GAMEDAY MEDIA PARKING

Media parking will be located in Kensington Garage next to Memorial Gym. Please access the garage entrance off 25th Avenue. All media representatives must have a proper credential to access parking garage.

PRESS BOX ACCESS

Media must wear "**MEDIA**" or "**PHOTO**" credentials to gain access to the press box. The field elevator is located near Gate 1. Seating charts are posted.

IN-GAME FIELD ACCESS

Field access is restricted to working photojournalists from kickoff until 5:00 remaining in the game. All photographers also must wear a "**PHOTO**" armband.

WIRELESS IN PRESS BOX

The press box is equipped with wireless internet access for the working press. Working photographers should transmit in the press box transmit. **TV production crews should order phone lines in advance. To order, call (615) 343-2012.**

COACH FRANKLIN'S POSTGAME REMARKS

Coach Franklin's post-game press conference is held after he addresses the team. **Only properly credentialed media will be allowed into the conference.**

Media wishing to participate in postgame interviews can meet at the elevator with 5:00 left to be escorted to Dudley Field.

The location in Vanderbilt Stadium for Franklin's postgame press conference and Vanderbilt student-athlete interviews is next to the Commodore locker room. Access the conference room is available in the south end zone field tunnel.

VANDERBILT PLAYER POSTGAME AVAILABILITY

The Vanderbilt Locker Room is closed. Up to five players will be made available for post-game interviews. These interviews will be conducted in the same room as Coach Franklin's remarks. The players will enter when the head coach concludes.

During home games, the visiting team interview room also is located off the south end zone of the stadium. The entrance is located in the end zone tunnel.

Joe Fisher, John Gromos and Mitchell Light provide concise and insightful Commodore coverage on the Vanderbilt Radio Network.

A Nashville native, Fisher enters his 16th season as the team's play-by-play announcer. He handles similar duties for Vanderbilt men's basketball and baseball. Fisher also serves as Vanderbilt Athletics' Director of Broadcasting.

Prior to joining Vanderbilt, Fisher was a television sports anchor in the Nashville market from 1987-96, with stints at WSMV-4 and WKRN-2. He also worked in public relations.

Gromos enters his 10th season as analyst. A former Vanderbilt quarterback, he ranks among the team's all-time Top 15 in passing yardage.

Gromos serves as Manager of Business Development for Turner Universal. He earned a degree in engineering from Vanderbilt in 1990.

Light enters his first full season providing sideline commentary. He replaced Kevin Ingram midway through the 2012 season. Light is a Vanderbilt graduate and editor of Athlon Sports publications.

Bob Horner has served as producer/engineer for more than two decades.

DIRECTIONS TO STADIUM

ARRIVING FROM SOUTH OF NASHVILLE

Take I-65 North to I-40 West to Exit 209A (Broadway-West End). Turn left to go west on Broadway. When Broadway splits, stay to the right to enter West End Ave. Take West End past the University on the left and turn left on 25th Avenue. The entrance into Kensington Garage is located just one block on right, just before Memorial Gym.

ARRIVING FROM NORTH OF NASHVILLE

Take I-65 South into downtown and take Exit 209B (Broadway-West End). Turn right on Broadway. When Broadway splits, stay to the right to enter West End Avenue. Take West End past the University on the left, turn left on 25th Avenue. Access into Kensington Garage is a block on right just before Memorial Gym.

ARRIVING FROM EAST OF NASHVILLE

Take I-40 West/I-65 North downtown to Exit 209A (Broadway-West End). Turn left at light to go west on Broadway. When Broadway splits, stay to the right to enter West End Ave. Take West End past the University on the left and turn left on 25th Avenue. The garage access is one block on right, just before Memorial Gym.

ARRIVING FROM WEST OF NASHVILLE

Take I-40 East to I-440 East. Take the first exit (Murphy Road-West End) and turn left at redlight. In .25 mile, turn left onto West End. The campus will be on your right. Turn right on 25th Avenue (one block past Wendy's). Kensington Garage access is one block on right, just before Memorial Gym.

ARRIVING FROM CHATTANOOGA/ATLANTA

Take I-24 West to I-440 West. Take Exit 1 (West End Avenue). Stay right off the exit onto West End. The Vanderbilt campus will be on your right. Turn right on 25th Avenue (one block past Wendy's). Kensington Garage access is one block on right, just before Memorial Gym.

STADIUM UPGRADES IN PLACE; MORE IMPROVEMENTS STUDIED

Several substantial improvements were finished at Vanderbilt Stadium just before the 2012 season opener. Many additional enhancements, potentially significant in nature, could be coming in the near future.

The gameday experience in Vanderbilt's 30-year-old, on-campus venue were substantially improved last year with the construction of a hillside berm next to the north end zone. Behind the berm, officials installed a new video board that more than doubled the size of the stadium's former Jumbotron.

Dudley Field in Vanderbilt Stadium, playing surface for Commodore football since 1922, returned to a synthetic surface for the first time in more than decade when the university decided to add cushioned Shaw Sportexe turf. The new surface drew rave reviews from Commodore players, who also benefited with the final enhancement – a new stadium lighting system.

The hillside berm, that accommodates 400 general admission ticket holders, brings total stadium capacity to 40,330.

The work last year adds to other major recent improvements. A thorough exterior renovation was completed in 2008-09, including new plazas and entrances at Gates 2 & 3 and an exterior paint and brick effort to unify Vanderbilt Stadium and the program's two other biggest sporting venues, Hawkins Field and Memorial Gym.

Plans for a future renovation have not been announced, but Vanderbilt administrators have journeyed to campuses across the nation to examine other stadium projects.
