Official game finals and statistics, and quotes from Coach Franklin, Commodore players and opponents are among the post-game materials.

PRESEASON CAMP COVERAGE

The first three weeks of preseason camp will be open to media outlets.

SECURING GAME CREDENTIALS

Vanderbilt does not offer online credentialing for home games.

Make credential requests by emailing Larry Leathers (larry.leathers@vanderbilt.edu). All applications will be notified of their status at least 10 days before the gameday. *Credentials will not be granted without signed approval of SEC credential policy.*

When possible, credentials will be mailed 10 days in advance. However, credentials can also be picked up on Fridays before games at the Athletic Communications Office. On gamedays, Media Will Call is located at Gate 1 (stadium entrance nearest the Marriott).

GAMEDAY MEDIA PARKING

Media parking will be located in Kensington Garage next to Memorial Gym. Please access the garage entrance off 25th Avenue. All media representatives must have a proper credential to access parking garage.

PRESS BOX ACCESS

Media must wear "PRESS" or "PHOTO" credentials to gain access to the stadium press box, which is located on the third floor. The field elevator is located near Gate 1. Seating charts are posted in various press box sites.

IN-GAME FIELD ACCESS

Field access is restricted to working photojournalists from kickoff until 5:00 remain in the game. To gain field access, photographers must pick up a "PHOTO" armband at Media Will Call (located at Gate 1 at stadium entrance nearest the Marriott).

WIRELESS IN PRESS BOX

The press box is equipped with wireless internet access for the working press. Working photographers should transmit in the press box transmit. Television production crews should order phone lines in advance. To order, call (615) 343-2012.

COACH FRANKLIN'S POSTGAME PRESS CONFERENCE

Coach Franklin's post-game press conference is held after he addresses the team. Only properly credentialled media will be allowed into the conference.

Media wishing to participate in postgame interviews should meet at the elevator with 5:00 left to be escorted to the south end zone area of Dudley Field.

There is a new location in Vanderbilt Stadium this season for Franklin's postgame press conference and player interviews. The Vanderbilt Press Conference Room is located in the north end zone, with access in the field tunnel.

PLAYER POSTGAME AVAILABILITY

The Vanderbilt Locker Room is closed. Up to five players will be made available for post-game interviews. These interviews will be conducted in the same room as Coach Franklin's remarks. The players will enter when Franklin concludes.

During home games, the visiting team interview room is located in the south endzone of the stadium. The entrance is located in the stadium tunnel.

VANDERBILT'S NEW RADIO FLAGSHIP

Vanderbilt football and men's basketball games will be carried on one of the nation's strongest radio signals following a flagship agreement announced in August between Vanderbilt Athletics and Nashville's NewsRadio WLAC AM-1510.

Starting with the Vanderbilt opener against South Carolina on August 30, all Commodore football and men's basketball games will air on WLAC 1510, a station that boasts one of the radio's most powerful evening signals. WLAC 1510 can be heard across middle America, from Canada to the Gulf of Mexico.

The flagship agreement was finalized in August by Vanderbilt Athletics, its multimedia rights holder IMG College and Clear Channel Media & Entertainment (CCM+E), one of America's largest media companies.

NewsRadio WLAC 1510 will air all radio programming related to Vanderbilt football and men's basketball, including game broadcasts and weekly coach's call-in shows.

Joe Fisher, John Gromos and Kevin Ingram provide concise and insightful coverage on the Vanderbilt Radio Network.

A Nashville native, Fisher enters his 15th season as the team's play-by-play announcer. He handles similar duties for Vanderbilt men's basketball and baseball. Fisher also serves as Vanderbilt Athletics' Director of Broadcasting.

Prior to joining Vanderbilt, Fisher was a television sports anchor in the Nashville market from 1987-96, with stints at WSMV-4 and WKRN-2. He also worked two years in public relations.

Gromos enters his 17th season as color analyst. A former Commodore QB, Gromos ranks seventh on the team's career passing yardage charts.

Gromos serves as Manager of Business Development for Turner Universal. He earned a degree in engineering from Vanderbilt in 1990.

Ingram enters his 11th season providing sideline commentary. A respected member of the Nashville radio market, Ingram co-hosts a popular morning show on 104.5 The Zone.

Bob Horner has served as producer and engineer for more than two decades.

NEW STADIUM IMPROVEMENTS

Several substantial improvements are in progress at Vanderbilt Stadium, the Commodores' on-campus venue for the last three decades.

Crews are nearing completion of the latest upgrades to the 40,550-capacity stadium opened in 1981, including construction of a fan-friendly hillside in the north end zone, installation of an expanded video board in the north end zone, new stadium lighting system, and a synthetic surface on Dudley Field.

The work adds to other major recent improvements. A thorough exterior renovation was completed in 2008-09, including new plazas and entrances at Gates 2 & 3, expansion of the concourse and an exterior paint and brick effort to unify Vanderbilt Stadium and the program's two other biggest sporting venues, Hawkins Field and Memorial Gym.

The stadium was opened in 1981 on the same site as Dudley Field, which stood at the corner of Jess Neely Drive and Natchez Trace since 1922. Though the old stadium was demolished prior to the 1981 project, the Commodores continue to play on the original Dudley Field plot.

ARRIVING FROM SOUTH OF NASHVILLE

Take I-65 North to I-40 West to Exit 209A (Broadway-West End). Turn left to go west on Broadway. When Broadway splits, stay to the right to enter West End Ave. Take West End past the University on the left and turn left on 25th Avenue. The entrance into Kensington Garage is located just one block on right, just before Memorial Gym.

ARRIVING FROM NORTH OF NASHVILLE

Take I-65 South into downtown and take Exit 209B (Broadway-West End). Turn right on Broadway. When Broadway splits, stay to the right to enter West End Avenue. Take West End past the University on the left, turn left on 25th Avenue. Access into Kensington Garage is a block on right just before Memorial Gym.

ARRIVING FROM EAST OF NASHVILLE

Take I-40 West/I-65 North downtown to Exit 209A (Broadway-West End). Turn left at light to go west on Broadway. When Broadway splits, stay to the right to enter West End Ave. Take West End past the University on the left and turn left on 25th Avenue. The garage access is one block on right, just before Memorial Gym.

ARRIVING FROM WEST OF NASHVILLE

Take I-40 East to I-440 East. Take the first exit (Murphy Road-West End) and turn left at redlight. In .25 mile, turn left onto West End. The campus will be on your right. Turn right on 25th Avenue (one block past Wendy's). Kensington Garage access is one block on right, just before Memorial Gym.

ARRIVING FROM CHATTANOOGA/ATLANTA

Take I-24 West to I-440 West. Take Exit 1 (West End Avenue). Stay right off the exit onto West End. The Vanderbilt campus will be on your right. Turn right on 25th Avenue (one block past Wendy's). Kensington Garage access is one block on right, just before Memorial Gym.
