### **VANDERBILT-GEORGIA SERIES NOTES**

- ★ Vanderbilt trails in the series with Georgia 18-50-2. In the last 25 games played between the schools, the Commodores are 3-21-1.
- ★ Vanderbilt's 2006 victory in Athens snapped a 12-game 'Dore losing streak to the Bulldogs that dated to a 43-30 Vanderbilt road win in 1994.

### KEY GAMES IN THE SERIES

- ★ 2007 An apparent Commodore victory went astray with 2:00 left when Vanderbilt TB Cassen Jackson-Garrison fumbled inside the UGA 10-yard line with the score tied 17-17. After QB Matt Stafford drove the Bulldogs 62 yards, Brandon Coutu's 37-yard FG as time expired sealed the Georgia comeback. win.
- ★ 2006 Vanderbilt played prehaps its finest game of the year, using a late fourth quarter rally to win 24-22 in Athens. It was Vanderbilt's first victory ever against a ranked opponent in its oncampus stadium. Bryant Hahnfeldt hit the game-winning 33-yard FG with :02 left.
- ★ 2000 Greg Zolman threw for 334 yards and a touchdown, but was unable to lead any late scoring drives in a 29-19 Vanderbilt loss.
- ★ 1994 TB Jermaine Johnson and QB Ronnie Gordon topped the 100-yard rushing plateau in 43-30 win. Johnson rushed for 176 yards sixth most ever while Gordon produced 126 yards and three TDs.
- ★ 1991 Commodore RBs Corey Harris and Sam Chalmers rushed for 169 and 111 yards, respectively, as Vanderbilt won 27-25 in Nashville. The Commodores battled back from early 14-0 and 17-7 deficits to take the lead, only to hold off a furious late Georgia rally.
- ★ 1985 Alan Herline's 46-yard field goal late in the third quarter produced the final points in a 17-17 tie between Vanderbilt and Georgia.
- ★ 1973 Vanderbilt PK Hawkins Golden booted four field goals
   still a Commodore single-game record in Vanderbilt's stunning
  18-14 win over Georgia in 1973. It represents the Commodores' only win in the series between 1962 and 1991.
- ★ 1961 Commodore QB Hank Lesesne connected on nine of 11 passes a school record 81.8% and three TDs in a 21-0 Vanderbilt victory in Athens.

# THE 2009 VANDERBILT-UGA GAME

# Georgia (84) at Vanderbill (10) Vanderbilt Stadium, Nashville (88,340) = Oct. 17, 2009 = SECTV

**NASHVILLE** – Joe Cox threw two touchdown passes, including one to Caleb King who scored twice, and Georgia beat Vanderbilt 34-10 on Saturday to snap a two-game skid.

Cox started slowly, missing on his first four passes with one interception. The senior got going with a short toss out to the league's top receiver, and A.J. Green took it 65 yards untouched for a TD in the first as the Bulldogs never trailed.

Georgia outgained Vanderbilt 399-296 on offense.

It wasn't enough as the Commodores lost their third straight. They got within the Georgia 28 twice in the first half and had to settle for a 41-yard field goal from Ryan Fowler while turning it over on downs on the other drive.

Smith was 11 of 26 for 121 yards. Playing in relief, Adams hit on 6 of 8 passes for 53 yards. Warren Norman paced the Commodore rushing attack with 52 yards.

# **SEEKING BACK-TO-BACK WINS**

The Commodores travel to Georgia Saturday in search of consecutive victories for the first time in more than a years.

The last time Vanderbilt captured consecutive wins were the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl (16-14 over Boston College) and 2009 season opener (45-0 Western Carolina).

Vanderbilt is coming off a 52-6 win over Eastern Michigan.

### **VANDERBILT IN 2010: LOTS OF YOUTH**

Looking for a quick description for Robbie Caldwell's first Vanderbilt squad? *Youthful* would work.

Five weeks into the season, the list of 'Dores seeing action features 21 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 13 true freshmen.

Only eight Commodore seniors have contributed this season.

### FIFTEEN NEW STARTERS THIS YEAR

Fifteen Commodores – eight on defense, six on offense and one specialist – have enjoyed their first career starts this season.

**Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr., RB) earned his first career start in the Commodore offensive backfield against Eastern Michigan.

Besides Reeves, the following offensive players have made their first career starts this year: **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., OG), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., LT), **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR), **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., OG-OT) and **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., WR).

Defensive players earning initial starts this year are **Archibald Barnes** (R-So., LB), **Nate Campbell** (R-Sr., LB), **Eddie Foster** (So., CB), **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety), **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., safety), **Rob Lohr** (R-So., DT), **Colt Nichter** (R-So., DT) and **Trey Wilson** (So., CB). Punter **Richard Kent** (R-So.) also is a first-year starter.

#### 30 'DORES SEE FIRST COLLEGE ACTION

Thirty Commodores have played their first snaps this season. Vanderbilt's first-time contributors are Mylon Brown (R-Fr., OG), Jabo Burrow (R-So., OG), Karl Butler (safety), Charlie Byrge (R-So., WR), Steven Clarke (Fr., DB), Eric Frieman (Fr., PK, Jay Fullam (R-Fr., safety), Chase Garnham (Fr., LB), Andre Hal (Fr., DB), Bobby Jewell (R-So., LB), Wesley Johnson (R-Fr., OT), Mason Johnston (R-Fr., TE), Richard Kent (R-So., P), James Kittredge (Fr., center), Jonathan Krause (Fr., WR), Kenny Ladler (Fr., safety), Fitz Lassing (Fr., TE), Taylor Loftley (R-So., DT), Reece Lovell (R-Fr., RB), Javon Marshall (R-Fr., DB), Jordan Matthews (Fr., WR), Walker May (R-Fr., DE), Thad McHaney (R-Fr., DE), Jared Morse (Fr., DT), Marc Panu (R-Fr., DT), Andre Simmons (Fr., safety), Carey Spear (Fr., PK), Logan Stewart (Fr., OL), Wesley Tate (R-Fr., RB) and Duane Vaughn (R-Jr., DB).

# THIRTEEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Only six teams across the nation have played more true freshmen than Vanderbilt this year.

The Commodores have played 13 true freshmen, including C/OG **Logan Stewart** and DT **Jared Morse** who saw their first snaps Saturday in the win over Eastern Michigan.

Florida and Air Force lead the NCAA with 17 true freshmen contributors.

Besides Stewart and Morse, other contributing first-year players are Karl Butler (safety), Steven Clarke (DB), Chase Garnham (LB), Andre Hal (DB), James Kittredge, (OC), Jonathan Krause (WR), Kenny Ladler (safety), Fitz Lassing (TE), Jordan Matthews (WR), Andre Simmons (safety) and Carey Spear PK).

#### CALDWELL: FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH

**Robbie Caldwell**, the 26th head coach in Vanderbilt football history, will be one of just 11 first-time head coaches in the NCAA FBS subdivision this season.

Caldwell, a veteran of more than three decades of collegiate coaching, was named to replace retiring Bobby Johnson on July 14. Caldwell and Kentucky mentor Joker Phillips are the SEC's only first-time head coaches this year.

Besides Caldwell and Phillips, other first-time FCS head coaches are Sonny Dykes (La. Tech), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), John "Doc" Holliday (Marshall), Mike MacIntyre (San Jose State), Larry Porter (Memphis), Jeff Quinn (Buffalo), Charlie Strong (Louisville) and Willie Taggart (Western Kentucky).

Caldwell has the most collegiate coaching experience of the 11 coaches, with Holliday having the second longest tenure.

### HAND NEWEST COMMODORE COACH

**Herb Hand**, a veteran offensive coach with excellent credentials, is the newest Vanderbilt coach. Hired in early August, Hand serves as offensive line coach and is the first staff hire by Robbie Caldwell.

Hand came to Vanderbilt after three years at the University of Tulsa, a tenure that featured some of the NCAA's most productive offenses. As Tulsa's offensive coordinator, Hand directed 2007 and 2008 offenses that topped the nation. Tulsa's 2008 unit averaged 570 yards and 47 points. Hand also spent six successful years with the University of West Virginia's productive spread offense before going to Tulsa.

#### BELIN NOW ON GEORGIA STAFF

Current Georgia inside linebacker coach **Warren Belin** spent the last eight years as a key Vanderbilt assistant.

Belin, 43, served in several role under former Commodore head coach Bobby Johnson. He was a mentor to linebackers for the entire tenure, while adding duties of special teams coordinator (2006-07) and recruiting coordinator (2008-09).

Belin mentored several Commodore standout linebackers, including All-SEC recipients Hunter Hillenmeyer, Moses Osemwegie, Jonathan Goff, Patrick Benoist and Chris Marve.



### COMMODORES FROM GEORGIA

Twenty-two players on the Commodore roster, including eight probable starters this week, hail from the state of Georgia.

Georgia is represented more than any other state on the Vanderbilt roster. Following the Peach state are Tennessee (16) and Florida (11).

This year, eight Commodores with ties to the Peach state have started, including TE **Brandon Barden** (R-Jr., Lincolnton), CB **Casey Hayward** (Jr., Perry), punter **Richard Kent** (R-So., Marietta), WR **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., Snellville), safety **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., Stone Mountain), RB/RS **Warren Norman** (So., Stone Mountain), OT **Ryan Seymour** (R-So., Kingsland), and WR **Udom Umoh** (R-Jr., Fort Valley).

Another prominent Commodore, DT **T.J. Greenstone** (R-Jr., Lawrenceville) is questionable against Georgia. He is one of four Vanderbilt team captains.

Other Commodores from Georgia are WR Chris Boyd (Fr., Roswell), OL Andrew Bridges (Fr., Atlanta), Blake Gowder (Fr., HB/TE), SN Conrad Quiros (R-So., Atlanta), DT Marc Panu (R-Fr., Mableton), WR Trent Pruitt (Fr., Fitzgerald), OL Grant Ramsay (Fr., Marietta, Ga.), RB Kennard Reeves (R-Sr., Duluth), DL Taylor Loftley (R-So., Chamblee), WR Jameson Sackey (R-So., Smyrna), LB Blake Southerland (R-Fr., Lawrenceville), LB Tristan Strong (R-So., Loganville) and DE Kyle Woestmann (Fr., Marietta).

### PREP TEAMMATES SQUARE OFF

Several Vanderbilt players will be facing close friends and former high school teammates when the Commodores and Bulldogs meet this Saturday in Athens.

- ★ Casey Hayward (Jr., CB) and Georgia's Ben Harden (Jr., OG) were standouts at Perry (Ga.) H.S.
- ★ Blake Southerland (R-Fr., LB) and Georgia's Christian Robinson (R-So., LB) both started at linebacker at Greater Atlanta Christian H.S. Southerland's older brother, Brannan, is a former starting fullback for the Bulldogs.
- ★ Zac Stacy (So., TB) ran behind blocks by UGA starting center Ben Jones (Jr.) at Bibb County (Ala.) H.S.
- ★ Three Commodores **Tray Herndon** (R-So., WR) and **Ryan van Rensburg** (R-So., FB/HB) and **Mason Johnston** (R-Fr., TE) played at The Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla., with two current Bulldogs: **Shaun Chapas** (R-Sr., FB) and **Brent Benedict** (Fr., OL).
- ★ Richard Kent (R-So., punter) and Kyle Woestmann (Fr., DE) were teammates with Georgia's Brandon Burrows (Fr., DE) at Walton H.S. in Marietta, Ga. Woestmann and Burrows were classmates who both played defensive ends.
- ★ Kenny Ladler (Fr., safety) and Mike Thornton (Fr., DT) were classmates and defensive standouts at Stephenson H.S. in Stone Mountain, Ga.

# MARVE HOPES TO RETURN THIS WEEK

Top Commodore tackler **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) hopes to return to action vs. Georgia after missing the last game to injury.

Marve underwent an arthroscopic procedure last week to repair a knee injured during Vanderbilt's 40-21 loss at Connecticut.

### **DUO AMONG NCAA STAT LEADERS**

A pair of Vanderbilt defensive standouts, **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Jr., DE), are among national leaders in key statistical categories.

Hayward, from Perry, Ga., shares the NCAA lead with four interceptions through five games. Fugger, of Oak Brook, Ill., ranks second in the nation with four forced fumbles.

Hayward, believed to be the first Commodore of the modern era to achieve interceptions in four consecutive games, also tops the squad with six career picks. Hayward's current interception total has been bettered by only four Commodores in the last 30 years: **D.J. Moore** (2007 and 2008), **Chris Donnelly** (1989), **Manuel Young** (1984) and **Leonard Coleman** (1982). The team's single-season record of eight interceptions is held by Coleman (1982) and **Thomas Wingfield** (1973).

Fugger's current forced fumble total is just as rare. Only two Commodore defenders since 1983 have posted more forced fumbles in a season than Fugger: **Jamie Duncan** (5, 1996) and Shelton Quarles (5, 1991).

### CALDWELL AS FIRST-YEAR COACH

How does **Robbie Caldwell** match up with other first-year Vanderbilt head coaches? So far, he's holding his own.

In just five games, Caldwell has matched the win total of four of the last six Commodore coaches.

Since Fred Pancoast's first team won seven games in 1975, the highest first-year win total was accomplished by Gerry DiNardo in 1991 (5).

# THREE CAPTAINS MISSED EMU GAME

Three of four Vanderbilt co-captains did not play against Eastern Michigan recuperating from an assortment of injuries.

**Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) missed the first game of his Commodore career recovering from a knee procedure performed earlier in the week. **T.J. Greenstone** (R-Jr., DT) missed his second consecutive game due to an ankle injury. **Adam Smotherman** (R-Sr., DT) continues to work hard to return to action from a knee injury suffered last spring.

### PENALTIES REMAIN CONCERN

Penalties remains a concern for the Commodores.

For the fifth straight game, Vanderbilt was flagged for more penalties than their opponents when they faced Eastern Michigan.

Vanderbilt ranks eighth in the SEC in total penalties (6.8 ppg) and 10th in penalty yardage (57.8 ypg).





# NOTES FROM EASTERN MICHIGAN WIN

- ★ Vanderbilt halted a seven-game home losing streak.
- ★ Vanderbilt produced 558 yards of total offense 205 rushing and 353 passing in the win over Eastern Michigan. It marks the team's highest offensive output since racking up 620 yards against Western Carolina in the 2009 opener.
- ★ The Commodores are 10-3 all-time against current members of the Mid-American Conference (MAC). Vanderbilt has won five straight games against MAC affiliates dating back to a 33-30 loss to Miami (Ohio) in 2000.
- ★ The 52 points scored by Vanderbilt was its most since a 58-point outburst against The Citadel in 1999.
- ★ Rob Lohr (R-So., DT) had a career game with six solo tackles. He dominated on one EMU possession early in the first quarter, making three consecutive tackles, including stops resulting in a 1-yard loss and no gain.
  - ★ It was a night of career highs for the Commodore offense:
    - John Cole longest reception (57 yards) and longest punt return (54 yards);
    - **Udom Umoh** longest reception (65 yards);
    - Larry Smith longest completion (65 yards to Umoh);
    - Mason Johnston first career catch went for 1-yard TD;
    - Kennard Reeves first career start at tailback;
    - Turner Wimberly longest reception (33 yards);
    - Zac Stacy longest rush for TD (61 yards);
    - Jared Funk first completion (57-yard TD pass to Cole);
- ★ Cole set a personal high with 103 receiving yards, the first Commodore receiver to surpass 100 receiving yards since Sean Walker totalled 138 against Duke on Oct. 25, 2008.
- ★ Larry Smith passed for 253 yards and two TDs. It was Smith's second highest single-game total, behind a 268-yard night at Rice last year.
- ★ The Commodore defense limited Eastern Michigan to 209 total yards and 10 first downs. The Eagles had just 91 total yards after the first quarter.

Of EMU's last 10 possessions, nine were 3-and-outs.

★ Richard Kent (R-So.) continues his impressive punting. Kent averaged 42.5 yards on four punts, with two being downed inside the EMU 20-yard line.

Though Kent's 39.3-yard average ranks 11th in the SEC, his effectiveness is exhibited by the Commodores' fourth place SEC ranking in net punting (38.1 yards).

- ★ The Commodores produced three quarterback sacks, registered by DE **Walker May**, DE **Johnell Thomas** and DE **Teriall Brannon**. The Vanderbilt offensive line allowed just one sack (coming late in the fourth quarter).
- $\star$  Senior linebackers **John Stokes** and **Nate Campbell** both contributed a pair of tackles for loss.
- ★ The defense limited EMU to just three first-down conversions in 15 attempts. The unit ranks second in the SEC behind Alabama in the statistic, limiting foes to a 32.1% success rate.
- ★ The Commodores tallied their initial points of the first quarter this season when Smith scored on a 1-yard plunge with 13:47 left.

### NORMAN MOVES UP RETURN CHARTS

Though just a sophomore, **Warren Norman** continues to move up Vanderbilt all-time kickoff return charts.

Norman, who did not have a return against Eastern Michigan, moved up one position to No. 9 all-time with a stellar performance at Connecticut. He returned four kickoffs for 162 yard against UCONN, including a long of 72 yards.

Norman is currently averaging 30.2 yards per return this year. He ranks third in the SEC – and 19th in the NCAA.

Norman's career average continues to rise also. He is now averaging 27.0 yards per kickoff, after setting a modern-day Vanderbilt team record in 2009 with a 26.2 yard average.

The Commodores scored 24 unanswered points in the second quarter against Eastern Michigan, one week after scoring 21 straight points in the second stanza at Connecticut.

Vanderbilt has outscored its opponents 68-31 in the guarter.

### WINNING TREND: 100-YARD RUSHERS

Success in the Vanderbilt running game leads to team success. Dating back to 2003, Vanderbilt has won every game in which its rushing attack features a 100-yard rusher. **Warren Norman**'s 111 rushing yards was a key factor in the Commodores' 28-14 victory at Ole Miss on Sept. 18.

Since the 2003 opener, Vanderbilt is 14-0 when a running back reaches 100 rushing yards.

### **VANDERBILT VS. NON-SEC FOES**

Vanderbilt is 14-11 in its last 25 games against non-Southeastern Conference teams. They are 1-2 in non-SEC play this year: beating Eastern Michigan 52-6 on Oct. 9 after earlier dropping decisions to Northwestern (21-23) and Connecticut (21-40).

Vanderbilt faces one more non-conference opponent: Wake Forest of the ACC in the season finale.

# STOKES NOMINATED FOR SCHOLAR ATHLETE AWARD

Senior linebacker **John Stokes** (Sr., LB) has been nominated by Vanderbilt Athletics for the prestigious Scholar Athlete Award sponsored by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame.

Stokes, a native of Memphis, Tenn., is the Commodores' third leading tackler and tops the squad with a pair of fumble recoveries in his final year as a starter.

Stokes maintains a 3.8 GPA, majoring in Medicine, Health & Society. He is a two-time District IV Academic All-American, and is up for the recognition again this fall. The son of Vanderbilt graduates also received early admission into Vanderbilt's Medical School after his sophomore academic year on campus, and is expected to start postgraduate classes in September 2011.

Stokes also is involved as an executive board member of one of Vanderbilt's largest student organizations, Manna Project International. He serves as site development coordinator, in charge of planning and creating community service trips abroad during Spring Break 2011.

There have been four previous Vanderbilt recipients of the award: Hunter Hillenmeyer, 2002; Andy McCarroll, 1989; Doug Martin, 1974; and Wade Butcher, 1961.

### SMOTHERMAN STILL LOOKS TO RETURN

Defensive co-captain **Adam Smotherman** (R-Sr., DT) hopes to return to action as soon as this Saturday from an ACL injury that came during the first session of the teams' 2010 spring drills.

Smotherman started 23 consecutive games prior to the injury, second most on the team by only the 29 straight starts by LB **Chris Marve** (29) that ended last week.

# IMPROVEMENT IN TURNOVER MARGIN

Through five games, Vanderbilt is tied for third in the SEC in turnover margin. Vanderbilt has forced two more turnovers than they have committed. Only Alabama (+7) and Florida (+4) rank among of the Commodores and Georgia (+2).

Turnovers have been key in recent Commodores' last two games. In the team's Sept. 18 win at Ole Miss, Vanderbilt forced three turnovers, resulting in 14 points, while committing no miscues. At UCONN, Vanderbilt trailed in the stat 3-2, including giving up a 44-yard interception return for a score.

Positive turnover margin proved to be a key factor in the team's 7-6 season in 2008.

# JOHNSON: NAMED TOP SEC OL VS. OLE MISS

Redshirt freshman tackle **Wesley Johnson** earned the SEC's top weekly honor for offensive lineman honor for his play against Ole Miss Sept. 18.

Johnson recorded six knockdown blocks and produced key blocks on a pair of long scoring rushes.

Johnson became the first Commodore to earn SEC top offensive lineman honors since left tackle Chris Williams was recognized in 2007.

# MARVE, NORMAN PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Standouts **Chris Marve** and **Warren Norman** were playing up to their preseason hype.

Marve, a junior LB from Memphis, and Norman, a sophmore RB/RS from Stone Mountain, Ga., were both named first team All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers.

Both are performing well this year: though out last year against EMU, Marve ranks among the SEC's leading tacklers while Norman ranks among league leaders as an all-purpose performer.

Marve was named to watchlists for the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award. In his third season as a starter, Marve is trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn achieved the feat in 1998-2000.

Marve, who posted 121 tackles in 2009, opened this season with a 12-tackle performance against Northwestern. He is tied for second in the SEC, averaging 9.8 tackles per game.

Norman, the 2009 SEC Freshman of the Year, rushed for 75 yards and two TDs against Eastern Michigan. He leads Vanderbilt in rushing yards (65.4 ypg), ranks fifth in the SEC in all-purpose yards (142.8 ypg) and is the conferences' second leading kickoff returner (30.2 avg.). Just a sophomore, Norman tops all Commodores with 1,110 career rushing yards and seven rushing TDs.

Last year, Norman produced one of the most productive freshman campaigns in SEC history one year ago. He topped the SEC with 1,951 all-purpose yards, breaking the legendary Herschel Walker's freshman SEC record in the process, and matched another league mark with three kickoff returns for touchdowns. Norman also ranked seventh in the SEC with 783 rushing yards.

# OTHER TOP RETURNEES

CASEY HAYWARD (Jr., DB) Corner cover leads SEC with four INTs and seven defensed passes.

★ Hayward has interceptions in last four games.

**SEAN RICHARDSON (Jr., Safety)** Regarded as one of the SEC's top safeties, Richardson blossomed as a starter at strong safety in 2009, earning 84 total tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.

★ Richardson is SEC's sixth leading tackler (8.8 per game)

**BRANDON BARDEN (R-Jr., TE)** Finished 2009 with 29 receptions, good for 357 yards and a TD. Former prep QB ranks as Vanderbilt's active career leader with 65 receptions and 718 receiving yards.

★ Barden tops team in catches (17) and is tied for lead in yards (172)

**RYAN FOWLER (R-So., PK)** Untested entering '09, Folwer connected on 11 of his last 12 attempts, including final eight. Fowler's 16 FGs tied a school record, earning Freshman All-America and SEC honors.

★ Fowler is 3-4 on the season in FGs

T.J. GREENSTONE (R-Jr., DT) 2010 co-captain posted 38 total tackles and two QB sacks last year, but missed last two games with injury.

★ Greenstone has seven total tackles and one QB sack

# REMEMBERING RAJAAN BENNETT

The Commodores are without one student-athlete who was expected to be a key member of the 2010 signing class, **Rajaan Bennett**.

Bennett, a highly sought-after running back from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga., died tragically on Feb. 18, 2010. Bennett was the victim of a residential shooting that shocked the McEachern and Vanderbilt communities. On Sept. 3, the school honored Bennett by retiring his No. 5 jersey and erecting a monument at its football stadium.

At a memorial service days after the death, his literature teacher read an essay entitled "Strength" written by Bennett within a week of his death.

The essay closed with the following lines:

"There will never be a time that I will give up. I work hard at whatever I do for that man upstairs to smile down on me with the rays of the sun.

"My drive cannot be stopped or even slowed down, because every obstacle has a way around it.

"Every day I become stronger from the weights physically, the books mentally and life emotionally. There is no limit to my strength and at the end of the day, I want to be known as the strongest."

Bennett rushed for 1,857 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior captain, helping McEachern to an undefeated regular season. A Rivals' 4-star recruit and one of Georgia's most decorated seniors, Bennett earned the state's AAAAA Offensive Player of the Year Award. At McEachern, Bennett was a campus leader and honors student.

The son of Narjaketha Bennett and the late Charles Bennett, Rajaan is survived by a younger brother and sister.
