VANDERBILT-ARKANSAS NOTES

- ★ Vanderbilt has played fewer games against Arkansas than any other member of the Southeastern Conference. The Commodores are 2-5 all-time against the Razorbacks, who joined the SEC in 1992.
- ★ The Commodores look to earn a second consecutive victory over Arkansas in Fayetteville. Vanderbilt earned a 24-17 comeback win over the Razorbacks in 2005.
- ★ The Commodores have never faced a team coached by Arkansas mentor Bobby Petrino.

LB CAMPBELL FROM ARKANSAS

Starting LB **Nate Campbell** (R-Sr.) is the lone Commodore hailing from the state of Arkansas.

Campbell was a four-sport standout at Hazen H.S., located just off Interstate 40 between Little Rock and Memphis.

Campbell has posted 15 total tackles – a single-season career high – four tackles for loss and a forced fumble in four starting assignments this season.

BROTHERS SQUARE OFF SATURDAY

A pair of brothers from Jacksonville, Fla., will wear different uniforms Saturday when the Commodores and Razorbacks square off.

Vanderbilt WR **Tray Herndon** (R-Jr.) will face his younger brother, **Javontee Herndon** (WR, Fr.) in Fayetteville.

Both Herndons have contributed this season: Tray has 5 receptions for 56 yards for the Commodores; Javontee has 2 catches for 32 for the Razorbacks.

PREP TEAMMATES TO FACE OFF

Vanderbilt's **Trey Wilson** (So., DB) and Arkansas' **Ramon Broadway** (Sr., DB) attended the same high school in Shreveport, La.

Wilson and Broadway were defensive back standouts on powerful Evangel Christian Academy teams that captured consecutive state titles in 2005 (Broadway's senior season) and 2006 (Wilson's sophomore campaign).

VANDERBILT IN 2010: LOTS OF YOUTH

Looking for a quick description for Robbie Caldwell's first Vanderbilt squad? *Youthful* would work.

The list of 'Dores seeing action features 21 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 13 true freshmen.

Only eight Commodore seniors have contributed this season.

SEVENTEEN NEW STARTERS THIS YEAR

Seventeen Commodores – eight on defense, seven on offense and one specialist – have enjoyed their first career starts this season.

Logan Stewart (Fr., center) and **Mason Johnston** (R-Fr., TE) earned their first career starts against South Carolina.

Besides Stewart and Johnston, the following offensive players have made their first career starts this year: **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., OG), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., LT), **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR), **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr., RB), **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., OG-OT) and **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., WR).

Defensive players earning initial starts this year are **Archibald Barnes** (R-So., LB), **Nate Campbell** (R-Sr., LB), **Eddie Foster** (So., CB), **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety), **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., safety), **Rob Lohr** (R-So., DT), **Colt Nichter** (R-So., DT) and **Trey Wilson** (So., CB).

Punter **Richard Kent** (R-So.) also is a first-year starter.

THIRTEEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Just six teams across the nation have played more true freshmen than Vanderbilt this year. Thirteen Commodore true freshmen have enjoyed action this season.

Florida and Air Force lead the nation with 17 true freshmen contributors.

30 'DORES SEE FIRST COLLEGE ACTION

Thirty Commodores have played their first snaps this season.

KITCHINGS NEW OFF. COORDINATOR

Running backs mentor **Des Kitchings** will replace **Jimmy Kiser** as the Commodores' offensive coordinator, Head Coach Robbie Caldwell announced Oct. 25.

The decision elevates Kitchings, currently in his third year on the Vanderbilt staff, to offensive coordinator for the first time in his coaching career.

Kiser will continue to coach the team's quarterbacks.

Earlier this year, the following coaching changes were made:

★ **Bruce Fowler** moved to assistant head coach/linebackers coach under Caldwell as assistant head coach.

★ **Jamie Bryant** became the sole defensive coordinator while continuing as the team's secondary coach.

★ **Rick Logo** added recruiting coordinator duties to his primary role as defensive tackles coach.

★ **Mike Pelton** hired as defensive ends coach.

★ **Ted Cain** moved to tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.

CALDWELL AS FIRST-YEAR COACH

How does **Robbie Caldwell** match up with other first-year Vanderbilt head coaches?

In just six games, Caldwell has matched the win total of four of the last six Commodore coaches.

Since Fred Pancoast's first team won seven games in 1975, the highest first-year win total was accomplished by Gerry DiNardo in 1991 (5).

HAND NEWEST COMMODORE COACH

Herb Hand, a veteran offensive coach with excellent credentials, is the newest Vanderbilt coach. Hired in early August, Hand serves as offensive line coach and was the first staff hire by Robbie Caldwell.

Hand came to Vanderbilt after three years at the University of Tulsa, a tenure that featured some of the NCAA's most productive offenses. As Tulsa's offensive coordinator, Hand directed 2007 and 2008 offenses that topped the nation. Tulsa's 2008 unit averaged 570 yards and 47 points. Hand also spent six successful years with the University of West Virginia's productive spread offense before going to Tulsa.

WINNING TREND: 100-YARD RUSHERS

Success in the Vanderbilt running game leads to team success.

Dating back to 2003, Vanderbilt has won every game in which its rushing attack features a 100-yard rusher. **Warren Norman's** 111 rushing yards was a key factor in the Commodores' 28-14 victory at Ole Miss on Sept. 18. Since the 2003 opener, Vanderbilt is 14-0 when a running back reaches 100 rushing yards.

ANOTHER CO-CAPTAIN MISSES ACTION

The Commodores are still yet to play a game this season when all four co-captains see action.

Joey Bailey (R-Sr., center) missed the South Carolina game with an ankle injury. It was his first missed game of the year.

The team's three defensive co-captains – **T.J. Greenstone** (R-Jr., DT), **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) and **Adam Smotherman** (R-Sr., DT) – played against the Gamecocks, the first time this year all three were in the same game.

Injuries have limited the defenders: Greenstone returned against South Carolina after missing three games with an ankle injury; while Marve and Smotherman missed time due to knee injuries.

DUO AMONG NCAA STAT LEADERS

Vanderbilt standouts, **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Jr., DE), remain among the national leaders in key defensive stats.

Hayward, from Perry, Ga., shares the NCAA lead with five interceptions. Fugger, of Oak Brook, Ill., also ranks third nationally with four forced fumbles.

Hayward, believed to be the first Commodore of the modern era to achieve interceptions in four consecutive games, also tops the squad with seven career picks. Hayward's current interception total has been bettered by only two Commodores in the last 30 years: **D.J. Moore** (2007, 2008), and **Leonard Coleman** (1982). The team's single-season record of eight interceptions is held by Coleman (1982) and **Thomas Wingfield** (1973).

Fugger's forced fumble total is just as rare. Only two Commodore defenders since 1983 have posted more forced fumbles in a season than Fugger: **Jamie Duncan** (5, 1996) and **Shelton Quarles** (5, 1991).

NORMAN MOVES UP RETURN CHARTS

Though just a sophomore, **Warren Norman** continues to move up Vanderbilt all-time kickoff return charts.

Norman, who had 155 yards on eight returns at Georgia two weeks ago, moved up three positions to No. 6 all-time on the list. He is averaging 24.8 yards per return this year, ranking sixth in the SEC and 44th in the NCAA.

Norman is now averaging 26.0 yards per kickoff for his career. In 2009, he set a modern-day Vanderbilt team record in 2009 with a 26.2 yard average.

COMMODORE NOTES

NOTES FROM SOUTH CAROLINA GAME

★ Vanderbilt's five-game streak of winning in which it scored the first points ended in the South Carolina loss. The streak dated to the Commodores' win in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl.

Prior to the South Carolina, the last time Vanderbilt lost when it scored first was against Wake Forest on Nov. 29, 2008.

★ **John Stokes** (Sr., LB) continues to put together his finest year as a Commodore defender. He had nine total tackles, including seven solo stops, in an impressive performance against the Gamecocks.

For the year, Stokes is the team's second leading tackler (53 total stops) and has established a new single-season career high for tackles.

★ The South Carolina game was definitely a tale of two halves for the Vanderbilt offense. After producing 180 total yards (85 rushing/85 passing) in the first half, the unit gained just 70 yards after intermission.

★ **Steven Clarke** (Fr., DB) had a career game while playing the longest stint of his brief career. Clarke had eight tackles, a sack and one QB hurry.

★ The field goal block by **Walker May** (R-Fr., DE) was the team's second of the year. **T.J. Greenstone** had the first block vs. Northwestern.

★ The Commodores' lone scoring drive – a 12-play, 83-yard touch-down possession in the second quarter capped by **Larry Smith's** 3-yard TD rush – was the offense's second longest drive of the season in terms of plays, and third longest in terms of yards.

★ **Richard Kent** (R-Fr.) continues to impress during his first year as the Commodores' punter. He was sensational against South Carolina, averaging 46.3 yards on nine punts. He had a career long effort of 60 yards, and placed two punts inside the SC 20-yard line. Kent was named the team's specialist of the week after the performance.

★ The Commodore defense yielded just 21 points, but allowed South Carolina and its talented receiving corps to produce 484 total yards. One week earlier, Georgia gained 547 total yards.

★ Vanderbilt's four SEC opponents have run 91 more offensive plays than the Commodores, or 22.8 plays more per game.

The Gamecocks ran 84 offensive plays, the most by a Commodore opponent this year. The play count was partially responsible for a 37:21-22:39 advantage for South Carolina in time of possession.

★ Freshman **Logan Stewart** earned his first career start, replacing fifth-year senior Joey Bailey at center. The Commodore offensive front consisted on a junior (**Kyle Fischer**), two sophomores (**Ryan Seymour**, **Jabo Burrow**), a redshirt freshman (**Wesley Johnson**) and a true freshman (**Stewart**).

★ The Vanderbilt defense produced a season-high four sacks of SC QB Stephen Garcia. **Sean Richardson** (Jr., safety), **Steven Clarke** (Fr., CB) and **Walker May** (R-Fr., DE) were in on their first career sacks.

★ **Warren Norman** (So., RB/KR) had a 40-yard rush on the first play of the game, but netted just five more yards on five additional carries. He and the team's other primary back **Zac Stacy** (So.) combined for 12 total carries.

★ Vanderbilt is now 25-37-3 in its homecoming games since World War II. The 'Dores have lost eight straight homecoming games dating back to a victory against Connecticut in 2002.

★ Odd stat: **Casey Hayward** (Jr., DB) shares the national lead with five interceptions, but has zero return yards.

STATISTICAL MILESTONES

★ **Larry Smith** (R-Jr., QB) surpassed the 1,000-yard mark for passing yards in the South Carolina game. His 1,005-yard total ranks ninth all-time among Vanderbilt junior QBs. Smith needs 379 passing yards to overtake Mike Wright (1,383 yards, 1977) into eighth place.

★ **John Cole** (R-So., WR) surpassed 50 career catches vs. the Gamecocks. He has 52 receptions in 17 career appearances. Cole also has a reception of 32 yards or more in three of the last four games.

★ **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) is approaching a single-season high in unassisted tackles. He enters the Arkansas game with 36 solo stops, just four from his career high set last year.

Hayward's totals in interceptions (5) and defended passes (10) also represent single-season highs.

★ **Sean Richardson** (Jr., safety) surpassed his previous season high in solo tackles. He has 44 stops on the year, one more than a year ago.

Richardson's team-high 6.5 tackles for loss also is a career high.

★ **John Stokes** (Sr.) played in his 44th career game, most on the squad.

★ **Richard Kent** (R-Fr.) has nine punts of 50 or more yards this year. Twenty of his 53 punts have been downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

★ **Kenny Ladler** has the most tackles (30) by a Vanderbilt freshman safety since Reshard Langford posted 55 tackles as a first-year player in 2005.

RECENT WINS OVER RANKED FOES

Vanderbilt, who has notched five wins over ranked opponents since 2005 but none in the last two years, will play a third ranked opponent this week when they face the Razorbacks.

The 'Dores have lost seven straight to teams ranked by the Top 25 since the 2009 opener.

In 2008, Vanderbilt registered three victories over ranked foes. The 'Dores beat No. 24 Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, No. 13 Auburn before an ESPN *College GameDay* crowd and No. 24 South Carolina.

STOKES NOMINATED FOR SCHOLAR ATHLETE AWARD

Senior linebacker **John Stokes** (Sr., LB) has been nominated by Vanderbilt Athletics for the prestigious National Scholar Athlete Award sponsored by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame.

Stokes is the team's second leading tackler and tops the squad with a pair of fumble recoveries in his final year as a starter.

Stokes maintains a 3.8 GPA, majoring in Medicine, Health & Society. He is a two-time District IV Academic All-American. The son of Vanderbilt graduates also received early admission into Vanderbilt's Medical School after his sophomore academic year on campus, and is expected to start postgraduate classes next fall.

Stokes also is involved as an executive board member of one of Vanderbilt's largest student organizations, Manna Project International. He serves as site development coordinator, in charge of planning and creating community service trips abroad during Spring Break 2011.

There have been four previous Vanderbilt recipients of the award: **Hunter Hillenmeyer**, 2002; **Andy McCarroll**, 1989; **Doug Martin**, 1974; and **Wade Butcher**, 1961.

CALDWELL: FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH

Robbie Caldwell, the 26th head coach in Vanderbilt football history, is one of just 11 first-time head coaches in the NCAA FBS subdivision this season.

Caldwell, a veteran of more than three decades of collegiate coaching, was named to replace retiring Bobby Johnson on July 14.

Caldwell and Kentucky mentor Joker Phillips are the SEC's only first-time head coaches this year.

Besides Caldwell and Phillips, other first-time FCS head coaches are Sonny Dykes (La. Tech), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), John "Doc" Holliday (Marshall), Mike MacIntyre (San Jose State), Larry Porter (Memphis), Jeff Quinn (Buffalo), Charlie Strong (Louisville) and Willie Taggart (Western Kentucky).

Caldwell has the most collegiate coaching experience of the 11 coaches, with Holliday having the second longest tenure.

THIRTEEN PLAYERS ON COUNCIL

Thirteen players participate in the Leadership Council, serving as an entity that addresses team and student-athlete issues while acting as their teammates' voice in communicating with Vanderbilt coaches.

Co-captains **Joey Bailey**, **T.J. Greenstone**, **Chris Marve** and **Adam Smotherman** are members of the Leadership Council. Others voted by teammates to represent various position groups include **Larry Smith**, QBs; **Kennard Reeves**, RBs; **Brandon Barden**, TEs/HBs; **John Cole**, WRS; **Tim Fugger**, DL; **John Stokes**, LBs; **Sean Richardson**, safeties; **Casey Hayward**, DBs; and **David Giller**, specialists.

MARVE WEARS DOSTER "KD1" PATCH

Chris Marve (R-Jr., LB) became the fourth Vanderbilt player to wear the "KD1" jersey patch when the Commodores opened against Northwestern.

The recognition is one of the most significant awarded by fellow Commodore players.

The patch honors the memory of Kwane Doster, the only Commodore ever to receive the SEC Freshman of the Year Award. Doster was shot and killed in his hometown of Tampa, Fla., on Dec. 26, 2004. It will be displayed on the front of Stewart's No. 90 jersey.

SOLID NET PUNTING

Behind first-year punter Richard Kent, the Commodores rank among the SEC's best in net punting. Though Kent is the SEC's sixth ranked punter (40.4-yard avg.), the Commodores are third in the league in net punting (38.9-yard avg). Vanderbilt coverage units have allowed just 20 punt return yards this year.

THIRD-DOWN STRUGGLES

The Vanderbilt offense continued to struggle in third down effectiveness against the Gamecocks.

To date, the poor third down results have played a role in Vanderbilt trailing the SEC in numerous offensive statistical categories, including scoring, first downs and total offense.

The offense has converted on its 24 percent of its third downs this season (21 of 89). On Saturday, they converted on three of 15 third downs.

Just one team in the nation, San Jose State, has converted third downs with less frequency than the Commodores.

JOHNSON: NAMED TOP SEC OL VS. OLE MISS

Redshirt freshman tackle Wesley Johnson earned the SEC's top weekly honor for offensive lineman honor for his play against Ole Miss Sept. 18.

Johnson recorded six knock-down blocks and produced key blocks on a pair of long scoring rushes.

Johnson became the first Commodore to earn SEC top offensive lineman honors since left tackle Chris Williams was recognized in 2007.

UNIFORM CHANGE: NAMES ON JERSEYS

For the first time since 2001, Vanderbilt jerseys sport player names.

The uniform change was introduced in the season opener versus Northwestern.

Jerseys during the Bobby Johnson tenure did not identify players.

TOP INDIVIDUAL PERFORMERS

Chris Marve, **Casey Hayward** and **Warren Norman** are playing up to their preseason hype.

Marve, a junior LB from Memphis, and Norman, a sophomore RB/RS from Stone Mountain, Ga., were both named first team All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers. Hayward, a junior CB from Perry, Ga., was mentioned on several preseason ballots.

All are performing well this year: Marve ranks among the SEC's leading tacklers; Norman among the league's top all-purpose runners; and Hayward among the conference's interception leaders.

CHRIS MARVE (R-Jr., LB)

Named to watchlists for the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award, Marve returned to action at Georgia after missing the previous game to injury. He contributed six tackles vs. South Carolina, and currently ranks eighth in the SEC in tackles (8.0 pg).

Marve is trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn achieved the feat in 1998-2000.

WARREN NORMAN (Jr., KR/RB)

Norman, the 2009 SEC Freshman of the Year, ranks fourth in the SEC in all-purpose yardage (143.0 ypg). He was limited to 99 all-purpose yards against South Carolina.

Norman also leads Vanderbilt in rushing yards (56.4 ypg). Just a sophomore, Norman tops all Commodores with 1,184 career rushing yards and seven rushing TDs.

Last year, Norman topped the SEC with 1,951 all-purpose yards, breaking the legendary Herschel Walker's freshman SEC record in the process. He also matched an SEC mark with three kickoff returns for TDs.

CASEY HAYWARD (Jr., DB)

Junior cornerback shares the national lead with five interceptions and tops the conference with 10 defended passes.

Hayward was the team's defensive player of the week after posting nine tackles, an INT and two defended passes against South Carolina.

OTHER TOP CANDIDATES

SEAN RICHARDSON (Jr., Safety) Regarded as one of the SEC's top safeties, Richardson blossomed as a starter at strong safety in 2009, earning 84 total tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.

★ *Richardson is SEC's sixth leading tackler (8.6 per game)*

BRANDON BARDEN (R-Jr., TE) Finished 2009 with 29 receptions, good for 357 yards and a TD. Former prep QB ranks as Vanderbilt's active career leader with 78 receptions, 813 receiving yards and seven TDs.

★ *Barden tops team in catches (21) and receiving yards (247)*

RYAN FOWLER (R-So., PK) Untested entering '09, Fowler connected on 11 of his last 12 attempts, including final eight. Fowler's 16 FGs tied a school record, earning Freshman All-America and SEC honors.

REMEMBERING RAJAAN BENNETT

The Commodores are without one student-athlete who was expected to be a key member of the 2010 signing class, **Rajaan Bennett**.

Bennett, a highly sought-after running back from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga., died tragically on Feb. 18, 2010. Bennett was the victim of a residential shooting that shocked the McEachern and Vanderbilt communities. On Sept. 3, the school honored Bennett by retiring his No. 5 jersey and erecting a monument at its football stadium.

At a memorial service days after the death, his literature teacher read an essay entitled "*Strength*" written by Bennett within a week of his death.

The essay closed with the following lines:

"There will never be a time that I will give up. I work hard at whatever I do for that man upstairs to smile down on me with the rays of the sun.

"My drive cannot be stopped or even slowed down, because every obstacle has a way around it.

"Every day I become stronger from the weights physically, the books mentally and life emotionally. There is no limit to my strength and at the end of the day, I want to be known as the strongest."

Bennett rushed for 1,857 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior captain, helping McEachern to an undefeated regular season. A Rivals' 4-star recruit and one of Georgia's most decorated seniors, Bennett earned the state's AAAAA Offensive Player of the Year Award. At McEachern, Bennett was a campus leader and honors student.

Bennett and his family were honored by the Commodores during an in-game ceremony on Oct. 23 when Vanderbilt faced South Carolina.
