## BULLDOGS RETURN HOME AFTER BREAK, FACE RANKED OPPONENT

Mississippi State returns home nearly a month after its last contest at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field to face Southeastern Conference Eastern Division foe Vanderbilt. The Bulldogs and the Commodores have not played since MSU Head Coach Sylvester Croom's first season in Starkville. The game will not be televised live and will kick off at 1:30 p.m. CT.

### STATE LOOKS FOR FIRST SEC WIN

Mississippi State will play its third Southeastern Conference foe when Vanderbilt arrives on Saturday and it will be the third ranked SEC team State will face. The Bulldogs dropped a 3-2 decision to Auburn at home and a 34-24 game at LSU in their last game.

### DOGS, 'DORES UNCOMMON OPPONENTS THROUGH THE YEARS

Despite both being charter members of the Southeastern Conference, Mississippi State and Vanderbilt have only faced each other 19 times on the gridiron. In fact, the two teams have only played each other four times in the past 19 years.

### STATE LOOKS TO END STREAK AGAINST ROTATING EASTERN DIVISION FOES

With Vanderbilt visiting the Bulldogs this weekend, it will mark the 13th game for State against a non-permanent Eastern Division opponent since the SEC adopted the current rotation prior to the 2002 season (Kentucky is State's permanent opponent from the Eastern Division). MSU has won only two of those previous 12 contests - a win over Vanderbilt in 2003 and a victory over 20th-ranked Florida in 2004. Since that Florida game, State has dropped six straight against such opponents.

### CAMERAS NOT ROLLING BECOMING RARITY FOR BULLDOGS

Mississippi State's game with Vanderbilt will be only the second game this season not televised live by one of the Southeastern Conference television partners. State won its first non-televised affair, a 34-10 victory over Southeastern Louisiana in early September.

### HARBISON, SISK WORKED TOGETHER AT CLEMSON

MSU defensive coordinator Charlie Harbison and Vanderbilt strength and conditioning coach John Sisk worked together when the two were at Clemson in 1997. Harbison served as the defensive backs coach on that Peach Bowl-bound team while Sisk was an assistant strength coach.

### TURNER WAS ON NC STATE STAFF WITH CAIN, CALDWELL AND KISER

Mississippi State defensive line coach David Turner worked with the defensive ends and linebackers at North Carolina State in 1995 and 1996 while Vanderbilt assistants Ted Cain (offensive coordinator) Robbie Caldwell (offensive line) and Jimmy Kiser (receivers) all served on the offensive staff.

### BULLDOGS BEGIN TENNESSEE MONTH WITH VANDY CONTEST

Mississippi State plays only three games in the month of October, and each game will feature an opponent from the Volunteer State. Beginning with Vanderbilt at home, State's month will also feature a trip to Knoxville to play Tennessee and a visit by Middle Tennessee State.

### PAIR OF DOGS CALL TENNESSEE HOME

Despite the proximity, only two Mississippi State players hail from Tennessee, Wade Bonner (Mason) and Blake McAdams (Ripley).

### DOG 'D' RANKS AMONG NATION'S BEST IN PASS DEFENSE

Nearly midway through the season, Mississippi State's defense ranks among the nation's leaders in pass defense. State is 25th nationally in pass efficiency defense (104.53) and 11th in the country in passing yards allowed per game (153.4).

### DEFENSE RACKING UP NEGATIVE PLAYS

Mississippi State defenders rank 27th nationally and fourth in the Southeastern Conference with an average of 6.6 tackles-for-loss each game. State posted a season-best 12 tackles behind the line of scrimmage against Auburn in its first conference game of the season.

Coach Croom will join the league's other 11 coaches on the SEC's Wednesday teleconference. Coach Croom's seven-minute segment is scheduled from 11:03-11:10 a.m. (CT). The teleconference phone number can be obtained by calling the MSU Athletic Media Relations office.

### WEEKLY PLAYER INTERVIEWS

During game week, all player interviews must be conducted by Tuesday evening and need to be arranged at least 24 hours in advance. Players MAY NOT be interviewed after Tuesday evening. Players will be notified of requested telephone interviews via a message placed on the player's locker. The player will call following practice at his convenience.

### PRACTICE COVERAGE

The first six periods (approximately one hour) of MSU's practice sessions are open to the media (still photo & TV video). The remainder of practice is closed to the media who may return following practice for interview purposes.

## B-MAC STILL AMONG CONFERENCE LEADERS

After a disappointing two-catch season in 2007, junior wide receiver Brandon McRae is making up for lost time in a big way. The Chester, Va., native has hauled in 28 passes on the season for 263 yards and a pair of touchdowns. McRae's 10-catch, 102-yard game against Georgia Tech set new career highs in both categories. He currently ranks second in the SEC with a 5.6-catch-per-game average.

## PEGUES CONTINUES TO CLIMB KICK RETURN CHARTS

Senior safety Derek Pegues has played in 40 games during his MSU career and he currently holds the Mississippi State record for kickoff returns in a career (93) and is 14 shy of setting the SEC career mark. His 2,151 career kickoff return yards is also a school record, as he passed Tony James (1,862, 1989-92) earlier this year. With 18 more yards, he will move ahead of Domanick Davis (LSU, 1999-2002, 2,168) for third all time in the Southeastern Conference.

## PEGUES FINDS NAME ON OTHER LISTS AS WELL

Pegues also holds the MSU school record with three interception returns for touchdowns, which is tied for second in the SEC. Also, his 11 total interceptions tie him for third in school history in that category.

He currently stands in fifth all time in the conference record books with 159 career total kick returns (64 punt/95 kickoff) and fourth in total return yardage with 2,842 (691 punt/2,151 kickoff).

## PEGUES AGAIN NAMED TO THORPE AWARD LIST

Derek Pegues was selected to the 2008 Jim Thorpe Award watch list, an honor given annually to the nation's best college defensive back. Pegues was one of just 40 defensive backs nationally to be included on the initial watch list, one of only eight named to the list for the second-consecutive season. He was also selected first-team pre-season all-Southeastern Conference by both the league's coaches and the media.

## BOWMAN BLOWS UP AGAINST TIGERS

Senior defensive tackle Jessie Bowman enjoyed the most productive game of his career with an eight-tackle performance against Auburn in Week 3. Bowman also notched three and a half tackles-for-loss and forced a fumble. The tackles-for-loss were the most by a Bulldog defender since Titus Brown recorded 3.5 TFLs against Tulane in 2006. For his efforts, Bowman was honored as the Southeastern Conference Defensive Lineman of the Week.

## BUTKUS AWARD CANDIDATE CHANEY OUT FOR SEASON

Senior Jamar Chaney led the Bulldogs with 89 tackles from his middle linebacker position a year ago, and was named to the Butkus Award Watch List over the summer. Chaney was a second-team all-Southeastern Conference selection by both the league's coaches and media prior to this season. While leading State with 12 tackles against Louisiana Tech, Chaney suffered a broken ankle on the game's final play. He underwent surgery the following day, and will miss the rest of the 2008 campaign.

In his absence, members of the defense have worn his jersey twice this season. Keith Fitzhugh wore #22 against Southeastern Louisiana and Dominic Douglas wore the jersey against Auburn.

## McADAMS CONTINUES HUNT FOR SEC PUNTING RECORDS

Senior punter Blake McAdams has started each game for the past four seasons for the Bulldogs, and his career numbers are approaching some of the all-time records set in the Southeastern Conference. McAdams set a new MSU school record for total punts with his 241 (previous: 217, Dana Moore, 1979-82). He is now only 36 shy of the SEC mark. His 9,540 total yards are a new school record and good for 12th in the history of the Southeastern Conference.

## SENIOR PUNTER HAS NIGHT TO REMEMBER AGAINST AUBURN

Blake McAdams punted 10 times for 381 yards against Auburn in State's SEC opener, pinning the Tigers inside the 20 three times. He also held Auburn return specialist Robert Dunn - who entered the game as the SEC's top punt returner - to just two returns for 22 yards.

## FITZHUGH, PEGUES HAVE ONLY PICKS

Senior safety Keith Fitzhugh picked off a pair of Louisiana Tech passes in the season opener and Derek Pegues intercepted an LSU attempt in the Bulldogs last game. Those are the only interceptions tallied by an MSU defense that picked off 18 passes and returned five for touchdowns a year ago.

## WRIGHT IN RIGHT PLACE, MAKES MOST OF FIRST CAREER STARTS

Sophomore linebacker K.J. Wright earned his first career start in the season opener and posted six total tackles and a team-best two tackles for loss. He followed that performance up against SLU with his first career sack. Wright leads the team with six tackles for loss and is second on the team with 27 total tackles.

## DOUGLAS MAKES MOVE TO MIDDLE, AGAIN AMONG DEFENSIVE LEADERS

Senior Dominic Douglas racked up the second most tackles among all Bulldog defenders a year ago, and lead the team

in stops twice. Against Louisiana Tech, Douglas was second on the squad with nine tackles, one shy of his career high (10, UAB, 2007). He currently ranks 11th in the SEC with a 7.2-tackle-per-game average, and at Georgia Tech started his first career game at middle linebacker. Douglas had started 14 times previously at weakside linebacker.

## FERGUSON GETS RARE FRESHMAN START

True freshman Sean Ferguson became just the second Mississippi State player in the past 22 years to start his first career game when he lined up at defensive end against Louisiana Tech.

## BAILEY BECOMING DEFENSIVE FORCE

Senior Tim Bailey, in his first season as a starter at defensive end has been a constant in the offensive backfield. He finished with two tackles, two pass deflections and a career-best five quarterback hurries against Tech, recorded his first career sack against Southeastern Louisiana and currently has 4.0 tackles for loss on the season.

## DIXON CONTINUES TO CLIMB UP MSU CAREER CHARTS

With 320 yards on 71 carries in the first five games of the season, Mississippi State junior tailback Anthony Dixon has now compiled 2,054 rushing yards on 527 attempts in 30 career games. The Terry, Miss., native stands fourth all time in attempts and became the school's 10th 2,000-yard rusher. His 26 rushing touchdowns also ranks second on the schools charts (Michael Davis, 27, 1991-94).

## "BOOBIE" BREAKS BIG PLAY

Dixon, playfully called "Boobie" by friends, busted a 71-yard rush in the first quarter of State's game at Georgia Tech. It was the longest rush of his career, and the longest rush by a Bulldog since Jerious Norwood's 76-yard scamper against Florida in 2005. Dixon's previous career best was a 65-yard carry against Arkansas in 2006.

## BRIGNONE BECOMING LEADER OF OFFENSIVE FRONT

Sophomore center J.C. Brignone has eclipsed the 80 percent mark in his blocking grade each of the past four games. He has played every snap of the last three games, posting nine knockdowns against Auburn and six at Georgia Tech.

## SHERROD BACK TO FULL STRENGTH, HAS BEST GAME AGAINST TIGERS

Sophomore offensive tackle Derek Sherrod missed the last week of preseason practice and the season-opener at Louisiana Tech while suffering from an infection. He returned to play in week two, and returned to his starting role against Auburn. Against LSU, he had the highest graded game of his career, posting a 92 percent while playing every snap.

The Bulldogs answered in the closing seconds of the period, driving 57 yards on six plays, and taking the lead on a 10-yard touchdown run by Jerious Norwood.

On the ensuing possession, Vanderbilt sustained a drive of 69 yards on nine plays and capitalized when Cutler found the end zone on a 26-yard run. After an MSU punt, Vanderbilt took advantage of a short field and took the ball into the end zone on a Steven Bright 1-yard run. VU led 17-7 with 8:37 left to play in the first half.

The 'Dores would score once more just before the half, turning a Bulldog interception into a touchdown in five plays, scoring on a 13-yard pass connection from Cutler to Erik Davis.

The third quarter was a battle of punting as neither team could sustain a significant drive. But with 4:41 left in the period, VU picked off a pass from MSU reserve signal caller Mike Henig at the State 14 and scored two plays later on a Matthew Tant 8-yard run and led 31-7.

MSU ended the evening's scoring on a late 62-yard drive that ended on a Norwood 5-yard run. The Bulldogs came up short on the two-point try and Vanderbilt ran down the remaining 2:28 on the clock to preserve a 31-13 victory.

The Vanderbilt ground attack, led by Cutler and Norval McKenzie, produced 228 yards and three touchdowns on 49 rushes. Cutler and McKenzie each had 49 yards rushing while Tant and Jeff Jennings combined for 70 more. Cutler also led the Commodores in passing, completing 10-of-17 aerials for 91 yards and a score.

The Bulldogs' star of the night was Norwood who rushed 12 times for 67 yards and was responsible for 12 of MSU's 13 points with his two TD scampers.

RUSTON, La. – Five Mississippi State turnovers, coupled with a strong second-half defensive effort from Louisiana Tech, ultimately led to a 22-14 victory for the homestanding Bulldogs over the visiting Bulldogs Saturday night at Joe Aillet Stadium in the 2008 season opener for both teams.

It was Tech's second straight win over MSU, paired with a 1996 triumph in Starkville, and the first-ever meeting in Ruston. MSU still leads the series 7-3.

Star running back Anthony Dixon led State with 91 yards on 18 carries. Aubrey Bell hauled in six passes for 67 yards for the Bulldogs. Wesley Carroll and Tyson Lee platooned under center. Carroll was 12-of-25 for 172 yards and a touchdown, but was also picked off three times on the night. Lee was efficient in his backup role, completing 10-of-15 aeriels for 85 yards. Jamar Chaney led MSU defensively with 12 tackles. Keith Fitzhugh picked off two passes for State as well.

State led 14-9 at halftime, but LTU shut out MSU in the second half of play, aided by three third-quarter miscues. On returning the opening kickoff of the third period, State's Wade Bonner fumbled while trying to elude a tackler, giving LTU excellent field position at the MSU 30. But after the first two plays of the drive netted just one yard, Tech's Taylor Bennett was intercepted by Fitzhugh, the second pickoff of the evening for the Bulldog defensive back.

After the teams traded stalled drives, another Mississippi State miscue would setup a go-ahead touchdown for the homestanding Bulldogs. LTU punter Chris Keagle's punt sailed over the shoulder of MSU's Jamayel Smith, who fumbled while trying to haul in the kick. The fumble was ultimately recovered by Tech at the State 9. Four plays later, Louisiana Tech was in the end zone. The short drive was capped by a six-yard run from Patrick Jackson and LTU led 16-14 with 6:30 to go in the third quarter.

Tech used yet another MSU turnover to add to its lead just before the end of the third. With State driving deep in Tech territory, Carroll was picked off for the third time on the night, as Deon Young returned the ball to the 50. A State personal foul added 15 more yards to the end of the runback, giving LTU another short field to work with. The home team was able to manufacture one first down and gain 24 yards to set up a Chad Oestrieher 28-yard field goal.

In the fourth, Tech continued its strong defensive effort, holding MSU without a first down in the quarter. Midway through the period, Oestrieher connected on a 50-yard field goal to hand the homestanding Bulldogs a 22-14 lead with 6:48 to go in the contest.

After mustering just a yard on three downs on the ensuing drive, State caught a big break when the resulting punt careened off the back of Tech's unsuspecting Steven Howze. MSU recovered at the LTU 47-yard line, but could not capitalize.

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Behind a stout defensive effort and solid offensive performance, Mississippi State kicked off its 2008 home opener against Southeastern Louisiana in commanding fashion on Saturday night at Scott Field, 34-10.

The Bulldogs (1-1), who host Auburn next, totaled 401 yards and limited the Lions to just eight first downs and 148 yards of offense.

SLU attacked first with a 46-yard field goal by Jeff Turner in the opening frame, but MSU answered quickly with a 50-yard reception by Marcus Green to set up Anthony Dixon's 14-yard touchdown, giving the Bulldogs a 7-3 advantage, one it never relinquished.

The second quarter began with a drive by MSU, resulting in a 33-yard field goal by Adam Carlson. Two drives later, the Bulldogs marched down the field once again for another 41-yard field goal from Carlson, making the score 13-3. With 10 seconds left in the first half, Wesley Carroll connected with tight end Austin Wilbanks on a 1-yard pass, stretching MSU's lead to 20-3.

Early in the third frame, MSU showed no mercy as Dixon rushed for another touchdown. SLU tried to fight back, coming up short with a fumble recovered by MSU's Cortez McCraney. The recovery put the Bulldogs at the SLU 27-yard line. Déjà vu occurred as Dixon rushed eight yards for yet another MSU touchdown, which placed him second on the school's all-time list behind Michael Davis with 25.

The Lions (1-1) finally found the end zone at the 4:54 mark of the fourth quarter when Jay Lucas rushed for a 1-yard scoring plunge for the game's final points.

SLU finished with just 33 yards on the ground, while MSU amassed 216. The junior Dixon led all rushers with 80 yards on 18 carries, while Christian Ducre totaled 67 yards on 10 carries.

The Bulldogs, who bounced back nicely following their 22-14 setback at Louisiana Tech last week, also threw for 185 yards, as three different quarterbacks saw action. Carroll, who started the game, was 15 of 23 for 158 yards and two touchdowns. Tyson Lee came off the bench and completed all three of his attempts for 27 yards.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - With 7:28 left in the opening half, Wes Byrum connected on a 35-yard field goal to give Auburn a 3-0 advantage. As it turned out, that's all the points the No. 9 Tigers needed as they relied heavily on their defense the remainder of the game to hold off a stingy Mississippi State squad in front of 52,911 fans at Scott Field, the school's fifth-largest crowd.

For the Bulldogs, who fell to 1-2 overall and 0-1 in Southeastern Conference play, their only points were the result of a safety that came on a holding call charged to Auburn center Ryan Pugh in the end zone with 7:06 left in the game.

The play was set up when MSU senior punter Blake McAdams pinned the Tigers at their own 3-yard line following a 52-yard punt.

However, the Bulldogs failed to capitalize on their ensuing possession when they didn't convert on fourth-and-inches at the Auburn 41 in a drive that started at the 50.

MSU also missed out on a golden opportunity early in the third quarter when Adam Carlson missed a 38-yard field goal.

But it wasn't just Carlson that misfired on this muggy night, where the 1998 Western Division championship team was honored at the half. Byrum had two misses himself, from 42 and 22 yards, respectively.

The Tigers, who avenged last year's 19-14 setback on the Plains, also had three fumbles, while the Bulldogs' lone turnover was the result of an interception thrown by

sophomore quarterback Wesley Carroll, who was 10-of-25 passing for 78 yards.

State, which travels to Georgia Tech next week, managed just 116 yards of total offense. And it certainly didn't help that starting running back Anthony Dixon was severely slowed with a pulled groin he aggravated early in the first quarter. He managed just five yards on seven carries, while Christian Ducre paced the Bulldogs with 49 yards on 16 touches.

Auburn (3-0, 1-0), which plays host to No. 7 LSU next week, amassed 315 yards, with 161 coming on the ground. Ben Tate did a bulk of the damage with 92 yards, 39 coming on one play in the waning seconds. Brad Lester accumulated 51 before being carted off the field early in the third with a neck injury.

The success Mississippi State enjoyed defensively can be attributed to Dominic Douglas and Jessie Bowman, who accounted for eight stops each.

Bowman's total was a career high, and he was also credited with 3.5 tackles behind the line of scrimmage.

As for the score, the five combined points were the fewest ever in this series, which dates back to 1905. It was also the first time MSU has been involved in a game with the final outcome of 3-2.

It was the fewest points the Bulldogs have yielded since defeating Jacksonville State 35-3 on Oct. 14, 2006.

ATLANTA, Ga. - A potent Georgia Tech rushing attack, coupled with a solid defensive effort and Mississippi State miscues, led the Yellow Jackets to a 38-7 victory over the visiting Bulldogs Saturday afternoon at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

Tech (3-1) rushed 54 times for 438 yards on the afternoon, including four touchdowns, and tallied exactly 500 yards in total. The effective ground game was led Jonathan

Dwyer, who amassed 141 yards and a score on nine carries and also hauled in one pass for 20 yards. Three other Yellow Jackets - Jaybo Shaw, Greg Smith and Embry Peeples - rushed for over 50 yards and a touchdown each.

State (1-3) manufactured 407 yards of total offense of its own on the afternoon, but could never capitalize when it penetrated into GT territory other than a single score late in the contest. Highlighting MSU's offensive day was receiver Brandon McRae, who hauled in 10 aeri-als for 102 yards. Star running back Anthony Dixon totalled 94 yards on 13 rushes.

Tech opened the game with an impressive 11-play, 79-yard scoring drive, with all 11 plays being rushes. The touchdown came on a 7-yard run by the running back Peeples.

State would assist Tech's second score of the afternoon, as a bad snap on the ensuing drive resulted in a fumble recovery for the Jackets at the MSU 40. On a second-and-long play from the 20-yard line, Shaw released the ball as he was being hit and found Demaryius Thomas in the end zone for a great catch as he was being shaded by State's defender. Tech led 14-0 with 6:06 to go in the first period.

State's next drive stalled as Adam Carlson's 18-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Michael Johnson.

The teams went scoreless until midway through the second period when the Yellow Jackets would take a 21-0 lead with 7:55 before halftime. Facing a fourth-and-3 at the Bulldog 25-yard line, Tech elected to go for it as Shaw exercised the quarterback option off the left side, split the defenders and darted to the end zone.

After State's second-half opening drive stalled inside Tech territory, it would not take the Jackets long to put more points on the board. On the first play from scrimmage in the second half, Shaw pitched to Dwyer who went 88 yards for a score, giving GT a 28-0 lead.

The Yellow Jackets added to their lead on their next drive, driving 53 yards on six plays to set up a 28-yard field goal from Scott Blair with 7:05 left in the third period.

Georgia Tech's running attack struck again early in the fourth period. An eight-play, 87-yard drive - all rushes once again - was capped when Smith escaped down the left sideline for 45 yards. Blair's extra point put Tech up 38-0.

State lone score of the contest came with 8:09 to go. Robert Elliott capped a 38-yard drive with a 6-yard touchdown run.

BATON ROUGE, La. - Mississippi State trailed by just seven at halftime, but fifth-ranked LSU scored the first 10 points of the second half and never looked back as the Tigers posted a 34-24 win over the visiting Bulldogs Saturday night at Tiger Stadium.

With the setback State fell to 1-4, 0-2 in the Southeastern Conference. LSU remained undefeated at 4-0, 2-0 in the league.

State got on the board first after Derek Pegues returned the opening kickoff 59 yards to the LSU 32. That set up a 42-yard Adam Carlson field goal. The Tigers matched that score with a field goal of their own on the ensuing drive. After stopping MSU on the next drive, LSU took the lead on its next possession, marching 88 yards for the score. Charles Scott's 1-yard plunge capped the Tiger drive.

The Tigers extended their lead to 17-3 on their next drive with a 61-yard drive. Once again, Scott provided a 1-yard touchdown, this one coming on a fourth down attempt with 10:10 to go before halftime. Scott led LSU's offensive charge on the night with 27 carries for 141 yards and two touchdowns.

An LSU fumble aided the Bulldogs in getting back into the contest with 2:20 remaining before the intermission. Taking the ball at its own 47, Anthony Dixon ripped off a 23-yard run for State to the LSU 30. Then, after starting quarterback Tyson Lee scrambled for 16 yards to the LSU 10, two Christian Ducre' 5-yard runs later had the Bulldogs in the end zone. LSU led 17-10 at halftime.

LSU scored the first 10 points of the second half on its first two possessions to take control of the contest at 27-10. On its opening drive of the half, the Tigers went 58 yards on six plays. The scoring play came when quarterback Jarrett Lee hit Brandon LaFell on a pass play, but LaFell fumbled into the end zone and teammate Richard Dickson recovered. On their second march, the Tigers went 45 yards before stalling at the State 22. David then punched through a 39-yard field goal and the Tigers led 27-10 with 4:42 to go in the third period.

The Bulldogs finally broke through for their first points of the second half with an impressive 18-play, 74-yard march that ended the third and began the final period. Christian Ducre' saw much of the work on the drive for State, both on the ground and also hauling in a couple of receptions. With LSU trying to mount a goalline stand, Dixon, who finished with 50 yards on the ground, finally punched in a 1-yard touchdown with 10:25 left in the contest. LSU led 27-17.

State did mount an impressive drive to close out scoring on the evening, marching 68 yards to paydirt. Ducre hauled in a Tyson Lee pass and took it 11 yards for the score. On the drive, Lee completed 4-of-5 passes for 63 yards and the touchdown, the big play coming on a 41-yard connection with Jamayel Smith.

MSU's Lee finished his first career start solidly by completing 17-of-26 passes for 175 yards and one touchdown. He did not throw an interception.
