## NOTES ON THE WAKE FOREST SERIES

**SERIES NOTES** The Commodores are 7-5 all-time against Wake Forest, though the Demon Deacons have captured the last two games played between the schools, including a 23-10 win in Winston-Salem that served as the 2008 regular season finale.

Vanderbilt and Wake Forest are in the midst of a seven-game series every year through 2014.

QB **Jay Cutler** provided a Commodore highlight in the series in 2005. Cutler guided a four-play, 49-yard touchdown drive late in the fourth quarter to help the Commodores to a 24-20 victory in Winston-Salem. The winning drive included a 28-yard Cutler toss to **Earl Bennett**, the first of Bennett's SEC-record 235 catches as a Commodore. The pair continue to hook up today as members of the Chicago Bears.

## PREP TEAMMATES TO FACE OFF

Several former prep teammates will square off when the Commodores and Deacons meet.

★ Three Commodores – **Ryan van Rensburg**, **Mason Johnston** and **Tray Herndon** – played with four Wake Forest players: **Scott Betros** (R-So., LB), **Chance Raines** (R-So., center), **Alex Wulfeck** (R-Fr., punter) and **Desmond Cooper** (Fr., safety) at The Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla.

★ **Blake Southerland** (R-Fr., LB) was teammates at Greater Atlanta Christian with Wake's **Chris Langley** (R-Sr., WR).

★ Three Commodores – **John Stokes** (Sr., LB/SN), **DeAndre Jones** (R-So., LB) and **Walt Wepfer** (R-So., Punter) – attended Memphis University School with Demon Deacon **Russell Nenon** (R-Sr., center).

★ **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., WR) attended Westlake H.S., in Austin, Texas, the same school that produced Wake's **Tanner Price** (Fr., QB).

★ **Marc Panu** (R-Fr., DT) and Wake Forest's **Kris Redding** (R-Fr., DT) were teammates at Whitefield Academy in north Georgia.

## MONAHAN FROM NORTH CAROLINA

**Austin Monahan** (R-Jr., TE) is the only Commodore from North Carolina.

Monahan, who is currently out of action for the third straight year due to a knee injury, attended Charlotte Country Day.

## SEVERAL VU COACHES HAVE ACC TIES

Several Commodore coaches, including Head Coach **Robbie Caldwell**, has ties to Atlantic Coast Conference teams.

Prior to joining Vanderbilt as an assistant head coach/offensive line coach in 2002, Caldwell coached offensive lines for more than a decade at North Carolina State and the University of North Carolina. Caldwell spent 11 years at N.C. State and two at UNC.

Caldwell and three Vanderbilt offensive staff – **Ted Cain** (TEs), **Jimmy Kiser** (QBs) and **Charlie Fisher** (WRs)– coached extensively at ACC schools.

Caldwell, Cain, Kiser and Fisher all spent years working at North Carolina State during the Wolfpack tenure of Dick Sheridan. Cain, Caldwell and Kiser were members of Sheridan's first N.C. State staff in 1986 – Cain as offensive coordinator, Caldwell as offensive line coach and Kiser as receivers coach. Fisher coached Wolfpack receivers a decade later (1997-98). Before coaching at N.C. State, Kiser and Fisher also coached together at Lenoir-Rhyne College in North Carolina.

**Ricky Logo**, the Commodores' defensive line coach, was one of North Carolina State's top defensive linemen during the early 1990s.

**Jamie Bryant** (Def. Coordinator) served one year on the defensive staff at North Carolina working as a staff member with Caldwell.

Conditioning director **John Sisk** also worked several years on the Clemson strength staff.

## TOP BACKS JOIN GROWING INJURY LIST

**Zac Stacy** (So., RB), one of the Commodores' top backs for the last two seasons, will join fellow sophomore running back **Warren Norman** on the sidelines for the rest of the 2010 season due to injury.

It's been a season marred with injuries for the young 'Dore squad. Twenty contributors have missed action, including more than a dozen that have missed three games or more.

**Rob Lohr** (R-So., DT) became latest player to get injured. He missed most of the Tennessee game – and is doubtful vs. Wake Forest – after sustaining an elbow injury.

**Mason Johnston** (R-Fr., TE) also will miss the last two games, after suffering a knee injury at Kentucky.

Stacy, the team's second leading rusher, will not return this season after sustaining a head injury two weeks ago in the Florida game. One week earlier, Norman was lost for the season when he sustained a wrist dislocation in the second half at Arkansas. Team physicians repaired Norman's injury during surgery on Nov. 2.

The 'Dores inserted **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr.) into the lineup against Kentucky and Tennessee. He has responded by rushing for 165 yards in the last two years.

Stacy, Norman and Johnston are three of five key Commodores to sustain probable season-ending injuries in recent weeks.

Three weeks ago, **Jamie Graham** (R-Jr., DB) underwent season-ending knee surgery. Graham earned two starts this year at nickel back and has 15 starts in his college career. He was injured vs. South Carolina.

**Adam Smotherman** (R-Sr., DT) re-injured an knee repaired last spring during practicing leading to the Florida game. Smotherman, a 23-game starter at tackle, played in just three games before sustaining the injury that effectively ended his career.

## NO SENIORS AMONG VU STAT LEADERS

How young are the Commodores? The squad does not have a single statistical category topped by a senior.

In stat categories, the leading senior rusher (**Kennard Reeves**) ranks fourth, the leading senior receiver (**Turner Wimberly**) ranks seventh and the leading senior tackler (**John Stokes**) ranks third.

## THIRTEEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Just six teams across the nation have played more true freshmen than Vanderbilt this year where 13 first-year contributors have enjoyed action. Air Force leads the nation with 19 true freshmen contributors, with Florida (17) and Tennessee (16) close behind.

Contributing first-year players are **Karl Butler** (safety), **Steven Clarke** (DB), **Chase Garnham** (LB), **Andre Hal** (DB), **James Kittredge**, (OC), **Jonathan Krause** (WR), **Kenny Ladler** (safety), **Fitz Lassing** (TE), **Jordan Matthews** (WR), **Jared Morse** (DT), **Andre Simmons** (safety), **Logan Stewart** (OC) and **Carey Spear** (PK).

## 30 'DORES SEE FIRST COLLEGE ACTION

Thirty Commodores have played their first snaps this season.

Offensive players making their first career starts are **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., OG), **Tray Herndon** (R-Jr., WR), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., LT), **Mason Johnston** (R-Fr., TE) **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR), **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr., RB), **Logan Stewart** (Fr., center), **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., OG-OT) and **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., WR).

Punter **Richard Kent** (R-So.) also is a first-year starter.



# COMMODORE NOTES

## NOTES FROM THE TENNESSEE GAME

- **Jordan Matthews** (Fr.) and **Tray Herndon** (R-Jr.) set career reception highs with five and four catches, respectively. Matthews also caught a touchdown for the third consecutive game.
  - The defense forced turnovers on three consecutive UT possessions, but were able to convert the miscues into just three points.
  - **Richard Kent** (R-So.) continued his superb net punting. Kent, who set a team record for punts in a season during the game, averaged 45.2 yards on six punts. The Vols fumbled one of Kent's punts and returned a second for just one yard.
  - The Commodores started the same offensive line – LT **Wesley Johnson**, LG **Jabo Burrow**, OC **Logan Stewart**, RG **Kyle Fischer** and RT **Ryan Seymour** – for the fifth consecutive game.
  - The Commodores passed for 222 yards, including 146 yards by **Jared Funk** (R-Sr.). It was the team's highest passing total against an SEC opponent this year.
- Funk replaced starter **Larry Smith** (R-Jr.) who struggled with accuracy for much of the game, hitting just 11 of 27 attempts for 76 yards.
- The Commodore offense started four drives at the Vanderbilt 47-yard line or in Tennessee territory, yet failed to produce points on any of the possessions. The drives ended with a punt, missed field goal, blocked field goal and interception.
  - **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., safety) notched his first career interception. **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) also contributed his team-high sixth pick.
  - **Sean Richardson** (Jr., safety) topped the Commodore defensive effort with nine total tackles, including eight solo stops.
  - **Brandon Barden** (R-Jr., TE) had three receptions for 58 yards. He is the only Commodore receiver with a catch in all 11 games.
  - After trailing badly in time of possession for much of the season, the Dores owned an advantage in each of the last three quarters.
- The Vanderbilt offense also improved in third-downs, succeeding on eight of 18 conversions, helping produce 23 first downs.
- **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr.) continues to impress running the football. Coming off a 105-yard performance at Kentucky, Reeves gained 60 yards on 17 carries.

## VANDERBILT VS. NON-SEC FOES

Vanderbilt enters the Wake Forest game 9-6 in its last 15 games against non-Southeastern Conference opponents.

The Commodores are 1-2 in non-conference play this year: defeating Eastern Michigan and losing to Northwestern and Connecticut.

In the last decade, the Commodores are 16-16 in non-SEC play.

## VU: SEC GRADUATION SUCCESS LEADERS

The Vanderbilt football team tops the SEC in graduation success rate, according to an NCAA report released last week.

The Commodores' graduation success rate for football (freshmen class of 2002-03) was 89 percent.

## DEFENSE: PRODUCING TACKLES FOR LOSS

The Vanderbilt defense ranks seventh in the NCAA – and first in the SEC – in tackles for loss. The unit is averaging 7.6 tackles for loss on the season. Arkansas and South Carolina are second and third in the SEC, respectively.

## DUO AMONG NCAA STATISTIC LEADERS

Vanderbilt standouts **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Jr., DE) remain among the national leaders in key defensive stats.

Hayward tops the NCAA with 17 defended passes and ranks fifth in the nation – and second in the SEC – with six interceptions. Fugger ranks fourth nationally with four forced fumbles.

Hayward, believed to be the first Commodore of the modern era to achieve interceptions in four consecutive games, also tops the squad with eight career picks. Hayward's current interception total has been bettered by only one Commodore in the last 30 years: **Leonard Coleman** (1982). The team's single-season record of eight INTs is held by Coleman (1982) and **Thomas Wingfield** (1973).

Only two 'Dore defenders, **Jamie Duncan** (5, 1996) and **Shelton Quarles** (5, 1991), have surpassed Fugger's forced fumbles total.

## VANDERBILT IN 2010: LOTS OF YOUTH

Looking for a quick description for Robbie Caldwell's first Vanderbilt squad? *Youthful* would work.

The list of 'Dores seeing action features 21 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 13 true freshmen.

Only eight Commodore seniors have contributed this season.

## NORMAN SIXTH: KICKOFF RETURNS

Though just a sophomore, **Warren Norman** ranks sixth all-time on the Vanderbilt all-time kickoff return charts.

Norman, out for the year with a wrist injury, is averaging 25.4 yards per return this year, ranking sixth in the SEC and 45th in the NCAA.

For his career, Norman is averaging 25.9 yards per kickoff. In 2009, he set a modern-day Vanderbilt team record in 2009 with a 26.2-yard average.

## STOKES, COLE EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

**John Stokes** (Sr., LB) and **John Cole** (R-So., WR) have been named to the CoSIDA/ESPN Academic All-District IV first team, the Academic All-America Committee announced Nov. 2.

Stokes, from Memphis, has played in 47 games as a Commodore and currently ranks third on the team with 46 solo tackles and 74 total tackles. Both totals are single-season highs for Stokes. He also is the team leader with two fumble recoveries.

Stokes has maintained a 3.80 GPA while majoring in Health, Medicine and Society.

This marks the third consecutive year that Stokes has been recognized at the district level for his academic achievements.

Cole, of Somerset, Ky., is second on the team with 21 receptions and 263 receiving yards. He has also returned 16 punts for 126 yards. He holds a 3.63 GPA while majoring in Human and Organizational Development.

## HAND NEWEST COMMODORE COACH

**Herb Hand**, a veteran offensive coach with excellent credentials, is the newest Vanderbilt coach. Hired in early August, Hand serves as offensive line coach and was the first staff hire by Robbie Caldwell.

Hand came to Vanderbilt after three years at the University of Tulsa, a tenure that featured some of the NCAA's most productive offenses. As Tulsa's offensive coordinator, Hand directed 2007 and 2008 offenses that topped the nation. Tulsa's 2008 unit averaged 570 yards and 47 points. Hand also spent six successful years with the University of West Virginia's productive spread offense before going to Tulsa.

## FOURTH CO-CAPTAIN OUT OF ACTION

The Commodores will not play this year with all four captains seeing action in the same game.

**Adam Smotherman** (R-Sr., DT) will miss the final four games by suffering a knee re-injury during a late October practice.

All four captains have spent time on the sideline due to injury. **Joey Bailey** (R-Sr., center) missed three recent games with an ankle injury. Two other defensive captains – **T.J. Greenstone** (R-Jr, DT) and **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) – are back in action, but missed midseason games with leg injuries.

## KITCHINGS NEW OFF. COORDINATOR

Running backs mentor **Des Kitchings** replaced **Jimmy Kiser** as the Commodores' offensive coordinator on Oct. 25.

Kitchings, in his third year on the Vanderbilt staff, moved into the offensive coordinator post for the first time in his coaching career. Kiser continues to coach Commodore quarterbacks.

Earlier this year, the following coaching changes were made:

★ **Bruce Fowler** moved to assistant head coach/linebackers coach under Caldwell.

★ **Jamie Bryant** became the sole defensive coordinator while continuing as the team's secondary coach.

★ **Rick Logo** added recruiting coordinator duties to his primary role as defensive tackles coach.

★ **Mike Pelton** was hired as defensive ends coach.

★ **Ted Cain** was moved to TE coach and special teams coordinator.

## CALDWELL AS FIRST-YEAR COACH

★ Vanderbilt is on pace to complete less than 50 percent of its passes for the third consecutive season. The Commodores are 122 of 258 (47.3%) on the season.

★ The Commodores also are on pace to produce less than 200 first downs for the third straight year after reaching at least 209 first downs for five straight years (2003-07).

## CALDWELL: FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH

**Robbie Caldwell**, the 26th head coach in Vanderbilt football history, is one of just 11 first-time head coaches in the NCAA FBS subdivision this season.

Caldwell, a veteran of more than three decades of collegiate coaching, was named to replace retiring Bobby Johnson on July 14.

Caldwell and Kentucky mentor Joker Phillips are the SEC's only first-time head coaches this year.

Besides Caldwell and Phillips, other first-time FCS head coaches are Sonny Dykes (La. Tech), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), John "Doc" Holliday (Marshall), Mike MacIntyre (San Jose State), Larry Porter (Memphis), Jeff Quinn (Buffalo), Charlie Strong (Louisville) and Willie Taggart (Western Kentucky).

Caldwell has the most collegiate coaching experience of the 11 coaches, with Holliday having the second longest tenure.

## THIRTEEN PLAYERS ON COUNCIL

Thirteen players participate in the Leadership Council, serving as an entity that addresses team and student-athlete issues while acting as their teammates' voice in communicating with Vanderbilt coaches.

Co-captains **Joey Bailey**, **T.J. Greenstone**, **Chris Marve** and **Adam Smotherman** are members of the Leadership Council. Others voted by teammates to represent various position groups include **Larry Smith**, QBs; **Kennard Reeves**, RBs; **Brandon Barden**, TEs/HBs; **John Cole**, WRS; **Tim Fugger**, DL; **John Stokes**, LBs; **Sean Richardson**, safeties; **Casey Hayward**, DBs; and **David Giller**, specialists.

## MARVE WEARS DOSTER "KD1" PATCH

**Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) became the fourth Vanderbilt player to wear the "KD1" jersey patch when the Commodores opened against Northwestern. The recognition is one of the most significant awarded by fellow Commodore players.

The patch honors the memory of Kwane Doster, the only Commodore ever to receive the SEC Freshman of the Year Award. Doster was shot and killed in his hometown of Tampa, Fla., on Dec. 26, 2004. It is displayed on the front of Marve's No. 13 jersey.

## STOKES UP FOR PRESTIGIOUS AWARDS

Senior linebacker **John Stokes**, a semifinalist for the prestigious National Scholar Athlete Award, has also been named as one of 10 finalists for the Awards and Recognition Association (ARA) Sportsmanship Award. The ARA Award winner will be announced in November.

Stokes and **John Cole** (R-So., WR) were also selected as ESPN District IV Academic Americans last week. Both are up for national Academic American recognition.

A native of Memphis, Tenn., Stokes also is a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, the prestigious collegiate honor formerly known as the Draddy Trophy.

Stokes is the team's third leading tackler (74 total tackles) and tops the squad with a pair of fumble recoveries in his final year as a starter.

Stokes maintains a 3.8 grade point average majoring in Medicine, Health & Society. He is a two-time District IV Academic All-American. The son of Vanderbilt graduates also received early admission into Vanderbilt's Medical School after his sophomore academic year on campus, and is expected to start postgraduate classes next fall.

Stokes also is involved as an executive board member of one of Vanderbilt's largest student organizations, Manna Project International. He serves as site development coordinator, in charge of planning and creating community service trips abroad during Spring Break 2011.

There have been four previous Vanderbilt recipients of the award: **Hunter Hillenmeyer**, 2002; **Andy McCarroll**, 1989; **Doug Martin**, 1974; and **Wade Butcher**, 1961.

## QB RODGERS OUT FOR SEASON

Transfer **Jordan Rodgers** (Jr., QB) will not play this season after undergoing arthroscopic surgery on this shoulder earlier last week.

Rodgers, a transfer from Butte (Calif.) J.C., and the younger brother of Green Bay starting QB Aaron Rodgers, has been bothered by the shoulder since August camp.

## THIRD-DOWN STRUGGLES

The Vanderbilt offense has struggled with third-down production for much of the year.

The offensive production has improved in the last two weeks against Kentucky and Tennessee. The unit has converted a combined 15 of 35 third downs, helping result in 22 first downs.

Through 11 games, the 'Dores still rank 12th in the SEC in both first downs (13.8 pg) per game) or third down efficiency (26% success rate).

The overall lack of success in key situations has Vanderbilt trailing in other key offensive statistical categories.

## JOHNSON: NAMED TOP SEC OL VS. OLE MISS

Redshirt freshman tackle **Wesley Johnson** earned the SEC's weekly offensive linemen award for his play against Ole Miss Sept. 18.

Johnson recorded six knock-down blocks and produced key blocks on a pair of long scoring rushes.

Johnson became the first Commodore to earn SEC top offensive lineman honors since left tackle Chris Williams was recognized in 2007.

## UNIFORM CHANGE: NAMES ON JERSEYS

## TOP INDIVIDUAL PERFORMERS

**Casey Hayward** and **Chris Marve** are playing up to their preseason hype. A third Commodore, **Warren Norman**, was performing at a similar level prior to a season-ending injury.

Marve, a junior LB from Memphis, and Norman, a sophomore RB/RS from Stone Mountain, Ga., were both named first team All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers. Hayward, a junior CB from Perry, Ga., was mentioned on several preseason ballots.

All have performed well this year: Hayward ranks among the conference's interception leaders, Marve is among the SEC's leading tacklers, and Norman still ranks among the league's top all-purpose runners and kickoff returners despite missing the last three games.

### CASEY HAYWARD (Jr., DB)

Junior cornerback ranks second in the SEC behind Alabama's Robert Lester with six interceptions after posting a pick vs. Tennessee.

He also tops the nation with 17 defensed passes. He had three in the loss to Tennessee.

### CHRIS MARVE (R-Jr., LB)

Named to watchlists for the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award, Marve returned to action at Georgia after missing the previous game to injury. He contributed just three tackles vs. Tennessee, but still ranks as the SEC's eighth top tackler (7.5 pg).

Marve is trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn achieved the feat in 1998-2000.

### WARREN NORMAN (So., KR/RB)

Norman, the 2009 SEC Freshman of the Year, ranks fourth in the SEC in all-purpose yardage (140.9 ypg). Norman suffered a season-ending wrist injury in the second half against Arkansas in the eighth game of the season.

Norman also leads Vanderbilt in rushing yards (57.4 ypg). Norman is the team's active career leader with 1,248 career rushing yards and seven rushing TDs.

Last year, Norman topped the SEC with 1,951 all-purpose yards, breaking the legendary Herschel Walker's freshman SEC record in the process. He also matched an SEC mark with three kickoff returns for TDs.

## OTHER TOP CANDIDATES

**SEAN RICHARDSON (Jr., Safety)** Regarded as one of the SEC's top safeties, Richardson blossomed as a starter at strong safety in 2009, earning 84 total tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.

## REMEMBERING RAJAAN BENNETT

The Commodores are without one student-athlete who was expected to be a key member of the 2010 signing class, **Rajaan Bennett**.

Bennett, a highly sought-after running back from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga., died tragically on Feb. 18, 2010. Bennett was the victim of a residential shooting that shocked the McEachern and Vanderbilt communities. On Sept. 3, the school honored Bennett by retiring his No. 5 jersey and erecting a monument at its football stadium.

At a memorial service days after the death, his literature teacher read an essay entitled "*Strength*" written by Bennett within a week of his death.

The essay closed with the following lines:

*"There will never be a time that I will give up. I work hard at whatever I do for that man upstairs to smile down on me with the rays of the sun.*

*"My drive cannot be stopped or even slowed down, because every obstacle has a way around it.*

*"Every day I become stronger from the weights physically, the books mentally and life emotionally. There is no limit to my strength and at the end of the day, I want to be known as the strongest."*

Bennett rushed for 1,857 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior captain, helping McEachern to an undefeated regular season. A Rivals' 4-star recruit and one of Georgia's most decorated seniors, Bennett earned the state's AAAAA Offensive Player of the Year Award. At McEachern, Bennett was a campus leader and honors student.

Bennett and his family were honored during in-game ceremonies Oct. 23.

## TAILBACK REEVES TOPS 100 YARDS RUSHING

Vanderbilt reached a key offensive stat against Kentucky that usually leads to team success.

For the first time in seven years, the Commodores lost a game which featured a Vanderbilt running back rushing for at least 100 yards. **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr., RB) ended with 105 yards on 19 carries against the Wildcats. Dating back to 2003, Vanderbilt had won 14 consecutive games in which its rushing attack featured a 100-yard rusher.

Reeves also added 60 rushing yards against Tennessee last week.
