VANDERBILT RE-VU

Vanderbilt endured a tough start to the 2012 season winning one game in February (1-7) and ultimately starting 7-10 before beginning play in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The Commodores did not see their record level off to .500 until a midweek win over Louisville on May 8. Despite the slow start to the season the Dores finished the season as one of the hottest teams in the nation finishing the regular season with four straight SEC series victories, including wins over ranked opponents Kentucky, LSU and Ole Miss. The team pushed its way back into the SEC Tournament Championship Game for the sixth time in nine trips under Head Coach Tim Corbin with wins over South Carolina and Florida before a loss to Mississippi State. The Commodores were sent to the Raleigh Regional for the NCAA Tournament, where the team topped UNC-Wilmington in the opener and stunned host NC State in the second game. Vanderbilt's season came to an end with back-to-back tough losses to the Wolfpack to finish the 2012 campaign 35-28.

PROS KNOW THE COMMODORES

The Vanderbilt roster boasts an astonishing 18 players that have been drafted prior to this season. The Commodores' 18 players are the most on any collegiate roster in the country. Senior Mike Yastrzemski is the only Dore to have been drafted twice, turning down Boston out of high school and Seattle last summer. Of the Commodores' 11-man recruiting class, seven were selected in last summer's major league baseball draft. Baseball America's list of the top 50 players from each class is littered with Commodores with nine total. Pitchers Walker Buehler (No. 1) and Carson Fulmer (No. 6) along with infielder Dansby Swanson (No. 28) and outfielder Rhett Wiseman (No. 30) are featured in the freshman class. Right-hander Tyler Beede is the second-rated sophomore. Lefty Kevin Ziomek (No. 18) and infielder Conrad Gregor (No. 41) are among the top 50 juniors. Senior outfielders Connor Harrell (No. 25) and Mike Yastrzemski (No. 27) are two of the top seniors in the nation.

DORES BRINGING BACK BUNCHES

Vanderbilt enters the season with high expectations carrying the highest preseason ranking in school history. The Commodores' previous high was in 2008 when the team opened the year at No. 3 in the Baseball America poll. The 2013 team returns 23 letterwinners, including eight position starters and the entire weekend rotation. The roster has 10 players that started at least 10 games last season and four players that have started over 100 games.

FOR STARTERS

Vanderbilt opens the season against an unfamiliar foe in Long Beach State with this weekend's series serving as the first three games the two schools have ever played. Since Coach Corbin's arrival in 2003, the Commodores are 6-4 in lid lifters, including 3-0 in season openers at Hawkins Field.

BUSY FEBRUARY

Vanderbilt does not waste any time jumping into the 2013 season with 10 games in the season's opening two weeks. The Commodores will play nine games at home and travel across town to take on Belmont next Tuesday. The Dores' season opening series at home is the first since 2010 when VU opened the year with a three-game series against Niagara.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Four Commodores earned preseason All-American recognition with juniors Conrad Gregor, Spencer Navin, Tony Kemp and Kevin Ziomek getting the nod. All four players were recognized by Baseball America to help lead the Commodores to the most All-Americans on the publication's list. Gregor was also named a preseason All-American by Perfect Game and Collegiate Baseball. Navin and Kemp were each tabbed All-Americans by Collegiate Baseball as well.

BACK-TO-BACK NO. 1 RECRUITING CLASSES

Vanderbilt became the first-ever school to land consecutive, top-ranked recruiting classes when Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball tabbed the Dores' freshman class No. 1.In the 13 years of the Baseball America recruiting class poll, no school had ever achieved back-to-back No. 1 recruiting classes and only Arizona State (2000, 2008) has two top classes. Vanderbilt now has three in the history of the poll with the best class in 2005, 2011 and 2012.

KEMP CLOSING IN ON TRIPLES RECORD

Junior Tony Kemp does not like to stop at second having already matched the school record with 15 triples in his first two seasons as Commodore. Last season the Dores' leadoff man recorded eight triples to lead the Southeastern Conference and match Ryan Klosterman's (2003-04) total from 2004. Kemp enters the 2013 season tied with Nick Morrow (1991-94) for the school record. Kemp's first two seasons have already put in position to challenge the league mark of 21 career triples held by Brian Duva (1991-94) of Florida, who needed 241 games to get to 21. Kemp has played in 128 games in his first two seasons.

IRON MIKE

Senior Mike Yastrzemski enters the season having started 137 straight games for the Commodores. The outfielder's amazing streak started during his freshman season in 2010 and has continued with the senior playing in every game the last two seasons. Yastrzemski has started 164 of his 187 career games entering this season.

TWO NEW COACHES JOIN CORBIN'S STAFF

The biggest change for the Commodores in 2013 is in the dugout, where long time pitching coach Derek Johnson and hitting coach Josh Holliday are gone. Holliday left to become the head coach at his alma mater, Oklahoma State, and was replaced by Travis Jewett in August. Jewett joins the Commodores from Arizona State, where he helped lead the Sun Devils to the College World Series in 2010. Jewett serves as the Dores' hitting coach and recruiting coordinator. Johnson left the Dores to become the Chicago Cubs' minor league pitching coordinator at the end of fall practice and was replaced by Scott Brown. VU's new pitching coach, Brown spent the previous nine seasons at St. John's building a national reputation as one of the best young minds in the game.

COMMODORES NOTES

SEC COACHES PICK COMMODORES TO WIN EAST

The coaches of the Southeastern Conference voted the Commodores as the team to beat in the SEC East division. Arkansas was picked to win the West and the overall league title. The Dores were selected to finish in front of (in order) Florida, Kentucky, South Carolina, Georgia, Tennessee and Missouri. In the West, the Razorbacks were picked ahead of (in order) LSU, Mississippi State, Ole Miss, Texas A&M, Alabama and Auburn.

PROFESSIONALS WITH PROFESSORS

This past fall, seven former Commodores were on campus working towards completing their degrees at Vanderbilt. Pitchers Sam Selman (Kansas City), Navery Moore (Atlanta), Corey Williams (Minnesota) and Jack Armstrong (Houston) joined position players Joe Loftus (Arizona) and Anthony Gomez (Miami) on campus as students working on their undergrad degrees. Former pitcher Mark Lamm (Atlanta) was back on West End working towards his graduate degree.

COMMODORES ON NEW TURF AT THE HAWK

Since last season Hawkins Field underwent a face-lift on the field, switching from natural grass to synthetic turf. The Hawk's new surface features multiple levels of turf blades and sand/rubber mix-tures throughout the field. The only dirt now on the field is the pitcher's mound. The brown turf on the field (infield, warning track) features shorter blades than the green turf.

FORMER COMMODORE DAVID PRICE WINS CY YOUNG AWARD

Tampa Bay Rays ace David Price won the American League Cy Young Award after an outstanding 2012 season. The lefty went 20-5 to tie for the AL lead with a league-best 2.56 ERA and 205 strikeouts, sixth-most in the AL, to win his first Cy Young Award. Price's newest trophy is just the latest addition to his trophy case after the southpaw won nearly every collegiate award for his 2007 season at Vanderbilt when he set a school record with 194 strikeouts.

HAWKINS FIELD: OFFSEASON HOME TO PRO DORES

Once again, Hawkins Field and Vanderbilt hosted numerous former Commodores over the offseason as the professional players prepared for their respective 2013 seasons. At least 20 former Dores used Hawkins Field and the baseball facilities during the winter months, including major leaguers David Price, Pedro Alvarez, Mike Baxter and Ryan Flaherty. Interviews with several players are featured in a web series on vucommodores.com called Catching Up.

COMMODORES SET TO PLAY ON TV 10 TIMES



HEAD COACH TIM CORBIN



Head Coach Tim Corbin begins his 11th season at the helm of the Vanderbilt baseball program. During his tenure Corbin has turned the Commodores into a national power and taken the program to unprecedented success leading Vanderbilt to the College World Series for the first time in 2011 and winning two Southeastern Conference titles.

The 2012 Vanderbilt Commodores overcame a slow start to the season to post the team's seventh straight trip to

the postseason. The Dores finished the season as one of the hottest teams in the nation winning four of the last four SEC series of the regular season, including series victories over No. 3 Kentucky and at No. 4 LSU. Vanderbilt rolled into the SEC Tournament having won 12 of the last 15 regular season games. Corbin guided the Commodores to the championship game for the sixth time in nine trips, losing to a red-hot Mississippi State team in the final. Vanderbilt made the NCAA Tournament with a trip to the Raleigh Regional finishing runner-up to host NC State to end the season 35-28.

For the second consecutive season (2011-12) the Commodores' freshman class was tabbed as the nation's best by Baseball America, becoming the first school in the poll's 13-year history to post back-toback top classes. Vanderbilt's 2012 freshman class was the unanimous top class, also picking up the honor from Collegiate Baseball. Since Corbin's arrival in 2003, Vanderbilt has earned three top-ranked recruiting classes (2005) and is the only school in the nation to have more than two top classes.

In 2012, one of Corbin's prize pupils, David Price, was named the American League Cy Young Award winner. Price was the top overall pick by Tampa Bay in 2007 after a stellar career at Vanderbilt. The southpaw went 20-5 with a 2.56 ERA and 205 strikeouts over 211 innings for the Rays to become the first Commodore to win the Cy Young.

Corbin's overall record of 411-217 (.655) is second all-time in terms of wins at Vanderbilt, and first in terms of winning percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

The Commodores' magical run in 2011 to Omaha saw several school records equaled or passed. VU won 54 games to match the school record set in 2007 and set the SEC record with 12 players selected in the Major League Baseball draft. Hawkins Field hosted the NCAA Regional round for just the second time in history and Super Regionals for the first time with the Dores sweeping through both rounds en route to the College World Series. Individual awards supplemented the team's success with Grayson Garvin earning SEC Pitcher of the Year and Tony Kemp picking up SEC Freshman of the Year honors. Garvin became the second VU pitcher to earn the prestigious league award joining David Price while Kemp is the second Commodore to be named the league's freshman of the year along with Pedro Alvarez. All four awards have come under Corbin's watch.

In 2007, Corbin guided the Commodores to their best season ever, finishing with a school record 54 wins. The team also achieved a No. 1 national ranking for the first time in school history and held that honor for 13 of 15 weeks during the regular season. The Vanderbilt baseball team also swept through the Southeastern Conference, winning both the regular season and tournament crown for the first time ever, and it marked the first time an SEC team had done it since 1996. The team lost only one conference series the entire season against SEC West Division winner Arkansas in Fayetteville and avenged the series loss by defeating the Razorbacks in the SEC tournament title game.

The conference recognized Corbin for the work he had done, naming him SEC Coach of the Year. Corbin also picked up Co-National Coach of the Year by College Baseball Insider and regional coach of the year honors by the American Baseball Coaches Association.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities. In the summer of 2006 he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba. The .919 winning percentage set a new national team-high and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee.

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a new artificial playing surface, a new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. In 2009 permanent seats in the outfield pushed Hawkins Field seating capacity to double the amount when Corbin arrived in 2003. These upgrades reinforce the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future. He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers three decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.
