## NOTES ON THE KENTUCKY SERIES

This is the 83rd meeting between the Commodores and Wildcats in a series that dates to 1896. Vanderbilt has played only two teams more frequently than Kentucky - Tennessee (102) and Ole Miss (84).

Vanderbilt's victory in 2008 ended a four-game Kentucky win streak. They are 4-5 since 1992 against the 'Cats in Lexington.

## KEY GAMES IN KENTUCKY SERIES

**2008** – Vanderbilt reached six wins and bowl eligibility behind versatile **D.J. Moore**, who put together one of the most remarkable games in Commodore history. Moore posts two interceptions as a defensive back and two catches for touchdowns as a receiver. QB **Chris Nickson** also has 118 rushing yards in a starring role.

**2005** – A classic in the series due to individual performances. For Kentucky, **Rafael Little** produces 372 all-purpose yards, including a 65-yard TD run. For Vanderbilt, QB **Jay Cutler** sets team records with 39 completions and five TD passes – all to **Earl Bennett**, who ties a SEC mark in the process.

**2003** – Four TD passes from **Jay Cutler** gives **Bobby Johnson** his first victory in SEC play as the Commodore head coach.

**2000** – **Greg Zolman** and TE **Tom Simone** hook up on seven-yard TD pass with 1:34 left to give Vanderbilt a 24-20 win.

**1995** – TB **Jermaine Johnson** rushes for 137 yards, and **Damian Allen** hits **Kenny Simon** with fourth quarter TD pass as Vanderbilt earns fifth straight win in series, 14-10, in Nashville.

**1970** – Down 17-0 early, the 'Dores roar back behind QB **Steve Burger** and end **Jeff Peeples** with 18 second half points to post an 18-17 win in Lexington.

**1940** – With Commodore Head Coach **Red Sanders** in the hospital, fans poured on the field to congratulate Vanderbilt players after a 7-7 tie with Kentucky. Filling in for Sanders was a Commodore assistant line coach named **Paul "Bear" Bryant**. Six years later, Bryant accepted the Kentucky position, going 60-23-5 in eight years.

**1901** – In a 22-0 win, Vanderbilt back **John Tigert** scores one of team's three TDs. Later, he'd go on to become a Rhodes Scholar and University of Florida president. Tigert also would serve as Kentucky's head basketball coach (1913) and head football coach (1915-16).

## THE '09 VANDERBILT-KENTUCKY GAME

### Kentucky (24) at Vanderbilt (13) Vanderbilt Stadium, Nashville (83,675) • Nov. 14, 2009 • SEC-TV

**NASHVILLE** – Randall Cobb ran for two touchdowns, Derrick Locke rushed for a career-high 144 yards and a touchdown, and Kentucky beat Vanderbilt 24-13 to become bowl eligible for the fourth straight year.

Kentucky (6-4, 2-4 SEC) has won seven of the past nine in the Vanderbilt series.

For the Commodores, it was another disappointing performance in a year of struggles. The Commodores posted their best scoring total against an SEC opponent, but failed to maintain a 13-10 lead at intermission.

In going without points through the second half, the Commodores managed only 31 offensive yards after halftime.

Quarterback Mackenzi Adams completed just 11 of 24 passes for 117 yards and one score. Warren Norman had 52 rushing yards.

The Commodores struggled much of the game to contain the Cobb-Locke duo. They amassed 252 all-purpose yards, with both doing damage from the Wildcat quarterback role.

## SEC LEADERS IN GRADUATING PLAYERS

The Vanderbilt football team tops the SEC in graduation success rate, according to an NCAA report released last week.

The Commodores' graduation success rate for football (2002-03 class) was 89 percent.

## STACY JOINS GROWING INJURY LIST

**Zac Stacy** (So., RB), one of the Commodores' top backs for the last two seasons, will join fellow sophomore running back **Warren Norman** on the sidelines due to an injury.

Stacy, the team's second leading rusher, will not play this week and is doubtful for the rest of the season after sustaining a head injury just before intermission of the Florida game.

One week earlier, Norman was lost for the season when he sustained a wrist dislocation in the second half at Arkansas. Team physicians repaired Norman's injury during surgery on Nov. 2.

Stacy and Norman are two of four key Commodores to sustain probable season-ending injuries in recent weeks.

Two weeks ago, **Jamie Graham** (R-Jr., DB) underwent knee surgery that is expected to require more than a month of rehab. Graham earned two starts this year at nickel back and has 15 starts in his college career. He was injured vs. South Carolina.

Last week during preparations for the Florida game, fifth-year senior Adam Smotherman re-injured an knee repaired last spring. Smotherman, a 23-game starter at defensive tackle, saw limited snaps in three games before sustaining the practice injury that effectively ends his Commodore career.

## WR JOHN COLE FROM KENTUCKY

**John Cole** (R-So, WR) is the only Commodore player from Kentucky.

Cole, from Somerset, Ky., ranks second among Vanderbilt receivers in catches (17) and receiving yards (224). He topped the Commodores in both receiving categories last year.

Cole had a stellar career at Somerset H.S., finishing as one of the state's most accomplished receivers. He set records in single-season TDs (28), single-season receiving yards (1,896) and career TD receptions (69), and was named Gatorade's Kentucky Football Player of the Year in 2007.

Cole is also an excellent academic student, and was elected last week as a District IV CoSIDA Academic All-American for the first time.

## PREP TEAMMATES TO FACE OFF

Three Commodores, including one defensive starter, will face prep teammates when Vanderbilt travels to Lexington Saturday.

- Safety starter **Kenny Ladler** (Fr.) was classmates with a trio of Wildcat freshmen at Stephenson H.S., near Atlanta: LB **Jabari Johnson**, RB **Raymond Sanders III** and versatile **Ronnie Shields**.

- Vanderbilt's **Terrell Brannon** (R-Sr., DE) were defensive teammates with two Kentucky players, **Antwane Glenn** (R-Jr., DT) and Antonio Thomas (Jr., LB) at Broome H.S., in Spartanburg, S.C.

- **Grant Ramsey** (Fr., OL) and Kentucky's **Andrew Joseph** (R-Fr., FB) were teammates at Pope H.S., north of Atlanta.

## NO SENIORS AMONG VU STAT LEADERS

How young are the Commodores? The squad does not have a single statistical category topped by a senior.

In stat categories, the leading senior rusher (**Kennard Reeves**) ranks fourth, the leading senior receiver (**Turner Wimberly**) ranks seventh and the leading senior tackler (**John Stokes**) ranks third.

## THIRTEEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Just six teams across the nation have played more true freshmen than Vanderbilt this year where 13 first-year contributors have enjoyed action. Florida and Air Force lead the nation with 17 true freshmen contributors.

Besides Stewart and Morse, other contributing first-year players are **Karl Butler** (safety), **Steven Clarke** (DB), **Chase Garnham** (LB), **Andre Hal** (DB), **James Kittredge** (OC), **Jonathan Krause** (WR), **Kenny Ladler** (safety), **Fitz Lassing** (TE), **Jordan Matthews** (WR), **Jared Morse** (DT), **Andre Simmons** (safety), **Logan Stewart** (OC) and **Carey Spear** (PK).

## 30 'DORES SEE FIRST COLLEGE ACTION

Thirty Commodores have played their first snaps this season.

## TWENTY-ONE NEW STARTERS THIS YEAR

Twenty-one Commodores – 11 on defense, nine on offense and one specialist – have enjoyed their first career starts this season.

Three defenders – **Walker May** (R-Fr., DE), **Johnell Thomas** (R-So., DE) and **Andre Hal** (Fr., DB) – earned their first career starts vs. Florida.

Besides those three, other defenders earning their initial starts are **Archibald Barnes** (R-So., LB), **Nate Campbell** (R-Sr., LB), **Eddie Foster** (So., CB), **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety), **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., safety), **Rob Lohr** (R-So., DT), **Colt Nichter** (R-So., DT) and **Trey Wilson** (So., CB).

Offensive players making their first career starts are **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., OG), **Tray Herndon** (R-Jr., WR), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., LT), **Mason Johnston** (R-Fr., TE), **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR), **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr., RB), **Logan Stewart** (Fr., center), **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., OG-OT) and **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., WR).

Punter **Richard Kent** (R-So.) also is a first-year starter.





# COMMODORE NOTES

## NOTES FROM FLORIDA GAME

★ Vanderbilt's first points came on **Javon Marshall's** recovery of a Florida punt blocked by **Ryan van Rensburg**. It was the first Commodore punt block in nearly four years.

★ **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) topped the Commodore defensive effort with 10 total tackles, including a pair of quarterback sacks. He leads the squad – and ranks fifth in the SEC – in tackles per game.

It marked the first multi-sack game of Marve's career.

★ The first career start for defensive end **Walker May** lasted just one series. The promising redshirt freshman suffered an ankle injury early in the first quarter and never returned.

May was one of two young defensive ends earning their first career starts against the Gators. The other was **Johnell Thomas** (R-So.).

★ Vanderbilt's youth was on full display against the Gators. The team's leading rusher (**Wesley Tate**, 41 yards) and receiver (**Mason Johnston** (24 yards on 2 receptions) are redshirt freshmen. Two of its top individual tacklers – CB **Andre Hal** (7 stops) and safety **Kenny Ladler** (6 tackles) – are true freshmen. The Commodore touchdowns were scored by a redshirt freshman (**Javon Marshall**) and true freshman (**Jordan Matthews**).

Only one senior (LB **John Stokes**) was among Vanderbilt's 24 position starters. At times, the Commodore defensive secondary featured junior safety **Sean Richardson** surrounded by freshmen **Ladler**, **Hal** and **Marshall**, and sophomores **Eddie Foster** and **Eric Samuels**.

★ Despite the lopsided final score, the Commodore defense started effectively, forcing the Gator offense to punt on three of its first four possessions.

★ Turnovers and special teams miscues doomed the Commodores during an 18-minute span of the first half that witnessed 41 Florida points.

The Gators returned a punt block and Vanderbilt fumble for scores and scored on one play after a second blocked punt.

It marked the second time in three years that Florida blocked two Vanderbilt punts in the same game.

★ The Vanderbilt offense struggled with production and consistency for the fourth straight week against an SEC opponent. The unit produced just seven first downs and 109 total yards, both season lows this year.

The offense has not surpassed 250 total yards in its last four games against SEC competition.

★ The 55 points surrendered were a season-high by Vanderbilt and the most given up by the Commodores since Georgia Tech tallied 56 points on Oct. 31, 2009.

★ **Richard Kent** (R-So.) continued to be way too active, attempting 12 punts in the game. It was the most this season for Kent, who tops the NCAA in total punts.

★ **Karl Butler** (Fr., safety) posted his first career interception in the fourth quarter. The turnover led to Vanderbilt's final score.

★ **Rob Lohr** (R-So., DT) registered his fourth quarterback sack of the season – and third in the last three games.

## DUO AMONG NCAA STATISTIC LEADERS

Vanderbilt standouts **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Jr., DE) remain among the national leaders in key defensive stats.

Hayward, from Perry, Ga., shares the SEC lead with five interceptions. Fugger, of Oak Brook, Ill., ranks fourth nationally with four forced fumbles.

Hayward, believed to be the first Commodore of the modern era to achieve interceptions in four consecutive games, also tops the squad with seven career picks. Hayward's current interception total has been bettered by only two Commodores in the last 30 years: **D.J. Moore** (2007, 2008), and **Leonard Coleman** (1982). The team's single-season record of eight INTs is held by Coleman (1982) and **Thomas Wingfield** (1973).

Fugger's forced fumble total is just as rare. Only two 'Dore defenders since 1983 have posted more forced fumbles in a season: **Jamie Duncan** (5, 1996) and **Shelton Quarles** (5, 1991).

## VANDERBILT IN 2010: LOTS OF YOUTH

Looking for a quick description for Robbie Caldwell's first Vanderbilt squad? *Youthful* would work.

The list of 'Dores seeing action features 21 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 13 true freshmen.

Only eight Commodore seniors have contributed this season.

## NORMAN SIXTH ON KO RETURN LIST

Though just a sophomore, **Warren Norman** ranks sixth all-time on the Vanderbilt all-time kickoff return charts.

Norman, who will miss the rest of this season after suffering a wrist injury against Arkansas two weeks ago, is averaging 25.4 yards per return this year, ranking sixth in the SEC and 45th in the NCAA.

For his career, Norman is averaging 25.9 yards per kickoff. In 2009, he set a modern-day Vanderbilt team record in 2009 with a 26.2-yard average.

## PHIL STEELE: FOUR 'DORES NAMED

Four Commodores were in Phil Steele's Midseason All-SEC team released Oct. 19.

The football magazine named **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) to its second team All-SEC defense. Included on its third team All-SEC squad were **Brandon Barden** (R-Jr., TE), **Warren Norman** (So., KR) and **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB).



## STOKES, COLE EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

**John Stokes** (Sr., LB) and **John Cole** (R-So., WR) have been named to the CoSIDA/ESPN Academic All-District IV first team, the Academic All-America Committee announced Nov. 2.

Stokes, from Memphis, has played in 45 games as a Commodore and currently ranks third on the team with 35 solo tackles and 55 total tackles. Stokes has maintained a 3.80 GPA while majoring in Health, Medicine and Society.

This marks the third consecutive year that Stokes has been recognized at the district level for his academic achievements.

Cole, of Somerset, Ky., is third on the team with 329 total yards and second on the team with 216 receiving yards. He has also returned 13 punts for 114 yards. He holds a 3.63 GPA while majoring in Human and Organizational Development.

## ODD SPECIAL TEAM STATS

Just one year removed from making the most field goals in more than a quarter century, the Commodores are on pace to attempt the fewest field goals in 40 years.

Vanderbilt is also on the verge of setting another team mark it would not like to challenge – most punts in a single season.

The Commodores have just four field goal attempts this season. Sophomore placekicker **Ryan Fowler**, who tied a school record with 16 field goals last year, has made three of the four tries.

The Commodores also have attempted just one field goal in six SEC games (a conversion vs. LSU) – and just one field goal in the last seven weeks.

Only six teams in the NCAA – Oregon State, Marshall, New Mexico, Eastern Michigan, La.-Lafayette and Washington State – have made fewer field goals than the Commodores.

The Commodores have 72 punts through nine games. Punter **Richard Kent** is on pace to break the team record for most punts in the season, set last year by Brett Upson. Kent is averaging 8.0 punts a game – and will break the team mark if he averages more than five punts during the final three games.

Both Fowler and Kent have been productive. In 2009, Fowler was named SEC All-Freshman. Kent is a solid SEC All-Freshman candidate this year and has been one of the NCAA's top net punters.

## OFFENSE SEEKING PRODUCTION

Lacking experienced playmakers and quality depth, the Commodore offense looks for improvement in its second year of operating the no-huddle attack.

★ Vanderbilt is on pace to complete less than 50 percent of its passes for the third consecutive season. The Commodores are 105 of 219 (47.9%) on the season.

★ The Commodores also are on pace to produce less than 150 first downs for the first time in 15 years. After posting at least 200 first downs for five straight years (2003-07), Vanderbilt will fall short of that total for the third straight year.

## FOURTH CO-CAPTAIN MISSES ACTION

The Commodores will not play this year with all four captains seeing action in the same game.

**Adam Smotherman** (R-Sr., DT) will miss the final four games by suffering a knee reinjury last week in practice.

All four captains have spent time on the sideline due to injury. **Joey Bailey** (R-Sr., center) missed the two recent games with an ankle injury. Two other defensive captains – **T.J. Greenstone** (R-Jr, DT) and **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) – are back in action, but missed midseason games with leg injuries.

## KITCHINGS NEW OFF. COORDINATOR

Running backs mentor **Des Kitchings** replaced **Jimmy Kiser** as the Commodores' offensive coordinator on Oct. 25.

Kitchings, in his third year on the Vanderbilt staff, moved into the offensive coordinator post for the first time in his coaching career.

Kiser continues to coach Commodore quarterbacks.

Earlier this year, the following coaching changes were made:

★ **Bruce Fowler** moved to assistant head coach/linebackers coach under Caldwell.

★ **Jamie Bryant** became the sole defensive coordinator while continuing as the team's secondary coach.

★ **Rick Logo** added recruiting coordinator duties to his primary role as defensive tackles coach.

★ **Mike Pelton** was hired as defensive ends coach.

★ **Ted Cain** was moved to TE coach and special teams coordinator.

## CALDWELL AS FIRST-YEAR COACH

How does **Robbie Caldwell** match up with other first-year Vanderbilt head coaches?

In just nine games, Caldwell has matched the win total of four of the last six Commodore coaches.

Since Fred Pancoast's first team won seven games in 1975, the highest first-year win total was accomplished by Gerry DiNardo in 1991 (5).

## HAND NEWEST COMMODORE COACH

**Herb Hand**, a veteran offensive coach with excellent credentials, is the newest Vanderbilt coach. Hired in early August, Hand serves as offensive line coach and was the first staff hire by Robbie Caldwell.

Hand came to Vanderbilt after three years at the University of Tulsa, a tenure that featured some of the NCAA's most productive offenses. As Tulsa's offensive coordinator, Hand directed 2007 and 2008 offenses that topped the nation. Tulsa's 2008 unit averaged 570 yards and 47 points. Hand also spent six successful years with the University of West Virginia's productive spread offense before going to Tulsa.

## CALDWELL: FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH

**Robbie Caldwell**, the 26th head coach in Vanderbilt football history, is one of just 11 first-time head coaches in the NCAA FBS subdivision this season.

Caldwell, a veteran of more than three decades of collegiate coaching, was named to replace retiring Bobby Johnson on July 14.

Caldwell and Kentucky mentor Joker Phillips are the SEC's only first-time head coaches this year.

Besides Caldwell and Phillips, other first-time FCS head coaches are Sonny Dykes (La. Tech), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), John "Doc" Holliday (Marshall), Mike MacIntyre (San Jose State), Larry Porter (Memphis), Jeff Quinn (Buffalo), Charlie Strong (Louisville) and Willie Taggart (Western Kentucky).

Caldwell has the most collegiate coaching experience of the 11 coaches, with Holliday having the second longest tenure.

## THIRTEEN PLAYERS ON COUNCIL

Thirteen players participate in the Leadership Council, serving as an entity that addresses team and student-athlete issues while acting as their teammates' voice in communicating with Vanderbilt coaches.

Co-captains **Joey Bailey**, **T.J. Greenstone**, **Chris Marve** and **Adam Smotherman** are members of the Leadership Council. Others voted by teammates to represent various position groups include **Larry Smith**, QBs; **Kennard Reeves**, RBs; **Brandon Barden**, TEs/HBs; **John Cole**, WRS; **Tim Fugger**, DL; **John Stokes**, LBs; **Sean Richardson**, safeties; **Casey Hayward**, DBs; and **David Giller**, specialists.

## MARVE WEARS DOSTER "KD1" PATCH

**Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) became the fourth Vanderbilt player to wear the "KD1" jersey patch when the Commodores opened against Northwestern. The recognition is one of the most significant awarded by fellow Commodore players.

The patch honors the memory of Kwane Doster, the only Commodore ever to receive the SEC Freshman of the Year Award. Doster was shot and killed in his hometown of Tampa, Fla., on Dec. 26, 2004. It is displayed on the front of Marve's No. 13 jersey.

## STOKES UP FOR PRESTIGIOUS AWARDS

Senior linebacker **John Stokes**, a semifinalist for the prestigious National Scholar Athlete Award, has also been named as one of 10 finalists for the Awards and Recognition Association (ARA) Sportsmanship Award. The ARA Award winner will be announced in November.

Stokes and **John Cole** (R-So., WR) were also selected as District IV CoSIDA Academic Americans last week.

A native of Memphis, Tenn., Stokes also is a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, the prestigious collegiate honor formerly known as the Draddy Trophy.

Stokes is the team's third leading tackler (59 total tackles) and tops the squad with a pair of fumble recoveries in his final year as a starter.

Stokes maintains a 3.8 grade point average majoring in Medicine, Health & Society. He is a two-time District IV Academic All-American. The son of Vanderbilt graduates also received early admission into Vanderbilt's Medical School after his sophomore academic year on campus, and is expected to start postgraduate classes next fall.

Stokes also is involved as an executive board member of one of Vanderbilt's largest student organizations, Manna Project International. He serves as site development coordinator, in charge of planning and creating community service trips abroad during Spring Break 2011.

There have been four previous Vanderbilt recipients of the award: **Hunter Hillenmeyer**, 2002; **Andy McCarroll**, 1989; **Doug Martin**, 1974; and **Wade Butcher**, 1961.

## KENT'S SOLID NET PUNTING

Behind first-year punter **Richard Kent**, the Commodores rank among the SEC's best in net punting.

Though Kent is the SEC's seventh ranked punter (41.7-yard avg.), the Commodores are fourth in the league in net punting (38.0-yard avg). Kent and the Vanderbilt coverage units have allowed just 17 punts to be returned this year.

## THIRD-DOWN STRUGGLES

The Vanderbilt offense continues to struggle producing first downs and having success in third-down situations.

Through eight games, the Commodores rank 12th in the SEC in both first downs (12.2 pg per game) or third down efficiency (21% success rate). The lack of success in key situations has Vanderbilt trailing in other key offensive statistical categories, including scoring and and total offense.

On Saturday, the offense converted on just two of 16 third downs vs. Florida, helping result in 12 Vanderbilt punt attempts.

## JOHNSON: NAMED TOP SEC OL VS. OLE MISS

Redshirt freshman tackle **Wesley Johnson** earned the SEC's weekly offensive linemen award for his play against Ole Miss Sept. 18.

Johnson recorded six knock-down blocks and produced key blocks on a pair of long scoring rushes.

Johnson became the first Commodore to earn SEC top offensive lineman honors since left tackle Chris Williams was recognized in 2007.

## UNIFORM CHANGE: NAMES ON JERSEYS

For the first time since 2001, Vanderbilt jerseys sport player names.

## TOP INDIVIDUAL PERFORMERS

**Chris Marve, Casey Hayward** and **Warren Norman** are playing up to their preseason hype.

Marve, a junior LB from Memphis, and Norman, a sophomore RB/RS from Stone Mountain, Ga., were both named first team All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers. Hayward, a junior CB from Perry, Ga., was mentioned on several preseason ballots.

All have performed well this year: Hayward ranks among the conference's interception leaders, Marve is among the SEC's leading tacklers, and Norman – despite now being injured – is among the league's top all-purpose runners.

### CASEY HAYWARD (Jr., DB)

Junior cornerback shares the SEC lead with Alabama's Robert Lester with five interceptions.

He also tops the conference – and is tied for fourth in the NCAA – with 13 defended passes.

Hayward contributed four total tackles and a defended pass for the Vanderbilt defense against Kentucky.

### CHRIS MARVE (R-Jr., LB)

Named to watchlists for the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award, Marve returned to action at Georgia after missing the previous game to injury. He contributed a team-high 10 total tackles at Florida. He currently is the SEC's fifth leading tackler (8.5 per game).

Marve is trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn achieved the feat in 1998-2000.

### WARREN NORMAN (So., KR/RB)

Norman, the 2009 SEC Freshman of the Year, ranks fourth in the SEC in all-purpose yardage (140.9 ypg). Norman suffered a season-ending wrist injury in the second half against Arkansas in the eighth game of the season.

Norman also leads Vanderbilt in rushing yards (57.4 ypg). Norman is the team's active career leader with 1,248 career rushing yards and seven rushing TDs.

Last year, Norman topped the SEC with 1,951 all-purpose yards, breaking the legendary Herschel Walker's freshman SEC record in the process. He also matched an SEC mark with three kickoff returns for TDs.

## OTHER TOP CANDIDATES

**SEAN RICHARDSON (Jr., Safety)** Regarded as one of the SEC's top safeties, Richardson blossomed as a starter at strong safety in 2009, earning 84 total tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.

★ *Richardson is SEC's seventh leading tackler (8.3 per game)*

**BRANDON BARDEN (R-Jr., TE)** Finished 2009 with 29 receptions, good for 357 yards and a TD. He ranks as Vanderbilt's active career leader with 81 receptions, 852 receiving yards and eight TDs.

★ *Barden has with 24 receptions, 281 receiving yards and three TDs.*

# COMMODORE NOTES

## REMEMBERING RAJAAN BENNETT

The Commodores are without one student-athlete who was expected to be a key member of the 2010 signing class, **Rajaan Bennett**.

Bennett, a highly sought-after running back from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga., died tragically on Feb. 18, 2010. Bennett was the victim of a residential shooting that shocked the McEachern and Vanderbilt communities. On Sept. 3, the school honored Bennett by retiring his No. 5 jersey and erecting a monument at its football stadium.

At a memorial service days after the death, his literature teacher read an essay entitled "*Strength*" written by Bennett within a week of his death.

The essay closed with the following lines:

*"There will never be a time that I will give up. I work hard at whatever I do for that man upstairs to smile down on me with the rays of the sun.*

*"My drive cannot be stopped or even slowed down, because every obstacle has a way around it.*

*"Every day I become stronger from the weights physically, the books mentally and life emotionally. There is no limit to my strength and at the end of the day, I want to be known as the strongest."*

Bennett rushed for 1,857 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior captain, helping McEachern to an undefeated regular season. A Rivals' 4-star recruit and one of Georgia's most decorated seniors, Bennett earned the state's AAAA Offensive Player of the Year Award. At McEachern, Bennett was a campus leader and honors student.

Bennett and his family were honored during in-game ceremonies Oct. 23.

## WINNING TREND: 100-YARD RUSHERS

Success in the Vanderbilt running game leads to team success.

Dating back to 2003, Vanderbilt has won every game in which its rushing attack features a 100-yard rusher. **Warren Norman's** 111 rushing yards was a key factor in the team's 28-14 victory at Ole Miss on Sept. 18. Since the 2003 opener, Vanderbilt is 14-0 when a running back reaches 100 rushing yards.
