VANDERBILT RE-VU

The Commodores took Vanderbilt to new heights in 2011, taking the school to its first-ever College World Series in June and matching the school record with 54 wins. On the way to Omaha, the Does captured a share of the Southeastern Conference title, hosted and won a Regional and for the first time hosted and won a Super Regional sweeping Oregon State. Vanderbilt established a new SEC record when 12 Commodores were selected in the MLB draft, including two first round picks in Sonny Gray and Grayson Garvin. The Does lost only two series all season (South Carolina, Florida) and dropped back-to-back games only once (Florida, Georgia). VU finished the season 29-1 against teams outside the SEC with the lone loss coming to Stanford. From last year's squad 13 letterwinners are gone, including eight pitchers. Four players earned All-American honors (Gray, Garvin, Aaron Westlake and Jason Esposito) and four freshmen earned Freshman All-American accolades (Tony Kemp, Conrad Gregor, Kevin Ziomek and T.J. Pecoraro).

NEW AND FAMILIAR FACES

The Vanderbilt lineup will feature a few new faces in 2012 to go along with several familiar names. The Commodores must replace starters at first base (All-American Aaron Westlake), third base (All-American Jason Esposito) and catcher (Curt Casali). However, six starters from last season's team return, including an intact outfield with Tony Kemp, Connor Harrell and Mike Yastrzemski. Joining the three outfielders as returning starters are middle infielders Anthony Gomez and Riley Reynolds and designated hitter/first baseman Conrad Gregor. The mound will feature several new faces with the Does' 2011 rotation (Sonny Gray, Grayson Garvin and Taylor Hill) and back-end of the bullpen (Navery Moore, Mark Lamm and Corey Williams) signing professional contracts last summer. Kevin Ziomek, Sam Selman, Tyler Beede and Drew VerHagen will compete for the weekend rotation while Will Clinard, Philip Pfeifer and Brian Miller will start the season at the back of the bullpen. The team's pitching will be bolstered by the scheduled return of T.J. Pecoraro from arm surgery later this spring.

TOP-RANKED RECRUITING CLASS

The Commodores 13-man class was ranked No. 1 by Baseball America last fall. The class features 12 freshmen and one junior college transfer. Right-hander Tyler Beede headlines the class as the only first round pick in last summer's MLB draft to not sign a professional contract turning down Toronto. Catcher Chris Harvey is also a key component of the class's top ranking, graduating from high school after his junior year to join the Commodores in the fall. The class consists of six position players (Harvey, Connor Castellano, Will Cooper, Vince Conde, John Norwood and Zander Wiel) and seven pitchers (Beede, Adam Ravenelle, Philip Pfeifer, Nevin Wilson, Brian Miller, Jared Miller and Drew VerHagen). The top-ranked class is the second for Vanderbilt with the first coming in 2005, a class that included eventual first round picks Pedro Alvarez and Ryan Flaherty.

TIM CORBIN

BY THE NUMBERS

376 wins at Vanderbilt makes him the second-winningest coach in school history.

232 wins over the last five years ranks second among SEC teams during that span.

129 of Corbin's players and recruits have been drafted by MLB in his career, including **96** while at VU.

120 SEC All-Academic selections during Corbin's tenure.

18 Vandy players have been selected as All-Americans.

FACING THE CARDINAL

Vanderbilt travels west for the team's annual opening weekend trip with a visit to Stanford. The Commodores took two-of-three from the Cardinal last season at Hawkins Field, winning on Friday and Saturday before a 5-2 loss on Sunday. The last time VU visited Palo Alto was in 2009 when the Dores dropped two-of-three on opening weekend. Vandy is 3-4 all-time against Stanford in a series dating back to the first meeting in 1973.

ALL-AMERICAN FRESHMEN NOW SOPHOMORES

Four freshmen Commodores garnered All-American honors last season with pitchers Kevin Ziomek and T.J. Pecoraro, outfielder Tony Kemp and designated hitter Conrad Gregor earning the distinction. The quartet, now sophomores, joins senior Riley Reynolds and junior Anthony Gomez as former Freshman All-Americans on the Dores' roster.

KEMP NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

After a stellar freshman campaign last spring that netted him the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year award Tony Kemp opens his sophomore season as a preseason All-American by Collegiate Baseball. Kemp was also a first team All-SEC performer last season after hitting .329 with a team-best seven triples, the most by a Commodore since Ryan Klosterman set the school record with eight in 2004.

DORES REPLACING A LOT

Anytime a team sets a draft record (VU set the SEC record with 12 players selected in 2011) there will be lots of experience and stats to replace the next season. Here are just a few things the Dores must replace this season: hitting stats - 36 home runs (71% of team's 2011 total), 220 RBI (53%), 70 doubles (54%), 173 runs (38%) pitching stats - 55 starts (83%), 42 wins (78%), 14 saves (78%), 450 innings pitched (77%), 425 strikeouts (75%).

NEARING 2K

The Vanderbilt baseball program is nearing 2000 wins in the program's 114th season of baseball. The Commodores enter the 2012 season with an all-time record of 1992-1601-3. VU will become the seventh current SEC team to reach the 2000-win mark as a program joining Alabama, Florida, Georgia, LSU, Mississippi State and South Carolina.

CORBIN CLOSING IN ON 400 WINS AT VU

Head Coach Tim Corbin enters the 2012 season with 376 wins as the Commodores' skipper. His 376 wins at Vanderbilt are the third-most of any active SEC coach at one school trailing only Ole Miss' Mike Bianco, who has led the Rebels for the past 11 seasons and has 434 wins at Ole Miss, and South Carolina's Ray Tanner, who has 689 wins in 15 seasons with the Gamecocks. The Vandy coach needs only 18 wins to reach 500 for his career.

STREAKS... CONTINUED

Tony Kemp enters his sophomore season having reached base in 30 straight games. The streak started at South Carolina April 16 with a five-hit performance. Connor Harrell also enters the season on a streak of 11 straight games having reached base.

COMMODORE NOTES

DORES ON TV

Vanderbilt is scheduled to play at least seven games on television this season as part of the SEC's 66-game TV schedule. The Commodores' first TV game will come at Florida on Saturday, March 17 on CSS. Two-time defending national champion South Carolina visits Hawkins Field at the end of March with CSS airing Saturday's (March 31) game. The Dore host Auburn on Friday, April 13 on CSS. Saturday's (May 5) tilt at Tennessee will also be broadcast on CSS. The following weekend the Commodores travel to LSU to take on the Tigers with two games televised by Fox Sports Network. Vanderbilt's final regular season series is at home against Ole Miss with Thursday night's game televised by ESPNU as part of the network's national weekly SEC baseball package.

FANN EARNS POST-GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Senior catcher Drew Fann earned the nod as the Vanderbilt male representative for the Southeastern Conference Brad David Community Service post-graduate scholarship. Fann is a two-time member of the SEC All-Community Service team and received his undergraduate degree in Human and Organizational Development last spring.

BIG LEAGUERS BACK AT THE HAWK

Vanderbilt has produced more professional players over the last eight seasons than any other school in the Southeastern Conference; including a nation-best eight first round picks. The Commodores set a new SEC mark with 12 players selected in June's MLB draft last summer. During the offseason several players visit Hawkins Field to work out. Big leaguers David Price, Mike Minor, Mike Baxter and Pedro Alvarez all worked out at The Hawk this past offseason alongside numerous former Dore playing in the minor leagues.

SEC COACHES PICK VU FOURTH IN EAST

The Southeastern Conference coaches have picked Vanderbilt to finish fourth in the SEC East Division this season. The Commodores are slated behind Florida, South Carolina and Georgia in the division and ahead of Kentucky and Tennessee. The Gators were voted to win the league while Arkansas was selected to win the West Division. The Razorbacks were picked ahead of LSU, Alabama, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Auburn.

LOTS OF UNDERCLASSMEN

The Commodores enter the season with 33 players on the roster, including 22 underclassmen. The roster consists of 12 freshmen, 11 sophomores, eight juniors and two seniors. Riley Reynolds and Drew Fann are the only two seniors on the squad with Fann being in his fifth year at Vanderbilt. Two juniors, Will Clinard and Andrew Harris, are in their fourth season at VU after redshirting their first season on campus.

BUSY OFFSEASON FOR DORES

Vanderbilt had a busy fall after the team returned to campus. Coach Corbin was the 12th Titan raising the fans' flag at the Tennessee Titans' game against the Indianapolis Colts. The team hosted a two-game series with Cal State Fullerton in October on the Dore's final weekend of fall ball. The next weekend the 2011 team was honored at a football game and received their SEC Champion/College World Series rings.

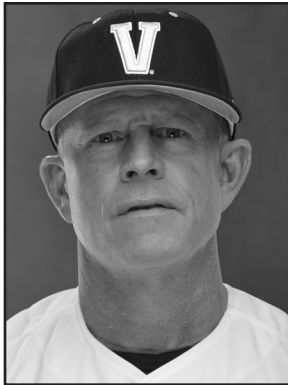

HEAD COACH TIM CORBIN



Head Coach Tim Corbin begins his 10th season at the helm of the Vanderbilt baseball program. During his tenure Corbin has turned the Commodores into a national power and taken the program to unprecedented success leading Vanderbilt to the College World Series for the first time in 2011 and winning a share of the Southeastern Conference title along the way.

The Commodores' magical run to Omaha saw several school records equaled or passed. VU won 54 games to match the school record set in 2007 and set the SEC record with 12 players selected in the Major League Baseball draft. Hawkins Field hosted the NCAA Regional round for just the

second time in history and Super Regionals for the first time with the Commodores sweeping through both rounds en route to the College World Series. Individual awards supplemented the team's success with Grayson Garvin earning SEC Pitcher of the Year and Tony Kemp picking up SEC Freshman of the Year honors. Garvin became the second VU pitcher to earn the prestigious league award joining David Price while Kemp is the second Commodore to be named the league's freshman of the year along with Pedro Alvarez. All four awards have come under Corbin's watch. Sonny Gray, Jason Esposito, Aaron Westlake and Garvin all garnered All-American honors with Kevin Ziomek, T.J. Pecoraro, Conrad Gregor and Kemp being named Freshmen All-American.

Corbin's overall record of 376-189 (.665) is second all-time in terms of wins at Vanderbilt, and first in terms of winning percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

The 2010 Commodores racked up the second-most wins in school history finishing the year with a 46-20 mark, eventually falling at Florida State in the third game of the Super Regional. In order to get to Florida State the team advanced out of the Louisville regional, a place that saw the Commodores' 2009 season end. During the regular season, Corbin led the Commodores to a 16-12 mark, good enough for third in the Southeastern Conference East division behind Florida and eventual national champion South Carolina.

In 2009, Corbin took a young squad with seven new offensive starters and molded them into a team that finished with a 37-27 record and runner-up finishes in the SEC tournament and the NCAA Louisville Regional. The 2009 draft saw six Commodores selected, highlighted by junior pitcher Mike Minor's selection with the seventh overall pick by the Atlanta Braves. His selection marked the fifth time in the last three seasons a Vanderbilt player has been picked in the first round.

In 2008, Corbin guided the Commodores to their second straight 40-win season (41-22) and third consecutive appearance in the NCAA tournament. The Commodores battled through the first half of the season without the services of Preseason Player of the Year Pedro Alvarez and managed to record road sweeps over Mississippi State and Tennessee for the first time in school history. The 2008 draft saw eight Commodores selected, highlighted by Pedro Alvarez who was taken with the second overall pick by the Pittsburgh Pirates. Vanderbilt became the first school in draft history to have the first overall pick (David Price in 2007) and second overall pick in consecutive drafts, an indication of the talent Corbin has brought into the program over the last six years.

In 2007, Corbin guided the Commodores to their best season ever, finishing with a school record 54 wins. The team also achieved a No. 1 national ranking for the first time in school history and held that honor for 13 of 15 weeks during the regular season. The Vanderbilt baseball team also swept through the Southeastern Conference, winning both the regular season and tournament crown for the first time ever, and it marked the first time an SEC team had done it since 1996. The team lost only one conference series the entire season against SEC West Division winner Arkansas in Fayetteville and avenged the series loss by defeating the Razorbacks in the SEC tournament title game. The conference recognized Corbin for the work he had done, naming him SEC Coach of the Year. Corbin also picked up Co-National Coach of the Year by College Baseball Insider and regional coach of the year honors by the American Baseball Coaches Association. The Commodores hosted their first ever NCAA regional as the No. 1 National Seed and arrived as a power in college baseball. Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

In the summer of 2006 he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports

Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba. The .919 winning percentage set a new national team high and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay in 2005 and 2011 as their recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America. Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 58 VU players have been drafted since 2004, the most of any SEC team during that span.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record. Along the way Vanderbilt racked up 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade but made the post-season tournament in 2004. During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series wins in all. His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team in 2003 finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games. That squad set then school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168) -- all of which were bettered in 2004. The team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each of which was ranked among the top 15 at the time. Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort. Four different pitchers contributed to the 4-0 victory over Western Kentucky University.
