

#### **NEED TO KNOW**

- ★ Head coach **Tim Corbin** is one victory shy of becoming Vanderbilt's all-time winningest coach. The 16th-year head man won his 655th career game on Wednesday as the Commodores defeated Indiana State, 8-5. The win matched the mark of Roy Mewbourne who was at the helm from 1979-2002.
- ★ Vanderbilt's 9-1 mark to begin the season is nothing new for the program. Vandy started 9-1 in 2010, 2011, 2013 and 2016. The Dores began 2016 an impressive 16-1. The best start to a season was by the 2007 Commodores who began 19-0.
- ★ Vanderbilt is the only team in the country to rank in the Top 15 for batting average, earned run average and fielding percentage. The Commodores are sixth in batting average (.352), 11th in earned run average (2.00) and 14th in fielding percentage (.986). In fact, Vandy is the only team in the Top 25 in all of those categories.
- ★ Five Vanderbilt freshmen have made starts this season while 15 total have made appearances. The unit has combined to hit .414 (61-for-147) with 39 runs and 41 RBIs while posting a 2.67 ERA with 39 strikeouts in 37 innings pitched.
- ★ Vandy's eight-game win streak is the longest since winning as many consecutive between March 3-15, 2016. During that stretch, the Dores defeated Stanford (2x), Radford (2x), Xavier (3x) and NIU (1x).
- ★ Sunday marked the beginning of a stretch that includes 12 games against 12 different opponents. The last time a Dore team played as many consecutive games against different opponents was 15-straight from Feb. 19-March 18, 1995.
- ★ The Commodores boast one of the strongest schedules in recent memory during 2018, playing a combined 22 games against opponents ranked in the preseason Top 25. The Dores are 2-1 in those games following a series win vs. Duke.
- The Dores' 16-member freshman class was ranked the nation's top recruiting class by Baseball America last September. It's the fifth time Vanderbilt has been named the nation's top class (2005, 2011, 2012, 2015).



#### **INSIDE THE MATCHUP VS. SAM HOUSTON STATE**

- ★ Vanderbilt and Sam Houston State meet for the first time in the history of the two programs on Friday.
- ★ The Commodores last competed in competed in the city of Houston as part of the seventh-annual Minute Maid Park College Classic in 2007. Vanderbilt defeated Rice, Arizona State and Baylor as part of a 3-0 mark at the event.
- ★ Sam Houston State is one of two Texas programs Vanderbilt will square off against this season. The Commodores will face No. 6 TCU at Dodger Stadium on March 11 as part of the Dodger Stadium College Baseball Classic.
- ★ Friday's matchup against the Bearkats marks the first of a 10-day, seven-game road trip. Following three games at Minute Maid Park, Vanderbilt hits the West Coast for four games beginning Wednesday at Long Beach State.

#### NATION'S TOP FRESHMEN OFF TO SIZZLING START

- ★ Vanderbilt's freshman class was named tops in the country by Baseball America last November.
- ★ Five Vanderbilt freshmen made starts this season while 15 total have made appearances. The unit has combined to hit 414 (61-for-147) with 39 runs and 41 RBIs while posting a 2.67 ERA with 39 strikeouts in 37 innings pitched
- ★ D1Baseball.com's list of 30 impact freshmen entering 2018 includes Vandy's Jake Eder (No. 16), Jayson Gonzalez (No. 18), Philip Clarke (No. 19) and Pat DeMarco (No. 25). With four players on the list, the Dores trail only Florida (5).

### **VANDERBILT RE-VU**

- $\star$  Vanderbilt heads into the weekend riding an eight-game win streak, capped by Wednesday's 8-5 win vs. Indiana State.
- ★ The No. 12 Commodores fell behind by four runs before using a trio of home runs including a three-run long ball from junior **Alonzo Jones** as part of a four-run sixth inning.
- ★ The Dores scored in four-straight innings between the fourth and seventh for the victory. The win moved head coach Tim Corbin into a tie with Roy Mewbourne for the most wins in Vanderbilt baseball history with 655.

#### **GOLDEN BOYS**

- ★ For a fourth-straight year, multiple Vandy players have been named to the Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List.
- ★ Julian Infante and Patrick Raby are among those featured. The award was first presented in 1978 and is given to an amateur player who best exhibits and combines "exceptional on-field ability and exemplary sportsmanship." The award is considered the most prestigious in amateur baseball.
- ★ Five Commodores have been named finalists for the Golden Spikes Award -- all coming since the 2007 season -- including David Price, who took home the honor in 2007. Other finalists include Pedro Alvarez (2007), Tyler Beede (2013), Carson Fulmer (2015) and Dansby Swanson (2015).

### **VANDY PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN SEC EAST**

- ★ Vanderbilt has been picked to finish in the same position according to the league's head coaches.
- ★ Florida was picked as the preseason favorite to win both the East and the SEC with a total of 91 points and 13-of-14 first-place votes. Arkansas was picked to win the West behind 12 first-place votes and a total of 90 points.

### **GAME NOTES**

#### A WORLD SERIES KIND OF FEEL

- ★ After playing 10-straight at home to begin the season, Vanderbilt heads west for a seven-game road trip including games at Houston's Minute Maid Park and Los Angeles' Dodger Stadium -- the two sites for the 2017 World Series matchup between the Astros and Dodgers.
- ★ The Commodores will take part in the Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic at Minute Maid from March 2-4. The three-day, six-team tournament features programs against local universities squaring off against the SEC. Vandy will face Sam Houston State (3/2), Louisiana (3/3) and Houston (3/4).
- ★ For the fourth-straight year, the Dores head to California, this go-around, visiting Long Beach State (3/7), UCLA (3/9) and USC (3/10) before facing off against TCU in the Dodger Stadium College Baseball Classic on March 11.

#### FORMER PLAYERS JOIN COBRIN'S STAFF

- ★ Last September, head coach Tim Corbin and associate head coach Scott Brown welcomed back former players Mike Baxter and David Macias. Baxter serves as the Dores' hitting coach and recruiting coordinator while Macias comes on board as Vanderbilt's volunteer assistant coach.
- ★ Baxter joins the Commodores after a 12-year professional career that included playing in the big leagues for four organizations over parts of six seasons. Baxter made his major league debut with the San Diego Padres in 2010, and also played for the New York Mets (2011-13), Los Angeles Dodgers (2014) and Chicago Cubs (2015).
- ★ Macias was previously on Corbin's staff as the team's strength coach in 2014 when the Dores won the national championship and was the volunteer assistant in 2015 when the Dores returned to the College World Series finals. Prior to rejoining Corbin's staff, Macias was with the Seattle Mariners organization as a minor league manager.

#### **D1BASEBALL.COM RECOGNIZES DORES**

- ★ Last September, D1Baseball.com recognized Vanderbilt as the **No. 2 program nationally** in the publication's bi-annual top-100 rankings. The list is designed to assess the overall health of programs in the current era with the ultimate goal of identifying "the programs in the best shape right now, with an eye toward the next five to 10 years."

#### THE SEC: IT JUST MEANS MORE

- ★ The Southeastern Conference has sent 58 teams to the College World Series since 1990 with Vanderbilt doing its part to represent the league in 2011, 2014 and 2015. The league has now appeared in the College World Series in 32 of the last 33 years including appearances by 18 teams in the last seven years.
- ★ In 2017, the SEC tied its own national record with six teams competing in the NCAA Super Regionals. The Commodores were among the field as part of the NCAA Corvallis Super Regional.
- ★ Total home attendance for all 14 SEC teams passed the two million mark for the seventh consecutive season a year ago while total attendance for the 2017 SEC Tournament was 127,479.
- ★ A total of 11 SEC student-athletes were selected on the first day of the 2017 Major League Baseball Draft including Vandy right-handed pitcher Kyle Wright (1st round/5th overall) and outfielder Jeren Kendall (1st round/23rd overall).

In 15 seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has transformed Vanderbilt into one of the national powers of college baseball and taken the program to unprecedented success winning the school's first-ever men's national title in 2014.

Corbin's overall record of 655-316-1 (.674) is second-best in terms of wins at Vanderbilt, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Under Corbin, Vanderbilt boasts the Southeastern Conference's longest streak of consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances at 12. The Dores have advanced to a Super Regional in four of the last five years.

In 2015, Vanderbilt returned to the College World Series for the third time in five years with team's fourth 50-win season in the last four making it back to the CWS Finals before losing in three games to Virginia. The Dores captured the SEC East with a 20-10 mark.

The 2014 Commodores topped Virginia in the College World Series finals in three games to claim the title in just the Dores' second trip to Omaha. For the third time in four years Vandy hosted NCAA Regionals and Super Regionals, topping Oregon in the Regional final and Stanford in the Super Regionals.

Vanderbilt's 2013 team was one for the ages as the Commodores matched the school record with a 54-12 record and smashed the SEC record with a 26-3 mark to win the league title.
