
South Carolina at Vanderbilt SEPTEMBER 4, VANDERBILT STADIUM



South Carolina 31 **V**ANDERBILT

South Carolina scored on its opening two possessions en route to a convincing 31-6 road victory over Vanderbilt in the season opener for both squads.

While quarterback Dontrial Pinkins directed an efficient Gamecock offense, the South Carolina defense controlled Vanderbilt's offense, forcing four turnovers and limiting the Commodores to just 36 net rushing

Down 17-0 late in the second quarter, Jay

Cutler guided the Commodores to their lone scoring drive, a six-play, 80-yard drive that featured three Cutler completions and the rushing of tailback Kwane Doster. South Carolina quickly regained control, adding a touchdown drive on its first drive of the second half.


Cutler topped the Commodore offensive attack by completing 24 of 38 attempts for 270 yards. Brandon Smith had seven receptions for 88 yards. On defense, safety Kelechi Ohanaja established a career-high with 18 tackles while Andrew Pace and Moses Osemwegie each contributed 11 tackles.



VANDERBILT 23 **OLE MISS 26** (OT)

For the fourth consecutive year, Ole Miss administered a heartbreaking loss to the Commodores, winning 26-23 in overtime after scoring 14 fourth-quarter points to get the extra period.

Vanderbilt, playing well in its first road game of the season, looked comfortably ahead, leading 23-10 in the third quarter. Momentum in the game seemed to go against the Commodores when an apparent 66-yard touchdown run by Matthew Tant was

called back with Vanderbilt leading 23-13.


Jay Cutler directed an effective Commodore offense, throwing for 131 yards and rushing for 60 yards. Norval McKenzie added 99 rushing yards while Erik Davis contributed 66 receiving yards. Moses Osemwegie was the Commodores' top defender, finishing with 11 tackles and a sack. Kelechi Ohanaja added seven tackles while Kevin Joyce contributed six tackles and a forced fumble.



For the second consecutive game, Vanderbilt was unable to maintain a second half lead on the road, as the Naval Academy remained undefeated with an exciting 29-26 victory over the Commodores in Annapolis.

The Commodores scored 12 consecutive points on a touchdown, safety and field goal to take a 19-14 lead midway through the third quarter only to watch the Midshipmen score 15 unanswered points to hold a 29-19 margin early in the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt

narrowed the lead to three on a Jay Cutler touchdown pass to Marlon White.

Cutler again led the Commodores, completing 15 of 20 passes for 176 yards and two touchdowns. Norval McKenzie had 54 rushing yards and a blocked punt that resulted in a safety. Linebacker Otis Washington and end Jovan Haye had 11 and nine tackles, respectively.

Vanderbilt earned its first victory of the year in convincing fashion, defeating Mississippi State 31-13 in front of a home crowd in Vanderbilt Stadium.

The Commodores scored 21 unanswered points in the second quarter, jumping out to a 24-7 halftime margin, then added a touchdown run by Matthew Tant late in the third quarter to push the margin to 31-7.

The Vanderbilt defense played its best game of the year, forcing five turnovers,

including four interceptions. Bill Alford had a pair of interceptions, with Andrew Pace and Lorenzo Parker getting the other aerial turnovers. Moses Osemwegie also played extremely well, contributing a game-high 11 tackles.

The Vanderbilt offense was efficiently directed by Jay Cutler, who competed 10 of 17 passes and guided a rushing attack to 245 yards.



The outcome was one of the most bitter in recent Vanderbilt history as the Commodores allowed 21 fourth-quarter points in a 37-34 loss to the Scarlet Knights.

Vanderbilt used Rutgers' turnovers and an explosive offense to build a 27-3 lead early in the third quarter before Rutgers started its remarkable comeback led by quarterback Ryan Hart and fullback Brian Leonard, who scored four second-half touchdowns.

Cutler provided the offensive spark, passing

for 260 yards. Brandon Smith had 130 receiving yards. Moses Osemwegie and Bill Alford each had 10 tackles while Dominique Morris returned an interception 29 yards for a touchdown.



Playing before 90,000 Georgia fans, Vanderbilt fell behind the Bulldogs early and never recovered, losing 33-3 in Athens.

The Commodores were unable to deal with the three-pronged Bulldog attack of quarterback David Greene, tailback Danny Ware and tailback Thomas Brown. Both backs rushed for more than 100 yards, while Greene threw for two touchdowns.

Georgia scored on its first two possessions, then added a safety before halftime

and two touchdown drives in the third quarter to take control.

Cassen Jackson-Garrison had 37 rushing yards for the Commodores while Cutler threw for 133 yards on 12 completions. Three Commodore defenders – Kelechi Ohanaja, Moses Osemwegie and Kevin Joyce – each contributed at least 10 tackles.



GAME 7 EASTERN KENTUCKY AT VANDERBILT

OCTOBER 23, VANDERBILT STADIUM

Vanderbilt used the passing of Jay Cutler, rushing of Kwane Doster and a solid defensive effort to topple Eastern Kentucky 19-7 at the Nashville campus.

Cutler completed 15 of 21 passes for 156 yards and a touchdown, while Doster rushed for 117 yards. Cutler also contributed 73 rushing yards, including a 55-yard touchdown carry.

After Eastern Kentucky took a 7-6 lead

early in the second quarter, Vanderbilt answered with 12 straight points. Despite the win, Vanderbilt's special teams struggled with a blocked punt and two missed extra points.

The Commodore defensive effort was led by Moses Osemwegie's 11 tackles and two defensed passes. Senior Robert Dinwiddie had three tackles for loss while cornerback Sean Dixon added seven tackles in his first collegiate start.

Playing in Baton Rouge for the first time in six years, Vanderbilt stayed with the defending national champions though the first half only to see its chances drop when Jay Cutler exited early in the third quarter with an injury. Missing an effective offense in the second half, the Commodores lost 24-7 to LSU.

Just before halftime, Cutler directed the Commodores on a 13-play, 83-yard touchdown drive to bring Vanderbilt within three, 10-7, at the break. With Vanderbilt's offense

lacking Cutler's production, the Commodores were held scoreless in the second half.

Marlon White's 72 receiving yards and 56 rushing yards by Norval McKenzie paced the Commodore offensive attack. Moses Osemwegie was Vanderbilt's top defender with 12 tackles and a forced fumble. Jonathan Goff had five tackles and a forced fumble in his first collegiate start at linebacker.

Playing most of the way without Jay Cutler at quarterback, the Commodores played well through the first half only to have the Gators score 20 unanswered points in the second half en route to a 34-17 loss at Vanderbilt.

The Commodores started strongly on Homecoming, taking a 10-0 first quarter lead on a field goal by Patrick Johnson and fumble recovery by Moses Osemwegie in the Florida end zone. Early in the second quarter, Vanderbilt rebuilt a 10-point lead at 17-7 on

Norval McKenzie's 19-yard touchdown run. From that point on, the Gators outscored Vanderbilt 27-0, using a shutdown defense and productive offense directed by Chris Leak.

The Commodores used a second quarter touchdown rush by freshman Jeff Jennings and a Jay Cutler-to-Chris Young touchdown pass in the third quarter to open a 13-0 margin. The Wildcats appeared listless until quarterback Shane Boyd started connecting with several receivers, including Glenn Holt,

who caught a pair of touchdown passes, the last coming with 1:39 left on the clock. Vanderbilt failed to move into Kentucky territory in the final minute.

The Commodores were hurt by poor special teams, missing a 21-yard field goal attempt and an extra point attempt that eventually proved the difference. Vanderbilt also had a punt blocked in the game.
