## NO. 19 ARKANSAS PREPARES FOR HOMECOMING

► Arkansas stays at home this week, wrapping up a two-week run in Fayetteville by hosting Vanderbilt for Homecoming. The Razorbacks are coming off a 38-24 victory over Ole Miss, while Vanderbilt fell 21-7 at home against then-19th-ranked South Carolina. Arkansas holds a 5-2 advantage in the series and has outscored the Commodores 190-96 for an average of 27.1 points in the seven games.

► UA is off to its best start under Coach Bobby Petrino and has its best mark after seven games since 2006.

► Arkansas is 218-95-5 (.693) all-time when ranked in the top 20 and 4-1 at No. 19.

## ARKANSAS IN HOMECOMING GAMES

► The game against Vanderbilt will be the 89th Homecoming game in school history. The Razorbacks are 52-32-4 (.614) in the previous 88 Homecoming games. Arkansas has won its last four Homecoming games, including a 63-27 victory over Eastern Michigan last year.

► For the 60th consecutive year, the most outstanding Arkansas senior in the Homecoming game will be honored with the Crip Hall Award. End Frank Fischel of Helena, Ark., was awarded the first Crip Hall Award in 1950 for his efforts in a 9-6 loss to Rice. The award recipient is chosen by members of the Arkansas media covering the game.

## CONSISTENT INSIDE THE CRITICAL ZONE

► Arkansas is 18-of-20 (.900) in the Critical Zone (inside the 20-yard line) so far this season, which leads the SEC and is tied for 15th in the NCAA. In 2009, the Razorbacks were 47-of-49 (.959) in the Critical Zone, which tied for first in the nation. Under Coach Petrino, Arkansas has been flawless in the Critical Zone in 21 of 32 games.

## THE TEAM

► Arkansas has held its 2010 opponents to 31-of-99 (.313) on third-down conversions, which is the best percentage in the SEC and the 13th in the NCAA.

► The Razorbacks are the only team in the SEC to reach the 400-yard passing mark in a game this season (428 at Auburn, 400 vs. ULM).

► The Razorbacks have averaged 155.7 rushing yards per game in the last three games, including a season-high 197 yards in their 38-24 win over Ole Miss.

► Arkansas has outscored its opponents 185-91 in the first three quarters this season (59-31 in the first, 68-30 in the second and 58-30 in the third).

► Arkansas has thrown for 300 or more yards in 15 of 32 games under Petrino. Prior to his arrival, Arkansas had thrown for 300 or more yards 16 times in school history.

► The Razorbacks have had two different quarterbacks throw for at least 300 yards in a game this season, marking just the second time in school history that has happened. In addition to Ryan Mallett and Tyler Wilson this year, the only other time also occurred under Petrino as Casey Dick and Nathan Dick combined for the feat in 2008.

## **QUARTERBACKS (SEE PAGE 10 FOR RYAN MALLET RECORDS)**

► Ryan Mallett has set or tied 34 school or stadium records at Arkansas (25 school, nine stadium). A complete list is available on page 10, but the records include: touchdown passes in a game (5) and in a season (30), pass completions in a season (225), passing yards in a game (408) and in a season (3,624), total offense in a game (412) and in a season (3,595), consecutive pass attempts without an interception (141), completion percentage in a game (13-19 att./875; 20+ att./875), 400-yard passing games in a season (2) and in a career (3).

► Ryan Mallett leads the SEC and ranks ninth in the NCAA with 291.4 passing yards per game. His SEC-leading total of 56 completions of 15 yards or more is fourth in the nation, while his 20 completions of 25-plus yards are second in the SEC and tied for 14th in the country. He also ranks second in the conference and 17th in the nation with 287.0 yards of total offense per game. His 15 passing touchdowns rank second in the SEC and are tied for 20th in the NCAA. He also ranks third in the SEC and seventh in the NCAA with his 14.07 yards-per-completion average. Mallett's 163.66 passer efficiency ranking is third in the SEC and ninth in the nation, while his .674 completion percentage is third in the conference and 13th in the NCAA.

► Ryan Mallett is the SEC's active career leader in total offense (5,604), TD responsibility (49), passing yards (5,664) and passing TDs (45). His passing TD total also ranks fourth all-time at Arkansas, while his passing yardage places him fifth and his total offense ranks sixth.

► Ryan Mallett has thrown a passing touchdown in 19 of 20 games as a Razorback and in 21 of his 23 collegiate starts. He has thrown for at least three touchdowns in nine starts. He has thrown for multiple touchdowns in 10 starts as a Razorback and 11 of 23 collegiate starts.

► In his 23 collegiate starts, Mallett has thrown for 200 or more yards 19 times (17 as a Razorback), 300 or more yards 10 times (all as a Razorback) and 400 or more yards three times (vs. UGA and Troy, 2009; vs. ULM, 2010).

► Ryan Mallett has had a completion of 25 or more yards in 19 of 20 games at Arkansas. He has also completed a pass of 50 or more yards in 11 games at UA.

► Tyler Wilson has come on for an injured Ryan Mallett in the last two games. Wilson threw four touchdown passes at Auburn after entering the game in the second quarter with three in his career. He also set single-game career highs with 332 yards passing, 25 completions and 34 attempts. Wilson came into Arkansas' 38-24 victory over Ole Miss in the third quarter and added 71 yards on 3-of-5 passing to his season total.

► Tyler Wilson became just the ninth different quarterback in Arkansas history to throw for at least 300 yards in a single game with his 332-yard performance at Auburn.

► Ryan Mallett owns a 16-7 collegiate record as a starting quarterback. During the 2007 season at Michigan, he was 3-0 with victories against Notre Dame, Penn State and Minnesota. He is 13-7 at Arkansas with victories over Missouri State, Texas A&M (twice), Auburn, Eastern Michigan, South Carolina, Troy, Mississippi State, East Carolina, Tennessee Tech, ULM, Georgia and Ole Miss.

► On Jan. 8, 2010, Ryan Mallett announced his intentions to return to college football for his junior season. Mallett set or matched 16 different school records during his sophomore season completing 225-of-403 passes for 3,624 yards and 30 touchdowns with just seven interceptions. He led the SEC in total offense (276.5), touchdown passes (30) and passing yards per game (276.5) in his first year in the league. He is the only quarterback from a BCS conference returning this year that finished in the top 10 nationally in pass efficiency in 2009 (152.5).

► Ryan Mallett's completion percentage in the season opener against Tennessee Tech of 87.5 ranked as the second-highest single-game total in SEC history (min. 20 comp.). It was also the highest by any quarterback in the nation on the opening weekend of college football. Mallett's 85-yard touchdown pass to Joe Adams was the second-longest in the NCAA during the first weekend of the season and the fifth-longest in Razorback history.

**RUNNING BACKS**

► The Razorbacks' backfield has shared the wealth so far in 2010. Four different running backs have reached the end zone this season, and two different running backs have led the team in rushing in a game.

► Knile Davis leads Arkansas with 470 rushing yards this season. He has earned a career-high rushing total in four games this season, including in each of the last three games. Against Ole Miss, he ran for 176 yards, the first 100-yard game of his career, including a career-long 71-yard carry. At Auburn, he put up 91 yards after an 82-yard game against Texas A&M. Davis also led the Razorbacks with a then-career-high rushing total of 67 yards vs. Tennessee Tech.

► Knile Davis leads the Razorbacks with four rushing touchdowns in 2010. The sophomore ran for a career-high three touchdowns in Arkansas' 38-24 win against Ole Miss.

► Broderick Green has paced the UA rushing attack in three games this season, leading the Razorbacks in rushing vs. ULM, at Georgia and vs. Alabama. He currently ranks second on the team with 221 yards this season.

► Arkansas returned 75 percent of its rushing production from 2009. UA returned 11 of the 13 players that touched the ball on the ground. In addition, four of the top five rushers returned for the Razorbacks.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

► The Razorbacks opened all six games in 2010 with the following starting lineup: Ray Dominguez (RT), Alvin Bailey (RG), Travis Swanson (C), Wade Grayson (LG), DeMarcus Love (LT). Bailey and Swanson each earned their first collegiate start vs. Tennessee Tech after redshirting the 2009 season as true freshmen.

► DeMarcus Love, who was named to the preseason Outland and Lombardi Award watch lists, has the longest active starts streak on the team. He has been among the first 11 players on offense for 23 straight games. Love is tied with linebacker Jerry Franklin for the team lead in career starts with 30.

► DeMarcus Love, Wade Grayson and Ray Dominguez each are three-year starters for the Razorbacks.

**RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS**

► Arkansas has had a 100-yard receiver in five games in 2010. Joe Adams topped the century mark vs. Tennessee Tech and at Georgia, while Greg Childs earned the distinction vs. ULM and at Auburn and Jarius Wright pulled it off vs. Alabama. The Razorbacks are one of just two teams in the SEC to have three different 100-yard receivers and the only school to have all three happen in three separate games.

► Greg Childs is tied for second in the SEC and 16th in the NCAA with six touchdown receptions this season. He also ranks third in the SEC and 29th in the NCAA with 81.7 receiving yards per game. Childs also is tied for second in the SEC, averaging 5.9 receptions per game, and his 14.0 yards-per-catch average ranks fifth in the conference.

► Joe Adams leads the SEC and ranks fourth in the nation with his 18.1 yards-per-catch average. He also ranks fourth in the SEC and 35th in the NCAA with 77.7 receiving yards per game and is tied for fifth in the conference with four touchdown grabs.

► Tight end D.J. Williams is the NCAA's active leader in career receptions by a tight end (126) and receiving yards by a tight end (1,562), in addition to being the Razorbacks' active leader in games played (45). His career receptions total ranks seventh on Arkansas' all-time list and is the most by a non-wide receiver in program history.

► Joe Adams has made at least one catch in each of his 29 career games. He has made multiple grabs in 21 of those games. The 29-game streak currently ranks as the longest in the SEC and is tied for the 16th longest nationally.

► Joe Adams has touched the ball 47 times in 2010 for an average of 17.7 yards per touch. He leads the team and ranks ninth in the SEC with 119.1 all-purpose yards per game, courtesy of 544 yards on 30 receptions, 211 yards on 11 punt returns, including a 97-yard score against Ole Miss that is the longest punt return for a touchdown in school history, and 63 yards on four kickoff returns.

► Arkansas is the only school in the SEC to have multiple receivers in the top five in the conference in receiving yards per game (Childs, 3rd, 81.7; Adams, 4th, 77.7). UA also is one of only two schools in the SEC with three receivers in the top 10 for receptions per game (Childs, 2nd-t, 5.9; Adams, 6th-t 4.3; Williams, 9th-t, 4.0).

► Greg Childs led the Razorbacks in receiving at Auburn with nine receptions for a career-high 164 yards. and a career-high-tying two touchdowns His reception total pushed him over 100 in his career and marked the second game this season in which he led the team in receiving yards and third time this season he had the most catches. It was the fifth 100-yard game of his career, which leads all active UA receivers.

► Four different receivers caught touchdown passes at Auburn. Greg Childs led the group with two, while Van Stumon, Ronnie Wingo Jr., and Joe Adams added one each. It was the first time since Nov. 21, 2009, vs. Mississippi State that four different Razorbacks caught touchdown passes.

► Cobi Hamilton became the fourth different Razorback to lead the team in receiving yards with his season-high 98-yard effort vs. Texas A&M.

► Greg Childs set new career highs for single-game receptions and receiving yards and tied his career high for touchdown catches against ULM. The Warren, Ark., native secured 12 grabs, which was one off the program record and tied for third-highest single-game total in school history, for 146 yards and two scores. The 100-yard game was the fourth of his career, which leads all active UA receivers.

► Each of the top five receivers from the 2009 squad returned, along with each of the starting wide receivers and the starting tight end from last season. Players who accounted for 30 of the 32 receiving touchdowns in 2009 returned to the team.

► All five Arkansas players that had a 100-yard receiving game for the Razorbacks last season returned to the squad (Joe Adams, Jarius Wright, Greg Childs, Cobi Hamilton and D.J. Williams). The five combined for nine different 100-yard performances a year ago. Arkansas was the only team in the league with five different players to have a 100-yard receiving game last year. The Razorbacks were the only team in the league with three players who had two or more 100-yard receiving games in 2009 (Childs, Wright and Adams).

► Jarius Wright has averaged 40.1 yards per touchdown reception in his career. One of the Razorbacks' homerun threats, Wright has caught seven TDs for distances of 70, 48, 46, 41, 31 (twice), nine and five yards.

## DEFENSIVE LINE

► The Razorbacks opened the last three games with the following front four: Damario Ambrose (DE), DeQuinta Jones (DT), Byran Jones (NG) and Jake Bequette (DE). Bequette has 26 starts in his career, which leads all defensive linemen on the team, while Byran Jones earned his first three starts as a Razorback.

► Arkansas ranks second in the SEC and 13th in the NCAA in sacks, averaging 2.86 per game in 2010. Defensive end Jake Bequette leads the team and is sixth in the SEC with 5.0 this season, while fellow DE Tenarius Wright's 3.0 sacks are tied for 12th in the conference.

► Jake Bequette leads the team's defensive linemen in tackles with 23 and in tackles for a loss with 6.0.

► Jake Bequette and DeQuinta Jones are tied for the team lead with two QB hurries.

**2010 SCHEDULE NOTES**

► The slate includes matchups with seven teams that reached bowl games in the 2009 season. Four won their bowl matchup. Georgia, who UA beat Sept. 18, won over Texas A&M in the AdvoCare V100 Independence Bowl. The Aggies fell to Arkansas on Oct. 9 in Arlington, Texas. Alabama won the BCS national championship and faced the Razorbacks in Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium Sept. 25.

► Arkansas' schedule includes games against teams that have won two of the last three national championships (LSU 2007, Alabama 2009).

► Arkansas continued its rivalry with former Southwest Conference foe Texas A&M on Oct. 9 when the teams met in the Southwest Classic held at Arlington, Texas, in Cowboys Stadium. Arkansas earned a 24-17 victory to move to 2-0 in the Southwest Classic. The Razorbacks lead the all-time series, 40-24-3.

► Vanderbilt returns to the SEC schedule as the Razorbacks meet the Commodores for the first time since 2006 and the first time in Fayetteville since 2005.

► Last season, UA's schedule ranked as one of the toughest in the nation. According to the NCAA, the 2009 slate ranked as the fourth-toughest in the nation. Arkansas faced six ranked opponents in 2009 (AP or USA Today). Three of the opponents on the 2010 schedule ended last season ranked inside the Top 25 (AP or USA TODAY).

► After having a bye weekend the second week of the season in 2009 which caused the Razorbacks to play 11 straight weeks, the bye this year fell in week five of the season. UA played three of its first four games in the state of Arkansas before facing Texas A&M in Arlington following the bye.

► Arkansas road games in 2009 included trips to Alabama, Florida, Ole Miss and LSU. This season, the Razorbacks have already traveled to Georgia and Auburn, with trips to South Carolina and Mississippi State upcoming. The Georgia game was the first for the Razorbacks in Athens since 2005.

**LINEBACKERS**

► Jerry Franklin led the team with nine tackles vs. Ole Miss, which kept the linebacking corps' streak of leading the team in tackles every game this season active. Franklin leads the team and is ninth in the SEC with 56 tackles this season and has paced the team in tackles five times this season. Franklin is aiming to become just the second Razorback since 1960 to lead the team in tackles for three straight seasons. His 31 career starts also lead the UA defense.

► Anthony Leon leads the team and is tied for fifth in the SEC with 10.0 tackles for a loss. He also is tied for third on the team with 2.5 sacks in 2010.

► Jerry Franklin ranks second on the team with 7.5 tackles for a loss. He also is tied for second among the Razorbacks with 2.5 sacks.

► Ross Rasner led the team in tackles for a loss against ULM with 3.0. Jerico Nelson added 2.0 and Jerry Franklin contributed 1.0. The three linebackers accounted for 6.0 of Arkansas' nine tackles for a loss against the Warhawks.

► Anthony Leon recorded four tackles for a loss, including two sacks, against Tennessee Tech and led the team with eight total tackles in his debut at LB. His four tackles for a loss were the highest for a Razorback since Jamaal Anderson had four against Wisconsin on Jan. 1, 2007.

**SECONDARY**

► Arkansas opened with the following starters in each of the last three games: Ramon Broadway (CB), Darius Winston (CB), Rudell Crim (S) and Tramain Thomas (S). Crim, a converted cornerback, has started a defense-best 20 straight games, while Winston earned the first three starts of his career.

► Rudell Crim and Tramain Thomas are tied for 10th in the SEC with two interceptions each in 2010.

► Ramon Broadway ranks 11th in the SEC with six passes defended this season.

► Tramain Thomas was named the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week, the John Thorpe Defensive Back of the Week and the SEC Defensive Player of the Week after recovering one fumble, recording one interception and piling up a season-high seven tackles, including 0.5 for loss, in UA's 24-17 win over Texas A&M at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

► The Razorback secondary has all five of UA's interceptions this season after accounting for seven in 2009. Rudell Crim and Tramain Thomas are tied for the team lead with two. Crim grabbed the first two interceptions of his career by taking one vs. ULM and another vs. Alabama, while Thomas pushed his career total to five with one at Georgia and one vs. Texas A&M. Andru Stewart added another vs. Alabama for his second as a Razorback. The secondary has at least one interception in five of the last eight games.

► The UA secondary accounted for all four turnovers vs. Texas A&M. Tramain Thomas had his first fumble recovery this season and an interception, while Rudell Crim and Elton Ford each added a fumble recovery and Greg Gatson recorded the first forced fumble of his career.

► Rudell Crim and Andru Stewart each made an interception vs. Alabama, marking the first time this season the Razorbacks grabbed two interceptions in the same game.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

► Freshman Zach Hocker is a perfect 29-for-29 on PATs and 6-of-7 on field goals. His 85.7 field goal percentage puts Arkansas on top of the conference. In Hocker's first SEC game, he made a 48-yard field goal that was the longest for the Razorbacks since 2000. He then matched that with a 48 yarder against Alabama and made his third of 45+ yards with a 46 yarder vs. Ole Miss.

► Alex Tejada has recorded 13 touchbacks so far this season, including four in the season opener vs. Tennessee Tech, to put together the second-highest total in the SEC. Last year, it took nine games and 54 kickoffs for the Razorbacks to record a touchback.

► Joe Adams has been the Razorbacks' punt returner all season. He has returned 11 punts for 211 yards, an average of 19.2 yards per return. His average return ranks second in the SEC and sixth in the NCAA. Against Ole Miss, Adams returned a punt 97 yards for a touchdown, the longest of his career and longest punt return for a touchdown in Arkansas history. His return broke the previous record of 95 yards set by Ken Hatfield vs. Tulsa in 1965 and was the first punt return for a score by the Razorbacks since 2003.

**EMBRACING ARKANSAS**

In his time at Arkansas, Coach Petrino has reached out to the community, faculty and former players through numerous initiatives including the following:

Made a personal \$100,000 commitment to the Razorback Foundation. Petrino's gift is believed to be the largest donation to the Razorback Foundation Annual Fund by a sitting Razorback head coach in school history.

Initiated a kickoff luncheon that has been a preseason highlight each of the last two years. The event was attended by close to 1,000 fans prior to the 2010 season. Coach Petrino was the featured speaker and coaches, football personnel and all players attended. Two players sat at each table with fans. The plan is for the luncheon to continue in future seasons.

Asked to establish a weekly radio show, which is held Wednesday evenings throughout the fall at a local restaurant where fans can attend.

Studied and asked for consideration for a synthetic field surface to be installed at Razorback Stadium. The installation began immediately following our spring game and was completed prior to the 2009 season.

After reading an article discussing city budget issues, Coach Petrino utilized time that was allocated for team meetings during 2009 spring football to send the entire squad to the city library. The group spent part of an afternoon cleaning, stacking books and visiting with children.

Organized a ceremony at halftime that has become a fixture at halftime of the annual Red-White game honoring the senior class from the past season and naming team award winners. He has invited former players back to be a part of it and the following have been on hand: Darren McFadden, Felix Jones, Shawn Andrews, Ken Hamlin, Quinn Grovey and Cedric Cobbs, among others.

Has made appearances at several other Razorback sporting events including men's and women's basketball games and baseball, including the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.

One area Coach Petrino focuses on is teaching players life lessons. Leadership classes and an etiquette dinner are two examples of the programs Coach Petrino has had players attend in order to prepare them for life beyond football.

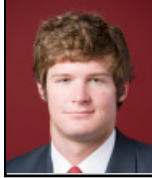
