WEEKLY GAME NOTES RELEASED: NOV. 2, 2008

THE GAME

■The Florida-Vanderbilt game will mark the 42nd meeting between the Gators and Commodores. UF has won each of the last 17 meetings and owns a 26-3-1 edge in the last 30 games between the schools and a 30-9-2 series advantage overall.

THE PLAN TO WIN

■The following four items outline Coach Meyer's Plan to Win:

PLAY GREAT DEFENSE (national rankings)

Scoring defense (5th, 11.6)

Rushing defense (13th, 103.1)

Interceptions (T13th, 13)

Total defense (16th, 289.0)

Passing defense (17th, 185.8)

- Four interception's returned for touchdowns are tied for first nationally. UF has had at least one interception in seven of eight games this year.
- ■UF has not trailed in seven of eight games this year and has not allowed an opponent to score in 18 of 30 quarters.
- **UF** has allowed just two first-half touchdowns all season and is outscoring opponents, 164-23, before the half. The Gators have also forced opponents to punt 23 times in the first half in 2008.
- ■The Gators have not allowed a rushing touchdown over the last two games
- Opponents are just 3-of-8 in the red zone over the last two games with just one touchdown
- ■UF's 13 interceptions this season are already two more than the team had a year ago

TURNOVERS

- ■Florida's +14 turnover margin this season leads the nation
- ■UF was the last team in the nation to turn the ball over in 2008
- ■UF has not turned the ball over in six of the last 10 games
- ■Six turnovers this season are the lowest total in the nation
- ■One of two schools to throw only two interceptions this season (Penn State)

SCORE IN THE REDZONE

- ■UF leads the nation in red zone offense.
- ■The Gators have scored on 33-of-34 trips inside the red zone this season and have been perfect in seven of eight games
- ■UF has scored on its last 23 trips inside the red zone, which is the longest streak under Coach Meyer
- ■UF has scored touchdowns each of its last 10 times inside the red zone
- ■The one time UF did not score this year was at the end of the Tennessee game, when the Gators ran on fourth and nine from the UT 12-yard line. There was less than five minutes remaining in the game and UF led, 30-6

WIN THE KICKING GAME

- ■Three of Florida's eight opponents this year have started a drive in UF territory. Overall, UF has started 21 drives in opponent territory this season and the Gators have scored on 17 of those.
- ■UF averaging 20.1 yards per punt return (second nationally)
- ■Punt return defense allowing 4.6 yards per return (15th nationally)
- Florida has punted only 26 times this season (8th lowest nationally)

NEED FOR SPEED

■Coach Meyer has stated he wants Florida to be the "fastest team in America." UF has a dozen players who have clocked a 40-time of 4.4 or less (seven on offense, five on defense). Of UF's 45 touchdowns this season, 29 have been scored by players that are among the fastest 12 on the team.

FLORIDA IN THE FOURTH QUARTER

■Florida has scored more points (92) in the fourth quarter than in any other this season. In addition, UF has allowed three teams only one first down in the fourth quarter this year (Miami, UT, Ole Miss). Tim Tebow has not thrown a fourth-quarter incompletion in over a month. The last incompletion in the fourth quarter by Tebow came on the final drive of the Ole Miss game.

GATOR STORYLINES

•With two SEC games remaining, Florida leads the SEC East with a 5-1 conference record.

- According to the NCAA, Florida's strength of schedule for the 2008 season is 11th.
- ■Florida has won each of its last four road games, which is the longest streak under Coach Meyer. In the last 10 years, UF has had two streaks of four-straight road victories (during 2003 and five-straight during the 1999-2000 seasons).
- ■Coach Meyer enters the game as the thirdwinningest active coach in college football, with a 77-17 (.819) record, among individuals who have been a head coach for at least five full seasons.

The Gator Radio Network team of Mick Hubert (play-by-play), Lee McGriff (color) and Steve Babik (sideline) will broadcast the contest. Scot Brantley and Travis McGriff join Babik as co-hosts of pregame. WFXJ radio (930-AM in Jacksonville) serves as UF's flagship station. The pre-game show begins two hours before kickoff. There is also a 90-minute show following the conclusion of the game.

WHAT'S NEW WITH THE GATORS...

SERIES NOTES

- •Florida and Vanderbilt were both charter members of the SEC when it began play in 1933. However, the two schools never met until 1945, with Vanderbilt posting a 7-0 win in the initial contest, which was played in Gainesville.
- ■Florida's 38-7 victory in 1995 was its 12th consecutive SEC win, which set a school record for consecutive league wins, breaking the previous mark of 11 set by the 1990-92 UF teams.
- ■Three of the last six meetings in Nashville, Tenn., have been decided by seven points or less and two of three meetings under Coach Meyer have been determined by seven points or fewer.

THE TEAM

■Florida is the only school in the SEC that does not have a senior starting on defense. Overall, four upperclassmen start on defense for the Gators, which is the lowest total in the league.

- ■This season, Florida defeated Tennessee for the fourth-straight year to improve Coach Meyer's record vs. the Vols to 4-0. Mever became the first coach in UF history to lead the Gators to wins on his first two trips to Knoxville. Tim Tebow became the third quarterback in Florida history to lead UF to wins in his first two career starts against the Vols (Kerwin Bell, Danny Wuerffel).
- In Florida's first road game of the year (30-6 win at Tennessee), 39 of the 70 players on the roster were underclassmen. Sixteen players on the Florida roster had never made a road trip and 21 had never played in a road game.
- ■Florida defeated then-No. 4 LSU this season, 51-21, to snap the Tigers' 23-game win streak in regulation and its 19-game win streak at night. The win was the most lopsided loss suffered by a defending national champion since 1984.
- ■Florida's 39-point margin of victory over Georgia this year marked the second-largest for the Gators in the series. The 49-10 victory marked the largest margin of defeat for Georgia under Mark Richt.

THE OFFENSE

- ■Florida leads the SEC in scoring (42.8), pass efficiency (164.51) and red zone offense (97.0). Florida has scored 26 points in each of its first eight games of the year for the first time since 2000.
- ■UF has averaged 54.3 points in the last three games, which leads the nation. UF's 50.0 points per game against Top 25 teams are second nationally among teams that have played more than one ranked opponent.
- Florida has scored a touchdown in 10-straight quarters and 12 of the last 13. In addition, the Gator offense has had just three three and out in the last 15 quarters.
- ■When Florida has had a play of 20-or-more yards on a drive, the Gators have scored 32 of 36 times (88 percent) and scored touchdowns 29 of 36 times (81 percent).
- Florida is the only school in the nation to have multiple 50-plus point games against ranked opponents in the last two years.

- ■Florida has scored on its first drive in four of eight games this year (Miami, Tennessee, Arkansas, LSU).
- ■In all, 19 different players have touched the ball on offense this season. Thirteen different players have had at least one carry, after 11 had at least one in 2007. A dozen different players have had at least one catch, which is one more than the total number that had at least one in 2007.
- ■Since Coach Meyer's first year as a head coach at Bowling Green in 2001, his teams have had fewer offensive turnovers than any team in the nation (128 total).
- ■Under head coach Urban Meyer, the Gators have outrushed 41 of 47 opponents (10-of-12 in 2005, 13-of-14 in 2006, 11-of-13 in 2007, 7-of-8 in 2008). Florida has rushed for a touchdown in 31 of the last 32 games, totaling 80 rushing touchdowns in the span.
- ■Florida is one of eight teams in the nation (LSU, Tulsa, Texas, Boise State, USC, Oklahoma, Houston) to pass for 95-or-more and rush for 95-or-more touchdowns since 2005.
- ■Florida is one of six teams in the nation to score 135-or-more total touchdowns at home since 2005 (135, tied for fifth and is first in the SEC). Florida is sixth nationally and is first in the SEC with 1,002 points at home since 2005.

■Florida's passer rating at home since 2005 (167.2) is second nationally.

■Since Coach Meyer's first season in 2005, the Gators have led the SEC in several offensive

■Florida has scored on 54-of-92 drives this season (58.7). In 2007, UF scored on 54.0 percent of its drives (81-of-150). The percentage was the second-highest by a league team since the SEC started keeping the record in 2000 (UF 54.9 in 2001). Florida's touchdown efficiency mark of 47.3 (71-of-140) was the highest total by an SEC team since the league kept the record starting in 2001.

- ■This season, Tim Tebow has rushed for eight touchdowns. The total is equal to or more than 23 Division I-A teams. Tebow is tied with Baylor's Robert Griffin for the most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback nationally in 2008. Half of Tebow's rushing touchdowns have come against Top-25 teams this year, which is tied for second nationally among all players.
- Against Kentucky, Tim Tebow threw his second interception of the year. Tebow has not thrown an interception in eight of the last 10 games. He is one of six players nationally to have thrown two-or-less interceptions this season (min. 125 att.).
- ■Tim Tebow is Florida's active career leader in rushing yards with 1,630, which is a school record for rushing yards by a quarterback. The previous career record for rushing yards by a quarterback at UF was 786 by Larry Libetore (1960-62).

■Over the past three seasons, Tim Tebow has been a part of teams that have gone 42-8 overall. As the starting quarterback at Nease High School as a senior in 2005, he helped lead the school to its first-ever Class 4A state championship. As a freshman at UF in 2006, he played in all 14 games in his role as the backup QB on the national championship squad. He is 16-5 as the starting QB at Florida.

RUNNING BACKS

- ■Florida's running backs have accounted for 999 yards on 148 carries (6.8 yards per carry) and they have 10 touchdowns. In 2007, the Florida running backs carried the ball 136 times for 761 yards and scored six rushing touchdowns. As a group, they averaged 5.6 yards per carry.
- ■Jeff Demps' average of 10.2 yards per carry leads the nation (min. 30 attempts). His average touchdown run this year is 47 yards. He had the first receiving touchdown of his career against Kentucky on a 61-yard reception.
- •Over the last four games, Jeff Demps and Chris Rainey have carried the ball 65 times for 517 yards and four rushing touchdowns (avg. 8.0 per carry).
- ■In 2007, Kestahn Moore was the only Gator running back to rush for a touchdown. UF has had four do so this season (Moore, Jeff Demps, Chris Rainey, Brandon James).
- ■UF running backs had three runs over 30 yards last year and they already have seven in 2008, five of which have come from Jeff Demps.
- ■Against LSU, Jeff Demps and Chris Rainey rushed for 129 yards and 63, respectively. The effort marked the fourth time this year that UF running backs were the leading and second-leading rusher for the Gators in a game. In 2007, UF never had two running backs finish in that order in a game.
- ■Jeff Demps had his second-straight 100-yard game with his 10-carry, 129-yard performance against LSU. He became the first true freshman to have back-to-back 100-yard games since Neal Anderson in 1982. Demps joins Anderson and Emmitt Smith as the only true freshmen in school history to have back-to-back 100-yard rushing games.
- ■Against Arkansas, Chris Rainey and Jeff Demps each rushed for 103 yards. Their efforts marked the first time in school history two freshman running backs carried for 100-or-more yards in the same game. Rainey had a 75-yard touchdown run in the game, which was the second-longest by a UF freshman in school history (John L. Williams, vs. W. Texas St., 1982, 86-yards).
- ■Emmanuel Moody led the Gators in rushing for the first time in his career with 55 yards at Tennessee. Moody finished the game with 6.1 yards per carry, which was the highest average for a Gator RB against the Vols since 1997 (Fred Taylor, 7.9, 17 carries for 134 yards).
- Against Hawaii, Jeff Demps had a 62-yard touchdown run. He rushed for more yards on that carry than the entire Hawaii offense did during the game. Demps' run was the third-longest by a UF freshman in the last 21 years and the longest by any true freshman in the country this season:
- 1. Percy Harvin, 67 vs. Arkansas, 2006 (SEC Championship Game)
- 2. Emmitt Smith, 66 vs. Tulsa, 1987
- 3. Jeff Demps, 62 vs. Hawaii, 2008

WIDE RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

Percy Harvin has scored a touchdown in each of the last 10 games he has played in. Over the span, he has scored 16 touchdowns and touched the ball 127 times for 1,419 yards (11.1 yards per touch). Four of Harvin's team-leading seven touchdown receptions this year have come on his last 10 catches.

INSTANT REPLAY

For the 2008 season, the rules committee is allowing several varying systems to implement video replay, as determined by each conference or institution. Each head coach is allowed one Instant Replay challenge per game, which is exercised by requesting a coaching and the property of the coaching and the statement of the coaching and the coaching

lenge per game, which is exercised by requesting a team timeout. A head coach may issue a challenge only if his team has one or more timeouts remaining in the half. If the challenged ruling is overturned, the timeout is not charged, but the coach has no more challenges during that game.

Plays that MAY be reviewed:

- 1. Governed by sideline, goal line and end line:
- a) Scoring plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line. This includes field goal attempts only if the ball is ruled below or above the crossbar or inside or outside the uprights. If the ball is higher than the top of the uprights the play may not be reviewed by Proceedings of the play may and the crossed of the uprights the play may not be reviewed.
- b) Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line.
- c) Runner/receiver in or out of bounds.
- d) Recovery of loose ball in bounds.
- e) A loose ball touching a side line, goal line or end line

2. Passing Plays:

- a) Pass ruled complete/incomplete/intercepted in the field of play and end zones.
- b) Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver.
- c) Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player.
- d) Quarterback (passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, the play is finalized).
- e) Illegal forward pass or illegal handing beyond the line of scrimmage.
- f) Illegal forward pass or illegal handing after change of possession.
- g) Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage.

3. Other detectable infractions:

- a) Runner ruled not down.
- b) Ball carrier ruled down when the recovery of a fumble by opponent or teammate occurs in the immediate action following the fumble and is prior to any official signaling the ball is dead
- c) Ball carrier out of bounds
- d) Forward progress errors with respect to first down.
- e) Touching of a kick.
- f) Number of players on field.
- g) Clock adjustments (in conjunction with overturned plays)
- h Fourth-down/try fumble plays.
- i) Fumble recovery on fourth down or try

NEXT UP

■The Gators return home to close out the SEC portion of the regular season as the Gators host South Carolina on Saturday, Nov. 15. Florida and South Carolina will play for the 29th time, including the 17th time in Southeastern Conference play since USC joined the league in 1992. Florida leads the series, 21-4-3, and has claimed 15 of the last 16 meetings with both schools members of the SEC. Each of Florida's four losses in the overall series has come in Columbia. Coach Meyer is 22-5 all-time and 11-1 at UF in the month of November and has won 17 of the last 18 outings in the month. Over the past five years, Urban Meyer-led teams have gone 17-1 in the month.

Kerwin Bell made his first start since sufferering a knee injury five weeks earlier. Georgia scored on its first four possessions of the game, but Bell and Ricky Nattiel kept the Gators in the game.

The Florida defense only allowed 58 yards of total offense after the break. Bell and Nattiel connected twice for touchdowns, but it was James Massey's three-yard touchdown run which put the Gators on top of the Bulldogs.

Nattiel finished the game with 97 yards and became the second Gator to surpass the 2,000-yard milestone. The three TD receptions tied a then-school record for most in a game.

The win marked just the fifth time Florida had defeated both Auburn and Georgia in backto-back games. Galen Hall became the first Gator coach to accomplish such a feat.

- ■Louis Murphy, who was the only Gator to make at least one catch in all 13 games last year, extended his streak to 21 (currently fifth-longest in SEC) with a 44-yard touchdown catch against UGA. Murphy is second on the team with three touchdown receptions this year. Six of his eight career touchdowns have come on passes of 30-or-more yards.
- ■Earlier this season against Ole Miss, Percy Harvin had a career-highs in receptions (13) and receiving yards (186). His 13 receptions tied for the best in school history in a conference game (Travis McGriff, vs. USC, 1998) and tied for the second best overall in school history (Andre Caldwell, FAU, 2007). Harvin carried the ball 10 times for 82 yards and one touchdown and totaled a career-high 268 all-purpose yards. His 186 receiving yards were the most by a UF player since 2002 and rank as the 10th-highest single-game total in school history.
- Aaron Hernandez has already matched his touchdown reception total from 2007. Hernandez had nine catches all of last year and has 16 this season for 163 yards (10.2 avg.).
- ■Percy Harvin needs 11 receptions to enter UF's all-time career chart. Currently, Taylor Jacobs (1999-02) ranks 10th with 133 receptions. In 2007, Andre Caldwell established a new school record by finishing his career with 185 receptions.
- ■Percy Harvin has already set a UF mark for career rushing yards by a receiver (1,441) and owns the single-season record for rushing yards by a receiver (764, 2007). In 2007, he touched the ball 142 times (59 receptions and 83 carries) and averaged 11.4 yards per touch. He averaged 9.2 yards per carry, which was the highest by any player in the nation in 2007 and the second-highest by any player in the country since at least 1996 (Anthony Alridge, Houston, 2006, 10.1).
- Tate Casey has caught 26 passes in his career seven of which have been for touchdowns.

■ Maurkice Pouncey became the fourth different player in four years at starting center under head coach Urban Meyer at Florida (2005, Mike Degory; 2006, Steve Rissler; 2007, Drew Miller). The other three were all seniors.

THE DEFENSE

- ■Fourteen of the 22 players on the UF defensive two-deep are freshmen or sophomores. In the last game against UGA, the Gators started eight underclassmen.
- ■In UF's last game, the defense limited UGA's Knowshon Moreno to 3.8 yards per carry and 65 total yards. He had averaged 145.3 yards a game over the previous three contests and was averaging 6.2 yards per carry on the year.
- ■In six of eight games this season, UF has not allowed its opponents' offense to score a touchdown in at least one half (Hawaii, Tennessee, Arkansas, Georgia, first; Miami, Kentucky, entire game).
- ■UF has allowed only 4-of-14 (29 pct.) fourth-down conversions this year after opponents converted 14-of-24 last year (58 pct.).
- ■Over the past four seasons, UF has ranked first in the SEC and fourth in the nation in rushing defense allowing just 92.0 yards per game. Only one other SEC team ranks in the top 10 in the category during the span (LSU, 10th, 99.6).

WHAT'S NEW WITH THE GATORS...

■In the last 71 games, the Gators have scored points off turnovers in 50 games. 334of UF's points under head coach Urban Meyer have come off turnovers.

LINEBACKERS

- Brandon Spikes, A.J. Jones and Ryan Stamper started Florida's last game against UGA. It marked the fourth time this year the three started together after doing so at Tennessee, LSU and Kentucky.
- ■Brandon Spikes is fourth in the SEC in tackles per game this year and is 52nd nationally with 8.43.
- ■Against LSU, Brandon Spikes had the first two interceptions of his career. He is one of only nine linebackers in the nation to have two interceptions in a game this year.
- ■Brandon Spikes has led the Gators in tackles in eight of the last 12 games he has played in. In addition, he has recorded 10-or-more tackles in five of his last nine outings.

SECONDARY

- ■This season, three different players have returned an interception for a touchdown (ties school record). The four interception returns for touchdowns are tied for first nationally this year and match the 2003 squad for the most in a single season in UF history. UF's 391 interception return yards ranks second nationally and are already the highest for a Coach Meyer-led Gator team and the most since 2003 (409).
- ■Florida's Joe Haden (56.0) and Ahmad Black (46.0) rank first and fourth, respectively, in interception return avg. this season among all players nationally.
- ■Florida is averaging 30.0 yards per interception return this season. In records dating back to 1977, the best total in school history was 24.9 in 2002.
- ■Ahmad Black recorded his team-leading fourth interception of the season against Georgia. Last year, the team was led by Tony Joiner and Wondy Pierre-Louis, who had two each. Black's two interception returns for touchdowns are tied with fiveothers for most in the nation by any player this season.
- ■Joe Haden's 88-yard interception return against Georgia tied Anthone Lott (1994 vs. LSU) for the fourth-longest interception return in Florida history. It also marked the longest return ever by a Florida player against Georgia.
- ■Ahmad Black's 80-yard interception returned for a touchdown against Hawaii was the third-longest by any player in the SEC in records dating back to 1996. As of games played through Saturday night (Nov. 1), the return is the fifth-longest returned for a touchdown by any player in the nation this year.
- ■Florida's defense has intercepted 98 passes since 2003, when Charlie Strong took over as defensive coordinator. The six-year total istied for sixth in the nation over the time period and is the best among SEC teams.
- ■Since 2003, 37 of Florida's 95 interceptions have come against teams ranked inside the top 25. The total is the second-highest among all teams nationally.
- ■The returning members of the secondary had four career interceptions combined entering the 2008 season and matched that effort in the opener against Hawaii.
- ■UF started a true freshman on opening day at cornerback for the second consecutive year (Janoris Jenkins). Joe Haden was the first true freshman in Gator history to make the start at cornerback on opening day.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- ■In its last outing against UGA, UF's starting defensive line was Justin Trattou, Lawrence Marsh, Terron Sanders and Jermaine Cunningham. The group combined for had a sack, a fumble returned 20 yards and three tackles for a loss.
- ■Carlos Dunlap is third in the SEC in sacks per game (.62) and is tied for 48th nationally. His five sacks lead all Gators this season. This year, the Gators have three players with three-or-more sacks already (Jermaine Cunningham and Lawrence Marsh). In 2007, UF had just three with three-ormore on the year.

- ■29-2 when holding opponents to 21 points or less. (55-2 career)
- ■25-3 when it rushes for 150 or more yards in a game and is 12-6 when held under 150 yards. (55-3 and 21-12 career)

- ■UF has been out-rushed in four of the nine games it has lost.
- ■The Gators have posted a 29-1 record when they hold an opponent to less than 100 team rushing yards.
- ■UF is11-0 in games in which it blocks a punt. (19-2)
- ■The Gators are 28-4 in games played in the state of Florida (23-2 in Gainesville, 3-1 in Jacksonville, 0-1 in Orlando, 1-0 in Tallahassee, 1-0 in Tampa).
- ■25-3 vs. unranked teams at game time. (60-3)

RULE CHANGES

■The following rule changes have been made for the 2008 season:

5-yard face mask penalty eliminated. Foul is only for twisting, turning or pulling the face mask and is for 15 yards.

Sideline infractions - first two are fouls for delay of game (5-yards) each after is sideline interference (15 yards).

When an official signals the ball is dead the play clock begins a 40-second count. In the event the ball is not ready to be snapped after 20 seconds into the count, the referee shall declare a timeout and signal that the play clock be set at 25 seconds. When play is to be resumed, the referee will give the signal and the play clock shall begin the 25-second count.

If the officials signal the game clock to be stopped for any of the following reasons, the referee shall signal that the clock should be set at 25 seconds:

- 1. Penalty administration
- 2. Charged team timeout
- 3. Media timeout
- 4. Injury timeout
- 5. Measurement
- 6. Change of possession
- 7. Following a downed kick
- 8. Score
- 9. Start of each period.
- 10. Start of a team's series in extra period
- 11. Instant replay review
- 12. Other administrative stoppage

- ■The SEC is the only conference in the nation with four teams ranked inside the AP preseason top 10 (No. 1 Georgia, No. 5 Florida, No. 7 LSU, No. 10 Auburn). Only two conferences in the nation (SEC and Big 12) have more than one team ranked inside the AP top 10.
- ■In 12 of the past 13 seasons, the SEC has had five-or-more teams ranked in the AP preseason top 25. In 2003, the SEC had four and in 2001, 2007 and 2008 the SEC had six. Every other season, the year started off with five league teams ranked in the AP top 25 to begin with.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- ■Brandon James had one punt return for 22 yards in UF's last game against Georgia. James' season total of 385 yards is just seven shy of Jacquez Green's school record of 392 in 1997.
- Freshman safety Will Hill has recorded six of the last nine kick-off tackles for the Gators over the last two games.
- ■Brandon James is one of four players in the country to return two punts for touchdowns this season (Dez Bryant, Okla. State; Eugene Harris, Miami-Ohio; Phillip Livas, La. Tech). James is the only player in the nation this season to have two punt returns for touchdown as well as have at least one receiving and rushing touchdown.
- Freshman Jeff Demps blocked the second punt of his career in UF's last game against Kentucky. Demps has matched Ryan Smith and Reggie Nelson for the most punt blocks by a Gator player under Coach Meyer.
- ■Jonathan Phillips improved to 9-of-9 on field goals by connecting on all three of his attempts against LSU. Phillips' streak of nine-consecutive field goals is the longest since Jeff Chandler had 16 in a row during the 2001 season (LSU game to the UT game). UF is the only school in the SEC and one of four nationally to be perfect on field goals in 2008.
- ■The chart below shows how Brandon James has ranked in his career in punt returns:

- ■Brandon James is tied for first nationally on the NCAA active leader chart for career punt returns for a touchdown (4). He is first nationally in punt return avg. (15.0) and third in punt return yards (980). Against Ole Miss, James became UF's all-time career punt return yard leader.
- ■Brandon James had a 74-yard return against Hawaii and an 78-yard return at Tennessee to increase his career total to four. The total is tied for the UF school record (Jacquez Green, 1995-96) and is tied for third with several others in SEC history. James has also tied the school record for punt returns for touchdowns in a season (Two, Five others, last Lito Sheppard, 2000). Half of James' career punt returns for touchdowns have come against Tennessee.
- ■Since 1996, there have been seven punts returned by a Florida player over 70 yards and Brandon James has been responsible for five of those.
- Chas Henry has averaged 43.2 yards per punt on his 26 kicks this season, which is second in the SEC. In the season opener against Hawaii, he had a career-long 60-yard punt. He has had 10 punts of 50-or-more yards this year and has landed 13 inside the 20-yard line after doing so eight times in 2007.
- Earlier this year against Kentucky, the Gators matched a school record with three blocked kicks (two punts, one fg). Six of UF's 14 blocked punts under Coach Meyer have come on the opponents' opening drive.

THE SCHEDULE

■UF opened the season on Aug. 30, 2008, against Hawaii in Gainesville. The Gators started the year with two-straight home games, as Miami visited "The Swamp" for the first time since 2002 on Sept. 6.

■UF plays seven teams that made bowl appearances last season (Hawaii, Kentucky, Florida State, Tennessee, Arkansas, Georgia and LSU).

THE STAFF

- For the first time since his initial season, head coach Urban Meyer introduced new members of the coaching staff as the following assistants are in their first season in Gainesville: Dan McCarney (Assistant Head Coach, Defense/Defensive Line); Kenny Carter (Running Backs); Vance Bedford (Cornerbacks).
- ■There are 11 new coordinators at SEC schools this fall. Florida and Vanderbilt are the only two schools in the league that have had their offensive and defensive coordinators in the position at their school each of the last three seasons.
- The Florida defensive staff has 102 years of combined collegiate coaching experience: Chuck Heater (32), Charlie Strong (25), Vance Bedford (15), Dan McCarney (30).
- ■Defensive coordinator Charlie Strong is in his sixth season at the position. The last time UF had a defensive coordinator for that length of time was Doug Knotts who held the position from 1970-78. Only Knotts and Gene Ellenson (1963-69) have held the position longer than Coach Strong in UF records dating back to 1960.

URBAN MEYER AND BILLY DONOVAN LEAD DRIVE TO RAISE \$50 MILLION FOR UF'S FLORIDA OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARS PROGRAM

■ Urban Meyer and Billy Donovan agreed to lead a campus charge to raise \$50 million for UF's Florida Opportunity Scholars Program in October of 2008. The program was created by UF President Bernie Machen to provide financial assistance to first-generation, financially disadvantaged students working towards a bachelor's degree.

THE STADIUM... ATTENDANCE NOTES

- ■In 2007, Florida ranked eighth nationally in average attendance with a total of 90,388.
- ■The attendance of 90,833 for the Mlami game on Sept. 6, 2008 established a school record. The previous school record of 90,716 was set against Tennessee on Sept. 17, 2005. The school-record-setting crowd was the largest ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 13 Super Bowls, two BCS national title games and has featured a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title in a bowl game 18 times.
- ■The attendance for the '05 season opener (90,707) was the largest opening-day crowd in Florida history. The previous record was 90,011 against San Jose State in the 2003 opener. The Gators opened the 2004 season against Eastern Michigan in front of a crowd of 90,009.
- ■The attendance of Florida's game at Tennessee (109,061) on Sept. 18, 2004, was the largest ever to see a Gator team play.
- ■The attendance for the 2004 Florida-Georgia game was an Alltel Stadium record (84,753). The previous record of 84,433 was set at the Florida-Georgia game in 2002.
- ■The Gators have ranked among the nation's top-15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 26 years (1982-2007) and have ranked among the nation's top-nine schools in each of the last 17 years (1991-2007).
- ■UF's average of 90,409 fans per home game in 2006 ranked as the best single-season mark in school history. The mark bettered that of the 2005 season, in which the Gators averaged 90,406.
- ■Florida maintains a current streak of 121-consecutive home sellouts dating back to the 1989 season. Here is where UF ranks nationally for current consecutive sellouts:

LEGENDARY STATUS...

THE ONLY SCHOOL IN THE NATION TO:

- Capture national titles in years they faced nation's toughest schedule. According to NCAA statistics, Florida faced the No. 1 schedule in the land in 1996 and 2006.
- One of three schools to capture multiple national championships in the last 12 years and the Gators have played in three national title contests in the past 13 years.
- One of only two schools in the nation with three quarterbacks to win the Heisman Trophy and one of two schools nationally to have multiple Heisman winners since 1996.
- One of three schools in major college history, and the only one in the SEC, to win at least nine games for a period of 12-consecutive years (1990-2001).
- One of six schools in major college history to win 100 games during a decade (102 wins in the 1990s).
- The only school in modern major college history to score 500 or more points for a period of four-straight years (1993-96).
- In the history of the NFL Draft, Florida and Miami (Fla.) hold the distinction of being the only schools represented for the most consecutive years in the first round of the Draft. From 1983-91, UF had at least one first-round draft choice for nine-straight seasons. Miami's 14-year streak, which began in 1995, is active.
- One of only four schools in the nation to have multiple recipients of the Draddy Trophy, which is presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame to the nation's top football scholar-athlete.
- The only school in the nation that can boast of a Heisman Trophy recipient (Danny Wuerffel), who also received the Draddy Trophy, which is presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame to the country's top football scholar-athlete.

THE ONLY SCHOOL IN THE SEC TO:

- Have three Heisman Trophy winners: Steve Spurrier (1966), Danny Wuerffel (1996) and Tim Tebow (2007).
- Win at least 10 games for a period of six-straight years (1993-98), becoming one of only three schools in major college history to accomplish this feat.
- Post a perfect 8-0 conference record in back-to-back seasons (1995-96).
- Rank in the top 15 of the final polls in 12-consecutive seasons (1990-2001), one of only four schools in major college history to do this.
- The Gators' 87-13 SEC record from 1990 to the seventh conference game of 2001 is the best league record over a 100 SEC game-time period in conference history.
- UF holds the SEC record for most consecutive seasons (12) with at least six league wins, a streak that doubled the previous record of six set by Alabama from 1961-66.
- One of only two schools in SEC history to win four-consecutive league championships (1993-96).
- Florida has played in eight of the 16 SEC Championship Games and has won seven SEC titles over the last 16 years.

FLORIDA & THE NFL...

- The 2008 National Football League season began on Thursday, Sept. 4. All notes below reflect 2008 opening-day totals and the 2008 NFL Draft.

GATORS AND THE NFL DRAFT

- UF had at least 40 players chosen in the NFL Draft for the decades of 1950, 1960, 1970, 1980 and 1990. UF already has 47 selections from the years 2000-08. The total is already the highest amount for any decade in school history.
- Since the inaugural NFL Draft in 1936, a Florida player has been selected in the first-round 38 times, covering 28 separate seasons. It is the seventh-most number of years for a top pick by any school in the nation.
- The Gators have had a first-round pick in nine of the last 11 years and 18 of the past 24. Over the past three years, Derrick Harvey (Jacksonville), Jarvis Moss (Denver) and Reggie Nelson (Jacksonville) have all been selected in the first round.
- Florida led the nation in 2007 with nine former players selected in the NFL Draft and there were 18 members of its 2006 national championship team either drafted or signed as a free agent.
- UF has had six defensive linemen drafted under Urban Meyer, the highest total in the nation over the past three drafts.
- The Gators had at least one NFL first-round draft choice for nine-straight seasons (1983-91). This marked the second-longest streak by any college in the history of the draft.

FLORIDA NFL NOTES

- Florida had 30 players on 2008 NFL openingday rosters, which was the 10th-highest total in the nation. In 2005, UF's 37 players were tied for the second-highest total of any school in the country. Overall, the Gators had 39 players on NFL rosters during the 2007 regular season.
- The Gators had at least one player (including practice squads) on 18 of the 32 NFL teams last season. Here is the breakdown of former Gators on active NFL rosters: 7 DE, 5 WR, 4 LB, 3 CB, 3 S, 2 DT, 2 RB, 1 TE, 1 OG, 1 OT, 1 QB.
- The 2008 Super Bowl marked the 25th time that at least one former UF player was in the title game.
- Eleven former Gators have combined to win 17 Super Bowl Championship rings. Emmitt Smith and Godfrey Miles won three apiece, while Don Chandler and Wilber Marshall each won two.
- Eighteen former Florida players have been invited to play in the NFL Pro Bowl.

Former Gator star **Emmitt Smith** became the NFL's alltime leading rusher on Sunday, Oct. 27, 2002, with an 11-yard run against the Seattle Seahawks in Dallas. Smith surpassed the long-time record held by Walter Payton, who

On April 12, 2003, Emmitt Smith was honored at halftime of the 2003 Orange and Blue Spring game.

Smith was a three-time All-American at the UF from 1987-89. He established 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928 yards. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. On Friday, Feb. 4, 2005, Smith retired from the NFL. Smith starred for 13 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys and spent his final two seasons with the Arizona Cardinals. He finished his career with 18,355 rushing yards and 164 rushing touchdowns, both of which are the highest totals ever posted in NFL history.
