FOR STARTERS

The University of South Carolina baseball team starts an eight-game homestand this weekend, facing No. 4 Vanderbilt for three games at Founders Park. Friday's game will start at 7 p.m. with an 8 p.m. first pitch for Saturday's contest. The series concludes Sunday afternoon at 1:30 p.m.

Friday and Sunday's games will be streamed on SEC Network + while Saturday's game will be televised on ESPNU with Matt Schick and Todd Walker on the call. All games will be broadcast on The Game 107.5 FM and the Gamecock Sports Network with Derek Scott and Tommy Moody on the call.

Carolina had the midweek free for final exams after being swept at Missouri this past weekend.

SCOUTING VANDERBILT

The Commodores, winners of eight in a row, defeated Tennessee Tech, 21-10, on Tuesday night in Nashville. Isaiah Thomas was 4-for-5 with five RBI and Pat DeMarco added three hits and three RBI in the win. Austin Martin leads Vanderbilt and the SEC with a .413 batting average while JJ Ble-day has a conference-best 21 home runs. Vandy leads the SEC with a .321 team batting average. On the mound, Drake Fellows is a perfect 9-0 with a 3.67 ERA and 78 strikeouts in 68.2 innings pitched.

SERIES VS. VANDERBILT

Carolina holds a 58-33 series advantage on Vanderbilt heading into this weekend's action. Last season, the Gamecocks took 2-of-3 games from the Commodores in Nashville, winning the series opener, 8-7, and taking the Sunday contest, 10-9. Jonah Bride and Carlos Cortes had three RBI apiece in that Sunday win. Carolina is 25-14 all-time against Vanderbilt in Columbia.

CAROLINA TO HONOR BASS WITH JERSEY RETIREMENT

The University of South Carolina athletic department will posthumously retire the jersey of Earl Bass prior to the Gamecocks' May 4 game against Vanderbilt. Bass was an outstanding pitcher for the Gamecocks and compiled a 34-3 career record despite missing most of the 1973 season with an arm injury. A first-team All-America selection in 1974 and 1975, Bass had a 12-1 mark in 1974 and was 17-1 in 1975. He set a then-national record by winning 23 consecutive games over two seasons, a feat that still ranks second in the NCAA. Bass holds school record for shutouts (10), earned-run-average (1.34) and strikeouts (392). Bass was runner-up in balloting for the Lefty Gomez Plate, symbolic of the top amateur baseball player in the United States, when he pitched the Gamecocks to within one game of the NCAA championship at the College World Series in Omaha, Neb., in 1975. He was inducted into the South Carolina Letterman's Hall of Fame in 1989 and was an SEC Legend at the 2017 SEC Baseball Tournament.

BERRYHILL CATCHES FIRE IN LAST 10 GAMES

Redshirt sophomore catcher Luke Berryhill hit his 10th home run of the season, a two-run shot, in the 10-3 win over Charleston Southern on April 23. He carries a 24-game reached base streak into the Vanderbilt series and is hitting .375 with three doubles and three home runs in his last 10 games.

TRIPLE YOUR TRIPLES

South Carolina had three triples on the night in the 10-3 win over Charleston Southern on April 23, two by freshman Brady Allen. The Gamecocks had back-to-back triples in the third inning as Allen and classmate Josiah Sightler each reached to start the inning. The last Gamecock to have two triples in a game was Lonnie Chisenhall against Western Kentucky on Feb. 10, 2007. The last time Carolina had three triples in a game was on March 4, 2005 vs. Pepperdine in Minneapolis, Minn. The school record for triples in a game is five set on March 17, 1986 against The Citadel.

GAMECOCK EXCEL AGAINST ACC COMPETITION

Carolina ended its five-game regular season slate with the Atlantic Coast Conference on Tuesday, defeating North Carolina, 5-2, in Charlotte. The Gamecocks went 4-1 against ACC teams this year, hitting .302 in those games. Andrew Eyster had the best results against the conference, going 8-for-16 with two doubles and two home runs in those five games. The three ACC opponents - Clemson, N.C. State and North Carolina - have a combined record of 95-42.

PITCHING STIFLES TAR HEEL BATS

Five Gamecock pitchers combined to allow just four hits to go along with 13 strikeouts in a 5-2 win over North Carolina on April 16. Dylan Harley had six strikeouts in 3.1 innings of relief, earning the win, while John Gilreath had four punchouts in 2.1 innings. Brett Kerry came on to earn his fourth save of the season, striking out Michael Busch to end the game.

TRINGALI EARNS WIN OVER THE GATORS

Cam Tringali had a strong start in Carolina's 6-3 win over Florida on Friday night. The redshirt freshman from Columbia went six-plus innings, allowing just four hits with one earned run and three strikeouts with no walks. Tringali earned the win against the Gators, his second of the season. He is now 2-2 with a 3.44 ERA and 52 strikeouts in 52.1 innings pitched.

GAMECOCKS WIN NINTH ONE-RUN GAME

Carolina defeated Texas A&M, 3-2, on April 20 to improve to 9-2 this season in one-run games. Twelve of Carolina's 24 wins have been by either one or two runs, four of them in the walk-off variety.

KERRY THROWS UP ZEROES IN WIN OVER ALABAMA

Freshman Brett Kerry was instrumental in helping the Gamecocks pick up the 5-4, 12-inning win over Alabama on Saturday (April 6) as he pitched the final 5.2 innings, allowing just two hits and no runs while striking out four. Kerry retired the final seven batters to the plate and picked up crucial outs with runners in scoring position in both the ninth and 10th frames. On the year, Kerry is 3-1 with a 2.74 ERA, five saves and 52 strikeouts in 42.2 innings pitched.

OLSON'S BLAST WALKS OFF WOLFPACK

Senior Jacob Olson's two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning lifted Carolina to a 10-8 win over No. 3 North Carolina State Tuesday night (April 2). It was Olson's second walk-off home run of the season as he also had one on March 9 against Valparaiso. It also was Olson's third multi-home run game of the year. Carolina had four home runs in the contest. The win was Carolina's fourth walk-off win of the year (Feb. 17 vs. Liberty, Feb. 23 vs. Utah Valley and March 9 vs. Valparaiso), three of which have come on walk-off home runs.

EIGHT GAMECOCKS DOT MLB OPENING DAY ROSTERS

South Carolina had eight players on Major League Baseball rosters on Opening Day (March 28), including Jackie Bradley Jr., who earned a World Series ring with the Boston Red Sox and was named the 2018 ALCS Most Valuable Player. Whit Merrifield (Kansas City), Justin Smoak (Toronto), Sam Dyson (San Francisco), Grayson Greiner (Detroit) and Christian Walker (Arizona) all are on active rosters while Steve Pearce (Boston), who was the 2018 World Series MVP, and Jordan Montgomery (New York Yankees) will start the 2019 season on the disabled list. Tyler Webb (St. Louis) was called up by the Cardinals on April 9 and made his season debut a night later.

HOPKINS NOTES

Hopkins had a pair of home runs in the 12-7 win over Furman on March 19. It is the second time in his career he has hit two home runs in a game. He had a pair on March 7, 2017, against The Citadel ... Hopkins hit for the cycle in the 12-6 win over Valpo on March 10. He homered in the fourth, doubled in the fifth, singled in the seventh and tripled in the eighth. It was the first cycle for a Gamecock since Kyle Martin at Florida in 2015 ... Hopkins earned the Tom Price Award, given to the Most Valuable Player of the Clemson series, after hitting three home runs and driving in nine on the weekend. For his efforts, Hopkins was named the SEC Player of the Week and National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball and the NCBWA.

OLSON NAMED A NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK (MARCH 11)

Senior Jacob Olson has been named a National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper on March 11. Olson has a tremendous week at the plate for the Gamecocks, hitting .522 with nine RBI, six extra-base hits and multi-hit games in all five contests. He had a walk-off solo home run in the bottom of the ninth to give Carolina a 3-2 win over Valparaiso on Saturday. Olson then had a pair of home runs and drove in five in Sunday's 12-6 win.

KERRY NAMED SEC CO-FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK (MARCH 4)

Freshman righthanded pitcher Brett Kerry was named the conference's Co-Freshman of the Week, it was announced on March 4. Kerry did yeoman's work for the Gamecock bullpen, earning two saves while striking out nine in 4.1 innings pitched. He struck out a pair in the ninth as Carolina defeated Appalachian State, 3-1, on Tuesday night. Kerry's big moment came in the Friday night win at Clemson. Coming on with a runner on first and two out in the sixth, he induced a groundout, then scattered two hits with seven strikeouts the final three hits as Carolina held on for a 5-4 win. He struck out the side, all looking, in the eighth while striking out the final two batters of the game.

MORGAN OFF TO A GREAT START ON THE MOUND

Junior Reid Morgan has pitched 69.1 innings in his first 11 starts as a Gamecock, allowing 28 earned runs and striking out 54 without walking just 11 batters. The junior from Kingwood, Texas, earned the win against Clemson on March 3, striking out five in 6.2 innings of work against the Tigers to move to 2-0 on the year. He then went a career high 8.2 innings in a no-decision against Valpo on March 9, striking out 10 in the longest outing from a Gamecock since Tyler Johnson in the 2016 Columbia Regional.

SEC LEADERS

At the plate, Jacob Olson is tied for third in the SEC with 12 home runs. Senior TJ Hopkins is tied for fourth with three triples. Luke Berryhill is eighth in slugging percentage (.594). On the mound, Reid Morgan is fifth with 69.1 innings pitched. As a team, SC is 14th in batting average, 12th in ERA and seventh in fielding percentage.

CAMPBELL NAMED BASEBALL AMERICA PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Sophomore Noah Campbell was named to Baseball America's Preseason All-America second team, the publication announced Jan. 28.

Campbell is coming off a freshman season in which he hit .270 with three doubles, three triples, three home runs and 13 RBI. The Durham, N.C., native was 7-for-8 in stolen base attempts and had a .372 on-base percentage. Campbell recorded 15 multi-hit games and four multi-RBI performances.

This past summer, Campbell hit .364 with seven doubles, six home runs and 26 RBI for Yarmouth-Dennis in the Cape Cod League. This is the third-straight year that a Gamecock has earned Preseason All-America honors by Baseball America. Last year, Carlos Cortes was a third-team selection, while Wil Crowe earned third-team honors in 2017.

CAMPBELL NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC; GAMECOCKS PICKED FOURTH IN EAST

Sophomore Noah Campbell was named to the Preseason All-SEC first team while South Carolina was picked to finish fourth in the East Division in the SEC Preseason poll, the conference office announced Feb. 7.

The Gamecocks earned 53 points in the preseason poll, good for fourth in the division. Vanderbilt was picked to win the East, picking up nine first-place votes and 87 points. Florida and Georgia followed the Commodores, while South Carolina was followed by Tennessee, Kentucky and Missouri. In the West, LSU was picked to win that division with 88 points and 10 first-place votes. The Tigers were followed by Ole Miss, Arkansas, Auburn, Texas A&M, Mississippi State and Alabama.

Vanderbilt was picked to be the SEC champion, earning six votes. LSU earned five votes, while Florida picked up two and Arkansas had one.

SUMMERVILLE -> COLUMBIA

South Carolina will have four players on its roster from Summerville, S.C., including three from Summerville High School. Senior TJ Hopkins and junior Sawyer Bridges return. Hopkins will be the starter in center field after hitting .345 last season before injury cut his season short. Junior Sawyer Bridges will be the Gamecocks' closer after sporting a 1.35 ERA and five saves last season for the Garnet and Black. Freshmen Daniel Lloyd and Dylan Harley will be key components on the pitching staff. Lloyd helped Summerville High School to a state championship in 2016 and earned 5A All-State honors as a senior. Harley prepped at Cane Bay High School, going 8-0 with 111 strikeouts in 2018.

2018 REWIND

The Gamecocks advanced to the Super Regionals in Arkansas after going 3-0 in the Greenville Regional at East Carolina in 2018. The Gamecocks won each of their last five SEC series in 2018, as Carolina swept LSU and won series against Vanderbilt, Ole Miss, Missouri and Texas A&M on its way to a third place finish in the SEC East (17-13) and fifth-place overall conference finish. Carolina handed Arkansas its only postseason loss until the College World Series championship series, defeating the Razorbacks 8-5 in game two of the super regional. The Carolina team finished seventh in the country in fielding percentage (.980) and 12th in home runs (79). Head Coach Mark Kingston coached 10 players that were picked in the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft.

FRESH FACES

Carolina welcomes in 19 newcomers to the 2019 team, 11 high schoolers and eight junior college transfers. This past week at Alabama, newcomers pitched 20.2 innings in the series, including Brett Kerry, who earned the win in relief on Saturday. Luke Berryhill also is hitting .276 and catching full-time for the Gamecocks, while George Callil, Andrew Eyster and Brady Allen are staples in the everyday lineup.

HOPKINS HEADLINES PUBLICATIONS' PRESEASON PROJECTIONS

- The website D1Baseball.com picked TJ Hopkins as the third-best senior in the country. He also was rated the No. 31 SEC Prospect for the 2019 Draft and a 2019 Top Prospect. Noah Campbell was rated the No. 12 prospect for the 2020 Draft by the website while being named a No. 8 SEC prospect for that draft. Ridge Chapman was the No. 39 senior in the country, while Jacob Olson was ranked No. 47.
- In Baseball America's 2019 SEC preview, the magazine listed Campbell at No. 6 in the SEC prospects for the 2020 draft. South Carolina was picked to finish fourth in the East by the publication while earning a regional bid.

HEAD COACH

2ND SEASON AT SOUTH CAROLINA - 10TH SEASON AS HEAD COACH NORTH CAROLINA (1995)

Mark Kingston was named the head baseball coach at the University of South Carolina on June 30, 2017. He became the 30th head coach in the history of Gamecock Baseball.

Kingston's first team at Carolina (2018) advanced to the Super Regionals in Arkansas after going 3-0 in the Greenville Regional at East Carolina. The Gamecocks won each of their last five SEC series in 2018, as Carolina swept LSU and won series against Vanderbilt, Ole Miss, Missouri and Texas A&M on its way to a third place finish in the SEC East (17-13) and fifth-place overall conference finish. Carolina handed Arkansas its only postseason loss until the College World Series championship series, defeating the Razorbacks 8-5 in game two of the super regional. The Carolina team finished seventh in the country in fielding percentage (.980) and 12th in home runs (79). Kingston coached 10 players that were picked in the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft and had 12 players selected to the Spring SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Kingston came to Carolina following a three-year stint as the head coach at USF. He compiled a 100-78-1 record while in Tampa, helping the Bulls to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances. Kingston owns a career mark of 334-226-1 in nine seasons as a head coach, including five at Illinois State, with four NCAA appearances in that nine-year span.

Kingston has helped lead 12 teams to NCAA Tournament berths as an assistant and head coach -- with five of those teams appearing in the NCAA Super Regionals, two participating in the College World Series and one winning a national championship. As a player at the University of North Carolina, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped UNC win the ACC Tournament and advance to the NCAA Regionals in 1990. As an assistant coach, Kingston helped the Miami Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. His 21-year collegiate coaching career also includes stops at Tulane, where he helped guide the Green Wave to the 2005 College World Series, and Purdue.

Kingston guided USF to a 42-19 mark in 2017, the first time since 1996 that the team had reached the 40-win mark. Under Kingston's leadership, the Bulls earned their second trip to the NCAA Tournament in three years. USF won 19-straight games from Feb. 19 - March 22, the second-longest streak in program history. During that streak, USF defeated then No. 3 Florida State in Tallahassee, its first victory against FSU since 1989. On May 9, the Bulls defeated then-No. 5 Florida in Gainesville. It marked the first time in program history that the Bulls beat both FSU and Florida on the road in the same season. The victories were just USF's second and third wins over top-five teams in program history. Kingston reached the 100-win mark at the helm of the program in the Gainesville Regional opener with a 9-1 win over Bethune-Cookman, making him the second-fastest coach in program history to reach 100 victories.

Kingston's Bulls dominated on the mound in 2017, posting a 3.24 team ERA and allowing 7.64 hits per nine innings, both in the top-10 nationally. The pitchers led the country with 10.1 strikeouts per nine innings and set a program record with 620 strikeouts. Offensively, shortstop Kevin Merrell set an American Athletic Conference record with a .384 average, the third-straight year he led the Bulls in hitting. Merrell was named an All-American by four separate publications and was named to the AAC First Team for a second-straight year. He was one of five Bulls named to All-American Athletic Conference teams, the most since 2009. Merrell was drafted by the Oakland Athletics with the 33rd overall pick in the MLB Amateur Draft, becoming the third-highest drafted player in program history. Overall, four USF players were selected in the draft, as Phoenix Sanders went in the 10th round to the Tampa Bay Rays, Joe Cavallaro was taken in the 24th round by the New York Mets and Ryan Valdes was selected in the 33rd round by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

In 2016, the Bulls recorded 517 strikeouts, logging back-to-back seasons of over 500 strikeouts for the first time in school history. Merrell posted a team-high .320 batting average and a first-team all-conference selection in the AAC. Pitcher Brandon Lawson also notched over 100 strikeouts on his way to a second-team all-conference honor. The Bulls won two series against ranked teams (No. 25 Michigan State, at No. 22 East Carolina), and had three players drafted - pitcher Tommy Eveld (ninth round, Arizona), pitcher Brandon Lawson (13th round, Tampa Bay), and outfielder Luke Maglich (34th round, Philadelphia).

Kingston made an immediate impact at USF in 2015, leading the Bulls to an NCAA Regional for the first time since 2002. Kingston and his staff increased the Bulls' 2014 win total by seven and earned the team's first NCAA Tournament win in 13 years. Coach Kingston's guidance helped produce four players who were drafted by Major League Baseball clubs, including pitcher Jimmy Herget (sixth round, Cincinnati), pitcher Tommy Peterson (12th round, Washington), infielder Kyle Teaf (30th round, Tampa Bay), and pitcher Casey Mulholland (37th round, Dodgers). Merrell was recognized as a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, and catcher Levi Borders was named to the Johnny Bench Watch list and was a unanimous selection on The American's First Team. Herget was also named to The American's First Team, and Peterson earned second-team honors. Merrell, first baseman Buddy Putnum, and Teaf were also named to the NCAA Gainesville Regional All-Tournament team.

Kingston came to USF with a long track record as a top-level recruiter and a producer of offensively explosive teams. He spent 2010-2014 as the head coach at Illinois State University, where he led the Redbirds to two MVC regular season championships and one conference tournament title while twice breaking the program's season wins record. He won more than 30 games in each of his five seasons at ISU, a program-record string that included a season-record 39 wins in 2013. He reached the MVC Tournament championship game three times and compiled an overall record of 173-102 (.629 win-

ning percentage). Kingston was twice named a “Rising College Coach” by Kendall Rogers of Perfect Game USA during a five-year tenure at Illinois State (2010-2014) in which he earned MVC Coach of the Year honors in 2010 and 2013 and helped 18 Redbirds earn First-Team all-MVC honors. Two of his players were named MVC Player or Pitcher of the Year and eight were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Kingston led ISU to rapid success, as the Redbirds ranked second in conference wins (64) from 2010-14 while posting two first-place finishes and no worse than a fourth-place conclusion in the MVC. His overall winning percentage of .629 and average of 35 wins per season were a strong improvement over previous seasons. ISU’s average RPI rating of 69.50 from 2010-13 ranked fifth among all northern Division I programs and Kingston’s recruiting classes contained 15 players ranked in the Top-20 in the state of Illinois by Prep Baseball Report, more than any other university.

He took over the ISU program after serving one season as the team’s associate head coach and promptly posted the most successful first-year head coaching stint in program history. Kingston led the 2010 Redbirds to their first-ever share of the MVC regular-season title, their first MVC Tournament title since 1994 and their first NCAA Tournament victory since 1976. ISU’s 32-24 record was the most wins for the Redbirds since 1999.

In 2011, Kingston guided the team to a then-record season win total (36-18), including a marquee victory at Miami (Fla.), and placed seven players on the All-MVC team. The following year (2012) ISU went 33-19 and posted a 10-game win-streak, the program’s longest since 1984. Closer Kenny Long was selected by the Houston Astros in the 22nd round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft, marking three-consecutive seasons in which a Redbird was selected in the MLB draft.

In 2013, Kingston guided ISU to a program-best 39 wins (39-19), posted a school-record 12-game winning streak, won the MVC outright for the first time in school history and set a Valley-record with eight first-team All-MVC selections. Offensively, ISU paced the MVC in batting average, on-base percentage, slugging percentage and home runs and the pitching staff fired a program-record 13 complete games, including 10 shutouts.

Prior to his stint at ISU, Kingston was part of 500 wins (500-279-2) in 13 seasons as an assistant coach and was widely respected as one of the top assistants in the nation. He spent the previous seven years at Tulane University, serving as recruiting coordinator throughout his tenure and as associate head coach the final five seasons with the responsibility of overseeing recruiting, coaching hitters and developing catchers and infielders.

At Tulane, Kingston’s recruiting and coaching efforts helped the Green Wave to six postseason appearances, two NCAA Super Regionals and a berth in the 2005 College World Series. The 2005 Green Wave team was seeded as the top team overall while also receiving the top academic honor in Omaha. Tulane averaged nearly 42 wins per season with Kingston on staff.

Kingston recruited or coached seven players who became All-Americans at Tulane, including James Jurries (2002) and Michael Aubrey (2003). The Green Wave sluggers became the first hitters in 18 years to hit .400 for the season and both earned Conference USA Player of the Year recognition. Aubrey was selected by the Cleveland Indians 11th overall in 2003, the highest Tulane player ever taken in the draft.

Prior to Tulane, Kingston spent two years at Miami (Fla.), where he helped the Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. While at Miami, the Hurricanes finished with top-five school single-season marks in batting average, runs scored and slugging percentage, and led the nation with 228 stolen bases in 2001. In the run to the 2001 national title, the ‘Canes had an NCAA-best 17-0 run to end the season and set a College World Series record with 12.3 runs per game while hitting .373 as a team in Omaha.

Kingston spent one year as an assistant at Illinois State, helping the 1999 Redbirds set then-school records for wins in a season (35), runs scored, RBI, doubles, hits and walks, while finishing second in school history in home runs, total bases and batting average.

Kingston began his coaching career with two seasons at Purdue, helping the Boilermakers post three of the top-seven batting averages in school history and place five position players on the All-Big Ten team after not posting any the year before his arrival.

A 1995 graduate of North Carolina with a degree in communications, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped the team win the ACC Tournament and advance to NCAA Regionals in 1990 as a sophomore. Kingston received the Trippe Bourne “Most Dedicated Player” Award for his outstanding work ethic and leadership during his junior campaign, and was named a team captain his senior season.

Drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers out of North Carolina in 1992, the Northern Virginia native played professionally for five seasons with Milwaukee and the Chicago Cubs organizations.

Kingston attended Potomac High School (Virginia), where he developed into a Collegiate Baseball Top-50 Prospect and was drafted by the New York Yankees after leading his team to the 1988 state championship. In 2006, Kingston was inducted into the Potomac Hall of Fame.

Kingston and his wife, the former Letitia Kelly, have three children, Kailyn Grace, Cameron James and Kathryn Patricia. He also wrote and produced two instructional videos for Championship Productions, “Keys to Consistent Hitting” and “Catching Drills and Fundamentals.” He also was the only assistant coach chosen to write a chapter in “The Baseball Drill Book” produced by the American Baseball Coaches Association.
