

MEDIA OUTLETS WELCOME AT TEAM'S SPRING PRACTICE

Vanderbilt Head Coach James Franklin plans to open 2013 Vanderbilt spring practices to media outlets.

Upon further notice, local media photographers and videographers will be allowed to shoot each Commodore. Certain practice periods may be closed to cameras.

The first practice is Friday, March 15.

Post-practice interviews with Coach Franklin and selected student-athletes will be available after virtually every session. Assistant coaches will be available after Thursday practices only.

Inclement weather can impact this practice schedule. If the Commodores are forced off the field, lost practices can be made up on Wednesdays or Fridays.

Two Saturday practices, on March 23 and March 30, will be open to the general public.


























RETURNING TO WORK AFTER BACK-TO-BACK BOWLS

Vanderbilt returns to the practice field in mid-March looking to back up one of the most impressive seasons in Vanderbilt gridiron history.

The list of program achievements witnessed in 2012 is long, but perhaps none top the fact that

VANDERBILT ALL-TIME BOWLS

Vanderbilt fans have now witnessed their Commodores making bowl appearances in back-to-back seasons.

FOLLOWING A YEAR OF HISTORIC **ACHIEVEMENT ON CAMPUS**

TYING TEAM RECORD FOR VICTORIES IN SEASON

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before - in 1915 and 1904.

SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in Southeastern Conference play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

SOARING ENTHUSIASM AMONG FAN BASE

Enthusiasm among the Commodore fan base continues to soar due to Franklin's improvement of the program. Attendance increased nearly 15 percent this season in renovated Vanderbilt Stadium.

FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

The postseason accomplishment tells college football fans across the nation how far Head Coach James Franklin has brought the Vanderbilt program. The Commodores are headed toward a bright future that bears no resemblance to much of the previous six decades on campus. The team enters Spring Practice sporting the longest active win streak among Southeastern Conference SEC teams. Their success rate in late-season games and league encounters under Franklin has rarely been witnessed. The Vanderbilt offense ranks as the program's most explosive since World War I. For a second straight year, the Commodore defense ranks among the nation's Top 25 in key stat lines such as scoring defense. And Nashville fans are beginning to come out to see the Commodores.

Indeed, it's a Brand New Day at Vanderbilt.



FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05


James Franklin is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in Vanderbilt history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I Era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 15-11 overall. His .577 winning percentage is under Franklin is the best by a Commodore mentor since eventual College Football Hall of

Famer Red Sanders had a .578 winning percentage from 1940-48.

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years was another Hall of Famer, Dan McGugin, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

JOHNSON TOPS SQUAD WITH 38 CAREER STARTS

Veteran offensive lineman Wesley Johnson (R-Sr.) paces all active Commodore position players with 38 career starts.

Johnson has started every game of his Commodore

career, seeing assignments at four line positions: center, right and left tackle, and left guard. The majority of his starts have come at left tackle.

If Johnson starts every game of his final season, he could become the all-time team leader in career starts. Brian Stamper, an offensive lineman from 2003-07, holds the mark with 48 starts.

THREE RETURNING 'DORES: 2012 ALL-SEC PICKS

Three Vanderbilt seniors, paced by record-setting wide receiver Jordan Matthews, are coming off All-Southeastern Conference recognition from a year ago.

Matthews, from Madison, Ala., was a unanimous 2012 First Team All-SEC selection after establishing a new team record with 1,323 receiving yards.

Joining Matthews on the AP All-SEC team were three second team picks: cornerback Andre Hal and placekicker Carey Spear. A fourth Commodore, offensive lineman Wesley Johnson was named honorable mention all-conference by the AP.

Matthews put together arguably the finest season by a Commodore receiver, finishing with 94 receptions and eight touchdown catches in addition to the record-setting yardage total. He ranks as the SEC's leading active career receiver in virtually every stat category.

Hal, a product of Port Allen, La., ranked second in the SEC last year with 16 passes defended. He finished with 36 solo tackles and two picks, both coming against Tennessee.

Spear, from Mayfield Village, Ohio, put together the best season ever by a 'Dore placekicker, setting team records with 20 field goals and 87 points scored by a kicker. On the season, he was 20-of-24, including 15-of-15 inside 43 yards.

Johnson, from Nashville, ranks among the SEC's most versatile and productive linemen. He started multiple starts at both tackle positions as a junior in 2012.

Commodore Offensive Production Increases, 2012 Point Average Most Since World War I

The 2012 Commodores produced more points than any Vanderbilt squad since the post-World War I era.

The Commodores totalled 390 points in 2012, the highest single-season total since Dan McGugin's 1915 Vanderbilt squad averaged 51.4 points during a 9-1

In becoming just the third Vanderbilt team since the 1920s to score more than 300 points, the Commodores also averaged 30.0 points. The 30-point average is the program's highest since 1915.

Vanderbilt also posted greater point production as the season endured. The Commodores averaged 41.7 points in the final six games and tallied at least 40 points against four opponents from BCS-affiliated leagues: Kentucky and Tennessee from the Southeastern Conference, and Wake Forest and North Carolina State from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Vanderbilt outscored its 13 foes in 2012 by a wide margin, 390-243. The 147-point differential is the second largest in modern Commodore gridiron history. Since World War II, the only point differential larger than 2012 came during the 1955 campaign when Vanderbilt outscored its opponents by 154 points for the season (240-86).

in numerous key categories. It was 15th in the nation in scoring defense, limiting opponents to 18.7 ppg., and 19th in total defense, holding foes to an average of 333.9 yards. The defense's 175.8-yard pass defense average ranked 14th nationally.

First Downs Allowed

The unit also ranked even higher nationally in other stat categories. The Commodores ranked sixth with a 102.4 defensive pass efficiency rating and 12th with 97 tackles for loss.

Shoop's squad also performed extremely well in third down situations. The team ranked No. 25 in the NCAA in third down efficiency (34 percent) and 21st in first downs allowed (18.2 pg.). On the season, opponents have been limited to a quick 3-and-out possession on 31% of their drives.

The 18.7-point scoring defense is the lowest scoring average against the Commodores in 15 years.

2012 VANDERBILT OFFENSE RANKS AMONG PROGRAM'S BEST EVER

The 2012 Commodore offense ranked among the program's most potent units of the modern era.

Coordinated by **John Donovan**, the offense produced 4,936 yards, the highest single-season total in modern history. The unit's average over 13 games was 379.7 yards, the highest yearly average since former SEC

Offensive Player of the Year Jay Cutler was a senior quarterback in 2005. It ranks as the fourth highest yearly total offense average since the 1940s.

For the first time since 1915, the Vanderbilt offense also tallied at least 40 points in five games.

The offense was extremely balanced in 2012, getting 214.4 yards from the passing game

The 2012 offense also was the first Vanderbilt unit ever to produce a 2,500-yard passer (**Jordan Rodgers**, 2,538 yards), 1,000-yard rusher (**Zac Stacy**, 1,141 yards) and 1,000-yard receiver (**Jordan Matthews**, 1,343 yards).

COMMODORES IMPROVED IN 2011; YET 2012 SQUAD MORE IMPRESSIVE

Statistics show that James Franklin's 2011 squad was far superior to the 2010 Commodore edition. Those stats also reveal that Franklin's 9-4 2012 team also out-performed the 2011 Commodores.

As Spring Practice opens on campus, Franklin will be doing his all to continue the improvement trend.

Vanderbilt's threegame improvement from 2011 to 2012 is the most obvious stat supporting the Commodores' 2012 improvement. In fact, the '12 squad produced more points, more total yards and more first downs on offense, and allowed fewer points on defense than their '11 counterparts.

In 2012, Vanderbilt averaged 30.0 points, 3.3 more than in 2011. The 2012 team also averaged 40.6 more yards of offense: 38.8 passing and 1.8 rushing. The improved production allowed the 2012 Commodores to register 1.7 more first downs per game.

The 2012 offense also is averaging 5.6 yards per play, a 0.3-yard improvement over 2011.

On defense, the 2012 Commodores registered two shutouts for the first time in nearly 50 years and allowed 18.2 points per game, 3.4 points fewer than in 2011.

The Commodores were improved in pass offense and pass defense in 2012. The offense's 138.9 pass efficiency rating last year was far superior to the 110.8 efficiency rating. Vanderbilt's pass efficiency on defense was 102.7 in 2012, eight points better than the previous year.

The 2012 squad also has produced more sacks and allowed less sacks by opposing defenses. The 2012 team edition also was flagged for 5.3 fewer yards in penalties.

VANDY STAFF: FULLY INTACT FROM 2012

Vanderbilt is the only Southeastern Conference program that will have its entire coaching staff intact from the 2012 season.

It marks the first time since 2009 that the Commodore staff remained intact. Last year, Franklin added George Barlow and Josh Gattis as position coaches/assistant recruiting coordinators.

Vanderbilt is one of nine schools from conferences affiliated with the BCS that will return intact staffs. The others are Baylor, Louisville, Maryland, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Notre Dame and Ohio State.

While the Commodores return virtually the entire receiving corps intact and much of an improved offensive line, the staff will use spring drills to closely examine leading candidates for two vacancies sure to impact the 2013 season: quarterback and tailback.

TOP OFFENSIVE RETURNEES

Rodgers put together one of the best seasons ever by a Vanderbilt senior quarterback, passing for more than 2,500 yards and 15 TDs.

Seven offensive starters are back from a 2012 unit that ranked among the most productive offenses in Vanderbilt history. Topping the list of returnees are Biletnikoff Award candidate **Jordan Matthews** at wide receiver and All-SEC offensive line prospect **Wesley Johnson**. They are backed by two-year wide receiver starters **Chris Boyd** and **Jonathan Krause**, and returning line starters **Joe Townsend**, **Jake Bernstein** and **Andrew Bridges**.

Redshirt senior **Austyn Carta-Samuels** and talented redshirt freshman **Patton Robinette** will compete with two others for Rodgers' vacancy at quarterback. Carta-Samuels earned one start last year and transferred to Vanderbilt after starting the 2009-10 seasons at the University of Wyoming. Robinette is a former Tennessee prep player of the year who showed talent on the practice field last year. They will compete with spring enrollee **Johnny McCrary** and versatile sophomore **Josh Grady**.

Two key running backs from Vanderbilt's Music City Bowl squad, redshirt senior **Wesley Tate** and sophomore **Brian Kimbrow**, are back to compete for the opening left by Stacy's graduation. Tate rushed for 376 yards and was most effective in short-yardage situations where he produced eight touchdowns. As a freshman, Kimbrow was an explosive threat, averaging 6.3 yards on 66 carries.

It could be an important spring for two more running back candidates: redshirt sophomores **Jerron Seymour** and **Derek King**. Seymour missed the 2012 season, but posted five rushing touchdowns as a freshman in 2011. King is switching after playing defensive back last year.

SIX COMMODORES AT NEW POSITIONS

Six players will appear at new positions when drills start March 15.

Versatile redshirt sophomore **Josh Grady** will see action at quarterback, shifting from wide receiver. Redshirt sophomore **Derek King** will move from cornerback to running back. A third redshirt sophomore **Jacquese Kirk** will switch from wide receiver to cornerback.

Three redshirt freshmen – **Torey Agee, Cory Batey** and **Adam Butler** – are moving: Agee from defensive end to defensive tackle, Batey from receiver to strong safety, and Butler from offensive line to defensive tackle.

SIX STARTERS BACK ON DEFENSE; PRODUCTIVE STANDOUTS RETURN

Six starters from a year ago are back for spring drills for a Commodore defensive staff that faces the task of replacing four key multi-year starters.

The list of 2012 standouts back this spring includes the team's three top tacklers in seniors **Kenny Ladler**, **Chase Garnham** and **Javon**

Marshall, defensive co-captain Walker May and All-Southeastern Conference recipient Andre Hal.

The defensive staff guided by coordinator **Bob Shoop** will begin the process of replacing five seniors that greatly impacted the Music City Bowl unit: interior tackles Rob Lohr and Colt Nichter, end Johnell Thomas, linebacker Archibald Barnes and cornerback Trey Wilson. In 2012, Lohr provided the defense with 11 tackles for loss as a senior, Barnes ranked as the team's fourth leading tackler, Thomas produced his finest season as a senior, and Wilson topped the squad with three interceptions.

TOP DEFENSIVE RETURNEES

The defensive staff has 21 letterwinners, including the six returning starters, back to combat the graduation losses.

Six of the team's top seven tacklers from 2012 — Ladler, Garnham, Marshall, May, Hal and senior linebacker **Karl Butler** — are returning this spring. Among the other top key contributors expected at spring drills at redshirt junior end **Kyle Woestmann** and sophomore end **Caleb Azubike**, the team's No. 2 and No. 3 sack specialists from a year ago.

SPEAR, KRAUSE TOP SPECIALISTS; STAFF MUST IDENTIFY NEXT PUNTER

The Vanderbilt corps of specialists includes a record-setting senior placekicker and one of the top punt returners in recent team history.

Carey Spear, an All-SEC selection in 2012 after booting a team-record 20 field goals, is expected to handle the team's placekicking and kickoff responsibilities. Spear gives the Commodores a strong-legged, accurate kicker who brings tremendous leadership abilities to the special team units. Senior Jonathan Krause became one of the SEC's top return specialists in 2012, averaging 11.2 yards on 25 punt returns. Krause, who took two punts for touchdowns last year, has the second best average of all SEC returners from the 2012 season.

The Commodores do need to solve one key uncertainty this spring. For the first time in three years, Vanderbilt is in search of a starting punter following the graduation of **Richard Kent**, who developed into one of the nation's specialists. **Colby Cooke**, a highly regarded redshirt freshman, and promising walk-on **Taylor Hudson** will compete for the role in spring drills.

Vanderbilt also returns junior **Andrew East**, a two-year starting snapper on all conversion and punt units.

The team's top kick returners, sophomore **Brian Kimbrow** and senior **Andre Hal**, also are back. Both averaged more than 22 yards per return last year.

COMMODORES CONCLUDE 2012 RANKED IN TOP 25

Vanderbilt's seven-game winning streak to cap the 2012 season enabled the Commodores to end the year ranked among the Top 25 for the first time in more than 60 years.

The 9-4 Commodores impressed enough sports-writers to finish No. 20 in the final Associated Press Poll. In the final USA Today-Coaches Poll, Vanderbilt was ranked No. 23.

It marks the first year since 1948 that Vanderbilt completed its season ranked in the AP Top 25. That year the 8-2-1 Commodores finished No. 12 in the AP Poll. The 1948 Vanderbilt squad ended its season with an eight-game win streak.

VANDERBILT ATTENDANCE ON THE RISE; 15% INCREASE ON CAMPUS IN 2012

Vanderbilt officials hope to see upward trends in home attendance to continue after the Commodores 9-4 campaign in 2012.

Last year, the Commodores hosted three sellouts, the most since 1996, and averaged 37,860 for six home dates, 15 percent higher than in 2011 when attendance totals improved over 2010 figures.

Vanderbilt's double-digit attendance in 2012 was the highest in the SEC, and came during a season when college football attendance nationwide dipped 1.6% from 2011 figures.

The Commodores hosted three sellouts on campus last year, the most in a single season since 1996.

Vanderbilt played before 93.8% capacity crowds at home. To Vanderbilt players and coaches, the most positive aspect of the increased crowds is the growing popularity of Commodore football.

Spear also ranked among the SEC's most accurate kickers. Spear finished the year third in the SEC with a 83.3 percent success rate. He was 20-of-24 on the season. He also made 11 of his 12 field goal attempts and was a perfect 14-of-14 inside 43 yards. Spear's misses are from 44, 44, 46 and 51 yards.

Spear also set a new Vanderbilt single-season scoring mark for points by a kicker. The two-year co-captain finished the year with 87 points, 14 more than the former record set by Ricky Anderson in 1982.

On Feb. 1, Head Coach **James Franklin** and his coaching staff delivered on a promise to Vanderbilt fans by signing what recruiting experts regard as the best class of national prospects in team history.

Franklin praised the 25-player class that ranks among the finest recruiting achievements of any coaching staff in the nation. According to Rivals.com, the class ranks 19th nationally, making it the highest ranked collection of signees in Commodore history.

"This is a significant day in Vanderbilt football history," Franklin said. "This signing class is further proof that Vanderbilt has arrived and intends to compete at the highest levels of college football. I'm incredibly happy to inform the Commodore Nation that the future of Vanderbilt Football is right now – and it's brighter than ever."

The 2013 class includes 12 players on offense, 12 on defense and one kicking specialist. It features three prep All-Americans and 17 players that earned rare four-star evaluations from national recruiting services. Fifteen members of the class made appearances in prestigious postseason all-star games. Five different signees played huge roles on state championship squads. Twenty members of the class were senior captains.

The recruiting effort attacked depth concerns. The signing class includes five wide receivers, five defensive backs, four defensive linemen, three linebackers and three tight ends.

- Johnson has never been called for a single holding penalty.
- Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 6.5 sacks on 1,021 career pass attempts, or one sack every 157 pass plays.
 - Johnson did not allow a single quarterback sack in 2012.
- Johnson has produced 152 knockdown blocks, 37 intimidation blocks and 106 blocks that led to a Commodore touchdown or first down.
- Johnson has been on the field for every Vanderbilt touchdown and PAT for the last three seasons.
- Johnson has played 2,364 career snaps: 1,578 at left tackle, 457 at center, 252 at right tackle, 108 at left guard and 67 at tight end. He has played 98.3 percent of the team's snaps over the last three years.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN



Doubters said it could not be done, but in two short years Vanderbilt Head Coach James Franklin has already taken Vanderbilt to heights not seen in decades, while completely changing the culture of the football program.

Armed with a tireless work ethic, contagious personality, strong leadership and an invigorating passion for his team, Franklin has guided Vanderbilt to back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history, signed the highest-rated recruiting class in school history three years in a row and mentored a squad that earned the AFCA Academic Achievement Award in 2012.

The program's all-around success has turned heads of fans and media members across the country as people look to learn more about the mind behind the team's rise from the depths of the SEC.

In two years, Franklin has reshaped the image of Vanderbilt football by not only his success, but also his energy and love for the program. He has created a fun, energetic and close-knit family atmosphere that players crave.

His passion for Vanderbilt is also on full display publicly through his relentless promotion of the program and random acts of kindness. Whether it is speaking to local organizations and businesses in Nashville, helping freshmen students move into their dorm rooms, allowing an inspiring 11-year-old boy to lead the team onto the field for homecoming, passing out ice cream on campus or sitting in the home of a potential student-athlete, Franklin spreads his goodwill and vision for the program to all that will listen.

To help spread his message, Franklin has provided unprecedented access to what takes place behind the scenes with his program. From pregame and postgame locker room speeches, to team meetings and trips inside the war room on signing day, Franklin has made a conscious effort to provide the public with an inside look at his program.

His efforts have paid dividends in the media with feature stories and videos landing on prominent websites such as SI.com and SBNation.com and in publications such as Sports Illustrated and the Washington Post. Just last August, a video featuring Franklin awarding a scholarship to walk-on fullback Marc Panu went viral, collecting 400,000 views on YouTube and was featured on ESPN SportsCenter, FOX's morning show and other national outlets.

Hired as the first African-American head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history on Dec. 17, 2010, Franklin's off-the-field accomplishments have been



outstanding, but the results on the field have simply been staggering.

In his initial season with Vanderbilt in 2011, Franklin became the only first-year coach in school history to guide the Commodores to a bowl game and surpassed the total wins achieved by the program in each of its previous two seasons. As an encore, all Franklin did in his second season was run circles around what he achieved in 2011 and more, much more.

He guided Vanderbilt to a 9-4

season, matching the school record for wins (1915), and ending the season with the longest winning streak in the SEC, having won seven straight. It was Vanderbilt's longest win streak since an eight-game streak in 1948.

The 'Dores capped the season with a 38-24 win over No. Carolina State in the Music City Bowl. After the victory Franklin also was named as a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors from the Bryant Awards.

Vanderbilt finished among the nation's best in a number of defensive statistical categories, ranking No. 6 in pass efficiency defense, No. 14 in pass defense, No. 15 in scoring defense and No. 19 on total defense.

In 2012, Vanderbilt's SEC wins came at Missouri, Kentucky and Ole Miss and at home against Auburn and Tennessee. The team's 40-0 shutout at Kentucky was its second shutout of the season, marking the first time Vanderbilt had two shutouts in the same year since 1968.

The team's win at Ole Miss was its sixth win of the season and came after facing a 23-6 deficit in the third quarter. Vanderbilt's win against Tennessee was its first at home over the Volunteers since 1982.

Other wins came against Presbyterian, UMass and Wake Forest.

Vanderbilt won at Wake Forest, 55-21, and scored the second-most points ever allowed at BB&T Field. The win also helped Vanderbilt eclipse 300 points for the second straight year – a first in school history.

Vanderbilt excelled in all three phases of the game in 2012. On offense, the team scored 40-plus points on five occasions for the first time since 1915. The defense allowed just 18.2 points per game – the fewest since 1975. On special teams, Vanderbilt had an All-SEC punter and kicker in the same year for the first time in team history.

Franklin also helped mentor three players to school records in 2012. All-SEC running back Zac Stacy became Vanderbilt's all-time leading rusher and was the first player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons. All-conference receiver Jordan Matthews set Vanderbilt's single-season receiving yardage record. Kicker Carey Spear set a new school record with 81 points scored and 19 field goals made. Six different players also received weekly awards from the SEC in 2012: Spear, cornerback Andre Hal, offensive linemen Wesley Johnson and Joe Townsend, defensive end Walker May and punter Richard Kent.

In two seasons at the helm, Franklin has compiled a 15-11 overall record. The 15 wins are the second most wins in school history of any second-year head coach. Only Dan McGugin registered more victories (16, 1904-05) in his first two seasons than Franklin has.

Franklin is 7-1 all-time in non-conference games and went 4-0 in non-SEC games in 2011, Vanderbilt's first unblemished non-conference mark since 1999.

In SEC play, Vanderbilt has also more than held its own. Four of Vanderbilt's SEC wins have come by 23 points or more. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23-plus points.

Before Franklin arrived, Vanderbilt had historically struggled to finish seasons on a strong note. However, it has been just the opposite under Franklin. For the first time since 1948, Vanderbilt finished undefeated in November. In two years, Franklin's teams are 6-2 in November. In the decade before he arrived on campus, Vanderbilt was 3-32 in November games.

The success of the team on the field has also translated to the stands. In 2012, attendance rose nearly 15 percent at the newly-renovated Vanderbilt Stadium, which hosted three sellouts for the first time since 1996.

In the offseason before the 2012 season, Vanderbilt installed a new video board in the south end zone, along with new hillside seating below the video board. New stadium lights and an artificial playing surface were installed in place of natural grass. A multi-purpose facility will open in the fall of 2013.

In his first season at Vanderbilt, Franklin led the 'Dores to the 2011 AutoZone Liberty Bowl. The team totally reversed two consecutive seasons of disappointment by earning the fifth bowl appearance in school history.

DONOVAN

Offensive Coordinator•RBs 3rd year on Vanderbilt staff

Donovan's offense continues to be a huge hit at Vanderbilt, a team that struggled with production prior to the arrival of James Franklin and Donovan, Franklin's top assistant at Maryland.

In 2012, Donovan's offense was the most productive in modern-day Commodore history. The unit produced 390 points and 4,936 total yards, both figures that are unmatched on the

Vanderbilt campus since the 1910s.

Donovan's balanced attack resulted in three of the finest individual seasons ever by Vanderbilt players. Senior Zac Stacy became the most decorated running back in team history, setting career record with 3,143 rushing yards and 30 rushing TDs. Stacy

MORE ON DONOVAN

Donovan's offense, led by all-time rushing leader Zac Stacy, receiver Jordan Matthews and quarter-back Jordan Rodgers, averaged 39.8 points during the Commodores' six-game win streak to conclude the regular season. It also topped 40 points in five games, the most by a Vanderbilt squad since 1915.

also became the first Commodore to ever produce back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons. Wide receiver Jordan Matthews set a team single-season record with 1,323 receiving yards. His 94-reception total also ranks No. 2 all-time among Commodores. Quarterback Jordan Rodgers also produced a career season, passing for 2,539 yards and 15 touchdowns.

The offense also showed marked improvement in turnovers and third down efficiency.

Donovan also overlooks the play of Commodore running backs. Besides helping Stacy to the finest seasons ever by a Vanderbilt back, Donovan mentored Wesley Tate and Brian Kimbrow in 2012. They combined for 789 yards and 11 touchdowns.



SHOOP

Defensive Coordinator-Safeties 3rd year on Vanderbilt staff

Bob Shoop's second defense at Vanderbilt continued the same positive trends that begun in 2011 when the Commodore defense enjoyed stunning, across-the-board improvement.

The 2012 defense ranks among the NCAA's Top 20 in several key categories, including 14th in pass defense, 15th in scoring defense and

19th in total defense

The unit 18.6-point scoring defense has been bettered only once (18.5 ppg in 1997) in the last 30 years on campus. The team's pass defense that

allowed just 191.8 yards ranked third in the SEC, helping the Commodores to the conference's fifth best total defense (339.9 ypg).

Shoop's attacking squad performs well in third down situations. In 2012, the unit ranked fifth in the SEC – and 25th in the NCAA – in third down success. The 'Dores allowed just 18.2 first downs, fourth best in the SEC.

MORE ON SHOOP

Shoop's unit owns one of the most impressive defensive streaks in the nation. According to ESPN, the Commodores have not allowed a touchdown beyond 20 yards in 455 plays. The last time Vanderbilt gave up a touchdown beyond its red zone was against Florida in the sixth game of the season.

The pressuring unit also producing tackles for losses in bunches. The squad ranked second in the SEC last year with 97 tackles for loss.

Shoop's defense enjoyed widespread success with limited individual recognition. Cornerback Andre Hal was the only Commodore to garner All-SEC honors. He also mentored Vanderbilt's rapidly-developing safeties, Kenny Ladler and Javon Marshall. The duo shared the team lead with 60 total tackles each.



CHARLES BANKINS

Special Teams Coordinator•TEs 3rd year on Vanderbilt staff

Bankins continued his remarkable job of coaching Vanderbilt special teams during the 2012 season.

Behind the placekicking of Carey Spear and the punting of Richard Kent, the Commodores put together arguably the finest combined special teams effort in team history.

Spear was sensational, earning

All-SEC honors after setting school records with 20 field goals and 87 points scored by a kicker. He also ranked among the SEC's most accurate kickers, hitting 83.3 percent of his field goal attempts (20-of-24).

Kent wasn't outdone by Spear. The third-year starter averaged 44.9

yards, the fourth highest single-season average ever by a Commodore. His outstanding ability to directionally punt was extremely effective in limiting returns and pinning teams deep inside their 20-yard line.

Junior Jonathan Krause also made huge strides as a punt returner. His 11.2-yard average

MORE ON BANKINS

For the first time in team history, both of Vanderbilt's specialists from the 2012 season received All-Southeastern Conference recognition in the same season. Kicker Carey Spear was named Second Team All-SEC by Associated Press writers; punter Richard Kent earned Second Team All-SEC honors from the head coaches.

was the second highest by a Commodore in the 20 years. He also became the first Vanderbilt player since 1968 to register two punt returns for touchdowns in the same season.

Bankins also mentored a young and improving corps of tight ends. A pair of redshirt freshmen who developed nicely during the season, Steven Scheu and Kris Kentera, combined for 18 receptions and three TD catches.

Def. Recruiting Coordinator DBs 2nd vear on Vanderbilt staff

In his first season on the Vanderbilt staff, Barlow mentored the Commodore defensive backs into one of the Southeastern Conference's most productive units.

The defensive backs were part of a Vanderbilt defense that ranked among the NCAA's best in several pass defense categories. The Commodores

rank No. 14 in the NCAA - and third in the SEC - in pass defense, allowing just 191.8 yards.

Barlow also did a superb job helping to develop first-year starting cornerback Andre Hal. The junior was named second team All-SEC after contributing a pair of interceptions and 16 passes defended as a shutdown cover opposite Trey Wilson, who ended his career with the most touchdown returns off interceptions of any Commodore.

MORE ON BARLOW

Barlow continued the recent run of outstanding Vanderbilt cornerbacks. First-year starter Andre Hal turned plenty of heads, ranking second in the SEC in passes defended. Hal also became the fifth Commodore DB in the last six years to earn All-SEC recognition. Senior Trey Wilson put together another solid year, and established a new team all-time record by returning two interceptions for touchdowns, running his career total to four.

Barlow is the third highly respected former NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) defensive coordinator on Franklin's staff, joining Bob Shoop and Brent Pry.

Barlow came to Vanderbilt after three years at New Mexico. In 2011, Barlow began the season as New Mexico's defensive coordinator and concluded as interim head coach.

Prior to New Mexico, Barlow served a highly successful decade mentoring defenses at James Madison (Va.) University, one of the top teams in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

In his first year with the Commodores, Gattis mentored the most productive wide receiving tandem in team history.

Gattis, who joined the Commodores after a successful season at Western Michigan, helped develop the talents of Jordan Matthews and Chris Boyd. Combined, Matthews and Boyd put

together receiving statistics unmatched by any other Vanderbilt duo. The

Matthews-Boyd tandem totalled 144 catches and 2,097 receiving yards, 217 yards more than the next closest Commodore duo.

Matthews was superb, earnig First Team All-SEC and Third Team All-America honors by ranking among the NCAA's Top Ten receivers with 94 catches and 1,323 receiving yards. Boyd also enjoyed a sensational season with 50 catches and 774 receiving yards.

MORE ON GATTIS

In 2011-12, Gattis' pupils have enjoyed staggering success at the wide receiver position. In 2012, Jordan Matthews enjoyed arguably the greatest year ever by a Vanderbilt receiver - 94 catches, 1,323 yards, eight TDs. In 2011, Gattis' top WR at Western Michigan, Jordan White, posted staggering totals: 140 catches for 1,911 receiving yards and 17 TDs.

They also combined to catch 13 touchdown passes.

Gattis came to Vanderbilt after mentoring Western Michigan receiver Jordan White to a spectacular All-America campaign in 2011. White set virtually every WMU receiving record working under Gattis' guidance.



Run Game Coordinator/Off. Line 4th vear on Vanderbilt staff

Hand continues to get excellent production from an offensive line that has lacked ideal size and depth.

In 2012, Hand continued to use innovation to maximize the effectiveness of his offensive line. Hand's belief in preparing linemen for multiple positions proved highly

beneficial when several players contributed key roles late in the year after shifting from their original position.

After the 2012 season, Hand added the duties of run game coordinator. Hand's desire for versatility on the offensive front was on full display late in the season with the play of redshirt junior Wesley Johnson and senior Ryan Seymour. Johnson, recognized as an honorable mention All-SEC selection, played extremely well at right tackle after moving from


left tackle. Seymour, a three-year starting guard who also took limited snaps at center, moved into Johnson's vacant left tackle role and also performed at a high level.

Rodgers, the younger brother of Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers, prospered under Rahne's guidance.

One year after completing just 50 percent of his passes,

Caleb Azubike, and tackles Barren Dixon and Vince Taylor, enjoyed career seasons in 2012


under Spencer's guidance.


Lattimore scored the go-ahead TD on a 1-yard run with 11:25 to go.

but instead of a touchdown, the Commodores (0-2) had to settle for a tying 26-yard field goal by Carey Spear.




"This was a great win for us," Vanderbilt Head Coach James Franklin said. "We are 1-0 this week. We're undefeated in the 2012 season that started today."



Murray also scored on a 1-yard sneak as the Bulldogs raced to a 27-0 lead in the first half. He finished 18 of 24 for 250 yards.


But there was more to this offensive performance than another big night for the quarterback. A lot more.

offense after an early injury to quarterback James Franklin, who sprained his left knee on a first-quarter run and didn't return.



him on any of his TD runs.



Moseley overshot an open Sammie Coates on fourth-and-13 with 52 seconds remaining.



Vanderbilt made it look easy in the second half - specifically the third quarter. Within

five minutes, the Commodores leapt to a 49-0 lead thanks to four touchdowns, including an interception return and the team's first punt return for a score since 1999.



VANDERBILT BLANKS KENTUCKY; FIRST SEC SHUTOUT SINCE 1968

LEXINGTON, **Ky**. – Before Saturday, Vanderbilt hadn't shut out a Southeastern Conference opponent since 1968.

That streak was broken Saturday in a 40-0 road win against Kentucky in which the Commodores dominated on offense, defense and special teams.

Quarterback Jordan Rodgers completed 18 of 29 passes for 220



yards, two touchdowns and one interception, and three different Commodores running backs rushed for scores against the overmatched Kentucky defense.

Vanderbilt's 40-point victory margin was its largest over the Wildcats in 96 years.

In the teams' 85 meetings, only two of Vanderbilt's wins have been more lopsided: 45-0 in 1916, and 50-0 in 1897.

The Commodores (5-4, 3-3) scored touchdowns on four of their five first-half drives, and none of the scoring drives took more than 4 minutes, 19 seconds.

Rodgers led his team 71 yards on 11 plays begin the game, ending the drive with a 34-yard touchdown pass to Jordan Matthews. It was the fourth time this season has scored on its first drive of the game.

PLAY OF THE GAME

After a 16-play opening drive, Kentucky misses a 50-yard field goal. The Commodores force nine of the Wildcats final 11 drives to five plays or less, including three three and outs.

KEY STATISTIC

The shutout was the first SEC shutout for Vanderbilt since blanking Kentucky 6-0 in 1968.







It ended a thrilling comeback for the Commodores (6-4, 3-3 SEC), who trailed 23-6 early in the third quarter but rallied for their fourth straight victory.

Now the postseason is in Vanderbilt's

future - again. The Commodores are poised to go to their second straight bowl game for the first time in school history.

Second-year coach James Franklin has engineered the guick turnaround, turning Vanderbilt into an SEC threat nearly overnight.


"I'm looking forward to the day when I don't have to say first ever, because we want this to be the culture at Vanderbilt. A culture of winning," Franklin said. "Our coaches and players believe it."

PLAY OF THE GAME

Jordan Rodgers found a wide open Chris Boyd down the sideline for 26 yards and the game-winning touchdown on the Commodores' final drive of the night.

KEY STATISTIC

The Vanderbilt defense kept the Commodores in the game by forcing Ole Miss to kick four field goals and limiting the Rebels' rushing attack to only 55 yards on 40 carries.

COMMODORES HAMMER VOLS FOR FIFTH CONFERENCE VICTORY

NASHVILLE - The Vanderbilt Commodores ended years of frustration at the hands of their in-state rival Tennessee with one of their best victories in decades.

Making their celebration even sweeter?

The Commodores also ensured Tennessee's third straight losing season, putting Volunteers' coach Derek Dooley's job status in further jeopardy.

GAME 11 Nov. 17, 2012 Nashville

Andre Hal intercepted two passes and Jordan Rodgers threw for two touchdowns as Vanderbilt routed Tennessee 41-18 Saturday night for the Commodores' fifth straight victory, clinching their first winning record in the regular season since 1982.

In-state rival Tennessee had won 34 of the past 35 games in this series coming into this game. The Commodores (7-4, 5-3 SEC) also snapped a 14-game skid against Tennessee at home with their first win in Nashville since 1982 and the most points they've scored against the Vols since a 51-7 win in 1923.


"This is what we all envisioned when we came here, that we could build something special here at Vanderbilt right here in Nashville. We are Nashville's team," Franklin said.

PLAY OF THE GAME

Jordan Matthews' first career rushing touchdown opened the scoring in the second half and was the beginning of a 21-point third quarter for the Commodores. Matthews took the ball 47 yards on a reverse for the score.

KEY STATISTIC

The Vanderbilt defense shuts down an explosive Tennessee offense, holding the Vols to 303 total yards including just 154 passing. UT entered the game averaging over 330 yards per game in the air.



the end zone for a touchdown and also returning a punt 83 yards for a score.


Stacy eclipsed 1,000 yards rushing for the second straight season and added to his career school record of 3,036 yards rushing, receiver Jordan Matthews set a single-season record with 1,262 yards receiving, and kicker Carey Spear hit a pair of field goals from beyond 50 yards and added seven extra points to finish with a school record 81 points.

PLAY OF THE GAME

COMMODORES NOTCH NINTH WIN; DEFEAT N.C. STATE IN BOWL 38-24

NASHVILLE – Vanderbilt is winning like the Commodores haven't in nearly a century. After capturing the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Head Coach James Franklin says everyone better get used to it.

Jordan Rodgers threw two touchdown passes and ran for another score as the Commodores capped their best season since 1915

GAME 13 Dec. 31, 2012 Nashville by defeating North Carolina State 38-24 in Nashville's LP Field.

"We're not going anywhere," a smiling and teary Franklin said. The Commodores finished 9-4 for their best record since going 9-1 in 1915. It marks only the third time the small-

est and only private university in the SEC has won as many as nine games in a season.

Vandy closed the season with seven straight wins for its longest streak since an eight-game run in 1948.

Senior Zac Stacy earned the bowl's MVP honors with 108 rushing yards and one touchdowns.

PLAY OF THE GAME

Two plays after safety Eric Samuels' interception of Mike Glennon just before halftime, Jordan Rodgers and Jordan Matthews connected on an 18-yard touchdown pass to give Vanderbilt a 28-14 lead going into intermission. The score was the eventual deciding points.

KEY STATISTIC

The Commodores forced five N.C. State turnovers – three interceptions and two fumbles – while committing zero turnovers. Vanderbilt scored 17 points following the turnovers.




