

NEED TO KNOW

- ★ Vanderbilt's 7-1 mark to begin the season is nothing new for the program. Vandy started 7-1 in 2010, 2011, 2013 and 2014. Vandy also began the 2016 season, 8-0, and started out that year an impressive 16-1. The best start to a season was by the 2007 Commodores who began 19-0.
- ★ Vanderbilt is the only team in the country to rank in the Top 10 for batting average, earned run average and fielding percentage. The Commodores are ninth in batting average (.345), sixth in earned run average (1.63) and second in fielding percentage (.993). In fact, Vandy is the only team in the Top 25 in all of those categories.
- ★ Five Vanderbilt freshmen have made starts this season while 14 total have made appearances. The unit has combined to hit .417 (48-for-115) with 30 runs and 31 RBIs while posting a 1.56 ERA with 26 strikeouts in 23 innings pitched.
- ★ With Sunday's victory, 16th year head coach **Tim Corbin** is just three victories shy of becoming the program's all-time winningest coach. Corbin is 653-316-1 with the Commodores.
- ★ Vandy's six-game win streak is the longest since May 17-25, 2016, when the Commodores defeated Morehead State and swept Auburn before beating Missouri and Texas A&M in the first two games of the SEC Tournament.
- ★ Sunday marked the beginning of a stretch that includes 12 games against 12 different opponents. The last time a Commodore team played as many in consecutive vs. single opponents was 15-straight from Feb. 19-March 18, 1995.
- ★ The Commodores boast one of the strongest schedules in recent memory during 2018, playing a combined 22 games against opponents ranked in the preseason Top 25. The Dores are 2-1 in those games following a series win vs. Duke.
- The Dores' 16-member freshman class was ranked the nation's top recruiting class by Baseball America last September. It's the fifth time Vanderbilt has been named the nation's top class (2005, 2011, 2012, 2015).



INSIDE THE MATCHUP VS. AUSTIN PEAY

- ★ Vanderbilt and Austin Peay meet for the 76th time in the history of the two programs on Tuesday.
- ★ The Commodores own a 53-20-2 advantage in the all-time series and have won eight of the last 10 matchups.
- ★ Vandy has won 11-straight games against the Governors at Hawkins Field dating to the 2003 season.
- ★ A season ago, Vanderbilt used early offense to cruise to an 8-4 win over Austin Peay at Hawkins Field. The Commodores scored in each of the first four innings and five of the first six to amass a 7-2 lead after six innings. Vandy threw six pitchers including five who are on the current roster.
- ★ Current junior Julian Infante provided three RBIs, finishing 1-for-3 in last year's victory.

NATION'S TOP FRESHMEN OFF TO SIZZLING START

- ★ Vanderbilt's freshman class was named tops in the country by Baseball America last November.
- ★ Five Vanderbilt freshmen made starts this season while 14 total have made appearances. The unit has combined to hit .417 (48-for-115) with 30 runs and 31 RBIs while posting a 1.56 ERA with 26 strikeouts in 23 innings pitched.
- ★ D1Baseball.com's list of 30 impact freshmen entering 2018 includes Vandy's Jake Eder (No. 16), Jayson Gonzalez (No. 18), Philip Clarke (No. 19) and Pat DeMarco (No. 25). With four players on the list, the Dores trail only Florida (5).
- ★ Here is a look at some of the standout freshman performances and where they rank nationally this season:

VANDERBILT RE-VU

- ★ No. 13 Vanderbilt posted a perfect 5-0 week, outscoring Presbyterian and UMass-Lowell a combined 61-7.
- ★ The Commodores hit .348 for the week, averaging 12.2 runs and 12.6 hits per game.
- ★ Vandy posted an impressive .995 fielding percentage while committing just one error.
- ★ Commodore pitching limited the Blue Hose and River Hawks to a .190 batting average while posting a 1.20 ERA.
- ★ Ten different pitchers did not allow a run including starters Maddux Conger, Drake Fellows and Jake Eder.

GOLDEN BOYS

- ★ For a fourth-straight year, multiple Vandy players have been named to the Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List.
- ★ Julian Infante and Patrick Raby are among those featured. The award was first presented in 1978 and is given to an amateur player who best exhibits and combines "exceptional on-field ability and exemplary sportsmanship." The award is considered the most prestigious in amateur baseball.
- ★ Five Commodores have been named finalists for the Golden Spikes Award -- all coming since the 2007 season -including David Price, who took home the honor in 2007. Other finalists include Pedro Alvarez (2007), Tyler Beede (2013), Carson Fulmer (2015) and Dansby Swanson (2015).

VANDY PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN SEC EAST

- ★ Vanderbilt has been picked to finish in the same position according to the league's head coaches.
- ★ Florida was picked as the preseason favorite to win both the East and the SEC with a total of 91 points and 13-of-14 first-place votes. Arkansas was picked to win the West behind 12 first-place votes and a total of 90 points.

GAME NOTES

A WORLD SERIES KIND OF FEEL

- ★ After playing 10-straight at home to begin the season, Vanderbilt heads west for a seven-game road trip including games at Houston's Minute Maid Park and Los Angeles' Dodger Stadium -- the two sites for the 2017 World Series matchup between the Astros and Dodgers.
- ★ The Commodores will take part in the Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic at Minute Maid from March 2-4. The three-day, six-team tournament features programs against local universities squaring off against the SEC. Vandy will face Sam Houston State (3/2), Louisiana (3/3) and Houston (3/4).
- ★ For the fourth-straight year, the Dores head to California, this go-around, visiting Long Beach State (3/7), UCLA (3/9) and USC (3/10) before facing off against TCU in the Dodger Stadium College Baseball Classic on March 11.

FORMER PLAYERS JOIN COBRIN'S STAFF

- ★ Last September, head coach Tim Corbin and associate head coach Scott Brown welcomed back former players **Mike Baxter** and **David Macias**. Baxter serves as the Dores' hitting coach and recruiting coordinator while Macias comes on board as Vanderbilt's volunteer assistant coach.
- ★ Baxter joins the Commodores after a 12-year professional career that included playing in the big leagues for four organizations over parts of six seasons. Baxter made his major league debut with the San Diego Padres in 2010, and also played for the New York Mets (2011-13), Los Angeles Dodgers (2014) and Chicago Cubs (2015).
- ★ Macias was previously on Corbin's staff as the team's strength coach in 2014 when the Dores won the national championship and was the volunteer assistant in 2015 when the Dores returned to the College World Series finals. Prior to rejoining Corbin's staff, Macias was with the Seattle Mariners organization as a minor league manager.

- ★ Last September, D1Baseball.com recognized Vanderbilt as the **No. 2 program nationally** in the publication's bi-annual top-100 rankings. The list is designed to assess the overall health of programs in the current era with the ultimate goal of identifying "the programs in the best shape right now, with an eye toward the next five to 10 years."

★ Head coach Tim Corbin is just three victories shy of becoming Vanderbilt's all-time winningest coach. The 16th-year head coach, who owns a 653-316-1 record, trails only Roy Mewbourne, who racked up 655 wins between 1979-2002. Here is a look back at some of Corbin's milestone victories:

THE SEC: IT JUST MEANS MORE

- ★ The Southeastern Conference has sent 58 teams to the College World Series since 1990 with Vanderbilt doing its part to represent the league in 2011, 2014 and 2015. The league has now appeared in the College World Series in 32 of the last 33 years including appearances by 18 teams in the last seven years.
- ★ In 2017, the SEC tied its own national record with six teams competing in the NCAA Super Regionals. The Commodores were among the field as part of the NCAA Corvallis Super Regional.
- ★ Total home attendance for all 14 SEC teams passed the two million mark for the seventh consecutive season a year ago while total attendance for the 2017 SEC Tournament was 127,479.
- ★ A total of 11 SEC student-athletes were selected on the first day of the 2017 Major League Baseball Draft including Vandy right-handed pitcher Kyle Wright (1st round/5th overall) and outfielder Jeren Kendall (1st round/23rd overall).

DORES IN THE PRO NOTES

- ★ At least one Dore has been drafted every year since 1991 with a total of 100 players signing professional contracts.
- ★ Vanderbilt is one of only two universities in the nation to produce multiple No. 1 picks with David Price (2007) and Dansby Swanson (2015), joining Arizona State (Rick Monday - 1965, Floyd Bannister - 1968, Bob Horner - 1978).
- ★ Under Corbin, Vanderbilt pro alums have earned over \$62 million dollars in signing bonuses.
- ★ Since head coach **Tim Corbin** arrived in 2003, every Vanderbilt starting catcher has been selected in the MLB Draft.
- ★ The Dores have had at least one MLB first round selection on the mound every year in the Tim Corbin era.
- ★ Eighty-nine pitchers have been selected in the MLB Draft, including 55 during the **Tim Corbin** era (since 2003).

- ★ Vanderbilt continues to honor the memory of **Donny Everett**, who tragically passed away in a drowning accident the day before the Commodores opened the 2016 NCAA Nashville Regional.
- ★ The Donny Everett Scholarship was established during the 2016 school year. Everett's memory lives on with the display of No. 41 on the field and with the No. 41 flag among the major league players in right field.
- ★ Everett was the 2015 Tennessee Gatorade Player of the Year and one of the highest-rated players in the nation to attend college. He turned down the Milwaukee Brewers as a 29th round draft pick to join Vanderbilt.

- ★ Vanderbilt plays 12 teams that reached the 2017 NCAA Tournament for a total of 22 games, including Auburn (3), Florida (3), Houston, Kentucky (3), LSU (3), Long Beach State, Louisville, Mississippi State (3), Sam Houston State, TCU, Tennessee Tech and UCLA. Of the 12 teams, eight reached the NCAA Super Regionals.

Now in its 16th season of existence, greets fans with chairback seats close to the field of play with bleacher seating in the outfield.

Nestled alongside Vanderbilt Stadium and Memorial Gymnasium

on the west end of campus, the ballpark was constructed as the Commodores' first baseball-only facility in school history. It was built near the exact location of McGugin Field, which served as baseball's home field for 76 years and part-time football practice field.

In 15 seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has transformed Vanderbilt into one of the national powers of college baseball and taken the program to unprecedented success winning the school's first-ever men's national title in 2014.

Corbin's overall record of 653-316-1 (.673) is second-best in terms of wins at Vanderbilt, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Under Corbin, Vanderbilt boasts the Southeastern Conference's longest streak of consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances at 12. The Dores have advanced to a Super Regional in four of the last five years.

In 2015, Vanderbilt returned to the College World Series for the third time in five years with team's fourth 50-win season in the last four making it back to the CWS Finals before losing in three games to Virginia. The Dores captured the SEC East with a 20-10 mark.

The 2014 Commodores topped Virginia in the College World Series finals in three games to claim the title in just the Dores' second trip to Omaha. For the third time in four years Vandy hosted NCAA Regionals and Super Regionals, topping Oregon in the Regional final and Stanford in the Super Regionals.

Vanderbilt's 2013 team was one for the ages as the Commodores matched the school record with a 54-12 record and smashed the SEC record with a 26-3 mark to win the league title.




