

THREE STRAIGHT BOWL APPEARANCES

The Vanderbilt football team continued to achieve in 2013. The Commodores reached nine wins in consecutive seasons for the first time in team history. The squad defeated SEC East rivals Florida, Georgia and Tennessee for the first time ever in the same season, won a second straight bowl, and earned a Top 25 postseason ranking in the Associated Press and coaches for the second consecutive year.

Simin Feng (left) and Hunter Stewart led their respective teams to the 2014 NCAA Championships. Feng captured medalist honors at the SEC Championships by a stunning eight-stroke margin and went on to earn All-America recognition. In his eighth NFL year, Cutler teamed with Chicago receivers Brandon Marshall and Alshon Jeffery to create one of the league's most potent passing attacks. Cutler's 89.2 QB rating last year was the highest of his career. The former SEC Offensive Player of the Year enters 2014 with 155 career touchdown passes and nearly 25,000 career passing yards.

The list of former Commodores includes nine offensive players, eight defensive standouts and a placekicker.

Three pro teams – the Buffalo Bills, Green Bay Packers and Philadelphia Eagles – have multiple former Commodores on their preseason rosters.

Two former 'Dore offensive linemen, **Chris Williams** and **Thomas Welch**, signed free agent deals with new teams: Williams with Buffalo and Welch with New Orleans.

Three seniors off the 2013 squad were selected in the 2014 NFL Draft. All-America wide receiver **Jordan Matthews** was picked in the second round by Philadelphia, All-SEC offensive tackle **Wesley Johnson** was

taken in the fifth round by Pittsburgh and all-conference cornerback **Andre Hal** was a seventh round pick of the Texans.



ZAC STACY

Vanderbilt's all-time leading rusher was a rookie sensation for St. Louis. Stacy became the Rams' most productive offensive weapon during the 2013 season, rushing for 973 yards and seven touchdowns. Stacy ranked second among all NFL rookies in rushing yards.


FORMER 'DORES IN PACKERS' SECONDARY

PRO DAY HELPS FOUR SENIORS GET ROOKIE NFL DEALS

In the last three years, a dozen 'Dore senior who did not attend the NFL Combine have used Vanderbilt's Pro Day as their avenue into pro football.

The on-campus activity comes in mid-March as NFL teams are evaluating draft-eligible prospects.

In 2014, four former Commodores used the activity held for the first time in the team's Indoor Practice Facility to earn rookie free agent deals. They were outside linebacker **Walker May**, Atlanta; wide receiver **Jonathan Krause**, Cleveland; cornerback **Steven Clarke**, Miami; and kicker **Carey Spear**, Philadelphia.

Wesley Johnson was one of four Commodores that participated in the NFL Combine. He was joined by Andre Hal, Kenny Ladler and Jordan Matthews.

COMMODORES IMPRESS WITH COMBINE RESULTS

All four Commodore seniors participating the 2014 NFL Combine – Jordan Matthews, Andre Hal, Wesley Johnson and Kenny Ladler – get plenty to earn the attention of pro scouts in attendance.

Nearly three months later, Matthews, Johnson and Hal were drafted while Ladler became a coveted rookie free agent. After erasing concerns about speed with a 4.46 40-yard dash, Matthews went on to do 21 reps of the 225-lb. bench press and post a 35.5-inch vertical jump.

Ladler was among the top safeties in three competitions, including a 36.5-inch vertical, while Hal responded with a sub-4.5 40 and excellent agility tests. Johnson ranked among the top linemen in the broad jump and 3-cone drill.



BUSY HAL

Cornerback Andre Hal stayed busy prior to getting drafted by the Texans. After playing in the East-West Shrine Bowl, Hal performed well at the NFL Combine, then returned to campus to train with Commodore teammates for Pro Day where he completed position drills.

TEAM FACILITIES



ON-CAMPUS INDOOR FACILITY

Inclement weather should not hinder Derek Mason's Commodores in the future. The team will have access to a new indoor practice facility that opened last November. The venue, located near the team's outdoor practice complex, features a regulation-size football field, synthetic surface, video board and video systems.

FIRST FULL SEASON WITH INDOOR PRACTICE VENUE



CORRIDOR DECOR The Corridor of Captains near the team's player locker room has undergone a thorough redesign. It highlights academic achievers, All-America and All-SEC recipients, the program's coaching legacy, bowl

appearances and all-time Commodores in the NFL.

Foul weather should not affect the Commodores' preparations, thanks to an indoor facility that opened close to the Vanderbilt football offices and locker rooms last November.

The \$31 million project includes a regulationlength football field, synthetic turf similar to the stadium playing surface, an array of modern video technologies, along with a 300-meter track.

The expansive indoor facility is one of several improvements that have produced positive impacts to the Vanderbilt football team. In the last two years, the program has witnessed the addition of a 140-seat team auditorium and position meeting rooms, revitalization of the players' locker room, and cushioned Shaw Sportexe synthetic turf in the stadium field.

A thorough redesign of the Corridor of Captains, football weight room and coaches' offices, should be complete this summer.

STUDENT-ATHLETES ACADEMIC SUCCESSES

During the 2013-14 school year, thirty-five members of Vanderbilt football team received Dean's List recognition from the university.

Commodore student-athletes are aided by a full-time staff of 11 highly qualified advisors and counselors in the Stratton Foster Academic Center.

Four academic advisors - Eugene Henderson, Max-Maurice Martin, Ashley Vogl and academic support director Elizabeth Wright - devote their energies to helping football student-athletes fulfill their academic obligations with discipline, perseverance, and integrity.

The bi-level Stratton Foster complex in McGugin Athletics Center was thoroughly renovated in 2011. It serves as a resource center to meet with a tutor or academic advisor, use a computer, or to study and read during spare moments.

VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY



ELITE ACADEMICS; SCENIC URBAN FEEL

Located in the popular Midtown district of Nashville, Vanderbilt is regarded among the nation's finest universities. The private research university enrolled 6,875 undergraduate and 5,960 postgraduate students last year. Those students came from every state and around the globe.

The university was founded 141 years ago when magnate Cornelius "Commodore" Vanderbilt provided an initial endowment.

Vanderbilt is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference, and is the only private school among its 14-member universities.

Vanderbilt is considered among the top universities in America. In its popular annual "Best Colleges" edition, *U.S. News & World Report* most recently ranked Vanderbilt No. 17 among all national universities and No. 2 among schools located in the Southeast.

The campus is just southwest of downtown Nashville on 330 pristine acres that are designated as a national arboretum. Two areas of campus closed to vehicles – the Peabody campus and the collection of academic buildings surrounding Kirkland Hall that form the original campus – are frequently named among the South's most beautiful college environments.

Though located within walking distance of downtown activities, the quality of Vanderbilt life is reflected in much smaller, less public ways – attending an athletic event, grabbing a late-night snack with friends, or having dinner at a professor's home.


Most Vanderbilt undergraduates live on campus during their time at the university. THE SEC: WITHOUT PEER





Vanderbilt is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference. During the last decade, Vanderbilt has shared in the league's unparalleled success. With the SEC Network coming this August, the conference's competitiveness promises to capture even more of the nation's college football attention.

• Incredibly, SEC football teams won seven of the last eight national titles, and nine of the 16 championships, during the BCS Era (1998-2013). The SEC also captured seven more BCS titles than any other conference.

• From 2006-13, more than half of the slots in the BCS Championship Game were taken by SEC teams (10 of 18).

• SEC teams were 54-12 (.818) in non-league play last year. Vanderbilt was 5-0 in non-league play.



• Since 2006, the SEC has accrued more bowl wins (49) than any other conference. Vanderbilt is 3-1 in postseason appearances during the span.



• On the opening weekend of NFL play in 2013, an all-time high 340 former SEC players were on active rosters. That's more than any other conference. Ten of those players were former Vanderbilt standouts.

• In the 2014 NFL Draft, 49 former SEC players were selected, including the No. 1 and No. 2 overall picks. It was the most of any conference.

• For the second straight year, the SEC tied a record with 11 first round picks in the 2014 Draft. Two former Vanderbilt standouts, **Jay Cutler** and **Chris Williams**, have been selected in the first round since 2006.







The Commodores on National Television

Vanderbilt is part of the Southeastern Conference's unmatched television package that promises to expand this season with the unveiling of the SEC Network.

On Thursday, Aug. 28, the Commodores will help christen SEC Network's initial season with a primetime home game against Temple.

The SEC Network promises to widen the league's footprint across America. The Network will air three SEC games each Saturday, along with producing a live "SEC Nation" morning show that will feature Joe Tessitore, Tim Tebow and Paul Finebaum among others.

Every Vanderbilt game is available on television due to national contracts between the SEC, ESPN and CBS Sports, and a regional package with FOX.





In 2013, Vanderbilt's dramatic win over Georgia was the Commodores' first national appearance on CBS in 12 years. The 'Dores also faced Ole Miss, South Carolina and Tennessee in national primetime games.

The Vanderbilt-Ole Miss game on Saturday, Sept. 6, will be aired on ESPN. The "SEC Nation" show also will broadcast that morning from Nashville's LP Field.
