MASON'S GOALS: TOUGH, SMART, RELENTNESS

Derek Mason will welcome a young yet experienced Commodore squad when he starts his second season on the Vanderbilt campus.

Twenty-two players who started at least five games in 2014 and 50 letterwinners will greet Mason when preseason camp opens in early August. The returnees include nine position starters and 23 letterwinners on offense, 11 starters and 24 letterwinners on defense, and two of three starting specialists.

Mason made excellent use of the offseason, luring two of the nation's top coaches – offensive coordinator **Andy Ludwig** from Wisconsin and head strength coach **James Dobson** from Nebraska – to Nashville. Mason, regarded among the nation's top defensive minds, also decided to coordinate the Commodore defense himself. Lastly, Mason attracted impressive young coaches **Cortez Hankton** and **Marc Mariotti** to mentor wide receivers and safeties, respectively.

Mason expects the 2015 Commodores to be more competitive and physical, and play smart, efficient football.

"We want to compete relentlessly for 60 minutes, play with toughness, and be an intelligent team on both sides of the ball," Mason said.

The offense features nine starters of at least five games from a year ago: quarterback Johnny McCrary, tailback Ralph Webb, tight end Steven Scheu, wide receivers C.J. Duncan and Latevius Rayford, and linemen Spencer Pulley, Jake Bernstein, Andrew Jelks and Will Holden.

The defense also includes 11 starters back from 2014: linemen Caleb Azubike and Adam Butler, linebackers Nigel Bowden, Zach Cunningham, Darreon Herring and Stephen Weatherly, safeties Oren Burks, Jahmel McIntosh and Andrew Williamson, and cornerbacks Torren McGaster and Taurean Ferguson. Kick returner Darrius Sims, kicker Tommy Openshaw and punter Colby Cooke are the team's top returning specialists.

The Vanderbilt staff also is excited to see the continued development of several highly regarded young contributors.

For the third straight year, Vanderbilt kicks off with a Thursday night matchup, hosting Western Kentucky on Sept. 3 on the SEC Network.

games on campus. On Sept. 12, Vanderbilt and Georgia square off in front of a CBS national audience at 2:30 p.m. CT. The Commodores also host Austin Peay on Sept. 19. After consecutive road games at Ole Miss, Middle Tennessee and South Carolina, the Commodores return to campus hosting Missouri on Oct. 24. The team's final two home appearances are against Kentucky on Nov. 14 and Texas A&M on Nov. 21.

OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

Starters back: 3 Letterwinners: 4

New offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig used Spring Drills to install his disciplined offensive attack and closely evaluate a young but talented quarterback corps.

A pair of SEC-caliber quarterbacks returning from their first season in a Vanderbilt uniform, Johnny McCrary (So.) and Wade Freebeck (So.), are expected to compete for the signal calling job after Patton Robinette announced the end of his career in mid-March. Both McCrary and Freebeck earned multiple starts in 2014, but neither enjoyed consistent success. Both showed physical development, maturity and scheme knowledge last spring.

Ludwig also will look for Shawn Stankavage (R-Fr.) to continue his development. The Commodores' signing class also featured Kyle Shurmur, an exciting quarterback prospect from Philadelphia.

While Ludwig looks to identify the team's starting guarterback, running backs coach Charles Bankins wants to see substantially more production from the rushing duo of Ralph Webb (So.) and Dallas Rivers (So.).

In 2014, Webb arguably was the team's most effective player on

offense, rushing for a freshman team-record 907 yards and four touchdowns. If Ludwig's offense at Vanderbilt resembles the units he guided at Wisconsin, Webb will get ample opportunities to showcase his abilities.

Rivers is one of the most intriguing Commodore backs, bringing a more physical, insidethe-tackle rushing style than Webb. Rivers also has the dual ability to help the Commodores at fullback.

Ladarius Banks (So.) also impressed during Spring Ball as a punishing blocker at fullback.

The list of true freshmen includes offensive back

candidates Josh Crawford, Jaire George and Jay Hockaday.

Starters back: 3 Letterwinners: 7

The receiver corps offers plenty of proof how perception can change in just one year. In 2014, a lack of experience and too many newcomers at the position was a major concern. This August, coaches have high expectations for the entire receiver corps.

Tight ends coach **Gerry Gdowski** and first-year receiver mentor **Cortez Hankton** are looking forward to welcoming a group that includes three solid starters, seven additional letterwinners, and several youngsters looking to make a name for themselves.

The corps is led by **Steven Scheu** (Sr.), who developed into one of the Southeastern Conference's leading tight ends in 2014, and wideout starters **Latevius Rayford** and **C.J. Duncan**. All three players posted single-season highs in 2014: Scheu set career highs last year with 39 catches and 525 yards, Rayford with 36 receptions, and Duncan with 441 receiving yards and four touchdowns.

Offensive coaches hope Scheu, Rayford and Duncan can take their game to the next level, but several others are available to also bring production to the corps.

The coaches expect Kris Kentera (Sr.), Darrius Sims (Jr.), Chandler Dorrell (So.), Caleb Scott (So.) and Trent Sherfield (So.) to push Rayford and Duncan. Kentera has been a reliable target for three years while Sims brings explosiveness to the position. Dorrell and Scott both contributed last

last year. **DeAndre Woods** (So.) also moves into the tight end corps after playing wide receiver last year. **Sean Dowling** (R-So.) should bring an excellent inside presence in his first full year at tight end.

The signing class brings three new members to the corps: tight ends **Kyle Anderton** and **Sam Dobbs**, and wide receiver **Jared Pinkney**.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Starters back: 4 Letterwinners: 9

The Vanderbilt offensive line features four starters, including three of the team's most experienced contributors, from a year ago.

This August, second-year offensive line coach **Keven Lightner** will welcome a unit that features the team's two most experienced starters, both starting tackles, and nine total letterwinners.

One of the unit's top performers, **Spencer Pulley** (Sr.), is moving to a new position and taking on greater leadership on the line. Pulley, who has 29 career starts and 25 consecutive starts at offensive guard, is moving to center to fill the void left by Joe Townsend's graduation.

Beside Pulley, the Commodores have two-year starter **Jake Bernstein** (Sr.), **Delando Crooks** (So.) and **Barrett Gouger** (Jr.) competing for the guard roles. Bernstein and Pulley share the team high with career starts, while Crooks was one of the Commodores' most improved blockers during spring drills. Gouger continues to develop, and has the versatility to shift to center if needed.

Bruno Reagan (R-Fr.) will also compete for playing time at guard. Andrew Jelks (Jr.) is a future All-Southeastern Conference caliber player and is expected to handle the left tackle role. Jelks earned SEC All-Freshman honors playing right tackle in 2013, then started all 12 games in 2014 replacing current NFLer Wesley Johnson at left tackle.

Will Holden (Jr.) is back at right tackle after earning 10 starts last year.

Blake Fromang (Jr.), Kevin McCoy (Jr.) and Bailey Granier (R-Fr.), who showed progress during spring drills, are additional tackles for the Commodores.

Cole Hardin (R-Fr.) and Gouger will compete for the reserve role at center.

New arrivals on the offensive line include highly regarded prep prospects Ean Pfeifer, Justin Skule and Jared Southers, and Egidio DellaRipa,

a sophomore who signed with the Commodores after starting one year at a Southern California junior college.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Starters back: 2 Letterwinners: 6

The Vanderbilt defensive line, under second-year coach **Frank Maile**, has the potential to develop into one of the team's strongest units.

The line is paced by a pair of veterans in Adam Butler (Jr.) and Caleb Azubike (Sr.), and several returnees that blossomed during Spring Ball, including Jay Woods (So.), Nifae Lealao (So.) and Torey Agee (Jr.).

This season, the corps also benefits from having one full year of experience in Derek Mason's 3-4 defensive scheme which was a departure from the system used by previous staffs.

Butler is arguably the Commodores' most versatile linemen. The 6-5, 300-pounder has 15 career starts and offers the ability to play inside at tackle or outside at end.

The staff sees Azubike as a valuable defensive playmaker, causing havoc as an athletic end. He enters his final season as the team's active leader with 12 quarterback sacks and 20 tackles for loss.

During spring drills, no Vanderbilt player impressed the staff more than Woods, a powerful and active presence who appears to be a top contender to star at either tackle or end. At tackle, Woods will get plenty of competition from Lealao, an agile young prospect who brings tons of upside to the interior tackle position.

Darion DeBrossard, a 2015 Commodore signee who brings an impressive frame to the unit, is another potential tackle.

Agee and **Jonathan Wynn** (So.) could earn sufficient roles on the line with productive preseason appearances.

Agee is a mature, two-year letterwinner capable of playing tackle or end. Wynn, a former outside linebacker, possesses an edge-rushing ability at end.

Two more young Commodore

hopefuls, redshirt freshmen **Sekou Clark** and **Riley Tindol**, both benefited physically from a redshirt freshman season and could find their way into the on-field rotation with a strong August effort.

LINEBACKING CORPS

Starters back: 4 Letterwinners: 7

Four key returning starters and several promising newcomers highlight the Commodore linebacking corps.

The unit mentored by **Kenwick Thompson** features All-Southeastern Conference candidates in **Nigel Bowden** (So.) and **Stephen Weatherly** (Jr.), and returning starters **Darreon Herring** (Sr.) and **Zach Cunningham** (So.).

Herring is the Commodores' most experienced linebacker with 24 career starts and is the unit's most versatile performer, blending the ability to play inside and move outside to nickel back. After contributing 45 tackles last year, Herring ranks as the team's active career leader with 162 total stops.

Bowden and Cunningham were extremely productive as young contributors at inside linebacker. Bowden earned Freshman All-SEC recognition after leading all SEC first-year linebackers with a team-high 78 tackles. He also averaged nearly eight tackles in league play. Cunningham became a key cog in the defense at midseason, averaging 8.2 tackles over the final five games.

Weatherly ended the 2014 season in sensational fashion, setting a team record with five tackles for loss against Tennessee. The athletic outside linebacker topped the 'Dores with 4.5 quarterback sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss.

Harding Harper (Sr.) and Ja'karri Thomas (Sr.) provided experienced depth at inside linebacker. Khari Blasingame (R-Fr.) also ranked among the

team's most impressive spring performers after switching from

The roster also includes several exciting young players pushing for playing time at outside linebacker opposite Weatherly.

Nehemiah Mitchell, a junior transfer, will get a close look after learning the scheme in an impressive spring showing. He will be challenged by returning letterwinner Landon Stokes (So.) and promising Charles Wright (R-Fr.).

The Commodores also added four talented linebacker prospects in the 2015 signing class: Jordan Griffin, Dare Odeyingdo, Caleb Peart and Josh Smith.

Starters back: 5 Letterwinners: 11

No position grouping differs more for the Commodores than the defensive secondary. After having to completely retool the unit in 2014, position coaches **Marc Mariotti** and **Brett Maxie** will welcome five starters and nearly a dozen performers from last year at preseason camp.

The unit will be paced by four veteran performers – cornerback **Torren McGaster** and safeties **Andrew Williamson**, **Jahmel McIntosh** and **Oren Burks**.

Vanderbilt coaches expect the added experience to help the unit create more turnovers than in 2014 when the Commodore defense totalled just six interceptions.

McGaster (Jr.) ended the 2014 campaign in style, connecting a pair of interceptions in the finale against Tennessee. He concluded the season as the team leader with 46 solo tackles and ranked third with 66 total tackles. McGaster could easily develop into an All-SEC performer.

Two other cornerbacks with starting experience, **Taurean Ferguson** (So.) and **Tre Bell** (So.), will compete for the job across from McGaster, along with two players who impressed during Spring Ball, **Tre Herndon** (So.) and **Bryce Lewis** (R-Fr.). Two other contenders to be closely watched in camp are **LaDarius Wiley** (R-Fr.) and 2015 signee **Donovan Sheffield**.

Williamson, Burks and McIntosh started at least six games in 2014,

team's Top Ten tacklers. Williamson continued to develop during spring drills, accepting a greater leadership role among the corps. Burks has superb physical skills and will continue to improve with experience. McIntosh brings physicality and a fifth-year presence to the safety position.

Three more safeties with a year of experience from last year – Jalen Banks (So.), Arnold Tarpley (So.) and Ryan White (So.) – will push for increased roles. Andrew Rector, a 2015 signee from Nashville, also will get plenty of repetitions in camp.

Sophomore **Emmanuel Smith**, Wiley and Tarpley are expected to compete for the nickelback role.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Starters back: 3 Letterwinners: 5

The Commodores return the bulk of their specialists for the 2015 season, including three with All-Southeastern Conference abilities.

The Commodores' top returning specialists are placekicker **Tommy Openshaw** (So.), kick returner **Darrius Sims** (Jr.), punter **Colby Cooke** (Jr.) and punt returner **Trey Ellis** (So.).

Openshaw comes off a solid 2014 campaign as a first-time contributor. He connected on 8-of-11 field goals last year, with all three misses coming from beyond 40 yards. Openshaw brings both accuracy (72.7 percent conversion rate) and excellent leg strength (long of 48 yards) to the role.

Sims is one of the SEC's most explosive returners. He ranked fifth in the conference last year with a 24.5-yard average. Sims also returned two kicks for touchdowns, both coming in SEC action. He is listed on several preseason all-conference units.

Cooke looks to build on a solid 2014 campaign when he averaged 42.4 yards as the team's top punter. He featured 14 punts of more than 50 yards and 19 attempts downed inside the opponent 20-yard line.

Ellis developed as the team's punt returner during the 2014 season, concluding with a 5.4-yard average.

Hayden Lekacz (So.) will compete with Openshaw for the placekicking role after seeing limited action as a true freshman in 2014.

The Commodores will need to replace quality long snapper Andrew East, who enters the season competing for a NFL job in Kansas City. Two juniors, Jacob Schultz and Wilson Johnson, are expected to compete with Davis Winkie (R-Fr.) among others to replace East.

Other potential punt and kick returners include **C.J. Duncan** (So.), **Torren McGaster** (Jr.) and **Dallas Rivers** (So.).
