The Commodores produced a hard-fought 14-12 victory in Coach Steve Sloan's debut as a head football coach. Vandy jumped on the scoreboard first when quarterback Fred Fisher raced over from six yards out late in the first period. A Fisher to Dan Mahaffey pushed the score to 14-3 after three periods, but the Mocs were far from dead. In a furious fourth period rally the Mocs hit first on a field goal and then with just 57 seconds left to play hit on a TD pass to cut the margin to two. A heavy rush by defensive end Joe Reynolds forced the attempted two-point pass to go astray and the Commodores had their win.

Heroes were plentiful as the Commodores scored their biggest win in several years by upsetting the Georgia Bulldogs before a screaming Homecoming crowd. Hawkins Golden, Lonnie Sadler, Jamie O'Rourke and Fred Fisher provided the offensive power and the entire defensive unit played magnificently, particularly in the second half. Golden, the slight soccer-style kicker, hit on field goals of 36, 47, 24 and 38 yards to provide the margin of victory. The go-ahead FG came with five minutes left to play and clincher was booted with just 1:33 remaining. Sadler and O'Rourke slashed through the Georgia line for 109 and 66 yards, respectively, while Fisher connected on 11 of 18 passes for 109 yards and one touchdown. As outstanding as the offense performed, the defensive unit stole the show. With the Commodores trailing 14-3 at intermission, the Vandy defense rose to the occasion and completely stifled the tough Bulldog attack. The Georgia offensive unit was limited to a mere 28 yards in the second half, 15 rushing and 13 passing, and only two first downs, both coming on the same play as a penalty was tagged to Vandy at the end of Georgia's only pass completion of the half. Barry Burton's booming punts, a 48.5 average and one for 79 yards kept the Bulldogs bottled up the second half.

The Commodores staged another of their furious fourth quarter rallies and almost pulled off the upset of the year in the Southeastern Conference. Gator Bowl-bound Tennessee quickly rolled to a 14-0 advantage in the first period and appeared to have matters well in hand. The Vandy defense once rose to the occasion, however, and until just four minutes remained in the game Tennessee's offense was shut down almost completely. The Commodores entered the final quarter still trailing by fourteen, but the first seven and a half minutes of the period will never be forgotten by fans of either team. On the second play of the quarter Martin Garcia climaxed a 74-yard drive with a one-yard plunge and Hawkins Golden kick cut the deficit to seven. Four plays later Bubba Byrd returned a Tennessee punt 38 vards to the Vols' one, and Garcia scored his second TD on the next play. The Hawk's kick tied the score. On Tennessee's next series the Vols fumbled the second play and the Commodores were back in action again. Six plays later found the Commodores with a fourth and a long one on the Tennessee goal line. Calling on the automatic Hawk, who led the nation in field goal percentage with 12 of 14, Vanderbilt took the lead with 8:38 to be played. Quarterback Conredge Holloway, injured earlier in the game, returned to rally the Vols and a pair of Ricky Townsend field goals, the last with just 1:08 remaining, spoiled Vanderbilt's tremendous rally.
