QUICK HITTERS

- ★ The Commodores are now 4-1 on the season after defeating Oregon State, 64-62, to capture the TicketCity Legends Classic in East Rutherford, N.J. It was Vanderbilt's third preseason tournament title in five years - the Commodores also won the 2007 South Padre Island Invitational and the 2008 Cancun Challenge.
- ★ VU moved to 2-0 on neutral floors in 2011-12.
- ★ The Commodores have now defeated the two Pac 12 schools from Oregon in 2011.
- ★ The championship game against Oregon State featured nine ties, and the lead changed hands nine times. Senior guard Brad Tinsley scored the game winning basket with 4.5 seconds remaining in regulation.
- ★ John Jenkins was named MVP of the TicketCity Legends Classic after averaging 21.0 points per game in the two games at the IZOD Center. Jeffery Taylor also made the all-tournament team.
- ★ Jenkins leads the SEC in scoring at 20.8 points per game, and has now scored in double figures in 37 straight games, dating back to Vanderbilt's loss to Mississippi State in the 2010 SEC Tournament.
- ★ Jenkins was 4-7 from beyond-the-arc, the third time this season he has made three threes in a game this season and the 34th time of his career.
- ★ Taylor held Oregon State's leading scorer, Jared Cunningham to only nine points. Cunningham had averaged 36 points per game in his previous two games against Texas and Hofstra.
- ★ Vanderbilt attempted only six attempts from the free throw line (5-6); it was VU's fewest attempts at the charity stripe this season, and the fewest since the Commodores were 5-6 against Presbyterian. The Commodores' 83.3% from the charity stripe against the Beavers is a season-high.
- ★ The Commodores committed 22 turnovers, a season-high. Oregon State converted 22 points off of those turnovers.
- ★ Kevin Stallings is now 363-212 in his career, and 240-149 with the Commodores.

MORE ON THE MONMOUTH SERIES

★ Friday's meeting will be the second in the series between the two schools. Monmouth won the first meeting at the Hawaii Pacific Thanksgiving Invitational in 2001.

★ Monmouth head coach King Rice is in his first season with the Hawks. Rice was an assistant with Coach Stallings at Vanderbilt from 2006-11 and at Illinois State from 1993-98.

★ Sam Ferry, who was a manager for four years with the Commodores and the video coordinator in 2010-11, is in his first year on Rice's staff as the Director of Operations.

JENKINS ECLIPSES 1,000 POINTS, TAYLOR CLIMBS SCORING LIST

John Jenkins scored 17 points against Cleveland State on November 13, and now has 1,047 points, becoming the 42nd Vanderbilt player to surpass the 1,000-point barrier and is currently 37th on the all-time scoring list. Jeffery Taylor now has 1,390 points in his career, and is now 16th on the Vanderbilt all-time scoring list. He trails former Commodore great Bobby Thym by 13 points for 15th place on the list.

THREE ON WOODEN PRESEASON WATCH LIST

The Commodores' Festus Ezeli, John Jenkins, and Jeffery Taylor are three of 50 players on the preseason Wooden Award Preseason Watch List - Vanderbilt, North Carolina, and Ohio State are the only three teams in the country with three players on the list.

LAST TIME OUT - VANDERBILT 64, OREGON STATE 62

Brad Tinsley hit a game-winning jumper with 4.5 seconds remaining to send Vanderbilt to the TicketCity Legends Classic Championship in a 64-62 win over Oregon State Monday night in East Rutherford, N.J. John Jenkins scored 14 points to lead the Commodores, while Jeffery Taylor added 13 points in the win.

- ★ Vanderbilt outrebounded Oregon State, 33-31, and moved to 4-0 on the season when outrebounding their opponent.
- ★ The 64 points scored was the lowest scoring output in a win this season.
- ★ John Jenkins (14) and Jeffery Taylor (13) were Vanderbilt's only double-digit scorers. It was the first time this season VU has had less than three double-figure scorers.
- ★ Taylor held Oregon State's leading scorer, Jared Cunningham to only nine points. Cunningham had averaged 36 points per game in his previous two games against Texas and Hofstra.
- ★ Vanderbilt attempted only six attempts from the free throw line (5-6); it was VU's fewest attempts at the charity stripe this season, and the fewest since the Commodores were 5-6 against Presbyterian. The Commodores' 83.3% from the charity stripe against the Beavers is a season-high.
- ★ The Commodores committed 22 turnovers, a season-high. Oregon State converted 22 points off of those turnovers.
- ★ The game was tied nine times, and the lead changed hands nine times. Senior guard Brad Tinsley scored the game winning basket with 4.5 seconds remaining in regulation.
- ★ Vanderbilt held the Beavers to 43.3% from the floor and only 14.3% from three, both season bests.
- ★ Monday night marked the first time this season that Vanderbilt has come away with a victory after being tied with two minutes to go.
- ★ Fifty-four of the team's 64 points were scored by the team's starters.

NEXT UP FOR COMMODORES

Vanderbilt has a busy week next week, with a home game set with #12/12 Xavier on Monday night and a road contest with #7/7 Louisville on Friday as a part of the Big East/SEC Invitational.

VANDERBILT AND NATIONAL RANKINGS

The Commodores ended the 2010-11 season ranked 29th in the nation in scoring offense (75.9), 35th in scoring margin (+8.2), 27th in 3FG% defense (31.3%), 37th in free throw percentage (74.3), and 38th in blocks per game (4.8). Individually, John Jenkins ranked ninth in three-point field goals per game (3.1), 25th in three-point field goal percentage (40.8), and 30th in scoring (19.5 ppg). Festus Ezeli finished 18th in blocks per game (2.6), and Brad Tinsley ended the year 27th in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.46).

PLAYER OF THE WEEK BONANZA IN 2010-11

Four of Vanderbilt's five starters (Brad Tinsley, John Jenkins, Lance Goulbourne, Festus Ezeli) claimed an SEC Player of the Week award last season.

FOUR 1,000-POINT SCORERS?

Jeffery Taylor became the 41st player in Vanderbilt history to surpass the 1,000-point barrier in 2010-11, and John Jenkins recently surpassed the 1,000-point mark to become the 42nd, and Brad Tinsley is 30 points shy. Festus Ezeli currently has 672 points.

COMMODORES LED SEC IN SEVERAL CATEGORIES IN 2010-11

Vanderbilt led the SEC in scoring in all games (75.9) and SEC games only (73.8 ppg). In all games, the Commodores finished statistically in the top three in scoring margin (3rd, +8.2), free throw percentage (2nd, .743), field goal percentage (3rd, .458), 3-point field goal percentage (2nd, .371), 3-point field goal percentage defense (2nd, .313), assists (3rd, 13.4), defensive rebounds (2nd, 26.0), and threes made (2nd, 7.7).

In SEC games only, Vanderbilt also led the league in three-point field goal percentage defense (30.5). VU finished in the top three in SEC games only in free throw percentage (2nd, .752), field goal percentage (3rd, .381), and threes made (3rd, 7.5).

GETTING TO THE LINE

For the second consecutive season (2009-10, 2010-11), Vanderbilt topped the league in free throws made and attempted in all games and in the 16 conference games. Vanderbilt attempted 837 free throws on the season, for an average of 24.6 attempts per game, and made 622 (18.3 per game). In league play, the Commodores attempted 383 free throws (23.9) and connected on 288 of those attempts (18.0).

Individually, Festus Ezeli was second in the league in free throw attempts with 216, with Jeffery Taylor finishing eighth in the conference with 167, and John Jenkins ninth with 161.

In 2011-12, the Commodores have made 67 free throws (107 attempts), compared to 55 makes by opponents (93 attempts).

MORE FREE THROW NUMBERS

One more reason that the Commodores will miss center Festus Ezeli - of the returning players in college basketball, Ezeli is the seventh-leading player in the country in terms of getting fouled. Ezeli was 140-216 from the charity stripe last season (64.8%).

LOOKING FOR THREE CONSECUTIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS

The Commodores have appeared in two consecutive NCAA Tournaments, and are seeking a third consecutive berth for the first time in the program's history.

PRESEASON QUICK HITTEES

- ★ Vanderbilt entered the 2011-12 campaign as the number seven team in the nation according to the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.
- ★ It marked the first time since November of 1993 (23rd) that the team had been ranked in the preseason, and it's the highest preseason ranking for a Commodore team since 1965, when VU was ranked fifth.
- ★ The Commodores return five starters from last year's team, but will miss the services of senior center Festus Ezeli, who sprained his MCL and PCL in his right knee in late October and will be out 6-8 weeks.
- ★ Junior John Jenkins, the SEC's leading scorer and leader in threes made in 2010-11 was named to the preseason All-SEC first team, along with senior forward Jeffery Taylor. Ezeli was named to the second team.
- ★ First time in the Stallings' era (since 1999) that he has had five returning starters.
- ★ Along with Jenkins, Ezeli, and Taylor, seniors Brad Tinsley (point guard) and Lance Goulbourne (forward) return as starters.
- ★ Tinsley led the SEC in assists in 2010-11 with 4.6 per game, and notched the schools' first-ever triple-double against Presbyterian (11 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists).
- ★ Goulbourne was the team's leading rebounder a season ago, and averaged 7.3 rebounds per game.
- ★ 6'9 senior forward/center Steve Tchiengang will fill in for Ezeli while he is injured. Redshirt freshman center Josh Henderson may also see action.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

- ★ The 2011-12 slate of games may be one of the most difficult the Commodores have ever faced and one that could see the Commodores take on as many as 13 teams that participated in post-season play a year ago.
- ★ The home schedule includes the season opener against Pac-12 member Oregon (November 11) and a matchup with perennial NCAA tournament stalwart and Atlantic 10 member Xavier on November 28. VU will travel to Louisville, also ranked in the preseason top 10, as part of the Big East/SEC Invitational on December 2nd, and will also host the ESPN Gameday franchise for the first time from Memorial Gym on February 11 against Kentucky.
- ★ Other NCAA Tournament teams on this year's non-conference schedule - Bucknell (Nov. 19), Texas (possible opponent, Legends Classic, Nov. 21), Indiana State (Dec. 17), Marquette (Dec. 29).

COMMODORES ON TELEVISION

Vanderbilt will appear on television 25 times in the regular season, with 17 slated for national broadcasts.

AS JEFFERY TAYLOR GOES...

So do the Commodores. Since 2010-11, Vanderbilt is 19-3 in games in which Taylor scores 15 or more points, and 8-9 in games in which he fails to reach the 15-point barrier.

MEMORIAL GYM IN ITS 60TH SEASON

- ★ The Commodores are now in their 60th season in the Southeastern Conference's oldest facility for basketball. Vanderbilt has an all-time record of 710-192 in its 60 years of existence.
- ★ In 2010-11, the Commodores finished 14-3, averaged 80.3 points per game, and shot 49.1% from the floor. Vanderbilt also made 8.4 3's per game, shot 41.9% from beyond-the-arc, and outrebounded opponents by a margin of +4.7. VU also shot 77.4% from the FT line at Memorial Gym.
- ★ Vanderbilt has won 126 of its last 134 home games against non-conference opponents.
- ★ Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 173-16 non-conference record at home (.919 win percentage).
- ★ The Commodores are 106-9 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.

3-POINT STREAK CONTINUES THROUGH 25TH SEASON; VU ONE OF THREE TEAMS TO HIT A TREY IN EVERY GAME SINCE 1986-87 SEASON

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 801 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (807) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (677) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

COMMODORES SELL OUT OF SEASON TICKETS FOR FIFTH CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Vanderbilt's games at Memorial Gym will once again be a hot ticket, with the 10,000+ season tickets allotted gone. The only single-game sales of tickets will be for the games in which Vanderbilt students are on holiday break - Friday, November 25 vs. Monmouth (8 p.m.), Saturday, December 17 vs. Indiana State (4:30 p.m.), Monday, December 19 vs. Longwood (7 p.m.), Wednesday, December 21 vs. Lafayette (7 p.m.), Monday, January 2 vs. Miami (OH) (7 p.m.). Tickets are \$20, and can be purchased on vucommoedores.com or by calling 615-322-GOLD.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

The Commodores sport a very wordly roster, with players from four different countries. Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang and James Siakam are from Cameroon. The rest of the team hails from the United States.

COMMODORES LOSE TWO PLAYERS FROM LAST YEAR'S TEAM

Vanderbilt's Andre Walker and Darshawn McClellan, who each received their Vanderbilt degree in May of 2011, each transferred to another school for their fifth year of eligibility. Walker transferred to Xavier, whom the Commodores play on November 28 at Memorial Gym, and McClellan will use his final year of eligibility at Louisiana-Lafayette.

NEW ADDITIONS

The Commodores will welcome guards Dai-Jon Parker (6'4, Baton Rouge, La.) and Kedren Johnson (6'4, Lewisburg, Tenn.), as well as forward Shelby Moats (6'7, Waconia, Minn.) to the fold this season. Despite the return of five returning starters, each will push for playing time. Center Josh Henderson and forward James Siakam, who each redshirted last year, are also eligible for the Commodores.

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 60TH SEASON

Storyed Memorial Gymnasium is in its 60th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 711-192 (.787) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 126 of its last 134 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 173-16 non-conference record at home (.915 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 106-9 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

NASHVILLE - John Jenkins scored 24 points, Jeffery Taylor added 21 and 11 rebounds as No. 7 Vanderbilt opened the season with a 78-64 victory over Oregon.

Brad Tinsley had 13 points for Vanderbilt. The Commodores hadn't been ranked in the preseason since November 1993 when they were No. 23, and they haven't been ranked this high since 1965 when they were fifth.

But the Commodores took control with an 18-0 run over the final 2:33 of the first half and the first few minutes of the second.

Oregon fell to 0-4 when opening against a ranked opponent. But the Ducks didn't go down easily as Tony Woods had 12 points and Brett Kingma and E.J. Singler added 10 each.

Vanderbilt led by 20 with 13:36 to go, but Oregon came back with 14 straight points. The Ducks got as close as 62-57 on a jumper by Kingma with 5:09 left.

Taylor answered by putting back his own miss with 4:41 left, then Jabari Brown had a turnover at mid-court. Johnathan Loyd missed both free throws, then Taylor hit a jumper to start a 12-0 run to seal the win.

The Ducks finished with 20 turnovers, which Vandy turned into 24 points.

- Notes: VU has now won 125 of its last 132 home games against non-conference opponents, and are 105-8 in the same category under Kevin Stallings. The Commodores went on an 18-0 run at the end of the first half and beginning of second to give the team a cushion they would use the rest of the way. Vanderbilt led by as many as 20 points midway through the second half. Jenkins broke his career record for three pointers made with seven. His previous career high was six, which he accomplished four times, most recently vs. Kentucky on Jan. 12, 2011. Jermaine Beal was the last VU player to hit 7 three's (vs. Auburn, 1/31/09) in a game. NASHVILLE - D'Aundray Brown had 18 points, eight rebounds and seven steals as Cleveland State upset No. 7 Vanderbilt 71-58 in a regional game of the Legends Classic.

Brown missed all of last season after tearing a tendon in his finger early, and the sophomore guard helped hold Vandy forward Jeffery Taylor to just nine points and forced the senior into six turnovers.

Cleveland State has four seniors back from a team that won the Horizon League last season. The Vikings hadn't played since an exhibition Wednesday night and looked very fresh, while Vanderbilt (1-1) appeared sloppy and slow after opening Friday night with a late tipoff against Oregon.

Cleveland State scored first on a 3-pointer by Trevon Harmon within the first minute and never trailed. The Vikings forced Vanderbilt into 21 turnovers - 15 of them steals. Harmon finished with 11 points and Jeremy Montgomery added 10.

John Jenkins, the Southeastern Conference's leading scorer with 19.5 points last season, had 17 for Vanderbilt. Lance Goulbourne added 11.

With the early tipoff, Cleveland State came into a Memorial Gym barely half full, and the Vikings jumped to a 16-point lead and were up 37-24 at halftime. They outshot Vanderbilt, hitting 50 percent (27 of 54) compared to 35.3 percent (18 of 51) and scored 22 points off the Commodores' turnovers.

- Notes: The Vanderbilt loss ended a 20 game home non-conference winning streak, dating back to Dec. 3, 2008, in a 74-55 loss to UIC. John Jenkins scored 17 points and became VU's 42nd player to eclipse the 1,000-point barrier. Steve Tchiengang grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds. Jeffery Taylor scored 14 points and led five players in double digits to help No. 18 Vanderbilt beat Bucknell 80-68 with two starters out due to injuries.

The Commodores (2-1) bounced back after losing to Cleveland State to drop from No. 7. John Jenkins, the Southeastern Conference's leading scorer last season, hurt his right ankle in the loss when he stepped on a player's foot in the first half, while senior center Festus Ezeli is out with a sprained knee until at least December.

Brad Tinsley, Lance Goulbourne and Kedren Johnson each added 12 points. Rod Odom had 10. Joe Willman led Bucknell (0-2) with 17 points. Joshua Singleton had 12 and Mike Muscala and Brian Fitzpatrick 10 apiece.

Josh Henderson, a redshirt freshman helping fill in with Ezeli out, hit a short jumper that put Vandy ahead to stay with 2:46 left. Tinsley hit a jumper, then Parker finished a fast-break with a layup for a 27-26 halftime lead. Vanderbilt kept building the lead from there, going up by as much as 76-55 on a 3-pointer by Parker with 2:30 left.

- Notes: Five players scored in double-figures for Vanderbilt (Taylor 14, Tinsley 12, Goulbourne 12, Johnson 12, Odom 10) for the first time since January 19 of last season against Ole Miss. EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. - John Jenkins scored 28 points and No. 18 Vanderbilt closed the game on a 10-2 run for an 86-79 victory over North Carolina State in the semifinals of the TicketCity Legends Classic.

Jenkins, who missed the Commodores' last game with a sprained right ankle, had 20 points in the first half of a game that was close until Vanderbilt (3-1) took the lead for good with a spurt that started with 2:16 to play.

The Commodores will play Oregon State for the championship on Monday night at the Izod Center.

Jeffery Taylor added 17 points for Vanderbilt and Lance Goulbourne had 15, including 10 in the opening 7 minutes of the second half.

C.J. Leslie, who missed the first three games of the season while sitting out a suspension for accepting \$410 worth of impermissible benefits, had 20 points for the Wolfpack (2-1), but the sophomore forward missed the last 6 minutes of the game because of leg cramps.

John Jenkins, Vanderbilt's top scorer at 23 points per game and the tournament MVP, finished with 14 points for the Commodores (4-1), who led by eight with 10:10 to play. Taylor added 13 points and Tinsley had nine.

Devon Collier had 19 points for the Beavers (4-1), while Ahmad Starks added 16.

Vanderbilt, especially Taylor, did an outstanding defensive job on Cunningham, who had two points in the second half. The junior guard scored 35 points against Hofstra and 37 in a semifinal win over Texas, but he just couldn't get open looks against Vanderbilt.

That included the game's final play, when Cunningham drove to the basket as time ran out but Taylor stayed with him and the ball didn't even hit the rim. The Oregon State bench was yelling for a foul, but replays showed it was a clean play by Taylor.

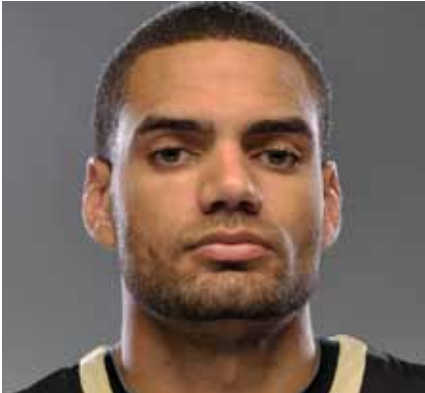
