FLORIDA HITS THE ROAD TO FACE VANDERBILT

THE STORYLINE

Florida travels to Vanderbilt at 5-3 (3-3 SEC) after a 34-31 overtime win in its annual Jacksonville clash with Georgia. Vanderbilt comes into the contest after losing on the road at Arkansas, 49-14, dropping the Commodores to 2-6 (1-4 SEC).

Saturday marks the 44th meeting in series history, with UF holding a 32-9-2 edge all-time. The Gators are 5-0 against Vanderbilt under head coach Urban Meyer.

LAST TIME OUT

Florida posted a dramatic 34-31 overtime win over Georgia in the teams' annual showdown in Jacksonville, with Chas Henry booting a 37-yard field goal on the game's final play.

Florida drove 91 yards for the game's first score, with a 20-yard run by Chris Rainey putting Florida up, 7-0. The Bulldogs immediately answered with a touchdown drive of their own, knotting the score at 7-7. The Gators used turnovers on back-to-back possessions to jump to a 21-7 lead heading into halftime.

Georgia furiously rallied, tying the score at 24-all with 9:01 remaining in the game. UF had an answer, as Trey Burton broke free for a 51-yard touchdown run to put Florida up, 31-24. However, a big kickoff return gave Georgia the ball at UF's 43-yard line to open its following drive. The Bulldogs capitalized, once again tying the game. Neither team was able to sustain a drive in the game's closing minutes, forcing overtime.

In the first overtime, Georgia faced third-and-nine at UF's 24 when Will Hill intercepted Aaron Murray's pass. Hill returned the ball 89 yards before being tripped up just shy of the goal line. Needing any type of score on its possesssion to win the game, Florida called upon Henry to kick the game-winner, and the senior from Dallas, Ga., delivered a perfect kick.

It marked Florida's 17th straight win over SEC East foes, while the Gators improved to 17-1 against its rivals under head coach Urban Meyer, who now holds a 32-3 career record in games with more than one week to prepare (season openers, coming off a bye, bowl games).

-DID YOU KNOW?-

Chas Henry's game-winning 37-yard field goal was the first by a UF player on the game's final play since Arden Czyzewski kicked a 41-yard field goal to defeat LSU, 16-13, on Oct. 7, 1989.

(Gainesville) Florida won its 19th consecutive game with a 27-3 victory. The Gators held the Commodores to just 99 yards rushing and 100 yards passing, the sixth time last season that the UF defense had held its opponent to under 100 yards rushing. Aaron Hernandez had seven receptions for 120 yards.

2008 UF 42 VU 14 (Nashville) The Gators posted a 42-14 win to clinch the SEC East as Tim Tebow accounted for five touchdowns, all of which came in the first half. He finished the game 12-for-17 for 171 yards and three touchdowns and led the squad in rushing with 88 yards on 11 carries and two scores.

2007 UF 49 VU 22 (Gainesville) Percy Harvin had 11 carries for 113 yards with two touchdowns and nine receptions for 110 yards, marking the first time in school history that a player rushed and received for more than 100 yards in a single game, as the Gators posted a 49-22 Homecoming victory.

UF 25 VU 19

(Nashville) Quarterback Chris Leak ran for two touchdowns and Florida's special teams blocked two punts as Gators claimed the road victory. UF's win, coupled with Tennessee's loss to LSU, clinched the Eastern Division crown.

UF 49 VU 42 (2OT)

(Gainesville) An interception by Reggie Lewis on a pass by Jay Cutler ended the game. On the previous possession, wide receiver Jemalle Cornelius hauled in a 16-yard reception from Chris Leak with a dramatic catch in the back of the end zone. Leak finished with a career-high 32 completions in 41 attempts for 257 yards and passed for three TDs

FROM LAST GAME

-DEFENSE-

- -The Florida defense had four takeaways, including three interceptions and one fumble recovery. The three turnovers created in regulation resulted in 14 points, while Will Hill's interception in overtime set the stage for the Gators to kick the game-winning field goal. It marked the fourth game this season the UF defense has forced at least four turnovers.
- -UF limited A.J. Green, who entered the game averaging 91.2 yards per game, to just 42 yards receiving on four receptions. Green was defended primarily by Janoris Jenkins, who grabbed an interception on the game's first play from scrimmage.
- -Florida held Aaron Murray below a 50 percent completion rate, the second game in a row it has done so and third time overall this season.
- -With UF's three interceptions in the game, the Gators have tallied 10 picks in its last three showdowns against Georgia.

-OFFENSE-

- -Florida posted big five plays of 20-plus yards and committed just one turnover to help the Gators post a plus-three turnover margin.
- -After going 5-of-11 in the red zone in the previous three games, UF was 5-of-6 with three touchdowns and two field goals.
- -Florida scored 21 points in the second quarter, which matched a season high for points in a quarter (Miami University, USF) and marked the first time of those instances that all the points have come from the offense.
- -The average touchdown drive for Florida was 1:54 after entering the game with an average of 3:33 for the season.
- -UF had three players exceed 100 all-purpose yards, the first time that has happened since the 2010 Sugar Bowl vs. Cincinnati.
- -The Gators totaled 231 rushing yards against the Bulldogs' defense, which entered the game giving up 99.2 yards per game on the ground and ranking No. 1 in the SEC and No. 12 in the nation.
- -Florida racked up 450 yards of total offense against a team that was giving up just 306.8 per game. The 34 points scored by the Gators was the most Georgia's defense has given up all season.
- -The Gators' 91-yard scoring drive at the start of the second quarter was their longest of the season.

-SPECIAL TEAMS-

- -Chas Henry kicked the game-winning field goal from 37 yards out in overtime, marking the second game-winning field goal for Florida during head coach Urban Meyer's tenure (Caleb Sturgis vs. Arkansas, 2009).
- -Henry also booted a 61-yard punt in the third quarter. It was his fourth this season of 60-plus yards. He averaged 46.8 yards on six punts with a net of 41.2.
- -Chris Rainey had six kickoff returns for 148 yards, with a long of 45 yards. He became the fourth Florida player this season to take a kickoff back 45 yards or more.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - Florida quarterback Terry Dean set a Southeastern Conference record with six touchdown passes, and the Gators set a school record with 512 passing yards in the Homecoming victory over Southwestern Louisiana. The win was Florida's 22nd in a row at The Swamp.

Dean threw one first-half touchdown to Chris Doering and two apiece to Jack Jackson and Willie Jackson as part of a 40-0 run to start the game and a 40-7 halftime lead. UF extended its lead in the third quarter as Dean connected with Jack Jackson a third time. In addition to setting a personal record with 153 yards receiving and tying his career high with eight receptions, Jack Jackson tied a school record with his three touchdown receptions.

Jeff Demps won an individual national championship during the spring 2010 outdoor track season, posting a scorching 9.96 time in the 100 meters. Demps also helped the Gators to the 2010 team men's indoor national championship. Having also been a part of the 2008 national champion football team, he became the first student-athlete in UF history to win a national championship in two sports.



-FRESH FACES-

-Twelve players have made their first career starts this season. Seven did so against Miami: Jonathan Bostic, John Brantley, Josh Evans, Jon Halapio, Jelani Jenkins, Moses Jenkins and T.J. Pridemore. Facing USF, Jeremy Brown, Trey Burton and Omarius Hines made their initial start. Jordan Reed made his at Tennessee, while Frankie Hammond, Jr., got that opportunity vs. Kentucky.

-In the opening week of the season, UF played more true freshmen (15) than any other school in the country. The Gators played 24 freshman in total, adding in the nine redshirt freshmen who saw the field.

- -Florida has had 29 freshmen appear this season (17 true), and 41 of the 75 players who have participated (54.7 percent) in a game for UF are freshmen or sophomores.
- -Against Tennessee, 27 percent of those on the travel roster were true freshmen while 41 percent were either true freshmen or redshirt freshmen. Overall, 30 percent of those who traveled to Tennessee were making their first road trip.

GATORS AND THE POLLS

- -Florida has been ranked in the AP poll 523 times, holding a record of 293-112-9 in games played while ranked. Additionally, Florida's all-time record against AP-ranked opponents is 81-72-4.
- -Under Urban Meyer, the Gators are 61-13 (.824) as an AP ranked team, including 19-8 (.704) when facing an opponent that is also ranked.
- -The Gators have been ranked in 89 Coaches' Polls under Urban Meyer, including 31 times in the top three.

OFFENSE

- -Seven offensive players made their first career start over the first four games of the season: John Brantley (QB), Trey Burton (HB), Jon Halapio (RG), Frankie Hammond, Jr. (WR), Omarius Hines (TE), T.J. Pridemore (FB) and Jordan Reed (TE).
- -Florida has scored 23 touchdowns and four field goals on 36 red zone trips this season. Earlier this season, the Gators scored on 15 consecutive red zone possessions, including 14 touchdowns, beginning in the opener against Miami. The streak was snapped on the opening drive at Alabama.
- -After a 5-for-11 red zone showing in losses to Alabama, LSU and Mississippi State, UF put together a 5-for-6 red zone performance in the win over Georgia.
- -The Gators posted a season-high 91-yard touchdown drive to get their first score against Georgia.
- -Florida improved its quick-strike offense against Georgia, with its average touchdown drives lasting just 1:54. It had been averaging 3:33 per touchdown drive coming into the game.

-Florida's four rushing touchdowns and 231 rushing yards against Georgia marked the team's second-highest output of the season in each category. The Gators had five touchdowns in defeating Kentucky and 251 rushing yards against USF.

-The Gators totaled five plays of 20-plus yards against Georgia, including a long of 51 on a Trey Burton touchdown run.

-The UF offense has had at least three different players record a touchdown in five games this

season (Miami, USF, Tennessee, LSU, Georgia), with 12 different players overall scoring a touchdown, including defensive and special teams. Against Kentucky, freshman quarterback Trey Burton accounted for all six of UF's offensive touchdowns.

-Florida has held the ball for 10-plus minutes during a single quarter in six different games this season:

- -UF had three drives of 13-plus plays against Mississippi State. However, those drives yielded just one touchdown and two missed field goals.
- -The Gators put together a 10-play, 80-yard touchdown drive in the fourth quarter against LSU that put UF up 29-26 late in the game. The drive was keyed by a third-down 51-yard John Brantley-to-Carl Moore pass.
- -Three of Florida's four touchdowns against LSU came from freshmen (Jordan Reed, Trey Burton, Andre Debose), while the fourth came from a sophomore (Mike Gillislee).
- -The Gator defense twice gave UF the ball inside the red zone to start first-half drives against LSU, and the Gators converted both into touchdowns.
- -Florida's offense put together three drives of 10-plus plays against Alabama. But two of those three ended in red-zone turnovers, with the third resulting in a field goal. Florida had two more against LSU, including one for a touchdown and another that resulted in a missed field goal.
- -UF scored a touchdown on each of its final four possessions against Kentucky and on seven of 11 possessions overall for the game.
- -Florida had three touchdown drives of 80 or more yards against Kentucky after having one over the first three games of the season.
- -Florida went a combined 9-for-15 on third-down conversions of sevenplus yards against Tennessee and Kentucky.
- -Three times this season, UF has scored three touchdowns in a 10-minute span or less. Facing Kentucky, the Gators posted three touchdowns in 9:42 over the third and fourth quarters. UF scored 21 points in the span of 5:11 vs. USF during the third quarter. In their opener vs. Miami University, the Gators scored 21 points in 4:52 in the second quarter. UF also posted three touchdowns in a span of 11:06 in the second quarter against Georgia.

OFFENSE (CONT.)

- -Nine of 11 starting offensive starters in the season opener vs. Miami were making their first start at the position they started in. Only Deonte Thompson and Jeff Demps had starting experience at their place on the field.
- -After punting on its first second-half possession vs. USF, Florida scored on 17 of its next 27 possessions (15 touchdowns and two field goals), discounting drives that ended with Florida running out the clock.
- -The Gator offense posted three plays of 25-plus yards vs. Miami: a 72-yard touchdown run by Jeff Demps, a 41-yard run by Mike Gillislee and a 25-yard touchdown reception by Chris Rainey. Against USF, Demps added a 62-yard scoring run.
- -In USF and Tennessee, Florida faced two teams with a first-year coach. In each game, UF scored seven first-half points. After halftime adjustments, the Gators rolled up 21 points against USF and 17 vs. Tennessee in the third quarter. Against Kentucky, also with a first-year coach, Florida had more balanced halves, tallying 21 points in the first and 27 in the second.
- -UF is outscoring its opponent in the fourth quarter by a 59-23 margin.

-PHYSICAL AND FAST-

-The Gator rushing attack has thrived in the fourth quarter over the past several seasons. On 503 carries in the fourth quarter since 2007, UF has piled up several SEC-bests with 5.4 yards per carry, 2,722 yards and 36 touchdowns.

QUARTERBACKS

- -John Brantley threw for two touchdowns in each of his first two starts in 2010 and had one at Tennessee and vs. Kentucky. He entered the season with two career multi-touchdown games, previously throwing two against Charleston Southern and a careerhigh three vs. FIU, both in 2008.
- -Brantley has completed 145 of 233 passes (62.2 percent) for 1,459 yards and six touchdowns with six interceptions for a passer rating of 118.2.
- -Brantley helped lead the Gators to 450 yards of offense against a Georgia defense that was giving up just 306.8 per game. The 34 points scored by the Gators was the most the Bulldogs defense had given up all season.

- -Brantley was 9-for-13 for 76 yards in the potential game-tying drive vs. Mississippi State. He was 2-for-2 for 51 yards in the final two minutes against LSU.
- -Brantley went 156 pass attempts without an interception, spanning from the 2008 game vs. Vanderbilt until the streak ended in 2010 against Kentcuky. He opened the 2010 season with an active streak of 79.
- -Brantley set career highs in completions (24), attempts (35) and yards (248) vs. Kentucky. Brantley spread the ball to eight different receivers in the game. Overall, he has distributed the ball to 13 different receivers this season.
- -Brantley connected on a career-long 51-yard pass to Carl Moore to key Florida's fourth-quarter touchdown drive against LSU that gave UF a late lead.
- -True freshman Trey Burton set a UF record and an SEC freshman record scoring six touchdowns in a single game against Kentucky. Burton had five on the ground and one receiving.
- -Burton's six-touchdown game was one shy of the national freshman record of seven, set by Marshall Faulk of San Diego State in 1991 vs. Pacific. Burton is the first freshman since 2005 (Steve Slaton of West Virginia vs. Louisville) to score six touchdowns in a game.
- -Burton posted his first career 100-yard rushing game with 110 yards and two touchdowns against Georgia, including a career-long 51-yard scoring run. It was his second career multi-touchdown game. Burton also led UF with five receptions for 35 yards, the second time this season he has led the team in catches.
- -Burton led the team with four receptions against Alabama, becoming the first UF freshman to lead the team outright in receptions in a single game since Jeff Demps did so with four against Kentucky in 2008.
- -Burton's two-game total of nine receptions (five vs. Kentucky; four at Alabama) was the most by a Florida freshman since Percy Harvin had 14 total receptions against Arkansas in the 2006 SEC Championship game (five) and Ohio State in the BCS National Championship Game (nine).
- -Burton has scored a touchdown on 11 of his 74 offensive touches (not including pass attempts) this season.

- -Against Kentucky, Burton completed his first career attempt, a 42-yard pass to Omarius Hines, which was then UF's longest pass play of the season.
- -Burton scored a two-yard rushing touchdown against Miami University on his first career rushing attempt, becoming the first true freshman UF quarterback to score on opening day since Cam Newton in 2007. Burton added another rushing touchdown in the win over Tennessee.
- -In addition to taking snaps at quarterback, Burton has started at full-back (USF, Georgia) and wide receiver (Tennessee, Kentucky, Alabama, LSU, Mississippi State) and seen time at tight end, h-back and on kickoff coverage.
- -With his fourth-quarter touchdown pass to Jordan Reed against USF, Brantley recorded his 14th career scoring pass and surpassed the career total of his father, John III. From 1977-78, the elder Brantley completed 99 of 201 passes for 1,515 yards, 13 touchdowns and 13 interceptions.
- -This season marks the eighth time since 1980 that UF has opened the season with a quarterback who has never started a game. Below is a look at those seasons and the quarterback who led the team in games started that year:

-Brantley completed 36 of 48 passes (75.0 percent) for 410 yards and seven touchdowns with no interceptions in 2009, good for a 194.9 pass efficiency mark. That passer rating was the best in the nation by a quarterback with 25-100 attempts.

RUNNING BACKS

- -Florida's stable of running backs, which includes Jeff Demps, Emmanuel Moody, Mike Gillislee and Mack Brown, has averaged 5.3 yards per carry with five touchdowns.
- -Demps handled nine rushes for 38 yards in the win over Georgia. The bulk of UF's season-high 50 carries were handled by quarterback Trey Burton (17) and wide receiver Chris Rainey (16). Rainey lined up in the backfield often in the game as the Gators attempt to get their running backs healthy. Demps was the only running back who appeared in the game.
- -Demps leads the Gators with 488 rushing yards through eight games, averaging 6.3 yards per carry.
- -Demps grabbed a 40-yard reception against Georgia, the second-longest catch of his career (61 yards vs. Kentucky, 2008).
- -Florida took several snaps without a running back in the game against Mississippi State, and only 11 of UF's 35 rushes in the game came from running backs.

RUNNING BACKS (CONT.)

- -Demps rolled up 150 or more all-purpose yards in each of the first three games, the first Gator to accomplish that feat since Harvin did so in 2007. He is averaging 172.0 all-purpose yards per game, third-highest in the SEC.
- -Demps led the Gators in rushing in each of the first five games this season. After tallying 98 vs. Miami, including a career-long 72-yard scoring run, Demps rushed for a personal-best 139 yards on 11 carries against USF for an average of 12.6 yards per carry. Demps missed the LSU game with a sprained foot.

- -Demps carried the ball a career-high 26 times against Tennessee, the most rushes by a UF running back since Ciatrick Fason's 26 vs. Vanderbilt in 2004, and finished with 73 yards on the ground.
- -After spraining his foot against Tennessee, Demps was limited in games against Kentucky, Alabama and Mississippi State and missed the LSU game.
- -Demps totaled 255 all-purpose yards against USF (139 rushing, 95 kick return, 21 receiving). It was the most by a UF player since Percy Harvin tallied 268 vs. Ole Miss in 2008.
- -UF averaged 169.0 yards rushing per game over the first four contests of 2010. In the two games once Demps became limited (Alabama) or missed (LSU), the Gators have averaged 84.0 yards on the ground.
- -Gillislee proved his value in clutch situations against LSU, as he powered ahead for a five-yard touchdown, the fifth of his career, that gave the Gators a fourth-quarter lead.
- -Gillislee posted his first career multi-touchdown performance against Tennessee, rushing for two scores and totaling 27 yards on eight carries.
- -Gillislee ripped off a 41-yard rush as he totaled 55 yards on six carries in the 2010 season opener. That came on the heels of a team-high 78 yards in the Sugar Bowl that included a career-long 52-yard carry.
- -In their first two games of the season, the Gators had a running back record a rush of 40-plus yards and a kick return of 50-plus yards. Gillislee accomplished the feat in the opener vs. Miami, and Demps matched it vs. USF.
- -Demps and Gillislee both totaled over 100 all-purpose yards vs. Miami. Demps finished with 158 (98 rushing, 56 kick return, four receiving) and Gillislee tallied 120 (65 kick return, 55 rushing).
- -Against Miami, Demps tied a career best with four receptions (vs. Kentucky, 2008).
- -Demps has proven over the past several years his consistency and bigplay ability. Since 2008, he is averaging 7.3 yards per touch, No. 1 in the nation in that category among active running backs (min. 250 touches).

WIDE RECEIVERS/TIGHT ENDS

- -Deonte Thompson leads the UF receiving corps with 27 receptions for 389 yards (14.4 avg.).
- -Beginning with the Kentucky game and ending with the LSU contest, 11 of Carl Moore's 12 receptions over the four-game span moved the chains on third down (10 times) or fourth down (once). All 11 of those third- and fourth-down receptions came when UF needed six yards or more to convert.
- -In SEC play, Moore has 15 catches for 256 yards (17.1 avg.).
- -Omarius Hines tied a career-high with four receptions in the win over Georgia (vs. Troy, 2009), tallying 50 yards.
- -Four wide receivers had multiple receptions against Georgia.
- -Twelve of UF's 24 receptions against Mississippi State were by players who did not have a reception in 2009.
- -Frankie Hammond, Jr., tied for the team lead with five receptions against Mississippi State, which was more than his entire 2009 total (four). With his three grabs against Georgia, Hammond has put together twogame totals of eight receptions for 115 yards.
- -Moore posted a career-best 95 receiving yards against LSU, including a personal-long 51-yard reception that keyed UF's fourth-quarter go-ahead drive.


- -Frankie Hammond, Jr., made his first reception of the season on a seven-yard touchdown catch from John Brantley that gave Florida a 17-10 lead at Tennessee it would not relinquish. Hammond then made his first career start vs. Kentucky.
- -Andre Debose got the first catches of his career vs. Kentucky, totaling four grabs for 36 yards, all in the first half. He led the Gators in all-purpose yards against Alabama (75) and LSU (163), scoring on an 88-yard kickoff return against LSU.
- -Omarius Hines made his presence felt on special teams against Tennessee, rushing for 36 yards on a fake punt that led to Hammond's go-ahead touchdown for the Gators. Hines also had a 19-yard rush against Alabama.
- -Against Mississippi State, Hines led the Gators in rushing with 58 yards and a touchdown on six carries (9.7 avg.). It marked the redshirt sophomore's first career rushing touchdown and third overall.
- -Deonte Thompson set career highs with six receptions and 83 yards vs. USF. By halftime, he had already tied his career high with five grabs, all of which went for first downs.
- -Moore set a season high with five receptions against USF, totaling 40 yards and a touchdown. It marked his first touchdown since the 2008 SEC Championship Game after missing 2009 with a back injury.
- -Nine of UF's 14 receptions in the first half against UK were by freshmen.
- -Jordan Reed made his first career appearance and scored a touchdown on his first reception, a two-yard fourth-quarter grab from John Brantley. Reed also threw the key down-field block on Jeff Demps' 62-yard touchdown run, escorting Demps the final 20 yards into the end zone. Reed got his first career start against Tennessee.

WIDE RECEIVERS/TIGHT ENDS (CONT.)

- -Against LSU, Reed took snaps at quarterback and scored his first career rushing touchdown.
- -Hines and Debose each carried an end around against LSU. Debose carried for nine yards and a first down, while Hines rushed for 10 yards. Hines' touchdown on the play was negated by a penalty, however.
- -After moving to wide receiver, Chris Rainey led the Gators with a personal-best six receptions vs. Miami, including a 25-yard touchdown grab in the fourth quarter. Rainey had 10 receptions in his first two games after switching to the wide receiver position (2010 Sugar Bowl and season opener vs. Miami). He had nine in his previous 32 career games.
- -Hines led the team with 49 receiving yards on three grabs against Miami and added his second career touchdown. Hines worked his way into the rotation toward the end of 2009, posting a pair of catches against South Carolina before tallying four receptions for 50 yards and a touchdown against FIU.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- -Four players on the UF offensive line made their first career start at that position on opening day: Gilbert started at left tackle; Jon Halapio started at right guard, his first career start; Maurice Hurt started at right
- tackle after six career starts as a guard; Mike Pouncey started at center after 28 starts at guard and four on the defensive line.
- -UF's left side boasts three seniors, with Marcus Gilbert at tackle and Carl Johnson at guard along with Mike Pouncey at center. On the right side, the Gators have used a three-player rotation with Maurice Hurt at guard and Xavier Nixon at tackle or Jon Halapio at guard and Hurt at tackle.

- -Florida's line cleared the way for a pair of explosive runs in the season opener, opening holes for Jeff Demps' 72-yard touchdown run and Mike Gillislee's 41-yard rumble. They paved the way for another huge Demps run against USF, clearing a path for Demps to go 62 yards to the end zone.
- -The offensive line powered the offense to 3,105 rushing yards in 2009, best in the SEC, and surpassed 300 rushing yards in a game three times last season (Charleston Southern, Kentucky, Florida State).
- -UF's offensive line has helped produce three consecutive seasons averaging over 200 yards rushing per game (221.8 in 2009, 231.1 in 2008 and 200.2 in 2007), the first time since 1975-77 the feat has occurred at UF.
- -UF's 362 ground yards against Kentucky in 2009 were the team's most against an SEC foe since 1989 (vs. Vanderbilt).
- -In 2009, Xavier Nixon became the first true freshman to start at left tackle for UF since Reggie Green did so in 1992. The last true freshman to start at either tackle position was Mo Collins at right tackle in 1995.

OFFENSIVE LINE (CONT.)

-The offensive line has paved the way for an SEC-best 7,567 net rushing yards since 2008, an average of 210.2 per game and a league-leading 5.4 per carry.

-Heading into the season, Florida's returning offensive linemen boasted a combined 87 career starts, led by Mike Pouncey's 32. That total represents the highest among returning offensive linemen since 2005, Urban Meyer's first season at UF, and represents a significant increase over the 51 starts last year's group possessed heading into the opener.

DEFENSE

- -The Gators brought back five usual starters from 2009, with Ahmad Black, Omar Hunter, Janoris Jenkins, A.J. Jones and Terron Sanders returning. In addition, Brandon Antwine, William Green, Brandon Hicks, Will Hill, Jaye Howard, Duke Lemmens, Lawrence Marsh and Justin Trattou bring starting experience prior to 2010 to the Gators.
- -Five defensive players have made their first career start this season: Jonathan Bostic (MLB), Jeremy Brown (CB), Jelani Jenkins (WLB), Moses Jenkins (CB) and Josh Evans (FS).
- -Florida is the only school in the nation (Hawaii, Nebraska, Oregon) that has four players with at least three interceptions (Ahmad Black, Jonathan Bostic, Jeremy Brown, Janoris Jenkins). Overall, seven Gators have at least one interception
- -In 25 red-zone trips this season, UF's defense has yielded 12 touchdowns and eight field goals.
- -Florida held Georgia under a 50 percent completion rate, the second game in a row and third overall in 2010 that UF's opponent has completed less than half its passes.
- -Three times this season the Gators have faced the SEC's current leading rusher: Tauren Poole (UT), Derrick Locke (UK) and Stevan Ridley (LSU). Each time, the player no longer led the SEC after facing the Gators. Florida held the trio to 3.4 yards per carry and no touchdowns combined.
- -The Gators have forced multiple turnovers in six of eight games this season (all but Alabama, Mississippi State), including four or more on three occasions (Miami University, USF, Georgia).
- -UF limited Mississippi State to 33 passing yards, the lowest total since limiting Ohio to 12 yards through the air on Sept. 14, 2002. MSU's four pass completions marked the fewest by an SEC opponent since Georgia completed four in 1987.

DEFENSE (CONT.)

-The 10 points allowed by Florida against Mississippi State were the lowest since UF's 37-10 victory over Florida State in 2009. The Bulldogs did not score over the final three quarters of the game. The Gators also forced a season-high six punts against MSU.



-The Gator defense held Alabama, which came into the game averaging 512 yards of offense, to 273 yards.

- -Florida allowed Greg McElroy to a season-low 84 yards passing, his lowest output since Nov. 21, 2009, vs. Chattanooga when he played just one half. It was the second-lowest total of McElroy's career.
- -Florida's secondary limited Alabama's Julio Jones to four receptions for 19 yards, the fourth-lowest yardage output of Jones'

S Will Hill

- -UK totaled 41 of its 99 rushing yards in the fourth quarter, when UF held the Wildcats scoreless.
- -UF limited Kentucky, which came into the game averaging 44.3 points per game, to 14 points. The Gators also forced UK into its first two turnovers of the season.
- -Florida limited Tennessee's Tauren Poole to 23 yards on 10 carries. Coming into the game, Poole led the SEC with 272 rushing yards (136.0 per game).
- -The Gators held Tennessee to 29 rushing yards, the fifth-lowest for a UF opponent in the Meyer Era and second-lowest by an SEC opponent in that span. (-11 by Tennessee in 2006).
- -UF had multiple interceptions in four consecutive games to begin the season, the first time the Gators have recorded such a streak under Urban Meyer (previous best: three in 2008 vs. South Carolina, The Citadel and Florida State).
- -Florida recorded four interceptions in each of its first two games against Miami and USF, tied for the most under Urban Meyer (2008 vs. Hawaii; 2009 vs. Georgia). The Miami game marked the first time in that span that those four interceptions were grabbed by four different players.
- -UF was the first team nationally to record four picks in back-to-back games since North Carolina did it on Nov. 14 and 21, 2009. In research dating back to 1996, it was the first time UF has accomplished the feat.
- -Florida scored on an interception in back-to-back games for the third straight season (Miami, USF), also doing so in 2008 (LSU, Kentucky) and 2009 (Mississippi State, Georgia).
- -After giving up six first downs, 96 yards and allowing the Bulls to go 4-for-4 on third-down conversions on USF's first drive, Florida held USF to 1-for-8 on third downs the rest of the game.
- -Florida totaled 106 interception return yards vs. Miami, including a 67-yarder for a touchdown by Janoris Jenkins, the Gators' highest interception return total since rolling up 152 vs. Georgia in 2008.
- -The Gators did not allow Miami to score a touchdown in four red zone trips and held the RedHawks to 4-of-15 on third-down conversions. In addition, Miami had a span of four first-half drives that resulted in three interceptions and one turnover on downs.

DEFENSE (CONT.)

-No SEC defense has forced more tunovers since Urban Meyer became the Florida head coach. The Gators' 158 turnovers created is also seventh in the country during that span.

- -Florida's three interception return touchdowns tie for second in the country in 2010 (with eight other teams). Janoris Jenkins provided UF's first points of the 2010 season on a 67-yard return for a touchdown, and Justin Trattou added another against USF. Jeremy Brown got his first career pick-six against Kentucky, coming on a 52-yard return.
- -The Gators tied for the national lead and set a school record in interception return touchdowns in 2008 with five and had another three in 2009.

DEFENSIVE LINE

-Florida has held three of its opponents in 2010 under 100 yards rushing. The Gators held 10 of their 14 opponents in 2009 under 100 and did so five times in 2008.



DE Justin Trattou

- -Against Tennessee, Kentucky and LSU, Florida's opponent came came into the game with the league's leading rusher. After facing the Gators, none of them remained atop the SEC rankings.
- -Justin Trattou tallied a career-high nine tackles in back-to-back games against LSU and Mississippi State and added eight against Georgia. He has a team-high seven tackles for loss during SEC play.
- -Trattou leads the team with seven tackles for loss, while Jaye Howard has six.
- -Trattou leads UF's defensive linemen with 40 tackles, while Duke Lemmens has added 29.
- -Randall Cobb came into the Kentucky game averaging 12 yards per carry and only tallied three yards on two carries against UF.
- -The Gators allowed Tennessee 29 rushing yards on 23 carries (0.9 avg.), the fifth-lowest total in the Meyer Era.
- -In his first two games of the season, Alabama's Mark Ingram averaged 154 rushing yards per game, while the Gators held him to 47 yards on 12 carries (3.9 avg.). Trent Richardson was averaging 89 yards per game and managed 63 against UF.
- -Trattou recorded his first career touchdown, returning an interception 35 yards for a score in the third quarter of UF's win over USF. He also has 2.5 tackles for loss and leads UF's defensive line with 12 tackles.
- -Lemmens led the team with a career-high eight tackles against Alabama. He additionally collected his second sack of the season in that game, also recording one against Tennessee.
- -UF limited Miami University to four yards rushing on 22 carries for an average of 0.2 yards per carry. It's the lowest output allowed since Tennessee posted -11 in 2008.
- -Howard earned his first multiple-sack performance in the season opener with two vs. Miami, totaling 2.5 tackles for loss with five total tackles. Howard leads Florida with 2.5 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss this season.
- -True freshman Sharrif Floyd has seen significant time in the defensive line rotation and has 11 tackles, including two for loss.
- -Earl Okine recorded his first career sack against Kentucky.
- -Trattou provided one of Florida's 2009 highlights, opening the fourth quarter of the South Carolina game with his second career interception, which he returned for 53 yards. It was the fourth-longest interception return by an SEC defensive lineman during the 2000s.

LINEBACKERS

- -Jonathan Bostic has three interceptions this season, tying for the team lead. He is tied with 10 others for No. 2 in the nation among linebackers.
- -All three of Bostic's interceptions have come in UF territory, including a pick in the end zone against Tennessee.
- -Bostic led Florida with eight tackles against the Vols, the second time in his career he has done so (Charleston Southern, 2009). He has 37 tackles and 1.5 sacks this season.



LB Jelani Jenkins

- -Jelani Jenkins posted a career-high and team-leading eight tackles in the win over Kentucky. He has 41 tackles on the season, second-highest on the team, with two tackles for loss and one sack. Jenkins also recorded his first career fumble recovery against Georgia, setting up one of UF's second-quarter touchdowns.
- -Jenkins recorded his first career interception against LSU, returning it 47 yards to the LSU 17-yard line and setting up Florida's first touchdown.
- -Jenkins' first career sack came against Tennessee for a loss of 10 yards and backed the Vols up to their one-yard line, ultimately leading to a UT punt.
- -Bostic (middle linebacker) and Jenkins (weakside linebacker) made their first career starts in the season opener.
- -A.J. Jones has 35 tackles, including three tackles for loss, and three pass breakups this season, while Brandon Hicks has 16 tackles and 1.5 sacks.
- -Duke Lemmens started at strongside linebacker against Tennessee after appearing at the position for a handful of snaps against USF. The shift suited Lemmens, who totaled one sack, two quarterback hurries and five tackles against UT. True freshman defensive end Ronald Powell has also seen time at the "Sam" position in UF's heavy package.
- -The starting trio of A.J. Jones (seven), Jelani Jenkins (six) and Jonathan Bostic (six) combined for 19 tackles against USF.
- -Hicks tallied six tackles and 1.5 sacks and a quarterback hurry against Tennessee, his first multi-sack game since Florida State in 2009.
- -Jones grabbed his first career interception last season at Mississippi State in 2009 and followed that up with a two-pick game the following week in Florida's 41-17 win over Georgia.
- -Hicks started the final three games of the 2009 season in place of Jones, who suffered a knee injury. Hicks responded with a career-high seven tackles and two sacks in UF's 37-10 victory over Florida State.

SECONDARY

- -Florida has 16 interceptions in 2010, tied for the nation's best, six of which have been returned for 30-plus yards, including three touchdowns.
- -Against USF, Ahmad Black recorded the Gators' first individual multiinterception game of the season and the second of his career (Hawaii,

2008). He is tied for sixth on the school's all-time list with 11 career picks.



CB Janoris Jenkins

- -Will Hill posted a pair of crucial interceptions in the win over Georgia, marking UF's second individual multi-interception game of the season.
- -Hill picked off Aaron Murray's overtime pass and returned it 89 yards, the second-longest interception return in the nation this season. His 102 interception return yards make him one of two players in the nation to exceed 100 interception return yards in a game this season.
- -Hill came up just shy of a game-winning pick-six on that 89-yard return, but allowed Florida to win the game with a field goal on its ensuing possession. That return was tied for the longest by a UF player in research back to 1996 (Tony George vs. Tennessee, 1997).
- -In addition to his two interceptions against Georgia, Hill also picked off a pass in the end zone on a two-point attempt that is not added in official statistics.
- -Jenkins' 67-yard interception return in the season opener was the sixth-longest by UF since 1996 and the longest by a Gator since Joe Haden's 88-yarder vs. Georgia in 2008. It was also the longest interception return of the opening weekend of the college football season.
- -Black has led the team in tackles five times this season, tallying a careerbest 13 against LSU, 12 vs. Miami and Georgia, 10 in the Mississippi State game and eight against USF. He leads the team for the season with 72 tackles, including five for loss.
- -Black recorded his second career sack in the Georgia game, forcing a fumble in the process to set up one of UF's second-quarter touchdowns.
- -Black had a 40-yard interception return against Miami to set up UF's third touchdown of the second quarter.
- -Jeremy Brown, making his first career appearance after two years of battling a back injury, has recorded an interception in three games this season, including his first career pick-six on a 52-yard interception return against Kentucky.
- -True freshman Matt Elam recorded his first career sack against Alabama.
- -Black is the SEC's career leader among active players in interceptions and interception return yards, while Janoris Jenkins is tied for third in interceptions. Nationally, Black is tied for seventh in career interceptions and sits alone at sixth in interception return yards among active players. Black is also tied for sixth on UF's all-time interceptions list.



- -Four opponents failed to crack the 100-yard mark in passing offense against the Gators in 2009 and six completed fewer than 50 percent of their pass attempts.
- -Despite losing two members to the NFL Draft (Joe Haden and Major Wright), the UF secondary has a strong veteran presence with safeties Ahmad Black and Will Hill returning along with cornerback Janoris Jenkins. Black and Jenkins have combined for 51 career starts.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- -Florida has had four different players return a kickoff 45 or more yards, with Andre Debose, Jeff Demps, Mike Gillislee and Chris Rainey all doing so.
- -Jeff Demps leads the SEC with a 32.5-yard kick return average (min. five). He has returned eight kicks for 260 yards with a long of 54. He had a kickoff return of 40-plus yards in each of the first three games this season.
- -Andre Debose recorded an 88-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against LSU. It marked the first for UF since Brandon James took one back in the 2009 season opener against Charleston Southern. Debose became the second freshman in UF history to have a kickoff return for a touchdown, joining Bo Carroll, who accomplished the feat in 1997.

Lomack, vs. Kentucky, Nov. 18, 1989). Chris Rainey totaled 148 vs. Georgia.

-Chas Henry leads the nation in yards per punt with a 48.8 average (min. 25 punts). He also has helped the Gators to the best net punting average in the nation at 44.6 yards.

- -Pressed into field goal kicking duties, Henry knocked home the game-winning 37-yard field goal in overtime against Georgia. It was the second game-winning field goal for UF under Urban Meyer (Caleb Sturgis vs. Arkansas, 2009) and the first to come on the game's final play since Arden Czyzewski vs. LSU in 1989.
- -Henry has posted four punts of 60-plus yards this season. He has had four games in 2010 in which he had multiple punts of 50-plus yards.
- -Henry had three punts of 50-plus yards against LSU, averaging 52.5 yards with a long of 58. He boomed three punts for a 62.3 average against Alabama, including a 75-yard kick that pinned Alabama at its own two-yard line. It ties for the fourth-longest in UF history and is the longest in the SEC this season.
- -Both the 62.3 average and the 75-yard punt vs. Alabama were the best single-game marks by any player under Urban Meyer.
- -Henry booted two field goals against Alabama, hitting from 39 and 21 yards. They were the first field goal attempts of his collegiate career.
- -Since 1996, no player in the nation has recorded a better single-game punting average (min. two punts) than Henry's 62.3-yard average against Alabama while also converting multiple field goals in the same game.
- -Henry punted three times for a 43.7-yard average against Tennessee, pinning UT inside the 20 twice. He followed that up with a booming 56.0-yard average on three punts against Kentucky.
- -Florida punted three times against the Vols, giving Tennessee an average starting position of its own 11-yard line. UF began four drives after receiving a punt, starting on average at its own 41-yard line.
- -Against USF, Henry punted four times for 174 yards (43.5 avg.) and allowed just one punt return yard for a net average of 43.2 yards. In the game, Henry hit a 50-yarder and pinned two inside the 20.

SPECIAL TEAMS (CONT.)

- -Henry punted 33 times last season for a 43.4 average. Only three punts were returned for positive yards (21 yards allowed), and 15 landed inside the 20. Henry booted eight of 50-plus yards. In 12 of 14 games, the Gators allowed zero punt return yards.
- -In 2009, Sturgis set a UF record for field goals attempted in a season (30) and had the second-highest total of field goals made (22) in school history.
- -Sturgis hit a 56-yard field goal and a 44-yarder in going 2-for-2 in the win over Georgia in 2009. The 56-yard kick was the second-longest in school history and longest in the SEC during 2009.
- -Mike Gillislee had two kickoff returns for 65 yards vs. Miami, with a long of 50. Jeff Demps then had two for 95 yards with a long of 54 against USF. They became the seventh and eighth UF players since 1996 to return a kickoff for over 50 yards.
- -True freshman Brad Phillips, a walk-on from Gainesville's Buchholz High School, made his collegiate debut handling kickoff duties against Alabama. The Gators again called on a walk-on to handle the kickoff vs. Georgia when Jacksonville native Zack Brust filled that role.
- -Redshirt freshman John Crofoot also debuted against Alabama as the holder on Henry's field goals. Crofoot is the fourth member of his family to be a special-teamer at an SEC school, following his brothers Clayton (Auburn), Chas (Auburn) and Ike (South Carolina).
- -Under Meyer, the Gators have successfully coverted all eight fake punt attempts into first downs. Against Tennessee, Omarius Hines rushed for 36 yards on a third-quarter fourth-and-six situation. The drive culminated in Florida's go-ahead touchdown.

-Since 1990, Florida has outscored its opponents by a combined 5,348 to 1,988 at home, putting the average outcome at 40.8 to 15.2 in favor of the Gators and making the average outcome a 25.6-point win.

-The Gators had two significant winning streaks at The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23-game streak from 1990-93 and a 30-game streak from 1994-99. In 126 home games from 1990-2009, UF scored 31 or more points 89 times and held its opponent to 14 or less points 70 times.

-IN THE STANDS-

- -The Gators have sold out all season tickets for the 31st consecutive season after averaging a school-record 90,635 last season.
- -Florida broke its single-game attendance record last season, drawing 90,907 to The Swamp for the Nov. 28 showdown against Florida State. It marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 14 Super Bowls, three BCS national title games and has featured 18 bowl games that included a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title.
- -The Gators have ranked among the nation's top-15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 28 years (1982-2009) and have ranked among the top nine in each of the last 19 years (1991-2009).
- -In addition, UF set a school attendance record during the 2008 season, averaging 90,544 per game, which ranked ninth in the nation. That broke the previous standard, set in 2006 when the Gators averaged 90,409.
- -Florida also maintains a current streak of 132 consecutive home sellouts dating back to the 1989 season. That ranks fourth in the nation for current consecutive sellouts.

UF'S LEGENDARY STATUS

-NATION'S ELITE-

- -No other school has captured a national title while facing the nation's toughest schedule. According to NCAA statistics, Florida has done so twice, in 1996 and 2006, and also won the 2008 title facing the second-toughest schedule in the country.
- -UF is the only school to claim three national championships in the past 13 years. The Gators have also played in the national championship game four times in the past 14 years.
- -Florida is one of only two schools in the nation with three quarterbacks to win the Heisman Trophy and one of two schools nationally to have multiple Heisman winners since 1996.

- -The Gators won at least nine games for a period of 12 consecutive years (1990-2001), something only three schools in major college history have done and no other SEC school has done.
- -Florida became one of six schools in major college history to win 100 games during a decade, producing a
- 102-22-1 record in the 1990s. UF again reached that benchmark in the 2000s, going 100-30.
- -UF is the only school in modern major college history to score 500 or more points for a period of four straight years (1993-96).
- -Florida is one of two schools to have a player selected in the first round on the NFL Draft for nine consecutive years, with a Gator being tabbed each year from 1983-91 (Miami, 14 years, 1995-2008).
- -UF is one of only four schools in the nation to have multiple recipients of the Campbell Trophy (formerly the Draddy Trophy), which is presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame to the nation's top football scholar-athlete.
- -No other school in the nation can boast a Heisman Trophy recipient who also received the Campbell Trophy (formerly the Draddy). Danny Wuerffel accomplished both in 1996, while Tim Tebow earned the Heisman in 2007 and the Campbell in 2009.

-SEC ELITE-

- -Florida is the only SEC school to have three Heisman Trophy winners: Steve Spurrier (1966), Danny Wuerffel (1996) and Tim Tebow (2007).
- -No other SEC school has won at least 10 games for a period of six consecutive years (1993-98), something only three schools in major college history have done.
- -The Gators are the only SEC team to rank in the top 15 of the final polls for 12 straight years, and only four have done it in major college football history.
- -The Gators have the best league record over a 100-SEC-game span, going 87-13 in SEC play from the beginning of the 1990 season through the seventh conference game of 2001.
- -Florida is only one of two schools in SEC history to claim four league championships in a row (1993-96).
- -Florida has played in 10 of the 18 SEC Championship Games that have been held, winning seven.

TITLE CENTRAL

-Florida is the only school in the nation to win three outright national titles since 1990. The 2006 and 2008 national championships were decided in the BCS National Championship Game, and Florida was the unanimous pick in all four major polls in 1996. - -Florida has had 26 players selected in the NFL Draft under head coach Urban Meyer and led the nation in players drafted with nine selections each in 2007 and 2010.
- -Florida has led the nation in players drafted on five occasions all-time. In addition to 2007 and 2010, UF paced the nation with 10 selections in 1978 and shared for the lead with eight choices in 1999 and 2003.
- -UF had at least 40 players chosen in the NFL Draft for the decades of 1950, 1970, 1980 and 1990. Florida had 50 selections from 2000-09, setting a school record for draft choices in a decade. The Gators got off to a quick start in the new decade with nine selections in the 2010 draft.

SEC IN THE NFL DRAFT

- -The SEC has led or tied for the lead for the most selections in an NFL Draft in 11 of the last 13 years, including the last four drafts.
- -The SEC had at least five players taken in every round of the 2010 NFL Draft. The league had eight players taken in rounds two, three and five; seven selected in round one and four; six in round seven; and five in round six.
- -Since conference expansion in 1992, the SEC has had 114 players taken in the first round of the NFL Draft, an average of 6.3 per year.
- -The SEC has had five picks in the top 20 of the first round four years in a row (2007-10).
- -Since 2004, the SEC has had 32 players taken in the first 18 picks of the first round.
- -In the last eight NFL Drafts, 11 of 12 SEC teams had at least one player go in the top 11 of the first round.
- -Since 1990, the SEC has had 782 players selected in the NFL Draft, more than any other conference. The SEC has also produced the No. 1 pick in five of the past 13 NFL Drafts.

GATORS' PRO SUCCESS

- -Florida has seen 19 former players go on to appear in the NFL's Pro Bowl. Of those, 12 made multiple appearances in the all-star showcase.
- -Percy Harvin earned Offensive Rookie of the Year for his performance with the Minnesota Vikings in 2009. Harvin caught 60 passes for 790 yards and six touchdowns, while averaging 27.5 yards per return and scoring two more touchdowns as Minnesota's primary kickoff returner.
- -Louis Murphy posted 34 receptions for 521 yards and four touchdowns as a rookie for the Oakland Raiders. Murphy, a fourth round pick, finished the 2009 season with 25 more receptions than fellow rookie wide receiver Darrius Heyward-Bey, who the Raiders selected with the seventh-overall pick in the same draft.
- -A Gator has earned a Pro Bowl berth in 32 of the past 36 NFL seasons, including 12 of the past 13 and a streak of 11 consecutive Pro Bowls from 1986-96.
- -At least one former UF player has appeared in the Super Bowl 27 times. Four Gators have appeared in the big game on two occasions (Super Bowls XXX and XLI).
- -Thirteen former Gators have combined to win 20 Super Bowl rings. Don Chandler, Wilber Marshall and Max Starks have each won two, and Emmitt Smith and Godfrey Miles each claimed three.
- -Florida is one of two schools (Pitt) that has two players --Emmitt Smith and Fred Taylor -- on top-15 list of the NFL's all-time top rushers.

-PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME-

The University of Florida is the only school in the Southeastern Conference to have two inductees into the NFL Hall of Fame since 2001.

Former Gator running back Emmitt Smith was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio, on Aug. 7, 2010, following Gator great Jack Youngblood into the elite fraternity.

Smith was a three-time All-American at UF from 1987-89. He established 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. He

finished his career with 18,355 rushing yards and 164 rushing touchdowns, both of which are NFL records.

Youngblood, regarded as the best defensive end in UF history, became the first Gator enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2001. He was named to the All-SEC team of the decade for the 1970s and was the Most Outstanding Player at the 1971 Senior Bowl. He went on to be a five-time All-Pro player for the Los Angeles Rams. Youngblood appeared in a Rams' record 201 consecutive games and only missed one game in his 14 seasons, that one coming in his final season in 1984.

HEAD COACH URBAN MEYER

Now in his sixth season at the University of Florida, Urban Meyer has guided the Gators to a pair of national championships, two Southeastern Conference championships and has posted the best regularseason SEC record (35-11) during the last five years and a 62-13 mark overall, which is the best winning percentage (.827) in UF history. He has led the Gators to 53 wins since the beginning of the 2006 season, the second-highest victory total in the nation in that time span (Chris Petersen, Boise State).



Meyer, who is in his 25th year coaching,

including 10 as a head coach, was the first coach ever to win two BCS National Championships and the first coach in the history of the SEC to win two outright National Titles. Florida has been ranked in 88 polls under Coach Meyer, including 62 weeks in the top 10.

A three-time national Coach of the Year, Meyer's career record stands at 101-21, and his .828 winning percentage is No. 1 nationally among active coaches with at least five years of coaching experience. He was named "Coach of the Decade" by Sporting News.

He owns a 57-6 (.905) record at home in his career, including 35-4 (.897) in The Swamp. Few are better at getting a team ready to play, as Meyer sports a 32-3 (.914) record when having more than a week to prepare for a game (season openers, bowl games and coming off a bye week).

In 2008, Meyer accomplished the unprecedented feat of knocking off the BCS No. 1-ranked team in consecutive games, downing Alabama in the SEC Championship Game before dispatching Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship Game. Add in the 2007 BCS National Championship Game victory over Ohio State, and Meyer is the only coach to have defeated three BCS No. 1-ranked teams in his career.

DID YOU KNOW?

MAKING A DIFFERENCE: Meyer is co-chair, along with basketball head coach Billy Donovan, of a campus charge to raise \$50 million for UF's Florida Opportunity Scholars Program. Meyer has committed \$1 million to the cause over the life of his recently-signed six-year contract. The program was created by UF President Bernie Machen to provide financial assistance to first-generation, financially disadvantaged students working toward a bachelor's degree. Today, there are 771 Scholars attending UF, and over \$3.6 million have been awarded through the program.

GATOR BAIT: Meyer holds a 17-1 record against traditional rivals Tennessee, Georgia, Florida State and Miami (Fla.). He is the only coach in school history to open his career with five straight wins each over Tennessee and Florida State.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOT JUST A NAME: Meyer-coached teams have blocked 48 kicks, including 31 punts, 14 field goals and three extra points. In 2008, the Gators blocked a school-record nine kicks, tied for the most by one of Meyer's teams (Utah, 2004). Florida has blocked one kick in 2010, as Omar Hunter batted down a field goal try against Kentucky.

THE ROAD TO THE DRAFT: There have been 26 Gators selected in the NFL Draft under Meyer, including seven first-round picks. No team in the nation had more players selected than Florida's nine in 2007 and 2010.

ACADEMIC EMPHASIS: During Meyer's tenure, 86 football players have graduated from the University of Florida, and 131 players have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, including a league-record 37 in 2008. Florida's APR was 971 in the May 2010 report by the NCAA, placing them in the 80th-90th percentile within the sport and well have football's Division I average of 947.

BEST OF THE BEST: Meyer is one of two active coaches to win a pair of outright national championships (2006 and 2008), coach a Heisman Trophy winner (Tim Tebow) and coach a first-overall draft pick in the NFL Draft (Alex Smith).

FASTEST TO 50

-Since the SEC's inception in 1933, no coach has begun his SEC career faster than Urban Meyer. With last year's win vs. Arkansas, Meyer collected his 50th win as an SEC head coach, reaching that mark in just 59 games. That tied Frank Thomas of Alabama for the fastest to achieve 50 wins as an SEC head coach.


