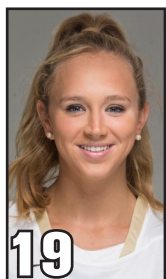

HEAD COACH CATHY SWEZEY



The 2018 Vanderbilt lacrosse season will mark the 21st season under the direction of head coach Cathy Swezey. Her tenure at the helm of the Commodores has included six NCAA Tournament appearances and a 2004 trip to the NCAA Final Four.

In addition, Swezey led Vanderbilt into the American Lacrosse Conference as one of the charter members in 2001 and the Commodores twice won the league title. In 2015, Swezey again took the program into uncharted territory as they joined the BIG EAST Conference after the ALC dissolved.

In 2017, the Commodores improved to 6-9 and finished with a 3-6 record in the BIG EAST. Julie Blaze led the squad with 33 goals on the year and was the first sopho-

more to hold the team lead in goals since April Tellham back in 1999. Her efforts on the field earned her a first team All-BIG EAST selection at the end of the season. The Commodores had to overcome two five-goal deficits in their 14-12 win over Villanova. It was the team's largest comeback since they overcame a five-goal deficit to beat No. 13 Stanford on March 2, 2014. Swezey guided senior Jill Doherty to one of the most successful careers in Commodore history. She finished her career second all-time in assists (84), third in draw controls (163), and seventh in points (175). Doherty led the team in assists during her senior campaign and became the first player in school history to led the team in assists for three straight season.

Swezey has built Vanderbilt lacrosse into a nationally recognized program, both on the field and off of it. In 2012, graduating senior Ally Carey was named a first team IWLCA All-American for the third consecutive season and retained her spot on the U.S. women's national senior team. In the classroom, six of Swezey's student-athletes were named to the 2012 IWLCA Academic Honor Roll, while a total of 23 Commodores were so honored by the American Lacrosse Conference.

A native of Moorestown, N.J., and a three-time Division III national champion, Swezey was hired as Vanderbilt lacrosse's second varsity head coach in 1997. Swezey has played a large part in the growth of lacrosse both at Vanderbilt and throughout Tennessee.

Swezey was the first to bring a team from outside of the eastern time zone to the NCAA Final Four. Her Commodores earned four consecutive berths in the NCAA Tournament between 2007 and 2010. Swezey was named the American Lacrosse Conference Coach of the Year in 2008, the same year she was honored as Vanderbilt's Coach of the Year for women's athletics. Nashville played host to a first-round game in the NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Tournament for the first time in history in 2007.

Swezey began building her program prior to the 1998 season. Her first team went 7-9, but it was a mere two years later that Swezey's 2000 squad would defeat a Top 10 team, Boston University, for the first time in the history of the program. Vanderbilt ended that year ranked 13th in the nation – one spot from reaching the NCAA Tournament – and Swezey was nominated as Coach of the Year by the IWLCA.

In 2002, Vanderbilt became a charter member of the American Lacrosse Conference. For guiding her team to its highest ranking ever, No. 8, and its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament, Swezey earned Coach of the Year honors from the ALC and InsideLacrosse.com.

The Commodores' success has produced a snowball effect in middle Tennessee. Swezey moved her team into a state-of-the-art facility, the Vanderbilt Lacrosse and Soccer Complex, in 2003. A number of former Commodore lacrosse players now work in the Nashville-area as high school and youth lacrosse coaches, and Vanderbilt regularly hosts camps and clinics on campus.

Swezey's coaching career began at her alma mater, Trenton State College (now the College of New Jersey). She was a graduate assistant coach for both field hockey and lacrosse from 1994-1996. During that time, the lacrosse team earned two NCAA championship titles, and the field hockey team earned the title in 1995. While coaching, Swezey earned her master's degree in teaching with a health education specialization.

The three-time All-American had an impressive two-sport career at Trenton State, winning eight national championships in field hockey and lacrosse as a player and graduate assistant coach. Swezey started for Trenton State's national championship lacrosse teams in 1991, 1992 and 1994, and for the 1990 national runner-up squad. Swezey missed the 1993 season with a knee injury, but returned to the field the following year.

Not only was she an All-American in 1992, she received the honor again in 1994. Swezey was named to the NCAA Final Four All-Tournament team in 1992 and 1994, and earned the Attack Player of the Year award from the South Jersey Lacrosse Club her senior season. She became a member of the U.S. Lacrosse squad upon graduation in 1994.

Swezey resides with her three children in Nashville.

North Carolina, 2004

Beth Hewitt enters her fourth year on the Vanderbilt lacrosse coaching staff as the associate head coach.

In 2017, the Commodore defense stood tall after the implementation of the 90-second shot clock. The Dores allowed less than 10 goals five times last season and were 5-0 in those

games. Against Butler, the Commodores allowed only four goals, the fewest since Feb. 7, 2015 against Kennesaw State.

On Sept. 2, 2015, head coach Cathy Swezey promoted Hewitt to associate head coach after one year as the Commodores' defensive coordinator.

Hewitt was hired in June 2014 due to her vast experience as a head coach, assistant coach and an All-American midfielder.

Hewitt spent the past five years as a head coach at Le Moyne College in Syracuse, N.Y., where she built the Dolphins into a Division II national power. In her five years at the helm, Le Moyne compiled an astonishing record of 71-19 (.789) with a 43-5 (.896) mark in the Northeast-10 Conference.

She guided the Dolphins to two Final Fours, three NCAA Tournaments, two NE-10 regular season championships and conference tournament titles. During a three-year stretch, from 2011-13, the Dolphins were 50-8, winning at least 16 games every year and not losing more than three games in a season. In 2011, the New York native, led Le Moyne to a school-record 18 wins and their first of two Final Four trips.

A college coach for less than a decade, Hewitt has built a reputation for forging success at programs in transitional phases.

In 2005, a year after she ended her heralded playing career at North Carolina, she ventured out to the University of Oregon. In Eugene, she helped the Ducks launch their lacrosse program. She spent three years at Oregon, holding the title of defensive coordinator in addition to helping recruit the program's first recruiting classes.

In 2009, she received her first head coaching job before she turned 30. She was handed the reins of the Le Moyne program amidst a reclassification process. During her first season, in 2010, the Dolphins were an independent in Division I, going 9-6. The next year, Le Moyne shifted to Division II and Hewitt quickly made the Dolphins a national power. In 2011, Le Moyne made its first of three straight NCAA Tournament appearances, reached the Division II Final Four and set a school record with 18 wins.

In 2012, the Dolphins again reached the Final Four. They also captured their first of two straight Northeast-10 Conference regular season championships with a perfect 12-0 record in league play. The dominance continued in 2013 with another perfect run through league play for their second conference title. The Dolphins then won their first conference tournament crown to punch their ticket for their sixth NCAA Tournament in school history.

At North Carolina, she was an All-American, All-ACC selection and a four-year letter winner and midfielder. She led the Tar Heels in scoring her last two seasons. During her career, UNC claimed an ACC title and reached the NCAA Final Four.

In addition to receiving her bachelors degree in Communication Studies at North Carolina and masters degree from Oregon in Educational Leadership, Hewitt has worked extensively with Ameriprise Financial as a recruiter, Harrow Sports Inc. in the field of consulting and Brine in the area of marketing and sales. Beth and her husband, Erik, have a daughter, Keegan, and a son, Kaden.

Ford Martin enters his second season at Vanderbilt as an assistant coach.

In his first season, Martin worked with the Commodore goaltenders and all three earned starts throughout the season. Callahan Kent started 10

games in her final season and made 71 saves. She finished her career fifth all-time in goals against average with 10.87. Freshman Madison Foglio and redshirt-freshman Lily Argyle both picked up their first career wins in 2017. Argyle started and played all 60 minutes in the Dores 14-12 comeback win over Villanova. Foglio started in the Dores 16-8 home win over UConn.

Vanderbilt head coach Cathy Swezey hired former volunteer assistant coach Ford Martin as an assistant coach in the fall of 2016.

Martin was a volunteer assistant coach for the Commodores for two seasons working primarily with the goalkeepers before he graduated in the fall of 2015. He worked with goalie Callahan Kent during her first two seasons as a Commodore. This past year, Kent had a breakout season achieving second team All-BIG EAST honors after finishing fourth in the nation in saves with 156.

Martin, a native of Potomac, Md., played goalie at Georgetown Prep and started 43 consecutive games in net. His team won three IAC championships, finished No. 1 in the state of Maryland his sophomore and senior seasons and was ranked in the top 15 nationally all three years.

Georgetown Prep started the "Ford Martin Award for Courage and Perseverance in the Face of Adversity," which he goes back every year and awards to a senior lacrosse player.

He graduated from Vanderbilt in 2015 with a bachelor's degree in Communications of Science & Technology.

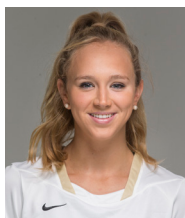
