### Duke Hits Road For Music City Showdown

The Duke Blue Devils (3-3, 1-2 ACC) will travel to Nashville, Tenn., on Saturday for a non-conference game against Vanderbilt (5-2, 3-2 SEC) at 3 p.m. in Vanderbilt Stadium. The game can be heard on the Duke Radio Network with **Bob Harris** (play-by-play), **Wes Chesson** (analysis) and **Anthony Dilweg** (sideline) calling the action. Both teams are entering the weekend with two consecutive losses. Duke suffered a 49-31 loss to Miami at home last weekend while Vanderbilt is coming off a 24-14 road loss to Georgia.

### 2006: Vanderbilt Downs Blue Devils 45-28

Commodores' quarterback **Chris Nickson** accounted for 400 yards of total offense and five touchdowns as Vanderbilt defeated Duke 45-28 in Durham. Vanderbilt scored 28 first half points for a 28-7 lead at halftime with Nickson rushing for two scores and throwing for two more. Duke trailed 38-7 in the fourth quarter before running back **Justin Boyle** brought the Blue Devils back with three rushing touchdowns. He finished the game with 14 carries for 113 yards and four touchdowns. Nickson carried the ball 15 times for 150 yards and three touchdowns in the game while throwing for 250 yards and two scores. Wide receiver **Earl Bennett** caught nine passes for 184 yards and one touchdown.

### The Duke-Vanderbilt Series

The Commodores lead the all-time series with Duke, 7-3. The first ever meeting between the two schools came in 1986 when Vanderbilt won 24-18 in Nashville. The Blue Devils won the next three contests in the series with all three victories by four points or less. The Commodores have won the last six meetings with the last game a 45-28 decision in 2006.

### Blue Devils Drop League Contest With Miami

Duke led 24-14 in the third quarter against the Hurricanes last weekend before Miami scored 35 unanswered points to break away from the Blue Devils. Backup quarterback **Jacory Harris** led Miami's comeback by accounting for five touchdowns, including a 15-yard run and four passing scores. Harris finished the game with 53 rushing yards on 10 carries while completing 18-of-28 passes for 185 yards and four touchdowns. Duke stretched the lead to 24-14 on a 10-yard touchdown pass from **Thaddeus Lewis** to **Raphael Chestnut**. Lewis finished the game with three total touchdowns (two pass, one rush). The Blue Devils forced three turnovers in the game with **Adrian Aye-Darko** recording two interceptions.

### Football Practices

The Duke football team conducts practice Sunday and Tuesday through Friday during the regular season.

The practices are generally open to accredited media for the first 20-30 minutes but individuals must let the Sports Information Office know of your desire to attend. Duke reserves the right to refuse any practice request deemed not to be in the best interest of the University.

### Media Parking & Will Call

The media parking lot is located to the west of the Wallace Wade Stadium in the Lot P off of Highway 751. The media Will Call is located at the West Gate of Wallace Wade Stadium.

### Duke Radio Network

A state-wide radio audience follows all the action of Duke football on The Duke Radio Network. The network provides in-depth pregame coverage, live play-by-play of all the action, and the post-game press conferences straight from the locker room to stations via satellite each game. The one-hour tailgate show, hosted by **John Roth**, is broadcast live from the Blue Devil Tailgate Terrace at home games.

Two-time North Carolina Broadcaster of the Year **Bob Harris**, the voice of the Blue Devils for the past 32 seasons, calls all the action for Duke fans each game. He was inducted into the Stanly County (N.C.) Sports Hall of Fame in 1993 and the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

Analyst **Wes Chesson** joins Harris in the booth each game and is in his 29th season providing color commentary for Duke games. Chesson, an All-ACC receiver at Duke from 1968-70, still holds five school receiving records, hauling in 164 catches for 2,399 yards during his playing days. He went on to play with the NFL's Atlanta Falcons (1971-73) and Philadelphia Eagles (1973-74).

In December of 2000, Harris and Chesson were selected to work the 64th annual Shrine Bowl Game of the Carolinas in Charlotte, N.C.

**Anthony Dilweg**, the 1988 ACC Player of the Year, joins the broadcast team for his 10th season, serving as the sideline reporter with a keen inside perspective. **John Rose** serves as the network's engineer.

### Locker Room Policy

The Duke lockerroom is closed to the media at all times. Following all home games, David Cutcliffe and designated players will address the media in the team meeting room on the second floor of the Yoh Football Center. Road accommodations for Coach Cutcliffe and Duke players to meet with the media will be made based on the facility.

### Press Credentials

All media attending Duke football home games must apply for and be issued press credentials. Requests for credentials should be made in advance by email and directed to Sports Information Director Art Chase. Priority is given to daily newspapers, major magazines and electronic media in the geographic areas of the competing teams.

### Glenn E. (Ted) Mann Press Box

Named after former Sports Information Director Ted Mann, the Duke press box is located on the third floor of the Finch-Yeager Building on the west side of Wallace Wade Stadium. Admittance is by credential only for the news media and press box personnel.

### Vanderbilt Scouting Report

The Commodores' defense has caused 18 turnovers in seven games this season with 13 interceptions and five fumble recoveries. The 13 interceptions rank tied for fourth nationally. **Myron Lewis**, **Ryan Hamilton** and **DJ Moore** each have recorded three interceptions. Hamilton also has two fumble recoveries and a caused fumble. **Patrick Benoist** leads the defense with 65 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss and two sacks. The offense has converted when inside the red zone, ranking tied for third in the country with a 96 percent success rate inside the 20-yard line.

### Cutcliffe History Against Bobby Johnson

Since **Bobby Johnson** started coaching at Vanderbilt in 2002, Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** has faced him every season except for 2005 and owns a 5-0 record. Cutcliffe held a 3-0 record against Johnson when he was the head coach at Ole Miss. He also helped Tennessee to victories over the Commodores in each of the past two seasons. Since Cutcliffe began coaching as a part time assistant at Tennessee in 1982, he is 23-2 against Vanderbilt. In his only trip to Nashville as a head coach, Cutcliffe came away with a 24-21 victory in Ole Miss' 2003 season opener.

### Duke Players From Tennessee

Two Blue Devils are from the state of Tennessee. True freshmen **Conor Irwin** and **Jeffrey Faris** each attended Knoxville Catholic in Knoxville, Tenn. Irwin is an offensive lineman while Faris plays cornerback. On the other side, Vanderbilt has three players from North Carolina. Junior **Nick Miller** is from Matthews while sophomore **Austin Monahan** and redshirt freshman **Bo Cramer** are from Charlotte.

## Inside the Numbers ...

**2** • Senior safety **Adrian Aye-Darko** had two interceptions against Miami to give him three for the season and four in his career. He currently is tied for fourth in the ACC in interceptions.

**9** • Junior quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** leads the ACC with nine touchdown passes this season. The Duke signal caller has thrown two or more touchdown passes in four of the six games this season to give him 11 career multi-touchdown games.

**11.0** • **Michael Tauiilili** leads the ACC and ranks sixth nationally with 11.0 tackles per game. He has recorded over 10 tackles in three of the six games this season with 13 against Navy, a career-high 16 against Virginia and 11 at Georgia Tech. He also is third on the team with 6.0 tackles for loss. He has led the team in tackles in all six games this season.

**15** • The Duke defense has forced 15 turnovers in six games this season with six fumble recoveries and nine interceptions. The Blue Devils have forced two or more turnovers in four of its six games, including six against Virginia and three against both James Madison and Miami. Duke ranks third in the ACC and eighth nationally with a +7 turnover margin on the year. Last season, Duke had 11 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries in 12 games.

**20** • Senior wide receiver **Eron Riley** has caught a pass in 20 straight games. He has at least one catch in 35 of his last 36 games. He has two or more catches in all six games this season and ranks fifth in the ACC with 4.83 receptions per game.

**30** • Three Duke players have started in 30 consecutive games. **Eron Riley** has the longest consecutive starts streak with 31 straight starts at wide receiver. Guard **Rob Schirmann** and defensive tackle **Vince Oghobaase** each started for the 30th consecutive game last weekend against Miami.

**41** • With two touchdown passes against Miami, **Thaddeus Lewis** increased his career total to 41 passing touchdowns. He is now one shy of matching **Dave Brown** for fourth on the all-time list at Duke.

**42.4** • Ray Guy Award candidate **Kevin Jones** is leading the ACC in punting with a 42.4 average. He currently ranks 24th in the country in punting and has placed 12 of his 34 punts inside the 20-yard line this season against just two touchbacks.

**360** • **Michael Tauiilili** has 360 career tackles to rank eighth all-time at Duke. He is now 14 tackles shy of **Billy Granville** for seventh on the career list. Tauiilili led the Blue Devils in tackles as a freshman and sophomore and is currently leading the squad with 66 stops on the year.

**2,000** • Senior wide receiver **Eron Riley** is one of six players in Duke history to record over 2,000 career receiving yards. Riley now has 2,056 receiving yards in his career and needs 27 yards to pass **Doug Green** for fifth on the school's career charts.

**2,227** • Senior **Jabari Marshall** has recorded 2,227 career kick return yards to rank third all-time in ACC history. He is closing in on North Carolina's **Eric Blount** for second on the league's all-time list, needing 87 yards.

**5,665** • **Thaddeus Lewis** has passed for 5,665 yards in his career to rank sixth all-time at Duke. He needs 53 passing yards to pass **Dave Brown** for fifth on the career charts. He also ranks fourth with 893 pass attempts and fourth with 490 pass completions.

### Duke vs. The SEC

The Blue Devils have a 52-48-5 all-time record against teams currently in the Southeastern Conference. The two teams Duke has faced the most are South Carolina and Tennessee. Against the Gamecocks, who were members of the ACC from 1953-71, the Blue Devils are 24-17-3. Duke has faced the Vols 29 times with a 13-14-2 overall record. The Blue Devils have also faced current SEC schools Alabama (1-2), Arkansas (1-0), Auburn (3-3), Florida (2-3), Georgia (0-1), Kentucky (4-0), LSU (1-1) and Vanderbilt (3-7).

### Campus Connections

Duke and Vanderbilt have two sets of players who attended the same high schools. The Blue Devils' starting center **Bryan Morgan** and the Commodores' junior safety **Joel Caldwell** each graduated from Hoover High School in Hoover, Ala. Duke freshman defensive lineman **Curtis Hazelton** and Vanderbilt senior cornerback **Josh Allen** each graduated from Roswell High School in Roswell, Ga.

### MacIntyre Played For The Commodores

Duke's defensive coordinator **Mike MacIntyre** played two years at Vanderbilt (1984-85) under his father, George, who served as the head coach of the Commodores from 1979-85. Mike went on to play at Georgia Tech and earn his bachelor's degree in 1989.

### Under Center

Duke has two junior quarterbacks with starting experience. **Thaddeus Lewis** and **Zack Asack** have combined for 35 starts and 51 games played. Lewis has started 29 straight games under center for the Blue Devils and is on pace to be one of the top quarterbacks in school history. Asack has six starts in 21 career games.

### Lewis & Multi-Touchdown Games

**Thaddeus Lewis** has thrown multiple touchdown passes in four of the six games this season and has a league-high nine passing touchdowns on the year. He had three touchdown passes against Navy and two against James Madison, Virginia and Miami. Lewis now has 11 multi-touchdown games through the air and 13 total multi-touchdown games with passing and rushing touchdowns combined.

### 200-Yard Games

Now in his third season as a starting quarterback, **Thaddeus Lewis** has passed for over 200 yards in 12 career games. He has passed for over 200 yards in two games this season, including his third career game of 300 or more yards with 317 against Navy. Lewis had 428 yards at Navy last season, which stands as the seventh-highest single-game total at Duke.

### Starting Streak Under Center

Junior quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** has started 28 consecutive games under center for the Blue Devils. He started the second game of the 2006 season against Wake Forest and has started every game since for Duke. His 28 straight starts rank as the fourth most on the team.

### Lewis Holds Duke Record

**Thaddeus Lewis** broke the school record with 206 consecutive passes without an interception earlier this season before the streak came to an end on the opening play against Virginia. Lewis went six straight games without an interception and threw 105 straight passes without an interception to start the 2008 season. The previous school record for consecutive passes without an interception was 169 by **Ben Bennett** over a four-game span in the 1982-83 seasons.

### Lewis-To-Riley

Quarterback **Thaddeus Lewis** has connected with wideout **Eron Riley** for a school record 18 touchdown passes in the past 28 games, including six this season. The previous Duke record for quarterback-to-wide receiver scoring connections was 16 held by the tandems of **Ben Bennett-to-Chris Castor** and **Steve Slayden-to-Doug Green**. The Bennett-to-Castor combination also holds the school single-season mark with 12 TDs in 1982. Lewis connected with Riley for four touchdowns at Navy last year, and only one other time in school history did a QB throw four TD passes to the same receiver. In 1997, **David Green** hit **Corey Thomas** for four scoring passes against Georgia Tech.

### Chestnut Leads Receivers Against Miami

Senior wide receiver **Raphael Chestnut** was the go-to target for **Thaddeus Lewis** against Miami last weekend, finishing with five catches for 48 yards and a touchdown. His 10-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter gave Duke a 24-14 lead. It was his first touchdown reception of the season and third of his career. His five catches were a season high and most since he caught eight passes against Georgia Tech in 2006.

### Tight Ends Getting Involved In Passing Game

Duke's tight ends caught four passes against Miami. **Brett Huffman** and **Danny Parker** each set career highs with two receptions apiece. Huffman had two catches for 36 yards with a long of 20 yards. Prior to the game he had three career receptions for 24 yards. Parker finished with two grabs for 11 yards. He doubled his career total as he entered the game with one catch for 14 yards against Virginia earlier this season.

### Riley Over Century Mark For Receptions

**Eron Riley** became the 12th player in Duke history to record 100 career receptions when he caught eight passes against Navy. He now has 112 career receptions for 2,056 yards and 20 touchdowns in his career. ### Spreading the Wealth

Through the first six games of the year, 14 different Blue Devils have recorded at least one reception. Of those 14 players, nine have caught at least five passes. Eight different wide receivers have combined for a total of 90 receptions. The running back corps has produced 18 receptions among three players while three tight ends have combined for 14 total catches. Duke has had 10 different players catch a pass in two games this year and has had at least eight players make a grab in all six games.

Senior running back **Clifford Harris** put his array of skills on display last week against Miami by rushing for 56 yards, catching two passes for 15 yards and one touchdown and throwing a 39-yard pass completion to **Eron Riley**. The touchdown reception covered two yards from **Thaddeus Lewis** and marked the first of Harris' career. The pass completion to Riley marked the second in Harris' career. Harris is now 2-of-4 throwing the football for 45 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

### Jackson Emerges

Sophomore running back **Tony Jackson** rushed for a team-high and career-best 69 yards on 11 attempts against Miami last week. Jackson spearheaded a running game that produced 142 yards and two touchdowns versus the Hurricane defense that had entered the weekend ranking second in the ACC against the run by allowing less than 100 yards per outing. Averaging 6.3 yards per carry on the day, Jackson had five runs of seven or more yards including a 23-yarder.

### Lewis Rushes For Score

**Thaddeus Lewis** had three total touchdowns with two passing and one on the ground against Miami. His one-yard rushing touchdown gave him two rushing scores on the season. The Duke offensive line looked like they did early in the season with a strong performance against Miami. The unit paved the way for Duke's 142 rushing yards while allowing only one sack by the Miami defense. It was the first time the Blue Devils rushed for over 100 yards since they went over 150 yards on the ground in each of the first two games of the season.

### Scoring 30+ Points

Duke's offense has a goal of reaching the 30-point mark each week. Cutcliffe-directed offenses have scored 30 or more points in 100 total games at Tennessee, Ole Miss and Duke, compiling a record of 90-10 in those contests. The breakdown includes a 59-3 ledger with the Volunteers, a 28-6 mark with the Rebels and a 3-1 record with the Blue Devils.

### Big Runs

In each of Duke's three victories this season, the Blue Devils have used big scoring runs to outdistance their opponents. Versus James Madison, Duke scored 24 consecutive points to turn a 7-7 game into a 31-7 final. In week three, the Blue Devils outscored Navy by a 24-7 count to end the game en route to a 41-31 triumph. Against Virginia, Duke tallied the final 31 points of the contest, erasing a 3-0 deficit for a 31-3 victory.

### Defensive Notes

#### Linebacker Duo Among ACC Top Tacklers

Duke linebackers Michael Tauiliili and Vincent Rey have combined for 121 tackles in six games and are the two of the top three tacklers in the ACC this season. Tauiliili leads the league and ranks sixth nationally with 11.0 tackles per game. Rey is third in the conference and ranks tied for 31st in the country with 9.2 tackles per contest. He also ranks tied for sixth in the ACC with 7.5 tackles for loss.

**Defense Dominates Navy In Second Half**

Trailing 24-20 at halftime, the Blue Devils' defense came out in the second half and shut down the Navy offense. The Midshipmen only tallied 130 total yards, 36 rushing yards and seven points in the second half. Navy was also only 2-of-8 on third down and did not reach the redzone during the second half. Of the 130 total yards following halftime, 68 came on a passing touchdown at the end of the third quarter.

**Walter Camp National Def. Player Of The Week**

Senior linebacker **Michael Tauiilili** was named the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week following the Virginia game where he posted a career-high 16 tackles to go with an interception, caused fumble and fumble recovery. Tauiilili led the Blue Devils in tackles for the fourth straight game with nine solo stops and a quarterback pressure.

**Duke Defense Forces Six Virginia Turnovers**

The Blue Devils defense forced six turnovers in a win over Virginia with four interceptions and two fumble recoveries. Five of the six turnovers came in the second half with Duke scoring three touchdowns following a turnover. **Michael Tauiilili** recorded an interception, caused fumble and fumble recovery to lead the defense. **Jabari Marshall** returned an interception 42 yards for a touchdown. **Glenn Williams** and **Leon Wright** each added an interception while **Catron Gainey** recovered a fumble.

**Bulk Of Defense Returns**

The Blue Devils returned 10 starters from last season, including the entire front seven. From the 2007 defense, Duke returns 82 percent of its tackles, 84 percent of its tackles for loss, 80 percent of its sacks, 91 percent of its interceptions, 82 percent of its pass breakups, 85 percent of its quarterback hurries, 86 percent of its fumble recoveries, 64 percent of its forced fumbles and 75 percent of its blocked kicks.

### Maggio Perfect On PAT Attempts

Sophomore placekicker Nick Maggio has made all 19 of his PAT attempts this season and 25 of his 26 overall kick attempts. He is a perfect 19-of-19 on extra point attempts and is 6-of-7 on field goal tries. For his career he is a perfect 32-of-32 on extra point attempts. He is now 8-of-12 overall on field goal attempts for his career after making kicks of 27, 21, 38, 46, 20 and 40 yards in the six games this season. His 7.4 points per game rank third in the ACC among kickers.

### Maggio Boots Career Long Field Goal

Nick Maggio made a career-long 46-yard field goal in the first quarter of the Navy game to give Duke a 10-7 lead. The kick was the first attempt over 40 yards in 2008 for Maggio. He is now 2-of-4 from 40 yards or more in his career with his previous career long a 40-yard field goal against Georgia Tech last season. On the year Maggio has made five of his six field goal attempts.

### Surgan Kicks 52-Yard Field Goal

Senior kicker Joe Surgan attempted his first field goal of the season at the end of the second half in the Navy game and put it through the uprights for a career-long 52-yard field goal. The kick matches Brent Garber's 52-yard field goal against N.C. State in 2002 as the eighth longest made field goal in school history. Surgan's previous career long was a 49-yard attempt against Clemson in 2005. In the NCAA this season, Surgan's kick is tied for the sixth longest with eight other players.

### Overtime

Duke has played seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted overtime periods in 1996. The Blue Devils own a 2-5 record in overtime games with a 1-3 mark in conference games decided by extra time. The last overtime game for Duke was in the 2007 season finale at North Carolina. The Blue Devils started on offense but missed a field goal and the Tar Heels took advantage with a game-winning touchdown run. Duke has played three overtime games in Durham and four on the road.

### First Time Starters

Four freshmen have earned starts for the Blue Devils this season. Redshirt freshman Kyle Hill and true freshman Johnny Williams each started against James Madison in the opener while true freshman Matt Daniels started at safety for the first time against Virginia. True freshman Lee Butler earned his first career start against Miami. Sophomore Eddie Morgan drew his first career start at safety against Northwestern. Sophomore tight end Brett Huffman earned his first starting nod against Virginia.

### Playing For The First Time

Several players have played their first collegiate snap this season. True freshman Trent Mackey, Jay Hollingsworth, Lee Butler, Matt Daniels, Donovan Varner and Johnny Williams have all seen playing time. Redshirt freshmen Chris Shannon, Garrett Utt, Kyle Hill and Charlie Hatcher played for the first time against James Madison along with sophomore Robert Drum and senior Ryan McFadyen, who played four years of lacrosse for the Blue Devils. Eriks Reks played for the first time against Virginia.

### 2008 Captains

Duke announced its four captains for the 2008 football season with two offensive captains and two defensive captains. On offense, senior running back Re'quan Boyette and senior tight end Tielor Robinson were voted captains by their teammates. The squad voted senior middle linebacker Michael Tauiliili and junior outside linebacker Vincent Rey as defensive captains.

### Coin Toss

Duke's opponents have won the coin toss in all six games this season. Each opponent won the coin toss and deferred to the second half. Duke received the first kickoff in each game, scoring a touchdown on the first possession against both Northwestern and Navy.

### Brothers In-Law

This past summer senior wide receiver **Ryan Wood** married the former **Erin Pridemore** of Buford, Ga. Erin's younger brother **Matt Pridemore** is a sophomore teammate of Wood and is also a wide receiver.

### Brotherly Love

The Blue Devils have four sets of brothers, including offensive coordinator **Kurt Roper** and running backs coach **Zac Roper** on the coaching staff. Senior tight end **Tielor Robinson** is joined on the roster by two family members as first cousins **Colin** and **Cameron Jones** are redshirt freshman for Duke. Also with freshman **Paul Asack** coming to Durham, he joins his older brother **Zack Asack** to give the Blue Devils three sets of brothers.

### The Duke Family Connection

Senior tight end **Tielor Robinson**, along with his two first cousins **Cameron** and **Colin Jones**, has significant ties to the Duke football program. Robinson's uncles — **Cedric** and **Walter Jones** — enjoyed outstanding careers for the Blue Devils. Cedric Jones is the father of Cameron and Colin and played from 1978-81. He caught 99 career passes for 1,732 yards (7th all-time at Duke) and 21 touchdowns (3rd). He earned second team All-America honors as a senior and spent nine seasons with the NFL's New England Patriots. Walter Jones is the uncle of the three current Duke players. He played from 1988-91 and had 119 receptions (10th all-time at Duke) for 1,968 yards (6th) and 17 TDs (4th) and was on Duke's 1989 ACC title squad. Robinson spent two years at Army before transferring to Duke prior to last season, and then sat out the 2005 campaign due to NCAA regulations. While with the Black Knights, Robinson rushed 114 times for 548 yards and five touchdowns while catching 34 passes for 297 yards and two scores. He earned Conference USA Player of the Week honors after accounting for 193 all-purpose yards and five TDs against Cincinnati in 2004. Robinson's mother, **Sandra Robinson**, is the sister of Cedric and Walter.

### Childhood Friends

Forced to attend different high schools in Houston didn't alter the close-knit relationship between **Vince Oghobaase** and **Michael Tauiilili**. Friends since childhood, the pair journeyed together to Durham and will embark on their third season starting together on the Duke defense. Last season Oghobaase led the team with 4.5 sacks while Tauiilili paced the squad with 13 tackles for loss to go along with 108 total tackles.

### International Ties

Along with the two players from Sweden on the Duke roster, **Pontus Bondeson** and **Marcus Lind**, the Blue Devils also are represented by **Chris Rwabukamba** and **George Pearkes** of Canada.

### Swedish Connection

The Duke roster features two players — **Pontus Bondeson** and **Marcus Lind** — who hail from Sweden. Members of the recruiting class of 2006, Lind, who played one year of prep football at St. Aquinas High School in Florida, committed to the Blue Devils and then informed the Duke coaching staff about his fellow countryman. Both redshirt freshmen, Bondeson and Lind are expected to compete for playing time in 2008 on the offensive line.

### McFadyen Adds Second Sport

After lettering four years on the lacrosse team, senior defensive end **Ryan McFadyen** joined the football program in the spring of 2008 and was awarded a scholarship prior to the start of the season. A reserve tight end, McFadyen has seen game action on special teams this season. From 2005-08, the Mendham, N.J., native helped the Blue Devil lacrosse squad to an overall record of 58-10 with three ACC regular season championships, two ACC Tournament crowns and three trips to the NCAA Final Four. McFadyen, a defenseman, has played in 56 career games with 25 starting assignments and is expected to play his fifth and final season of eligibility in the spring of 2009.

### Duke Graduate

Wide receiver **Ryan Wood** has already received his undergraduate degree from Duke. After graduating in May, 2008, with a degree in sociology and a markets and management certificate, Wood is now enrolled in the humanities graduate program while he finishes out his collegiate football career with the Blue Devils. Wood is also the holder on Duke's placekicking unit.

### Roster Breakdown

The Duke roster features 22 seniors, 14 juniors, 30 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 23 true freshmen. The Blue Devils are represented by a total of 22 states — along with two foreign countries in Canada and Sweden. Georgia is called home by the most Blue Devils, 15, followed by Florida (14), North Carolina (13) and Texas (10).

### A Glance At The 2008 Opponents

Duke's 12 opponents this season combined for a record of 54-29 in the first seven weeks of the 2008 season with 10 of the 12 posting winning records. Those 12 teams combined for an 86-65 (.570) overall record in 2007 with six schools playing in bowl games: James Madison (8-4), Northwestern (6-6), Navy (8-5), 35-32 loss to Utah in the Poinsettia Bowl), Virginia (9-4, 31-28 loss to Texas Tech in the Gator Bowl), Georgia Tech (7-6; 40-28 loss to Fresno State in the Humanitarian Bowl), Miami (5-7), Vanderbilt (5-7), Wake Forest (9-4; 24-10 win over Connecticut in the Meineke Car Care Bowl), N.C. State (5-7), Clemson (9-4; 23-20 overtime loss to Auburn in the Chick-Fil-a Bowl), Virginia Tech (11-3; 24-21 loss to Kansas in the Orange Bowl) and North Carolina (4-8).

# David Cutcliffe Head Coach

- Cutcliffe was named Duke's 21st head football coach on December 15, 2007
- Cutcliffe was honored as the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year after leading the Ole Miss Rebels to a 10-3 record, a share of the league Western Division title and a 31-28 victory over Oklahoma State in the Cotton Bowl
- Cutcliffe secured a record of 44-29 (.603) as the head coach at Ole Miss from 1999-04
- Cutcliffe mentored each of the past two Super Bowl MVPs in Peyton Manning (Tennessee) and Eli Manning (Ole Miss)
- During Cutcliffe's six seasons at Ole Miss, the Rebels set school single-season records for total offense, passing offense and scoring offense while winning twice at both Auburn and LSU, securing consecutive victories over Florida and defeating both Arkansas and South Carolina on three occasions
- In 2006-07, Cutcliffe helped Tennessee win 19 games with two appearances in the Outback Bowl
- In 2007, Cutcliffe and the Volunteers went 10-4, captured the SEC Eastern Division crown and defeated Wisconsin in the Outback Bowl as quarterback Erik Ainge earned game MVP honors
- Cutcliffe's offenses at Ole Miss registered a ledger of 28-6 when scoring 30 or more points ... With Cutcliffe as offensive coordinator, Tennessee scored 30+ points in 62-of-100 games, posting a 59-3 record in those contests
- In 19 seasons in Knoxville, Cutcliffe helped Tennessee post a 173-54-7 (.754) overall ledger
- In 1998, Cutcliffe was named the recipient of the Frank Broyles Award, an honor presented annually to the top assistant coach in the nation
- Cutcliffe has coached in 22 bowl games in his career and owns a 4-1 (.800) record in bowl tilts as a head coach
- Cutcliffe helped Tennessee to four SEC championships as well as the 1998 national championship
- A native of Birmingham, Ala., Cutcliffe graduated from the University of Alabama in 1976
- Cutcliffe got his start in coaching at Banks High School — his alma mater — and spent four years as an assistant coach before becoming the head coach in 1980
- Cutcliffe is married to the former Karen Oran of Harriman, Tenn., and they are the parents of four children — Chris, Marcus, Katie and Emily

#### Duke 28, Florida 21 October 6, 1962

After allowing 21 points in the second quarter to trail 21-0 at halftime, Duke uses 21 points in the third period to tie the game ... The Blue Devils get the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter from **Mike Curtis** for the win.

#### Duke 25, South Carolina 21 October 8, 1977

Behind 21-3 at halftime, Duke's comeback was highlighted by a 30-yard interception return for a touchdown by **Earl Cook** with less than five minutes left in the game ... **Ned Gonet** rushed for 110 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Blue Devil offense.

#### Duke 25, Georgia Tech 24 October 29, 1977

The Blue Devils trail 24-9 at the end of three quarters, and **Mike Dunn's** seven-yard touchdown pass to **Tom Hall** with 13 seconds remaining caps the comeback ... Hall, who caught three passes from Dunn during Duke's game-winning drive, finished the day with eight grabs for 89 yards.

#### Duke 29, Virginia 24 September 26, 1981

Down 24-15 with 10 minutes left in the fourth quarter, Duke rallies for the win on a 25-yard touchdown pass from **Ron Sally** to **Gary Frederick** with 8:51 remaining and a two-yard touchdown run by **Mike Grayson** with just 59 seconds to play.

#### Duke 25, Tennessee 24 September 4, 1982

Trailing 24-12 late in the third quarter, **Greg Boone** takes a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown and **Joel Blunk** scores on a 13-yard run in the fourth period as Duke defeats the Volunteers in the 1982 season opener.

#### Duke 32, Georgia Tech 26 October 29, 1983

Down 26-14 in the third quarter, the Blue Devils score the final 18 points of the game for the win ... **Darryl Brunson** ices the game with a late fourth quarter interception.

#### Duke 31, Wake Forest 21 November 5, 1983

Wake Forest leads 21-7 in the third quarter, but Duke scores 24 second half points as **Mike Grayson** finds the end zone twice on the ground.

#### Duke 27, N.C. State 26 November 10, 1983

Behind 26-7 in the third period, **Ben Bennett's** scoring toss to **Mark Militello** with 26 seconds left in the game wins the game for Duke.

#### Duke 23, North Carolina 21 November 23, 1985

The Tar Heels lead 21-3 late in the third quarter, but **Steve Slayden** hooks up with **Doug Green** for three touchdowns in the final 17 minutes for the victory ... Trailing by five with less than two minutes left, Duke's **Fonda Williams** recovers a Tar Heel fumble at the Blue Devil 44 yard line ... With no timeouts, Slayden engineers a drive that ends with a five-yard scoring strike from the quarterback to Green.

#### Duke 21, Clemson 17 September 30, 1989

On the short end of a 14-0 halftime score, the Blue Devils storm back to defeat seventh-ranked Clemson on **Billy Ray's** seven-yard touchdown pass to **Chris Brown** with 3:18 remaining in the fourth period ... The win was the first of seven in a row for Duke as the Blue Devils went on to win the ACC title.

### Duke Vs. Heisman Trophy Winners

Duke has played against nine Heisman Trophy winners since the award was introduced in 1935: Felix "Doc" Blanchard (Army), Glenn Davis (Army), Howard Cassady (Ohio State), Joe Bellino (Navy), Roger Staubach (Navy), Tony Dorsett (Pittsburgh), George Rogers (South Carolina), Charlie Ward (Florida State), and Chris Weinke (Florida State).

The Blue Devils have posted a 2-7 overall record in these games.

#### 1945: Army 48, Duke 13

In a game played at the Polo Grounds pitting top-ranked Army against 19th-ranked Duke, Doc Blanchard ran six times for 64 yards and one touchdown, caught a 59-yard pass from Glenn Davis for a touchdown, and had six kickoffs for 324 yards.

#### 1946: Army 19, Duke 0

Glenn Davis led his Army team and its 23-game winning streak against Duke at the Polo Grounds before a sellout crowd of 59,031. Davis ran for 70 yards on 16 carries and caught two touchdown passes of 14 and 30 yards on the day.

#### 1955: Duke 20, Ohio State 14

Howard Cassady and his 1954 Rose Bowl Champion Buckeyes built a 14-0 lead, but Duke rallied for the victory. Cassady ran 11 times for 40 yards and was just one-of-five passing with two interceptions. Cassady's highlight of the day came early on a 38-yard punt return for a touchdown.

#### 1960: Duke 19, Navy 10

Joe Bellino and Navy came into Durham with an 8-0 record and left with their first loss of the season. Bellino ran 20 times for 62 yards and had four receptions for 65 yards. It was the only game of the season that Bellino failed to cross the goal line.

#### 1963: Navy 38, Duke 25

Roger Staubach led second-ranked Navy to victory by completing seven-of-14 passes for 122 yards with one interception. He ran 12 times for 72 yards and scored on a five-yard run.

#### 1976: Pittsburgh 44, Duke 31

Tony Dorsett ran 31 times against the Blue Devils for 129 yards and one touchdown.

#### 1980: South Carolina 20, Duke 7

George Rogers ran for 224 yards on 36 carries in Columbia as South Carolina defeated Duke, 20-7.

#### 1993: Florida State 43, Duke 7

Charlie Ward kicked off his senior campaign in Durham leading his top-ranked Seminoles to victory over the Blue Devils. Ward was 22-of-31 passing for 272 yards and had no interceptions. He threw touchdown passes of 36 and three yards, and ran for an 11-yard score.

#### 2000: Florida State 63, Duke 14

Chris Weinke had his most productive game of the season against the Blue Devils, completing 37-of-47 passes for 536 yards and five touchdowns. The 536 yards passing marked the most ever by a Florida State quarterback in a single game.

# Game 1 James Madison 7 Duke 31

August 30, 2008  
Wallace Wade Stadium • Durham, N.C.

**DURHAM, N.C.** — Duke RB Clifford Harris and WR Eron Riley scored two touchdowns each as the Blue Devils ushered in the David Cutcliffe Era with a 31-7 victory over James Madison in front of a crowd of 32,571 at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The start of the contest was delayed for one hour, 27 minutes due to inclement weather but the rain didn't stop a near-capacity crowd of seeing Cutcliffe — hired the previous December as Duke's 21st head football coach — and the Blue Devils snap a nine-game losing streak.

Harris gave the Blue Devils a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter by scoring from one yard out to cap an 11-play, 66-yard drive. The march included a fourth down conversion when RB Tony Jackson picked up four yards off tackle on fourth-and-one from the James Madison 45 yard line.

The Dukes answered with a scoring drive of their own, but needed just five snaps to score when QB Rodney Landers darted 47 yards to the end zone to tie the game.

In the second quarter, Duke QB Thaddeus Lewis engineered a 14-play, 67-yard scoring drive and found Riley for six points from seven yards out with just five seconds prior to halftime. The Blue Devils again executed a fourth down conversion when Harris gained five yards on fourth-and-one from the James Madison 21 yard line.

James Madison claimed the momentum to begin the second half on Scotty McGee's 60-yard kickoff return, but Landers' pass on second down from the Duke 32 yard line was intercepted and returned 67 yards by CB Jabari Marshall. The Blue Devils took advantage of the miscue as a Lewis-to-Austin Kelly pass pushed Duke inside the five yard line before Harris plunged into the end zone from the one for a 21-7 lead.

On the next play from scrimmage, Landers fumbled the football and Duke DE Greg Akinbiyi recovered to give the Blue Devils possession at the James Madison 34 yard line. Six plays later, Lewis hooked up with Riley on a 20-yard scoring strike to increase the margin to 28-7. The Blue Devils scored on their fourth consecutive possession later in third period when K Nick Maggio's 27-yard field goal capped an 11-play, 38-yard drive.

Harris finished the night with a career-high 95 yards on 17 carries as the Duke ground attack picked up 218 yards. Lewis hit on 17-of-28 throws for 141 yards and the two touchdowns, with Riley hauling in seven tosses for 67 yards.

Duke's defense allowed just 239 yards of total offense with LBs Michael Tauiliili (9 tackles) and Vincent Rey (7 tackles) leading the charge. Akinbiyi finished the game with three tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and two fumble recoveries while DE Wesley Oglesby had four tackles, two tackles for loss, one sack and one caused fumble.

For James Madison, Landers rushed for 96 yards and added an additional 51 in the air.

# Game 2 Northwestern 24 Duke 20

September 6, 2008  
Wallace Wade Stadium • Durham, N.C.

**DURHAM, N.C.** — Northwestern QB C.J. Bacher threw for 226 yards and RB Tyrell Sutton scored two touchdowns as the Wildcats defeated Duke, 24-20, in front of 23,614 fans at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The Blue Devils took the opening kickoff and marched 72 yards in 11 plays for a 7-0 when RB Clifford Harris scored from two yards out. Later in the opening period, Northwestern used a four-play, 55-yard drive for an 18-yard scoring run by Sutton to knot the contest.

Early in the second quarter, Northwestern turned a Duke miscue into points. The Blue Devils gave the Wildcats excellent field position with a punting game error, and Sutton's 18-yard touchdown run pushed the visitors ahead, 14-7. The two teams then traded field goals in the final three minutes of the half and Northwestern claimed a 17-10 advantage at intermission.

Duke K Nick Maggio's second field goal of the game capped a nine-snap, 60-yard drive and pulled the Blue Devils to within 17-13 with 5:14 remaining in the third quarter. Backup QB Zack Asack engineered the drive, completing all five of his pass attempts for 38 yards while rushing three times for an additional 13 yards. Two possessions later, QB Thaddeus Lewis guided a nine-play, 73-yard drive and scored on a 16-yard rush to push Duke back in front, 20-17, with just over 12 minutes left in the fourth period.

Northwestern responded with a nine-play, 72-yard drive and received the game-winning touchdown on a two-yard run by RB Omar Conteh. Duke would drive inside the Northwestern 25 yard line on each of its final two possessions, but could not score.

Lewis finished the night with a career-high 24 completions in 42 attempts for 256 yards. Freshman WR Johnny Williams caught 11 passes for 135 yards, marking the second-highest single-game total for receiving yards by a rookie in Duke history. WRs Austin Kelly and Eron Riley hauled in four passes each for 37 and 28 yards, respectively. Harris had 86 yards on the ground on 18 attempts while RB Jay Hollingsworth carried the ball 11 times for 41 yards.

In addition, CB Jabari Marshall became Duke's career leader in kickoff return yards, eclipsing the previous mark of 1,890 yards held by Randy Jones (1987-90).

Defensively for the Blue Devils, LBs Vincent Rey and Michael Tauiliili logged eight tackles apiece.

For the Wildcats, Bacher was 14-of-31 through the air for 226 yards while Sutton finished the night with 66 yards on 16 carries.

Duke outgained Northwestern by a 472-328 margin in total offense, and held possession of the football for 39:15 of the game.

**DURHAM, N.C.** — Duke QB **Thaddeus Lewis** threw three touchdown passes to WR **Eron Riley** to guide the Blue Devils to a 41-31 victory over visiting Navy in front of 25,082 fans at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The Lewis-to-Riley combination became the top touchdown-producing tandem in Duke history with their 17th scoring play — a 49-yard effort that gave Duke a 10-point cushion in the final period. The previous school standard of 16 touchdown passes was held by the combinations of **Ben Bennett-to-Chris Castor** and **Steve Slayden-to-Doug Green**.

For the second straight week, the Blue Devils took the opening kickoff and marched to the end zone. Lewis capped off the 12-snap, 78-yard drive with a 27-yard scoring strike to Riley. The Midshipmen responded with a 73-yard touchdown run by **Shun White** to knot the game at 7-7.

After K **Nick Maggio's** career-long 46-yard field goal gave Duke a 10-7 advantage, Navy took advantage of a Blue Devil miscue to take its first lead of the game. Duke mishandled a punt and the Mids recovered at the Blue Devil 10 yard line, and Navy QB **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada** hooked up with SB **Greg Shinego** for a passing touchdown and a 14-10 lead late in the opening quarter.

Duke's defense got into the scoring act midway through the second period when LB **Vincent Rey** scooped up a fumble and rumbled 37 yards for a touchdown. Navy, however, produced 10 points in a span of 1:05 late in the half to go ahead 24-17, and Duke K **Joe Surgan** sent the teams into intermission with the Mids up by four points by booting a career-long 52-yard field goal as time expired.

Lewis guided two short scoring drives of 38 yards in the third quarter to give Duke a 34-24 lead. His five-yard touchdown toss to Riley came with 7:17 left in the period before TE **Tielor Robinson** scored on the ground from two yards out with 1:46 on the clock.

The Midshipmen would pull within three points on their next possession when QB **Jarod Bryant** hit WR **Tyree Barnes** for a 68-yard touchdown pass on the final snap of the third period. Duke's defense would hold Navy to just 40 yards of total offense in the final quarter to help seal the victory.

Lewis completed 25-of-35 passes for 317 yards and three touchdowns while adding a career-high and team-best 41 rushing yards. Riley finished with eight grabs for 137 yards and the three scores. LBs **Michael Tauiiliili** and **Rey** paced the Duke defense with 13 and 12 tackles, respectively.

**DURHAM, N.C.** — Duke's defense forced six turnovers and LB **Michael Tauiiliili** posted 16 tackles as the Blue Devils snapped a 25-game losing streak in ACC play with a 31-3 triumph over Virginia as 25,527 spectators looked on at Wallace Wade Stadium.

Tauiiliili added one interception, one fumble recovery and one caused fumble and received National Defensive Player of the Week honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation. The Houston, Texas, native also moved into eighth place on Duke's all-time tackles chart with 340 career stops. The double figure tackle performance marked Tauiiliili's second in 2008 and the 14th of his career.

The first half featured just six total points as the teams traded field goals — a 33-yarder by Virginia's **Yannick Reyerling** and a 20-yard effort from Duke's Nick Maggio. In the third quarter, Duke rookie RB **Jay Hollingsworth** sparked the Blue Devil offense by carrying the football seven times for 35 yards and capping a 10-play, 55-yard drive with a 10-yard touchdown reception from QB **Thaddeus Lewis** to give the Blue Devils the lead.

Following an interception by Duke CB **Leon Wright**, Lewis marched the Blue Devils 62 yards in six snaps and hit WR **Eron Riley** for a 30-yard touchdown to push the lead to 17-3 with 3:37 left in the third quarter.

In the fourth quarter, the Blue Devils extended their advantage to 24-3 when CB **Jabari Marshall** returned an interception 42 yards for a touchdown. Later in the period, Duke took advantage of another turnover when TE **Tielor Robinson** scored on the ground from one yard out to account for the final margin.

Lewis struggled for much of the opening half, hitting on just nine-of-20 throws for 73 yards and two interceptions. After intermission, the junior completed nine-of-12 tosses for 87 yards and two touchdowns. Hollingsworth finished the afternoon with a team-high 59 rushing yards on 15 carries. WR **Austin Kelly** caught a team-best four passes for 34 yards.

Duke's defensive forced five turnovers in the second half including four interceptions. LB **Vincent Rey** (11) and S **Glenn Williams** (10) joined Tauiiliili in reaching double figures in the tackle column. Wright added three pass breakups while DE **Greg Akinbiyi** was credited for one quarterback sack. The three points allowed marked Duke's lowest total in conference play since the Blue Devils shut out North Carolina in the 1989 season finale.

Virginia QB **Marc Verica** started for just the second time in his career and was 19-of-42 passing for 194 yards with four interceptions. LB **Jon Cooper** paced the Cavalier defense with 12 tackles while LB **Clint Sintim** posted six tackles including three sacks.

**ATLANTA, Ga.** — Georgia Tech's defense held Duke scoreless and FB **Jonathan Dwyer** rushed for a career-high 159 yards as the Yellow Jackets defeated the Blue Devils, 27-0, in front of 46,104 fans at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, Ga.

Duke's offense managed just nine first downs and 132 yards of total offense while the Yellow Jackets posted 454 yards with a balanced attack headlined by Dwyer's rushing and QB **Jaybo Shaw's** 230-yard passing day. Shaw completed nine-of-14 passes — all to WR **Demaryius Thomas** — for 230 yards including an 88-yard scoring strike.

Georgia Tech drove to the Duke eight yard line on its opening possession of the game, but DE **Greg Akinbiyi** forced a fumble that was recovered by teammate **Wesley Oglesby** to thwart the scoring chance. The Yellow Jackets moved the ball to the Duke 30 yard line early in the second period, but lost possession when NG **Clifford Respress** stopped Shaw after a one-yard gain on fourth-and-three.

Shaw's 32-yard completion to Thomas highlighted Tech's 11-play, 61-yard drive that resulted in a 20-yard field goal by K **Scott Blair** with just under six minutes before halftime.

The Yellow Jackets went ahead 10-0 midway through the third quarter when **Roddy Jones** found the end zone from four yards out on the ground to cap a 10-snap, 57-yard drive. On the first play of the fourth period, Shaw scored on a two-yard run to push the lead to 17-0.

Shaw's long touchdown pass to Thomas and a 26-yard field goal from Blair accounted for the final margin.

For the Blue Devils, QB **Thaddeus Lewis** completed 15-of-28 tosses for 97 yards with one interception. WR **Eron Riley** caught a team-high five balls for 20 yards. The Duke defense was led by LB **Michael Tauiliili**, who reached double digits in the tackle column for the 15th time in his career with an 11-stop outing that included two tackles for loss. Akinbiyi finished the day with seven tackles including three behind the line of scrimmage while DT **Vince Oghobaase** picked up five stops with one quarterback sack.

Dwyer averaged 6.9 yards per attempt with 159 yards on 23 carries. The Yellow Jackets maintained possession of the football for 38:46 of the game including 11:06 of the third quarter. Georgia Tech's defense posted 11 tackles behind the line of scrimmage, forced eight Duke punts and allowed just two third down conversions in 11 attempts.

**DURHAM, N.C.** — Miami QB **Jacory Harris** threw for four touchdowns and ran for another as the Hurricanes spoiled Duke's Homecoming with a 49-31 victory over the Blue Devils as 32,011 fans looked on at Wallace Wade Stadium.

Harris came off the bench to complete 18-of-28 throws for 185 yards and added 53 yards on the ground. Miami scored 35 unanswered points in the second half to overcome a 17-14 halftime deficit to post their fifth straight win over the Blue Devils.

The Hurricanes jumped on top 7-0 late in the opening period when QB **Robert Marve** tossed a 17-yard scoring strike to WR **Davon Johnson**. The Blue Devils responded with an 11-play, 80-yard scoring drive to knot the game on QB **Thaddeus Lewis'** two-yard touchdown pass to RB **Clifford Harris**. The touchdown drive was keyed by Harris' 39-yard halfback pass to WR **Eron Riley** that gave Duke a first-and-goal at the Miami five yardline.

On the next possession, Marve was intercepted by Duke S **Adrian Aye-Darko**, and the Blue Devils took advantage by marching 77 yards on 10 snaps as Lewis scored from one yard out to give Duke a 14-7 lead. The Blue Devils went ahead 17-7 when K **Nick Maggio** booted a 40-yard field goal with 1:33 remaining in the half. The Hurricanes sent the teams to intermission with the scored 17-14 by driving 68 yards on eight plays at the end of the second quarter with Harris finding TE **Chris Zellner** for a nine-yard scoring pass.

The third quarter began with Aye-Darko's second interception of the day setting up another Duke touchdown. Harris was picked off on Miami's first snap from scrimmage, and Lewis hooked up with WR **Raphael Chestnut** for a 10-yard touchdown to push Duke ahead, 24-14.

Miami then scored 35 consecutive points with Harris throwing three touchdown passes in the spurt. The Hurricanes took advantage of good field position with scoring drives that covered 69, 59, 28, 55 and 46 yards, respectfully.

Duke accounted for the final margin when QB **Zack Asack** capped a 12-play, 64-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run late in the fourth period.

Lewis was 12-of-28 through the air for 130 yards with two touchdowns. Chestnut caught five balls for 48 yards while the Blue Devil ground attack was paced by RB **Tony Jackson** (69 yards) and Harris (56 yards). LB **Michael Tauiliili** carded a team-high nine tackles.
