SEASON OUTLOOK

The foundation is in tact for the Vanderbilt swimming and diving team, and the 2008-09 season is a year of opportunity for the Commodores. Vanderbilt enters its third season since bringing the program back in December 2006. The Commodores' youth will be on display this season as 15 of the 19 swimmers are underclassmen making them the youngest team in the Southeastern Conference and one of the youngest teams in all of Division I swimming. Even though they lack collegiate experience, head coach Jeremy Organ sees a lot of promise and talent in his 2009 squad.

Suzanne Wetz and Rebecca Rogers are the team's lone seniors while Alex Walsh and Jess Cohen are the team's lone juniors.

After experiencing a lot of turnover, Organ welcomes nine new faces to the program. Almost the entire freshman class made an immediate splash in terms of competitiveness and depth by swimming Vanderbilt's top times in five of 14 individual events during the fall season. Laura Dillon has emerged as the team's top breaststroker in less than five months on campus. Dillon, a former first-team high school All-American, set the Vanderbilt school record in the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke in the final fall meet at the Hilltopper Invitational. Fellow freshman Kelly Obranowicz recorded the top fall times in the 100 and 200-yard butterfly while Allie Voss has shown her versatility by posting solid times in the 100 and 200 breaststroke and 50 freestyle.

The Commodores enter the spring dual season led by seasoned sophomores Leigh-Ann Axt, Jennifer Molchan and Alexandra Jennings. The sophomore trio has rewritten many school records since arriving on campus 16 months ago.

Axt put together one of the best freshman season's in school history en route to setting three school records. The Kingwood, Texas native shattered the school's 100-yard butterfly, 200-yard butterfly and 200-yard freestyle marks at the SEC Championships last February. Prior to the spring season, Axt took little time adjusting to college swimming, as she recorded Vanderbilt's top time in eight of 13 individual events.

Molchan is coming off an impressive fall 2008 season where she established career-high times in the 50 and 100-yard freestyle. The former high school All-American put on an impressive display at the Hilltopper Invitational in November by swimming a 52.78 in the 100-yard freestyle just missing Leslie Holt's 18-year old record of 52.38. Jennings enters the spring dual season with some momentum of her own after posting fall 2008 team-high times in the 100 and 200-yard backstrokes.

In 2007-08, the Commodores peaked at the right time of the year as nearly every swimmer on the roster posted personal and season-best times at the SEC Championship in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

In the off-season, Organ introduced a new member of the coaching staff by bringing in former North Florida standout Krysten Nemecek to be an assistant coach. When not in the pool competing, Nemecek spent her time coaching various club teams for the Serenata Beach Club in Vedra, Fla. Nemecek will join second year diving coach Andrea Meyers on Organ's staff.

The Commodores welcome two new divers to this year's roster in Liz Asche and Nicole Woodworth. Coach Meyers liked what she saw out of the two promising freshmen during the fall season.

"Liz and Nicole are very coachable student-athletes and they come into practice every day prepared and with a positive attitude," Meyers said. "They not only put in 100 percent during practice but they workout and practice on their own time. They made excellent progress in the fall season and I expect that to continue into the spring dual season. I have really enjoyed coaching them this year and I look forward to helping them progress over the next three years."

Woodworth posted season-high marks of 239.40 and 227.33 in the one and three-meter dive at Vanderbilt's lone home fall meet against Rhodes and Centre College. "In the next few years I definitely see Nicole putting together an impressive list in both the one and three-meter dive. I would

like to see her compete in Southeastern Conference finals."

With nine freshman and seven sophomores the future appears to be bright at Vanderbilt. Prior to the 2009 season, head coach Jeremy Organ sat down with the Vanderbilt Athletic Communications staff for a question and answer

session.



1.) You enter your third season as head coach of the swimming team. What are your thoughts on your first two seasons?

The first two years have been a tremendous experience. To have the opportunity to build a team from scratch at such a great institution like Vanderbilt is really special.

2.) What are some of your team goals this season?

We are looking for our first dual meet victory this year and hope to accomplish that by setting more team records along the way.

3.) What do you think the strengths are of this year's team?

I think our strength is our youth, and the fact that everyone is hungry to go out and compete to the best of their ability each week.

4.) What are your thoughts on the freshmen class and how have they found success early on?

The freshmen class has really meshed well with the upperclassmen. This cohesiveness has allowed the team as a whole to improve together.

5.) You brought in Krysten Nemecek this season, what does she bring to the table and how will she help your team this year?

Krysten has been a great addition to our team this year. She brings a lot of youthful enthusiasm to the pool deck every day.

6.) You have the youngest team in the Southeastern Conference this season. What challenges and opportunities does that present to your team?

I think being a young team does have its advantages. For example, as a team we are able to approach every competition as a learning experience and grow from that experience. We may make some mistakes along the way, but learning from those mistakes only makes us stronger.

7.) Leigh-Ann Axt had one of the best season's in school history last year as a freshman. How does her success and leadership rub off on the rest of the team?

Leigh-Ann has definitely set the bar for everyone else to measure by. The next step in her progression will be how effective she can be as a leader this season and that can be difficult for a sophomore to handle. I think this is something that she will excel at and I can't think of a better person to lead us over her career.

8.) What are your thoughts on this year's schedule?

I think our schedule should give us an opportunity to be in situations to be successful. It will also present us with some challenges where we will have to raise our game to a new level.





HEAD COACH JEREMY ORGAN

Last season under Organ, the Commodores rewrote the Van-

derbilt record books with Leigh-Ann Axt's leading the way with three school records. Despite finishing 10th at the Southeastern Conference Championship, the team made huge strides in building the program to where it needs to be.

"I'm excited to start our program up from the ground floor," Organ said. "It's going to be a lot of fun just to build something from scratch, and Vanderbilt is already a great fit for swimmers. I'm excited to build the program and watch us grow."

In 2007, Organ directed the first swim team at Vanderbilt since the 1992 season when the university was forced to drop the team. The Commodores finished the season with an 0-3 dual meet record and finished 10th at the team's first Southeastern Conference meet since 1992.

Before coming to Vanderbilt, Organ served as the head senior assistant/

head masters coach of the Nashville Aquatic Club, one of swimming's most competitive club teams. While coaching the NAC, Organ mentored six national championship qualifiers in addition to assisting 20 swimmers earn Division I scholarships.

Organ also served as the senior coach at the Greater Pensacola Aquatic Club. While in Pensacola, the club produced several national qualifiers and national age group top-16 swimmers.


Organ enjoyed a highly successful collegiate career, swimming at the University of North Dakota. While at UND, Organ was a six-time All-American. Organ also earned North Central Conference Swimmer of the Year honors in 1995.

Following graduation, Organ stayed with North Dakota to become Head Assistant Coach from 1996-2000. While in this position, Organ earned Long Course Coach of the Year honors in

1998 and 1999. He also helped to establish the swimming strength and conditioning program, supervising student-athlete's academic progress and implementing community service programs.

While working as a coach at NDU, Organ also served as the head coach for the Forks Area Swim Team. During that time, he garnered North Dakota Age Group Coach of the Year honors in 1998 and 1999.

Organ also has extensive experience in overseeing the growth of several swim programs, including the Great Pensacola Aquatic Club, where he nearly doubled the senior swim program in just two years. Also, while Organ was with the Nashville Aquatic Club, the program grew from 250 participants in 2002, to over 300 swimmers in 2005.



After her freshman year, she transferred to Southern Illinois University. She was named a Scholar Athlete all three years at SIU, was named Missouri Valley All-Conference twice and was named to the Verizon Academic All-American team along with the ESPN Academic All-American Team.

Meyers was a varsity diver for four years at St. Charles East High School. While on the team, she helped the school earn its sixth consecutive state championship.

Academic success, along with athletic achievement, is important to Meyers. Her goal is to not only prepare the divers to perform the best they can on the boards, but to also encourage success in the classroom.

Meyers has coached club diving and has given private lessons. In addition to her coaching experience, Meyers has completed the US Diving Training Course for Competitve Diving.

A native of St. Charles, III., Meyers currently resides in Nashville.

Outside of the pool, Nemecek excelled in the classroom. In May '08, Nemecek graduated with Magna Cum Laude honors in Health Administration from University of North Florida. En route to attaining her degree, she was named to the Atlantic Sun Conference All-Academic team four times.

As a senior at North Florida, Nemecek posted five first-place finishes and 21 top-three finishes. The former breaststroke standout holds the second-fastest 200-yard breaststroke time in the school's history.

Nicholas S. Zeppos Chancellor

Nicholas S. Zeppos was named Vanderbilt University's eighth chancellor on March 1, 2008. An avid fan of Vanderbilt athletics, Zeppos served as the role of faculty representative for the Commodoreathletics program before his ascension to the chancellorship.

A distinguished legal scholar, teacher and executive, Zeppos served from 2002 to 2008 as Vanderbilt's chief ac-

ademic officer, overseeing the university's undergraduate, graduate, and professional education programs and research in liberal arts and sciences, engineering, music, education, business, law, and divinity. As provost and vice chancellor, he chairs Vanderbilt's budgeting and capital planning council and leads all fundraising and alumni relations efforts across the institution, as well as overseeing the dean of students and dean of admissions.

Zeppos has led a number of important initiatives at Vanderbilt, including the planning process for The Commons, a landmark transformation of the first-year experience; the Strategic Academic Planning Group; innovative efforts in undergraduate admissions and financial aid; and the development of new programs in Jewish studies, law and economics, and genetics, among others. He also has led the university's Shape the Future fund-raising campaign, which exceeded its \$1.25 billion goal two years ahead of schedule and set a new target of \$1.75 billion by 2010.

Zeppos joined Vanderbilt in 1987 as an assistant professor in the Law School, where he has been recognized with five teaching awards. He subsequently served as an associate dean and then as associate provost before being named provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs in 2002, and served as interim chancellor from August 1, 2007 until March 1, 2008, when he was appointed chancellor.

From 1982-1987, Zeppos practiced law in Washington, D.C., at the United States Department of Justice and Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering, where he specialized in appellate litigation involving complex regulatory, statutory, and constitutional matters. He has written widely on legislation, administrative law, and professional responsibility, and is a nationally recognized scholar in these fields. He served as chair for the Scholars Committee, advising the Senate and the ABA on the confirmation of Justice Stephen Breyer, and as chair of the Rules Advisory Committee of the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit. He has alsoservedasaconsultanttogovernmentagencies, majorcorporations, and trade associations on complex litigation, policy design, and strategy.

Zeppos is a 1979 magna cum laude graduate of the University of Wisconsin Law School where he served as editor in chief of the Wisconsin Law Review and was selected as the outstanding graduate of his class, and a 1976 Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Wisconsin where he studied history.

He is married to Lydia Ann Howarth, a graduate of the University of Chicago and Lawrence University, who is a writer and editor. They have two sons, Benjamin and Nicholas.





David Williams II Vice Chancellor for University Affairs

For the last five years, Williams has directed an initiative to more fully integrate Commodore athletics into the total Vanderbilt student life experience. With the support of former Chancellor Gee, newly appointed chancellor Nicholas Zeppos, the university's senior management team and Vanderbilt Board of Trust, Williams' efforts as Vice Chancellor for University Affairs and Athletics have

been successful in creating opportunity for student-athletes to participate in programs across the Vanderbilt landscape.

Today, Williams' efforts has placed the Vanderbilt program among the nation's most innovative, offering a streamlined organization. Since sweeping changes were initiated in September 2003, Williams has firmly placed his stamp on the program. He has overseen the recruitment and hiring of seven outstanding head coaches. Williams has addressed facility concerns with a five-phase enhancement program expected to approach \$60 million and will affect virtually every Vanderbilt student-athlete by its completion date.

Vanderbilt athletics have blossomed under Williams. Nine sports participated in postseason action last year, just one shy of the school record set in 2006-07. An unprecedented seven Commodore athletes have been selected in the first round of their respective sports in the last three years. Off the field, the student-athletes' collective GPA has reached impressive levels.

Athletics is but a small part of Williams' influential Vanderbilt role. Williams also serves as General Counsel directing a staff of 14 attorneys, Secretary of Vanderbilt and its nationally recognized Medical Center, the Office of Risk Management, the University's Compliance and Conflict of Interest functions, and the operations of the University's Board of Trust.

Williams' campus participation also includes a tenured full professorship at the School of Law, lecturing on Tax Law, Sports Law and Education Law. He has taught a course on Law and Higher Education at Peabody College, and from time to time, courses in the undergraduate curriculum.

Williams came to Vanderbilt after serving in numerous administrative roles at Ohio State University over a 14-year period. When he accepted the Vanderbilt role, Williams was Vice President of Student and Urban/Community Affairs and Professor of Law at Ohio State.

A native of Detroit, Mich., Williams received a Bachelor of Science in Social Science and Master of Arts in Education from Northern Michigan University where he was a member of the track team. He also earned a Master of Business Administration and a Doctor of Jurisprudence from the University of Detroit, and an L.L.M. in taxation from New York University.

Williams and his wife, Gail, have two school-aged children: Samantha, who is a varsity swimmer and rising freshman at Brown University, and Nicholas, who is an eighth grader at University School of Nashville and competes in swimming, basketball, track and soccer. His wife serves as the Associate Director of Community Relations at Vanderbilt, and is chair of the Metro Transit Authority (MTA) board of directors.



Kevin Colon Associate Director of Student Athletics

Kevin Colon, a 12-year veteran of Vanderbilt athletics,

oversees the Commodore swimming program.
As one of four directors of sport operations with Vanderbilt athletics, Colon also oversees Commodore baseball, track and field and cross country.

Colon joined the Vanderbilt staff in 1998, organizing and directing CHAMPS/Life Skills, the community outreach arm of Commodore athletics. As CHAMPS/Life Skills director, Colon guided Vanderbilt student-athletes into an expanded role in giving back to local schools, hospitals, non-profits and other efforts aimed at disadvantaged residents of Nashville and Middle Tennessee. The programalsoemphasizedacommitmenttoacademicexcellence, personaldevelopment, leadership and career development for participating student-athletes.

Before joining Vanderbilt, Colon served two years as Assistant Director for Student Services at Kansas State University. He also served a tenure as football academic advisor at Syracuse University. Colon earned an undegraduate degree from Iowa State University and a master's degree from the University of Toledo.

A former track athlete, Colon has one son, DuBois (11).

CENTENNIAL SPORTSPLEX

The Centennial Sportsplex is the home of the Vanderbilt swimming and diving team. The Commodores train and host home meets in the Sportsplex.

In fall of 2008, a state-of-the-art digital scoreboard was installed on the east side of the competition pool, allowing spectators and coaches to see the times of all competing lanes.

Opened in 1990, the Centennial Sportsplex is Middle Tennessee's ultimate fitness, recreation and sports complex. A \$20 million and 145,000 square-foot facility, the Sportsplex is a year-round facility for ice skating, fitness, swimming and tennis.

The Aquatics Center contains two pools, including a 50 meters by 25 yards competition pool. There is also a diving well with a depth of 14 feet that has two one-meter and two three-meter spring boards.

The Sportsplex also contains an Ice Center, complete with two full-size ice rinks. The National Hockey League's Nashville Predators hold their practices in the Sportsplex's Ice Center.

A 2,400 square foot fitness center is also located at the Centennial Sportsplex. The fitness center contains weight machines, treadmills, stair machines, exercise cycles and rowing.

The Sportsplex has hosted exciting national events such as the US Senior and Junior National Swim meets, the YMCA National Swim Meet, the US Water Polo Olympic Trials, the US Figure Skating Championships, the Virginia Slims Tennis Championships and the USTA Women's Challenger.
