



## 2006 Preview

The 2006 Vanderbilt women's lacrosse team looks to rebound from a 6-9 record during the 2005 season. With a solid core of returning players and a wealth of young talent, the Commodores look ready to make a return trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Options abound for the Commodore attack, which returns its top five scorers from a season ago.

"We are very excited about the fire power of our offense this year," Head Coach Cathy Swezey said. "We have several threats and know that if one of them is shut down, someone

else is sure to step up and fill her shoes. I think it will be tough for defenses to limit our scoring."

Senior captain Kate Hickman enters the 2006 season as Vanderbilt's top returning scorer for the second straight year. Hickman has scored 41 goals in each of the last two seasons (an average of 2.3 goals per game in 2004 and 2.7 gpg in 2005). She currently ranks sixth all-time in goals scored at Vanderbilt with 87 career tallies.

But defenses learned quickly a year ago that there is not a single source for Vanderbilt's offense. Sophomore Margie Curran burst onto the collegiate lacrosse scene

as a top-10 prep recruit a year ago. Her impressive season made the prognosticators look brilliant, as she scored 30 goals and added 11 assists en route to earning All-Rookie honors from womenslacrosse.com. Her five-goal performance at Cornell was a feat matched only by Hickman in 2005.

The junior duo of Jennifer Tapscott and Kendall Thrift can also put points on the board. Thrift posted 19 goals and 19 assists a year ago, while Tapscott had 21 goals and 12 assists. The pair com-

bined for goals on eight occasions, including the sudden-victory goal at Ohio State when a Tapscott-assisted goal by Thrift helped VU defeat the Buckeyes, 14-13.

Senior captain Bryn Sedlacek, junior Nicole Pugno, and sophomores Ali Lemons and Ashley Paschall give the Commodores four more viable scoring options while also adding depth to the VU midfield. Each scored at least seven points for the 2005 Dores. Sedlacek is a reliable midfielder who started all 15 games a year ago. Pugno, Lemons and Paschall all came off the bench to contribute a year ago, and will be aided by the experi-

ence and confidence they gained.

"The number one difference in our team this year will be the speed and depth we have in the midfield," Swezey said. "We can go several players deep into our bench and sustain a high-paced game against opponents."

On the other side of field, the Commodore defense will combine experienced veterans with talented newcomers to protect sophomore goalkeeper Brooke Shinaberry.

"Our defense is the most athletic group of girls we have ever had protecting the eight-meter," Swezey said. "Although youthful, I am certain that our aggression and speed will show a significant difference in the number of goals we allow. And with Brooke Shinaberry returning from a red-shirt season, we know that our goal is well protected."

Junior captain Molly Frew is the anchor of the VU defense. A second-team All-ALC selection a year ago, Frew tied for the team lead in caused turnovers and was second in ground balls. Entering her third year, Frew already has started 33 career games for the Commodores.

Sasha Cielak drew the assignment of marking the opponent's best player during games last season, and as a freshman earned third-team All-America recognition from *Inside Lacrosse* magazine.

The defense will also be bolstered by the return

of redshirt-freshman Heather Koutrakos. A native of Sparks, Md., Koutrakos was featured in Coach Swezey's starting lineup in Vanderbilt's first game of the 2005 season, but an injury in that contest forced her to miss the rest of the year.

Sophomore Michele Slotke missed two games a year ago due to injury, but started the remaining 13 contests. She is a steady midfielder who helps the Commodores' transition game with her speed and stickhandling.

Behind the defense, Shinaberry returns to the Commodore lineup after redshirting in 2005. A former U-19 National Team goalkeeper, Shinaberry saw action in 10 games during her freshman year, allowing an average of only 9.11 goals per game and finishing with a 5-2 record.

Coach Swezey brought another stellar class to Vanderbilt this spring, as seven former prep standouts became Commodore freshmen this fall. Below is a complete list of the class with positions:

The Commodores will again face one of the nation's most challenging schedules. Of Vanderbilt's 16 opponents, 10 ended the season in the IWLCA's Top 25. Three of Vanderbilt's conference foes were ranked in the top 10 a year ago, including Northwestern (No. 1), Penn State (No. 7) and Johns Hopkins (No. 10).

#### Rule No. 13

New for the 2006 season, the IWLCA has instated a rule creating "hard boundaries." Unlike prior years, players throwing or running the ball out of bounds will not regain possession of the ball following a stoppage. In the case of a deflection on a pass or a loose ball situation, "the player/team that last touched the ball before it went out of bounds will lose possession of it."

One exception to this rule occurs following shots. If a shot or deflected shot goes out of bounds, the player closest to the ball at the time it crosses the boundary line shall gain possession. This portion of the rule is similar to previous years.
