Bobby Johnson is looking for Vanderbilt's 2007 squad to take the next step to fulfill his desire that Commodore players, coaches and followers come to expect greater success on the gridiron.

"We are continuing to focus on building the program, and getting it to the point where there's an expectation of success among everybody associated with our program. Our players, our coaches, our students and our fans deserve to enjoy such an expectation," Johnson said.

Johnson, in his sixth year at the helm of Vanderbilt football, continues to make progress in the ultimate pursuit of upgrading the Commodore program to the point where it contends for Southeastern Conference championships.

When Johnson opens preseason camp the first Saturday of August in Nashville, he will be greeted by the deepest Commodore squad in years. Fifty-two letterwinners, the most in the Johnson Era, will compete for starting and key reserve roles. This summer, obvious holes in the Commodore lineup will be more difficult to identify for Johnson's coaching staff.

"The overall talent is definitely upgraded from our earlier teams," Johnson said, "and that has resulted in improved depth at most positions. We still have a ways to go, but we're getting the program closer to where it has to be for us to enjoy success."

Seventeen starters from the 2006 squad – nine on offense and eight on defense – are back trying to retain their assignments. The returnees include some of the SEC's finest players, including All-America prospects Earl Bennett at wide receiver, Jonathan Goff at interior linebacker and Chris Williams at offensive tackle. The Commodores' entire offensive front, topped by Williams and fellow tackle Brian Stamper, could return intact. The offensive backfield led by junior quarterback Chris Nickson will be deeper than a year ago. Back on the defensive front are Curtis Gatewood and Theo Horrocks, two extremely productive seniors. The linebackers, led by Goff and fellow senior Marcus Buggs, are more mobile than recent Commodore units. The secondary, paced by two-year starting safety Reshard Langford, is young but athletic. Both kicking specialists also return from the past year.

"We have some talented players, no question," Johnson said. "We simply have to develop more guys that can go in, and play effectively against the best competition in America. I expect some guys will step forward when camp opens and make their case for playing time."


For the last two years, Johnson's Vanderbilt squads have been extremely competitive. Their nine wins in the span is the most since a 10-win accumulation by the 1993-94 Commodores. Those wins have included three of the Commodores' biggest road victories in many years: 28-24 wins at Arkansas and Tennessee in 2006 and a 24-22 triumph at Georgia in 2007.

"We're going to compete, I know that about this team," Johnson said. "We've been very competitive the last two years. Now, we just have to keeping getting better. We have to execute, to eliminate mistakes, make plays and give ourselves the very best chance for victory."

### **COMMODORE OFFENSE**

**QUARTERBACK** Without overstating the obvious, Vanderbilt's chances for more team success substantially improve with the continued development of its signal calling corps led by **Chris Nickson** (6-1, 210, R-Jr.). The group took initial steps in spring drills, with Johnson telling SEC writers that the position was one of the most improved on the team.

Nickson produced an array of remarkable individual performances as

a first-year starter in 2006. A threat with his arm and leas. Nickson guided the Commodores to a huge victory at Georgia, and generally put together a solid campaign. As a passer, he threw for 2.085 yards and 15 touchdowns while hitting 55 percent of his attempts. As a rusher, Nickson was the team

leader with 694 yards and nine scores, both tops among all SEC quarter-backs. His 2,779-yard accumulation in total offense has been bettered by just three quarterbacks in Vanderbilt history.

The coaches expect Nickson's leadership and mental approach to the game to blossom this season. The staff will also look for Nickson to display better accuracy with medium range passing routes and produce greater efficiency in short yardage and red-zone situations.

The quarterback competition features two others with experience from a year ago in **Mackenzi Adams** (6-2, 215, R-So.), **Richard Kovalcheck** (6-2, 220, R-Sr.), untested redshirt freshman **Jared Funk** (6-2, 195) and highly touted freshman **Larry Smith** (6-2, 200).

One of the Commodores' top athletes, Adams looked good in limited duty last year, showing an ability to manage the offense while producing yards equally with his arm and legs. Kovalcheck spent his first year on campus last year after transferring from the University of Arizona where he started games over portions of two varsity seasons. Kovalcheck is the team's best drop-back passing option. In spring drills, Funk displayed plenty of upside, including perhaps the strongest arm of the group. Smith comes in off a remarkable prep career, but is not expected to challenge the veterans for playing time in 2007.

**RUNNING BACK** Preseason camp should be exciting for the Commodores' deep and talented corps of backs.

While the two top performers from last year's one-back set are **Cassen Jackson-Garrison** (6-1, 215, Sr.) and **Jared Hawkins** (5-10, 195, R-So.), arguably the most watched back might be **Jeff Jennings** (6-1, 215), a redshirt junior that didn't play a snap last year.

Jackson-Garrison started all 12 games last year, showing plenty of grit by playing the season opener at Michigan just two weeks after undergoing an appendectomy. He set a career high in rushing yards, but struggled in crucial short yardage situations. Hawkins displayed an excellent power-running style as a productive rusher in his redshirt freshman campaign. Hawkins also averaged nearly seven yards a carry, displaying an awesome ability to read teammates' blocks. As he adds

versatility as a more deft blocker and receiver, Hawkins value to the offense could soar.

Jennings missed all last season recuperating from a knee injury that occurred late in the 2005 campaign. The months of rehab became obvious in Spring Practice with Jennings showing the explosiveness and physicality that made him a starter two years ago. If Jennings returns to '05 form, the Commodores will be, without question, an improved and deeper team. Jennings' top strengths – running downhill inside the tackles, converting on key third and short situations, catching the ball as a receiver and effectively blocking blitzing linebackers – were occasional areas of concern with the Commodore attack last year.

The Commodores also have four young candidates with plenty of upside at running back. **Gaston Miller** (5-7, 165, So.) is a lightning quick runner while **Kennard Reeves** (5-11, 195, R-Fr.) made greater strides than any Commodore during spring drills. The staff also is enthusiastic about the power and athleticism of **Ryan van Rensburg** (6-1, 215, Fr.) and the elusive potential of **Jermaine Doster** (5-10, 205).

**TIGHT END/FULLBACK/H-BACK** The Commodores expect improvement from their top two tight ends – **Brad Allen** (6-3, 240, R-Jr.) and **Jake Bradford** (6-6, 263, R-So.) – after each experienced their most substantial roles a year ago.

Allen developed into a solid blocker as a first-year starter in '06, but needs to improve his route-running and receiving abilities to become a bigger offensive weapon. Bradford possesses ideal size, and should develop into a steady contributor as he sees increased playing time.

**Justin Green** (6-6, 230, R-Fr.) progressed off the field, working hard to add weight and strength, and gives the team its best downfield receiver at the position. **Matt Bubis** (6-0, 228, R-So.) could contribute on special teams and in a reserve role.

Any of four incoming freshmen – **Brandon Barden** (6-5, 225), **Tim Fugger** (6-4, 225), **Austin Monahan** (6-6, 235) and **van Rensburg** – have a chance to secure playing roles with productive showings in fall camp.


**WIDE RECEIVER** All-America **Earl Bennett** (6-1, 202, Jr.) tops the Commodore wide receiving corps. A preseason Biletnikoff Award candidate

and unanimous preseason All-SEC prospect, Bennett is in the midst of a career that could go down as one of the finest in team and league history. After racking up huge stats for the second straight year in 2006 - 82

catches, 1,146
receiving yards,
six touchdowns
- Bennett stands
just 48 receptions
shy of the all-time
SEC record.

Though Bennett has a knack for making huge plays at key moments, he's anything but a stat-oriented star for the Commodores. He's as good a teammate as any Vanderbilt player, a guy that favors team success over individual achievement.

When preseason camp opens, the starting receivers along with Bennett in three-wide sets will be George Smith (6-3, 200, R-Jr.) and Sean Walker (6-0, 180, R-Jr.). Smith was the team's No. 3 receiver in 2006 and enters this season in the best shape of his career. Walker was one of the Commodores' most pleasant surprises a year ago, catching 16 passes in his first year of serious participation. Walker's quick burst and overall speed might be Vanderbilt's most electrifying player in the receiving corps.



The coaches expect either Alex Washington (5-10, 180, R-So.) or Justin Wheeler (6-0, 180, R-So.) to blossom in camp, and force a playing role. Other receiver prospects are Chris Reinert (5-9, 185, R-So.), Larry Simmons (5-10, 165, R-So.) and **Udom Umoh** (5-11, 175, Fr.).

A former captain, Stamper earned All-SEC honors in 2005 before missing most of last year with the back injury. Though Stamper missed most of Spring Practice with a foot injury, he has worked without pain through the team's summer conditioning program.

With a productive Stamper in uniform, the Commodores own an outstanding tandem at tackle. Without Stamper, the squad likely will look to a pair of relative newcomers to solidify the position. Former tight end Thomas Welch (6-7, 295, R-So.) enters the preseason off an outstanding effort in spring drills. Some observers think the agile Welch will compete for the starting right tackle role, regardless of Stamper's status. Eric Hensley (6-6, 320, R-So.) has steadily progressed, and appears ready to play in his third preseason camp.

In the middle, the Commodores bring back durable senior **Hamilton Holliday** (6-3, 290) at center. Holliday was a valuable starter in 2006, displaying sound blocking techniques and committing few mental errors while handling nearly all the team's offensive snaps.

Holliday is backed up by a potential standout in **Brad Vierling** (6-3, 290, R-So.), Rvan Vance (6-3, 280, R-So.) and Joev Bailey (6-4, 275, R-Fr.).

Two redshirt seniors, Merritt Kirchoffer (6-5, 320) and Josh Eames (6-5, 305), started more than half of last season at left and right guard, respectively, and will enter preseason with a chance to nail down the starting roles. Kirchoffer is a physical specimen and one of the team's strongest players, but has yet to come into his own. Kirchoffer has the natural gifts to blossom into a superb player in his final year. Eames is the unit's Mr. Reliable, always knowing which defender to take on, and is arguably the best blocker on the team. Eames missed four games due to injury and enters camp needing to show he is fully healthy.

Ryan Custer (6-3, 295) and Vierling are versatile players with the ability to move into the starting lineup at guard. After spending part of Spring Practice working at defensive tackle, Custer has experience at both quard positions. Vierling is a hard-nosed player who could compete at guard or center. Several young prospects, including **Drew Gardner** (6-6, 300, R-So.) and **Nick Forte** (6-, 290, R-So.), will try to earn playing roles. The Commodores' signing class also includes two talented newcomers in **Kyle Fischer** (6-6, 300) and **James Williams** (6-6, 300).

### COMMODORE DEFENSE


**DEFENSIVE LINE** The leader at tackle is co-captain **Theo** Horrocks (6-3, 290, Sr.), a two-year starter and one of the most productive Commodore interior linemen in years. The all-conference caliber Horrocks goes hard every snap, and leads on and off the field. In 2006, Horrocks posted career numbers in virtually every statistical category while playing more than 90 percent of the defensive plays.

Gabe Hall (6-1, 290, Sr.) and Greg Billinger (6-3, 280, So.) will compete for the starting tackle position next to Horrocks. A beast in the weightroom, Hall has trimmed down to 290 pounds and appears ready to battle for the starting job. Hall played well for the Commodores early in the 2006 season only to become limited by injuries as the season wore on. Prehaps the Commodores' most athletic interior lineman, Billinger played as a true freshman in 2006, and should improve with each game.

**Adam Smotherman** (6-4, 275, R-Fr.) also sparkled in spring drills before being slowed by a leg injury, and could earn playing time in camp.

With a strong showing in camp, either **David Whittington** (6-2, 275, R-Jr.), Brandon Holmes (6-3, 295, R-Jr.) or Derrius Dowell (6-3, 280, R-So.) could claim a substantial reserve role. Two freshmen, Rob Ashabranner (6-2, 270) and T.J. Greenstone (6-3, 265), will get a

Gatewood (6-3, 245,R-Sr.) is back at defensive end after posting a superb season last year as a firstyear starter. Gatewood positioned himself for All-SEC consideration by displaying off-the-edge quickness and the toughness to take on 300pound tackles as a junior. He ended the year among the league leaders in sacks and forced fumbles and had 36 solo tackles.

Across from Gatewood, Commodore coaches will look to a pair of talented redshirt sophomores, **Broderick** Stewart (6-5, 225) and **Steven Stone** (6-5, 255), as the starter. Stewart was a big-play specialist last year,

Commodores a pair of solid performers and excellent leaders returning for their final year.

Goff, highly regarded by NFL draft experts, continues the superb Commodore tradition at linebacker, and enters 2007 with 27 consecutive starts to his resume. He also ranks as the Commodores' active career leader – and third best among SEC players – in total tackles and solo stops. Goff also enters camp five pounds lighter than a year ago in an effort to add quickness.

Buggs is an emotional leader and impact hitter for the Vanderbilt defense. As a starter in 2006, Buggs displayed a big-play ability and a willingness

to punish ball carriers. He should continue to blossom, and like Goff, serves as an excellent example at practice for the more inexperienced inebackers.

Two line-

backers coming off excellent Spring **Practice** efforts, **Brandon Bryant** (6-1, 228, R-So.) and Patrick **Benoist** (6-0, 215, So.). are expected to compete for the open outside linebacker role. On numerous occasions last spring, the coaches bragged on the development of both players.



rarely witnessed on the Commodore campus.

Langford also brings a field general presence to the Commodore secondary. As a two-vear starter entering the season, Langford knows the responsibilities of every secondary position and will serve as a steadying force to an otherwise youthful corps.

**Darlron** Spead (5-10, 185, R-So.) also returns as one of the team's top playmakers in the secondary. Spead was the Commodores' top nickelback and snared three interceptions as a redshirt freshman last year. Though limited in spring drills due to an offseason knee procedure, Spead is expected back 100 percent in fall camp.

Across from Langford, **Ryan** 

**Hamilton** (6-1, 208, R-So.) returns as the starting free safety. Thrust into a starting job in 2006, Hamilton improved with every game despite playing the entire campaign at less than full speed. Hamilton is coming off an outstanding Spring Practice, and is positioned to have a banner year in 2007.

Langford's backup at strong safety, **Brent Trice** (6-2, 210, So.), is one of the most gifted athletes on the Commodore roster. After playing a key role as a true freshman last year, Trice has a chance to develop into an outstanding player in the future. **Joel Caldwell** (6-1, 190, R-So.) moved to free safety during spring drills after starting several games at cornerback last year. Caldwell will contend for valuable minutes for the Commodore secondary as he becomes more familiar with the safety responsibilities. Walk-on **Roger Herndon** (5-11, 200, R-So.) also will get a look at safety in camp.

A pair of talented sophomores, **Myron Lewis** (6-2, 195) and **D.J. Moore** (5-10, 175) exited spring drills as the likely starters at cornerback.

Moore got a taste of the SEC as a freshman, starting nine straight games after the season opener. An athletic corner, Moore also is solid in run support

and earned a big-play reputation in 2006. The experience Moore gained last year should be a huge benefit in his sophomore season. Lewis' involvement in the Commodore secondary last year was limited, but he came on with a tremendous Spring Practice to earn the starting job entering preseason camp. Lewis blends outstanding size with superb athleticism.

The Commodores also return a pair of former starters at cornerback in redshirt juniors, **Josh Allen** (5-9, 182) and **Jared Fagan** (5-9, 180). Allen enjoyed a solid Spring Practice after finishing 2006 in the starting lineup, while Fagan watched his participation increase as the season endured.

The staff also was pleased with the development of **Alan Strong** (5-9, 175, R-Fr.) during spring drills, and expects the newcomer to contend for playing time during preseason camp. Another cormerback prospect to watch in camp is incoming freshman **Jamie Graham** (6-0, 180).

### **COMMODORE SPECIAL TEAMS**

**SPECIAL TEAMS** The Commodores return two-year starter **Bryant Hahnfeldt** (5-11, 190, Jr.) as their placekicking specialist. The junior helped the Commodores defeat Georgia with a last-second field goal, but struggled at other times last year, making just eight of 17 field goals. At the same

time, Hahnfeldt captured the admiration of both coaches and teammates by showing tremendous desire, coming back to compete just nine months after undergoing knee surgery.

Hahnfeldt, an All-SEC freshman pick in 2005, should be full of confidence and much stronger with a full year of conditioning under his belt.

Hahnfeldt is the only kicking prospect with college experience. Other prospects are **Thomas Carroll** (5-9, 165, R-So.) and **John**


