








# **LEAGUE WITHOUT PEER**










- Since 2006, the SEC has posted a 10-4 record in BCS bowl games, more wins and a higher winning percentage (.750) than any other conference.
- SEC teams were 54-11 (.831) in non-league play last year, the highest percentage among FBS conferences.
- Four of the last six Heisman Trophy winners have come from SEC schools. In recent years, top SEC players have walked away with virtually every other significant postseason award.

















### THE COMMODORES ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

Vanderbilt is again part of the Southeastern Conference's unmatched national TV package.

On Aug. 29, the Commodores will participate in the opening night of ESPN's 2013 coverage with a primetime home game against Ole Miss.

Every Commodore game is available on television due to national contracts between the SEC and CBS Sports and ESPN, and regional packages with Comcast Sports Southeast and FOX.

Vanderbilt's conference victories last year over Ole Miss and Kentucky were among four Commodore games aired on the SEC Network.





Annually, SEC games on CBS and ESPN channels are among the most watched on the college schedule. Vanderbilt games also bring outstanding audiences. In 2011, a Vanderbilt game was ESPNU's highest rated primetime college football game of the year.









# FRANKLIN'S THIRD YEAR: CONTINUED IMPROVEMENT

The Vanderbilt Commodores return 17 starters and 41 letterwinners for the 2013 season. The returnees include eight starters and 18 letterwinners on offense, seven starters and 21 letterwinners on defense, and two of three specialists.

Vanderbilt looks to improve off a 2012 campaign that featured second-year Head Coach James Franklin guiding the Commodores to a 9-4 overall record capped by a 38-24 victory over N.C. State in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl. The squad tied a school record for both single-season wins and SEC victories en route to securing a Top 25 final ranking and the first back-to-back postseason bowl appearances in program history. Offensively, the 2012 Commodores produced more points than any Vanderbilt squad since 1916. On defense, the Commodores ranked among the NCAA Top 20 in numerous categories and limited opponents to the lowest scoring average in more than a decade. Special teams also ranked among the nation's best, with placekicker **Carey Spear** and punter Richard Kent earning All-SEC honors.

The Commodore offense, which averaged 40.1 more yards in 2012 than the previous year, features the veteran wide receiver tandem of **Jordan Matthews** and **Chris Boyd**, who amassed 2,097 receiving yards and 13 touchdowns in 2012. Three backs with productive resumes – **Wesley Tate, Brian Kimbrow** and **Jerron Seymour** – will step in to fill the void left by two-time All-SEC recipient Zac Stacy. Senior **Austyn Carta-Samuels**, a two-year starter in the Mountain West Conference prior to transferring to Vanderbilt, is pushing to replace Jordan Rodgers at quarterback. The offensive line features

four returning starters, including All-SEC candidate  $\boldsymbol{Wesley\ Johnson}.$ 

The defense returns six of its top seven tacklers from last year. The secondary is loaded with talented veterans, including cornerback **Andre Hal** and safeties **Kenny Ladler** and **Javon Marshall**. The linebackers are paced by returning seniors **Chase Garnham** and **Karl**


Butler. Ends Walker May, Kyle Woestmann and Caleb Azubike are key returnees on the defensive front.

For the second straight year – and third time in seven seasons, Vanderbilt kicks off ESPN's coverage of FBS college football when

the Commodores host Ole Miss on Thursday, Aug. 29.

The schedule has Vanderbilt making mid-September road trips to South Carolina and UMass sandwiched around home games against Ole Miss, Austin Peay, UAB, Missouri and Georgia. The slate also includes back-to-back SEC road games at Texas A&M and Florida. In late November, the Commodores play Kentucky at home and Tennessee on the road before hosting Wake Forest in the season finale.

# **OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD**

### **STARTERS BACK: 1 LETTERWINNERS: 6**

Despite the graduation of two-time All-Southeastern Conference running back **Zac Stacy** and two-year starting quarterback **Jordan Rodgers**, the Commodores have several talented players ready to step forward in the offensive backfield.

At quarterback, four prospects topped by redshirt senior **Austyn Carta-Samuels** will enter preseason camp competing for the starting role in Vanderbilt's opener against Ole Miss. Likewise, at least four contenders are hoping to secure the tailback vacancy left by Stacy's departure.

Though Carta-Samuels has started just one game at Vanderbilt, he was a two-year starter at Wyoming, guided the Cowboys to a bowl win and was the 2010 Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year. He came out of spring drills with an edge over his competition, giving the offense a strong-armed veteran at the quarterback role.

Redshirt sophomore **Josh Grady**, redshirt freshman **Patton Robinette** and true freshman **Johnny McCrary** are expected to provide strong competition for Carta-Samuels.

Grady is a dual-threat prospect who moved to quarterback in Spring Practice after participating as a wide receiver last year. Robinette showed mobility, thorough knowledge of the offense, and an accurate arm during the spring. McCrary displayed plenty of athleticism and arm strength throughout spring practice.

The tailback role looks to be a competition between redshirt senior **Wesley Tate**, sophomore **Brian Kimbrow** and redshirt sophomore **Jerron Seymour**.

Redshirt sophomore **Derek King** and two freshmen, **Ralph Webb** and **C.J. Duncan**, also are candidates.

Tate and Kimbrow combined for 789 rushing yards and 11 TDs last year in support of Stacy. They bring different skills to the position: Tate bringing power to the attack, Kimbrow offering more quickness and big-play abilities.

Senior Fitz Lassing returns as the starter when the Commodores add a fullback to the mix. He has competition from redshirt junior Blake Gowder among others.

Three walk-on prospects –

Hasan Clayton, Will Fritz and

Joseph Hoffman – complete the running back corps.



# RECEIVING CORPS

### **STARTERS BACK: 4 LETTERWINNERS: 8**

The Commodores return arguably their impressive receiver corps in program history, paced by the Southeastern Conference's most potent duos at wide receiver.

Second-year coach **Josh Gattis** returns the team's top three wideouts for a second straight year. Tight ends mentor **Charles Bankins** also has multiple letterwinners back. Both coaches have newcomers on the roster ready to make their case for playing roles.

Leading the Commodore returnees at wide receiver are senior **Jordan Matthews**, a preseason Biletnikoff Award candidate and consensus All-SEC pick, and redshirt junior **Chris Boyd**. Together, the Matthews-Boyd tandem has combined for 231 catches, 3,537 receiving yards and 31 touchdowns. They were the SEC's No. 1 duo last year, setting a team record with 2,097 combined receiving yards.

Matthews is on pace to challenge several SEC career records. Remarkably, Boyd is ahead of Matthews' pace through two years.

Vanderbilt also returns a third multiple-year starter at wide receiver in senior **Jonathan Krause**. The team's top punt returner, Krause has 56 career receptions. Redshirt junior **Trent Pruitt** could easily play their way into roles this fall.

The staff also signed five talented wide receivers last February: Carlos Burse, Jordan Cunningham, Gerald Perry, Latevius Rayford and DeAndre Woods.

Along with the abundance of outside receiving threats, offensive coaches expect to see more production this season from a young corps of tight ends. A pair of redshirt sophomores Steven Scheu and Kris Kentera, were becoming aerial targets as the 2012 campaign closed. Scheu, like junior Dillon van der Wal, is more of a classic tight end, possessing the physical frame to effectively block SEC ends and linebackers. Kentera, a converted quarterback who has packed on nearly 30 pounds since arriving on campus, might be the team's most versatile receiving option over the middle.



# OFFENSIVE LINE

### **STARTERS BACK: 5 LETTERWINNERS: 6**

The Commodores return an offensive line that features six veterans with starting experience and a corps of talented redshirt freshmen eager to begin their collegiate careers.

In 2012, Herb Hand's line helped Vanderbilt produce its most potent offense of the modern era. The unit's 30.0-point scoring average is the highest single-season average since the mid-1910s. The 379.7-yard total offense average was 40 yards more than the previous year, and the fourth highest by a Commodore offense since the 1940s. Holes opened by the line also helped senior **Zac**

Stacy become the first Commodore running back to post back-toback 1,000-yard rushing seasons and set new team career standards with 3,143 yards and 30 rushing touchdowns.

Anchoring the line is versatile All-SEC candidate and 2012 co-captain **Wesley Johnson**, who enters his fifth year with 38 career starts at four different line positions. He projects as the team's starting left tackle. In 2012, Johnson didn't allow a single

quarterback sack while starting at both left and right tackle.

Redshirt junior **Andrew Bridges**, who spent the offseason adding bulk, is back to compete for the tackle role across from Johnson.

The staff will need to replace two starting guards that graduated, Seattle draftee Ryan Seymour and Josh Jelesky.

Two juniors, **Spencer Pulley** and **Joe Townsend**, and redshirt sophomore **Jake Bernstein** were effective interior starters in 2012. Pulley and Townsend both started at center while Bernstein impressed as a physical presence while starting multiple games at both guard positions.

Redshirt junior **Chase White** adds quality depth, with game experience at guard and tackle. Senior **Ryan Brockway** also provides depth at guard.


At the conclusion of spring drills, redshirt freshmen **Barrett Gouger** and **Andrew Jelks** were contending for starting roles at guard and tackle, respectively. Both are big, talented prospects who should contribute this season.

Three other redshirt freshmen – Blake Fromang, Will Holden and Kevin McCoy – bring more potential to the corps.

The team's signing class also includes highly regarded prospects **Delando Crooks** and **Sean Dowling**.

# **DEFENSIVE LINE**

### STARTERS BACK: 2 LETTERWINNERS: 8

The Vanderbilt defensive line returns with six proven performers and numerous young Commodores just waiting for an opportunity to state their case for playing time.

Third-year coach **Sean Spencer** will mentor a unit that could qualify as Vanderbilt's most athletic defensive line corps in recent years. Spencer also expects to see more size and bulk at all four positions.

Three valuable contributors from a year ago – tackles Rob Lohr and Colt Nichter and end Johnell Thomas – have graduated, but those likely to fill their roles are quality players who enjoyed success with the Commodores in 2012.

Three upperclassmen tipping the scale at more than 300 pounds – senior **Jared Morse**, redshirt junior **Vince Taylor** and junior **Barron Dixon** – are expected to be in Spencer's tackle rotation. They will compete with at least four talented newcomers during preseason camp.

Morse is back for his final season after contributing nine tackles for loss and a pair of sacks among 24 tackles. Taylor might have been the team's most improved down lineman during spring drills, showing superb quickness and strength. Dixon is coming off his best year, having registered 22 tackles in 2012.

The newcomers at tackle include three intriguing redshirt freshmen – **Adam Butler**, **Ladarius Banks** and **Torey Agee** – and 2013 signee Jay Woods. Butler and Agee showed promise in Spring Ball after moving from offensive guard and defensive end, respectively.



The Commodore defensive end position appears deeper than it

has been in years, with senior and 2012 captain **Walker May**, junior **Kyle Woestmann** and sophomore **Caleb Azubike** leading the unit. Collectively, May, Woestmann and Azubike totalled 13 quarterback sacks and 22.5 tackles for loss in 2012. All three enter the season off a superb summer conditioning program.

Two redshirt sophomores, **Darien Bryant** and **Jimmy Stewart**, bring speed and depth to the position. Another potential playmaker at end is redshirt freshman **Stephen Weatherly**, a rush end who continuously impressed coaches throughout the spring. The 'Dores also signed three more quality prospects: **Landon Stokes**, **Mack Weaver** and **Jonathan Wynn**.





# LINEBACKER CORPS

### **STARTERS BACK: 2 LETTERWINNERS: 7**

Two veteran starters and five other letterwinners from a year ago headline Vanderbilt's linebacking corps.

The returning starters, seniors **Chase Garnham** and **Karl Butler**, are joined by a bevy of talented young prospects ready to step into increased roles for third-year coach **Brent Pry**.

Garnham has earned a reputation for making big plays as an outside linebacker in 2011 and middle linebacker last year. It's a short list of returning Southeastern Conference linebackers that can match Garnham's 2012 stats of 84 total tackles, seven sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss.

Butler came into his own as a first-year starter at outside linebacker in 2012. Arguably the team's most athletic linebacker, Butler contributed 51 total tackles and was extremely productive in passing situations.

Garnham and Butler also bring excellent leadership to the corps that only loses one key contributor to graduation, **Archibald Barnes**.

The staff has big plans for sophomores **Darreon Herring** and **Jake Sealand**. Both earned valuable roles as true freshmen in 2012, and exited spring drills in the mix for expanding roles and potential starting jobs.

Herring, projected as an outside linebacker, and Sealand, a classic inside linebacker, were big hitters last year. Herring had 33 tackles, forced two fumbles, and showed solid skills as a pass defender. Sealand posted

24 tackles, a forced fumble and frequently applied pressure on opposing quarterbacks.

Redshirt sophomore Larry Franklin, who played in the two-deep last year with Herring and Sealand, and junior Kellen Williams should see plenty of action.

Junior Casey Hughes and redshirt freshman Ja'karri Thomas will provide added depth at outside linebacker. Another redshirt freshman, Harding Harper, could get plenty of attention at the inside position.

A pair of walk-ons, senior

Patrick Sutton and junior Hunter

Bowman also will get snaps during preseason camp.

The Commodores added three impressive 2013 signees to the corps: Nigel Bowden, Oren Burks and Zach Cunningham.

Hal, Ladler and Marshall are proven starters for the Commodores, and among the Southeastern Conference's most productive secondary performers from a year ago. Clarke, a three-year letterwinner, is ready to step in at cornerback.

# **DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD**

### STARTERS BACK: 3 LETTERWINNERS: 7

The defensive secondary should be a strength of the squad this fall, with the Commodores returning three quality starters and several newcomers that impressed during spring drills.

Leading the corps is senior **Andre Hal**, regarded by many as one of the nation's top cornerbacks, and a pair of starters covering the deep middle of the field, free safety **Kenny Ladler** and strong safety **Javon Marshall**.

They are supported by three-year letterwinner **Steve Clarke** and a pair of promising redshirt freshmen cornerbacks — **Paris Head** and **Torren McGlaster** — and the top two reserve safeties from a year ago, redshirt sophomores **Jahmel McIntosh** and **Andrew Williamson**.

The Commodores must replace two-year starting corner **Trey Wilson**, who earned a reputation of creating touchdowns on defense. Wilson set a new team record with four interception returns for scores.

Hal's ability to cover and reaction in passing situations was on full display in 2012, when he deflected 14 passes and picked off two others. The preseason Thorpe Award candidate possesses the tools to run with top SEC receivers and play physical in man-to-man coverage.

In Ladler and Marshall, Vanderbilt returns the SEC's active leading tacklers from the safety position. Both possess years of experience in the

### **STARTERS BACK: 4 LETTERWINNERS: 10**

The Commodores return some of the SEC's top special teams' performers in all-conference placekicker **Carey Spear**. They also have to replace one of the league's best in graduated punter Richard Kent.

Spear, two-year snapping specialist Andrew East, and top returners Jonathan Krause, Brian Kimbrow and Andre Hal are among the key players back for the Commodores.

In 2012, Vanderbilt enjoyed arguably its finest season in special teams, getting superb play in virtually every area.

Spear is a preseason Lou Groza Award candidate coming off the best year ever achieved by a Vanderbilt kicker. Spear's 20 field goals set a new team record and his 83.3 percent accuracy is the highest by a 'Dore kicker since 1974.

Coordinator Charles Bankins must replace graduated punter

**Richard Kent**, a three-year starter who was among the nation's best last year with a 44.9-yard average.

The punting competition appears wide open, with four prime candidates: Spear, junior walk-on **Taylor Hudson**, redshirt freshman **Colby Cooke** and 2013 signee **Tommy Openshaw**.

East is expected to handle all of the team's snapping for a third straight season. East will be backed by junior **Connor Morrison** among others.

The Commodores' top kick returners are Hal and Kimbrow. Hal has a career average of 23.4 yards, including one return for a touchdown in 2011. Kimbrow showed plenty of talent in 2012, averaging 22.1 yards on 22 returns. Senior **Steven Clarke** ranks as another potential kickoff returner.

Krause is back as one of the SEC's top punt returners. In 2012, Krause averaged 11.2 yards and became the first 'Dore since 1968 to take two punts for touchdowns. Others with punt return experience are **Jordan Matthews** and **Trent Pruitt**.
