Vanderbilt Hits The Road For Contest At Alabama

The Commodores travel to Tuscaloosa, Ala., for their first road SEC contest of the season at Coleman Coliseum on Wednesday night. Tip off is set for 8 p.m. CT, and the game can be seen live on CSS, ESPN360.com, and ESPN Full Court, and the radio call can be heard on the Vanderbilt-ISP Radio Network and vucommodores.com, with Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson courtside with all of the action.

Vanderbilt moved to 1-0 in SEC play and won its sixth consecutive game with a 95-87 win over Florida on Saturday afternoon at Memorial Gym. The Commodores had four players in double-figures against the Gators, with junior center A.J. Ogilvy leading the way with 24 points. Senior guard Jermaine Beal scored 22 points, sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor was a perfect 5-for-5 from the floor and 4-for-4 from the charity stripe in route to 14 points, and freshman John Jenkins came off of the bench to score 13 points for the Commodores in the win. Perhaps the best stat line of the day game from sophomore forward Andre Walker, who flirted with a triple-double with eight points, 10 rebounds, and seven assists against the Gators. He also added three steals in 34 minutes of action Saturday.

The Commodores shot 52.5% from the field against the Gators and converted on 78.8% of its free throw attempts (26-33) in the game. Ogilvy was 10-for-12 from the free throw line, Beal was 8-for-8, and Taylor was 4-for-4. VU also outscored the Gators 40-22 in the paint, 20-8 in points off of turnovers, 18-10 in second chance points, and 27-12 in bench points. Vanderbilt also committed a season-low seven turnovers against Florida's full-court pressure, and forced 14 Gator turnovers.

Taylor leads four players averaging double figures with 14.1 points per game. Beal and Ogilvy each add 13.3 points per contest, and freshman John Jenkins chips in 11.0 points

per game. Ogilvy leads the team on the glass with 5.7 rebounds per game; Taylor is next at 5.5 per contest.

Wednesday's game at Alabama marks the beginning of a stretch which has the Commodores on the road for four out of their first five SEC contests. VU travels to South Carolina on January 16, returns home to face Auburn on January 23, then travels to Tennessee (January 27) and Kentucky (January 30) the following week.

Vanderbilt and Alabama will meet for the 218th time Wednesday night, with the Crimson Tide holding a 65-62 advantage in the series. The two teams split two meetings in 2008-09, but Alabama won the last meeting, knocking Vanderbilt out of the SEC Tournament with an 82-75 win in Tampa, Fla., on March 12.

Stallings Now In Second Place On All-Time VU Wins List

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings, who won his 300th career game as a head coach last season, got his 200th win as Vanderbilt coach against Middle Tennessee State on January 4. He is in sole possession of second place on the all-time Vanderbilt wins list after surpassing Bob Polk's mark of 197 wins against Manhattan.

Now in his 17th season as a head coach, Stallings has the third most wins in the SEC among current coaches (Bruce Pearl, Billy Donovan) and 201 in his 11-year career at Vanderbilt. Stallings trails only Roy Skinner (278, 1962-76) on the all-time coaching wins list.

Offense Hitting Its Stride

Vanderbilt's offense has taken off in its last five games, averaging 87.0 points per game in the five wins over Mercer, Manhattan, Southern Miss, MTSU, and Florida. The Commodores are shooting 51.7% from the floor (150-290) in the five games, and has a scoring margin of +28.4. Overall, Vanderbilt is fourth in the SEC in scoring at 79.3 points per game and second in field goal percentage at 49.4%.

50% From the Floor...

Vanderbilt has converted 50% or more of its shots from the field in eight games so far this season, and have an 8-0 record in those games.

The Commodores and SEC Starts

The last time Vanderbilt started off 2-0 in league play came in the 2005-06 season, when the Commodores knocked off Auburn and Kentucky. In the Stallings era (since 1999-00), VU has started off 2-0 twice (2004-05, 2005-06), but has never started 3-0.

You Never Know What You're Going To Get...

Vanderbilt has had five different leading scorers (Beal, Ogilvy, Taylor, Tinsley, Jenkins), five different leading rebounders (Goulbourne, McClellan, Ogilvy, Taylor, Walker), five different assist leaders (Beal, Jenkins, Taylor, Tinsley, Walker), and six different leading shot blockers (Ezeli, Goulbourne, McClellan, Ogilvy, Tinsley, Walker) so far this season. Eight different Commodores have scored in double figures this season.

Taylor Has Solid Start

Sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor has gotten off to a quick start for the Commodores, averaging 14.1 points per game. He posted back-to-back double doubles (Arizona, Missouri) for the first time since Matt Freije in 2004 and has scored in double figures in all but four games so far this year.

Taylor Has Hot Hand Vs. TSU

Taylor was 10-for-11 from the floor against Tennessee State in his 20-point effort on December 19. The 90.9% shooting night set a new individual single-game FG%

Alabama

Scouting Alabama

Alabama enters the game with an 11-4 overall record and a 1-0 mark in SEC play after knocking off LSU in Baton Rouge on January 9, 66-49. Alabama has won four straight games dating back to December 23.

Sophomore forward JaMychal Green leads the Crimson Tide in scoring and rebounding, with 15.6 points and 6.8 rebounds, respectively. Senior guard Mikhail Torrance also averages double figures with 15.5 points per contest.

Vanderbilt's Record Against the SEC

Vanderbilt has a 616-620 all-time record against the schools that currently comprise the SEC.

Stallings Versus Alabama

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings has a 7-6 all-time record against Alabama. Against Crimson Tide coach Anthony Grant, Stallings is 1-0. Stallings is also 1-0 against Grant - VU knocked off his 2008-09 VCU team, 71-66, in the finals of the 2008 Cancun Challenge.

record at Memorial Gym. The previous record was 90.0 (minimum 10 attempts) by Vanderbilt's Brett Burrow on Feb. 16, 1985 against Tennessee.

Team Shoots Well Vs. Tennessee State

The Commodores converted on 67.9% of its shots from the floor (36-53), which set a new record for single-game field goal percentage in the Stallings era. The previous best came on March 13, 2008, against Auburn at the SEC Tournament in the Georgia Dome, when the Commodores connected on 67.3% (33-49) of their shots from the field.

VU Block Party

For the year, VU has 89 blocks, and is averaging 5.9 blocks per game, which is ahead of the clip set by last year's team, which set the school record for blocks in a season. Vanderbilt blocked 137 shots in 2008-09, a rate of 4.42 per game.

Ogilvy Grabs SEC Player of the Week Honor

A.J. Ogilvy won his first SEC Player of the Week award for the week of November 30-December 6 after averaging 22.0 points and 6.0 rebounds against Missouri and DePaul, respectively. It was the first player of the week honor for the 6'11 center from Sydney, Australia - he won three SEC Freshman of the Week awards in the 2007-08 season.

Ogilvy Reaches Milestone Vs. Lipscomb

A.J. Ogilvy tallied three blocks against Lipscomb on November 16, which gave him 100 blocks for his career, making him the second Commodore to post 1,000 points and 100 blocks in a career. Vanderbilt great Will Perdue is the only other VU player to accomplish the feat, with 1,281 points and 157 blocks. Ogilvy is only the fourth Vanderbilt player to eclipse the 100-block barrier in his career.

Double-Digit Man

Ogilvy has scored in double-figures in 68 out of 78 games in his three-year career at Vanderbilt. He has 20 career 20+-point outings and has had eight double-doubles in his career.

Ogilvy On Career Lists

Junior A.J. Ogilvy has already made the all-time records list in scoring and blocks after only two years and change of competition. Ogilvy currently has 1,225 points, and in 23rd place all-time. His total of 123 blocks puts him in second place overall for blocks in a career.

Ogilvy And The 20-Point Barrier

Ogilvy has scored 20 or more points in 20 games in his three-year Vanderbilt career, and the Commodores are 19-1 in those games. Also, when he attempts 10 or more free throws, VU is 14-1 in his three-year career.

Beal Also Sees Scoring Increase

Jermaine Beal has seen his scoring increase in every year of his career. So far in 2009-10, he is averaging 13.3 points per game. Last season, he pumped in 12.5 points per game, the team's second highest scoring average, and increased his scoring from his sophomore to junior season by nearly five points (4.9). He averaged 3.8 points per game as a freshman and 7.6 points per game as a sophomore.

Beal Nears 1,000-Point Barrier

Beal has 972 points in his Vanderbilt career, which leaves him 28 points of the 1,000-point barrier. Beal would be the 40th player in Vanderbilt history to the mark and the second on this year's team to eclipse 1,000 points. A.J. Ogilvy became the first sophomore in VU history to go over the 1,000-point mark last season.

International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very worldly roster, with players from five different countries. A.J. Ogilvy is from Australia, Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang is from Cameroon.

Walker Returns From Torn ACL And Excels

Andre Walker, a 6'7 guard/forward who tore his ACL against Middle Tennessee State on November 24, 2008, returns from the injury after extensive rehab. Walker, who redshirted the season last year because of the injury and is a sophomore this year, has started in all but one game so far this year and is averaging 6.6 points and 4.1 rebounds per game. Most recently against Florida, Walker scored eight points, grabbed 10 rebounds, dished out seven assists, and had three steals in 34 minutes of action against the Gators.

Hinkle Transfers

6'6 redshirt sophomore Charles Hinkle has decided to transfer after the fall semester. Hinkle, from Los Alamitos, Calif., averaged 1.4 points and 0.5 rebounds in 10 games in the 2009-10 season, and 1.8 points and 0.8 rebounds in his two-year Vanderbilt career. Hinkle sat out the 2007-08 season as a redshirt.

6'11 redshirt sophomore big man Festus Ezeli has started five games this season and has filled in nicely for the Commodores after A.J. Ogilvy missed some practice time in October with a concussion and lately with a sore heal.

Recently against Southern Miss, Ezeli came off of the bench and added eight points, four rebounds, and three blocks for Vanderbilt, and against MTSU, he scored a season-high 10 points to go along with three blocks.

Commodores Add John Jenkins To The Fold

Vanderbilt had one signee in 2008-09, John Jenkins from nearby Station Camp High School in Gallatin, Tenn. Jenkins, a 6'4 shooting guard, led all high scorers last season at 42.3 points per game and scored more than 30 points in every one of his games last year as a high school senior. He converted 62% of his shots from the floor and 47% from three and also made 88% of his free throws in his senior year. So far in 2009-10, Jenkins has scored in double figures 10 times and is averaging 11.0 points per game.

Jenkins Latest To Lead Commodores

Jenkins has led the team in scoring in three out of the last five games, and is leading the team with a 15.6 scoring average in those games. Against Southern Miss, Jenkins tied a Memorial Gym record for three-point field goal

percentage, making 6-of-6 from beyond the arc in route to a 20-point effort against the Golden Eagles. Jenkins tied Barry Booker, Kevin Anglin and Dawid Przybyszewski for the gym record. All four of the players that hold the record went 6-of-6 from beyond the arc.

Jenkins Grabs Back-to-Back Freshman Of The Week Honor

Jenkins has now won two consecutive SEC Freshman of the Week awards after he has honored for his performances against Middle Tennessee State and Florida last week. He averaged 13.0 points and 4.0 rebounds in two Commodore wins over the Blue Raiders and Gators. He was also named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his performances against Manhattan and Southern Miss December 27-January 4. The 6'4 freshman shooting guard averaged 17.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, and 3.0 assists in the wins over the Jaspers and Golden Eagles.

3-Point Streak Enters 22nd Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 744 consecutive games after the 2008-09 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (753, 1/10) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (635, 1/10) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

Commodores And The Top 25

Vanderbilt has been ranked twice so far this year in the Top 25 - with both times coming at the #24 slot in the polls. The Commodores moved into the 24th slot in the

ESPN/USA Today poll for the week of December 7-14 after registering two wins over Missouri and DePaul. VU was also in the poll earlier this year at #24 in both polls before their appearance in the 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational, but quickly moved out after going 2-1 at the Lahaina Civic Center. Prior to making the rankings in mid-November, the Commodores were last ranked during the 2007-08 season when they held a spot in the Top 25 for 16 consecutive weeks (December 3 to March 17).

Vanderbilt Signs Three In Early Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that guard Kyle Fuller, center Josh Henderson, and forward Rod Odom have signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2010.

Fuller, a 6'1 point guard from Moreno Valley, Calif., averaged nearly 20 points and nine assists per game in 2009 as a junior to lead his Rancho Verde High School team to a 24-6 record and trip to the sectional quarterfinals. This summer, he averaged almost 25 points and 10 assists per contest for his Inland Empire 17 and Under AAU Squad. Fuller will be the Commodores' third player from California on the roster, joining Festus Ezeli and Darshawn McClellan.

Fuller chose the Commodores over California, UCLA, and Marquette.

Henderson, a 6'11 center, comes to Vanderbilt from Roanoke, Va., where he plays at Cave Spring High School. He averaged 17.0 points, 11.0 rebounds, and 4.0 blocks per game as a junior with the Knights. Henderson, who has maintained a 3.5 GPA in high school, chose the Commodores over Davidson, Virginia, and Wake Forest.

6'8 forward Rod Odom, from Bellport, N.Y., comes out the early signing class for the Commodores. Odom, ranked the 77th best prospect in the nation by ESPN.com, is a long, athletic forward who averaged 16.5 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and three blocks at Middlesex School in Concord, Mass., as a junior. Odom chose Vanderbilt over Arizona, Boston College, Georgia Tech, Louisville, and West Virginia.

Commodores Knock Off St. Mary's

Vanderbilt knocked off St. Mary's, 72-70, on November 20 to open a four-game road swing that included the 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational. Vanderbilt handed St. Mary's only their third non-conference loss in their last 29 games in McKeon Pavilion, with Jeffery Taylor leading the way for VU with 19 points.

Vanderbilt Finishes 2-1 At 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational

The Commodores returned home from their trip to Maui with a record of 2-1, with wins coming over host Chaminade and Arizona, and Vanderbilt's lone loss coming against Cincinnati in the first round of the tournament. Senior guard Jermaine Beal led four players in double figures in the three games in Maui, averaging 14.7 points per game. Junior center A.J. Ogilvy averaged 13.0 points, sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor added 11.0 points, and true freshman guard John Jenkins chpped in 10.7 points per contest.

2009-10 PRESEASON NOTES

Returning for the Commodores...

The Commodores return 14 letterwinners from a year ago, including all five starters for a team that finished with a 19-12 overall record and an 8-8 record in SEC play in 2008-09. Vanderbilt missed the postseason for the first time for the first time since the 2002-03 season and only the second time in the Kevin Stallings era, which began prior to the 1999-00 season. However, the Commodores were the eighth-least experienced team in the nation in 2008-09 according to KenPom.com, and the team won eight out of its last 11 regular season games, including a win over SEC regular champion LSU in Baton Rouge on March 4.

Senior point guard Jermaine Beal is back after leading the SEC for the second consecutive season in assist-to-turnover ratio, while also increasing his scoring average to 12.5 points per game as a junior, a 4.9 point-per-game increase from his sophomore season. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, is one of the program's hardest workers and will lead the Commodores as the only senior on the squad.

The other four starters returning for Vanderbilt include junior center A.J. Ogilvy (15.4 points, 7.1 rebounds per game), sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor (12.5 points, 6.2 rebounds), sophomore guard Brad Tinsley (11.0 points, 2.5 rebounds), and a combination of Steve Tchiengang (3.6 points, 3.1 rebounds) and Darshawn McClellan (2.1 points, 3.0 rebounds) at the power forward position.

Other returning letterwinners include redshirt sophomore wing Charles Hinkle, redshirt sophomore center Festus Ezeli, sophomore forward Lance Goulbourne, redshirt sophomore forward Andre Walker, junior forward Joe Duffy, and walkons Chris Meriwether and Aaron Noll.

6'6 guard Jordan Smart returns after redshirting a year ago, and the only newcomer to the fold, freshman guard John Jenkins, also joins the team.

Walk-on junior guard Elliott Cole will miss the entire season due to a shoulder injury.

Player Accolades

Then-sophomore center **A.J. Ogilvy** was named to the All-SEC second team by the league's coaches at the end of the 2008-09 campaign and was an honorable mention selection by the league's media after averaging 15.4 points and 7.1 rebounds per game, both team highs. Freshman **Jeffery Taylor** was named to the All-Freshman team for his exploits by the league's coaches, and **Elliott Cole**, **Joe Duffy**, and **Andre Walker** were named to the Winter SEC Academic Honor Roll for their work in the classroom. It marked the 12th time in the Stallings era that Vanderbilt has had a player on the All-SEC team, and the fifth time VU has had someone on the All-Freshman team. Stallings has coached 29 members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll since his arrival on the Vanderbilt campus in 1999-00.

Leaders From 2008-09 Season

A.J. Ogilvy led the team in scoring at 15.4 points per game and rebounding with 7.1 rebounds per contest. Point guard Jermaine Beal, who once again led the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio last year, added 12.5 points, freshman Jeffery Taylor chipped in 12.2 points a game, and Brad Tinsley tallied 11.0 points a game. Taylor was second on the team in rebounding with 6.2 rebounds per game.

Ogilvy Named To Preseason All-SEC 1st Team

League coaches have named A.J. Ogilvy to their preseason All-SEC first team. He was a second-team All-SEC preseason selection by SEC media.

Ogilvy Reaches 1,000-Point Plateau

With his performance against LSU on March 4th of 2009, Ogilvy became the first sophomore in the history of

Vanderbilt basketball to eclipse the 1,000 point barrier. He has 1,041 points in his career. Vanderbilt legend Clyde Lee scored 1,100 points in his first two seasons in a Commodore uniform as a sophomore and junior. Freshmen were not eligible in those years (1963-65). Billy McCaffrey, who played as a junior and senior (1992-94) also scored 1,000 points in two seasons (1,359 points).

Two Freshman Double Digit Scorers For First Time Since...

1977. Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor and Brad Tinsley both averaged double digits at 12.2 and 10.7 points per game in 2008-09, respectively, the first time since 1977 that VU has had a true freshman scoring tandem. Charles Davis (15.3) and Greg Fuller (10.8) accomplished the feat in 1977.

Block Party In 2008-09

The Commodores blocked 137 shots in 2008-09 as a team, which set a new single-season record. The previous mark was 131 during the 1994-1995 season.

Beal And Tinsley Are VU Sharpshooters

Beal and freshman guard Brad Tinsley did not qualify for 3-point field goal percentage in the SEC rankings in 2008-09 because they did not make 2.5 threes per game (NCAA minimum for 3-pt FG%). However, if the minimum was dropped to 1.5 per game, Beal and Tinsley would have placed in the top ten in the league rankings. Beal would have tied for fifth at 40.3% (58-144), and Tinsley would have been third at 41.1% (69-168). Evaldus Baniulis of South Carolina would lead the league at 52.1% (38-73).

Drake Moves On

George Drake, who graduated with a degree in Sociology in May of 2009, will pursue a master's degree at UAB in the 2009-10 campaign. Drake was granted a waiver from the NCAA to play immediately for the Blazers and will compete this season.

Underclassmen Produce In 2008-09

Vanderbilt's redshirt freshmen and freshmen accounted for 1,085 points last year, a percentage of 49.7%, and underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) tallied 1,619 points, or 74.1% of the points scored in 2008-09.

Tinsley Ties Freshman Record

Freshman Brad Tinsley made 69 three-pointers in his initial collegiate campaign, a total that tied Shan Foster for the most three's made by a Commodore freshman in a single season. Foster made 69 threes in his freshman season, which came in 2004-05.

Beal Leads SEC In Assist-to-Turnover Ratio For Second Consecutive Season

Jermaine Beal, who started in every game last season as a junior, led the league in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.02, percentage points in front of Tennessee's Bobby Maze and Garrett Temple of LSU. As a sophomore in 2007-08, Beal led the SEC and was sixth in the nation in the category at an astonishing 3.06 to 1.

SEC PRESEASON POLLS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish third in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 90 points in the poll to finish behind Kentucky (148), and Tennessee (117). South Carolina was chosen fourth (77), Florida fifth (68) and Georgia was chosen sixth (25).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 144 votes, 24 votes better than Ole Miss (120). Kentucky received 20 out of the 25 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received three votes and Tennessee received two. Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

A.J. Ogilvy and Jermaine Beal combined to score 46 points, including 28 in the second half to propel the Commodores to a 95-87 win over Florida in the Southeastern Conference opener.

VU had four players finish in double figures, led by Ogilvy's 24. Beal chipped in a season-high 22 points while Jeffery Taylor and John Jenkins added 14 and 13 points, respectively. Andre Walker posted an excellent all-around effort with eight points, 10 rebounds, and career-high seven assists.

With the win, Vanderbilt improves to 12-3 overall and 1-0 in the SEC. The loss drops Florida to 11-4 and 0-1 in league play.

The 95 points scored against Florida marks the highest point total against the Gators since the 'Dores recorded a 105-85 win over the Gators in Nashville during the 1979-80 season.

Vanderbilt got the Gators into foul trouble and outscored them 20-8 off turnovers.

Kenny Boynton had a career-high 28 points for Florida. Erving Walker also had a career-best 22. Alex Tyus added 12, and Dan Werner 11. Vernon Macklin and Chris Murphy each fouled out with more than six minutes remaining.

MEMORIAL MAGIC - THE HOME TO VANDERBILT HOOPS SINCE 1952

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM ENTERS 58TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 58th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008. The Commodores also have a six-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster scored 42 points, including a three with 1.7 seconds remaining, in an 86-85 Vanderbilt win on March 8, 2008 against Mississippi State.

* The Commodores have posted a 690-186 (.787) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium. * VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.

* Vanderbilt has won 115 of its last 122 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 162-15 non-conference record at home (.915 win percentage).

* The Commodores are 95-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.

* The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.
