Upcoming Bulldog Schedule

- For the 12th consecutive year, Georgia will play Tennessee and Vanderbilt in back-to-back weeks.
- **VU:** Georgia leads the series with Vanderbilt 48-18-2, but will be trying to get back on track in Athens after the Commodores snapped a 11-game losing streak to the Bulldogs at Sanford Stadium in 2006.
- **UF:** Georgia and Florida will meet in Jacksonville for the 77th time. Georgia leads the all-time series 47-37-2 and downed the Gators 42-30 last year.
- **UK:** The Bulldogs lead the all-time series 48-11-2, but will be attempting to get back on track in Lexington after falling to the Wildcats 24-20 in 2006.
- **AU:** The Deep South's Oldest Rivalry will be renewed for the 112th time. Auburn leads the series with Georgia 53-50-8 but fell to the Bulldogs 45-20 in Athens last season.
- **GT:** Georgia is 7-0 against Ga. Tech under Mark Richt. The Bulldogs lead the all-time series 59-36-5.

Getting Early Experience

The Bulldogs have played 24 freshmen (12 true freshmen) during the 2008 season. Flanker **A.J. Green**, right guard **Cordy Glenn**, center **Ben Jones** and kicker **Blair Walsh** have all started games for Georgia as true freshmen this season.

Fast Facts

- Saturday's Georgia-Vanderbilt game will be the first meeting in the series that both teams are ranked in the top 25.
- It will be only the third time in school history that Homecoming will feature a pair of nationally ranked teams in AP polls dating back to 1936. In 1942, #5 Georgia blanked #2 Georgia Tech 34-0. In 1946, #3 Georgia crushed #7 Ga. Tech 35-7.
- Georgia is 2-2 against nationally ranked teams on Homecoming. Along with the aforementioned wins over Tech, unranked Georgia lost to #3 Tech 23-9 in 1952 and #9 Auburn beat unranked Georgia 14-0 in 1963.

Georgia-Vanderbilt Series

Since Mark Richt took over as Georgia's head coach in 2001, the Bulldogs have won six of seven meetings against Vanderbilt. However, Vandy won the last game against Georgia in Sanford Stadium after picking up a 24-22 win in 2006. The Bulldogs beat Vandy 20-17 last year with a field goal as time expired. Georgia leads the series 48-18-2 overall and is 24-4 in Sanford Stadium.

Inside The Numbers

Vanderbilt is averaging 24.5 points a game, while Georgia is putting up 33.0 points per game. In scoring defense, Vanderbilt is surrendering 16.3 points a game while the Bulldogs have allowed 18.3. The Bulldogs rank fourth in the SEC in punting (37.4 net average) and the Commodores are holding down the third spot (37.6). Vanderbilt (+7) is tied for second and Georgia (0) ranks sixth in the SEC in turnover margin.

The Bulldogs were nearly perfect in scoring inside the Red Zone before having two INTs against Tennessee. They are scoring at an 88 percent clip (21-for-24) with 15 touchdowns and six field goals. Before the Tennessee game, the only time Georgia had not scored inside the Red Zone was when they ran the clock out in the 27-10 win at ASU. The Bulldogs had the ball at the 1 yard line.

Simply The Best

Georgia has the SEC's best record during the last seven seasons as well as the last 12 seasons. The Bulldogs are 69-16 (.812) the last seven seasons and 112-33 (.772) during the last 12 years. Georgia is the only SEC team to be ranked in the AP Top 25 11 straight seasons.

Quick Starts Lead To Victories

In Georgia's five wins this year, the Bulldog have outscored their opponents 89-17 in the first quarter. In the season opener, the Bulldogs built a 24-0 lead over Georgia Southern and they jumped out to a 28-7 edge over CMU. Georgia trailed South Carolina 7-6 and led ASU 21-3. In Georgia's 41-30 loss to No. 8 Alabama, it was the Crimson Tide who had the quick start after building a 31-0 halftime lead. The Bulldogs got back on track against the Vols and built a 13-0 lead to start the game.

Homecoming At Georgia

Since 1922, Georgia is 67-17-2 in Homecoming contests. This year, Vanderbilt will be Georgia's opponent after the Bulldogs defeated Troy in 2007. The Commodores spoiled the 2006 Bulldog Homecoming with a 24-22 victory. It ended an 11-year winning streak in Homecoming tilts. Overall, Georgia is 17-3 against the Commodores on Homecoming, falling in 1922, 1994 and 2006.

The Bulldogs went 6-1 in Homecoming games at Sanford Field (1922-28) before moving to their current home in Sanford Stadium.

There have been two ties on Homecoming. In 1938, Georgia and Georgia Tech played to a scoreless tie while the 1962 game between the Bulldogs and Kentucky ended at 7-all.

In records dating back to 1922, Georgia has outscored its Homecoming opponents 2,163 to 1,078. (See chart on pg. 8 for entire Georgia-Vanderbilt Homecoming series)

Georgia Looks To Get Healthy

Senior MLB **Dannell Ellerbe** (knee) is expected to return after missing the Tennessee game while senior TE **Tripp Chandler** (shoulder) is doubtful for this week's game against the Commodores. Junior LT **Vince Vance** suffered a season-ending injury to his right knee during the Tennessee game and junior SE **Kris Durham** has yet to recover from an ankle injury which kept him out of action against the Volunteers. Junior DE **Rod Battle** (neck) returned to the Bulldog lineup against UT after missing three games.

Zero-to-Seventy in Seven Seasons

Mark Richt is one of only nine coaches who won at least 70 games in their first seven seasons (2001-07). His victories in that span included two SEC Championships and 24 wins over ranked teams.

Georgia has attended a bowl game every season since Mark Richt took over as head coach and the team's current streak of post-season appearances stands at 11, breaking the former school record set from 1980-89.

Aerial Assault

Georgia's top two receiving threats are freshman **A.J. Green** (29 rec., 441 yds., 3 TDs) and senior **Mohamed Massaquoi** (23 rec., 331 yds., 3 TDs).

Massaquoi recorded a season-high 103 receiving yards and one TD on five catches against the Vols. It was his second career game over 100+ yards and his first since a career-high 108 yards against Auburn in 2005. Massaquoi has caught a pass in 27 straight games. For his career, Massaquoi has 11 TD receptions.

Green was the top target against the Sun Devils after snagging eight passes for 159 yards (both career highs) and one TD. His performance earned him SEC Freshman Player of the Week honors. Green led the Bulldogs against Alabama with six catches for 88 yards and one TD. Green could become the first freshman to lead Georgia in receiving since Terrence Edwards (53 rec., 772 yds., 9 TDs) in 1999.

Against Tennessee, sophomore FB **Shaun Chapas** hauled in three passes for a career-high 64 yards.

Moreno Becoming Household Name

If you have not seen him play yet, you have probably seen **Knowshon Moreno** on the covers of *Sports Illustrated*, *ESPN The Magazine* and the *Sporting News*. Perhaps you saw him hurdle CMU's Vince Agnew en route to 168 yards rushing and SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors during the second game of 2008. Moreno is tied for 12th in the nation in scoring with 60 points. He made his debut as a punt returner against South Carolina. He had one return for 32 yards.



Knowshon Moreno

Moreno burst onto the scene in 2007 by recording 1,334 rushing yards and scoring 14 times. Moreno is trying to become only the second Bulldog in school history to rush for more than 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons. Herschel Walker did it all three years of his career (1980-82).

Youthful Front Again In 2008

Georgia's offensive line suffered another blow against Tennessee when junior LT **Vince Vance** went down with a season-ending knee injury. He is the second starting LT to suffer a season-ending knee injury this season after Freshman All-American LT **Trinton Sturdivant** was lost for the year in the preseason. Sophomore **Clint Boling** is projected to be filling in at LT. Boling filled in for Vance during the Tennessee game and was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week. After starting the first three games at RG, freshman **Cordy Glenn** is expected to return to the starting lineup.

A year after having three first-year starters, Georgia's offensive line featured new players at all five positions in the season opener. Then after the first three games, the Bulldogs revamped the starting unit again. For the Arizona State and Alabama games, Georgia's starters were Vance (LT), sophomore **Chris Davis** (LG), freshman **Ben Jones** (C), Boling (RG) and freshman **Justin Anderson** (RT). Georgia is averaging 33.0 points a game and 430.3 yards of total offense.

Injuries Hurt Tight End Depth

Redshirt freshman tight end **Aron White** got his first start against Tennessee because senior **Tripp Chandler** was out with a shoulder injury. Sophomore **Kiante Tripp** saw action at tight end against Alabama. Sophomore **Bruce Figgins** also played against the Volunteers. Figgins decided to delay shoulder surgery and not take a redshirt in order to help out at TE. Senior FB **Brannan Southerland** got some snaps at TE against the Vols because of his blocking ability.

Kiante Tripp is wearing his sixth different number (47, 64, 75, 92, 94 and current number of 83) since coming to Georgia. He started at DE, moved to OT, then was lining up at TE and now might have to move back to OT.

THE DEFENSE

Tradition Never Graduates

Willie Martinez is in his fourth year as the defensive coordinator and eighth overall on Mark Richt's staff. Since 2001, a total of 32 former Bulldog defenders have moved on to the NFL (6 off the 2001 team, 4 from 2002, 3 from 2003, 4 from the 2004, 5 from 2005, 7 from 2006 and 3 from 2007). Under Martinez, the Bulldog defense is +21 in turnover margin.

The 2008 Georgia defense features nine returning starters, highlighted by linebacker **Dannell Ellerbe** and cornerback **Asher Allen**. The Bulldogs' key losses were defensive end Marcus Howard, who had an SEC-leading 10.5 sacks and now plays for the Indianapolis Colts.

Looking To Setting The Tone

Georgia's defense this season has allowed 110 points this season and 41 of those came in the loss to #8 Alabama. The Bulldog defense has recorded 12 scoreless quarters through the first six games. Georgia has held four teams to under 60 yards rushing. The Bulldogs held Tennessee to 1 yard and Arizona State to 4 yards.

Opponents' ReoCURRAN Nightmare

Sophomore WLB **Rennie Curran** leads the team in tackles (47), including a career-high 14 (10 solo) in a loss to Alabama. Curran has been the Bulldogs' top tackler four times this season and also leads the team with 3.0 sacks (tied for fifth in the SEC). Sophomore **Darryl Gamble**, who started for the injured **Dannell Ellerbe** at MLB against the Vols, tied for a team high with five tackles against Tennessee. Gamble ranks second on the team with 25 tackles.

Curran provided the season's biggest defensive stop in the SEC opener against South Carolina and earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his efforts. With the Gamecocks aiming for a tying touchdown in the fourth quarter, Curran hit Mike Davis on the 1-yard line and caused a fumble that was recovered by junior **Asher Allen** in the end zone. This stop proved pivotal as the Bulldogs won 14-7. Curran, Allen and sophomore **Reshad Jones** tied for the team lead in tackles with six each. Curran followed up that performance with a team-high nine tackles against ASU and added a sack.

Sophomore MLB **Akeem Dent** was second on the team with 10 tackles (six solo) and a sack against the Crimson Tide.

Seasoned Secondary Leads By Example

The Bulldogs' starting unit features junior **Asher Allen**, junior **Prince Miller**, sophomore **Reshad Jones** and senior **CJ Byrd**. Junior **Bryan Evans** and sophomore **Vance Cuff** have also seen ample time in the defensive backfield while senior safety **Andrew Williams** has gotten his share of snaps in 2008. Miller set a career high with six tackles against No. 8 Alabama and recorded his first career sack against the Vols. Redshirt freshman safety **John Knox** got his first career start against ASU. Evans tied his career high with seven tackles (all solo) versus the Sun Devils. Jones had his third career INT to clinch the 14-7 victory over South Carolina. The Gamecocks were driving for a potential game-tying TD when Jones picked off a Chris Smelley pass on the Georgia 3 yard line.

Defensive Front Working By Committee

Through six games this year, Georgia has recorded 13 sacks. Redshirt freshman **Justin Houston** and sophomore **Demarcus Dobbs** each recorded their first career sack against Arizona State. Houston was rewarded with his first career start versus Alabama. Against Central Michigan, Dobbs snagged a pass that teammate **Prince Miller** tipped and returned it 78 yards for a TD with 1:10 left in the first half versus CMU. This was the longest INT return for a TD since 2003 (Odell Thurman, Auburn, 99 yards) and the 10th-longest in school history. Dobbs' INT for a TD was the first for Georgia since 2006 (Tra Battle, Auburn).

Senior defensive tackle **Corvey Irvin** recorded a career-high six tackles, including four solo stops, a sack, two tackles for loss and two pass break-ups versus CMU. Irvin's performance was a positive sign since the Bulldogs lost senior starting defensive tackle **Jeff Owens** for the season in the opener due to a knee injury. **Jarius Wynn** also gives the Bulldogs additional support in the middle.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Walsh Has Career Day

Bulldog freshman **Blair Walsh** scored a career high 14 points on four field goals (34, 20, 41, and 28 yards) and two PATs against UT. He has made 10 of his first 12 kicks. His two misses have come from 52 and 54 yards. He enjoyed a memorable start to his career as he scored nine points in the 45-21 victory over Georgia Southern. Then, his first career field goal attempt came from 52 yards out and he punched it through.

Walsh became the first Bulldog true freshman to kick in a season opener since All-American and eventual College Football Hall of Famer Kevin Butler in 1981. Walsh's field goal was the longest ever by a Bulldog freshman at Sanford Stadium.

Butler holds the school record with 11 field goals of more than 50 yards as well as the Georgia and SEC record with a 60-yarder against Clemson in 1984. As a freshman, Butler made a 52-yarder in victories at Ole Miss and at Georgia Tech. Butler's son, redshirt freshman **Drew**, made his debut for the Bulldogs with a 38-yard punt against South Carolina.

Mimbs Handling The Punts

Senior **Brian Mimbs** ranks fifth in the SEC with a 42.2 average. He is also the holder for Walsh. Mimbs was recently named a semi-finalist for the Draddy Trophy, which is college football's most prestigious academic honor.

Mimbs enjoyed a career performance during the win over South Carolina. On five punts, he averaged 52.2 yards a punt which ranked as No. 2 in school history (Bobby Walden vs. Texas, 63.0, three punts, 1958). With Georgia leading 14-7 in the fourth quarter, Mimbs came on to punt near his own goal line and booted a career-best 77 yarder to flip the field. Senior **Bo Fowler** resumes his snapping duties.

Redshirt freshman **Zach Renner** blocked his second punt of the season during the Alabama game. Kendrell Bell holds the school record with three blocked punts in one season.

Brown, Samuel Returning Kicks

Senior **Ramarcus Brown** is fourth in the SEC, averaging 25.4 yds./return. Brown had a season-long 44-yarder versus Arizona State. He had 146 yards on six returns against Alabama, which ranks No.4 in school history. Freshman **Richard Samuel** made his debut as kick returner against No. 8 Alabama and had a 41-yard return. He is now sharing duties with Brown.

Options At Punt Returner

Five different Bulldogs have returned a punt this season. Senior **Asher Allen** has 91 yards on five returns for an 18.2 average. However, junior **Prince Miller** made his case for the job as he is averaging 44.7 yards per return after scampering for a 92-yard touchdown against #8 Alabama.

2008 GAME SUMMARIES

GEORGIA SOUTHERN

August 30, 2008 • Sanford Stadium – Athens, Ga.

Georgia's Matthew Stafford threw for a career-high 275 yards and tailback Knowshon Moreno rushed for three touchdowns as the top-ranked Bulldogs earned a 45-21 season opening victory over Georgia Southern in front of sellout crowd of 92,746 at Sanford Stadium.

Georgia scored on its first two possessions to take a 10-0 lead and held a 31-0 advantage at halftime.

Georgia rolled up 535 total yards while holding the Eagles to 290 to improve to 8-0 all-time in season openers under Mark Richt. The Bulldogs built a 38-0 lead before Georgia Southern got on the board in the second half.

Stafford went 13-of-21 for 275 yards and two touchdowns. He had scoring passes of 61 yards to Kris Durham and five yards to Demiko Goodman. Reserve quarterback Joe Cox went 4-for-6 for 48 yards, including a 4-yard scoring toss to freshman A.J. Green.

Moreno gained 59 yards on eight carries, including scoring runs of two, three and 23 yards. He also had two receptions for 53 yards. Tailback Caleb King led the Bulldogs with 95 yards in his Georgia debut.

Georgia's other points came on a 53-yard field goal by kicker Blair Walsh. That was the longest field goal by a Georgia freshman in Athens. Walsh also kicked all six extra points.

Tackle Corvey Irvin and linebacker Darryl Gamble paced Georgia with six tackles each. Linebacker Dannell Ellerbe added five tackles and an interception in the end zone to thwart a Georgia Southern scoring chance.

CENTRAL MICHIGAN

September 6, 2008 • Sanford Stadium – Athens, Ga.

Sophomore running back Knowshon Moreno rushed for 168 yards and tied a career-high with three touchdown runs as the No. 2 Georgia Bulldogs defeated the Central Michigan Chippewas 56-17 in front of 92,746 fans and a FSN regional television audience at Sanford Stadium.

Matthew Stafford completed 18-of-28 passes for 213 yards, hooking up with Mohamed Massaquoi on a pair of touchdown passes. Massive defensive end Demarcus Dobbs rumbled for an improbable 78-yard score after picking off a deflected pass.

Georgia raced to a 28-0 lead over the Chippewas just before halftime, and stymied any hopes of a comeback with two big scoring plays early in the third quarter.

After Central Michigan closed to 28-14 on Dan LeFevour's second TD pass, Moreno put it away. The sophomore took the pitch on a sweep around right end, burst upfield when he spotted a hole, stiff-armed defensive back Eric Fraser and crashed off the pylon for a 52-yard score.

Moreno wasn't done, either. He capped a 99-yard drive with a 21-yard touchdown, the last of his 18 carries and equaling his three-score performances against Florida and Troy during a brilliant redshirt freshman season. He's off and running again with the seventh 100-yard game of his career.

LeFevour, who put up similar pass-rush numbers a year ago to Heisman Trophy winner Tim Tebow, was 23-of-43 for 248 yards, but ran just four times for 20 yards.

SOUTH CAROLINA

September 13, 2008 • Williams-Brice – Columbia, S.C.

A four-yard touchdown run by running back Knowshon Moreno in the third quarter proved to be the game-winner as the No. 2 Georgia Bulldogs earned a hard-fought 14-7 victory over South Carolina before 83,704 fans at Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia, S.C., and a CBS national television audience.

Georgia (3-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) forced two turnovers by South Carolina (1-2, 0-2) in the fourth quarter.

The first time came with about eight minutes left and South Carolina on Georgia 2. Tailback Mike Davis tried to leap the pile when linebacker Rennie Curran jarred the ball loose and into the arms of cornerback Asher Allen.

South Carolina got a final chance and drove to the Georgia 17. That's when Reshad Jones sealed things, intercepting Chris Smelley's pass with 13 seconds left at the 3.

The Bulldogs held South Carolina to 18 yards on 16 rushes. They also made sure the Gamecocks didn't ruin a second straight shot at a championship season.

For much of this one, it looked like the Gamecocks might do it again as the Bulldogs trailed 7-6 midway through the third quarter. Georgia had already muffed a scoring chance near the goal line, settling for Blair Walsh's 23-yard field goal after having a third-and-goal at the South Carolina 1.

Moreno, who finished with 79 yards on 20 carries, didn't squander the Bulldogs' next opportunity.

He ran left, then took a hard cut up the middle with his feet sliding out from under him. Moreno steadied himself with his right hand, then slipped through for his seventh touchdown of the year. Quarterback Matthew Stafford converted the 2-point try on a pass to receiver Kris Durham and Georgia led 14-7.

ARIZONA STATE

September 20, 2008 • Sun Devil Stadium – Tempe, Ariz.

Knowshon Moreno rushed for 149 yards and two touchdowns and A.J. Green caught eight passes for 159 yards to lead No. 3 Georgia to a decisive 27-10 victory over No. 24 Arizona State in front of 72,955 fans at Sun Devil Stadium in Tempe, Ariz., and an ABC national television audience.

It was Georgia's first regular-season trip to the West since a 1960 visit to Los Angeles to play Southern California.

The Bulldogs (4-0) allowed just four yards rushing against Arizona State (2-2), the Sun Devils' lowest rushing total since 2002.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Bulldogs scored three touchdowns in the second quarter. The first score came on a run when Moreno took a handoff at Arizona State's 9, sped around right end and catapulted into the end zone from the 4.

The Bulldogs' next score came after a fumble by Arizona State tailback Dimitri Nance. Five plays later, Moreno burst through a gaping hole in the middle of the line for a 3-yard touchdown to put the Bulldogs ahead 14-0.

Arizona State trimmed the lead to 14-3 on a 25-yard field goal by Thomas Weber. The kick capped a 10-play 75-yard drive -- and 40 of the yards came on Georgia penalties.

Georgia quickly responded as Matthew Stafford first it Matthew Stafford hit Green for 23 yards. Then he found Green between two defenders for a 31-yard reception. Three plays later, a wide-open Green caught a 14-yard pass in the end zone for a 21-3 Georgia lead.

The Sun Devils tried to make a game of it after halftime. They took the second-half kickoff and marched 71 yards in nine plays, scoring on a 6-yard pass from Rudy Carpenter to Andrew Pettes.

But the Bulldogs answered with a 29-yard field goal by Blair Walsh to push their lead back to 24-10 heading into the final quarter. Walsh made it 27-10 with a 22-yarder midway through the fourth quarter.

2008 GAME SUMMARIES

ALABAMA

September 27, 2008 • Sanford Stadium – Athens, Ga.

No. 8 Alabama scored on all five offensive possessions in the first half and raced to a 31-0 lead as the Crimson Tide defeated No. 3 Georgia 41-30 in front of 92,746 fans at Sanford Stadium and an ESPN national television audience.

The loss snapped Georgia's 11-game winning streak, which was the nation's second longest active streak of any Division I-A team.

Alabama quarterback John Parker Wilson completed his first seven pass attempts and finished 13-of-16 for 205 yards in leading the Crimson Tide to their first victory over the Bulldogs when both teams were ranked.

The Bulldogs scored 30 points in the second half, but it wasn't enough to overcome their largest halftime deficit since 1999. Prince Miller returned a punt 92 yards for a touchdown on the first play of the fourth quarter to pull Georgia to within 31-17, but Alabama responded on the ensuing drive with a Leigh Tiffin field goal to make it 34-17 with 9:45 left.

The Alabama defense stifled the Bulldogs' ground attack, limiting Knowshon Moreno to just 34 yards on nine carries. Matthew Stafford completed a career-high 24 passes for the Bulldogs.

The Bulldogs donned their black jerseys for the third time and ESPN's College Gameday visited Athens for the first time since 1998.

TENNESSEE

October 11, 2008 • Sanford Stadium – Athens, Ga.

Matthew Stafford passed for a career-best 310 yards, Knowshon Moreno ran for 101 yards and No. 10 Georgia beat Tennessee 26-14 on Saturday at Sanford Stadium before a sellout crowd of 92,746 and a CBS national television audience.

Freshman kicker Blair Walsh kicked four field goals. His final one came after a 17-play drive consumed 10:55 in the final quarter.

Georgia gained 458 yards on 81 plays and held Tennessee to 209 yards on 45 plays. Tennessee netted only one yard on the ground.

Stafford was 25-for-36 and a touchdown. Georgia didn't punt in the first half and gained 273 yards, including 211 passing by Stafford.

Leading 13-7, the Bulldogs took the ball on their 3 with 2:17 left in the first half after freshman Richard Samuel bobbled a kickoff. When Georgia faced a third-and-8 play, Tennessee called a time-out in hopes of getting the ball back in good field position. Instead, Stafford passed to Moreno for 14 yards to spark a 97-yard touchdown drive.

Tennessee was hurt by two personal foul penalties on Georgia's long drive. Safety Demetrice Morley drew a helmet-to-helmet penalty for his hit on receiver Mohamed Massaquoi, knocking Massaquoi out of the game for a few plays. Cornerback DeAngelo Willingham was called for a late hit on receiver Demiko Goodman on the Vols' sideline after Goodman's 17-yard reception.

Willingham's penalty gave Georgia a first down at the Tennessee 7 with 26 seconds left. On third down from the 9, Stafford passed to an open Massaquoi for the touchdown and a 20-7 lead. Massaquoi had five catches for 103 yards.

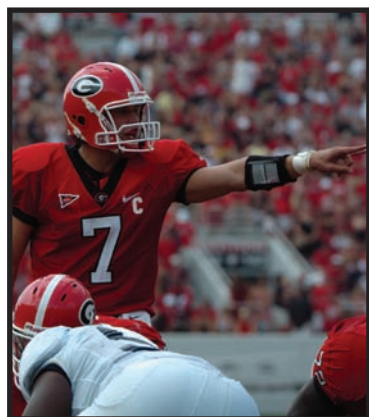

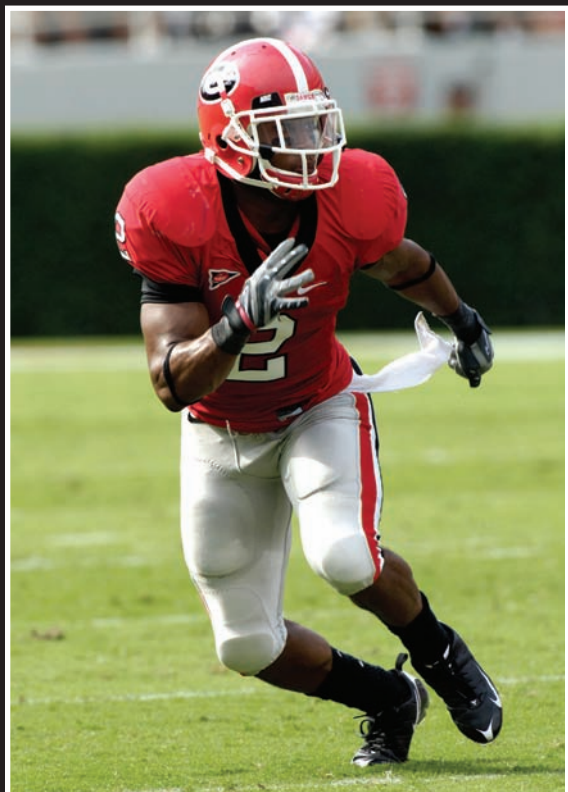
