player at Memorial Gymnasium, and one short of the Flames' (4-2) single-game record. The Horizon League's preseason player of the year made two 3-pointers in an 11-0 first-half run that broke an 18-18 tie and put the Flames ahead to stay. Mayo was 5-for-5 on 3-point shots in the second half.

"We were severely outplayed, outfought, and out-hustled tonight," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "It was a very disappointing and embarrassing performance."

"We didn't have the defensive effort required to keep their score to a minimum. We just didn't play well enough to win. That's what it comes down to."

Robo Kreps added 23 points, including three 3-pointers, as the Flames won their third straight game.

Overall, the Flames made 12 of 19 (63.2 percent) 3-point attempts. Vanderbilt (5-2) was 4-for-24 (16.7 percent) from beyond the arc.

"I thought, all in all, our guys fought hard. I was proud of the fight we had in us and I thought we played as hard as I could have hoped for."

Ramon Harris added 12 points and seven rebounds while making all five of his shots and the Wildcats (12-4, 1-0) held the Commodores (11-4, 0-1) to just 31.6 percent shooting (18 of 57) in snapping Vanderbilt's six-game winning streak.

Jermaine Beal led Vanderbilt with 18 points and Jeffery Taylor had 15 points and 11 rebounds, but the Commodores struggled without leading scorer A.J. Ogilvy. The sophomore dressed but watched the entire game from the bench after aggravating a heel injury on Friday.

"We knew he wasn't going to be able to go this morning," remarked Stallings. "He hurt his foot yesterday in the first 15 minutes of practice. We hoped it would get better in time for the game, but obviously it didn't."

The Wildcats took control during a 21-4 run early in the second half. The Commodores got as close as six in the final minute, but Kentucky made its free throws to avoid a late-game collapse.

A.J. Ogilvy scored a career-high 28 points and Vanderbilt had its best scoring night this season in routing South Carolina 96-83, keeping the Commodores very faint NCAA tournament dreams alive.

The Gamecocks (20-7, 9-5) came in sitting alone atop the SEC East, having won four of their last five. They scored the opening basket, and that was their only lead of the night as they trailed by as much as 25.

"In the first half, I thought we did a good job defensively," Kevin Stallings, VU head coach, said. "In the second half, we were content to score with them."

Vanderbilt (17-11, 6-8) snapped a two-game skid, coming off its worst shooting performance of the season in a loss at Georgia. The Commodores made up for that by hitting 11 of their first 13 against South Carolina.

A.J. Ogilvy is as healthy and confident as he's been all season, and that could spell trouble for the rest of the Southeastern Conference as the postseason nears.

Ogilvy set a career high in scoring for a second straight game, racking up 33 points and grabbing 10 rebounds to help Vanderbilt upset No. 12 LSU 75-67 in the Tigers' home finale.

Ogilvy, a 6-foot-11 sophomore, scored on an array of short jump hooks, putbacks and even driving layups that frustrated an LSU defense anchored by 6-11 center Chris Johnson, one of the best shot-blockers in college basketball. Johnson had four blocks to bring his season total to 84, but Ogilvy never backed down.

When Ogilvy saw multiple defenders, Jermaine Beal gave the Commodores the balance they needed, hitting three 3-pointers and finishing with 17 points. Brad Tinsley had two 3s late in the game, the last giving Vanderbilt (18-11, 7-8 SEC) a 71-66 lead with 38 seconds to go.

Marcus Thornton scored 18 points for the Tigers (25-5, 13-2), the SEC regular season champs who lost for only the second time at home this season in 20 games at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center. Tasmin Mitchell added 16 points for the Tigers and Bo Spencer had 14.

Vanderbilt shot 51 percent against an LSU squad that prides itself on defense and led 50-39 after Beal's 3-pointer with under 13 minutes to go.

While Vanderbilt broke the 50 percent mark shooting (27-of-52) for the game, LSU shot 36.5 percent (21-of-58) on what was supposed to be a celebration of the Tigers' senior class.
