### Homecoming At Georgia

Since 1922, Georgia is 69-17-2 in Homecoming contests. This year, Vanderbilt will be Georgia's opponent after the Bulldogs shut out Tennessee Tech 38-0 last year. It wasn't that long ago when the Commodores spoiled Georgia's Homecoming. In 2006, the Commodores left town with a 24-22 victory. It ended an 11-year winning streak in Homecoming tilts. Overall, Georgia is 18-3 against the Commodores on Homecoming.

The Bulldogs went 6-1 in Homecoming games at Sanford Field (1922-28) before moving to their current home in Sanford Stadium. There have been two ties on Homecoming. In 1938, Georgia and Georgia Tech played to a scoreless tie while the 1962 game between the Bulldogs and Kentucky ended at 7-all.

In records dating back to 1922, Georgia has outscored its Homecoming opponents 2,226 to 1,092.

Along with the game, the traditions include a Friday afternoon parade, former Redcoat Band members and UGA cheerleaders performing with the current squads during the game and at halftime. Also, a Homecoming King and Queen are crowned.

### 2009 Homecoming Flashback: Georgia Blanks Tennessee Tech

For the first time since 1981, Georgia posted a shutout on Homecoming, blanking Tennessee Tech 38-0. In 1981, Georgia beat Kentucky 21-0. The Golden Eagles were limited to 55 total yards of offense on 47 plays. This was the second lowest output by a Bulldog opponent in school history (the record is 39 total yards by The Citadel in 1958). The Golden Eagles had minus 13 yards rushing on 31 carries and 68 passing yards. The TTU rushing total was the lowest since Georgia held Kentucky to a record minus 50 in 1999.

Meanwhile, the Bulldogs scored 21 points in the first quarter to cruise to another victory. Senior quarterback Joe Cox was 6-for-6 for 80 yards with one TD (a 23-yard strike to freshman tight end **Orson Charles**) in the first half. He completed his first 10 passes and finished the afternoon 10-for-13 with 140 yards and two touchdowns. Georgia capped the first quarter outburst when freshman cornerback **Branden Smith** lined up at quarterback, took the snap, and sprinted for a 52-yard touchdown. Smith tallied 69 yards rushing in the half and 72 yards on three carries for the game. Defensively, **Marcus Dowtin** led the Bulldogs with seven stops and the team registered six sacks on the day.

### Georgia-Vanderbilt Series

Georgia and Vanderbilt resume their series this Saturday, which first began in 1893 in Nashville. Georgia leads the all-time series 50-18-2. The Bulldogs have won 14 of the last 15 meetings. Georgia registered a 34-10 win last year in Nashville. In 2008, the Bulldogs enjoyed a 24-14 homecoming win between the hedges. Georgia head coach Mark Richt is 8-1 against Vanderbilt. The Commodores most recent win in the series came in 2006, a 24-22 decision here in Athens.

### Green Has Electrifying Return

**A.J. Green** made his 2010 debut versus the Buffaloes and picked up just where he had left off in 2009. Green had the fifth 100-yard receiving game of his career after hauling in seven catches for 119 yards and two touchdowns. In addition, he had a 40-yard end-around that set up an acrobatic one-handed catch in the end zone for the Bulldogs' first score of the game (**Green's catch was No. 1 on ESPN's Top-10 List following the game**). Versus the Volunteers, Green hauled in six catches for 96 yards and a score, in addition to returning one punt seven yards.

With 17 career touchdown catches, Green now ranks fourth in Bulldog history. Currently, he trails Terrence Edwards (30), Fred Gibson (20) and Brice Hunter (19). Green was suspended the first four games of the season by the NCAA.

## OFFENSE

### Murray Directing Bulldog Offensive Attack

Redshirt freshman QB **Aaron Murray** is coming off his best performance of the season during Georgia's 41-14 rout of Tennessee. Murray accounted for four touchdowns, (2 rushing, 2 passing) to help UGA snap a four-game losing streak. He started his first game for the Bulldogs in the opener and led them to a 55-7 win over Louisiana in the 2010 opener. He also finished with four TDs (3 passing, 1 rushing) in that contest, going 17-for-26 for 160 yards with one INT. Murray completed passes to nine different receivers as UGA totaled their most points since 2004 (62-17, Kentucky). At Colorado, Murray tied his career high with three TD passes after connecting with eight different receivers.



The 6-1, 209-pound Murray redshirted in 2009 after enrolling early at UGA in January of that year. Senior SS **Josh Murray** is his older brother who walked on last year following a five-year career in professional baseball and has traveled and dressed out for the Bulldogs last three games.

Freshman **Hutson Mason** serves as Murray's backup. On his first collegiate snap, Mason delivered a 26-yard TD strike to former QB **Logan Gray** and finished 2-for-5 with 33 yards.

**Did You Know?** According to the NCAA record book, Mason is only the second QB in NCAA Division I FBS history to throw a TD on his first collegiate snap (The other is Taylor Bennett-Ga. Tech). Also, Mason is just the sixth QB in NCAA history to throw a scoring strike on the first pass of his career. Mason is the first Bulldog to throw a TD pass on his first career attempt since RB Thomas Brown connected with QB Joe Tereshinski on a 9-yard trick play against Florida in 2005.

### Tight Ends Enjoy Bigger Role Vs. UT

The Bulldogs feature one of the deepest and most versatile groups of tight ends in the country. This corps was one of Murray's top targets versus the Volunteers. **Orson Charles** and **Aron White** combined four catches for 76 yards after Charles started his third consecutive game. Coming into the game, the tight ends had 10 catches for 124 yards through five games.

White got the start versus #12 Arkansas. He was named to this year's Mackey Award Watch List after starting 12 games as a redshirt sophomore last season. White was named the Offensive MVP of the Independence Bowl after hauling in two touchdown passes to conclude 2009.

### Pouring On The Points

Coming into the Tennessee game, Georgia had scored 42 points through three SEC games in 2010. The Bulldogs tallied 41 points versus the Volunteers. This marked the biggest output in an SEC game since the 52-41 win over Arkansas in Fayetteville last year. Georgia's scoring outburst against Tennessee was aided by three turnovers (two fumble recoveries, one interception) that the Bulldogs turned into 17 points.

### Durham Among Murray's Top Targets

While junior flanker **A.J. Green** was sidelined for the first four games, senior **Kris Durham** developed into Georgia's primary receiving threat. However, Durham was forced to sit out the Colorado game after suffering a stinger versus Mississippi State. But he is still enjoying a career season.

In the matchup with Mississippi State, Durham had four catches for 64 yards in the first half before having to leave the game in the second half. A week before, he hauled in a career-high 101 yards on five catches, including a 46-yarder, against #12 Arkansas. Durham was the leading receiver in each of the first three games. He has 18 catches for 341 yards and one touchdown on the year.

The top three most catches by a Bulldog senior are: Terrence Edwards, 59, 2002; Mohammed Massaquoi, 58, 2008; Hines Ward, 55, 1997. Edwards finished the '02 season with a school record 1,004 yards.

Durham redshirted in 2009 with a shoulder injury and sat out a portions of the 2008 season with ankle and hand injuries.

### Catching On

In addition to Durham and Green, sophomore SE **Tavarres King** returned to the lineup against South Carolina and then hauled in four catches for a season-high 91 yards and a touchdown against Arkansas. He followed that with 79 yards, including a 40-yard score, against MSU. Against UT, sophomore SE **Rantavious Wooten** had his first TD of the season after catching a 9-yard reception from Murray as King caught three balls for 48 yards.

Along with King, sophomore SE **Marlon Brown** and FLK **Logan Gray** provide additional depth. Brown had one catch against Colorado, pulling down the first TD reception of his career. The 6-5 Brown has seven catches for 92 yards in five games. He tallied a career-high 40 against the Gamecocks. Gray joined with Brown to have one of the better preseasons after Gray chose to convert to FLK after playing QB and returning punts his first two seasons. Against UL, Gray snagged his first career TD, a 26-yard TD from freshman **Hutson Mason**.

### Tailbacks Share The Load

The Bulldogs had four different leading rushers in 2009, but finished the year by employing a combination of **Caleb King** and **Washaun Ealey**. Sophomore **Carlton Thomas** is getting a chance for an increased role with the above duo this season, but missed the UT game with a hamstring injury. King returned to the lineup against Mississippi State after missing the past two games with an ankle injury and then had his second career 100-yard game against CU.

### Paving The Way For The Tailbacks

Seniors **Shaun Chapas** and **Fred Munzenmaier** have split time as the featured fullback for the Bulldogs after Chapas injured his ankle against South Carolina. Chapas was sidelined for the Arkansas game due to the injury but returned for limited action against Mississippi State. They both enjoyed a productive game against UL. They each had a receiving touchdown.

In his first three seasons, Munzenmaier had a total of three catches for 21 yards. Against Mississippi State this year, he collected five catches for 36 yards to give him eight on the year for a total of 55 yards.

## DEFENSE

### Three New Defensive Coaches, 3-4 Scheme Leads Bulldogs

Mark Richt retooled his defensive staff following the 2009 season. Georgia's defensive staff in 2010 is led by defensive coordinator/outside linebackers coach **Todd Grantham**, assistant head coach/defensive line/recruiting coordinator **Rodney Garner** (12th year at UGA), defensive backs coach **Scott Lakatos** and inside linebackers coach **Warren Belin**.

With Grantham running the defense, Georgia made the switch to a 3-4 alignment this spring. New terminology includes two ends, a nose with two inside linebackers and two outside linebackers. With this switch, the Bulldogs had six first-time starters versus UL. Georgia has had a total of nine first-time starters on defense.

Grantham came to Georgia from the Dallas Cowboys where he was the defensive line coach from 2008 to 2009. Before arriving in Athens, Grantham spent 11 seasons in the NFL but also has had assistant coaching experience at Virginia Tech and Michigan State.

### Tyson Anchoring D-Line

Junior **DeAngelo Tyson** has started five games at nose for Georgia this season. Redshirt freshman **Kwame Geathers** and sophomore **Abry Jones**, who got the start against MSU, help Tyson fill this role and also alternate at DE. Geathers notched a career-high three tackles against UL. Senior **DE Brandon Wood** got the first start of his career in the UL game and came away with three tackles, including one for a loss. Senior **Demarcus Dobbs** emerged as the leader to fill one of end spots on the line. Dobbs has a total of 16 tackles through six games this season, including 2.5 TFLs. Freshman **Garrison Smith** was in the rotation among the defensive ends versus Colorado, marking his first action of the year as he became the sixth true freshman to play in 2010.

### Houston Leading The SEC In Sacks

Thanks to another pair of sacks versus UT, junior OLB **Justin Houston** is now leading the SEC with six. Houston is also tied for second in the conference in tackles for loss (10.5). He exploded for a career-high 10 tackles, including two sacks, and forced a fumble against South Carolina. Houston tallied five tackles and three tackles for loss in the victory over the Volunteers to go along with seven QB hurries.

Despite playing in only 10 games as a sophomore at DE, Houston finished second in the SEC in 2009 with a team-leading 7.5 sacks and 15 tackles for loss.

### Putting A Dent In The Opposition

In Georgia's new 3-4 scheme, the linebackers play an important role in slowing the opposition's offensive attack - and senior ILB **Akeem Dent** has led the charge. Dent has registered three straight games with 10 or more tackles. He tied his career high with 12 tackles against the Volunteers (*previous career high came against Colorado*) and is tied for fourth in the league with 52 stops. Against MSU, fellow senior OLB **Darryl Gamble** picked off his first pass since snagging a pair at LSU in 2008. Georgia's fifth INT of the year came from junior ILB **Marcus Dowtin** against Colorado. It was the first of his career.

Versus #24 South Carolina, both OLBs - Houston and sophomore **Cornelius Washington** - posted career highs in tackles. Houston's 10 tackles and two sacks were complemented by Washington's seven tackles (six solo) and one tackle for loss. Sophomore ILB **Christian Robinson** has started every game and had a breakout day against USC. Robinson equaled his career high with five tackles and added a sack and a fumble recovery before adding another five against the Razorbacks.

### Retooled Secondary Adjusting To 3-4

Sporting three new starters in the secondary, the Bulldog cornerbacks and safeties recorded three INTs and allowed just eight completions versus UL. It was the first three-INT game for the Bulldogs since a 2008 win at LSU. Since the season opener, Georgia has only had three picks in the last five games and two were by linebackers.

Georgia's sixth INT of the year came against UT as redshirt sophomore **Bacarri Rambo** grabbed a pass that had been tipped by teammate **Vance Cuff**. Junior **Brandon Boykin**, who had one of the INTs against UL, is the leader in the secondary. He was fourth on the team in 2009 with 54 tackles and three interceptions while starting 12 of 13 games. Junior **Jakar Hamilton** has filled one of the vacancies at safety. He returned an INT for a TD, Georgia's first pick-six since Rambo did it against Tennessee last year. CB **Shawn Williams**, who got his first start against UT, tallied a career-high seven tackles (five solo) off the bench against #12 Arkansas. **Sanders Commings** started his first career game against the Razorbacks and answered with a career-high five stops, including half a tackle for a loss.

## SPECIAL TEAMS

### Georgia Kicking Tandem of Butler, Walsh Continues As Nation's Elite

Georgia junior punter **Drew Butler** and junior place-kicker **Blair Walsh** rank among the nation's best at their respective positions. In 2009, Butler was a consensus All-American and the Ray Guy Award winner, which is given to the nation's top punter. Walsh was one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award, which is given to the nation's top place-kicker. Both are again on the Watch Lists for their respective awards in 2010.

Butler became only the third Bulldog in school history to lead the NCAA in punting, joining Zeke Bratkowski and Bobby Walden. In 2009, Butler averaged 48.1 yards on 56 punts. So far in 2010, Butler has averaged 44.4 yards on 26 punts, eight that went for 50+.

In 2009, Walsh ranked among the best in school history in Field Goal Percentage for a single season and that's impressive considering his range. He drilled 20-of-22 FGs (90.9%) in 2009, including 4-of-5 from 50 or more yards.

Walsh has hit at least one FG in 14 straight games and 28 games in his career. He stands at the No. 3 spot in the record books with 110 consecutive PATs behind Brandon Coutu (114) and Billy Bennett (113). Walsh was 7-for-7 in PATs versus UL. He is now 11-for-12 on FGs for the year.

### KOR Record Watch For Boykin

In 2009, junior defensive back **Brandon Boykin** set the school record for kickoff return yardage in a season with 988 yards on 38 returns. It was also the most kickoff returns in a season, breaking the old mark of 28 shared by Gene Washington (1974) and Asher Allen (2007). So far in 2010, Boykin has 10 returns totaling 229 yards.

**Did You Know?** In 2009, Boykin became the first player in SEC history with two 100-yard kickoff returns for touchdowns in the same season. He had one versus South Carolina and one at Tennessee. Boykin, Vanderbilt's Warren Norman (2009) and Tennessee's Willie Gault (1980) share the SEC record for KOR TDs in a season with three. Boykin's 100-yard KOR against USC was the longest scoring play for Georgia in Sanford Stadium history.

### Did You Know?

Georgia had its second 7-second TD drive of the season at Colorado. Quarterback **Aaron Murray** connected with flanker **A.J. Green** for a 39-yard touchdown on the only play of the drive. The Bulldogs also had a 7-second drive against UL.

At Mississippi State, the Bulldogs drove 90 yards for a touchdown in just seven plays and only 25 seconds. QB **Aaron Murray** connected with SE **Tavarres King** for a 40-yard touchdown to cap the drive. Georgia leads all schools nationwide this year with six NFL captains, including a captain of the current Super Bowl champion - Saints tackle Jon Stinchcomb.

"We have a great coach, a great leader at Georgia (**Mark Richt**)," said former Georgia quarterback Matthew Stafford, a Detroit captain. "It probably rubs off on us."

### Durham A Semifinalist For William V. Campbell Trophy

Senior SE **Kris Durham** has been named one of 121 semifinalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy. Durham, who earned his undergraduate degree in Middle School Education with a 3.52 GPA and is currently in graduate school, is one of 47 players from the Football Bowl Subdivision and one of only six players from the Southeastern Conference on the list.

The only student-athletes eligible for the William V. Campbell Trophy, formerly known as the Draddy Trophy, must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

One of the past recipients of the Campbell Trophy is Georgia's Matt Stinchcomb in 1998.

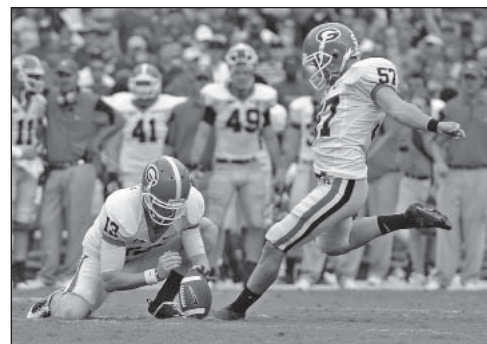
### A Closer Look At Butler & Walsh

In 2009, **Drew Butler** was in his first season as a starter, and all he did

was lead the NCAA with an average of 48.1 yards on 56 punts. His 57.0 average against #9 Oklahoma State was the second-best average for a game since 1958 (Bobby Walden, 63.0). Butler's 75 yarder against the Cowboys was the longest since Brian Mimbs booted a 77 yarder in 2008 versus USC. Butler also serves as the holder for **Blair Walsh**.

Butler is the son of former NFL standout and Bulldog All-American Kevin Butler. Butler is on Georgia's post-game radio show.

Meanwhile, Walsh's 2009 campaign was equally impressive as he ended up in the No. 2 spot in school history for FG accuracy in a single season. He hit 20-of-22 (90.9%). The record is 13-of-14 (92.86%) by Billy Bennett in 2000. Walsh's consistency made him one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award. Walsh connected on a 37-yard FG to beat Arizona State as time expired in 2009. This was the first game-winning FG for the Bulldogs since Coutu drilled one from the same distance to beat Vanderbilt in 2007 (*also a 20-17 win*). Walsh also hit a career-long 53-yard field goal at #9 Oklahoma State in 2009. Walsh's FG was the longest on the road since Hap Hines hit a 54 yarder vs. Kentucky in 1996.

### We Are Family

Freshmen twins **Alec Ogletree** and **Alexander Ogletree** are the first brothers at Georgia to play together in the same game since 1999. Against South Carolina, they took the field on special teams. Alec is a strong safety while Alexander is a fullback. Before the Ogletrees, Dustin and Miles Luckie in 1999 were the last siblings to play for Georgia in the same game. That year, Miles started all 11 games at center while Dustin started in seven games at end. Dustin and Miles were part of triplets that played for Georgia in the late 1990s.

There are three sets of brothers on the 2010 Bulldog roster. Along with the Ogletree twins, there's redshirt freshman starting QB **Aaron Murray** and senior walk-on strong safety **Josh Murray**; and redshirt junior **Josh Sailors** (FB) and redshirt freshman walk-on **Blake Sailors** (CB).
