Nashville Sports



- ★ More than 1.5 million people reside in the Nashville area. It is the largest city to serve as home to a Southeastern Conference member.
- ★ Permanently named capital of Tennessee in 1843, Nashville serves as the government, financial and medical hub for the state.
- ★ The Nashville area includes 14 universities, with more than 35,000 enrolled students.
- ★ To millions, Nashville is known as "Music City," paying homage to the city's rich musical heritage and active industry, and as the "Athens of the South," recognizing the city's dedication to fine arts and higher education.
- ★ Downtown Nashville is a vibrant urban riverfront setting 1.5 miles from campus.
- ★ Several major firms have headquarters or major entities in the city. Vanderbilt is its largest private employer.
- ★ A scenic community of hardwood forests, rolling hills, spacious municipal parks, clean lakes and historic villages, Nashville ranks as one of the nation's best places to live.



The city features several unique entertainment districts: Second Street, Broadway, Printer's Alley and the Gulch. Many clubs, such as B.B. King's, Lonnie's and City Hall attract large college crowds.


Of course, Nashville draws many of national acts. Bands playing here recently include Amos Lee, Beyonce, Pink, Nickelback, Tim McGraw and Faith Hill, and Bang, Bang, Bang.

Music venues abound in Nashville. The famous Ryman Auditorium and 18,000-seat Sommet Center are downtown. Close to campus, rising national acts play to student crowds in clubs such as the 12th & Porter, Exit In and Mercy Lounge.



Nashville Facts

- ★ Located on the Vanderbilt campus, the Ingram Performing Arts Center is one of Nashville's newest and most acoustically pleasing concert venues. The nation's newest symphony center, the grand Schermerhorn, also just opened in the city.
- ★ Within two miles of campus is an abundance of museums, ranging from works from world-renown arts at the Frist Center for the Arts and Centennial Park and its Parthenon replica to the musical history at the Country Music Hall of Fame.

The Nashville area hosts several huge musical events. The CMA Music Festival is held downtown while the nationally acclaimed Bonnaroo Music and Arts Fest is staged an hour south of the city.
