The Breakdown

Tennessee makes the quick trip to Nashville for a 6:30 PM CST start at Vanderbilt. A win would give the Volunteers their first three-game winning streak since the 2007 Vols won their final five games of the regular season. The Vols are 4-6 overall in 2010 and fifth in the SEC East at 1-5.

The Series

- Tennessee owns a 71-27-5 all-time in edge over Vanderbilt in the series, including a 35-17-4 record in Nashville and a 36-10-1 mark in Knoxville.
- The Vols have won four consecutive games in the series and 26 of the last 27 games against the Commodores since 1983.
- Tennessee has defeated Vanderbilt 13 consecutive times in Nashville...the Vols are 20-1-1 in their last 22 vs. the Commodores at Vanderbilt Stadium since 1966.
- Tennessee defeated Vanderbilt 22 consecutive times from 1983-2004, a streak that ended with a 28-24 Commodore win at Neyland Stadium in 2005.
- A win would snap a three-game losing streak to SEC division rivals but would also improve the Vols to 5-3 in their last eight games inside the division.
- The Vols have 11 wins in the last 12 games of the series 1998 with an average margin of victory of 21.9 points.

To Note

Nov. 13: Tennessee 52, Ole Miss 14

- Tennessee improved to 4-6 with a 52-14 win over Mississippi at Neyland Stadium...the Vols scored 50 or more points in consecutive games for the first time since 2000 (d. Arkansas, 63-20; d. Kentucky, 59-20).
- In his second career start, QB Tyler Bray was 18-of-34 for 323 yards and three touchdowns, including an 80-yard TD strike to fellow true freshman Justin Hunter on the first play from scrimmage.
- The win snapped a six-game losing streak vs. SEC West opponents and marked the first home win vs. the West since a 34-3 win over Miss. St. in 2008.
- After not forcing five turnovers in a game for almost 10 years (vs. Arkansas, Nov. 11, 2000), UT has done so in consecutive games, forcing five vs. Ole Miss and also the preceding week vs. Memphis.

Century Mark

- Tauren Poole rushed for 107 yards on 12 carries, while true freshman receiver Justin Hunter caught three passes for 114 yards, giving the Vols a 100-yard rusher and receiver in consecutive games (Poole, 101 rushing; Denarius Moore, 103 receiving at Memphis) for the first time since 1997.
- In 1997: Jamal Lewis, 124 rushing, Marcus Nash, 126 receiving vs. Arkansas; Lewis, 128 rushing and 105 receiving; Nash 195 receiving vs. Alabama.

November Remember

- Tennessee continues its November schedule with Saturday's game at Vanderbilt...over the last 10 seasons from 2000-09, the Vols are 35-9 in November (.795)...UT has won 13 of its last 16 games during the month since a 39-10 win at Vanderbilt on Nov. 18, 2006.
 - Tennessee is 72-12 (.857) in November in the last 21 seasons since 1990, including an astounding 37-3 (.925) record in regular-season games in November or later during the decade of the 1990s.
 - The Vols were 51-3[^] (.944) in November from 1991-2003 and are 17-8 (.680) during the month since 2004...UT won 21[^] consecutive November games between 1990-96.

Tennessee Media Policies

The following is a list of media policies for the 2010 Tennessee football season. Members of the media are expected to adhere to these policies, as they are put in place to allow student-athletes adequate time to devote to their school work and their team commitments. It should be noted that true freshmen will not be available for interviews.

Interviews with Derek Dooley and the assistant coaches should be coordinated through Associate AD Jimmy Stanton. All player interview requests should be made through Associate SID John Painter or Graduate Assistant Andrew Lentz at least 24 hours in advance.

The Neyland-Thompson Sports Center is for student-athletes and Tennessee Athletics staff and members of the media should not be in the facility (outside of scheduled practices) unless by appointment through the office of media relations. All post-practice interviews will take place on Haslam Field, or in the case of an indoor practice, inside the Neyland-Thompson Sports Center.

A working space for media is available in Stokely Athletics Center adjacent to the media relations office.

Coach and Player Interview Opportunities

■ Game Day

All Tennessee post-game press conferences will be held in the Stokely Family Media Center, located in the northwest corner of Neyland Stadium near Gate 25. The press conference will begin with head coach Derek Dooley 10-15 minutes after each home game. Coach Dooley will be followed by selected players. A member of the Tennessee Media Relations staff will escort all media down to the media center when there are five minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

■ Sundays

Game highlights from the previous day's contest are available from the Derek Dooley show from 9-10 a.m. A system test will be made at 8:45 a.m. and there is no programming on open dates. Please credit IMG College/Vol Network for video use.

The Dooley Era Begins

Derek Dooley may own a rival's pedigree, but to Tennessee fans he felt just like one of their own when the Vols introduced him as the school's 22nd head coach in January.

Dooley, 42, came to UT after three seasons as head coach at Louisiana Tech, where he also served as athletics director since March 2008. He was the only athletics director serving as head football coach on the FBS level.

Dooley is the youngest son of Georgia legend **Vince Dooley**, who coached the Bulldogs for 25 seasons and claimed six league crowns and the 1980 national title.

Dooley never accepted the predetermined path to success. He played his college football at Virginia, turning down scholarship offers elsewhere to walk on and later earn his own scholarship from Cavaliers head coach **George Welsh**.

Then after a successful start to the legal profession, Dooley switched gears and returned to his love of football. Four short years later, he latched onto the staff of **Nick Saban** at LSU and moved into the fast lane of the SEC. After five successful seasons that included the 2003 national title, Dooley moved with Saban to the NFL's Miami Dolphins.

Dooley was named to his first head coaching position by Louisiana Tech in December 2006, and immediately began laying the foundation for future success. Included in his 17-20 overall record was an 8-5 mark in 2008 highlighted by the school's first postseason victory in 30 years at the Independence Bowl. Tech finished second in the WAC that season and played in a bowl game for only the third time since joining the major college ranks in 1989.

The Louisiana Sports Writers' Association named him 2008 Coach of the Year.

Dooley is married to **Dr. Allison Jeffers Dooley**, an OB/GYN and Fort Worth, Texas, native. They have two sons, **John Taylor** and **Pey-**

Head Coaching Debuts

Derek Dooley is Tennessee's 22nd head coach and on Sept. 4 became the 18th to win his first game as Vols skipper. Overall, Tennessee head coaches are 18-4 all-time in their first games. **Gen. Robert R. Neyland** coached the Vols during three separate tenures and thus had two additional "first" games. He won all three contests, improving the total number to 20-4.

Coaching Prowess

Head coach Derek Dooley's staff at Tennessee has a proven track record—eight of his assistants have coaching experience in one of the BCS conferences, five have coached in the NFL and three have experienced the formidable SEC.

Baggett, Chaney, Hiestand, Smith and Wylie spent a combined 24 years coaching in the NFL with eight different teams-- the Baltimore Ravens, Dallas Cowboys, Green Bay Packers, Houston Oilers, Miami Dolphins, Minnesota Vikings, New York Jets and St. Louis Rams.

UT's assistant coaching staff has a combined 66 years of coaching experience in all six BCS automatic qualifying conferences. The Vols' assistant coaches have coached in the bowl games that now comprise the BCS a total of 10 times and boast coaching experience in 59 total bowl games-- including the Super Bowl.

Noting the Staff

Chaney, Thompson Return

Offensive coordinator **Jim Chaney** and linebackers coach **Lance Thompson** are in their second years in Knoxville. Both joined Tennessee's staff in 2009 and were retained by first-year head coach **Derek Dooley**.

Chaney, arrived on The Hill after three seasons in the NFL with the St. Louis Rams. He was most notably the mastermind of a stellar Purdue offense from 1997-2005, during which time the Boilermakers ranked inside the top 10 nationally in total offense six times.

Super Bowl XLIV winning quarterback **Drew Brees** played for Chaney during his tenure in West Lafayette, and the pair led Purdue to the Big Ten Championship and a Rose Bowl berth in 2000.

Thompson came to Rocky Top via Tuscaloosa, where he served on Nick Saban's staff from 2007-08. His coaching resume is overflowing--Thompson has been a member of two national championships staffs, has a pair of SEC titles, two ACC championships and a Conference USA divisional winner.

Smith Comes Home

Rounding out Derek Dooley's staff was former Tennessee standout **Chuck Smith**. The Los Angeles native coaches the Vols' defensive line.

Best known for his work with some of the biggest names in pro football, Smith spent last season with the New York Jets No. 1 ranked pass defense. Over the past five seasons, Smith has coached and mentored nearly 60 NFL players, including **Albert Haynesworth**, **Robert Ayers** and **Shaun Ellis**-- all three former Vols. He also worked with **Michael Johnson**, **Osi Umenyiora**, **Derek Morgan** and **Bart Scott**.

During his career in the NFL, Smith recorded 58.5 sacks in nine seasons and served as a captain during the Atlanta Falcons' lone Super Bowl appearance after the 1998 season. He was later selected the "Best Defensive Lineman in Team History," by Falcons' fans.

On The Hill, Smith started at right end for two seasons. He helped the Big Orange to a win in the 1990 Sugar Bowl and earned All-SEC honors in 1991.

Wilcox on a Rising Star

According to a recent Sports Illustrated article, Tennessee defensive coordinator **Justin Wilcox** is one of college football's best assistant coaches. The article, compiled by **Andy Staples** and **Stewart Mandel**, predicts Wilcox's career is on the rise, citing the 49-4 record Boise State amassed during his four year tenure with the Broncos.

The General

The Proverbial, Perpetual Yardstick

One of the greatest coaches in the history of the game of football, **Gen. Robert Reese Neyland** is still, and will most likely always be, the yardstick by which all Tennessee football coaches are measured. For 21 years, he led the Big Orange to win after win and championship after championship. His 173 wins, seven conference titles and four national championships set the bar at one of the nation's finest football institutions.

According to UT legend **Gus Manning**, no one summed up Neyland and his coaching ability better than **Wallace Wade**:

"He could take his and beat yours or take yours and beat his." -- Wallace Wade, Alabama and Duke head coach and Neyland rival.

Gen. Neyland's Maxims of Football

1. The team that makes the fewest mistakes will win.
2. Play for and make the breaks and when one comes your way -- SCORE.
3. If at first the game or the breaks go against you, don't let up -- put on more steam.
4. Protect our kickers, our QB, our lead and our ball game.
5. Ball, oskie, cover, block, cut and slice, pursue and gang tackle -- for this is the WINNING EDGE.
6. Press the kicking game. Here is where the breaks are made.
7. Carry the fight to our opponent and keep it there for 60 minutes.

SEC Co-Freshman of the Week

■ QB Tyler Bray threw for 323 yards and three TD's vs. Ole Miss in his second career start...his first was at Memphis the week prior, and when he threw for 325 yards and five TD's.

■ Bray was named Co-SEC Freshman of the Week (with Marcus Lattimore, SC) for his efforts after earning the honor outright the previous week.

■ Bray is the first Tennessee quarterback to throw for 300+ yards in his first two career starts...additionally, he is the first Vols QB to throw for 300+ yards in consecutive starts since Casey Clausen did so in 2001, (332 yards vs. LSU in 2001 SEC Championship Game, 393 yards vs. Michigan in Capital One Bowl).

■ Since throwing an interception returned for a touchdown against South Carolina, Bray is 46-of-81 for 807 yards, 10 touchdowns, and no interceptions (181.22 pass efficiency rating).

■ The Vols averaged 199.6 yards passing in the first seven games and are averaging 338 yards/gm. in the last three.

■ Bray is one of 16 true freshmen to start at quarterback in NCAA FBS Division I in 2010.

■ DB Prentiss Waggner has set a Tennessee season record with his third interception returned for a touchdown...in the 3rd quarter vs. Ole Miss, Waggner returned an Ole Miss pass 10 yards for a TD...he previously had returned interceptions for touchdowns vs. both UT Martin and UAB.

■ Waggner breaks the UT record of 2 INT's returned for TD in one season, previously accomplished six times and most recently by Eric Berry in 2008.

■ The Vols returned two interceptions for touchdowns vs. Ole Miss, including a 46-yard TD return by Eric Gordon in the first quarter...for the season, Tennessee has four returns for touchdowns...Waggner has also recovered three fumbles this season, a total that leads the SEC.

Injury Update

■ Three players left the Ole Miss game with injuries and did not return: DB Eric Gordon (head), DB Janzen Jackson (ankle), and WR Zack Rogers (head)...RG Zach Fulton (ankle) left the Memphis game with an injury and did not return...he did not play vs. Mississippi...K Daniel Lincoln kicked vs. Ole Miss after missing five consecutive games (leg)...C Cody Pope (stinger) has missed eight consecutive games since Florida...DE Ben Martin, CB Naz Oliver and DT Marlon Walls have missed all 10 games this season because of injury.

Big Game Hunter

■ True freshman WR Justin Hunter recorded his second 100-yard receiving game of the season, catching three passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns... Hunter ranks second on the team with 392 receiving yards and five touchdowns and has caught 14 passes.

■ Hunter, who is averaging a remarkable 28.0 yards per reception, has tied a Tennessee freshman record with five touchdown receptions.

■ Four of Hunter's five TD receptions are from 30+ yards (80 vs. Ole Miss, 42 vs. Memphis, 38 vs. Georgia, 35 vs. Florida)...Hunter's 100-yard game vs. Georgia was the first for a UT freshman since Robert Meacham's 147-yard game vs. Kentucky in 2004.

■ Tennessee vs. Vanderbilt: Last 5 Games

Nov. 21, 2009 - UT 31, VU 16 (Knoxville)

■ Despite a defense depleted with injuries, the Vols clinched bowl eligibility with their fourth straight win over VU...UT running back carried for 171 yards and a 5-yard touchdown that put the Vols ahead 7-0 in the first quarter...Placekicker Devin Mathis gave UT a 10-edge before VU retaliated with 10 unanswered points of its own...The Vols closed the first half with touchdown passes inside the 20 from Jonathan Crompton to Denarius Moore and Luke Stocker...A pair of FGs from VU kicker Ryan Fowler pulled the Commodores within 24-16...UT's Wes Brown returned an INT 25 yards for a TD to seal the win with three seconds left...Crompton's third-quarter INT ended a streak of 142 pass attempts without one, one shy of Casey Clausen's school record of 143.

Nov. 22, 2008 - UT 20, VU 10 (Nashville)

■ UT scored all 20 of its points in the second quarter to win its 13th-straight in Nashville over VU...UT running back Montario Hardesty opened up the scoring with a 7-yard TD run...UT kicker connected on two field goals and Eric Berry returned an INT to the end zone for a 20-0 halftime lead...The Vols held the Commodores to 25 yards rushing and forced three turnovers...UT gave up 10 points in the third quarter, a Bryan Hahnfeldt 31-yard field goal and a 42-yard interception return by Reshard Langford...UT had just 21 passing yards but rushed for 222...The Vols' running attack allowed them to hold possession for 35:14...UT reached the quarterback a season-high seven times.

Nov. 17, 2007 - UT 25, VU 24 (Knoxville)

■ UT kicker Daniel Lincoln kicked a 33-yard FG with 3:04 remaining to lift the Vols past VU completing UT's largest home fourth quarter comeback ever...After a sloppy first three quarters for UT quarterback Erik Ainge, he led three fourth quarter scoring drives to finish 29-of-43 for 245 yards and three scores...The Vols opened the final stanza with a 7-yard TD pass to Josh Briscoe and pulled within two on a 5-yard TD throw to Austin Rogers...After UT's third defensive three-and-out of the quarter, Dennis Rogan returned the ensuing punt 45 yards to the VU 33...UT progressed to the 16 before giving way to Lincoln for the go-ahead kick...VU kicker Bryan Hahnfeldt had a chance to win the game, but his 49-yard FG grazed the left upright and went wide.

Nov. 18, 2006 - UT 39, UM 10 (Nashville)

■ UT running back LaMarcus Coker broke off an 87-yard TD in the third quarter, the fourth-longest run in Vols' history, en route to a 126-yard, two TD-performance...Quarterback Erik Ainge completed 21-of-26 for 266 yards and a pair of scores...UT outgained VU 429 yards to 218...VU led 7-6 in the second period after quarterback Chris Nickson hit George Smith for a 7-yard touchdown...UT scored two TDs to lead 19-7 at halftime and went on to score 33 unanswered...Vols receiver Robert Meachem hauled in seven receptions for 95 yards and a TD...17-yard TD catch put Vols ahead 36-7 in the third frame.

Oct. 3, 1996 - VU 28, UT 24 (Knoxville)

■ VU snapped the nation's second-longest losing streak to an opponent after UT had won 22 consecutive meetings...VU quarterback Jay Cutler tossed two TDs and Cassen Garrison rushed for one as it built a 21-7 second quarter lead...UT used its longest drive of the season (16 plays/7:26) to pull within 21-14 on a Rick Clausen TD pass to Chris Hannon...VU's 21-14 advantage extended to the fourth quarter...UT running back Arian Foster pushed into the end zone for one of his two scores on the first play of the fourth quarter to tie the game at 21...Foster finished with a career-high 223 yards and his 268 all-purpose yards tied him for the third-best single-game performance in UT history...UT kicker James Wilhoit kicked a 29-yard FG to give UT its first lead at 24-21 with 8:25 left...Cutler, in his last game, hit Earl Bennett from 5 yards out for the game-winning TD with 1:11 to play...UT managed to reach the VU 11-yard line but Rick Clausen's desperation pass into the end zone with no time remaining was intercepted by Jared Fagan.

■ Recent Notes in the Series

- UT and VU have only met once on Nov. 20 all-time, a 38-33 victory favoring the Vols in 2004.
- Despite winning four of the last five meetings, the Vols have committed more penalties than VU in each outing. The last time VU was penalized more than UT was in the 2002 outing.
- UT has outgained VU in total offense in 21 consecutive

meetings. The last time the Commodores outgained UT in total offense was Nov. 28, 1988, when VU put up 392 yards to UT's 334. The Vols prevailed, 14-7.

■ In nine of the last 10 meetings, the Vols' opening drive has resulted in points. On seven of those occasions, UT scored a touchdown.

■ The Vols have bested 150 rushing yards in three of the

- Tennessee's back-to-back games of at least 50 points was the first such effort since wins over Arkansas 63-20 and Kentucky 59-20 on consecutive weekends in 2000.
- For the second week in a row, Tyler Bray competed passes of 20 yards or more to five different receivers... He had seven such completions vs. Ole Miss, including two each to Justin Hunter and Denarius Moore.
- Moore's streak of 100-yard receiving games was halted at two, but the senior still has 16 catches for 419 yards and three touchdowns over his last three contests...He has a TD reception in three straight games for the second time in his career (also 2009).
- Moore's 228 receiving yards at South Carolina ranks fourth in NCAA Division I FBS this season.
- Freshman QB Tyler Bray set UT records for one half in his first career start with 308 yards passing and 5 TD passes in the opening 30 minutes at Memphis.

Quarterbacks

- **Tyler Bray** (Fr., Kingsburg, Calif.) has two career starts and earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors one week and shared them the next...He completed 19-for-33 for 325 yards and 5 TDs at Memphis, then 18-of-34 for 323 yards and 3 TDs vs. Ole Miss...Bray set UT records for a half with 308 yards passing and five TDs in opening 30 minutes at Memphis...His five TD passes were caught by five different receivers.
- The freshman has not been intercepted in his last 81 pass attempts, completing 46 in that stretch for 807 yards and 10 touchdowns (181.22 pass rating).
- Bray in his two starts has completed 12 passes of 20 yards or more to seven different receivers.
- **Matt Simms** (Jr., Franklin Lakes, N.J./El Camino [Calif.] CC) started the first eight games of the season

- UT has started at least two true freshman offensive linemen in each of the last seven games.
- Tennessee's linemen owned a combined three career starts heading into the 2010 season...Center **Cody Pope** (Jr., Julian, Calif.) offensive tackles **Dallas Thomas** (So., Baton Rouge, La.), James, and offensive guard **JerQuari Schofield** (Fr., Aiken, SC) all made their starting lineup debuts in the 2010 opener...**Jarrod Shaw** (Sr., Lafayette, La.) was the only starting lineman with prior experience (3 starts in 2009).

■ Moore caught six passes vs. the Gamecocks for 228 yards and touchdown...The yardage total ranks fourth in FBS football this season, second-highest in UT history and the most by a Vols player away from Neyland Stadium...His effort also was ninth-best in SEC history (most since 2002)...Moore's 38.0-yard average in the game is a UT record (minimum 5 catches).

■ The Vols scored two defensive touchdowns vs. Ole Miss and have four this season...**Prentiss Waggner** has set a school record by returning three interceptions for touchdowns, eclipsing the previous record of two (six times, most recently: Eric Berry, 2008)...the school and NCAA record for return TD's is seven, set in 1971...Tennessee had two return TD's in 2009.

The Coaches' Challenge

The head coach may challenge the ruling of any reviewable play. He retains a challenge if his initial challenge is successful and thus results in a reversal by the replay official. The head coach will then have a single challenge that he may use any time during the game if his team has not used all its timeouts. Thus a team may have a total of two challenges in the game, but only if the first results in a reversal of the on-field ruling.

The Source

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The SEC has used instant replay since 2005.

The Plays

■ Reviewable

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:

- Scoring Plays, including the ball in possession of a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
- Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
- Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds

2. Passing Plays:

- Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
- Touching of a forward pass by a player or an official
- Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
- Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
- Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
- Quarterback (Passer) starts arm forward, ball comes loose and play is ruled incomplete (if ball is quickly recovered)
- Quarterback (Passer) throws incomplete swing pass that is close to being forward or backward, and pass is ruled forward (if ball is quickly recovered)

3. Miscellaneous:

- Runner ruled not down.
- Runner ruled down (when ball carrier is judged down by rule and the ball is fumbled, play may be reviewed if recovery of ball occurs in the immediate action following fumble and is prior to any official signaling ball is dead. Also reviewable when runner is ruled out of bounds near goal line.)
- Forward progress with respect to first down
- Touching of a kick
- Number of players on field
- Clock adjustments (in conjunction with reviewed plays)
- Fourth-down/try fumble plays
- Field Goal Attempts (only when ball is ruled below or above the crossbar, inside or outside the uprights when it is lower than the top of the uprights.)

- The game clock expires at the end of a half. If at the end of the game, the time may be restored to the clock only if the score is tied or the team that would next snap the ball trails by eight points or fewer.

The Process

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with the HD Instant Replay system provided by XOS Digital. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official and the Communicator are selected and assigned by the Conference.

A live HD video feed is sent directly to the replay booth from the TV truck. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while recording it into the XOS Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play while the Communicator marks all incoming replays.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Replay Technician. As the Technician and the Communicator mark the incoming video, each view will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Replay Technician can touch the thumbnail and immediately send that play or replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a jog shuttle remote controlled by the Replay Official. All video is viewed on an HD monitor that sits in front of the Replay Official. The touch screen is only used to select the replays and to log specific play data in the event a call is overturned.

While all plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five on-field officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

UT Wins at Neyland

The Best Just Got Better

The Home of the Vols just got a makeover, transforming one of college football's meccas into an aesthetic masterpiece. The concrete walls that used to hold up the west side of Neyland Stadium were replaced with brick. Below the press box, six new panels display some of the finest to ever don the Orange and White— **Al Wilson, Gen. Robert R. Neyland, Reggie White, Peyton Manning, Johnny Majors and Doug Atkins.**

Most noticeable from the outside are the approximately **700,000 bricks** laid since December that totally transformed the look of the stadium's north and west sides. Standing in the middle of that transformation is the majestic Gate 21 plaza area.

"Gate 21 is the focal point of the stadium," said David Elliott, assistant athletics director for event management. "It's our marquee entrance. Gate 21 typically has brought in 30,000 to 35,000 people on a game-by-game basis. It is a stunning, stunning entrance."

Six lofty archways dominate the entrance, which doubles during the work week as a key campus transportation hub. No doubt the traffic on game days is just as hectic.

Adjacent to the Gate 21 plaza is another change, the new amphitheater at the corner of Phillip Fulmer Way and Andy Holt Avenue. The Vol Network's Kick-off Call-In Show takes place there, sporting spiffy new digs after spending years on a make-shift platform in front of a worn down hillside.

Just inside Gate 21, the Tennessee Official Team Shop is open for business six days a week under management of the UT Bookstore. Four other souvenir locations are located throughout the stadium, including one in an exclusive new seating area.

Tennessee Terrace

The Tennessee Terrace now occupies the west upper deck, with 1,800 individual chair-back seats and a climate-controlled concourse featuring new restroom and concession areas. All of the stadium's high-end concessions are available to Tennessee Terrace patrons, and those individuals also have the added bonus of sitting on the home sideline after the Vols switched back to the west for the first time since 1992.

Plans call for stadium renovations to take a break over the next two years and resume in December 2012. That should allow for a more normal maintenance schedule, including structural painting projects on the stadium's exterior that are first in line for

Home of the Vols

■ Shields-Watkins Field was constructed in 1921 and the Vols cruised to a win in their first game on the site, 27-0 over Emory and Henry.

■ After renovations, Neyland Stadium capacity is now listed at 102,455—the third largest in the land and the South's biggest. Only Michigan (107,501) and Penn State (107,282) have larger stadiums.

■ With an all-time record of 431-109-17 (.789), the Home of the Vols is the nation's second winningest college football venue. Only Georgia Tech's Bobby Dodd Stadium has more wins (437), but is eight years older than Neyland Stadium.

■ Tennessee's fans have faithfully poured into Neyland Stadium for nearly nine decades. Thanks to the support of a steady fan base, the Vols have led the SEC in attendance each of the past 36 seasons. Additionally, The Home of the Vols has ranked among the top five nationally for 34 years.

■ Seven former Volunteer greats have their jersey

numbers retired. Doug Atkins (91), Peyton Manning (16) and Reggie White (92) have their numbers etched in Tennessee lore. Clyde Fuson (62), Rudy Klarer (49), Bill Nowling (32) and Willis Tucker (61) were all Vols who made the ultimate sacrifice for their nation during WWII.

Unveiling of the Neyland Statue

Perhaps the most anticipated improvement to the Home of the Vols was unveiled Nov. 12 as part of homecoming activities on Mississippi weekend. Vols young and old were in attendance for the unveiling of the twice-life-size statue of the stadium's namesake, **Gen. Robert R. Neyland** (pictured at right).

The statue is in its permanent resting place between gates 15A and 17.

Tauren Poole had touchdown runs of 24 yards and 14 yards as Tennessee beat UT Martin 50-0 on Saturday night for Derek Dooley's first victory as the Volunteers' coach.

It was Tennessee's first shutout since a 48-0 win over Vanderbilt in 2003 and first time facing an FCS opponent since a win over The Citadel in 1983.

Tauren Poole had been waiting all year to prove he'd been unfairly stuck behind Bryce Brown and David Oku on the Vols' depth chart last season. He delivered, darting through holes, running around coverage and picking up 110 yards on 17 carries before sitting out the entire fourth quarter.

Oku had his share of carries too and found some large holes for a 44-yard touchdown run with 5:00 left in the first quarter to give the Vols a 10-0 lead in the season opener for both teams.

Denarius Moore ran 58 yards for a touchdown and caught a 42-yard scoring pass from Matt Simms. Moore finished with 66 yards on four catches, and Gerald Jones had 86 yards on six catches before injuring his left hand.

Tennessee scored nearly every way it could. Austin Johnson tackled D.J. McNeil in the end zone for a safety. Prentiss Waggner intercepted Derek Carr and ran 54 yards for a touchdown. Daniel Lincoln kicked field goals of 21 and 35 yards.

LaMichael James ran for 134 yards, including a 72-yard touchdown, in his first game back after a one-game suspension and No. 7 Oregon scored 45 consecutive points to beat Tennessee 48-13 on Saturday night.

James had only 27 yards at halftime after being targeted by the Volunteers' defense for the entire first half. He started picking up momentum after the break, rushing for 25 yards on five carries in the Oregon's first second-half drive. He broke several tackles on the 72-yard touchdown run on the first play of the subsequent drive for the Ducks (2-0).

Tennessee (1-1) went up 13-3 in the first half after an hour-long delay for lightning but fell apart after James' long run.

A pass by Matt Simms intended for Zach Rogers was intercepted by Cliff Harris, who returned it 76 yards for another score to give Oregon a 27-13 lead with 6:27 left in the third quarter.

The Vols got a 48-yard field goal from Daniel Lincoln on their first drive and immediately got the ball back when Barner fumbled the following kickoff after a 39-yard return. Da'Rick Rogers had a 21-yard run that set up a 35-yard field goal by Lincoln with 8:53 left in the first quarter.

Tennessee had its chances against a second-straight top-10 foe, down seven points midway through the fourth quarter. But Florida used a nine-play drive capped by a 2-yard touchdown run from Trey Burton to seal a 31-17 victory.

Tennessee (1-2, 0-1) tied the game at 10 with a 49-yard touchdown pass from Matt Simms to Denarius Moore with 8:59 in the third quarter. Simms completed 19 of 31 passes on the afternoon for two touchdowns and a career-best 259 yards against a pair of interceptions.

Florida appeared stopped on the next drive until Meyer called for a fake punt on fourth-and-6. Omarius Hines ran 36 yards to keep the drive alive, and John Brantley eventually connected with Frankie Hammond on a 7-yard touchdown pass.

Early in the fourth quarter, Simms appeared to be sacked in the end zone for a safety, but an official review ruled him down on the 1. Tennessee punted but forced a turnover and scored on its next possession, a 35-yard touchdown pass from Simms to Justin Hunter on fourth-and-6 to cut Florida's lead to 24-17 with a 11:24 left.

After Burton's touchdown put the Gators up 31-17, Tauren Poole took a reception 31 yards into UF territory before the ball was jarred loose, ending the Vols comeback bid.

Tennessee scored first for the first time against Florida since 2001 when Daniel Lincoln kicked a late first-quarter, 49-yard field goal, tying his career high.

Matt Simms threw a 25-yard touchdown to Denarius Moore on Tennessee's first play of double overtime as the Volunteers beat Alabama-Birmingham 32-29 on Saturday.

The Volunteers (2-2) held a 23-7 lead at halftime, but the Blazers (1-3) outscored the Vols 16-0 in the second half. David Isabelle found Frantrell Forrest on a 27-yard touchdown strike and ran for 6 yards for another score. Bryan Ellis hit Jeffery Anderson on a pair of 2-point conversions, which evened the score at 23-23.

Daniel Lincoln converted a 40-yard field goal and UAB's Josh Zahn matched with a 35-yarder through the uprights to send the game to double overtime. Zahn connected on a 21-yard field goal to put UAB up 29-26 before the Vols' final touchdown.

Simms opened the scoring with a 13-yard pass to Moore at the 10:59 mark of the first quarter. UAB responded to tie the game at 7 with a 52-yard touchdown pass from Bryan Ellis to Mike Jones with 2:34 in the first quarter. Simms answered with a 72-yard touchdown to Zach Rogers on the next play.

BATON ROUGE, La. -- LSU scored on the game's very first play and again on the very last play -- after Tennessee was penalized for too many men on the field. Those scores were enough to allow the Tigers to escape with a 16-14 decision that was heartbreaking to the UT faithful.

The Tigers remained unbeaten after a Volunteers penalty for too many players on the field rescued LSU from what appeared to be a botched final play. LSU (5-0, 3-0 SEC) was confused on third-and-goal from the 1 and allowed the clock to run nearly to zero before a mishandled snap seemingly ended the game and sent Tennessee players streaming onto the field in jubilation.

The celebration was cut short when officials ruled the Volunteers (2-3, 0-2) had 13 defensive players on the field when the ball was snapped. Stevan Ridley then bulled into the end zone from less than a yard out for the wild finish.

Jordan Jefferson had an 83-yard TD run on LSU's first offensive play, but UT's defense limited the Tigers after that, forcing four turnovers including three interceptions.

Tennessee was in the game the whole way despite playing in its first road game of the season. Tauren Poole's 1-yard dive over the pile helped the Vols to a 7-7 tie at halftime. Matt Simms' 3-yard touchdown run put the Vols in the lead with 11:34 left in the fourth quarter.

The first interception of LaMarcus Thompson's career in the Vols' end zone put Tennessee in position to bury the Tigers in a hole with another score, but the Tigers' defense got a critical stop on fourth-and-1 at the LSU 31.

Poole topped 100 yards for the third time in 2010 with a 109-yard performance. Gerald Jones returned from a three-game absence after nursing a hand injury to lead the Vols with five receptions for 46 yards while helping UT convert a season-high seven third downs.

ATHENS, Ga. -- Aaron Murray ran for two touchdowns and threw for two more as Georgia snapped a four-game losing streak and defeated Tennessee 41-14 at Sanford Stadium.

A.J. Green caught his third touchdown pass in two weeks as the Bulldogs ended their longest losing streak since 1990. The Vols fell to 2-4 (0-3 in the SEC) and committed three turnovers, allowing the Bulldogs to take a 17-0 lead in the first quarter.

Murray was 17 of 25 for 266 yards passing and ran seven times for 41 yards. Green had six catches for 96 yards, giving him 13 catches for 215 yards since his return.

Freshman Justin Hunter was a bright spot for Tennessee, catching four passes for 110 yards and one touchdown. Hunter was on the receiving end of a 38-yard touchdown from Matt Simms in the second quarter, and his 100-yard receiving effort was the first for a Vols freshman since Robert Meacham did so in 2004.

Matt Simms finished 9-of-13 for 179 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Tauren Poole accounted for the other Tennessee touchdown on a 2-yard run in the third quarter and finished with 51 yards on 15 carries. True freshman Rajion Neal caught three passes for 70 yards, while Tyler Bray played the fourth quarter at quarterback and went 8-for-12 for 81 yards. During one drive in the fourth quarter, Bray was one of seven true freshmen on the field for the Vols.

Trent Richardson's 65-yard touchdown run and 5-yard touchdown reception were part of 28 unanswered second-half points as No. 7 Alabama beat Tennessee 41-10 on Saturday night.

Alabama came out of halftime with only a 13-10 lead after a sluggish first half. The Tide wasted no time in the third quarter, getting three straight first downs on its opening drive before Mark Ingram pushed the ball 1 yard for the touchdown for a 20-10 lead.

Richardson and Ingram had just 91 yards rushing at halftime, but added 96 yards on the ground in the third quarter, including Richardson's touchdown and a pair of 1-yard scoring runs by Ingram. Richardson finished with 119 yards on 12 carries, and Ingram had 88 yards on 14 runs.

For their part, the Volunteers had a few shots to keep the game competitive in the second half. Matt Simms led a long drive that eventually stalled at the Alabama 35 after three straight run plays, and Michael Palardy missed a 52-yard field goal attempt that could have cut the Crimson Tide's lead to a touchdown.

Tennessee got the first score for the first time since the Vols' 17-13 win in 2004. Tauren Poole found a gaping hole in the line and ran 59 yards to the end zone with 8:44 left in the first quarter.

Poole finished with 117 yards on the ground, becoming the first player to rush for more than 100 yards against Alabama since Mississippi's BenJarvus Green-Ellis ran for 131 on Oct. 13, 2007.

COLUMBIA, S.C. -- Tennessee battled back from a 14-point deficit, but ultimately fell short in its upset bid of No. 17 South Carolina, dropping the contest by a score of 38-24.

Senior wide receiver Denarius Moore, had a career day, pulling down six catches for 228 yards, the second-best mark in Tennessee history.

The Vols, trailing 24-10 in the third quarter, pulled off their first successful fake punt since 2004 as Chad Cunningham ran for 25 yards on fourth-and-10. On the next play, freshman quarterback Tyler Bray connected with Moore on a 30-yard scoring pass to pull within a touchdown.

Bray and Moore were at it again on Tennessee's next series. The two combined for a 64-yard reception to the Gamecocks 2 and, after a personal foul penalty pushed the Vols back, Bray hit Gerald Jones for a 17-yard touchdown to tie it up at 24-24.

Bray, who entered the game in the third quarter, told his teammates not to hang their heads. "I came back in the second half and said, 'Hey guys, let's go' and started throwing it to the playmakers," said Bray, who also threw an interception that defensive end Devin Taylor returned 24 yards for a touchdown.

Redshirt sophomore linebacker Herman Lathers led the Volunteers with seven tackles (six solo) and one sack.

Bray threw scoring passes to talented freshmen Justin Hunter and DaRick Rogers, as well as veterans Denarius Moore and Gerald Jones during Tennessee's first-half offensive onslaught.

UT's defense was also on its game, forcing five turnovers and sacking Memphis QBs on five different occasions.

Tyler Bray threw three touchdown passes, two of them to Justin Hunter, and Tauren Poole ran for two more as Tennessee got its first Southeastern Conference win of the season with a 52-14 victory over Mississippi on Saturday.

On Tennessee's first play from scrimmage, Bray attempted a pass to Gerald Jones which was tipped by Mississippi's Jonathan Cornell right into the hands of Justin Hunter. Hunter had 80 yards of green space and took it all the way to the end zone.

The Vols (4-6, 1-5) were in control the whole game, thanks to Bray's passing. The Vols had only seven yards on the ground in the first half but countered it with 265 yards by air.

Bray finished 18 for 34 with 323 yards. In two games as the starter, Bray has completed 37 of 67 for 648 yards and eight touchdowns without turning the ball over.

Ole Miss (4-6, 1-5) couldn't get its offense going with Masoli being pressured by the Vols' defensive line all day. The Rebels entered the game having given up only seven sacks in eight games, but the Vols took Masoli down twice and sacked backup Nathan Stanley once.

Tennessee took a 21-0 lead with 2:33 left in the first quarter when Eric Gordon picked off a pass by Masoli at the Rebels 46 and ran it back for a touchdown. Prentiss Wagner returned another Masoli interception for a score, his third touchdown on an interception return this season, setting a Tennessee record.
