

A PROGRAM FIRST: BACK-TO-BACK BOWL APPEARANCES...

Vanderbilt will make its sixth postseason appearance in its 121-year history when the Commodores play North Carolina State in the 15th Annual Franklin American Music City Bowl on Dec. 31, 2011 in Nashville.

...DURING A YEAR OF HISTORIC ACHIEVEMENT BY VANDERBILT

MOST VICTORIES IN SEASON IN THREE DECADES

Vanderbilt's eight regular season wins are the most since the Commodores went 8-3 in 1982 en route to the Hall of Fame Bowl in Birmingham.

SIX-GAME WIN STREAK TO END REGULAR SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a six-game win streak, the team's longest since a six-game stretch in the 1982 season. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in Southeastern Conference play this year. The 1935 Commodores were the only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season.

SOARING ENTHUSIASM AMONG FAN BASE

Enthusiasm among the Commodore fan base continues to soar due to Franklin's improvement of the program. Attendance increased nearly 15 percent this season in renovated Vanderbilt Stadium.

FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games.

DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points. in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl held in Memphis.

The Commodores are 2-2-1 all-time in postseason bowls. The Vanderbilt victories have come in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl (16-14 over Boston College) and 1955 Gator Bowl (25-13 over Auburn). Vanderbilt also tied Texas Tech 6-6 in the 1974 Peach Bowl. The losses were close high-scoring affairs, 31-24 to Cincinnati in the 2011 Liberty Bowl and 36-28 to Air Force in the 1982 Hall of Fame Bowl.

This also will mark the first time that Vanderbilt has ever returned to a bowl location.

James Franklin has enjoyed instant success as Vanderbilt's head coach, guiding the Commodores to consecutive bowl appearances in his first two years on campus.



FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904

Head Coach **James Franklin** is off to one of the most successful two-year coaching starts in team history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before World War I has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklind.

The Commodores are 14-11 under Franklin's direction.

With 14 wins under his belt, Franklin has more total victories than all but one of Vanderbilt's 16 second-year head coaches. The only former coach with more wins this early in his Commodore tenure was eventual Hall of Famer Dan McGugin.

Vanderbilt outscored its 12 regular season foes by a 352-219 margin. It marks just the 12th year since 1948 that the Commodores have accomplished the feat.

The 133-point differential is the second largest in modern Commodore gridiron history. Since World War II, the only point differential larger than this season came during the 1955 campaign when Vanderbilt outscored its opponents by 154 points for the season (240-86).

Six Commodore Standouts Earn All-SEC Honors

Six Vanderbilt student-athletes, paced by record-setting wide receiver **Jordan Matthews**, earned postseason All-Southeastern Conference honors from either Associated Press sportswriters or the conference's 14 head coaches.

Matthews, a junior from Madison, Ala., was a unanimous First Team All-SEC selection after establishing a new team record with 1,262 receiving yards.

Joining Matthews on the AP All-SEC team were three second team picks: senior running back Zac Stacy, junior cornerback Andre Hal and junior placekicker Carey Spear. The coaches selected senior punter Richard Kent to their second team. Junior offensive lineman Wesley Johnson earned AP honorable mention.

It marks the first time since 2007 that four Vanderbilt student-athletes were named to the AP All-SEC team. Matthews also is the first Commodore to earn first team honors since cornerback D.J. Moore in 2008.

Matthews has 87 catches on the season, the second highest reception total ever by a Commodores. In addition to his 1,262 receiving yards, Matthews has eight touchdown catches. He also ranks second in the SEC in both receptions and receiving yards.

Stacy is the only current Commodore to earn back-to-back All-SEC recognition. The team's all-time leading rusher with 3,036 yards and 29 touchdowns, Stacy became the first Commodore to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons when he surpassed the 1,000-yard mark in Vanderbilt's regular season finale. He finished with 1,034 rushing yards and nine touchdowns. Stacy is just the eighth SEC running back to produce back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons in the last decade and the 30th back in conference history to surpass 3,000 career rushing yards.

Hal, a product of Port Allen, La., shared the SEC lead with 13 passes defended. The junior defensive back finished with career highs of 35 solo tackles, 47 total tackles and one fumble recovery. Hal's two interceptions also played a huge role in Vanderbilt's 41-18 win over Tennessee.

Spear, from Mayfield Village, Ohio, put together the best season ever by a Vanderbilt placekicker, setting team records with 19 field goals and 81 points scored by a kicker. Spear topped all SEC kickers (with at least 14 field goal attempts) with a 86.4 percent success rate. On the season, he was 19-of-22, including 14-of-14 inside 43 yards.

Kent, from Marietta, Ga., also enjoyed a career year, averaging 44.8 yards on 54 punts. Nineteen of Kent's punts were downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line. He had 16 punts of 50-plus yards, including four beyond 60 yards.

Johnson, a redshirt junior from Nashville, started at both tackle positions this season, and has started all 37 games of his Commodore career.

The Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl matchup will mark just the second meeting ever between Vanderbilt and North Carolina State.

In the only previous meeting, the Commodores under eventual College Football Hall of Fame recipient Red Sanders registered a 7-0 victory in Nashville over a No. 20-ranked Wolfpack squad in 1946 as the nation was coming out of World War II. Remarkably, the victory was Vanderbilt's fifth of the season – all coming as shutouts.

Vanderbilt is 68-61-5 all-time against teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Vanderbilt concluded the regular season with a 55-21 victory vs. Wake Forest of the ACC.

2012 'DORES: IMPROVED OVER 2011

Statistics show that James Franklin's 8-4 2012 Commodores are improved over his initial team that appeared in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl.

Vanderbilt's two-game improvement this season in overall record is the most obvious stat supporting that fact. Quite simply, the 2012

Commodores are producing more points, total yards and first downs on offense – and allowing fewer points and first downs on defense.

This year, Vanderbilt is averaging 29.3 points, 2.4 more than a year ago. They are also averaging 49.8 more yards of offense: 47 passing and 2.8 rushing. The improved production has the 2012 Commodores posting 1.7 more first downs.

regular season of the 2011-12 seasons.

The 2012 offense also is averaging 5.8 yards per play, a 0.5-yard improvement over last year.

On defense, the 2012 Commodores also are faring better than a 2011 unit that ranked among the most improved defenses in the nation.

The 2012 defense has registered two shutouts for the first time in nearly 50 years. The unit is allowing 18.2 points a game, 2.5 points less than last year.

The 2012 squad also has more sacks – and is allowing less sacks by opposing defenses. The current team is also getting flagged for 4.3 fewer yards in penalties.

The only stat where the 2012 Commodores are not getting the results of a year ago is in turnovers. This year, Vanderbilt has been one of the nation's best in limiting turnovers, committing just 18 after having 27 turnovers in the 2011 regular season. The improved ball security has not translated to improved turnover margin because Vanderbilt has forced just 13 turnovers this season.

ALL FOUR VANDERBILT LOSSES COME TO TEAMS RANKED IN THE BCS TOP 25

All four teams that have topped Vanderbilt this season are ranked in the latest Bowl Championship Series (BCS) Poll, including three listed among the Top Ten teams in the nation.

Florida, Georgia and South Carolina from the SEC East Division are ranked No. 3, No. 7 and No. 10, respectively, in the BCS poll released Dec. 2. The fourth opponent, Northwestern, is No. 20 in the latest ballot.

The combined record of the four teams that have defeated Vanderbilt this year is 41-8.

CAREY SPEAR Specialist of the Week , Nov. 24 (Wake Forest)

Carey Spear (Jr., PK) was recognized as SEC Specialist of the Week for his strong kicking performance in the Commodores' 55-21 win at Wake Forest.

Spear became the first Vanderbilt kicker since 1996 to make two field goals of at least 50 yards in a game against the Demon Deacons. Spear converted from 50 and a career-long 52 yards.

The performance allowed Spear to post 81 total points, breaking the team record for points scored by a placekicker in a single season.

Spear made his last 10 field goal attempts, including four beyond 43 yards. He also had two field goals in his last four games.

ANDRE HAL Def. Player of the Week , Nov. 17 (Tennessee)

Andre Hal (Jr., CB) earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors after his impressive individual performance in Vanderbilt's 41-18 home rout of Tennessee.

Hal posted two interceptions against the Volunteers, returning each inside the Tennessee 20-yard line. The Commodore offense quickly scored touchdowns after each interception to break the game open.

WALKER MAY Def. Lineman of the Week , Nov. 10 (Ole Miss)

Walker May (R-Jr., DE) was recognized as the SEC's Defensive Lineman of the Week for his strong defensive effort in Vanderbilt's 27-26 comeback win at Ole Miss.

May, a native of Birmingham, Ala., set career highs with six solo tackles and three tackles for loss in the win that gave Vanderbilt bowl eligibility for the second consecutive season. The defensive co-captain's performance also included a key 14-yard guarterback sack.

WESLEY JOHNSON Off. Lineman of the Week , Nov. 3 (Kentucky)

Wesley Johnson (R-Jr., OT) was recognized as SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his superb blocking effort in Vanderbilt's 40-0 shutout win at Kentucky.

The Nashville native blocked at an 87 percent grade, frequently springing Commodore backs for big gains. Johnson and his offensive line mates paved the way for 227 yards rushing and 220 yards through the air as Vanderbilt produced a season-high 29 first downs.

CAREY SPEAR Specialist of the Week , Nov. 3 (Kentucky)

Carey Spear (Jr., PK) was recognized as SEC Specialist of the Week for his strong kicking effort in the Commodores' shutout victory at Kentucky. Spear made two field goals in the victory, including a 48-yarder.

JOE TOWNSEND Off. Lineman of the Week, Oct. 20 (Auburn)

Joe Townsend (So., center) was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week after Vanderbilt's 17-13 win over Auburn.

The native of Hendersonville, Tenn., recorded 10 knockdown blocks in his second career start, helping pave the way for the Commodores to record 209 rushing yards. Of his 10 knockdown blocks, four helped spring Commodore rushers for a touchdown or a first down.

RICHARD KENT Co-Specialist of the Week, Oct. 6 (Missouri)

Richard Kent (R-Sr., punter) shared SEC Specialist of the Week honors after his punting performance in the team's 19-15 road win at Missouri.

Kent, from Marietta, Ga., punted six times, pinning Mizzou inside the 20 on two occasions. In addition, the Tigers were limited to three return yards after entering with one of the nation's best return games.

During the Wake Forest game, Stacy became just the eighth SEC back this decade to produce back-toback 1,000-yard rushing seasons. He also became the 30th SEC back to reach 3,000 career rushing yards.

Stacy has nine games of 100-plus rushing yards in his career, trailing only Jermaine Johnson, who had 11 games of 100-plus rushing yards from 1993-95. The Commodores have enjoyed plenty of success when Stacy reaches the 100-yard rushing mark, going 8-1 overall.

Stacy's three highest single-game rushing totals are 198 yards vs. Army on Oct. 22, 2011, 184 yards at Wake Forest on Nov. 26, 2011, and 180 yards at Wake Forest on Nov. 24, 2012.

performing units in the nation this season.

Coordinated by **Bob Shoop**, the unit ranks among the NCAA Top 20 in numerous key categories. They currently rank 15th in scoring defense (18.3 ppg.), 17th in total offense (326.4 ypg.) and 10th in pass defense (175.8 ypg.).

The unit also ranks even higher in other stats. The Commodores are fifth in the nation with a 99.8 defensive pass efficiency rating and 93 tackles for loss.

Shoop's squad also performs

extremely well in third down situations. The team ranks No. 12 in the NCAA in third down efficiency (31 percent) and 15th in first downs allowed (17.7 pg.). On the season, opponents have been limited to a quick 3-and-out possession on 33% of their drives.

Vanderbilt was last ranked on Oct. 18, 2008. The last time Vanderbilt was ranked in the final AP poll was 1948 (No. 12).



MATTHEWS HOLDS RECEIVING MARK; **CHASING MORE TEAM RECORDS**

Jordan Matthews (Jr., WR) has established himself as one of the finest to ever play wide receiver at Vanderbilt. He's also well on his way to putting together one of the most productive seasons ever by a SEC receiver.

Matthews' 2012 totals of 87 catches and 1,262 receiving yards rank among the Top Ten season efforts in league history.

Only seven other SEC receivers have caught more than 87 passes in a season.

And just eight others have amassed more than 1,262 receiving yards. Matthews had another stellar performance in the regular season finale,

catching 10 passes for 144 yards and a TD in the victory at Wake Forest. In the effort, Matthews broke Boo Mitchell's 24-year-old team record

for receiving yards. Entering the Music City Bowl, Matthews is 10 receptions shy of the team and SEC record of 97 catches set by Keith Edwards in 1983.

Matthews is getting more recognition for his receiving achievements. Phil Steele's and CBSSportsline.com named the junior to their Third Team All-America Team. He also became a unanimous First Team All-SEC pick

by the coaches and Associated Press in early December.

Matthews ranks second in the SEC in receptions and receiving yards. He also leads all SEC receivers with a 109.6-yard average in SEC play.

The junior now ranks fifth on the Vanderbilt career receiving yardage list with 2,226 yards and tied for sixth with 143 career catches.

The 144-yard effort at Wake Forest was Matthews' seventh game this season of at least 100 receiving yards.

VANDERBILT'S MATTHEWS & BOYD COMBO: SEC'S MOST PRODUCTIVE RECEIVING DUO

Wide receivers **Jordan Matthews** (Jr.) and **Chris Boyd** (R-So.) concluded the regular season as the SEC's most productive receiving duo.

Combined, Matthews and Boyd are averaging 168.2 receiving yards per game, 13.1 yards more than the Tennessee duo of Justin Hunter and

Cordarrelle Patterson (155.1 ypg). Texas A&M's combo of Mike Evans and Ryan Swope (152.6 ypg) ranks third in the conference.

In Vanderbilt's season finale at Wake Forest, Matthews and Boyd combined for 13 catches, 179 yards and one TD.

The Wake Forest performance by Matthews (10 catches, 144 yards, 1 TDs) and Boyd (3 catches, 35 yards) established them as the all-time leading Commodore receiving combo. The combined receiving yardage of 2,018 surpasses the former team record of 1,880 yards set by Chuck Scott and Keith Edwards in 1983.

Matthews also set a new Commodore record with 1,262 receiving yards, earning unanimous

First Team All-Southeastern Conference honors after the regular season.

Matthews trails only Cobi Hamilton of Arkansas in the SEC with 87 catches and 1,262 receiving yards. Matthews tops the league with a 109.6-yard receiving average in conference games.

Matthews' receiving totals also rank high among SEC single-season achievements. His 87-reception total is the eighth

highest single-season total in league history. His 1,262 receiving yards ranks No. 9 in SEC history. Boyd ranks 12th in the SEC with 43 catches and 756 receiving yards.

Matthews and Boyd both topped 100 receiving yards at Georgia on Sept. 22, becoming just the eighth Vandy duo to ever accomplish the feat.

RODGERS ENJOYING BEST YEAR AT QUARTERBACK

Jordan Rodgers (R-Sr., QB) is arguably putting together the second finest season ever by a Vanderbilt senior quarterback.

In Vanderbilt's current six-game win streak, Rodgers is producing at a very high level while eliminating mistakes. During those six appearances, Rodgers is completing 63.1 percent of his passes (101-of-160), averaging 227.2 passing yards, and has thrown for 10 touchdowns.

Rodgers also has thrown just three INTs during the streak. In the season finale, Rodgers was 17-of-23 for 229 yards

and two TDs, leading Vanderbilt to a win at Wake Forest. He has thrown two TDs in each of his last five games.

For the season, Rodgers has set career highs in every stat category. He is 175-of-294 for 2,431 yards and 13 TDs.

His 59.5% completion percentage is the best by a Vanderbilt signal caller since Jay Cutler hit 61% as a junior in 2004.

Rodgers is also moving into select company among Vanderbilt quarterbacks. He ranks seventh in career total offense, amassing 4,429 yards (3,955 passing and 474 rushing) in just 18 career starts.

Rodgers also ranks fifth all-time among Commodore senior QBs with 2,431 yards. He needs 118 passing yards to move into second place all-time behind Cutler's 3,073-yard total in 2005. Rodgers is 10-8 as a starting quarterback at Vanderbilt.

FULLBACK MARC PANU – RECENT YOUTUBE SENSATION

On Aug. 10, James Franklin surprised fourth-year player Marc Panu (FB, Mableton, Ga.) by presenting the walk-on with a full scholarship for 2012-13. Franklin broke the news to Panu in a team meeting and the moment was captured for posterity, however no one imagined the amount of attention the moment would garner.

Within one week, the video of the announcement had received over 350,000 views on YouTube, while Panu and Franklin had been interviewed by media outlets ranging from The Tennessean to FOX News.

When Franklin arrived at Vanderbilt for the 2012 season, Panu moved to fullback. He has played in 24 straight games during the 2011-12 season, seeing action as a short-yardage blocker and special teams contributor. He began at Vanderbilt as a walk-on LB/DE and was named defensive scout team MVP as a sophomore.

Johnson, Lohr Top Squad With 37 Career Starts

Two Vanderbilt veterans - Wesley Johnson (R-Jr., OL) and Rob Lohr (R-Sr., DT) - pace all active Commodore position players with 37 career starts.

Johnson has started every game of his Commodore career, seeing assignments at center, guard and tackle. Lohr also has started every game of the last three years.

One specialist, Richard Kent (R-Sr.), also has been the team's primary punter for 37 consecutive games.


In its first postseason appearance, Vanderbilt edges No. 8 Auburn 25-13 at the 1955 Gator Bowl on the strength of five fumble recoveries. The Commodores also receive an inspirational performance by injured quarterback Don Orr.





Defense, defense, defense. That was the main attraction at the 1974 Peach Bowl, as neither the Commodores nor Texas Tech are able to secure a touchdown in an eventual 6-6 tie.

Vanderbilt quarterback Whit Taylor earns MVP honors at the 1982 Hall of Fame Bowl by passing for 452 yards. Norman Jordan caught 20 of Taylor's throws in a high-scoring affair.





Making its first bowl appearance in 26 years in Nashville, the Commodores ride a superb defensive effort and key turnovers to defeat No. 24-ranked Boston College 16-14 in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl.

James Franklin becomes the initial Vanderbilt head coach to take his first team to a bowl as the Commodores face Cincinnati in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl. The game features a number of explosive plays from both teams.

Memphis, Tenn. – Isaiah Pead ran for 149 yards and a touchdown, and Ralph David Abernathy IV's 90-yard kickoff return early in the fourth quarter put Cincinnati ahead as the Bearcats edged Vanderbilt 31-24 in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl.

The Commodores (6-7 overall) led 21-17 early in the fourth quarter until Abernathy became the first Cincinnati player to return a kickoff for a TD in the program's 13 bowl appearances.

The Commodores, making their fifth bowl appearance and first since 2008, finished the season with a 6-7 record.

Senior QB Larry Smith replaced Vanderbilt starter Jordan Rodgers in the third quarter, and he threw for a season-high 142 yards. Smith's biggest completion was a 68-yard scoring toss to Chris Boyd that gave the Commodores for a 21-17 lead early in the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt lost the lead on the ensuing kickoff.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Vanderbilt won a bowl game for the first time in exactly 53 years, with Bryant Hahnfeldt kicking a 45-yard field goal with 3:26 left for a 16-14 win over #24 Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl held on New Year's Eve on Nashville's LP Field.

The Commodores hadn't played in a bowl since 1982 – the SEC's longest drought. The victory gave Vanderbilt (7-6) its first winning season since 1982. This is just the fourth time in the past 50 years that Vanderbilt has won seven games in a season.

The Eagles got the ball twice after Hahnfeldt's third field goal. They had to punt the first time, then Vanderbilt DB Myron Lewis picked off a pass with 1:36 left.

Vanderbilt scored its lone TD when freshman safety Sean Richardson fell on a Commodore punt that bounced off the knee of BC's Paul Anderson with 10:35 left in the third quarter.

The 'Dores gave redshirt freshman Larry Smith his first career start at quarterback.

Hahnfeldt, a Nashville product playing his final game as a Commodore, matched a single-game career high with the three field goals. The Commodores also forced two interceptions while allowing none.

HALL OF FAME Dec. 31, 1982 • Birmingham, Ala. VANDERBILT 28 - AIR FORCE 36

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – Without question, the Hall of Fame Bowl was one of college football's most exciting 1982 postseason games.

The game matched one of the nation's most potent aerial attacks featuring Vanderbilt All-SEC quarterback Whit Taylor and one of America's most devastating rushing attacks in the Falcons' option attack.

Offensively, this game lived up to the hype as 33 Hall of Fame records were broken and another eight were tied in Legion Field. Unfortunately for the Commodores, Air Force walked away the winner 36-28 after a remarkable fourth quarter comeback.

For three quarters, Whit Taylor was unstoppable. Connecting with a variety of wide receivers and running backs, Taylor's fourth touchdown pass of the game, a four-yarder to Norman Jordan, gave the 'Dores a 28-17 margin entering the fourth quarter. Down by double digits, the Air Force Academy scored rushing TDs on three consecutive possessions to take the victory.

Taylor was named the Most Valuable Player, after completing a team-record 38 passes of 51 attempts for 452 yards, which remains as the second highest single-game passing yardage total in Vanderbilt history. Jordan's performance arguably was more remarkable. Though rushing for just four yards, Jordan hauled in 20 receptions for 173 yards and three touchdowns, breaking five Hall of Fame Bowl records.

ATLANTA, Ga. – The 1974 Peach Bowl was a game with no champion but two winners, the Commodores and Texas Tech Red Raiders.

Despite the effective rushing of Red Raider tailback Larry Isaac and fullback Cliff Hoskins, the Commodore defense held Texas Tech without points in the first half and entered halftime with a 3-0 lead after Mark Adams kicked a 31-yard field goal with 10 minutes remaining.

Neither team was able to muster much offense in the third quarter, though Texas Tech did tie the score at 3-3 after a drive stalled at the Vanderbilt 16-yard line.

Early in the fourth quarter, the Commodores' freshman lineman Dennis Harrison stopped a deep Texas Tech threat by blocking a Red Raider field goal attempt. The Tech drive started following one of two VU turnovers during the game.

After the blocked field goal, the Commodores responded with a possession that ended with Adams' second field goal of the day, a 26-yarder that resulted in a 6-3 Vanderbilt margin. However, Texas Tech tied the game at the 2:00 mark on a 35-yard field goal by Brian Hall. On its final drive, Vanderbilt could not move into scoring range.

The Commodore offense struggled much of the day, with quarterback David Lee hitting just five of 14 attempts. Running back Jamie O'Rourke had 76 rushing yards.

The limited offensive production from both teams resulted in numerous defensive and scoring records being set in the game.

Within hours of the conclusion, Vanderbilt Head Coach Steve Sloan announced he was leaving his position to accept the head coaching job at Texas Tech.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Still hurting from a dislocated right elbow suffered in the Tennessee game, quarterback Don Orr scored two touchdowns and set up another as the Commodores defeated No. 8-ranked Auburn in the 11th Gator Bowl 25-13.

The Vandy defense provided a huge lift for the 'Dores, recovering five fumbles in the win.

Vanderbilt's first score was set up when Orr recovered an Auburn fumble. Eight plays later, Joe Stephenson ran seven yards for the VU TD.

Auburn answered on a 38-yard TD pass from Howell Tubbs to Rob James in the second quarter, but the rest of the game belonged to the Black and Gold. On Vanderbilt's following possession, Orr carried the ball 44 yards to the Tigers' 28. He then passed to Joe Scales, who advanced to the Auburn 4-yard line. On the next play, Orr carried the ball over the line after a fake to fullback Phil King to give Vanderbilt a 13-7 lead at the half.

At the opening of the third quarter, Vanderbilt guard Sonny Tatum recovered an Auburn fumble, and the Commodores marched quickly into scoring position as Orr crossed the goal line for his second touchdown of the day to make the score 19-7. Both teams scored once more in the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt's score came on a one-yard run off right tackle by Charley Horton.

Vanderbilt coach Art Guepe cleared his bench in the final minutes, using 38 of the 39 men dressed for the game. Capitalizing on Auburn's five fumbles and using an ailing quarterback, Vanderbilt captured its first bowl appearance.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN



Doubters said it could not be done, but in two short years Vanderbilt Head Coach James Franklin has already taken Vanderbilt to heights not seen in decades, while completely changing the culture of the football program.

Armed with a tireless work ethic, contagious personality, strong leadership and an invigorating passion for his team, Franklin has guided Vanderbilt to back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history, signed the highest rated recruiting class in team history for the second year in a row and mentored a team that continues to garner academic achievement recognition.

The program's all-around success has turned heads of fans and media members across the country as people look to learn more about the mind behind the team's rise from the depths of the SEC.

In two years, Franklin has reshaped the image of Vanderbilt football by not only his success, but also his energy and love for the program. He has created a fun, energetic and close-knit family atmosphere that players crave.

His passion for Vanderbilt is also on full display through his relentless promotion of the program and random acts of kindness. Whether it is speaking to local organizations and businesses in Nashville, helping freshmen students move into their dorm rooms, allowing an inspiring 11-year-old boy to lead the team onto the field for homecoming, passing out ice cream on campus or sitting in the home of a potential student-athlete, Franklin spreads his goodwill and vision for the program to all that will listen.

To help spread his message, Franklin has provided unprecedented access to what takes place behind the scenes with his program. From pregame and postgame locker room speeches, to team meetings and trips inside the war room on signing day, Franklin has made a conscious effort to provide the public with an inside look at his program.

His efforts have paid dividends in the media with feature stories and videos landing on prominent websites such as SI.com and SBNation.com and in publications such as Sports Illustrated and the Washington Post. Just last August, a video featuring Franklin awarding a scholarship to walk-on fullback Marc Panu went viral, collecting 400,000 views on YouTube and was featured on ESPN SportsCenter, FOX & Friends morning show and an abundance of newspapers across the nation.

Hired as the first African-American head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history on Dec. 17, 2010, Franklin's off-the-field accomplishments have been outstanding, but the results on the field have simply been staggering.

In his first season with Vanderbilt in 2011, Franklin became the only first-year coach in school history to guide the Commodores to a bowl game and surpassed the total wins achieved by the program in each of its previous two seasons. As an encore, all Franklin did in his second season was run

ENTHUSIASM SOARS ON CAMPUS

Vanderbilt played before three home sellouts, the most since 1996. Total home attendance spiked 14 percent from a year ago.

circles around what he achieved in 2011 and more, much more.

This year, he guided Vanderbilt to an 8-4 record during the regular season, including wins in the final six games. As a result, the team was rewarded with an invitation to the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl against NC State. Franklin was also rewarded for his efforts with a new contract that included facility enhancements to McGugin Center and Vanderbilt Stadium.

Franklin's new contract came after a regular season in which the Commodores rewrote a number of Vanderbilt records. The team's eight wins were the most by a Commodore team since 1982, and the six-game win streak was the longest since 1955. The last time Vanderbilt closed the regular season with six straight wins was 1948.

Vanderbilt's SEC wins came at Missouri, Kentucky and Ole Miss and at home against Auburn and Tennessee. Vanderbilt's road win at Missouri was Franklin's first road triumph in the SEC. The team's 40-0 shutout at Kentucky was its second shutout of the season, marking the first time Vanderbilt had two shutouts in the same year since 1968.

The team's win at Ole Miss was its sixth win of the season and came after facing a 23-6 deficit in the third quarter. Vanderbilt's win against Tennessee was its first at home over the Volunteers since 1982.

Other wins came against Presbyterian, UMass and Wake Forest. Vanderbilt won at Wake Forest, 55-21, and scored the second-most points ever allowed at BB&T Field. The win also helped Vanderbilt eclipse 300 points for the second straight year – a first in school history.

Vanderbilt excelled in all three phases of the game in 2012. On offense, the team scored 40-plus points on five occasions for the first time since 1915. The defense allowed just 18.2 points per game – the fewest since 1975. On special teams, Vanderbilt had an All-SEC punter and kicker in the same year for the first time in team history.

Franklin also helped mentor three players to school records in 2012. All-SEC running back Zac Stacy became Vanderbilt's all-time leading rusher and was the first player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in back-toback seasons. All-conference receiver Jordan Matthews set Vanderbilt's single-season receiving yardage record. Kicker Carey Spear set a new school record with 81 points scored and 19 field goals made. Six different players also received weekly awards from the SEC in 2012: Spear, cornerback Andre Hal, offensive linemen Wesley Johnson and Joe Townsend, defensive end Walker May and punter Richard Kent.

In two seasons at the helm, Franklin has compiled a 14-11 overall record. The 14 wins are the second most wins in school history of any second-year head coach. Only Dan McGugin registered more victories (16, 1904-05) in his first two seasons than Franklin has.

Franklin is 7-1 all-time in non-conference games and went 4-0 in non-conference games in 2011, marking the first undefeated non-SEC record since 1999.

In SEC play, Vanderbilt has also more than held its own. Four of Vanderbilt's SEC wins have come by 23 points or more. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23-plus points.

Before Franklin arrived, Vanderbilt had historically struggled to finish seasons on a strong note. However, it has been just the opposite under Franklin. For the first time since 1948, Vanderbilt finished undefeated in November. In two years, Franklin's teams are 6-2 in November. In the decade before he arrived on campus, Vanderbilt was 3-32 in November games.

The success of the team on the field has also translated to the stands. In 2012, attendance rose nearly 15 percent at the newly-renovated Vanderbilt Stadium, which hosted three sellouts for the first time since 1996.

In the offseason before the 2012 season, Vanderbilt installed a new video board in the south end zone, along with new hillside seating below the video board. New stadium lights and an artificial playing surface was also installed in place of natural grass. A new multipurpose facility is also currently being constructed and is scheduled to open in the fall of 2013.

In his first season at Vanderbilt, Franklin led the Commodores to the 2011 AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis on New Year's Eve. The team totally reversed two consecutive seasons of disappointment by earning the fifth postseason appearance in school history.

JOHN DONOVAN Off. Coordinator-Running Backs 2nd year on Vanderbilt staff

Donovan's offense continues to be a huge hit at Vanderbilt, a school that struggled with point production prior to Donovan's and James Franklin's arrival on campus.

This season, Donovan coordinated one of the most productive offenses in modern day team history. The 2012 Commodores' accumulation of 4,711 total yards ranks as the highest total in

modern Vanderbilt history. Vanderbilt also scored 352 points, the highest

single-season total by a Commodore squad since World War I.

Donovan's balanced attack resulted in three of the finest individual seasons ever by Vanderbilt players. Senior Zac Stacy became the most decorated running back in team history,

nationally with a 175.8yard average.

Shoop's attacking squad also performs well forcing fourth downs. The unit ranks 12th nationally on third down situations.

The pressuring unit also leads the SEC with 93 tackles for loss this year, the most by any SEC defense.

MORE ON SHOOP

Despite missing four quality starters from a year ago, Shoop's Vanderbilt defense didn't miss a beat. The unit ranked among NCAA leaders in several categories. The defense also held five SEC opponents under 20 points and posted its first shutout in conference play since 1968.

Shoop's defense enjoyed widespread success with limited individual recognition. Cornerback Andre Hal was the only Commodore to garner all-conference postseason honors.

Shoop also mentored Commodore safeties, developing Kenny Ladler and Javon Marshall into extremely productive starters. Ladler and Marshall topped the defense in tackles.



CHARLES BANKINS Special Teams Coordinator•TEs 2nd year on Vanderbilt staff

In his second season on campus, Bankins continued his remarkable job of coaching Vanderbilt special teams.

Behind the placekicking of junior Carey Spear and the punting of senior Richard Kent, the Commodores put together arguably the finest combined special teams effort in team history. Spear was sensational, setting a

school record with 19 field goals and 81 points scored by a kicker. He also ranked as the SEC's most accurate kicker, hitting 86.4 percent of his field goal attempts (19-of-22).

Kent wasn't outdone by Spear. The third-year starter averaged 44.8 yards, the fourth highest single-season average ever by a Commodore. His outstanding ability to directionally punt was extremely effective in limiting returns and pinning teams deep inside their 20-yard line.

Junior Jonathan Krause also made huge strides as a punt returner.

His 11.2-yard average was the second highest by a Commodore in the 20 years. He also became the first Vanderbilt player since 1968 to register two punt returns for touchdowns in the same season.


Lattimore scored the go-ahead TD on a 1-yard run with 11:25 to go.

but instead of a touchdown, the Commodores (0-2) had to settle for a tying 26-yard field goal by Carey Spear.




"This was a great win for us," Vanderbilt Head Coach James Franklin said. "We are 1-0 this week. We're undefeated in the 2012 season that started today."



Murray also scored on a 1-yard sneak as the Bulldogs raced to a 27-0 lead in the first half. He finished 18 of 24 for 250 yards.


But there was more to this offensive performance than another big night for the quarterback. A lot more.

offense after an early injury to quarterback James Franklin, who sprained his left knee on a first-quarter run and didn't return.

Vanderbilt's first points of the game came when Missouri punter Trey Barrow couldn't handle a snap while standing in the back of Missouri's end zone, with the ball rolling out the back. A 5-yard Stacy run late in the second half gave the Commodores a 9-6 lead they wouldn't relinquish.

PLAY OF THE GAME

With the Commodores clinging to a four-point lead on their own 26-yard line and facing a 3rd & 9, Zac Stacy runs for 13 yards to pick up the first down and stay in bounds allowing the Dores to run out the clock.

KEY STATISTIC

Punter Richard Kent's big day kicking the ball was key as the senior averaged 43.4 yards per punt, swinging field position with two punts of over 50 yards and two inside the 20-yard line.

NASHVILLE – No one will overlook Jeff Driskel again, not after the Florida quarterback ran the ball better than even Tim Tebow.

Driskel ran for 177 yards and three touchdowns, and the fourthranked Gators beat Vanderbilt 31-17 on Saturday night to stay undefeated going into their big showdown with No. 3 South Carolina. Driskel ran only 11 times, and the sophomore set the Florida record



for yards rushing by a quarterback, topping Tebow's 166 yards against Mississippi in 2007 on 27 carries.

Vanderbilt watched Gators running back Mike Gillislee so closely that Driskel didn't even think the Commodores laid a hand on

him on any of his TD runs.


The Gators (6-0, 5-0 SEC) finished off their last SEC road trip outside of the state of Florida with their 22nd straight win over Vanderbilt. Florida, which rallied in the second half to beat Texas A&M, Tennessee and LSU already this season, took control early this time. The Gators scored 21 straight points, including 11 in the second quarter where they took the lead for good.

PLAY OF THE GAME

Florida led 24-17 when they took over at their own 30-yard line in the fourth quarter. Gators' QB Jeff Driskel put the game away on the first play of the drive with a 70-yard run, untouched for a score.

NASHVILLE – Luckily for Zac Stacy, he won't be remembered for his last carry on a record-setting day.

Vanderbilt overcame a fourth-quarter fumble by its senior running back, who rushed for 169 yards and a go-ahead touchdown in a 17-13 victory over Auburn on Saturday.

Stacy had 27 carries and became the school's all-time rushing



leader but lost the ball on his final rush, allowing the Tigers (1-6, 0-5 Southeastern Conference) to take over at their 32-yard line with 2:24 left.

Vanderbilt (3-4, 2-3) responded by smothering the SEC's worst-scoring offense. Clint

Moseley overshot an open Sammie Coates on fourth-and-13 with 52 seconds remaining.


Stacy's 27-yard run in the fourth quarter broke Frank Mordica's previous school mark of 2,632 rushing yards from 1976-79. Stacy, who also holds the Commodores' single-season rushing record, now has 2,670 yards.

The Commodores rushed for 209 yards compared to Auburn's 103 yards. Vanderbilt also ran 17 more plays than the Tigers.





NASHVILLE – For more than 25 minutes, Vanderbilt didn't look the part of the favorite. But the Commodores needed just 55 seconds to assume the role. Two late first-half touchdowns made up for a penalty-filled opening half and broke open a tight game as Vanderbilt rolled to a 49-7 victory over winless Massachusetts on Saturday. Jordan Rodgers completed 17 of 21 passes for 217 yards and two



touchdowns. He also ran for a score as the Commodores (4-4) overcame 11 penalties, two turnovers and the loss of their starting running back to blow out UMass (0-8). Vanderbilt made it look easy in the second half - specifically the third guarter. Within

five minutes, the Commodores leapt to a 49-0 lead thanks to four touchdowns, including an interception return and the team's first punt return for a score since 1999.


"It was huge," Rodgers said. "We needed it. We got off to a slow start and we needed to hit a couple of those touchdowns late in the half to give us some momentum - some kind of confidence going into halftime because we had too many mental mistakes."

VANDERBILT BLANKS KENTUCKY; FIRST SEC SHUTOUT SINCE 1968

LEXINGTON, KY. (AP) – Before Saturday, Vanderbilt hadn't shut out a Southeastern Conference opponent since 1968.

That streak was broken Saturday in a 40-0 road win against

Kentucky in which the Commodores dominated on offense, defense and special teams.

Quarterback Jordan Rodgers completed 18 of 29 passes for 220



yards, two touchdowns and one interception, and three different Commodores running backs rushed for scores against the overmatched Kentucky defense.

Vanderbilt's 40-point victory margin was its largest over the Wildcats in 96 years.

In the teams' 85 meetings, only two of Vanderbilt's wins have been more lopsided: 45-0 in 1916, and 50-0 in 1897.

The Commodores (5-4, 3-3) scored touchdowns on four of their five first-half drives, and none of the scoring drives took more than 4 minutes, 19 seconds.

Rodgers led his team 71 yards on 11 plays begin the game, ending the drive with a 34-yard touchdown pass to Jordan Matthews. It was the fourth time this season has scored on its first drive of the game.

PLAY OF THE GAME

After a 16-play opening drive, Kentucky misses a 50-yard field goal. The Commodores force nine of the Wildcats final 11 drives to five plays or less, including three three and outs.

KEY STATISTIC

The shutout was the first SEC shutout for Vanderbilt since blanking Kentucky 6-0 in 1968.

COMMODORES RALLY FROM 17-POINT DEFICIT TO DOWN REBELS

OXFORD, MISS. – It was a clutch moment that has so often flummoxed Vanderbilt's football program for the better part of its history.

But in yet another piece of mounting evidence that the Commodores aren't a SEC doormat anymore, Jordan Rodgers calmly surveyed the field and found Chris Boyd wide open for a 26-yard touchdown pass with 52 seconds remaining to give Vanderbilt a 27-26



victory over Mississippi on Saturday night. It ended a thrilling comeback for the Commodores (6-4, 3-3 SEC), who trailed 23-6 early in the third quarter but rallied for their fourth straight victory.

Now the postseason is in Vanderbilt's future - again. The Commodores are poised to go to their second straight bowl game for the first time in school history.

Second-year coach James Franklin has engineered the quick turnaround, turning Vanderbilt into an SEC threat nearly overnight.


"I'm looking forward to the day when I don't have to say first ever, because we want this to be the culture at Vanderbilt. A culture of winning," Franklin said. "Our coaches and players believe it."

PLAY OF THE GAME

Jordan Rodgers found a wide open Chris Boyd down the sideline for 26 yards and the game-winning touchdown on the Commodores' final drive of the night.

KEY STATISTIC

The Vanderbilt defense kept the Commodores in the game by forcing Ole Miss to kick four field goals and limiting the Rebels' rushing attack to only 55 yards on 40 carries.

COMMODORES HAMMER VOLS FOR FIFTH CONFERENCE VICTORY

NASHVILLE - The Vanderbilt Commodores ended years of frustration at the hands of their in-state rival Tennessee with one of their best victories in decades.

Making their celebration even sweeter?

The Commodores also ensured Tennessee's third straight losing season, putting Volunteers' coach Derek Dooley's job status in further jeopardy.

GAME 11 Nov. 17, 2012 NASHVILLE

Andre Hal intercepted two passes and Jordan Rodgers threw for two touchdowns as Vanderbilt routed Tennessee 41-18 Saturday night for the Commodores' fifth straight victory, clinching their first winning record in the regular season since 1982.

In-state rival Tennessee had won 34 of the past 35 games in this series coming into this game. The Commodores (7-4, 5-3 SEC) also snapped a 14-game skid against Tennessee at home with their first win in Nashville since 1982 and the most points they've scored against the Vols since a 51-7 win in 1923.

'This is what we all envisioned when we came here, that we could build something special here at Vanderbilt right here in Nashville. We are Nashville's team," Franklin said.

PLAY OF THE GAME

Jordan Matthews' first career rushing touchdown opened the scoring in the second half and was the beginning of a 21-point third quarter for the Commodores. Matthews took the ball 47 yards on a reverse for the score.

KEY STATISTIC

The Vanderbilt defense shuts down an explosive Tennessee offense, holding the Vols to 303 total yards including just 154 passing. UT entered the game averaging over 330 yards per game in the air.



The latest victory came Saturday in a blowout fashion as Jordan Rodgers threw for 229 yards and two touchdowns, and Zac Stacy ran for a season-high 180 yards and two scores in a dominating 55-21 win over Wake Forest.

Vanderbilt also scored twice on special teams, blocking a punt and recovering it in

the end zone for a touchdown and also returning a punt 83 yards for a score.




