COACH'S POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Media wishing to participate in postgame interviews should meet at the elevator with 5:00 left in the game to be escorted to the south end zone area of the field.

Coach Johnson's post-game press conference is held immediately after he addresses the team. Only properly credentialled working media will be allowed into the conference, which is held in Room 153 of McGugin Athletic Center. To attend, cross Jess Neely Drive and enter McGugin Center at the entrance marked "Press Conference Area." Once inside McGugin, enter the media room through either of the first two doors on your right.

PLAYER POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The Vanderbilt Player Locker Room is closed to media. Up to five student-athletes will be made available for post-game interviews. These interviews will be conducted in the same room as Coach Johnson's post-game remarks. The players will enter this area when Johnson concludes with his press conference.

During Commodore home games, the visiting team interview room is located in the south endzone of the stadium. The entrance is located in the stadium tunnel. Vanderbilt athletic communications personnel will make every effort to provide quickie stats to the media.

SATELLITE FEEDS

Vanderbilt does not offer satellite feeds and teleconferencing of the Monday press gathering with Johnson.

Vanderbilt will provide a postgame highlight feed for any non-televised SEC game. Transmission info will be provided Thursday before the game.

Media wishing to interview players during the week should contact the Athletic Communications staff.

Practice interviews are available Tuesday-Wednesday, prior to position meetings (typically 90 minutes before practice). Upon request, the head coach and players also are available briefly at the end of practice those days.

Media outlets are permitted to shoot the first 30 minutes of practice; afterward, sessions are closed to all cameras. *The staff may close practice without notice.*

Out of town media can arrange interviews on a 24-hour notice through the Athletic Communications Office.






